Iran says six powers to meet before more nuclear talks Iran

ISTANBUL, 20 Sept— Iran's chief nuclear negotiator Saeed Jalili said on Wednesday he and European Union foreign policy chief Catherine Ashton had agreed to defer more nuclear talks until she has consulted the six world powers she represents next week.

Jalili said his talks with Ashton had been constructive. "We evaluated the common points and what we could do for further cooperation and future meetings," Jalili told a news conference in Istanbul, after meeting Ashton late on Tuesday.

He said they had agreed to renew contact after Ashton has met the six powers seeking to rein in Iran's nuclear programme. The United States, Russia, China, France, atom bomb would threaten its

Germany and Britain have existence and that it may sought to persuade Iran to scale back its nuclear work by intensifying economic sanctions and diplomatic pressure. They fear Iran is developing an atomic bomb capability, but Tehean says its nuclear programme has only peaceful purposes.

Ashton is expected to meet the six powers on the margins of the United Nations General Assembly in New Yorknextweek.

Though three rounds of talks with Iran since April have made little progress, neither side wants to stop negotiating because of concerns that a breakdown of diplomacy could lead to war.

Israel, believed to be the Middle East's only nucleararmed state, says any Iranian attack Iran if diplomacy and sanctions fail.

In Vienna, the head of Israel's atomic energy commission said Iran carried out its nuclear activities "with impunity" as international measures had no effect on the programme. "Iran is utterly indifferent to decisions and wishes of the international community," Shaul Chorev told the annual assembly of the 155-nation International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA).—Reuters

Obama, Karzai discuss 'insider' attacks in Afghanistan

WASHINGTON, 20 Sept-President Barack Obama and Afghan President Hamid Karzai agreed on Wednesday to press forward with a US-Afghan security pact, the White House said, despite the curtailment of NATO operations in response to a surge in "insider" attacks on foreign servicemen.

"The two presidents discussed a range of issues, including efforts to stem insider attacks on US, coalition, and Afghan forces,' the White House said in a statement summarizing a video conference call between the two leaders.

They also agreed to continue implementation of a Strategic Partnership agreement signed in May during Obama's visit to Afghanistan, the White House said.

The White House said

on Tuesday there would be no change in Obama's timeline for gradually handing over security responsibility to Afghans and eventually withdrawing US troops. NATO has agreed to remove most of its forces in 2014.

At least 51 foreign troops have been killed in "insider" attacks this year in which Afghan security personnel have turned their weapons on their Western mentors.

NATO ordered a cutback on Tuesday in operations with Afghan forces in response to a surge of insider attacks, but said the restriction was temporary and would not derail the security handover.

Idaho and South Dakota are the first states to begin early voting on Friday, although North Carolina has been accepting absentee ballots by mail since 6 September. By the end of

Such voters make up large percentages of those casting ballots before Election Day, and they tend to back Democrats. Absentee ballots, popular among military voters, tend to favour Republicans.

The restrictions on early voting are among several election laws passed by Republican-led legislatures since 2010. Other new laws, also challenged by Democrats and voting-rights groups, have been aimed at limiting voter registration and requiring voters to show photo IDs. Three killed in explosion in Kandahar, Afghanistan Afghanistan

KANDAHAR, 20 Sept—At least three people were killed in a blast targeting a police vehicle in Kandahar, capital of the southern Afghan province of Kandahar, on Wednesday, a provincial government spokesman said.

"A bomb fixed in a motor tricycle was detonated at around 7:45 pm local time when a police vehicle was passing by in the 14 subdistrict of Kandahar city,"Jawid Faisal told Xinhua.

The dead included two policemen and a passer-by child and the wounded were five policemen and a civilian, he said.

No group has claimed responsibility for the attack but Taleban militants have been behind most suicide and roadside bomb attacks across the war-ravaged country.

NASA rover snaps pictures of an eclipse from Mars Science

CAPE CANAVERAL, 20 Sept— NASA's Mars rover Curiosity, dispatched to determine if the planet most like Earth in the solar system could have supported microbial life, has taken on a second job — moonlighting as an astronomer.

Last week, Curiosity outfitted its high-resolution camera with protective filters and took pictures of the sun as Phobos, one of Mars' two small moons, sailed by. It was A&M University, told a tricky shoot.

Phobos and its sister moon Deimos are closer to Mars than our moon is to Earth, so they shoot across the sky relatively quickly. Phobos takes less than eight hours to circle Mars. Deimos takes about 30 hours to make the trip.

Last Thursday, the moons started to cross paths.

"Phobos grazed the edge of the sun, as seen from Curiosity. We had basically a partial eclipse," astronomer Mark Lemmon, with Texas reporters during a conference call on Wednesday.

The rover took more than

600 images with its left and right cameras, about 100 of which captured some part of the eclipse.

Not all the pictures have been radioed back to Earth. Curiosity has a partner in the project. From the other side of the planet, the rover Opportunity was expected to try to shoot the eclipse on Wednesday.

Aside from pretty pictures, the images should help scientists learn more about Mars' internal structure. Like Earth's moon, Mars' moons have some gravitational pull that slightly change the planet's shape.

That in turn changes the moons' orbits - Phobos is slowing down, Deimos is speeding up, like our moon," Lemmon said. "This is something that happens very slowly over time.'

In 10 million to 15 million years, Phobos is expected to be so close to Mars that it will be torn apart by the planet's

gravity. The moons' passages by the sun, captured by NASA's rovers, help scientists nail down their orbits and determine how fast they are

changing. That information in turn is used to assess how much Mars is deformed as the moons go by.

Curiosity resumed skywatching on Tuesday, when both moons passed overhead.

"This was a really hard thing to do. The timing was very precise," Lemmon said. The next Martian

eclipses will take place in about 11 months. By then, Curiosity should be in a better vantage point. The rover's eventual

science target is a three-milehigh mound of sediment rising from the floor of the Gale Crater impact basin where Curiosity landed six weeks ago.

Tech giants form new Internet lobby group Tech

SAN FRANCISCO, 20 Sept— Google, Facebook, Amazon and 11 other technology heavyweights on Wednesday announced that they have formed a lobby group, vowing to strengthen and protect a free and innovative Internet.

The group, called "The Internet Association," is the first trade association representing the interests of the Internet economy in the United States, it said in a Press Release. The association now has 14 members, namely Amazon.com, AOL, eBay, Expedia, Facebook, Google, IAC, LinkedIn, Monster, Rackspace, Salesforce.com, TripAdvisor, Yahoo and Zynga. Although Apple and Microsoft are absent from the list, the group said it represents "the unified voice of the Internet economy."

"A free and innovative Internet is vital to our nation's economic growth," said Michael Beckerman, President and CEO of The Internet Association. He said those companies "understand the future of the Internet is at stake" and they "must work together to protect it." Beckerman recently stepped down as a top aide to US House Energy and Commerce Committee Chairman Fred Upton. The group is based in Washington.

Tech giants have been more politically savvy these years as US lawmakers are putting more attention to issues like on-line privacy and competition.

Googlespentarecord 5.03 million US dollars on lobbying during the first quarter this year, a big increase from 1.48 million dollars in the same period last year. Facebook also

broke its lobbying record in the second quarter of 2012, the quarter during which the company went public. It spent 960,000 dollars in wooing politicians, tripling the money it spent in the same period of 2011.—Reuters

RIM shares rise on Microsoft file technology license deal Tech

TORONTO, 20 Sept-Research In Motion's shares jumped on Tuesday after it signed a patent licensing deal with Microsoft Corp to use one of the technology company's file storage systems. Microsoft said the patent being licensed by RIM greatly expands the size of files that flash memory devices can handle and increases the speed at which those files can be accessed. The technology also provides the ability to seamlessly transfer data between a variety of different devices.

'This is potentially money out of RIM's coffers for the right to use the ex-FAT patent in its technology. But what it does for investors and others is provide a glimpse into what the BlackBerry 10 devices can do," said Kevin Restivo, a mobile device analyst at global research firm IDC.

RIM has seen its once dominant position in the smartphone market slip away to Apple Inc, Samsung and other competitors, and the company's fate may depend on the success of its new line of devices, the BlackBerry 10, which is set to hit the market early in 2013. RIM hopes the BlackBerry 10 will help it regain market share that has been ceded to snazzier devices such as Apple's iPhone and others that run on Google Inc's Android operating system.

"I think there is some anticipation and speculation around the devices that RIM will launch as a result of the announcement today," Restivo said. RIM shares closed 21 Canadian cents higher at C\$7.24 on Tuesday on the Toronto Stock Exchange. On Nasdaq, they closed 2.3 percent higher at \$7.42.-Reuters

Bank group warns of heightened risk of cyber attacks Tech

SAN FRANCISCO, 20 Sept-A financial services industry group warned US banks, brokerages and insurers on Wednesday to be on heightened alert for cyber attacks after Bank of America and JPM organ Chase experienced unexplained outages on their public websites.

The Financial Services Information Sharing and Analysis Centre, which is widely known as FS-ISAC, raised the cyber threat level to "high" from "elevated" in an advisory to members, citing "recent credible intelligence regarding the potential" for cyber attacks as its reason for the move.

The problems with the websites at the two banks came after an unidentified person posted a statement on the Internet threatening to attack Bank of America and the New York Stock Exchange as a "first step" in a campaign against US companies. The posting said the attacks would continue until the film that had stirred up anti-US protests across the Middle East was "erased" from the Internet.

It was not possible to identify the person who posted the statement. Nor was it clear if the threat had anything to do with the issues at either of the two banks.

Dan Holden, director of security research at Arbor Networks, said that several US banks were under assault by a distributed denial of service (DDoS) campaign. He declined to identify them by name.

An outside security contractor who was familiar with the attacks said that they were "massive" in scope.

Denial-of-service attacks seek to disrupt websites and

other computer systems at the targeted organization by overwhelming their networks with computer traffic.

FRAUDALERT

The move by FS-ISAC came just two days the FBI published a "fraud alert" advising financial services firms that cyber criminals may be disrupting service to their websites in a bid to keep banks from noticing a recent surge in fraudulent large-sized wire transfers. (1.usa.gov/SUGCDZ)

"Often these DDoS attacks are part of a more sophisticated blended threat - One that utilizes DDoS as a diversion for more complex, difficult to detect techniques with the intention to extract customer data or financial information," said Holden of Arbor Networks.

An FBI spokeswoman declined to say if the tactics cited in the fraud alert were related to the problems experienced by the two banks.

Six million Americans likely to pay healthcare tax in 2016 Health

WASHINGTON, 20 Sept-US budget experts raised their forecast on Wednesday of how many Americans will probably have to pay a penalty in 2016 for not buying health insurance to 6 million from 4 million. The 50 percent increase was likely to draw fire from Republicans on the campaign trail who want to repeal President Barack Obama's signature healthcare law and who reject the penalty as a government intrusion into the lives of individuals.

But the nonpartisan Congressional Budget Office said some of the increase reflects state opposition to an expansion under the healthcare law of the Medicaid programme for the poor, which is most unpopular in states with scheduled to rise in 2016 to

There are now 49 million people without health insurance in the United States, according to the US Census Bureau. The law requires most Americans to have some form of health insurance — known as the individual mandate. The law stipulates that those who do not acquire health coverage will face a penalty.

NEW YORK, 20 Sept—People who smoke or drink heavily may develop pancreatic cancer at an earlier age than folks who avoid those habits, a new study suggests.

It's long been known that smoking is a risk factor for developing pancreatic cancer — a disease that is rarely caught early and has a grim prognosis. Only about five of every 100 people diagnosed with the cancer are still alive five years later. The evidence on heavy drinking has been more mixed, but some studies have suggested it's also a risk factor. Now, the new results show the disease may strike smokers and drinkers earlier in life.

"If you do have these habits, and you're going to develop pancreatic cancer, the age of presentation may be younger," said lead researcher Dr Michelle A Anderson, of the University of Michigan Health System in Ann Arbor. Her team also found that the effect disappeared for

The findings do not prove that smoking or drinking led to the earlier cancers. But Anderson's team did account for a number of other factors, like body weight and family history of pancreatic cancer. And smoking and heavy drinking were still linked to earlier diagnoses.

What's more, Anderson noted, there was a "dose" effect. Smokers who went through more than a pack a day were diagnosed at a younger age than people who smoked less than a pack per day. And once people had refrained from smoking or heavy drinking for a decade, the excess risk of an early cancer seemed to disappear.

According to Anderson, the findings could have implications in the future, if widespread screening for pancreatic cancer becomes a reality.-Reuters

Colombia's Santos faces tougher peace talks-Colombia Pastrana

BOGOTA, 20 Sept— The last Colombian president to negotiate with Marxist rebels says current leader Juan Manuel Santos will face an even tougher time in new talks because of opposition from the far right and doubts about whether rebel leaders are united.

Andres Pastrana led the last attempt at peace more than a decade ago, but those talks collapsed and they were seen as having helped the **Revolutionary Armed Forces** of Colombia, or FARC, build up their fighting forces.

Half-way through his four-year term, Santos is staking his reputation and political future on a new round of peace talks set to start in October with the drugfunded FARC rebels, who took up arms almost 50 years ago in a conflict that has killed tens of thousands.

Pastrana is warning that possible divisions inside the FARC could make it a lot more difficult to reach a peace deal

"Are the FARC united? Are all the (FARC divisions) in the negotiation?," Pastrana asked rhetorically in an interview late on Tuesday

with Reuters at his office.

"During our negotiation, one knew that when (FARC founder Manuel) Marulanda was there and took a decision, it was monolithic. Today, are these decisions monolithic or is there a front that wants to continue drug trafficking or that doesn't want to enter into a peace process? That is the doubt.'

Pastrana's negotiations from 1999 to 2002 gave rebels a demilitarized area the size of Switzerland, but further talks collapsed after guerrillas hijacked an airplane.

The failure paved the way

for conservative Alvaro Uribe to take over the presidency with a clear mandate to crack down on the FARC.

A decade of Uribe's USbacked offensive more than halved the guerrilla army's ranks and pushed it back to remote jungle and mountain hide-outs.

Down but not out, the FARC increased its attacks in the last two years of Uribe's government and has continued to harass government forces since Santos took office.

"We're close to seeing mass unemployment in cities and queues for social handouts. There are few alternatives for those people

Mexico detains 16 guards over prison break

MEXICO CITY, 20 Sept-A local judge on Wednesday ordered the detention of 16 prison guards in connection with Monday's mass prison break at a northern Mexican jail along the border with the US state of Texas.

The prison's director and 15 guards are to be detained for 40 days while prosecutors investigate their possible role in the escape, the Coahuila state attorney general's office said in a statement.

After taking testimony from the guards, Coahuila state prosecutor Homero Ramos said investigators were looking into the possibility that several inmates escaped through the prison's gate with the help of the guards. Coahuila's Public Security Secretary Jorge Luis Moran indicated at a Press conference that recaptured inmates "confirm the hypothesis that inmates escaped through the main gate and that there was total complicity, collusion and betrayal on the part of prison employees."

Moran said the majority of the escaped inmates had connections with the Zetas drug cartel, and its leaders, with the help of the prison staff, had arranged the jailbreak. State police officers were attacked by gunmen with high-caliber weapons and grenades when they tried to reach the prison immediately after the escape, raising suspicions that the Zetas were involved, he added.-Xinhua

Spain to have 6 million unemployed in 2013: CEOE

MADRID, 20 Sept—The Spanish Confederation of **Business** Organizations (CEOE) reported on Wednesday that Spain will have almost 6 million people unemployed in 2013. According to the data released by the business organization, despite the labor reform adopted by the Spanish government, unemployment will continue to grow and in 2012 will reach 5.8 million people. This means that the unemployment rate will be 25.2 percent in 2012 and will reach 26.5 percent in 2013.

UK needs more ambitious electric car grant scheme — MPs UK

LONDON, 20 Sept-Britain needs a more ambitious programme to encourage the uptake of low-carbon vehicles, as sales of the cars have disappointed, a committee made up of MPs said on Thursday.

As part of its aim to reduce carbon dioxide emissions to 80 percent below 1990 levels by 2050, the government has offered 25 percent off the price of a plug-in electric car capped at 5,000 pounds.

Plug-in cars, such as the Chevrolet Volt, Nissan Leaf, Toyota Prius and Vauxhall Ampera, typically cost in excess of 20,000 pounds. The government expects to see tens of thousands of plug-in vehicles, which have a longer driving range than all-electric vehicles but which still need to be charged, on the roads by 2015, but demand has been weak, said a report by the Transport Select Committee.

In 2011, 1,052 vehicles eligible for the plug-in car grant were registered. The committee said consumer demand was lagging behind and that the subsidy was ineffective because the purchase price was still too high.

Radioactive shipment returned to India

COLOMBO, 20 Sept-Sri Lanka has returned a metal shipment that arrived on an Indian vessel after local tests showed they were radioactive, the Power and Energy Ministry said here on Wednesday.

The consignment, contaminated with a radioactive material, has been discovered by the port authorities in a 40-foot container and upon testing it has been found that 125 units of stainless steel and aluminum products were all contaminated.

The tests, which were carried out by the Atomic Energy Authority (AEA), had revealed significant traces of Cobalt 60, which is a highly radioactive element used in the treatment of cancer, Power and Energy Ministry spokesman D. Ramanayake told Xinhua. "The container has been returned to India and the AEA will inform the Indian authorities of the radiation contamination. Sri Lanka's AEA will continue to test materials shipped to Sri Lanka," he said.

The AEA also kept the container secluded for about a week after it arrived at the Colombo port.

Sri Lankan authorities have not decided whether they would take legal action against the owners of the shipment.—Xinhua

LONDON, 20 Sept— Britain's financial workers watched their bonuses fall to 12,000 pounds on average last year, down about 11 percent from a year earlier, as regulation and tough economic conditions squeezed the sector, official data showed.

Streamlined visa process draws more tourists to US

WASHINGTON, 20 Sept— Mexico, China and Brazil, along with other countries, are contributing more to the US tourism industry thanks to a streamlined visa process and reduced wait time, the White House said on Wednesday.

The White House released a progress report saying the Departments of State and Homeland Security were surpassing the goals set by President Barack Obama in January in terms of visa interview time and visa processing capacity to boost the tourism industry in the country.

The report said 88 percent of non-immigrant visa applicants worldwide are interviewed within three weeks of submitting their applications, as against the goal of 80 percent envisioned by Obama. "In key markets such as China, consular officers are keeping interview wait times to an average of five days in 2012 while managing a yearon-year 37 percent increase in visa demand," the report said. Like Mexico and Brazil, China has passed the 1million-visa milestone, the report noted.-Xinhua

NEW YORK, 20 Sept—Nike Inc is beefing up its capacity to use its cash to purchase its own shares, with the board of the world's largest sportswear maker approving an \$8 billion buyback programme. The new \$8 billion four-year repurchase programme for Nike's class B stock will follow the company's current \$5 billion buyback plan once that programme is completed during the second quarter of fiscal 2013, Nike said on Wednesday.

"Over the past 10 years, Nike has returned \$10 billion to shareholders through the repurchase of more than 167 million shares," Chief Executive Mark Parker said in a statement, adding that share buybacks are a prudent use of Nike's cash.

Nike has a market value of \$44 billion based on its closing share price Wednesday of \$97.66 and its 453.87 million shares outstanding. Another US company, CVS Caremark, also announced a big \$6 billion share buyback programme on Wednesday.—*Reuters* British banks like Barclays and Royal Bank of Scotland have been under pressure to stop a highreward, high-risk culture that was blamed for the financial crisis. Pay structures have also been changed, with many firms lifting base salaries while cutting bonuses.

The total amount of bonuses paid out to British financial service staff fell to 13 billion pounds in the latest financial year, down almost a third from the peak of 19 billion pounds four years ago, the ONS said. Floyd Mayweather must pay Manny Pacquiao over \$113,000 for legal fees Boxing

NEW YORK, 20 Sept-Manny Pacquiao is still waiting to fight Floyd Mayweather Jr, but he claimed a victory of sorts on Wednesday when a federal judge ruled Mayweather must pay Pacquiao more than \$113,000 for failing to give a deposition in a defamation suit, according to several media reports.

The majority of the money will likely go to Pacquiao's attorneys, who had filed suit on behalf of their boxer client for defamation after Mayweather told reporters and others that Pacquiao uses performance-enhancing drugs.

'Calling a professional athlete a cheater is the most serious charge one can make," Pacquiao's original lawsuit said. "Accusing an athlete of using performance-enhancing drugs-however baseless and lacking in evidence - is toxic.'

Mayweather was scheduled to sit for a deposition sometime between June and October last year, but never showed up. One of his arguments was that he was too busy training, but investigators obtained photos of Mayweather at various nightclubs across the country showing him dancing, drinking and spending significant amounts of money.

'Mayweather decided that he, not the court, would determine if and when his deposition would take place," according to the motion. -Reuters

Louisiana man arrested in university bomb threat case

NEW ORLEANS, 20 Sept-A man has been arrested in connection with a bomb threat that led to the evacuation of Louisiana State University, but he does not appear to be linked to recent threats against other universities, school police said on Wednesday. William Bouvay, 42, of Baton Rouge, was arrested late on Tuesday on charges of communicating false information of a planned bombing, the university police said. LSU's Baton Rouge campus was evacuated after receiving a phone call on Monday warning of multiple bombs.

Students were later allowed to return to their dormitories after police swept buildings at the university, which has 29,000 students and 4,700 faculty and staff. No explosives were found. Police said the bomb threat was made from a deactivated cell phone that was only able to make emergency calls. Investigators pinpointed a GPS location from which the call was placed, then searched the area and identified Bouvay as a suspect. When questioned, he admitted making the threat, police said. The Louisiana case was similar to several other recent cases. On
