## Djokovic beats Tsonga for third China Open title

BEIJING, 7 Oct—Top-seeded Serbian Novak Djokovic beat Frenchman Jo-Wilfried Tsonga 7-6 6-2 on Sunday to win his third China Open tennis title in Beijing.

World number two Djokovic dug deep in the first set after an early trade of breaks to win a close tie-breaker and then broke the third-seeded Tsonga twice in the second set.

“I think the first set was really even and maybe a couple of points decided the winner there,” Djokovic told reporters.

“We both had our chances aside from those breaks that we converted... I managed to hold my nerve in the end.

“I made that early break in the second (and) I felt much more comfortable on the court.”

Sunday’s victory gave Djokovic, who also won the China Open in 2009 and 2010, his fourth title of the year.

The 2012 Australian Open champion will remain in the hunt to take back the world number one ranking from Roger Federer at the end of the year.

“That’s the target,” Djokovic said. “This will definitely help me in that race but it’s still quite open. There are still tournaments to come, big ones.”

Tsonga said he needed to raise his game to beat top players such as Djokovic after his sixth straight loss to the Serbian.

“I think it was a good match,” Tsonga said. “I missed

## Brokerage, highway cargo terminal under construction

YANGON, 7 Oct—Thiri Yadana Retail and Wholesale Brokerage and Highway Cargo Terminal are under construction near Aungmyingala Highway Bus Terminal at the junction of No 3 Highway in Mingaladon Township and Thudhamma Road in North Okkalapa Township.

Under the project, U Myat Thu of Ga Mone Pwint Co Ltd said, "Ga Mone Pwint Co Ltd constructs the building on the land of Yangon City Development Committee. It is located on 38.5 acres of land. The project started in September and it is estimated to be completed in

September 2013. The brokerage will comprise over 900 shops and 50 two-storey buildings plus hotels, banks and bus terminals."

The designs of structures of the projects will be drawn from architects from Thailand. The cargo terminal will be facilitated with 36 feet wide two-way concrete roads and 18 feet wide one way road. Two vehicles each can stop over at the shops, totaling over 1800 vehicles. About 200 vehicles from visitors may stop for shopping.

Tyre, battery, engine oil, car parts, construction materials, home cornices and electronic equipment are



available at the brokerage. In the near future, the brokerage will be centred for city dwellers to transport commodities to countryside.—Kyemon

**Venezuelans urged to vote in Sunday's presidential election**

CARACAS, 7 Oct— Venezuelans were urged on Saturday to cast their ballots in an upcoming presidential election to determine the course of the country.

"We need to maintain civil conduct on a day which represents a crucial commitment for the nation," Pablo Perez, governor of Venezuela's most populous

Zulia state, said in a televised speech.

"On Sunday it will be up to each person's conscience, but the next day we will all be just Venezuelans," he added.

Some 19 million Venezuelan voters will go to the polls on Sunday, in a race that pits incumbent President Hugo Chavez, who is promoting his so-called "21st century socialism," against opposition leader Henrique Capriles, who describes his goals as "progressive."

Latest poll gave Chavez 57 percent of voting intentions and Capriles 43 percent.

German Campos, who head the local 30:11 polling agency, said that the election would be fair and transparent.

Venezuelan elections are the most secure on the planet, Campos told state-run broadcaster Venezolana de Television, citing a report by election observing agency the Carter Centre.

"The process is the best in the world," he said.

Campos said that the nation had managed to get virtually all qualified citizens onto the voter roll and that the government's literacy campaign, which had achieved essentially 100 percent literacy in the nation by 2005, had ensured transparency.

Sunday's election is a one-round, first-past-the-post system. There are six candidates in total, but only two are considered to have real chance of winning.

**Four killed, 10 wounded in attacks in Iraq**

BAGHDAD, 7 Oct — Four people were killed and 10 wounded in separate bomb and gunfire attacks in Iraq on Saturday, the police said. A soldier was killed and three were wounded when a roadside bomb went off around noon near an Iraqi army patrol in Taji area, some 20 km north of the capital Baghdad, an Interior Ministry source told Xinhua on condition of anonymity.

In the early hours of the day, gunmen broke into a house at a village near the city of Samarra, some 120 km north of Baghdad, and shot dead a man and wounded two of his family members, a local police source told Xinhua anonymously. In a separate incident, a policeman was killed and another wounded in a roadside bomb explosion near their patrol in central the city of Fallujah, some 50 km west of Baghdad, a local police source told Xinhua.

In Iraq's eastern province of Diyala, a magnetic bomb attached to a minibus carrying school children detonated in the city of Saadiyah, some 120 km northeast of Baghdad, killing a school teacher and wounding four children, a provincial police source told Xinhua on condition of anonymity. Violence in Iraq has ebbed from its climax in 2006 and 2007, when sectarian conflicts pushed the country to the brink of a civil war. But tensions and sporadic shootings and bombings are still common across the country.—Xinhua

**Gunmen attack NATO container in Pakistan, driver, cleaner injured**

ISLAM ABAD, 7 Oct — Unidentified gunmen in Pakistan's southwest region attacked a container, carrying supplies for NATO forces in Afghanistan, and injured its driver and his assistant, police in the region said on Saturday.

The driver and his assistant received bullet injuries in Mastung area of Balochistan and were shifted to Quetta, the provincial capital. Officials said that the container loaded with goods was on its way from Karachi to Afghanistan when unknown gunmen riding a motorcycle opened fire at the container.

The assailants also set the container on fire. Later, the attackers managed to escape.

The local militia force rushed to the site of attack and conducted a search operation but no one was arrested.

The police also registered a case against unknown attackers and started investigation into the incident.

No group claimed responsibility. Taliban militants are blamed for such attacks. Some 70 percent supplies are reportedly transported for nearly 150,000 US-led NATO troops in Afghanistan.—Xinhua

**Israeli air force shoots down drone aircraft**

JERUSALEM, 7 Oct—The Israeli air force shot down a drone after it crossed into southern Israel on Saturday, the military said, but it remained unclear where the aircraft had come from.

The drone was first spotted above the Mediterranean in the area of the Hamas-ruled Gaza Strip to the west of Israel, said military spokeswoman Avital Leibovich.

It was kept under surveillance and followed by Israeli air force jets before it was shot down above a forest in an unpopulated area near the border with the occupied West Bank.

Leibovich said it was shot down at about 10 a.m. (0700 GMT), after it travelled

east some 35 miles across Israel's southern Negev desert.

Defence Minister Ehud Barak praised the interception as "sharp and effective". "We view with great severity the attempt to compromise Israeli air space and will consider our response in due course," Barak said in a statement.

Soldiers, assisted by helicopters, were searching the area for the remains of the drone, which security sources said most likely did not originate from the Gaza Strip.

Israel's Army Radio reported the drone was not carrying any explosives.

Israeli parliament member Miri Regev, a former chief spokesman of the

war with Israel in 2006.

Defence officials would not confirm Hezbollah's connection to the drone.

**Iran dismisses EU threats on natural gas export ban**

TEHERAN, 7 Oct—The Iranian oil ministry has dismissed the recent threat by the European Union (EU) to ban Iran's natural gas export, semi-official Fars news agency reported Saturday. The EU threat is a "propaganda campaign," Alireza Nikzad-Rahbar, a spokesman of the ministry, was quoted as saying in response to EU diplomats' recent remarks that EU is mulling over imposing a ban on Iran's gas export into Europe to put up pressure on the Islamic republic over its controversial nuclear programme.

"Right now no EU member imports Iranian gas supply," Nikzad— Rahbar said. "The new EU threat is just a propaganda maneuvering and will never take place since they (the EU members) can never make themselves politically dependent on the other countries." Iran is now exporting gas to Turkey and has swap deals with Armenia and Azerbaijan, according to the report.

On Friday, Iranian Oil Minister Rostam Qasemi held comprehensive talks with Turkish oil officials in Istanbul over increasing exports of Iranian oil and natural gas supplies to Turkey, said Fars.

The two countries also agreed on

Uzbekistan's natural gas transit to Turkey via Iran and in return for Iran's gas transit to Europe through Turkey, said the report.

In the meantime, Iranian lawmaker Esmail Kowsari said the EU intention to impose a ban on Iranian natural gas export to Europe would prove a "mistake," Teheran Times daily reported on Saturday.

"The European Union should be aware that it is making a mistake, and Iran will get through this stage, and in the future, the member states of the union will beg Iran to renew their oil and (natural) gas contracts due to their need for energy," Kowsari was quoted by the daily as saying on Friday.

The EU members based their decision on the recent fluctuations in Iran's foreign exchange market, which is a miscalculation, he said. Kowsari, a member of the Iranian Majlis (parliament) National Security and Foreign Policy Commission, also said it would be the EU's last resort to complete the economic blockade on Iran.

"As we overcame most of our problems (caused by) oil (sanctions), we will deal with encroachment on the export of (natural) gas," said the Iranian lawmaker.—Xinhua

**North China residential building blast kills one, injuring 34**

SHIJIAZHUANG, 7 Oct—Illegal manufacturing and storage of detonators triggered an explosion in a residential building of Baoding City in north China's Hebei Province, which has left one killed and 34 injured by Sunday morning, local police said.

Police found self-made detonator shells at the explosion site of the six-storey building in Dongwuyao Village. Detonator shells and materials of explosives were also discovered in the building's basement. Police suspected illegal manufacturing and storage of detonators might have caused the blast. The injured have been sent to hospital for treatment. Among them, two remained in critical condition, said a spokesman with the city government.

Part of the building

collapsed after the blast happened at around 3 pm at the Yaoheningyuan Residential Community in Baoding. Witnesses said heavy smoke was seen following the explosion,

which shattered window glass of buildings 200 meters away. An overhaul of illegal storage of explosives has been staged across the city following the blast, police said.—Xinhua

SpaceX set for its first cargo run to space station **Science**

CAPE CANAVERAL, (Florida), 7 Oct—Space Exploration Technologies, the first private company to fly to the International Space Station, is poised to launch its initial cargo mission to the orbital outpost as part of a \$1.6 billion contract with NASA to deliver supplies.

Liftoff of the company's Falcon 9 rocket and Dragon capsule is scheduled for 8:35 p.m. EDT on Sunday (0035 GMT Monday) from Cape Canaveral Air Force Station in Florida.

If successful, the company, founded and run by Internet entrepreneur Elon Musk, will restore a U.S. supply line to the station that was cut off by the retirement of the space shuttles last year.

Since then, NASA has been dependent on Russian, European and Japanese freighters to service the station, a permanently staffed research laboratory that flies about 250 miles (400 km) above Earth.

In May the firm, also

known as SpaceX, made a practice run to the \$100 billion orbital outpost, a project of 15 countries, clearing the way for the first of 12 cargo runs.

SpaceX is one of two firms hired by NASA to deliver cargo to the station.


Its other contractor, Orbital Sciences Corp. (ORB.N), on October 1 rolled out its first Antares rocket to a new launch pad on Wallops Island, Virginia, for an engine test-firing slated for this month or early November.

The rocket is scheduled to make its debut flight before the end of the year.

Orbital also plans a practice run to the space station, similar to what SpaceX did when its Dragon ship docked at the station. If all goes well, Orbital will be cleared to begin work on its \$1.9-billion NASA contract to fly cargo to the station.

For Dragon's first supply run, NASA is sending about 1,000 pounds (454 kg) of

food, clothing, supplies and science gear to the station.

Unlike previous station cargo ships, which were not reusable and burned up in the atmosphere during descent, SpaceX's capsule returns to Earth.

As a result, it will be able to carry back experiment samples and station hardware that is broken or no longer needed.

NASA contributed \$396 million to SpaceX and up to

\$288 million to Orbital to help the firms develop their cargo ships. The agency is running a related, \$1.12 billion program with SpaceX, Boeing (BA.N) and privately owned Sierra Nevada Corp. to design station crew transports.

"There's this burst of creativity going on in the private sector," said former NASA astronaut Garrett Reisman, who joined SpaceX in March 2011.—Reuters

Italy's Wind calls for mobile network sharing **Tech**

CAPRI, 7 Oct—Italy's third-largest mobile phone company Wind called for peers to share their frequencies and antennas to help roll out a superfast network.

"I believe there is awareness among all mobile operators that there is the need to place, into a specifically created company, frequencies and networks," Wind Chief Executive Maximo Ibarra said on the sidelines of an

event in Capri on Friday. "Competition will be on services," he said.

Elsewhere in Europe, mobile operators have already inked or are negotiating network-sharing deals as they aim to save costs and boost coverage at a time of economic downturn. In June, Vodafone and O2, owned by Telefonica of Spain, agreed to form a joint venture in Britain to pool

infrastructure and cut costs of building a new superfast service.

Ibarra also said plans by Telecom Italia to separate its fixed network into a new company should be open to the state, broadband infrastructure company Metroweb and alternative carriers to join. Telecom Italia, Italy's biggest telecoms company, is in talks with state-backed financing

body Cassa Depositi e Prestiti (CDP) to spin off its valuable landline infrastructure and boost broadband investment in Italy. The CDP is expected to take a minority stake in the project.

Telecom Italia Chairman Franco Bernabe has said the company will take a decision on whether to go ahead with the spin-off by the end of the year.

Apple's iPhone 5 gets thumbs-up from Consumer Reports **Tech**

SAN FRANCISCO, 7 Oct—Consumer Reports, the influential reviewers' group that blasted the iPhone 4 for a faulty antenna, on Friday gave Apple Inc's latest smartphone a thumbs-up despite echoing widespread complaints about its patchy mapping service.

The organization, which in 2010 withheld its recommendation for the iPhone because of spotty reception when the gadget was held in a certain way, said laboratory tests confirmed that the new iPhone 5 ranked among the best smartphones but its mapping function clearly fell short.

Apple's latest iPhone, sporting a larger 4-inch screen and 4G capability, drew scathing reviews for glaring errors in a new, self-designed mapping service. Chief Executive Tim Cook apologized last week and directed users to rival services run by Google Inc and others.

**Tech** Amazon pays top dollar to buy Seattle HQ

NEW YORK, 7 Oct—Amazon.com Inc said on Friday it will spend over \$1 billion to buy its Seattle corporate headquarters in what will be the United States' biggest commercial real estate deal so far this year for a single property.

The world's largest Internet retailer plans to buy 11 buildings in the trendy South Lake Union area, comprising 1.8 million square feet of corporate office space, for \$1.16 billion from Microsoft Corp co-founder Paul Allen's investment firm.

Based on the value of the deal, Amazon is paying the highest ever price for an office building over 100,000 square feet in Seattle at around \$644 per square foot. That is more than double the average rate of \$308 per

square foot for the city's office space, according to Real Capital Analytics.

Amazon has been leasing the properties and it may make more economic sense for it to buy the location in the current low-interest environment and gain more control over its HQ, analysts said.

Amazon expects to close the deal in the fourth quarter on the modern office buildings in South Lake Union, a former semi-industrial wasteland now known as a center for tech firms and fashionable restaurants. "It's good to have control over your home office," said RJ Hottovy, an equity analyst at Morningstar.

At the end of August, Allen's Vulcan Real Estate, part of his Vulcan Inc

investment vehicle, put the buildings up for sale.

The deal marks the United States' biggest single-asset commercial real estate transaction of 2012, according to Real Capital Analytics, which tracks such sales.

Allen, who co-founded Microsoft with school friend Bill Gates, has been the central figure in the revitalization of the South Lake Union neighborhood.

Amazon already has plans to build new offices nearby to house its growing staff, which total more than 50,000.

Earlier this year, the e-commerce company revealed plans to build more than 3.3 million square feet of office space over the next eight years.

**Mexico announces discovery of rich oil deposit**

MEXICO City, 7 Oct— Mexico has discovered new deepwater oil deposits in the Gulf of Mexico with estimated reserves of 75 million to 125 million barrels, President Felipe Calderon announced on Friday.

Calderon said new deposit Supremus 1, the latest find by state-owned oil

company Pemex, is located at 250 km east of Matamoros city in Tamaulipas state. It could be the largest oil field found in years with prospective reserves that could amount to as much as 13 billion barrels of crude equivalent.

With a flow depth of almost 2,900 metres,

Supremus 1 is the eighth-deepest deposit in the world and is the second oil deposit announced by Calderon in less than 40 days.

On 29 Aug, Calderon announced the discovery of Trion 1, a deposit also located in the Gulf of Mexico less than 90 km from the northeastern Tamaulipas state.

The deposits confirm the existence of a large oil system in the Gulf of Mexico's deep waters, said the Mexican president, adding Mexico would continue working on the 22 wells, among which 15 have already been drilled during his administration.

Pemex is the world's seventh largest oil producer and the largest fiscal contributor of the country.

**China's individual and private businesses expand steadily**

BEIJING, 7 Oct — Individually-owned businesses grew steadily at 4.4 percent annually, while private enterprises achieved an annual growth rate of 15.5 percent from 2002 to

2012, according to the data released by the State Administration for Industry and Commerce (SAIC).

Private enterprises currently account for over 70 percent of China's total

enterprises. Together with individually-owned businesses, they contribute to more than 60 percent of the country's GDP, the data show.

Meanwhile, together, they provide 80 percent of jobs nationwide, and 90 percent of new jobs are from the private sector, according to the data.

Ma Fu, head of the private economy regulation department under the SAIC, said that reforms to improve the market system and create a fair competition environment over the years have contributed to the rapid and steady growth of the nation's individual and private businesses during the past decade.—Xinhua

**More Canadians fall sick in huge E coli beef recall**

WINNIPEG, (Manitoba) 7 Oct—Ten people have now fallen sick from contaminated beef products from a Canadian plant that sent its meat across Canada and the United States, more than twice the number earlier reported, health officials said on Saturday.

The latest cases, linked to one of Canada's largest-ever meat recalls, include three more illnesses in Alberta, where the giant XL Foods beef processing plant is located, two in Quebec and one in Newfoundland and Labrador.

All 10 people are

recovering, the health and food inspection officials said on a conference call with reporters.

The ever-widening recall of meat from the plant now involves more than 1,800 products including steaks, ground beef and roasts and now spans all of Canada and most US states.

The previous four cases were also in Alberta, and officials say they have evidence that these victims ate meat produced by the XL Foods plant in Brooks, Alberta, which has been shut down since 27 September.—Reuters

**US says receives Airbus A350 loan funding documents**

WASHINGTON, 7 Oct—The US government said on Saturday it had received European Union documents on funding for the Airbus (EAD.PA) A350 after requesting them from the World Trade Organization over a month ago in an ongoing transatlantic dispute over aircraft subsidies. "The compliance panel directed the EU to provide documents and briefing upon a request made by the United States more than a month ago, and we received the documents just yesterday," a spokeswoman for the US Trade Representative's Office said.

It is the first time the funding of Europe's answer to the Boeing (BA) 787 Dreamliner, due to make its maiden flight next year, has been drawn directly into the world's largest trade dispute but it remains to be seen how the WTO will act on the data.

Both sides are pressing for major trade sanctions after the Geneva-based WTO

found that Airbus and US rival Boeing had benefited from billions of dollars of unfair subsidies in a pair of trade complaints now in their ninth year.

Washington has called on Airbus to stop receiving loans from its host European nations—Britain, France, Germany and Spain—and argues that the WTO should take loans for the A350 into account when evaluating penalties for earlier support.

The EU says the carbon-composite jet lies outside the case and that its funding will comply with the latest WTO decisions.

A US source told Reuters that outside estimates placed the loans paid to Airbus for the A350 at around \$4.5 billion. According to the US source, who asked not to be identified, the A350 funding numbers were supplied on Friday as part of a WTO compliance procedure. Both sides claim to have obeyed WTO rules while saying their adversaries have not.

A European source said the WTO panel merely wanted to see the funding papers to assess whether they were relevant. It has so far declined to address the A350 payments directly. No official

WTO dispute could offer further bait to US opponents of the \$45 billion merger, which would be subject to thorough vetting by US authorities, including the US Trade Representative's

European comment was immediately available.

The new move comes at a sensitive time for Airbus parent EADS (EAD.PA) as it ponders a merger with Britain's BAE Systems (BA.TO), which has significant interests in the United States.

Recent rumblings in the

**France cuts 2012 growth forecast to 0.2 pct**

PARIS, 7 Oct— French national statistics institute Insee late Thursday revised down its 2012 growth forecast for the country to 0.2 percent from a previous projection of 0.4 percent.

Due to dim performance of industrial activities and weakening consumption, the country's main growth engines, France was set to report zero growth over the third and fourth quarters of the year, compared to an initial forecast of 0.1 percent and 0.2 percent respectively, Insee said in report.

New data showed that the already struggling French economy would stagnate for the five consecutive quarter since the post-war period, adding more pressure on the socialist government to realize its promise of growth recovery in 2013.

Officials seek to expand growth by 0.8 percent in next year's budget. But economists considered the budget too ambitious in the face of the fragile economic activities and deteriorating business climate.

Quarterly growth of 0.3 percent would be needed in 2013 to achieve the 0.8-percent target, said Cedric Audenis, head of Insee's conjuncture division.

Last month, Prime Minister Jean-Marc Ayrault unveiled plans to save more than 30 billion euro (39 billion US dollars) for 2013, the toughest adjustment in three decades, to trim budget gap to 3 percent of national wealth from expected 4.5 percent this year.—Xinhua

**Death toll from meningitis outbreak rises to seven**

NASHVILLE, 7 Oct— The death toll from a widening outbreak of fungal meningitis linked to steroid injections has risen to seven, with 65 cases now reported in nine states, officials said on Saturday. The latest two deaths were reported on Saturday in Michigan, according to the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Those affected fell ill after receiving steroid injections linked to a pharmaceutical compounding plant in Massachusetts.

New cases in Ohio and Minnesota on Saturday brought to nine the number of states affected, officials said. Other states with reported cases of people who fell ill after receiving the injections—primarily for back pain - are Michigan, Tennessee, Virginia, Florida, Maryland, North Carolina and Indiana.

Meningitis is an infection of the membranes covering the brain and spinal cord. Vials of steroids linked to the outbreak were shipped to 76 facilities in 23 states and could have been used to inject thousands of patients, authorities have said.

As in other states where the outbreak has been detected, Minnesota authorities are trying to determine who else may have been infected at six locations known to have used the drugs in question, said Buddy Ferguson, public information officer for the state's Department of Health.— Reuters

**Egypt's Mursi says falls short of goals, seeks to****Egypt****assuage critics**

CAIRO, 7 Oct—Egyptian President Mohamed Mursi said on Saturday he had fallen short of goals he promised to fulfil in his first 100 days in office, but aimed to assuage critics by highlighting his most prominent achievements.

Mursi, who hails from the Muslim Brotherhood, was handed power in June by the army council that ruled Egypt for 16 months following Hosni Mubarak's ouster in a popular uprising in 2011 and after a presidential election.

He spoke on Saturday before tens of thousands of Egyptians gathered at the Cairo stadium to mark the anniversary of Egypt's successful crossing of the Suez Canal in its October 1973 war against Israel.

"When election results were announced and I took up responsibility on 30 June, I announced a clear programme," Mursi told

the crowds, referring to a 100-day plan that broadly focused on issues of security, supply of energy and bread, street cleanliness, and traffic decongestion.

"What has been achieved is not enough of course, but what has been achieved by professional standards is about 70 percent of what we targeted during those 100 days."

Mursi said that among his government's main shortcomings was the ability to supply butane gas cylinders to Egyptians. Millions of home do not have natural gas piped into their homes.

The state currently sells butane cylinders at about 5 Egyptian pounds (\$0.82) each as part of its energy subsidy programme. The actual cost of the cylinders is about 65 pounds.

"There is a 15 percent supply shortage that pains us all but there are reasons

for this. We are not trying to escape responsibility," Mursi said, citing deep-rooted corruption in the country as one of the reasons for insufficient supplies.

Amongst his top achievements, however, Mursi stressed the interior ministry's work to step up security in the country, which had deteriorated after last year's uprising.

Seeking to ward off criticisms that he had placed foreign policy ahead of domestic affairs, Mursi said his travels to Addis Abbaba, Beijing, and New York among other destinations since his election were targeted at boosting the economy.

"We conducted 9 trips in 11 days. They brought the economy around \$10 billion (6 billion pounds) in the form of direct support as well as investment projects during a brief period," Mursi said.

**US, Peru to update 60-year-old defence cooperation accord****US**

LIMA, 7 Oct—The United States and Peru decided on Saturday to renegotiate a 60-year-old defence cooperation agreement between the two countries as Washington seeks to deepen security ties with Latin America after a decade focused on wars in Iraq and Afghanistan.

US Defence Secretary Leon Panetta said updating the 1952 bilateral defence

agreement with Peru would help the two countries work more closely on issues of mutual concern, from terrorism and drug trafficking to response to natural disasters.

"We have agreed to begin this process with the aim of improving and modernizing the agreement," Defence Minister Pedro Cateriano told a joint news conference. Panetta said updating the

accord would "improve our ability to conduct joint activities, to do training and other exchanges."

"Ultimately that will help us deal with shared security challenges in the future," the US defence secretary said.

The effort would update the Cold War-era document to take into consideration current threats facing the two sides and legal developments, including a new Peruvian constitution as well as new laws. The decision is part of a new US defence strategy approved earlier this year that shifts strategic focus to the Asia-Pacific region while deepening training and assistance to partner nations to help them provide for their own defence.

**Premier Wen urges disaster prevention**  
**China following Yunnan landslide**

YILIANG, (Yunnan), 7 Oct—Premier Wen Jiabao has called for local governments to take more precautions against possible disasters and make greater efforts to handle safety-related issues, especially those concerning children. Wen made the call Friday after visiting the site of a landslide that occurred Thursday in the village of Zhenhe in Yiliang county, southwest China's Yunnan Province.

The landslide killed 18 primary school students and one villager. Wen presented a bouquet for the victims and gave his condolences to their families, saying that governments at all levels must prioritize the safety of schools and students while carrying out reconstruction.

Wen said the government should learn from the landslide

that disaster-prevention efforts must be carefully carried out in mountainous regions with complicated geological conditions.

Nothing can be left to chance when it comes to safety of the people, especially children, Wen said, adding that the local government should thoroughly check every residence to find potential safety risks.

After taking a flight from Beijing to Yiliang on Friday, Wen and accompanying officials took a six-hour ride on a rough and dangerous mountain road to arrive at the remote village.

The victims' families were each given 20,000 yuan (3,160 US dollars) in accordance with compensatory measures enacted after multiple earthquakes hit the county in early September.

The trip marks Wen's second visit to Yiliang since early September. He previously visited the area on 8 Sept, just one day after several earthquakes hit the county, killing 81 people.

After listening to reports on the causes of the landslide, Wen warned the local government that an earthquake might trigger a series of geological disasters in the near future.

Wen told two villagers who lost their children in the disaster that he came to the site to mourn the victims and will forever remember them.

The students who were buried in the landslide were attending school during the ongoing National Day holiday to make up classes that were missed due to the September quakes, local authorities said.—Xinhua

**Captain killed, tourists hurt in blast on Greek boat****Greece**

ATHENS, 7 Oct—A small replica cannon blew up on a mock pirate ship off the southern Aegean island of Kos on Saturday, killing the boat's captain and injuring five passengers, Greek coastguard officials said. The cannon had been loaded with explosive powder, such as that found in fireworks.

A coastguard official, who declined to be named, said the captain died in the explosion. Two Dutch passengers, a Belgian and two German children were hurt, a second coastguard official told *Reuters*. "Their injuries are not life-threatening," the official told *Reuters*, adding that a relative of the captain had managed to steer the boat back to port. The 15-metre ship was carrying 26 passengers at the time.—*Reuters*

**Yemen foils al-Qaeda plan to bomb air base used by United States****Yemen**

ADEN, 7 Oct—Yemeni security forces foiled a plan by militants linked to al-Qaeda to bomb an air base jointly used with the United States to carry out attacks against the group, a security official said on Saturday. A car packed with explosives was discovered by authorities near the gate of Al Anad air base in Yemen's southern province of Lahj, the official told *Reuters*.

"This was a planned suicide attack. Once the car was discovered, security forces immediately arrested two men who were inside the vehicle ... The car was filled with explosives and anti-tank missiles," he added.

The Al Anad air base is used jointly with US forces to launch attacks against al

Qaeda militants across Yemen, mainly using US-controlled drones. Yemen, a US ally, has been in upheaval since a popular uprising ousted veteran president Ali Abdullah Saleh in February. Overlooking one of the world's busiest oil shipping routes, the country is plagued by poverty and lawlessness that the toppling of Saleh has done little to change.

Washington backed a military offensive in May to recapture areas of Abyan Province—which borders Shabwa Province—from Islamist insurgents.

Yemen-based al-Qaeda in the Arabian Peninsula is viewed by Washington as the most dangerous branch of the militant network established by Osama bin Laden.—*Reuters*

**Obama and Democrats raise record funds, poll holds steady**

**US**

WASHINGTON, 7 Oct—US President Barack Obama's campaign and its Democratic allies raised \$181 million in September for his re-election effort, the largest total that either side has announced yet in the 2012 campaign.

The big September number and a good jobs report on Friday that showed unemployment dipping to 7.8 percent from 8.1 percent shifted some attention from Obama's lackluster debate performance on Wednesday against Republican Mitt Romney.

Helping buoy Obama's fundraising in September was

his party's convention and a modest lead in the polls over Romney, whose campaign was plagued by his remark that the 47 percent of the population who receive government funds are "victims."

Obama's campaign said on Saturday that more than 1.8 million people donated to it last month. Of that, 567,000 were new donors. A vast majority of the donations—98 percent—were \$250 or less. The average contribution was \$53.

"That's by far our biggest month yet," campaign manager Jim Messina said in

an email to supporters, urging them to chip in even more as the 6 November election draws near.

Obama needs a lift after a surprisingly tame performance at the debate shook his campaign's sense that it was closing in on election victory.

However, Romney's strong showing in Denver did little to convince more voters he understands them or is a "good person," according to a Reuters/Ipsos survey released on Saturday.

The Democratic president is ahead of his challenger on character

attributes that can win over undecided voters who have not been swayed on tangible policy points, according to the online poll.

On the broad question

of who they will vote for in November, Obama kept his 2 percentage point lead among likely voters—47 percent to 45 percent—in the online survey.

The gap was unchanged from Friday, when Obama led 46 percent to 44 percent in the tracking poll. His lead was 6 percentage points before the two men first went head-to-head in Denver. "We haven't seen additional gains from Romney. This suggests to me that this is more of a bounce than a permanent shift," Ipsos pollster Julia Clark said.

Romney, enjoying a boost of support in many polls after his debate performance, addressed a boisterous crowd of 6,500 in the city of Apopka in central Florida, a state that will be critical in whether he wins the White House.

**Iran's cruise missiles responsive to any threat**

TEHERAN, 6 Oct—Iranian Defence Minister Brigadier General Ahmad Vahidi said on Saturday that Iran can give a crushing response to any possible enemy threat thanks to its high cruise missile capability, semi-official *Fars* news agency reported.

"Our cruise missiles can completely respond to any kind of threat," Vahidi told *Fars*, stressing that Iran's missiles can hit every enemy target with high precision and power.

Iran has no shortage in the missile field, however, this does not mean the end of the work, he was quoted as saying by *Press TV*.

Vahidi emphasized that Iran is implementing more projects and is facing no problem in terms of range, precision, and destruction power of its missiles, said the report.

**Turkey** Turkey strikes back at Syria after Erdogan warning

ISTANBUL, 7 Oct—Turkey returned fire after Syrian mortar bombs landed in a field in southern Turkey on Saturday, the day after Prime Minister Tayyip Erdogan warned Syria that Turkey would not shy away from war if provoked.

It was the fourth day of Turkish retaliation for firing by Syrian forces that killed five Turkish civilians on Wednesday.

The exchanges are the most serious cross-border violence in Syria's conflict, which began as a democracy uprising but has evolved into a civil war with sectarian overtones. They highlight how the crisis could destabilise the region.

NATO member Turkey was once an ally of Syrian President Bashar al-Assad but turned against him after his violent response to an

uprising in which, according to the United Nations, more than 30,000 people have died. Turkey has nearly 100,000 Syrian refugees in camps on

its territory.

Erdogan said on Friday his country did not want war but warned Syria not to make a "fatal mistake" by testing its

resolve. Damascus has said its fire hit Turkey accidentally.

Turkish Foreign Minister Ahmet Davutoglu said on Saturday that parliament's authorisation of possible cross-border military action was designed as a deterrent.

"From now on, if there is an attack on Turkey it will be silenced," he said in an interview with state broadcaster TRT.

Western powers have backed fellow NATO member Turkey over Syria but have shown little appetite for the kind of intervention that helped topple Libya's Muammar Gaddafi. Turkish calls for a safe zone in Syria would require a no-fly zone that NATO states are unwilling to police.—Reuters

**Police discover abandoned hand grenades, bullets in Turkish capital**

ANKARA, 6 Oct—Turkish police found 11 hand grenades and 16 rifle bullets left on an overpass along the Anadolu Boulevard in the capital Ankara on Saturday, local newspaper *Today's Zaman* reported on its website.

The police discovered ammunition in a bag during routine patrolling on the overpass near the Nursing School of the Fatih University and closed the overpass to pedestrians, the report said, adding that the ammunition was taken to the Ankara Police Department after initial examination.

The police has launched an investigation into the discovery, and it was not immediately clear whether any terrorist group was linked to the ammunition, according to the report.—Xinhua

**Two planes collide at Madrid's Barajas Airport, no casualties** **Spain**

MADRID, 7 Oct—Two aircraft were involved in a collision while on the ground at Madrid's Barajas airport on Saturday afternoon, without casualties reported.

The incident occurred between an Air Europe with 297 passengers bound for the Venezuelan capital, Caracas and an aircraft from the Iberworld airline with 384 passengers travelling to Cancun in Mexico.

The incident, which happened around 16:10 local time (1410 GMT), took place at Terminal 1 at the airport and sources said it was provoked when the Air Europe flight was being pushed back from its station and its tail collided with the wing of the Iberworld flight.

The damage to both planes is said to be "light", and the 681 passengers were able to disembark without reported injuries.—Xinhua

**Sudan** Sudan military plane crashes with 20 on board

KHARTOUM, 7 Oct—A Sudanese military plane crashed in a rural area west of the capital Khartoum on Sunday, killing some of the 20 armed forces personnel on board and injuring others, the army said.

The plane was traveling from Khartoum to El Fasher in the country's strife-torn Darfur region, military spokesman Al-

Sawarmi Khalid told *Reuters* without saying how many people died or what caused the crash.

"Some were killed and some were injured," he said, adding that the Antonov 12 transport plane was also carrying military equipment.

There have been several crashes in Sudan in recent years, where years of US

sanctions have made it difficult for airlines to get spare parts for their fleets.

In August, 32 people including a government minister died when a plane taking them to an Islamic festival in a southern border state crashed. State media blamed that accident on bad weather.

A military helicopter crashed in the country's

North Kordofan state in December because of a technical failure, killing six crew members, the military said at the time.

Government forces have been battling an insurgency in Darfur since rebels took up arms in 2003, accusing the central government of neglecting the remote region.



### Western Mediterranean Dialogue ends with “Malta Declaration”


RABAT, 7 Oct—The second Western Mediterranean Dialogue, commonly known as the “5+5 Dialogue,” ended on Saturday with the approval of a final declaration named the “Malta Declaration.” At the concluding Press conference, the leaders of Malta, Libya, Morocco, Mauritania and Tunisia highly praised the outcome of the summit and expressed their aspiration to enhance the regional cooperation in supporting small- and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs), combating irregular migration and strengthening the fight against smuggling. Malta’s Prime Minister Lawrence Gonzi said the summit promoted dialogue between Western Mediterranean countries for exchange of ideas on issues of security, migration and economic development.

The Milan Chamber of Commerce, according to the declaration, will set up a regional network of centres to provide service to SMEs.

“In the discussion, we underlined the importance of supporting particularly the development of small- and medium-sized enterprises as a fatal sector in job creating,” Gonzi said. On the issue of irregular migration, Tunisian President Moncef Marzouki said he had suggested the creation of a task force focusing on rescuing migrants. The task force, he said, should be composed of military and civilian assets.

“It is very difficult to accomplish (preventing irregular migration) with only one solution. It needs a package of solutions based on solidarity between all the members both from the North and the South,” Gonzi said.

Moreover, the declaration condemned the violence in Syria and called for its immediate end. The second Western Mediterranean Dialogue opened here on Friday. The first such summit was held in Tunis in December 2003.—Xinhua

### Scaffold collapse kills two in East China city

FUZHOU, 7 Oct—Two workers were killed on Sunday morning after a scaffold at a construction site collapsed in Fuzhou City in east China’s Fujian Province, according to local government. Four workers were buried by the collapsing scaffold at the Silver Bay Construction site in Mawei District of Fuzhou City, said a spokesman of the city government.

Two of them were seriously injured and died in hospital. The other two were under medical treatment.

The scaffold collapsed at 7:24 am while workers were cleaning the walls of a building. Police said they are investigating the cause of the accident.—Xinhua

### Greek austerity talks to continue, progress

**Greece**

ATHENS, 7 Oct—Greece will continue talks with international lenders next week on new austerity measures for the debt-ridden country to clinch its next loan tranche, the finance minister said on Saturday, with both sides saying progress had been made.

Negotiators had been pushing for a deal before a meeting of euro zone finance ministers on Monday, but Greece said it would settle for a statement acknowledging that talks were advancing.

“We will continue next week as well,” Finance Minister Yannis Stournaras told reporters following talks in Athens with Greece’s troika of creditors—the European Union, European Central Bank and International Monetary Fund. “We hope there will be a positive presentation from the troika, the IMF, EU and ECB, at the eurogroup,” he said. “We’re trying to reach a

compromise that will be in the interests of the economy and the poor.”

Five consecutive years of recession have driven unemployment to record levels, gutted household incomes and led to repeated bouts of protest and unrest on the streets of the Greek capital.

New protests are expected on Tuesday when German Chancellor Angela Merkel will make her first visit to Greece since the euro zone debt crisis erupted in late 2009. The trip represents a show of support for the government of conservative Prime Minister Antonis Samaras and an apparent signal of the determination of Europe’s most powerful leader to keep Greece within the euro.

Earlier on Saturday, a senior Greek government official said the sides needed another two weeks to agree a pact on almost 12 billion

euros of new savings to secure the next tranche of some 31.5 billion euros (\$41.14 billion)

in urgently needed loans.

Without it, Greece says it will run out of money at the end of November.

The official said there had been “convergence” in the talks and that a positive statement from euro zone finance ministers on Monday would mark a “signal for talks to continue ... next week and the week after that”.

Rescue teams were dispatched to the spot, said the report, adding that an investigation into this incident was underway.

### China spends heavily in afforestation efforts

**China**

BEIJING, 7 Oct—The Chinese government allocated 46.2 billion yuan (7.22 billion US dollars) from its central budget to the return-farmland-to-forests plan during 2008-2011, according to the National Development and Reform Commission (NDRC).

As of the end of 2006, around 9.3 million hectares of farmland had been converted to forests since the government launched a national campaign in 1999.

Around 15 million hectares of hillside was closed to facilitate afforestation during the period, according to the NDRC.

Under the plan, farmers received grain and cash subsidies if they returned their farmlands to woodlands to combat soil erosion.

By 2006, some 124 million farmers had been subsidized and the ecological environment had seen significant improvements, the NDRC said.

The emphasis on boosting forest coverage came amid the country’s efforts to increase its “forest carbon sink capacity.” This means using forested areas to remove carbon dioxide from the atmosphere, thereby helping address global climate change.

China’s forest coverage reached 20.36 percent in 2010, up from 18.2 percent in 2005, and is expected to further increase to 21.66 percent by 2015.—Xinhua

### Afghan police kill 28 militants within 24 hours

**Afghanistan**

KABUL, 7 Oct—The Afghan Ministry of Interior Affairs on Sunday said that the police forces, backed by the army and the NATO-led coalition forces, have eliminated 28 Taliban militants in different provinces within the past 24 hours.

“Afghan National Police (ANP) in collaboration with the army and coalition forces launched 17 cleanup operations in Kabul, Nangarhar, Laghman, Kapisa, Kunduz, Faryab, Wardak, Ghazni and Paktika provinces, killing 28 armed Taliban militants over the past 24 hours,” the ministry said in a statement.

The ANP also detained 13 suspected militants besides seizing weapons and ammunition in the above

raids, the statement added, without saying if there were any casualties on the side of security forces.

The Taleban insurgents, who have been waging an insurgency of more than one decade, have yet to confirm the death of their men.

The security forces have intensified cleanup operations against Taleban and other militants throughout the country recently but the insurgents in retaliation responded by carrying out bombings and laying out ambushes against them.

On Saturday, two US soldiers with the coalition were killed in an insurgent attack in eastern Afghanistan, the coalition confirmed in a statement.—Xinhua


**Three Japanese Self Defence Ships arrive in Cambodia to boost naval force ties** **Cambodia**

PREAH SIHANOUK, 7 Oct—Three Japanese maritime self defence force ships docked at Cambodia’s Sihanoukville Autonomous Port on Saturday morning for a 5-day visit to promote ties and exchange experience between two countries’ naval forces. The ships were greeted by Cambodian Rear Admiral Ros Veasna, deputy commander of Ream Naval base in Preah Sihanouk Province.

According to a Press release from Japanese Embassy to Cambodia, the 3 ships, named *Kashima*, *Shimayuka* and *Matsuyuki*, are led by Rear Admiral Hidetoshi Fuchinoue, commander of Japan Training Squadron.

“The visit is to strengthen friendship relations between the two nations,” the Press release said. “It will also give opportunities for 194 Japanese cadet school graduates to learn about culture and military as well as to strengthen friendship with Cambodia through various exchange programmes.”

During the stay in Cambodia, Rear Admiral Fuchinoue plans to visit Phnom Penh to pay courtesy call on Cambodian Deputy Prime Minister and Defence Minister Tea Banh and commander of Cambodian Royal Navy Tea Vinh on 8 October, it added.—*Xinhua*

**Gunmen attack NATO container in Pakistan, driver, cleaner injured**

ISLAMABAD, 7 Oct—Unidentified gunmen in Pakistan’s southwest region attacked a container, carrying supplies for NATO forces in Afghanistan, and injured its driver and his assistant, police in the region said on Saturday.

The driver and his assistant received bullet injuries in Mastung area of Balochistan and were shifted to Quetta, the provincial capital.

Officials said that the container loaded with goods was on its way from Karachi to Afghanistan when unknown gunmen riding a motorcycle opened fire at the container.

The assailants also set the container on fire. Later, the attackers managed to escape.

The local militia force rushed to the site of attack and conducted a search operation but no one was arrested.

The police also registered a case against unknown attackers and started investigation into the incident.

No group claimed responsibility. Taliban militants are blamed for such attacks.

Some 70 percent supplies are reportedly transported for nearly 150,000 US-led NATO troops in Afghanistan.

**Singapore announces incentives for more to join healthcare sector** **Singapore**

SINGAPORE, 7 Oct—Singapore’s Health Ministry announced enhanced incentives on Saturday to encourage midcareer professionals to switch their careers to become a nurse or allied health professional starting from April next year. The incentives announced by Minister of State for Health Amy Khor include fully-sponsored course fees and higher monthly training allowances of between 50 and 70 percent.

Singapore government is investing more in healthcare facilities to cater to an ageing population, and the demand for nurses and

allied health professionals are expected to increase.

One way to grow the pool is to attract more mid-career professionals, but they will need to undergo a professional conversion program by the Workforce Development Agency.

Such programmes typically cost between 62,000 Singapore dollars ( 50,407 US dollars) and 68,000 Singapore dollars (55,285 US dollars) for each trainee. About 20 to 30 percent of the fees are currently funded by employers, while the rest are subsidized by the Workforce Development

Agency.

But from April next year, the Workforce Development Agency will bear all training fees. Monthly training allowances will also go up. Registered nurses or allied health trainees can expect to receive allowances of between 1,500 Singapore dollars and 1,700 Singapore dollars, compared the current 1,000 Singapore dollars.

“We find that one of the stress points for mid-career professionals switching into healthcare really is the loss of income during their conversion training period ... and the cost of the training itself,” Khor said.—*Xinhua*

**Philippines agrees landmark peace deal with rebels** **Philippines**

MANILA, 7 Oct—The Philippine government and Muslim rebels have agreed a peace deal for the country’s troubled south, President Benigno Aquino announced on Sunday, signaling an end to a 40-year conflict that has killed more than 120,000 people and crippled the region’s economy.

The long-awaited agreement sets in train a roadmap to create a new Bangsamoro autonomous region in Muslim-dominated areas of the south of the mainly Roman Catholic country before the end of Aquino’s term in 2016. Bangsamoro refers to Muslim and non-Islamic minority people in the southern Philippines.

“This agreement creates a new political entity and it deserves a name that symbolizes and honours the struggles of our forebears in Mindanao and celebrates the history and character of that part of our nation. That name will be Bangsamoro,” Aquino announced via a live broadcast from the presidential palace.

“This framework agreement is about rising above our prejudices. It is about casting aside the distrust and myopia that has plagued the efforts of the past,” said Aquino, surrounded by his cabinet ministers.

While obstacles still lie ahead, the deal signals a major breakthrough in trust between the government and the Moro Islamic Liberation Front (MILF) separatists, who have long viewed Manila’s motives in the talks with suspicion. The deal, reached during talks in the Malaysian capital Kuala Lumpur over the past week, will set up a 15-member Transition Commission, which has until 2015 to draft a law creating the new entity to replace the current autonomous region.

The new entity and its jurisdiction will be determined through a plebiscite after the passage of the organic law.

The Muslim area will gain more political and economic powers, including imposition of taxes to cut central government subsidies, a bigger share in revenues from natural resources and a more active role in internal security.—*Reuters*

**Ferry disaster probe to be completed in six months: HK official**

HONG KONG, 7 Oct—Director of the Marine Department of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR) government Francis Liu said on Saturday that he expected a probe into the Lamma ferry disaster to be completed in six months.

Liu said officers are looking into various aspects of the tragedy, including whether safety measures on board the two vessels were adequate and why did the *Lamma IV* sink within

minutes after the collision.

Lai Tung-kwok, Secretary for Security of the HKSAR government, said the police have boarded and will continue to board the two boats to collect all necessary evidence.

“They are now conducting interviews on the survivors and witnesses to ascertain what they know so that we can piece up all available information to map out what happened in that night.” Lai said the police have already

set up a hotline and have requested those witnesses to come forward to provide information.

The police have also set up a desk at the Lamma Island pier because they believe that during the incident, quite a number of Lamma residents were on board one of the vessels. Through setting up the desk, the police hope that they can obtain more information from eye witnesses on board the ship. Two vessels—“*Sea Smooth*” and Hong Kong

Electric’s “*Lamma IV*”—collided off Yung Shu Wan Pier of Lamma Island at around 8:20 pm local time on Monday, when the city’s residents were celebrating the National Day of China. A girl was certified dead in hospital last night, bringing the death toll of the disaster to 39. Patrick Nip, Director of the Social Welfare Department of the HKSAR government, said more than a hundred social workers are helping families involved in the disaster.—*Xinhua*

## Beijing's PM2.5 monitoring network releases complete data

China

BEIJING, 7 Oct—A network to monitor PM2.5 in the air in the Chinese capital was completed on Saturday as another 15 monitoring stations began releasing real-time data.

The network, which is composed of 35 PM2.5 monitoring stations, will publish the air quality data online, according to the Beijing Environment Monitoring Centre.

The PM2.5 air quality standard monitors fine particles with a diameter of 2.5 microns or less. It is considered more hazardous to people's health as it can go deeper into the lungs. But PM2.5 monitoring was not included in China's air quality monitoring before.

The monitoring network will undergo a trial operation for three months, before the city's environmental protection department formally adopts the data in 2013 as new measures to evaluate the air quality of the city.

The Ministry of Environmental Protection has ordered 74 cities to apply a more comprehensive air quality monitoring standard and publish daily reports on PM2.5 by the end of this year.

## European Investment Bank grants Morocco 43-m-euro loan for agriculture

Morocco

RABAT, 7 Oct—The European Investment Bank (EIB) has granted Morocco a loan of 43 million euros (about 56 million US dollars) to develop its agriculture and improve the efficiency of irrigation, a local radio reported on Saturday.

The loan aims to reinforce Morocco's water-saving facilities for irrigation in the regions of Gharb, Haouz and Souss Massa, with a goal of modernizing the irrigation system for a better productivity.

The agreement on the loan will accompany the country's policy for agriculture, a key economic sector that represents an average of 13.5 percent of GDP between 2006 and 2011 and employs around 40 percent of the country's workforce.

The EIB has already financed major irrigation projects in Morocco, mainly the irrigation project in Doukkala for 60 million euros (about 78 million dollars).—Xinhua

## Bosnian president to visit Pakistan on 9-10 Oct

ISLAMABAD, 7 Oct—President of Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bakir Izetbegovic, will be visiting Pakistan on 9-10 Oct at the invitation of President Asif Ali Zardari, the Foreign Ministry said on Saturday.

During his stay in Islamabad, President Izetbegovich will meet the president and the prime minister. The ministers of Foreign Affairs and Defence will also call on the Bosnian

president, a Foreign Ministry statement said.

He will also address the business community of the two countries. In addition, the National University of Science and Technology (NUST) will confer an honorary doctorate on President Izetbegovic. "His visit would not only help further enhance bilateral cooperation between the two countries particularly in trade, investment, education and

defence, but would also provide an opportunity to exchange views at the highest political level on various important international issues of mutual interest," the statement said.

President Izetbegovic is the son of late Alija Izetbegovic, the revered former President of Bosnia and Herzegovina. The last presidential visit from Bosnia took place in 2004 when Mr Sulejman Tihic, the then

President of Bosnia, paid a state visit to Pakistan.

Pakistan extended support to the people of Bosnia, especially during their struggle for independence, and Bosnia supported their Pakistan brethren during the devastating earthquake in 2005 and floods in 2010-2011.

Pakistan and Bosnia and Herzegovina enjoy excellent relations deeply embedded in shared values and mutuality of interest on major global issues of common concern. The two countries also jointly pursue the common objective of global peace and stability in international forums, the Foreign Ministry said.

## California gasoline prices hit record amid supply woes

US

LOS ANGELES, 7 Oct—Gasoline prices in California hit record levels on Saturday, after an unprecedented surge in pump prices propelled by a perfect storm of factors that drove inventories in the region down to near-historic lows.

The average cost of a gallon of gas in the state stood at \$4.614, edging past the previous record of \$4.61 set in 2008, according to figures from AAA.

But prices topped \$5 a gallon in some locations. On Saturday, a local NBC station showed one downtown Los Angeles gas station selling regular grade at \$5.49 a gallon.

Average prices in the Golden State were \$4.145 a

week ago, AAA data show.

The abrupt price spike has shocked California's car-loving residents, and left some retailers in Los Angeles scrambling for supplies. Signs have emerged that the run-up in prices could soon end, but motorists may think twice about hitting the road for now.

"I think \$5 is kind of hitting the limit," driver Genoush Tunian told the local CBS station in Los Angeles. A series of events have conspired to limit supplies, causing gas inventories in the West Coast region to fall this week to their third-lowest level in 20 years on a seasonal basis, government data shows.

A fire closed Chevron Corp's Richmond, California, refinery during the summer. A Chevron pipeline that carries crude oil from the state's Central Valley to refineries in the San Francisco Bay area has also been closed since mid-September.

More recently, Phillips 66 shut two plants to conduct planned maintenance, while a power outage hit Exxon Mobil Corp's refinery in the Los Angeles-area city of Torrance on Monday, disrupting operations for days.

On Friday, Exxon said the Torrance plant had resumed operations, which helped ease supply fears.


**Bradley Cooper snubbed Dita Von Teese?**



Gerrard has won the Champions League and UEFA Cup with Liverpool plus two FA Cups and three League Cups.—Reuters

a superb volley from Branislav Ivanovic.

West Bromwich Albion moved up to fourth place on 14 points with a 3-2 win over Queens Park Rangers, who remain winless and bottom.

Everton trailed twice at Wigan Athletic before saving

a point in a 2-2 draw when Leighton Baines scored a penalty against his former club in the 87th minute.

The other game that could affect the top standings was at Upton Park where West Ham United were kicking off against Arsenal

at 1630 GMT.

Manchester United, who started the day in third place and Tottenham Hotspur, who started fifth, do not play until Sunday. In Saturday's other match, Reading appeared to be heading for their first league win of the season after going 2-0 up at Swansea City, but the home side fought back with two late goals to grab a 2-2 draw and avoid a fourth successive defeat.—Reuters

## Hamilton takes wrong turn as McLaren pole run ends

SUZUKA, (Japan), 7 Oct—Lewis Hamilton recognised he had made a wrong decision on Saturday as McLaren's run of four pole positions in a row came to an end at the Japanese Grand Prix. The 2008 Formula One world champion, whose headline-grabbing move to Mercedes in 2013 was announced last week, was referring only to his choice of qualifying setup on a difficult afternoon for his McLaren team.

"I chose a direction but it's very difficult," he said after a session that ended with Hamilton ninth and Red Bull's double world champion Sebastian Vettel on pole. Ferrari's overall leader Fernando Alonso qualified sixth.

"Every time you do a run you try to fine tune the setup and sometimes you just go the wrong way."

"The car was feeling good and was quick in FP2 and FP3 (the second and third practice sessions) but I got it wrong in qualifying."

McLaren were chasing their best qualifying run since 1999 but hopes of another pole depended on Hamilton since team mate Jenson Button had a five place penalty for an unscheduled gearbox change.

In the end, even with the drop, Button will still start ahead of Hamilton in eighth after qualifying third fastest.

"As soon as I did my first lap, I knew immediately it was wrong. I did everything I could with my adjustments I have with the steering, I had the front wing maxed out and it was not enough to overcome the issue I had," said Hamilton.

"We had a long run yesterday with this setup and it was not too bad. I am hoping perhaps with a wind direction change tomorrow and the downforce level I have got then perhaps it will work a

little bit better." Hamilton's title hopes have faded with the European summer and the 27-year-old is now 52 points behind Alonso with six races remaining and a maximum 150 points to be won. Button, winner at Suzuka last year despite Vettel starting on pole, is 75 points off the leader.

The older Briton, world champion with Brawn GP in 2009, said in contrast that his car had felt surprisingly good.

"I have been all over the place with setup and to find something that suits the car around here I am very happy about," he told reporters.

"I was happy with the balance through qualifying, the race is another thing. I haven't done many laps on high fuel but with the way the car felt in qualifying I am confident we can adjust the setup for the race with high fuel and it should work well."—Reuters

## Top seeds Azarenka, Sharapova set up China Open final

BEIJING, 7 Oct—World number one Victoria Azarenka set up a final date with Maria Sharapova at the China Open after the top two seeds enjoyed comprehensive victories in their semi-finals on Saturday.

Sharapova blew away home favorite Li Na 6-4, 6-0 before top seed Azarenka saw off the challenge from France's Marion Bartoli 6-4, 6-2.

Sharapova served three double faults to concede an early break to go 1-3 down in the first set against the Chinese number one Li but sailed through once she found her groove.

"It was a really high quality first set with a few ups and downs, and obviously she had the lead in that set, but I came back," the Russian told reporters.

"There were a few key moments to that set and after I broke her in the last game, it was important to take that momentum into the second set and keep going."

Sharapova, who lost in the quarter-finals of the Pan Pacific Open in Tokyo last week, was happy to be back in contention.

"I came into this tournament not playing extremely well in Tokyo, and I had a couple of days of practice here," she said.

"So I was hoping from the first round I'd really step it up and get better and I feel as the tournament has gone on I've been playing and moving better."

Belarussian Azarenka, who withdrew before her quarter-final in Tokyo due to health issues, showed no

signs of trouble as she powered past Bartoli.

Azarenka last won a title in March when she beat Sharapova in Indian Wells while the Russian is seeking her first trophy since winning the French Open in June.

Single euro-zone budget gains momentum ahead of summit

BRUSSELS, 7 Oct—Debate about the idea of creating a separate budget for euro zone countries is intensifying in the run up to an EU summit later this month, with less opposition to the proposal than many officials first expected, diplomats say.

At a private dinner held last week among the EU ambassadors of several northern European countries, including Britain, Denmark, the Netherlands and Finland, those present were surprised to find a fair degree of consensus on the proposal.

"I wouldn't say that there was strong support for it, but there was certainly a feeling that this is an idea that should be explored in more detail," said one diplomat briefed on the discussion that took place at the gathering.

The single budget proposal was first sketched out by Herman Van Rompuy, the president of the European Council, in a paper circulated in September as part of an effort to stimulate debate about how Europe's monetary union should be improved.

In the paper, Van Rompuy said a "fully fledged

fiscal union" among the 17 countries that share the euro could involve the creation of a single treasury office and "a central budget whose role and functions would need to be defined".

Those suggestions have since been refined into guidelines that will form the basis of discussion among EU leaders at the summit on October 18-19. The idea will also be explored among euro zone finance ministers at a meeting in Luxembourg on Monday.

There is still no clear definition of what a single, central budget would entail, but Germany strongly supports the idea and France is on board too, which in terms of euro zone decision-making means it has substantial momentum.

Britain's support, underlined by Prime Minister David Cameron on Sunday, is also significant, even if it stems more from a desire to distance Britain from the problems of the euro zone than from any solidarity with the single currency club.

BIRMINGHAM, 7 Oct—A campus police officer at the University of South Alabama on Saturday shot and killed a naked freshman who repeatedly chased, threatened and rushed him, a university spokesman said.

Gilbert Thomas Collar, 18, died from a single bullet wound to the chest, spokesman Keith Ayres said. Collar was ordered several times to halt and continued to challenge the officer even after being shot, Ayres said. He died at the scene.

The incident began shortly before 1:30 am when the officer heard loud banging on the window of the campus police station. He drew his gun after finding the student in a fighting stance, according to Ayres. The officer tried to calm Collar and retreated several times before shooting him, he said.—Reuters

Secessionist gunmen attack gov't compound in southern Yemen, 3 injured

ADEN, (Yemen), 7 Oct—A group of secessionist gunmen opened fire at a government compound in Yemen's southern province of al-Dhalea on Sunday morning, leaving at least three security personnel injured, a security official told Xinhua.

The secessionist gunmen, armed with machine guns and grenades, attacked a fortified government compound in downtown al-Dhalea province, injuring at least three security personnel, the security official said, requesting anonymity.

"Several government officials and army officers holding a meeting inside the local council headquarters

were the targets of the armed attack, but security troops repelled the gunmen," the source added.

"The attackers were the same ones who ambushed a military patrol earlier in the day in the city," he added.

In another incident, a roadside bomb targeted a bus carrying government employees in the neighbouring southern province of Lahj, an army officer told Xinhua anonymously.

No reports about casualties or injuries were available, the army officer said. North and South Yemen unified peacefully in 1990, but their relationship deteriorated in 1994. Calls for

separation in the country's southern regions were renewed in 2007.

Southerners have complained of being marginalized, particularly since they lost the four-month civil war in 1994.

Pro-secession protests have multiplied in the south amid a worsening economic situation in Yemen and charges of discrimination in favor of northerners.

Some factions of the pro-secession Southern Movement want autonomy for the country's south, but more hard-line members are pressing for a return to complete independence.

Bus from Toronto overturns in New Jersey, 23 hurt

NEW YORK, 7 Oct—Nearly two dozen people were injured on Saturday when a bus traveling from Toronto to Brooklyn, New York, overturned while approaching an exit ramp on a New Jersey highway, according to New Jersey state police. Twenty-three of the 57 people aboard the bus were

taken to hospitals, but none of the injuries was considered life-threatening, police spokesman Adam Grossman said.

The accident occurred about 7:40 am as the bus traveled east on Interstate 80 in Wayne Township. The bus overturned in a grassy area about 100 yards from the

highway, he said. The cause of the accident is under investigation, he said.

The Star-Ledger newspaper reported that the passengers, who left Toronto at about 8:15 pm on Friday, had planned to attend a Seventh-day Adventist Church event in Brooklyn.


## Steel suspension bridge across Namlin Creek

Namlin Creek that originates in Kengtung region is passing through Kengtung, Mongphyat, Tahlay and Kenglak. The creek that flows into Mekong River contributes to agricultural works of its surrounding villages by creating natural beauties. Its current is speedy. Its route is many bends. Its structure is made of rocks. Thus, the creek cannot be used in water way transport. However, small-scale hydropower can be generated from the current depending on its speedy current.

However, the small creek is a natural barrier in transportation of local people from the villages in Nayawng Village-tract of Tahlay Sub-Township. The large areas of farmlands owned by local farmers from Nayawng Village-tract are located on the opposite side of the creek. Nawkha Village of Lahu national race and Pahsan Village of Ahka national race are also located on the opposite side of the creek. Thus, the local people difficultly cross the creek by small raft for going to their farmlands. Sometimes, they faced danger of death.

In the aftermath of Tahlay Earthquake, officials reviewed that a bridge should be built across Namlin Creek for development of the region. That was why the local authorities stroke for construction of a suspension bridge near Pahok Village.

As the steel suspension bridge was constructed on 3 May 2012, the local people participated in construction tasks in their bit. On 8 May, the 300 feet long and 5 feet wide steel



suspension bridge emerged across the creek.

In an interview, Lahu national villager Ko Kya U, 24 of Baythala Village said that his family has been engaged in agricultural tasks since the time of their grandparents. They went to opposite side of the creek by a raft made of tubes of motorcar. At present, not only cattle but also people and

motorcycles can pass through the suspension bridge safely. The local people can extensively engage in farming. The students from Pahsan and Lawkha villages have easy access to Basic Education High School thanks to the bridge. Likewise, the local people can make trips to Tahlay, Tachilek, Mongphyat and Kengtung by motorcycle.

The MaHtaTha 43<sup>rd</sup> bus line will start from Aungmingala Highway Bus Terminal and finished at Gandi General Hospital in Botahtaung along No 3 Highway, Chaukway, North Okkalapa Roundabout, Nawade, 8<sup>th</sup>-Mile, Pyay Road,

Hledan, Strand Road, and former Thiri Mingala Market.

## US, South Korea agree on longer range ballistic missiles

**SEOUL, 7 Oct—**South Korea has reached a landmark agreement with the United States to extend the range of Seoul's ballistic missiles by more than twice the current limit to counter the threat from North Korea, the government said on Sunday.

The move to significantly boost the South's missile capabilities along with development of advanced aerial reconnaissance vehicles is likely to rattle the communist North, which has remained at odds since the 1950-53 Korean War left the peninsula divided.

It may also stoke concern in China, Japan and Russia, parts of which would be within range of the new missiles.

Under the agreement,

South Korea can develop missiles up to a range of 800 kms (497 mile) from the current ceiling of 300 kms (186 mile), Chun Young-woo, top secretary to President Lee Myung-bak for foreign and security affairs, told reporters.

He said the United States and South Korea also agreed to maintain the maximum payload for a

South Korean-developed ballistic missile at the current level of 500 kilograms (1,102 lbs).

However, if Seoul chose to develop a missile with shorter ranges, it could increase the payload accordingly.

South Korea has also been allowed to develop unmanned aerial vehicles, or UAVs, with an unlimited payload weight if the flying distance is within 300 kilometres.—Reuters
