Shan literature and culture.

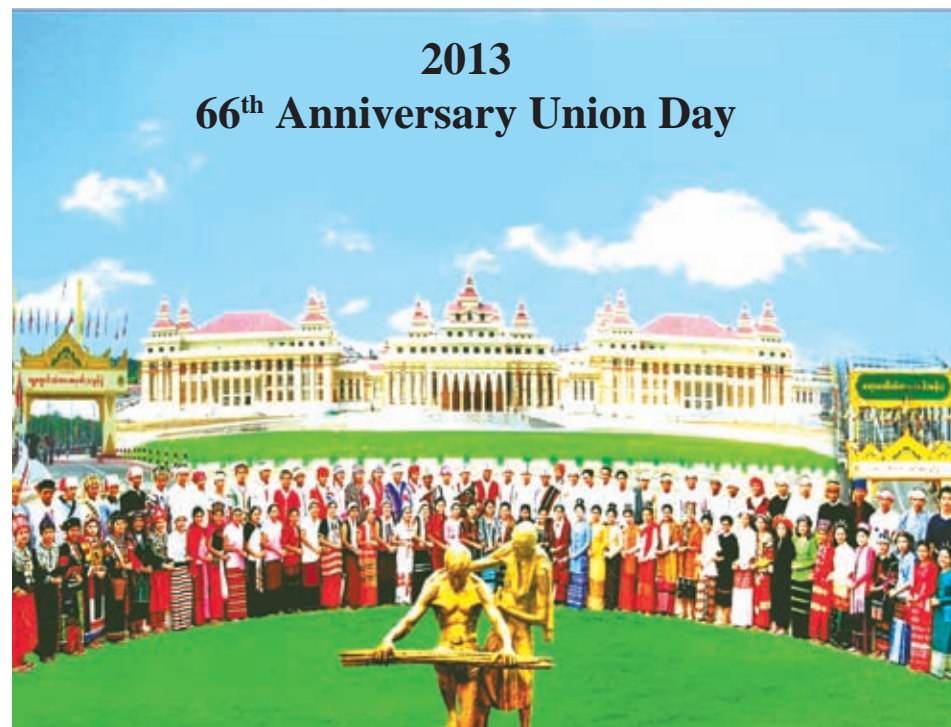

Clinton says US failing to explain policies to Muslims

WASHINGTON, 1 Feb —The outgoing US Secretary of State Hillary Clinton said on Thursday that America has not been successful in explaining its policies to the Muslim world.

When questioned on why favouritism toward America in recent years has even been lower than the Bush administration, Clinton responded: "I take responsibility, along with our entire government and our Congress and perhaps our private sector."

Clinton made the remarks at the Council on Foreign Relations in Washington in her final address as secretary of state. She is expected to step down on Friday and be succeeded by Democratic Senator John Kerry.

Clinton said one of the reasons is the United States has "not done a very good job in recent years reaching out in a public media way or in a culturally effective way to explain ourselves." She said she had encountered many

depictions on US policies by media in the Arab and Muslim world, which she believed are "absolutely untrue."

"Our response has been—nobody will either believe it or we can't possibly contest it," Clinton said.

To change the dynamics, Clinton called for active engagement with the media in the region, including al-jazeera, the popular pan-Arab satellite channel, who she viewed as "relentlessly negative" about America.

"You can't be in the arena and expect there to be a change if you're not willing to get off the bench," she said. "And from my perspective, that's our fault."

Two killed, three wounded in explosion at US embassy in Turkey

ANKARA, 1 Feb—A suspected suicide bombing occurred in front of the US embassy in the Turkish capital of Ankara on Friday, killing two people and wounding three others, according to private NTV news channel.

The explosion occurred at the entrance used by the embassy personnel and visitors, reported CNNTurk, saying that a security guard at the X-ray machine at the entrance was killed in the explosion when a suspected suicide bomber was passing through the machine.

"At approximately 13:15 on 1 February, there was an explosion at the US Embassy. Appropriate measures have been taken by the Turkish Police who

are now investigating the incident," US Embassy in Ankara confirmed in a written statement.

Television footage showed that the embassy door had been blown out, with the wall around scattered and body parts strewn around the scene. Dozens of ambulances and fire engines have rushed to the scene, also home to other diplomatic missions. Ankara Governor Alaaddin Yuksel told reporters, "It was a suicide bombing, and the blast occurred inside the US Embassy building," adding that the gate is the visa section of the embassy compound.

One of the killed was an US security guard and the other was the suicide bomber, said Yuksel.

The Turkish governor, however, declined to comment if they had received any intelligence before the attack. In his first comments following the explosion, Turkish Prime Minister Recep Tayyip Erdogan said he needs to be briefed on the explosion.

Turkish police stepped up security measures around the embassy and cordoned off the area for fear of a second possible attack. Police helicopters were also screening the area over the embassy building. Ankara governor and police department chief went to the site to closely coordinate security measures.

Egypt opposition to protest after deadly week

CAIRO, 1 Feb—Opponents of Egyptian President Mohamed Mursi have called mass demonstrations on Friday, raising the prospect of more bloodshed despite a pledge by politicians to back off after the deadliest week of his seven months in office.

Protests marking the second anniversary of the uprising that toppled Hosni Mubarak have killed nearly 60 people since 25 January.

It prompted the head of the army — the institution that effectively ran Egypt for six decades

until Mursi's election — to warn that the state was on the verge of collapse.

The country's most influential Islamic scholar hauled in rival political leaders for crisis talks on Thursday and persuaded them to sign up to a charter disavowing violence and committing to dialogue as a way to end the crisis.

But barely had those talks ended at a mediaeval university, when Mursi's foes called for new nationwide protests, including a march on the presidential palace in Cairo, which his followers

see as a provocative assault on a symbol of his legitimacy.

"We are going out tomorrow, to Tahrir, and there is a group going to the palace," said Ahmed Maher, a founder of the 6 April youth protest movement which helped bring down Mubarak in 2011.

"We also confirm our peacefulness and that weapons must not be used, because we see that violence, weapons and molotovs have cost us a lot," he added after attending the talks.

Explosion at Mexican oil giant Pemex headquarters kills 25

MEXICO City, 1 Feb —A powerful explosion rocked the Mexico City headquarters of state-owned oil giant Pemex on Thursday, killing at least 25 people, injuring more than 100 and trapping others inside.

The mid-afternoon blast shattered the lower floors of the downtown tower, throwing debris into the streets and sending frightened workers running outside.

A government official, speaking on condition of

anonymity, said preliminary findings suggested the blast was caused by a gas boiler exploding in a Pemex building next to the tower. But the cause was still being investigated, the official added.

The explosion was the latest in a series of safety problems to hit Mexico's national oil monopoly.

Interior Minister Miguel Angel Osorio Chong said the blast killed at least 25 people, up from a previous count of 14, and injured 100.

Dozens of employees were believed to be still trapped inside, and rescue workers said the death toll at the Pemex skyscraper could keep rising.

Two years on, Benghazi threatens "another revolution" in Libya

BENGHAZI, 1 Feb—As night fell over Benghazi, a familiar sound echoed across the eastern Libyan city - an explosion, and then gunfire. A bomb had just been thrown at a police car on patrol, injuring an officer.

It was the latest of many attacks on local security forces. Two months before, the man whose job it was to ensure Benghazi was safe, the police chief, was shot dead outside his home.

Two years after Libya's second city kindled the uprising that ousted Muammar Gaddafi, it epitomises a popular revolution gone awry—rival militias and Islamist gunmen more powerful than the police, moving residents to ask: where is

the state? "Imagine a city taken over by militias when all you want is to support the state," activist

Mohammed Buganah said. "People feel insecure. They are very upset and annoyed about this."

There have been

assaults on diplomats and international missions, including the 11 September killing of the US ambassador, amid a rising tide of kidnappings, bombings and assassinations, mainly of security officials.

Space shuttle Columbia's second life — as a cautionary tale

CAPE CANAVERAL, (Florida), 1 Feb — Space shuttle Columbia's flying days came to an abrupt and tragic end on 1 Feb, 2003, when a broken wing gave way, dooming the seven astronauts aboard. Although Columbia now lies in pieces, its mission is not over.

The recovered wreckage, painstakingly retrieved from Texas and Louisiana for months after the accident, was preserved for a

unique archive and education program at the Kennedy Space Centre in Florida.

"I can talk about safety, but once I open those doors and folks enter into the room, it becomes a different conversation," said Michael Ciannilli, who oversees NASA's Columbia Research and Preservation Office.

"When you come face to face with Columbia in the room, it becomes real."

Take-Two delays launch of Grand Theft Auto V video game

SAN FRANCISCO, 1 Feb — Ake-Two Interactive Software Inc said on Thursday it has pushed back the launch of the latest game from its hit "Grand Theft Auto" franchise to 17 September from its previously announced release window of spring 2013. Shares of Take-Two were down six percent at \$12.31 in early afternoon trading on the Nasdaq. The delay was to allow Take-Two's Rockstar Games studio, which develops "Grand Theft Auto" games, additional development time, the video game company said.

"Grand Theft Auto V" will be released worldwide for Microsoft Corp's Xbox and Sony Corp's PlayStation3 game consoles on 17 September, the company said. The action-adventure game lets players complete criminal missions in urban settings. The franchise's last title "Grand Theft Auto IV" has sold over 25 million units since its release in 2008. Grand Theft Auto V is set in a fictional city inspired by present-day Southern California. The delayed launch pushes earnings from Grand Theft Auto V sales from June to September, Sterne Agee analyst Arvind Bhatia said. The new title of the massive-

ly popular franchise has the potential to rake in close to \$1 billion in retail sales and sell 15 to 20 million units, according to Bhatia.

"It adds to their development cost and it's launching closer to what we think is going to be a period where new consoles will be coming out and there will be more competition from other titles," Bhatia said.

The video game industry has been struggling to cope with flagging sales over the last year. Analysts say consumers are holding back from buying hardware and software as they wait for rumoured next-generation versions of Sony Corp's PlayStation and Microsoft Corp's Xbox, expected later this year.

The delay could mean Take-Two is possibly creating a "cross-generation" title that could work on current and next-generation consoles, said analyst Mike Hickey of National Alliance Capital Markets. "Remember, Xbox signed an exclusive deal with Rockstar at the beginning of the prior cycle for episodic content, and Sony provided exclusive resources for the completion of Grand Theft Auto IV," Hickey said. — Reuters

Ten years ago, Columbia was on its 28th mission, a rare research initiative in the midst of International Space Station construction flights. The crew included the first astronaut from Israel, Ilan Ramon, and six Americans—commander Richard Husband, pilot William McCool, flight engineer Kalpana Chawla, payload commander Michael Anderson and flight surgeons David Brown and Laurel Clark.

After 16 days in space, the shuttle was gliding back to Florida for landing when it broke apart due to wing damage that had unknowingly occurred during launch.

Accident investigators determined that a chunk of insulating foam from the shuttle's fuel tank had fallen off 81 seconds after liftoff and hit a carbon composite wing panel that turned out to be unexpectedly fragile. The breach proved fatal. NASA had no idea falling foam debris, a common occurrence during shuttle launches, could do so much damage.—Reuters

NASA sees Earth-directed coronal mass ejection erupt from Sun

WASHINGTON, 1 Feb — The Sun erupted with an Earth-directed coronal mass ejection, or CME, at 2:09 am EST (0609 GMT) on Thursday morning, US space agency NASA announced.

Experimental NASA research models, based on observations from the Solar Terrestrial Relations Observatory, and Solar and Heliospheric Observatory, show that the CME left the sun at speeds of around 575 miles per second, which is a fairly typical speed for CMEs. His-

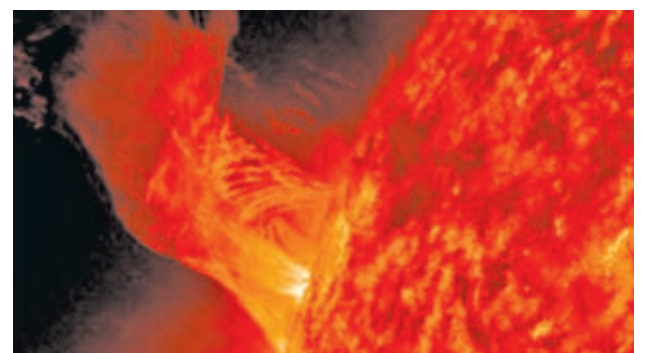
Schwarzenegger calls for more readiness in combating climate problems

VIENNA, 1 Feb — Actor and former Governor of California Arnold Schwarzenegger called for more willingness in combating climate problems at the opening of his Vienna R20 Conference on Thursday. "We should not be part of the problem, but part of the solution. Together we can bring the destruction of the environment to a stop—terminate it," he said.

Schwarzenegger mentioned three points in a "recipe for success" which he said he used to turn California into a green flagship state. Firstly, political ideology needed to be removed from the issue, he said, adding

"There is no liberal or conservative air, we all breathe the same air." Secondly, he said "do not wait for international climate agreement," and that while he would look forward to such agreements to eventuate, one could not let the process of waiting for international decisions paralyze forward progress.

Finally, he said people should not be demotivated and made to think they are helpless to do anything on climate protection, but rather efforts should be made to "tell the people how they can do it," particularly with the aid of newly emerging technologies.—Xinhua

Sony ignites talk of PS4 unveil with Playstation meeting

TOKYO, 1 Feb — Sony Corp will this month host its first major Playsta-

tionally, CMEs at this speed are mild, NASA said in a statement.

A CME is a solar phenomenon that can send solar particles into space and reach Earth one to three days later.

Sony declined to say whether it would release a new product at the meeting in New York on 20 February. "We will be talking about the Playstation business," spokesman Masaki Tsukakoshi said on Friday. A Google search for "Sony 20 Feb Playstation" returned more than 7 million hits. The last time Sony held a Playstation event, in January 2011, it presented a prototype of its handheld Vita console. Before that, it convened a gathering in

2005 two months after it first demonstrated the PS3 concept. A meeting in 1999 revealed designs for the PS2.

It has been more than six years since Sony launched the PS3 home console, a longer gap than between it and its PS2 predecessor, adding to the anticipation that it will soon disclose its next gaming concept. Since Sony's last home console launch, the games market has been transformed by the boom in smartphones and tablet computers that have wooed players with free or cheap games.—Reuters

Armenia to join international pacts on peaceful use of outer space

YEREVAN, (Armenia), 1 Feb — Armenia will join five international treaties on peaceful use of outer space, the Armenpress news agency reported on Thursday.

Becoming a member of the UN Committee on the Peaceful Use of Outer Space (COPUOS), Armenia will join the five international agreements — Outer Space Treaty, Rescue Agreement, Convention on Liability, Convention on Registration and Moon Agreement — that regulate the activities of members in space.

Armenia in December was elected as a member of COPUOS in the General Assembly of the United Nations. The membership gives Armenia a chance to take part in new space projects.

In the frameworks of such projects, Armenian scientists will have the opportunity to visit scientific centers of space agencies of the United States, Europe and Russia.—Xinhua

Breastfeeding reduces ovarian cancer risk: Australian study

SYDNEY, 1 Feb — Women who breastfed their babies for at least 12 months have significantly lower risk of ovarian cancer, a study by Australia's Curtin University researchers revealed on Thursday.

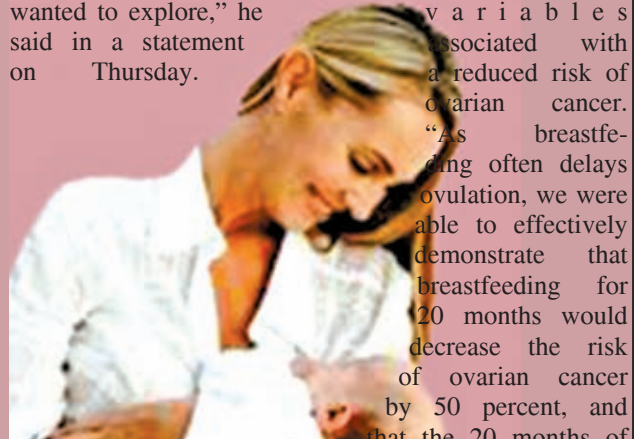
Curtin University's study extends what was known about the beneficial effects of breastfeeding on mothers.

The university said a case-control study was undertaken in Guangzhou, China, where information on the number of months of lactation and number of children breastfed was collected from a sample of 493 incident ovarian cancer patients and 472 hospital-based controls.

Curtin's Health Sciences Professor Colin Binns said China was chosen for the study due to its high population size, which provided a higher number of ovarian cancer cases to explore.

"The lower incidence of ovarian cancer in China suggests there are factors

operating there to reduce the incidence which we wanted to explore," he said in a statement on Thursday.



"We also knew that Chinese women breastfed for longer than women in the western world so it was an ideal location," Binns said the study added further knowledge to the relatively limited amount of research from countries with a low incidence of the

disease, with more details on the breastfeeding variables associated with a reduced risk of ovarian cancer. "As breastfeeding often delays ovulation, we were able to effectively demonstrate that breastfeeding for 20 months would decrease the risk of ovarian cancer by 50 percent, and that the 20 months of breastfeeding could be spread over a number of children and still have the same effect," he said. "The results of our study would recommend that mothers breastfeed for 12 months to gain substantial effect—and longer if they wish."

Toyota tops car brands in US consumer perception: survey

DETROIT, 1 Feb — Toyota Motor Corp (7203.T) again topped an annual US consumer survey on brand perception released on Friday as all the top automakers' scores rose from last year. Ford Motor Co (F.N), Honda Motor Co Ltd (7267.T), General Motors Co's (GM.N) Chevrolet, Daimler AG's (DAIGN.DE) Mercedes-Benz and Volvo (0175.HK) rounded out the top six, which was unchanged from last year, according to Consumer Reports, the influential consumer magazine that conducted the survey last month.

"The brand leaders have a really strong hold on the mind-share of the consumer," Jeff Bartlett, deputy auto editor online for Consumer Reports, said in an interview. "We're seeing much less space between brands.

In other words,

consumers seem to think many excel in the areas that matter most to them and it's harder for brands to stand out." For example, he said safety is very important to consumers, but most cars are pretty safe. The survey comes less than a month after the Detroit auto show, during which the industry showed off its latest vehicles and concept cars.

Bartlett said the survey was "one window into what consumers are thinking" and is often a lagging indicator influenced by news headlines or neighbourhood experiences. Each of the top 10 saw perception scores rise in the survey. It is based on how consumers perceive each brand in seven categories: quality, safety, value, performance, design, technology and green attributes. The first two categories remain the top buying factors, the magazine said. Toyota led

with a score of 133 points, up about 11 points from last year. Ford, Honda



and Chevy saw their total perception scores respectively rise about 2 points to 117.8 points, about 26 points to 114 and more than 7 points to 94.4.

Kenya's HIV/AIDS transmission among infants drops

NAIROBI, 1 Feb— Kenya's health officials said HIV/AIDS exposed infants have reduced from 27 percent in 2007 to 14.9 percent in 2011, due to increased uptake of elimination of mother to child transmission (EMTCT) and voluntary medical male circumcision (VMMC) services. Director of National Aids Control Council (NACC) Alloys Orago revealed that 69 percent of HIV positive pregnant women receives antiretrovirals prophylaxis hence the reduction in infection.

The prevalence in Kenya has peaked between 1995 and 1996 at 10.5 percent, subsequently falling by approximately 40 percent and remaining stable for several years. "Today, 69 percent of HIV positive pregnant women receives antiretroviral

prophylaxis hence has reduced the proportion of HIV exposed infants from 27 percent in 2007 to 14.9 percent in 2011," Orago said at the launch of the Kenya AIDS Epidemic update for the year 2012 in Nairobi. The NACC director said it was important gains have been made in preventing new HIV infections through services that prevent mother to child transmission.

He revealed that Kenya performed more than 230,000 voluntary medical male circumcision procedures from November 2008 to December 2010 helping reduce the risk of female to male HIV transmission by 60 percent. He said 1.6 million Kenyans are currently living with HIV/AIDS and are in dire need of antiretrovirals, adding that sexual transmission remains the primary



driver of the epidemic in the country. "Periodic household surveys indicate that Kenyans on average are less than half as likely to have multiple sex partners to day as in late 1990s while condom use has more than doubled," he added.

US tablet shipments soar during holidays, threaten to surpass PCs

SAN FRANCISCO, 1 Feb — Apple Inc Chief Executive Tim Cook's prediction that tablets would one day outsell personal computers appears to be coming true. Holiday season shipments of tablet computers touched a record 52.5 million, up 75 percent from a year ago, as consumers snapped up a wide range of the touch-enabled mobile devices and lower priced offerings, according to International Data Corp (IDC), which tracks both markets. Growth of the tablet market handily outpaced that of personal computers, with PC shipments sliding 6.4 percent to 89.8 million in the October-December period.

In another sign of the rise of tablets, Apple, the No. 1 seller of tablets, shipped 22 million of them in the fourth quarter, compared with 15 million personal computers shipped by No. 1 PC seller Hewlett-Packard

Co during the same period. But increasing competition means that Apple's one-time stranglehold on the tablet market continues to loosen. The market share of its iPad fell to 43.1 percent in the fourth quarter from 51.7 percent the previous year, IDC said. Samsung Electronics, the No. 2 seller of tablets with its flagship Galaxy brand, captured 15.1 percent of the market, more than double its 7.3 percent share a year earlier.

Software maker Microsoft Corp, which launched its Surface with Windows RT tablet during the holidays, shipped about 900,000 units, IDC said. Microsoft has been banking on Surface to showcase its new Windows 8 software to compete with Google Inc's Android-based tablets and the iPad. Amazon.com Inc, despite having a wider range of products for the holidays, saw its share slip to 11.5 percent from 15.9 percent.—Reuters

Sharp logs 2.5 bil. yen operating profit in 3rd qtr

OSAKA, 1 Feb— Struggling Sharp Corp has logged an operating profit of around 2.5 billion yen for the October-December period, due to a weaker yen and robust sales of smartphones equipped with its advanced liquid crystal panels, people familiar with the matter said on Friday.

It is the first time in five quarters that the electronics



maker has made operating profit. The company will officially announce the earnings results Friday afternoon. Sharp has been urged by its main creditor banks to return to the black on an operating basis for the second half of the current business year through 31 March as a condition for continued financial support.

Surveillance aircraft gather at US base in Okinawa

TOKYO, 1 Feb —The US military appears to be boosting its monitoring capabilities in preparation for North Korea's expected third nuclear test. It's amassing surveillance aircraft at a US base in Okinawa Prefecture, southwestern Japan.

A US WC-135 plane arrived at the Kadena air base

in mid-January. It can collect radioactive particles that would be released into the atmosphere by a nuclear test. The craft is currently performing take-off and landing exercises. On Thursday, it took off shortly before 10 am and returned to the base about 2 hours later.

A US RC-135 electron-

ics reconnaissance plane was also reported to have flown on Thursday morning. It collects communication data.

A special aircraft converted from a business jet also landed at the base on Tuesday. It can detect information on ground units by using radar.—NHK

Japan to apply for inclusion of Amami-Ryukyu on World Heritage list

TOKYO, 1 Feb—The government decided on Thursday to apply for the inclusion of the Amami and Ryukyu Islands in southern Japan on UNESCO's provisional list of candidates for World Heritage sites.

The Environment Ministry is hoping to secure World Heritage status for the islands in Kagoshima and Okinawa prefectures in the summer

of 2016.

If the islands are registered by the UN Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization as a World Natural Heritage site, it will be Japan's fifth listing.

The Amami-Ryukyu region under consideration comprises Amami-Oshima Island, Tokunoshima Island, the northern part of Okinawa's main island

and Iriomote Island, inhabited by rare species such as Amami rabbits and Okinawa rails, according to ministry officials.

It is expected to take more than a year for the ministry to define the area to be registered as a World Natural Heritage site.

The government also officially decided to recommend the Tomioka silk mill, the oldest Japanese

government-run silk mill, in Gunma Prefecture as a World Cultural Heritage site.

The government submitted the recommendation of the silk mill to UNESCO on Thursday. The World Heritage Committee will decide whether to register the mill as a precious cultural site in the summer of 2014.

At least three killed, 20 hurt in multi-car crash in US

CHICAGO, 1 Feb—At least three people were killed and roughly two dozen injured in a series of crashes involving 30 to 40 vehicles in "white-out" conditions along a slippery stretch of highway in Detroit on Thursday, according to officials of the US state Michigan. Two children were among those who died in eight to 10 collisions that occurred on an elevated stretch of the interstate highway, Michigan State Police Lieutenant Michael Shaw

said. Another 20 to 25 people were injured in the morning rush hour accidents, according to police estimates.

The multi-vehicle crash on southbound I-75 from Springwells to Schaefer Highway forced closure of the road for hours, as authorities and emergency crews helped the injured. "Visibility was reduced to zero and an incident occurred and then you had a chain reaction multi-car pile-up," Michigan Department of Transporta-

tion spokesman Rob Morosi said, adding it will probably be early evening before the freeway is again totally reopened to traffic.

The number of killed and injured could change as the investigation continues.

Weather forecasters earlier bumped up their Thursday snowfall predictions for Metro Detroit and issued a winter weather advisory for the area, which could see up to 10 centimeters of lake effect snow.—Reuters

Syria protests over Israel attack, warns of "surprise"

BEIRUT/AMMAN, 1 Feb —Syria protested to the United Nations on Thursday over an Israeli air strike on its territory and warned of a possible "surprise" response. The foreign ministry summoned the head of the UN force in the Israeli-occupied Golan Heights to deliver the protest a day after Israel hit what Syria said was a military research centre and diplomats said was a weapons convoy heading for Lebanon.

"Syria holds Israel and those who protect it in the Security Council fully responsible for the results of this aggression and affirms its right to defend itself, its land and sovereignty," Syrian television quoted it as saying.

The ministry said it considered on Wednesday's Israeli attack to be a viola-

tion of a 1974 military disengagement agreement which followed their last major war, and demanded the UN Security Council condemn it unequivocally. UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon expressed "grave concern". "The Secretary-General calls on all concerned to prevent tensions or their escalation," his office said, adding that international law and sovereignty should be respected.

Israel has maintained

total silence over the attack, as it did in 2007 when it bombed a suspected Syrian nuclear site—an attack which passed without Syrian military retaliation.

In Beirut on Thursday Syria's ambassador said Damascus could take "a surprise decision to respond to the aggression of the Israeli warplanes". He gave no details but said Syria was "defending its sovereignty and its land".—Reuters

Brazil police blame toxic foam for 235 deaths in nightclub

SANTA MARIA, 1 Feb—A highly flammable foam was responsible for the death of 235 people in a nightclub in southern Brazil last weekend, filling the venue with a thick poisonous smoke within three minutes, police investigators said on Thursday.

The toxic soundproofing foam, responsible for the illnesses of many survivors, may have been the Kiss club's greatest hazard, according to police in Santa Maria, who also faulted broken fire extinguishers and a single, obstructed exit for the tragedy.

"If it weren't for this material, no one would have died," said Santa Maria police chief Marcelo Arigony, holding a piece of foam, which was installed without a flame retardant coating. "In parts of the club without the foam, almost nothing burned."

Police are investigating whether city officials were negligent in allowing the club to operate. As part of a separate criminal investigation, police have also detained the club's owners and two members of the band, suspected by police

of starting the blaze with a cheap flare on early Sunday morning.

Santa Maria's mayor and fire officials have traded blame for an irregular operating license and expired safety plan at the club. On Thursday, the mayor suspended the licenses of all the city's nightclubs and music venues for 30 days.

A nationwide crackdown on unsafe nightclubs also gathered steam, as Brazil's most populous state, Sao Paulo, and its capital city signed an agreement for the joint inspection of bars and clubs. On Wednesday alone, authorities inspected 300 establishments in the state of Sao Paulo.

Train crash injures 150 in South Africa

PRETORIA, 1 Feb—Two commuter trains collided in South Africa, injuring at least 150 people, including many children.

The accident occurred when one train rear-ended stationary cars near a station in the capital Pretoria on Thursday morning.

The carriages involved were mangled. Both trains were packed with commuters at the time of the acci-

dent.

The injured are receiving treatment at hospital. But around 20 of them, including the male driver of the moving train, are in serious condition.

Local media says the rail authority suspects that the crash may have happened due to manual operation, in place after a cable to send a stop signal to trains was stolen.—NHK

Armenia presidential candidate shot, hospitalized

YEREVAN, 1 Feb—Armenian presidential candidate Paruyr Hayrikyan was shot on late Thursday by an unknown gunman and immediately taken to hospital, local media reported.

The 63-year-old leader of the National Self-determination Union was seriously wounded but his life was not in danger, said the reports.

Hayrikyan is one of eight candidates in the 18 Feb presidential vote but not regarded as a close rival for incumbent Serzh Sargsyan, who is expected to be re-elected for a second five-year term.

While visiting Hayrikyan at the hospital, Armenian parliament speaker Ovik Abramian said the attack on the candidate could be aimed at destabilizing the situation in the country.

But whether the vote is to be postponed depends on Hayrikyan's condition, Abramian said. The shooter has yet to be identified as the search for him is still underway.—Xinhua

Japanese gov't panel on collective self-defence to meet on 8 February

TOKYO, 1 Feb — Prime Minister Shinzo Abe has decided to convene the first meeting of a panel on 8 February to consider lifting Japan's self-imposed ban on exercising the right to collective self-defence, a senior government official said on Friday.

Abe will attend the meeting, set to consist of members of a panel that had existed during his previous stint as prime minister in 2006 to 2007 to study Japan's exercise of the right,

or coming to the defence of an ally under armed attack, the official said.

Under the current interpretation of the pacifist Constitution, Japan does not permit itself to exercise the right because doing so would go beyond self-defence allowed under the charter. Abe, who became prime minister again in December, plans to visit the United States in late February in a bid to enhance Japan's alliance with the country. At the coming pan-

el meeting, Abe is expected to receive a report on the final conclusion of the previous panel as he failed to get it due to his resignation in 2007 before it was compiled, the official said.

"Concerning the issue of collective self-defence, the government will reconsider appropriate responses in view of the new security environment," Deputy Chief Cabinet Secretary Katsunobu Kato said at a press conference.

Gun shooting comes amid call for stricter control

WASHINGTON, 1 Feb—One person has been killed and two others wounded in a shooting in the US state of Arizona. The incident is spurring ongoing arguments over gun control in the country. Police say a gunman shot at 3 men in an office building in Phoenix on Wednesday morning. The suspect re-

mains at large.

Police say the suspect is believed to have fired a gun during a meeting when he got into a dispute with the men he shot. The incident prompted many people to evacuate the building. The shooting came on the same day former Democratic congresswoman Gabrielle Gif-

ords, who was shot in the head in Arizona 2 years ago, testified at a Senate hearing. She appealed for bipartisan support for stricter gun control.

Calls for tougher rules have been growing in the United States since last month's shooting rampage where a man killed 20 chil-

dren and 6 staff members at a Connecticut elementary school. President Barack Obama is seeking new legislation to ban the sale of assault weapons with high-capacity magazines.

Many US media outlets are reporting the incident along with Giffords' testimony.—NHK

Armed robbers kill three policemen in Nigeria

KADUNA, 1 Feb—Daredevil armed robbers on Thursday killed three policemen in an operation which lasted two hours in central north Nigeria's Kaduna State. The robbers also razed a police station and two banks in Birnin-Gwari, a town in the Brinin Gwari Council of Kaduna, Aminu Lawan, the state police spokesperson told Xinhua. Lawan said three policemen were killed by the armed robbers during the attack.

He said the robbers who were about 100 in numbers over-powered the police and they had to retreat.

As at the time of filing this report, he said no arrest has been made but that the

command had launched an investigation into the incident. A resident of the area told Xinhua that the robbers struck in the early hours of Thursday.

The armed robbers headed for the police station in the area and engaged in gun duel with the policemen on duty where the shot sporadically for hours and overpowered the men on duty, the resident added.

The incident came barely 24 hours when the Emir of Birnin Gwari, Zubairu Jibril raised the alarm that armed robbers had taken over his domain, declaring that the men of the underworld were in charged of affairs of the area. Jibril spoke when he

led other traditional rulers, politicians and traders on a courtesy visit to the Kaduna State Governor, Mukhtar Ramalan Yero to laid a formal complain on the activities of armed bandits in the area.

He told his audience that the robbers raped wives of their victims and that over 7,000 cattle had been stolen so far by the bandits. In October 2012, the sleepy town of Dogodawa in Birnin-Gwari Local Government Area of the state was attacked by unidentified gunmen who went haywire killing 20 people in the process. Those killed in that attack were mostly Moslem worshippers returning to their houses in the early hours.—Xinhua



Japanese eel designated as endangered

TOKYO, 1 Feb —The government has designated the Japanese eel an endangered species due to a sharp decline in its population.

The Environment Ministry added the eel to its Red List of threatened species. The eel is listed as IB, the second highest category in terms of risk of extinction.

The population of wild Japanese eels is estimated to have dropped by at least

50 percent over the past 10 years. Experts blame over-fishing and water pollution.

The Red List designation does not restrict fishing or trading of the eel as it is not legally binding. Environment Minister Nobuteru Ishihara said the eel is an indispensable part of Japanese culinary culture.

He pledged all-out efforts to conserve the eel.

Three police officers injured in explosion at refugee camp in Kenya

GARISSA, 1 Feb—At least three police officers were on Thursday evening seriously injured when unknown assailants hurled a hand grenade at their vehicle at Ifo1 refugee camp, 9 km from Dadaab town. Dadaab District Officer Bernard Ole-Kipuri said the latest explosion occurred at 8:30 pm (1630 GMT). Ole Kipuri said the injured three police officers who were with others were on a normal night patrol in the sprawling camp which has experienced insecurity incidents in the recent past.

"The officers who had just patrolled the expansive camp were returning to their police post but were attacked just 50 metres before reaching," Ole Kipuri told Xinhua by telephone.

He added that after the hurling the grenade at the police officers, the attackers suspected to be insurgents from Somalia later proceeded to shoot other passersby indiscriminately although no civilian was injured.

Kipuri said that the three who sustained serious injuries have been admitted at the Dadaab district hospital. The administrator said no arrest had been made in connection to the incident but noted that the police were on hot pursuit of the suspects.

Dadaab town that hosts the four main refugee camps has witnessed a series of grenade, gun attacks and kidnappings which have been linked to members of the Somalis Al-Shabaab group.

Dealing with debts

Myanmar could finally find a way to reduce the burden of national debt by taking out bridge loans and clearing the outstanding debts due to Asian Development Bank, World Bank and Japan International Cooperation Agency following the Paris Club creditor countries' cancellation of 50 % of the total arrears due to them. And more debt cancellation is coming on the way in the next six months.

The immediate benefits of the debt settlement may be the low-interest-rate development loans from the World Bank and Asian Development Bank. World Bank has contributed USD 80 million toward community-driven project for development of 15 village-tracts—one each in seven regions and seven states and Nay Pyi Taw Council Area—to be implemented over a period of six years from 2012 to 2019. It is expected those villages will set an example for other villages across the country.

While we might need a monitoring programme like the one of International Monetary Fund (IMF) called staff monitored programme which provides a framework for economic cooperation between IMF and the Union government to ensure resources made available by debt relief and fresh loans are used properly and effectively in infrastructural development and poverty alleviation programmes, we need to empower and educate the rural folk to be able to make use of what they have in hand.

Despite increasing irrigation facilities, increased amount of agricultural loans and efforts at mechanized farming, weather still determines the harvest and untimely rain and floods especially in these years seem to be fond of paying frequent visits to the farmland in delta region, driving farmers into indebtedness.

The government as part of rural development and poverty alleviation scheme is introducing microfinance services. And since the basic aim of microfinance is to lift people out of poverty and not to drag them into debt trap, we need to ensure its real benefits toward the poor and reconsider the way it is offered for money from loans is often used for durable consumer goods or consumption instead of being used for productive investments.

Small and medium enterprises are expected to become the major driving force of the economy. We are therefore to strengthen microfinance organizations not only for reducing poverty but also for encouraging small entrepreneurs.

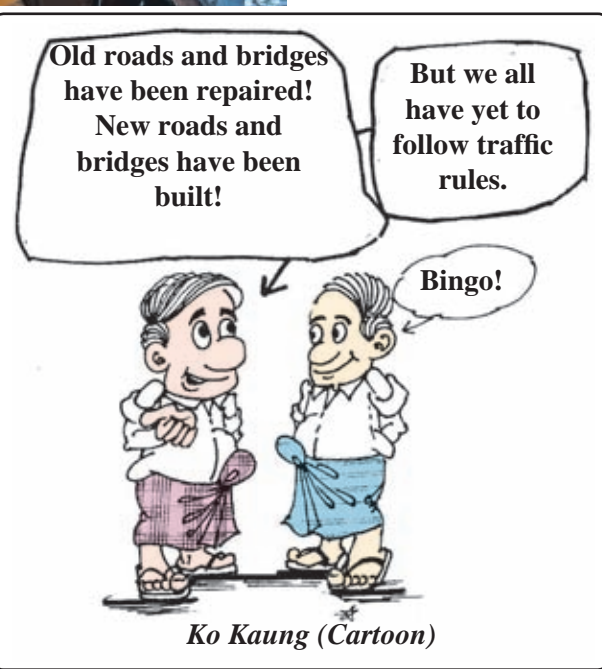

MP voices concern for safety and potential of air transport

NAY PYI TAW, 1 Feb—U Tin Maung Oo of Shwepyitha Constituency called for explanation of the cause of Heho plane crash so as to win back the confidence of local and foreign travelers, asking about the measures against recurrence of such incident.

Deputy Minister for Transport U Han Sein replied that F-100 of Air Bagan crashed while landing to Heho Airport on 25 December, 2012 and the Union Transport Minister and personnel rushed to the scene for investigation, five-member investigation commission was then formed and the plane crash publicized through State-owned media in the aftermath. The investigation commission on 25, 26 December conducted necessary investigation and asked Air Accident Investigation Bureau (AAIB) of Singapore to analyze flight data recorder and cockpit voice recorder. As it suggested analyzing them at Australia Transport Safety Bureau (ATSB), five

members from investigation commission went to ATSB in Canberra of Australia from 21 to 25 January.

Chairman of the Investigation Commission Deputy Director-General of Civil Aviation Department would meet the press at the CAD Headquarters in Yangon today. The investigation commission will publicize final investigation results when finished. Instructions have been given to pilots and control towers to ensure non-recurrence of such incident.

The questioner U Tin Maung Oo said “This case seems to be just normal on the surface. But when the foreigners come into our country, as the State has enacted FDI Law, they will necessarily use air transport. At present, some travelers going to Kalaw no more use plane. They are using motor cars. It is a matter of concern for our future economy. In fact, the answer I want (from the deputy minister) is they are promoting Myanma Airways in cooperation with foreign missions abroad.”

“Nappy” hunters leave Norwegian baby bottoms bare

OSLO, 1 Feb—Southern Norway is in the midst of a diaper shortage after a supermarket price war lured enterprising bulk shoppers from eastern Europe who have cleaned out the shelves, customs officials and retailers said.

Norway is one of the world's most expensive countries. However, supermarkets in the south trying to lure local customers by undercutting rivals on the price

of “nappies” inadvertently made it profitable enough for residents of nearby countries to start trading in them.

“They buy every last diaper, I mean everything we have on the shelves, throw it in the back of their car and take them home, where they sell it for a nice profit,” says Terje Ragnar Hansen, a regional director for retail chain Rema 1000.

“It's not stealing and it's not even criminal but it's

a big problem, ... they leave nothing for our regular customers.

Customers come into Norway from Sweden, drive along the coast to fill their cars, then take a ferry back to the continent, said Helge Breilid, the chief of customs in Kristiansand on Norway's southern coast.

Some have been stopped with diapers worth up to 50,000 crowns (\$9,100), roughly 80,000 diapers, a

Dr Phil says Manti Te'o hoaxer admits to love for linebacker

LOS ANGELES, 1 Feb—A California man who has admitted to fabricating Notre Dame linebacker Manti Te'o's fake girlfriend in an elaborate hoax told talk show host Phil McGraw he felt a deep romantic love for the football player, McGraw said on Wednesday.

“Here we have a young man that fell deeply, romantically in love,” McGraw told the television morning show “Today” to discuss his two part interview with Ronaiah Tuiaosopo, which will air on “Dr Phil” on Thursday and Friday.

“I asked him straight up, ‘Was this a romantic relationship with you?’ and he says yes. I said, ‘Are you

then therefore gay?’ And he said, ‘When you put it that way, yes.’ And then he caught himself and said, ‘I am confused,’” McGraw told “Today.” Te'o has said in a previous media interview he is not gay.

The fake girlfriend hoax involving Te'o, who was a finalist for college football's highest individual honor the Heisman trophy, caused a sensation when it was revealed earlier this month on news website Deadspin.com.

Tuiaosopo says he played the part over the phone of Lennay Kekua, the fictitious woman who was Te'o's girlfriend in the

hoax. Te'o, 22, had spoken about the woman in media interviews, and reports described her surviving a car accident and then dying of leukemia in September.

Te'o has said since the hoax was exposed that he was the victim of an elaborate prank, that he never met Kekua and that his acquaintance Tuiaosopo admitted to him that he was the one who played the part of Lennay.

Dr. Phil said in a segment on “Today” on Wednesday that after an extensive interview with Tuiaosopo, he believes Te'o had no role in creating the hoax.—Reuters

BERLIN, 1 Feb— One of Germany's most famous biscuit-makers has appealed to an extortionist dressed as the “Cookie Monster” to return its prized golden biscuit emblem.

The Bahlsen biscuit company's emblem has hung above its headquarters in Hanover since 1913 and was first reported stolen a week ago.

Just days after it went missing a ransom note arrived at the local newspaper which included a photo of the thief dressed as the “Cookie Monster” from children's television series “Sesame Street”, pretending to take a bite from the golden biscuit.

In a message posted on Facebook on Thursday and addressed to the monster, Bahlsen promised to donate

52,000 packets of biscuits to charities if the 20 kg (44 pound) golden biscuit was returned.

The original ransom note demanded that Bahlsen give biscuits to children in hospitals across Hanover and donate a 1,000-euro (\$1,400) reward for the emblem's return to an animal home.

A spokeswoman denied media suggestions that the theft and ransom note were part of a marketing stunt and said the firm was anxious to recover the emblem as soon as possible.

Five robbery suspects killed in Nigeria's oil rich state: police

PORT HARCOURT, (Nigeria), 1 Feb—Five robbery suspects were killed in gun battles with security agents in Nigeria's oil rich Rivers State in January, local police authorities said on Thursday.

the southern state, that 67 persons were also arrested for various crimes committed in the first month of the year. Those arrested include 13 suspected cultists, 19 kidnap suspects, 32 armed robbers and three suspected vandals of oil pipelines.

“Among the 32 armed robbery suspects, 19 were wounded by the police in the process of their arrests.

Ancient petroglyphs stolen from California site recovered

LOS ANGELES, 1 Feb— Four ancient petroglyphs that were stolen from a historic site in Northern California last year have been recovered, but no suspects have been identified in the brazen theft, federal authorities said on Thursday.

The petroglyphs,

which were carved into volcanic rock more than 3,500 years ago, were discovered missing in October from the site in the Volcanic Tablelands, east of Yosemite, near California's border with Nevada.

They are said to represent a pristine example of

Great Basin rock art that portrayed the daily hunter-gatherer activities that took place in the area at the time.

“Recovery of the petroglyphs was a priority from day one. I am pleased that they were returned,” Bernadette Lovato, manager for the bureau's field office in Bishop, California, said in a statement.

“Now we need the public's help to identify the vandals responsible for damaging the site,” Lovato said. A Bureau of Land Management spokesman declined to release further details about the recovery of the petroglyphs, citing an ongoing investigation. The bureau said the suspects may have experience with masonry cutting and access to such tools.

The Volcanic Tablelands are described by the Bureau of Land Management as a vast volcanic landscape formed more than 700,000 years ago by materials spewing from the Long Valley caldera.

Australia to provide further fund to protect Great Barrier Reef

CANBERRA, 1 Feb—Australian government will provide a boost to the Great Barrier Reef, with increased funding to fight the crown-of-thorns starfish, Environment Minister Tony Burke said in a statement on Friday.

"The Gillard government is absolutely committed to protection of the Great Barrier Reef as a top priority," Burke said.

The coral eating crown-of-thorns starfish, which can reach almost one

meter in diameter when fully grown and destroy coral faster than it can regenerate, are recognized as a significant threat to the reef.

According to him, an additional 800,000 AU dollars (almost 833,320 US dollars) will be provided this financial year, building on the 1.43 million announced last year.

Last year the Gillard government provided 1.43 million to the Association of Marine Park Tourism

Operators, which has a track record of engaging its members to control crown-of-thorns starfish.

"Under the first round of funding, tourism operations have removed more than 37,500 crown-of-thorn starfish from tourism hotspots around Cairns, Port Douglas and the Whitsundays, restoring the ecological balance and strengthening the resilience of the target areas," Burke said.

Fukushima reactor buildings to be cleaned by robots from late July

TOKYO, 1 Feb—The operator of the tsunami-hit Fukushima nuclear power plant said on Thursday it will use robots from late July to accelerate work to reduce radiation levels in buildings housing three crippled reactors.

The method, decided

by Tokyo Electric Power Co and the government, is aimed at making the buildings more accessible for workers to conduct preliminary investigations necessary to decommission the reactors that contain melted fuel.

The details of condi-

tions inside the reactor containers are currently unknown. Under the plan, remote-controlled robots are expected to clean the interior of the Nos. 1 to 3 reactor buildings with high-pressure water and other means.

Cambodia begins funeral procession for late ex-King Norodom Sihanouk

PHNOM PENH, 1 Feb—An estimated 1 million mourners took part in a funeral procession on Friday to move the body of late Cambodian former King Norodom Sihanouk from the royal palace to an ornate, custom-built crematorium in a park in the capital's parks.

The body of the most revered monarch, who died of illness at the age of 90 in Beijing on 15 October last year, was transported in a Khmer architectural float from the palace, where it has been exhibited for more than 3 months, and paraded through the city to the cremation site.

As the body began to leave the palace at around 08:45 am local time, the 101-gun artillery salute was fired in honour of the late King Father and Buddhist monks chanted in religious

language, while mourners, handed with lotus flowers, wreaths, or Sihanouk's portraits, silently walked in the procession.

Among the mourners are Sihanouk's wife Queen Mother Norodom Monineath and his son King Norodom Sihamoni, President of the

Senate Chea Sim, President of the National Assembly Heng Samrin and Prime Minister Hun Sen.

The procession ceremony was live televised through all local television channels and most of the radio stations.

Indonesian gov't outlines ways to improve water supply infrastructure, irrigation

JAKARTA, 1 Feb—An Indonesian minister said that government has set plans to improve water supply for the public and repair national irrigation system so as to increase rice production, local media reported on Friday. National Development Planning (Bappenas) Minister Ardiya Alisjahbana said that the implementation of the plans require intense coordination between central and regional governments.

"The target of clean

water pipe network was set at 68 percent by 2015, and now it has entered 55 percent at the average," she was quoted by the Antara news agency as saying. The 2015 water supply target was part of Indonesia's efforts to comply with Millennium Development Goals (MDGs).

Some 65.27 trillion rupiah (about 6.4 billion US dollars) is required to finance the projects, she said, adding that 12 trillion of the funds would be provided by

the government while the remaining lion part of 52.27 trillion rupiah was expected to be contributed by investors. More than 100 million people in Indonesia lack access to drinking water, according to the data issued by the ministry.

The minister said the inadequate water supply problem was incited by insufficient operation of the state-run firm following financial restructuring process in the firm.

Seminar held in Tokyo to draw Indonesian trainees

TOKYO, 1 Feb—The operator of an international trainee programme backed by Japan's government has held a seminar in Tokyo to attract more Indonesian trainees to the country. The event on Thursday was attended by about 50 agricultural, fishery and food makers' associations from Japan and 26 Indonesian groups that send trainees to the country.

In 2011, the number of foreign trainees in Japan topped 82,000. About 60 percent were from China.

But amid China's economic growth, the number of trainees from the country has been falling. A survey in January last year showed that almost 40 percent of Chinese trainees in areas hit by the 2011 earthquake and tsunami returned to China. The head of an ice makers' association in Miyagi, one of the prefectures hit hardest by the dis-

aster, says 60 Chinese trainees returned to China. He adds that no one responds to recruitment ads of businesses in affected areas, and that he hopes Indonesians will help rebuild them. Indonesia has the world's 4th-largest population.—NHK

BRISBANE, 1 Feb—A passenger train derailed and crashed into a station in eastern Australia, injuring 14 people.

The incident occurred at a terminal in Brisbane on Thursday.

An eyewitness says the 6-car train jumped the tracks and crashed into the station almost without slowing down.

Local police say 15 people, including passengers and the driver, were on board at the time.

The accident destroyed the lead car and the toilet area of the station. But no one was killed as the toilets and the platform were empty. The train's operator suspects that the crash was caused by electricity problems.

as of Wednesday morning, making it the most anticipated film among Chinese moviegoers.

After debuting on 21 January in the Chinese mainland, “Skyfall,” the latest installment in the James Bond series, came out on top in the week ending 27 January. It raked in about 224 million yuan (about 36 million US dol-

lars) in Chinese theaters, accounting for more than 56 percent of ticket sales that week.

The domestic cartoon hit “Pleasant Goat and the Big, Big Wolf” came in behind “Skyfall,” with 63 million yuan, while “Bring Happiness Home,” a domestic comedy, came in third with 43 million yuan.

Whitney Houston anniversary to be marked with TV Grammy special

LOS ANGELES, 1 Feb—Grammy organizers plan to mark the first anniversary of the sudden death of Whitney Houston with a behind-the-scenes TV show on how they scrambled to honour the singer just 24 hours after she died. The Recording Academy said on Thursday that the hour-long special entitled “The Grammys Will Go On: A Death in the Family” will air on 9 February, the day before the 2013 Grammy Awards ceremony in Los Angeles.

Houston, who sold hundreds of millions of records and scored the mega hits “I Will Always Love You” and “I Wanna Dance with Somebody,” drowned in a bathtub at a Beverly Hills hotel room on 11 Feb, 2012—the eve of last year’s Grammy Awards show. Houston’s unexpected death at age 48 cast a shadow over the event, which quickly changed its programme to pay homage

to the soaring voice that had dominated the Grammys in decades past.

Singer and actress Jennifer Hudson performed a medley of Houston’s hits at last year’s Grammys, and rapper and host LL Cool J opened the show with a prayer. The TV special on broadcaster CBS features rehearsals and interviews with artists — including Hudson, Bruce Springsteen and Taylor Swift — and the show’s producers in the hours before and after Houston’s death. The Recording Academy produces the annual Grammy awards.

Dressed in a black Chanel dress, the

26-year-old troubled starlet —whose probation remains revoked because she allegedly lied to police about driving her car during a crash last June—was told by Judge Stephanie Sautner: “Glad to see you’re feeling better,” after her new lawyer admitted, “I know there was some drama with her appearing today.”

A pre-trial hearing has now been set for 1 March, but the judge said that Lindsay is not required to appear for it. She then ruled that she must be present for the actual trial, which will take place on 18 March.

Talented 49ers roster finally comes of age

NEW ORLEANS, 1 Feb—Barely three years since being derided as a sorry parody of the franchise which once dominated the NFL, the San Francisco 49ers have a chance to claim a record-equaling sixth Super Bowl win on Sunday. It has been 18 years since the 49ers last appeared in a Super Bowl—their fifth victory coming against San Diego Chargers in Miami in 1994—and in that time the franchise endured some poor seasons.

think that is something that a lot of teams do—'well, we didn't win anything this year, we need to fire everybody and get rid of them'. That is not my philosophy and I think it has paid off in that we have kept a lot of the pieces together. That is satisfying."

Jim Harbaugh, who took over as head coach for the 2011 season, has rightly

LOS ANGELES, 1 Feb—Vijay Singh pulled out of the Phoenix Open on Thursday before the start of the first round, a day after admitting he had used deer antler spray which contains an ingredient banned by the PGA Tour. The former world number one, who was scheduled to tee off in the company of American Ryan Moore and Swede Carl Pettersson at the TPC Scottsdale, cited a back injury for his withdrawal.

Singh, 49, was replaced in the field by American Richard H Lee. A three-times major winner, Fijian Singh revealed earlier this week he had been using deer antler spray for a couple of months in an interview with *Sports Illustrated* magazine. On Wednesday, he issued a

statement in which he expressed shock that the spray contained IGF-1 (insulin-like growth factor), a natural anabolic hormone that stimulates muscle growth. "While I have used deer antler spray, at no time was I aware that it may contain a substance that is banned under the PGA Tour anti-doping policy," said Singh, who has battled assorted health problems in recent years, especially with his back. "I am absolutely shocked that deer antler spray may contain a banned substance and am angry that I have put myself in this position. I have been in contact with the PGA Tour and am cooperating fully with their review of this matter."

THE HAGUE, 1 Feb — After AZ, PEC Zwolle and PSV, Ajax secured the last spot in the semifinals of the Dutch Cup, de KNVB Beker, by crushing Vitesse 4-0 in Emmen on Thursday.

The match was played in front of only a few thousand fans in Emmen, because the stadium of Vitesse in Arnhem was not available due to a dance party. Both teams had already played each other in the Dutch league last Sunday when Vitesse beat Ajax 3-2 after bouncing back from a 2-0 deficit.

This time Vitesse was not able to produce a comeback. Danny Hoesen opened the scoring in the 7th minute, while in the second half Lasse Schone finished a Siem de Jong pass for the second goal.

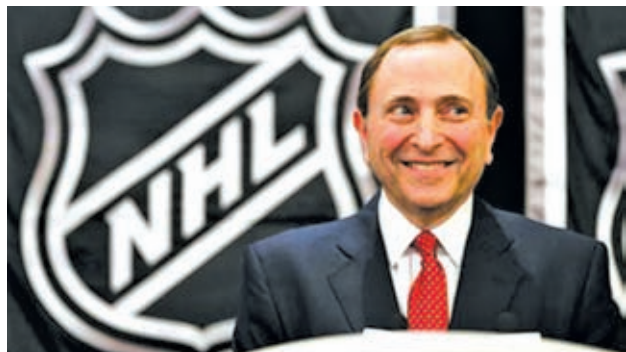
