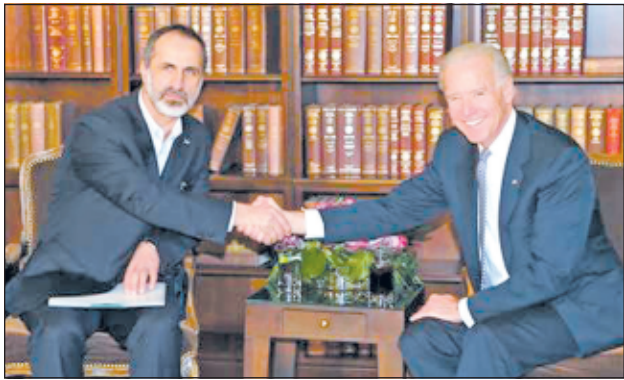

## Biden raises possibility of direct US, Iran talks

MUNICH, 3 Feb— The United States is ready for direct talks with Iran if it is serious about negotiations, Vice President Joe Biden said on Saturday, backing bilateral contact many see as crucial to easing a dispute over Teheran's nuclear programme.

Speaking at a security conference in Munich, Biden said Iran — which says it is enriching uranium for peaceful energy only — now faced “the most robust sanctions in history” meant to ensure it does not develop

nuclear weapons.

“But we have also made clear that Iran's leaders need not sentence their people to economic deprivation and international isolation,” Biden said. “There is still time, there is still space for diplomacy backed by pressure to succeed. The ball is in the government of Iran's court.”

To date, fitful talks on Iran's nuclear programme have been between Teheran and the EU's top diplomat representing six world powers including

Washington. But analysts have suggested that with his re-election behind him, President Barack Obama might have more leeway to take on direct negotiations with Iran. That makes the year ahead critical for chances of overcoming a stand-off which, if left to fester further, could see Iran approach nuclear weapons capability, possibly provoking military action by Israel that could inflame the Middle East.

Progress on Iran would also help ease regional tensions as the United States prepares to pull most combat troops out of Iran's neighbour Afghanistan by the end of 2014.

Asked whether Washington might consider direct talks with Iran to smooth the process, Biden said, “When the Iranian leadership, Supreme Leader (Ayatollah Ali Khamenei), is serious.”

“We have made it clear at the outset that we would be prepared to meet bilaterally with the Iranian leadership, we would not make it a secret that we were doing that, we would let our partners know if that occasion presented itself.”

## Syrian opposition talks with Russia and Iran

MUNICH, 3 Feb— The Syrian opposition leader met the foreign ministers of Russia and Iran on Saturday, opening a window to a possible breakthrough in efforts to broker an end to Syria's civil war.

Russia and Iran have been the staunchest allies of Syrian President Bashar al-Assad throughout an armed uprising, and any understandings they might reach with Assad's foes could help overcome the two sides' refusal to negotiate.

At an annual international security conference in Munich, Syrian National Coalition leader Moaz Alkhatib had talks with Russia's Sergei Lavrov that may have been made possible by Alkhatib

signalling readiness to talk to Damascus.

“Russia has a certain vision but we welcome negotiations to alleviate the crisis and there are lots of details that need to be discussed,” Alkhatib said after the meeting.

After a 45-minute meeting with Iranian Foreign Minister Ali Akbar Salehi, Alkhatib told Reuters: “We agreed we have to find a solution to end the suffering of the Syrian people.”

He also met separately with US Vice President Joe Biden and UN special envoy for Syria Lakhdar Brahimi.

Alkhatib's purpose in his meetings was “to discuss finding a way to remove the regime with the

least possible bloodshed and loss of life,” he said.

Russia has blocked three UN Security Council resolutions aimed at pushing out Assad out or pressuring him to end the civil war, in which more than 60,000 people have died. But Moscow has also tried to distance itself from

## Israeli president tasks Netanyahu with forming new government

JERUSALEM, 3 Feb— Israeli President Shimon Peres tasked incumbent Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu on Saturday evening with the task of forming a new government, amid the results of the 22 January national elections.

The two met at the presidential residence in Jerusalem on Saturday evening, after Peres received recommendations from 82 members of Knesset (parliament) who named Netanyahu the most suitable candidate for the task. “After receiving the recommendations of 82 elected members of the 19th Knesset, I have decided to task incumbent Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu with forming the next government,” Peres said during a press conference on Saturday evening.

“The state of Israel needs diplomatic and financial stability in order to have the ability to make the required decisions regarding issues on the agenda like the deficit, the need to equalize the burden in the Israeli society and the need to renew the peace process with the

Palestinians,” Peres added. “Therefore, the state needs a new government as soon as possible, to start to roll up its sleeves and work in order to face these challenges,” Peres added.

Netanyahu thanked Peres and the Knesset members who recommended him for the task, acknowledging it as a “great privilege and responsibility” to be nominated to the task for the third time in Israel's history.

He added he will strive to build a strong and wide government to handle the financial and security challenges facing Israel at present time.

According to the Israeli law, Netanyahu has 28 days to create his future government. If he hits a dead-end he is eligible to receive an extra two-week extension. If he does not comply with the task by this time, a new election would be announced.

## Dynegy power plant blown up in southern California

CHULA VISTA, 3 Feb— Thousands of spectators turned out along San Diego Bay on Saturday to watch as demolition crews worked on the 165-foot structure, as onlookers cheered and shock waves set off car alarms across a widespread area.

Most of the estimated 5,000 spectators gathered in Marina View Park in Chula Vista, about 1,000-foot north of the plant, for the early morning spectacle.

Often criticized by environmentalists as an eyesore, the plant was built in the late 1950s at the edge of an expanse of wetlands

adjacent to the bay.

Like other plants along the California Coast, it burned oil when it was first fired up in 1960. It later converted to natural gas, according to Laura Hunter of the Environmental Health Coalition. “This is a symbol of the past way of generating power which we know now is not sustainable,” Hunter said. “There's no better symbol for what we're learning about how to live on this planet than that where a power plant stood, a park and open space will be built,” she said.

It took several years of planning before officials could move ahead with the final demolition of the plant, according to Kristine Zortman, of the Unified Port of San Diego.—Reuters

## Four killed, including French man, in Senegal's Casamance

DAKAR, 3 Feb— Four people, including one French citizen, were killed in Senegal's southern Casamance region when suspected separatist rebels clashed

with government soldiers, a military source said on Saturday.

“There are four dead including a French man,” said the source.

He said it was not

clear whether the death of the French citizen was directly related to the rebels' long-running low-intensity bush war for independence in the mostly-Christian

southern region of predominantly Muslim Senegal.

The others killed in the attack late on Friday were Senegalese, the source said.—Reuters

## Dell nears buyout that could top \$24 billion

NEW YORK, 3 Feb—Dell Inc is edging closer to an agreement to sell itself to a buyout consortium led by Michael Dell, its founder and chief executive, and private equity firm Silver Lake Partners in a deal that could top \$24 billion, people familiar with the matter said on Friday.

The buyout consortium is negotiating taking Dell private at \$13 to \$14 per share, two of the people said. This translates into an equity valuation for the Round Rock, Texas-based company of between \$22.6 billion and \$24.4 billion.

Dell shares were up 2.5 percent at \$13.57 in after-

noon trading.

Michael Dell is expected to take majority ownership of the world's third-largest personal computer maker while Silver Lake and Microsoft Corp would become minority investors, three of the people said.

The transaction is set to be finalized over the weekend and the timetable could still slip, the people cautioned, asking not to be named because the matter is not public.

The investment group, which held negotiations with Dell's camp in New York on Thursday, has secured up to \$15 billion of debt financing to take Dell

private from four investment banks — Barclays, Bank of America Merrill Lynch, Credit Suisse and RBC Capital, people familiar with the matter said.

Barclays is also advising Silver Lake on the transaction, along with Perella Weinberg Partners,

said two of the people. JP-Morgan Chase & Co is advising Dell.

Representatives for Dell, Microsoft, Silver Lake and Barclays declined to comment. Perella Weinberg could not be immediately reached for comment.

## Russian rocket falls into sea in failed launch

Moscow, 3 Feb—A rocket carrying a communications satellite suffered engine trouble and plunged into the Pacific Ocean shortly after launch on Friday, Russian news agencies reported.

The unsuccessful launch of the *Intelsat-27* satellite was one of several setbacks for Russia's space programme in recent years, including failed satellite launches and an unsuccessful mission to study the Mars moon Phobos.

The *Zenit-3SL* rocket carrying the satellite suffered engine failure shortly after liftoff, state-run *Itar-Tass* reported, citing a Rus-

sian space industry source. The rocket is a joint production of Ukrainian and Russian companies, it said.

*Intelsat-27* was to provide services for media, government and other customers in the Americas and Europe, according to the website of Luxembourg-based Intelsat.

Russia is increasing space spending and plans to send a probe to the moon in 2015, but its celebrations in 2011 of the 50th anniversary of the Soviet achievement of putting the first man in space were marred by several botched satellite launches.

## Court rejects Oracle's bid for a quicker end to HP suit

SAN FRANCISCO, 3 Feb—A California appeals court on Thursday rejected an attempt by Oracle Corp to quickly end a bitter lawsuit brought by Hewlett-Packard Corp over Oracle's decision in 2011 to end support for HP's Itanium based servers.

HP accused Oracle of violating a contract when it decided it would no longer make new versions of its database software, which was

compatible with HP's high-end servers based on Intel Corp's Itanium chips. Oracle maintained it had no such contract with HP. The servers tend to be used by large corporations with rigorous computing needs.

After a trial last year, a state judge in San Jose, California ruled that a contract existed between HP and Oracle, and that Oracle was required to continue to offer

its product suite on HP's Itanium server platform. Oracle was required to port its products to HP's Itanium-based servers without charge to HP, the judge ruled.

Damages will be decided at a subsequent phase of trial.

In 2012, Oracle asked a California appeals court to reverse the contract ruling, which could have ended the case. However, California's 6th District Court of Appeal rejected the request late on Thursday, without further explanation.

Oracle must now wait until the trial is over to appeal all of the issues at once. Representatives for both companies declined to comment.

The case in the 6th Appellate District is Oracle Corporation vs Superior Court (Hewlett-Packard Company), number H038880.

## Coming soon to Facebook — more action, battle games

SAN FRANCISCO, 3 Feb—When nWay began a trial of its dark, sci-fi combat game "ChronoBlade" on Facebook last year, the San Francisco-based startup felt sure it had a hit on its hands.

"First of all, what comes is, 'Wow, I had no idea you could actually do a game of this quality on Facebook,'" said Dave Jones, Chief Creative Officer of nWay, who has worked on "Grand Theft Auto."

Then came some resistance: Jones admits some potential investors and partners questioned how an action-focused game with slick graphics can play to a Facebook audience more accustomed to "Farmville" and other less time-consuming casual games. Others wondered how the game — which launches this spring — would gain significant

users and revenue on the social network.

But Facebook Inc is betting nWay and a clutch of other developers this year can extend console-style action games beyond Microsoft Corp's Xbox or Sony Corp's PlayStation onto the world's largest social network.

Facebook is spearheading the launch of 10 high-quality games created by third-party developers in 2013 that squarely target so-called hardcore gamers, an atypical audience overlooked thus far against the wealth of family-friendly offerings like Zynga Inc's "Farmville" that now dominate the social network's gaming landscape.

The effort, which began late last year but will accelerate in 2013, is part of Facebook's ongoing objective of making sure its 1 billion-plus users log in and spend more time on the network, which in turn boosts ad revenue. Facebook also takes a cut of its applications' revenue.

Facebook's push into action and battle games follows a meeting in January between companies that make games like "first-person shooters" and Vice President Joe Biden to look for ways to curb gun violence in the wake of the Connecticut school shootings.—Reuters

## Google moves closer to resolving EU investigation

BRUSSELS, 3 Feb—Google Inc has offered to change some of its business practices to appease European competition authorities and avoid billions of dollars in fines.

The European Commission said on Friday it had received detailed proposals from the world's most popular search engine, which has been under investigation for two years following complaints from more than a dozen companies, including Microsoft, that Google has used its market power to block rivals.

If the Commission accepts the proposals under

its settlement procedure, it would mean no fine and no finding of wrongdoing against Google.

Companies found to be in breach of EU rules can be fined as much as 10 percent of global turnover, which could mean up to \$4 billion if there is no resolution in Google's case.

EU Competition Commissioner Joaquin Almunia declined to give details of the proposal but told *Reuters*: "We are analyzing it".

Google spokesman Al Verney said the group continues to work cooperatively with the commission.

Google's offer includes

labeling its own services in search results to make them stand out from rival services and also imposing fewer restrictions on advertisers, according to people familiar with the matter, who declined to be named because of the sensitivity of the issue.

They said the proposed deal does not mention the way Google enforces its patents against competitors as the company has already agreed with the US Federal Trade Commission that it would no longer seek sales bans when suing companies which infringe on key patents. The FTC ended its investigation last month

without any action, handing Google a major victory.

Google ranks first in Internet searching in Europe, with an 82 percent market share, versus 67 percent in the United States, according to research firm comScore. Lobbying group

ICOMP, whose members include complainants Microsoft, Foundem, Hot-map, Streetmap and Nextag, said any solution should include measures ensuring that rivals could compete on a level playing field with Google.

## Jet Airways swings to profit ahead of potential Etihad deal

NEW DELHI, 3 Feb—India's second biggest carrier Jet Airways (JET.NS), close to a tie-up with Abu Dhabi's Etihad Airways, swung to a quarterly profit of 850 million rupees on Friday on lower costs and rising fares in an under-serviced market.

Jet shares have almost doubled in the past three months as Etihad's plans to pick up a stake in the airline have become clearer.

The Jet deal, if closed, will be the first since India relaxed ownership rules in September last year and

allowed foreign carriers to buy up to 49 percent in domestic carriers that are battling stiff competition and high operating costs.

Jet's earnings surprised analysts, who according to Thomson Reuters I/B/E/S, were expecting a profit of 278.5 million rupees. It was the third straight quarter it has exceeded estimates.

The October-December earnings were a sharp turn around from a 1.01 billion rupees loss from a year earlier.

Pricing power in the market has improved leading to a 17.1 percent

jump in yields — a measure of average revenue per passenger — and that is likely to continue, Jet said in a statement to the Bombay Stock Exchange.

Kingfisher Airlines, controlled by liquor baron Vijay Mallya and once India's No 2 carrier, has stopped flying since the start of October, allowing other carriers to raise fares on key routes.

Budget carrier SpiceJet (SPJT.BO), which is also in talks with foreign airlines to sell a stake, swung to a quarterly profit at the end of 2012, and said it would target a bigger slice of revenue from international flights in the future. Fiercely competitive Indian carriers are struggling under massive debt, as they have to sell tickets below-cost in a market marred by high taxes on fuel and high airport charges.

"We continue in our endeavour on cost cutting measures, exploring various avenues of ancillary revenues and process improvements across all segments of the business, which will help us improve

the business further," Chief Executive Nikos Kardassis said in a statement.

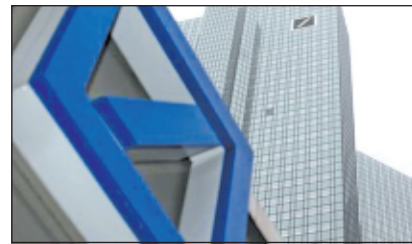
Jet has discontinued flying to many loss-making routes in the past few months, which sometimes meant aircraft getting grounded "in the short term," and that hurt revenue by 550 million rupees, Jet said.

Top executives from Gulf carrier Etihad and Jet met Indian civil aviation minister Ajit Singh and Trade minister Anand Sharma on Thursday, in a sign that a deal is likely to be announced soon.

"Pursuant to the announcement of liberalised FDI (foreign direct investment) policy permitting foreign investment in Indian airline, the company is in discussion with a reputed airline for a strategic investment in the company," Jet said on Friday. Jet expects to finalise a stake sale deal with Abu Dhabi's Etihad Airways in a week or so, an executive at the airline, who declined to be named, said.

## Deutsche Bank to cap bonus payouts at 300,000 euros: source

FRANKFURT, 3 Feb—Deutsche Bank AG (DBKGn.DE) will cap bonus payouts for 2012 at 300,000 euros per employee, a source familiar with the bank's thinking said on Friday.

However, total remuneration for 2012 will not be limited to 300,000 because the cap does not apply to deferred payouts, the source added. Employees are set to find out in the next couple of days what the extent of their remuneration will be for 2012.

Deutsche Bank unveiled a quarterly loss on Thursday after it took nearly \$4 billion in charges to try and draw a line under a slew of scandals.

The bank said its bonus pool for 2012 had been cut by 11 percent to 3.2 billion

euros. The number of employees in the Corporate Banking and Securities unit—the investment bank—has fallen 13 percent year-on-year. Average compensation for Deutsche investment bankers was 332,785 euros in 2011, down 12 percent on 2010 levels.

In September, the bank said it would alter remuneration to encourage its bankers to focus on "longer-term sustainable performance". Senior managers will have to wait five years to receive bonus share awards, rather than have them staggered over three years, the bank said at the time.

Overall, Deutsche Bank's headcount had fallen 2.7 percent year-on-year to 98,219 employees at the end of 2012.—Reuters

## Revived search for a TB vaccine may be about to pay off

CHICAGO, 3 Feb—After nearly 100 years, researchers could be on the verge of finding a vaccine that would eradicate tuberculosis infections, a scourge that kills 1.4 million people a year.

Global health experts are eagerly awaiting clinical trial results, expected early next week, of the first new vaccine in 90 years designed to prevent tuberculosis infections. While it might not prove effective, it will bring scientists much closer to creating a new generation of TB vaccines.

Known as MVA85A, the vaccine is the farthest along of more than a dozen candidates being developed globally to stop the transmission of mycobacterium tuberculosis, which is quickly outsmarting the best antibiotic weapons used against it.

"In my own personal view, I will consider this (trial) to be a landmark or a watershed," said Peggy Johnston, senior program officer at the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation in Seattle. "If it is negative,

it would be the first trial we can demonstrate that yes, we can conduct a clinical trial and get a solid answer. If it turns out to be at all positive, it will be a clear watershed for the field."

Although companies are making strides developing new drugs to fight TB, such as Johnson & Johnson's recently approved drug, bedaquiline, experts believe a vaccine ultimately will be the best tool to eradicate the ancient disease, which infects 9 million people a year.

"Drug development at the moment is lagging the rate at which drug resistance is emerging. We can't constantly be chasing after the next drug that becomes ineffective," said Christine Sizemore of the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases, a part of the National Institutes of Health. Dr Ann Ginsberg of Rockville, Maryland-based Aeras, a non-profit biotech developing MVA85A said it is "the single tool that could have the greatest

potential impact on the TB epidemic." Ginsberg said better drugs will be useful to treat people who are already sick, but by the time a person with TB is diagnosed, they have already infected 10 to 15 people.

"A vaccine can stop transmission," she added.

A lot is riding on the trial's results, which will give the first solid clues about whether scientists are on the right track to create a new generation of TB vaccines. MVA85A is being developed by researchers at Britain's Oxford University with support from Aeras, the Wellcome Trust, the

European Commission and the Oxford-Emergent Tuberculosis Consortium, a joint venture between Oxford and Emergent Biosolutions Inc created to make the vaccine. It is one of 16 vaccines being studied in human clinical trials and the study results will inform the design of more than 50 vaccines being tested in preclinical trials in animals.

Most of the development has occurred in the last decade with the emergence of drug-resistant TB, which could affect as many as 2 million people by 2015, according to the World Health Organization.

## Religare Capital says tech error caused unusual trades

MUMBAI, 3 Feb—A technology glitch at Religare Capital Markets caused "unintended transactions", the brokerage said on Saturday, a day after deeply discounted sale of large blocks of shares in Tata Motors (TAMO.NS) and UltraTech Cement (ULTC.NS) hit the markets.

National Stock Exchange Ltd said on Friday it was investigating the block sales in two stocks, the latest in a series of unusual price movements to rattle the market. "Religare Capital Markets Limited uses third party software for execution of orders on stock exchanges. Due to some technical issue in the software, unintended transactions got executed," the brokerage said in a statement. "There was no broker error and no loss to any clients," it said, adding

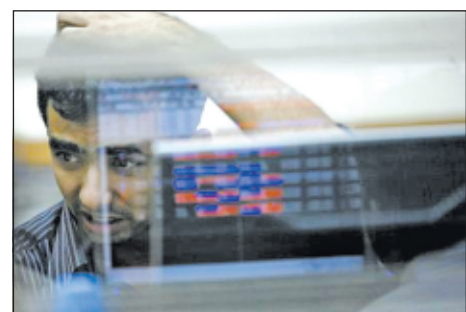
the matter was being looked into by the software provider. It said there was no impact on client business and the brokerage would operate normally on Monday.

A total of 2.07 million shares in Tata Motors were sold in six blocks at an average price of 274.92 rupees in the afternoon on Friday, well below the roughly 292 rupee level at which the shares were trading at the time. Tata shares fell as low as 268.25 rupees before ending the session down 5.49 percent at 281.64 rupees.

Shares in UltraTech, a cement maker, ended down 3.4 percent after an earlier block sale of 41,863 shares took place at an average 1,853.80 rupees, also well below where shares were trading at the time. Both trades took place around the same time.—Reuters

## Mali hails “saviour” Hollande, he says fight not over

TIMBUKTU, 3 Feb—Cheering, grateful Malians mobbed French President Francois Hollande on Saturday as he visited French troops fighting Islamist jihadist rebels, and he pledged France would finish the job of restoring government control in the Sahel state.

In a one-day trip to Mali accompanied by his ministers for defence, foreign affairs and development, Hollande was hailed as a liberator in the ancient northern city of Timbuktu, which French and Malian forces retook from the rebels six days ago.

He also received a rapturous reception in the capital Bamako, where he said the Islamist fighters allied to al-Qaeda had suffered heavy losses in a three-week-old French intervention that he ordered last month at Mali's request.

Although the insur-

gents have been driven from Mali's main northern towns, Hollande cautioned that the task of France's military operation in Mali, codenamed Serval (Wildcat) and involving 3,500 soldiers on the ground, was not yet over.

“There is still a whole part of the north that remains unconquered ... There are terrorist elements concentrated in some areas of the country, others who are dispersed. There are risks of terrorism. So, we have not yet finished our mission,” he told a news conference at the French ambassador's residence.

He added France would withdraw its troops from Mali once the West African country had restored sovereignty over all its national territory and a UN-backed African military force, which is being deployed, could take over from the French.

“We do not foresee staying indefinitely,” he said, but he spelled out no specific time frame for the French mission.

Mali's interim President Dioncounda Traore thanked “our brother” Hol-

lande for launching the French intervention. It has cost the life of only one French serviceman so far and has driven the rebels into the mountains of north-east Mali.—Reuters

## Indonesian president arrives Nigeria with trade delegation

ABUJA, 3 Feb—Indonesian President Susilo Bambang Yudhoyono on Saturday arrived Abuja, Nigeria's capital city accompanied by 99 businessmen in a move to strengthen existing rela-

tions with the West African nation.

President Goodluck Jonathan and his wife, Dame Patience Jonathan, received the Indonesian leader and his wife, Ani Susilo.

The president and his delegation's visit to the country is to strengthen existing relations and for bilateral and multilateral trade discussions.

On arrival, Yudhoyono inspected a guard of honor mounted by the the Brigade of Guards, and also a 21 gun-salute in his honor.

The two leaders, members of the delegation, ministers and Nigerian top businessmen, thereafter, proceeded into a closed-door bilateral talks.

Yudhoyono is in Nigeria as part of state visit to three African countries, namely Liberia, Nigeria and Egypt, and some Middle Eastern countries, including Saudi Arabia.

The visit is part of the country's effort to strengthen bilateral and multilateral ties.

## Roadside bomb kills one in Syrian capital

DAMASCUS, 3 Feb—One person was killed and another injured on Saturday when a roadside bomb ripped through the time-honored al-Hijaz area in the heart of Syrian capital Damascus, local media said.

The roadside bomb went off near a coffee shop at al-Naser Street, local media said, adding that the blast killed a member of

bomb squads who came to defuse it.

Also in Damascus on Saturday, an explosive device affixed under a car went off near al-Shagour area in central the city, injuring the driver and causing material damages, reports said.

Meanwhile, armed rebels using snipers and bomb shells attacked on Saturday the police sta-

tion of al-Qadam suburb of Damascus, killing a policeman and injuring other two, local media said, adding that many rebels were also killed in the assault.

Blasts and attacks have become daily routines in Syria that has been gripped by a 22-month-old crisis which left more than 60,000 people killed amid faltering efforts for peace.

## Iran unveils new indigenous fighter jet

TEHERAN, 3 Feb—Iranian President Mahmoud Ahmadinejad unveiled on Saturday a new home-made fighter jet, local media reported.

Iran's advancement in military sector does not aim at “expansionism and violating others' rights,” however, it will be utilized for “defensive and deterrence” purposes, Ahmadinejad was quoted as saying by semi-official ISNA news agency in a ceremony held here to disclose the Iranian military achievement.

The advanced fighter jet, named *Qaheer-313* (*Conqueror-313*), which has been designed and built by the Iranian experts, can fly at low altitudes, the Iranian Defence Minister, Brigadier General Ahmad Vahidi, said on the sidelines

of the ceremony, according to semi-official *Mehr* news agency. The bomber can carry a payload of domestic weapons and ammunition and enjoys low radar-detecting surface, Vahidi was quoted as saying.

Another feature of this fighter is “advanced unique hydroelectric system,” said Vahidi on the occasion of the Daheh Fajar (Ten-Day Dawn) celebrations marking the victory of 1979 Islamic revolution.

According to Press TV, the fighter jet is similar to the US-built *F/A-18*, although its appearance looks similar to *F-5E/F Tiger II*. The new single-seat bomber has the ability to track down enemy aircraft, engage in combat and target locations on the ground.

## Over 2,000 IDPs flee conflicts between army, al-Qaeda in S Yemen

SANAA, 3 Feb—Fears of battles between the Yemeni army and al-Qaeda militants in the country's southern city of Radda in al-Bayda Province have forced at least 2,630 people to flee their home since last week, the official *Saba* news agency reported on Saturday.

The internally displaced people (IDPs) have been accommodated in houses of their relatives in several villages and towns of the neighbouring Province of Dhamar, the agency said, adding that more displaced families are expected in the following days.

The number of IDPs increased after last Monday's suicide bomb attacks on the military sites that killed at least 14 soldiers and injured more 17, according to the state media. The terrorist attacks happened as the Yemeni army advanced into mountains surrounding hideouts of al-Qaeda militants in the tribal villages of Gaifa on the outskirts of Radda.

The new IDPs from al-Bayda left their hometown a few months after about 100,000 people who had fled months-long conflicts between the army and al-Qaeda militants in the

southern province of Abyan returned home, according to recent statistics by the UN office in Yemen's southern port city of Aden.

The Defence Ministry said the planned offensive “aims at driving the militants out of residential regions to reinforce the government control.” About seven military units, backed by fighter jets, fought against al-Qaeda fighters for about 10 hours in al-Thalep Mountain on Monday night. The defense ministry said the al-Qaeda suffered heavy blow during the battle, but gave no specific number of casualties.

## Abu Dhabi airport customs seizes 128 kg of narcotic drugs

ABU DHABI, 3 Feb.—Custom inspectors at the Abu Dhabi International Airport have foiled the smuggle of huge quantities of narcotics when searching three passengers arriving from India to the capital of the United Arab Emirates,

local news agency WAM said on Saturday.

When inspecting the luggage of the three passengers, the airport's customs officers found 52 bags of narcotic poppy seeds, weighing 52 kg, from the first suspect.

In the bags of the second and third suspects, the officers found 35.1 kg and 41.1 kg of the same drugs respectively. The three passengers, all Indian nationals, were referred to a competent authority, said the report.—Xinhua

## Five accused plead not guilty to Delhi gang rape, murder

NEW DELHI, 3 Feb—Five men pleaded not guilty on Saturday to charges they raped and murdered an Indian trainee physiotherapist, in a case that led to a shake-up of laws against sexual crimes after protests about a rising number of attacks on women. Police say the gang lured the 23-year-old woman onto a bus in New Delhi, where they repeatedly raped and assaulted her with a metal bar before throwing her bleeding onto a highway. She died of internal injuries two weeks after the 16 December attack.

A Reuters witness saw the men file into the court room with their faces covered, where lawyers in the case said they were read thirteen charges including murder, which carries a maximum penalty of death. They left after 15 minutes. “After the judge read out the charges, the five pleaded not guilty and walked out” said AP Singh, a lawyer defending two of the accused, Vinay Sharma and Akshay Thakur.

Singh said the prosecution will call three witnesses to the next hearing on Tuesday, which is the formal start of the trial. The prosecution says it has strong evidence against the five men including blood stained clothing, DNA matches, mobile phone

records, confessions and eye-witness statements.

Singh says Sharma was never on the bus and Thakur was hiding beneath a seat and never took part in the crime. The other men—brothers Ram and Mukesh Singh and Pawan Kumar—are represented by two other lawyers. Mukesh Singh has replaced a lawyer who claimed his client was tortured in police custody, and no longer claims mistreatment.

A sixth person police say was part of the gang that attacked the woman and her

friend is a juvenile and will be tried separately. The brutality of the attack was shocking even to a nation inured to a rising wave of sexual crimes against women. Thousands of young protesters took to the streets in the weeks that followed. In response to the public outcry, on Friday the cabinet fast-tracked new, tougher penalties for sex crimes. Under the new rules, due to be signed into law by the president in the coming days, gang rape that leads to death will be punishable by death while minimum penalties will be raised to 20 years for gang rape and rape of a minor. The laws must later be ratified by parliament.

## Biden reassures Europe on transatlantic ties

MUNICH, 3 Feb—In a bid to reassure Europe of the transatlantic ties, the Vice President of the United States Joe Biden reaffirmed on Saturday that Europe remains the closest allies of the US.

“Simply put, President (Barack) Obama and I continue to believe Europe is the cornerstone of our engagement with the rest of the world, and it’s the catalyst for our global cooperation,” Biden told the 49th Munich Security Conference here, adding that “it’s that basic, nothing has changed”.

Biden’s remarks came

at a time when concerns are voiced about the possible cooling down of transatlantic relations as the US is shifting its foreign policy emphasis toward Asia.

While stressing that the US and Europe have been cooperating well on various fronts, Biden said, “you remain our closest allies.”

Commenting on the latest development of Europe, Biden saw positive steps especially in terms of the handling of eurozone crisis. He mentioned the measures taken by the European Central Bank to ease the market tensions and called on eurozone govern-

ments to remain focused on growth and jobs.

“These may be fundamental European problems requiring European solutions, but the resolution has a tremendous impact on the United States of America and the global economy,” he said. With regard to the transatlantic trade and investment agreement, Biden said the regulations and standards differences continue to divide the US and Europe. But he believed the US and Europe can overcome the differences.

Biden pointed out that the mutual agenda of the US and Europe had shifted

## Islamist threatens to attack Germany, Merkel

BERLIN, 3 Feb—A German Islamist has threatened to attack Berlin this summer and kill Chancellor Angela Merkel in a video posted on the Internet, a newspaper reported on Saturday.

A spokesman for Germany’s intelligence service, the Office for the Protection of the Constitution, confirmed its agents had seen such a video. “This is an Islamist battle song. It is known to the security services and is being evaluated,” said the spokesman.

*Die Welt* newspaper reported that a three-minute video had surfaced on the Internet with a German Is-

lamist calling himself Abu Azzam, believed to be a radical Salafist who moved to Egypt last year.

“Looking back at an Arab spring, we are looking forward to a European summer,” said Abu Azzam in the video, according to the newspaper.

“Osama, wait for us... We want to see Obama and Merkel dead,” he was quoted as saying, adding that Germany’s Reichstag parliament building would be subject to attacks like those on New York’s World Trade Center in 2001. German authorities have stepped up surveillance of Salafist groups who

espouse a radical version of Islam. Germany is home to roughly 4,000 Salafists, a tiny proportion of the total Muslim population of about four million. Germany’s involvement in the NATO mission in Afghanistan has

led to fears of an attack on German soil. Berlin is also supplying military transport planes to fly West African troops to Mali to help French and Malian forces fighting Islamist rebels.

## Turkey says tests confirm leftist bombed US Embassy

ISTANBUL, 3 Feb—A member of a Turkish leftist group that accuses Washington of using Turkey as its “slave” carried out a suicide bomb attack on the US embassy, the Ankara governor’s office cited DNA tests as showing on Saturday.

Ecevit Sanli, a member of the leftist Revolutionary People’s Liberation Army-Front (DHKP-C), blew himself up in a perimeter gatehouse on Friday as he tried to enter the embassy, also killing a Turkish security guard.

The DHKP-C, virulently anti-American and listed as a terrorist organization by the United States and Turkey, claimed responsibility in a statement on the Internet in which it said Turkish Prime Minister Tayyip Erdogan was a US “puppet”.

“Murderer America! You will not run away from people’s rage,” the statement on “The People’s Cry” website said, next to

a picture of Sanli wearing a black beret and military-style clothes and with an explosives belt around his waist.

It warned Erdogan that he too was a target. Turkey is an important US ally in the Middle East with common interests

ranging from energy security to counter-terrorism. Leftist groups including the DHKP-C strongly oppose what they see as imperialist US influence over their nation.

DNA tests confirmed that Sanli was the bomber, the Ankara governor’s of-

and a military staff college in Istanbul, but his sentence was deferred after he fell sick during a hunger strike. He was never re-jailed.

Condemned to life in prison in 2002, he fled the country a year later, officials said. Interior Minister Muammer Guler said he had re-entered Turkey using false documents.

Erdogan, who said hours after the attack that the DHKP-C were responsible, met his interior and foreign ministers as well as the head of the army and state security service in Istanbul on Saturday to discuss the bombing.

Three people were detained in Istanbul and Ankara in connection with the attack, state broadcaster TRT said. The White House condemned the bombing as an “act of terror”, while the UN Security Council described it as a heinous act. US officials said on Friday the DHKP-C were the main suspects but did not exclude other possibilities.

Islamist radicals, extreme left-wing groups, ultra-nationalists and Kurdish militants have all carried out attacks in Turkey in the past.

## Earthquake jolts north Japan, no tsunami—NHK

TOKYO, 3 Feb—An earthquake with a preliminary magnitude of 6.4 jolted Japan’s northern island of Hokkaido on Saturday, the Japan Meteorological Agency said.

No tsunami was seen as a result of the quake and there were no reports of damage to local police as

#### Township Sanghanayaka Committees

Over (542) Township Sanghanayaka Committees comprising over (3900) members of the Sangha have been formed throughout seven States and seven Regions in the Republic of the Union of Myanmar. In accordance with the fundamental principles of Sangha Organizations, members of Township Sanghanayaka Committees shall be elected only by majority of Sangha Working Committee members of respective townships with their free consent. The main objectives of Township Sanghanayaka Committees are to carry out the noble task of the purification, perpetuation and propagation of the Buddha Sanana and other religious matters in their respective townships.

#### Functions and duties of Township Sanghanayaka Committees

1. Shall carry out their functions concerned in accordance with the fundamental principles approved and adopted by the Congregation of the Sangha of All Or-

ders and procedures of Sangha Organization, procedures of settlements of Vinayadhamma Kamma Adhikarana Disputes Act, other decisions and instructions approved and passed by the meeting of the State Central Working Committee of the Sangha of All Orders.

2. Shall perform their duties leading to the purification, perpetuation and propagation of the Buddha Sanana and the unity of the members of Sangha.
3. Shall make monks

and novices (Samaneras) dwelling in their township to know and follow the instructions of the higher levels of Sangha Organizations.

4. Shall collect and prepare the final list of monk-hood/ noviticehood of monks and novices in their township and send it to respective State/Regional Sanghanayaka Committees and State Sanghamahanayaka Committee.
5. Shall report their functions to respective State/Regional Sanghanayaka Committees occasionally.
6. May issue necessary instructions to Ward/ Village-tract Sanghanayaka Committees in their townships.
7. According to the clause (93) sub clause (I) and (K), if submissions are made, it must be inquired and make appropriate decision and shall report it to respective State/Regional Sanghanayaka Committees.
8. Shall performed to issue new registration cards of Sanana members and amend, substitute, cancel or keep back

them as necessary in accordance with the instructions of higher levels of Sangha Organizations.

9. Shall perform to scrutinize the Sanana matters related to Pariyatti and Patipatti affairs.
10. Shall perform to form Sangha Vinicchaya Court to decide and settle disputes and cases arising in their township in accordance with special prescribed procedures and settlements of Vinayadhamma-kamma Adhikarana Disputes Act, and the court's decision shall be informed to respective township authorities concerned to carry out the decisions to be obeyed.
11. Shall conduct and supervise the election and limitation of Vinayadharas, Township Sangha Working Committee members and Ward/ Village-tract Sanghanayaka committee members.
12. Shall give advice and admonitions occasionally to the monks and novices in their township without affecting management of respective monasteries and monastic institutes.
13. If it is a necessary, shall consult with

14. Out of the matters, the important ones which had been done within a year shall be submitted to the annual meeting of the Township Sangha Working Committee.
15. If any representative of Sangha Samutti or any member of Vinayadharas, Sangha Working Committee, Sanghanayaka Committee and Patron Committee falls vacant, it shall be informed to the respective State/ Regional Sanghanayaka Committee and the State Sanghamahanayaka Committee within five days after vacancy has been learnt.

According to the functions and duties of the Township Sanghanayaka Committees, various matters and affairs in connection with the members of the Sangha or Sangha Organizations can only be decided and settled by members of the Sangha themselves. Matters, affairs or disputes in connection with the members of the Sangha cannot be decided and settled by any civil court or authorities concerned.

## Boeing 787 investigation making progress—US NTSB

WASHINGTON, 3 Feb—US officials on Friday said they are making progress in their investigation of a battery fire on a Boeing Co 787 Dreamliner in Boston this month, as the grounding of Boeing's entire fleet of 787s stretched into a third week.

All 50 Boeing 787s remain grounded as authorities in the United States, Japan and France investigate the Boston battery fire on 7 January and a separate battery failure that forced a second 787 to make an emergency landing in Japan a week later.

The US safety board said it continued to look at flight data recorded aboard the 787 aircraft involved in the 7 January event at Boston airport for any information about the performance of the lithium-ion battery that caught fire, and its charging system, which was built by Securaplane, a unit of Britain's Meggitt Plc.

"Our investigators are moving swiftly and we are

making progress," Kelly Nantel, a spokeswoman for the US National Transportation Safety Board, said after the US safety board issued a seventh update on

the investigation. She did not elaborate.

Boeing welcomed the news and said it continued to work closely with authorities in the United States and Japan.

The NTSB said an expert from the Department of Energy had joined the investigation, and an NTSB investigator would travel to

France on Sunday or Monday with a "battery contactor", which connects the battery to the planes' electrical systems, for further tests at the equipment's

manufacturer, Thales SA. The NTSB experts at the US Naval Surface Warfare Centre laboratories were continuing to look at a second, undamaged lithium-ion battery pulled from the same Japan Airlines plane. Both batteries were built by GS Yuasa, a Japanese company. Initial tests, including

infrared thermal imaging of each cell in the undamaged battery, found no anomalies, according to the NTSB update. It said the battery's eight cells were undergoing another scan to examine their internal condition. ## Thirty-five killed as militants attack Pakistan checkpoint

DERA ISMAIL KHAN, 3 Feb—Militants attacked an isolated army checkpoint in Pakistan's restive northwest on Saturday, with at least 35 people killed in the initial assault, subsequent crossfire and a rocket attack on a house, officials said.

The Pakistan Taliban claimed responsibility, saying the attack was in response to a US drone strike in neighbouring North Waziristan last month in which two commanders were killed. The Pakistani military and pro-government militias have since 2009 regained territory from the Pakistan Taliban, who once controlled land a few hours' drive from the capital of Islamabad.

The militants attacked the post at Lakki Marwat early on Saturday.

A security official said

12 militants and 13 soldiers were killed in the clash. Two bodies had suicide bomb belts on them.

"Cross-firing between militants and security officials continued for four hours," one source said.

The militants also targeted a house next to the camp with rockets, killing 10 members of one family, including three children, the official said.

"Pakistan has been cooperating with the US in its drone strikes that killed our two senior commanders, Faisal Khan and Toofani, and the attack on military camp was the revenge of their killing," the Taliban spokesman said. He said four suicide bombers attacked the camp and blew themselves up. He said more than a dozen soldiers were killed.—Reuters

## 8 NATO service members die in Afghanistan in Jan

KABUL, 3 Feb—Up to eight soldiers with the NATO-led International Security Assistance Force (ISAF) had been killed in Afghan war in January this year, the lowest casualty in a month over the past four years.

According to iCasualties, a website tracking the casualties of NATO-led troops in the US-led war on terror, eight soldiers had been killed in the militancy-hit country last month, three of whom are Americans.

A Polish soldier with the coalition was killed in a hostile fire incident on Jan. 23 in eastern Ghazni province, 100 km south of capital city of Kabul, according to the website.

Out of all deaths last month, four soldiers had been killed in home-made bomb or Improvised Explosive Device (IED) attacks

across the country.

The simple but difficult to be detected Taliban weapon used in making suicide vests and roadside bombs, has proved a challenge for Afghan and NATO-led forces in the central Asian country.

Three other service men were killed in separate small arms fire incidents in different part of the insurgency-hit country last month, including one British soldier who was shot and killed by an Afghan army soldier.

The incident took place on 7 Jan, as the Afghan soldier opened fire against coalition forces in a military base in Nahr-e Saraj district of southern Helmand province, 100 km south of Kabul, the latest in the so-called green-on-blue insider attacks.

## US woman missing in Turkey found dead in Istanbul: report

ISTANBUL, 3 Feb—A US woman who had been missing in Turkey's Istanbul for days was found dead, local daily *Hurriyet* reported on Saturday.

The woman, identified as Sarai Sierra, a 33-year-old mother of two, went missing while vacationing alone in Istanbul. Her family last heard from her on 21 Jan, the day she was supposed to return.

The body, which was sent to hospital, was reportedly killed by knife. Private broadcaster NTV claimed that police found Sierra's driving license next to the body.

Senior police sources said that the woman may have died from a stab wound on her abdomen and confirmed that at least 10 people have been detained at the crime scene.—Xinhua

## FARC requests mediation to release three kidnapped officers

BOGOTA, 3 Feb—The Colombian FARC guerrilla said on Saturday it would only deliver three officers—two policemen and a soldier—held in its captivity to a Colombian civil society organization and the International Committee of Red Cross (ICRC).

"We will proceed to make arrangements of the case to release them through the civil society organization Colombians for Peace and the ICRC," said the Revolutionary Armed Forces of Colombia (FARC) said in a statement.

The two policemen

were kidnapped on January 25 in a rural area of the Colombian southwestern Valle del Cauca Province. The government requested this week for their immediate release.

"We also inform that in the attack occurred on Tuesday in Policarpa (southwest) with official army troops (...) we captured a soldier, which we are able to also release simultaneously with the policemen," said the rebel group. "We inform to their relatives that they are in good conditions and treated with respect and dignity," it added.—Xinhua

## Heavy rains render 8,000 Bolivian families homeless

LAPAZ, 3 Feb—Hail storms, downpours and landslides have made 8,159 families across Bolivia homeless and damaged about 2,000 hectares of farmland, authorities said on Friday.

Vice Civil Defence Minister Oscar Cabrera said 48 towns in eight states have been affected, with the south sustaining the most severe damage, where three states will receive priority emer-

gency aid, particularly food aid. The government will devise a recovery plan to prevent refugee flows to Argentina, Cabrera added.

The Civil Defence Ministry has allocated some 2.5 million US dollars to cover nationwide emergency services such as buying blankets, food supplies and the machinery needed to carry out recovery work, he said.

## Two kidnapped hostages freed in S Philippines

ZANBOANGA City, 3 Feb — Gunmen of al-Qaeda-linked terrorist Abu Sayyaf group, released two Filipino television crews in the jungle of Jolo island on Saturday night, but still kept a Jordanian journalist, Philippine military said on Sunday.

The two Filipinos, Rolando Letrero and Ramelito Vela, were freed from the Abu Sayyaf camp in Patikul town at around 6 pm for still unspecified reason, said Philippine Army Spokesman Randolph Cabangbang.

Police sent them to a hospital for medical check-up and treatment, he added.

As for the whereabouts about the Jordanian journalist, Cabangbang said they had no information about it, as the released victims said they had not seen Atyani a week after they were seized. The police and marines were verifying the fate of the Jordanian captive.

Jordanian broadcast journalist Baker Atyani and two Filipino companions declared “missing” in Jolo, Sulu since 13 June of last

year. An Abu Sayyaf Group leader later claimed to have in custody the three victims.

The 380-strong Abu Sayyaf group (ASG), founded in the early 1990s, is a violent Muslim terrorist group operating in the southern Philippines. The ASG engages in kidnappings for ransom, bombings, beheadings, assassinations, and extortion. The group’s stated goal is to promote an independent Islamic state in western Mindanao and the Sulu Archipelago, areas in the southern Philippines.—Xinhua

## Eight students injured after van overturns in Japan’s Hyogo Prefecture

OSAKA, 3 Feb—A total of eight high school students were injured, with one in critical condition, after a van they were aboard overturned on an expressway in Hyogo Prefecture, western Japan, on Saturday morning, local press reported.

The accident occurred at around 8 am local time when the van carrying nine female students from a tennis club of a high school in Matsuyama City, Ehime Prefecture, hit the central reservation on the expressway and overturned.

Local police arrested a 37-year-old teacher of the high school who drove the van for negligent driving. The driver told the police that he drove too fast and caused the overturn.

The students were heading for Kasai City in Hyogo Prefecture to take part in a tennis match, the reports said.

## China island resort alert to holiday overpricing

SANYA, 3 Feb—The mayor of Sanya on Sunday vowed tight monitoring of local tourism businesses to avoid a repeat of the overcharging allegations that dogged the renowned resort city last Spring Festival.

Authorities of Sanya, in China’s island province of Hainan, will clamp down on illegal activities in the tourism industry during the upcoming holiday travel rush, said Wang Yong.

“Sanya will not pass the tests if any overcharging takes place again,” he said.

In the peak tourist sea-

son of Spring Festival in 2012, a series of overcharging scandals tainted the beach city’s reputation as a paradise for tourists from home and abroad. Some visitors complained that they were overcharged “extremely irrationally.”

Government authorities will monitor and investigate hotels, restaurants and travel agencies based on guide prices suggested by the government, according to Wang.

The government will severely punish illegal tour guides, travel agents and

tourism sites, he added.

Especially in the management of seafood markets and bars, administrative departments will utilize an electronic order system that will allow them to keep tabs on pricing, the mayor said.

Wang also warned all businesses in Sanya to “keep their noses clean” or face tough penalties.

During last year’s Spring Festival, Sanya, a city with a population of 700,000, received about 500,000 tourists drawn to its warm weather, sea and sand.

## Sri Lanka rescues 138 people from sinking boat

COLOMBO, 3 Feb—The Sri Lankan Navy rescued over 100 people from a sinking boat off the country’s eastern seas, a navy spokesman said on Sunday.

Navy spokesman Kosala Warnakulasuriya told Xinhua that navy boats were deployed the previous night after information was received about a stranded boat. When the navy reached the boat they found 138 people cramped into a small boat and their lives were in danger.

The navy immediately transferred the passengers onto the navy boats and brought them ashore, the navy spokesman said.

He said that most of them were suffering from dehydration and were admitted to a local hospital.

Among those on the boat were women and children and it was still not clear if they were heading to some country to seek asylum.

In recent times hundreds of Sri Lankans had been arrested while attempting to go by boat to Australia to seek asylum.

Sri Lankans, Bangladeshi nationals and Afghans often make the dangerous trip by boat despite many of them failing in their journey.

## Sinopec to sell cleaner gasoline in 2014

BEIJING, 3 Feb—Sinopec Corp, Asia’s biggest oil refiner, has said it is upgrading desulphurization facilities and will supply cleaner oil products from 2014 over public concerns about oil quality. Sinopec said in statement on Friday that it will build upgraded desulphurization facilities in 12 refineries by the end of 2013 and will sell oil

products that meet the national 4 standard for pollutant emissions.

China has no country-wide standard on sulphur content in gasoline, and such standards currently vary by region. Beijing is the only city in China to have adopted the national 5 standard, equal to the Euro V vehicle emissions standard, which caps sulphur content below 10

ppm (parts per million).

China’s developed regions, including Shanghai, Jiangsu and Zhejiang, use the national 4 standard, 50 ppm or below, while remaining regions have adopted the national 3 standard, which allows the sulphur content in fuel to be as high as 150 ppm.

But cleaner fuel may also mean higher prices. When Beijing and Shang-

hai switched from national 3 standard to the stricter national 4 years ago, gasoline prices rose by 0.2 to 0.3 yuan (0.03 to 0.05 US dollar) per litre.

Repeated bouts of smog this winter in China’s central and eastern parts have given rise to public outcry over oil quality, which contributes to air pollution.

## Philippine Coast Guard warns of possible vessel oil spill

MANILA, 3 Feb—The Philippine Coast Guard (PCG) warned of possible oil spill by a passenger vessel, which partially sank near a port in northern Philippine province of Oriental Mindoro, if it is not immediately be removed from the area.

Oil sheen was sighted near waters of Calapan port where listing MV Baleno 168 was moored, the agency said, but added that oil sheen dissolved immediately.

“If the water condi-

tion at the incident area will change to heavy wave with strong winds and currents, subject vessel may possibly capsize and oil spill may occur,” the agency said.

The vessel was loaded with about 2,450 litres of diesel and 9, 125 litres of low sulfur fuel when it encountered trouble last Thursday and partially sank near the port. It was also loaded with 227 litres of lubricant oil.

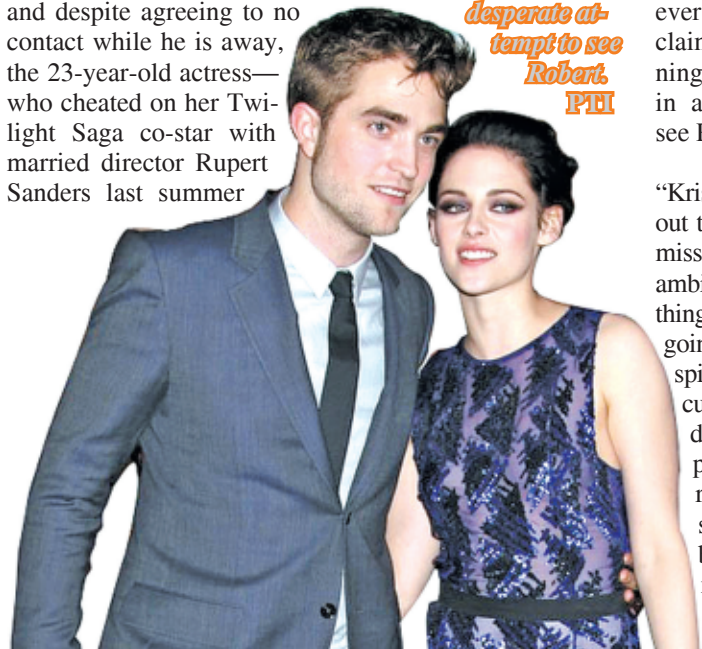

albeit difficult, is wisdom. Peace, albeit trite, is what I want in my short life. Peace." Brown and Ocean both are nominated in the best urban contemporary album category at the Grammys Awards, which will be announced on 10 February in Los Angeles.

LONDON, 3 Feb—Holders Czech Republic showed how tenaciously they will fight to retain the Davis Cup on Saturday, while five-times champions Spain avoided being knocked out in the first round for the first time since 2006 by winning their doubles rubber against Canada. Czechs Tomas Berdych and Lukas Rosol won a record-breaking dou-

bles match against Swiss duo Marco Chiudinelli and Stanislas Wawrinka.

Their seven hour two minute victory, including a 24-22 final set, put the Czechs 2-1 ahead in the tie in Geneva and they need to win only one of the two singles rubbers on Sunday. The Czechs needed 13 match points before the Swiss finally cracked

but for France and Serbia things were far more straightforward as they took unassailable 3-0 leads in their matches against Israel and Belgium respectively. Argentina also clinched a quarter-final berth by taking a 3-0 lead against Germany.

Top seeds Spain, missing top-15 players Rafa Nadal, David Ferrer and Nicolas Almagro and world number 24 Fernando Verdasco, gave themselves a chance of joining them after Marcel Granollers and Marc Lopez produced a gritty five-set win. Trailing 2-0 after dropping both singles matches on Friday, the Spanish duo overcame Daniel Nestor and Vasek Pospisil 4-6, 6-4, 6-7, 6-3, 6-2 to stay alive in the tie. The Spaniards, however, face a tough task on Sunday with Canada's world number 15 Milos Raonic to play Granollers in the first match of the reverse singles.—Reuters

Double Olympic champion Charles Hamelin claimed his second short-track speedskating World Cup victory of the season by winning a men's 500m

race. The Canadian won in 41.092 and Wu Daijing of China clocked 41.095 for second, while Russia's Vladimir Grigorev was third in 41.165. Noh Jinkyu led a South Korean sweep of the podium in the men's 1,500m, recording 2:17.482 for his fourth win of the season. Kim Yun-Jae was second and Kwak Yoon-Gy third.—Xinhua

"We did well not to panic during some moments under pressure today, though we still need to mature in those terms," he added.

**Author of “American Sniper” shot dead in Texas**

HOUSTON, 3 Feb— The author of “American Sniper” has been shot dead in the US state of Texas, US media reported on Saturday.  
Chris Kyle and another man were found dead at Rough Creek Lodge, an upscale hunting lodge in northern Texas, on Saturday afternoon, according to local TV channel ABC13. Investigators have not

released any details of the shooting.  
Kyle, 38, was a former Navy SEAL and served four tours of duty in Iraq. In January 2012, Kyle’s best-selling autobiography “American Sniper” was released. A native Texan, Kyle claimed to have recorded the most career sniper kills in US military history, according to reports.—Xinhua

The United States will now need a victory from John Isner or Sam Querrey in Sunday’s reverse singles if they are to avoid the upset to Brazil, who are back playing in the world group for the first time in nine years.

Needing a win to extend the tie, Melo and Soares, who had lost only once in five ties, came out and took the opening set in a tie-break 8-6 but Bryans answered right back taking the second also in a tie-break 9-7.—Reuters

**Bayern extends lead on top of German Bundesliga**

BERLIN, 3 Feb—Unstoppable Bayern Munich continue their triumphal march as they cruised to a 3-0 win over Mainz whereas Bayern’s midfield bottom side Greuther Furth flabbergasted Schalke 2-1 to wrap a last gasp win at the 20th round of Bundesliga on Saturday. Bayern Munich consolidate their title ambitions as they increased their point account to 51 points with great help of Mario Mandzukic who donated a brace within seven minutes.

The hosts utilized a cleverly devised strategy, during the first half, when they isolated Bayern’s midfield Bastian Schweinsteiger and Javi Martinez. Thus Bayern did not manage to produce opportunities meanwhile Mainz came close twice through Shawn Parker. With four minutes remaining



in the first half, Bayern midfielder Thomas Mueller rounded Mainz goalkeeper Christian Wetklo to break the deadlock out of the blue following a pass into path by Toni Kroos.

Mainz situation worsened at the 50th minute, as Mario Mandzukic exploited a David Alaba pass into the box, to double the lead, and to score his 12th goal of the season. Mandzukic was not done with the scoring and so he made it three on scoreboards, seven minutes later, following a combination via Philipp Lahm to destroy Mainz hopes of a comeback.

NEW ORLEANS, 3 Feb— Minnesota Vikings running back Adrian Peterson carried off two top awards, including Most Valuable Player honors, at the National Football League awards show on Saturday. Peterson, who overcame a career-threatening injury to lead the Vikings into the playoffs, was also named Offensive Player of the Year after

coming within nine yards of setting a single season NFL rushing record.  
While pleased to have won recognition for his performance, Peterson told reporters he was disappointed to have fallen short of his ultimate goal. “I was definitely hoping to get to the Super Bowl. That was my goal,” said the 27-year-old Peterson, whose 2011 season ended when he tore ligaments in his knee. “Come back, lead my team and help my team get to the Super Bowl. “Unfortunately, that didn’t happen. But I played my heart out every opportunity I had ... (and) I got a couple of good pieces of hardware to bring back and stack in my statue area. “So it feels good.”  
The Houston Texans’ J J Watt won the Defensive Player of the Year award.

“I can get a lot better, I’m only 23,” Watt said. “I’m still growing as a human being, and as a person and as a player.” Denver Broncos quarterback Peyton Manning denied Peterson a clean sweep of awards available to him by winning Comeback Player of the Year honors. Former Indianapolis Colts leader Manning missed the entire 2011 season after undergoing a series of neck surgeries and returned to the field with the Broncos, leading them to the playoffs as top seed in the American Football Conference.  
“I really did not know what to expect,” Manning said about his return. “I had the double variables of coming off an injury, not playing for a year and joining a new team, a new system, new team mates.

**Parcells, six others make Pro Football Hall of Fame**

NEW ORLEANS, 3 Feb— Former Super Bowl winning head coach Bill Parcells was among seven men voted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame on Saturday. Parcells was joined by six former players, including three first-time nominees, to be inducted into the Hall of Fame, the greatest individual honour in the sport. Offensive linemen Larry Allen and Jonathan Ogden and defensive tackle Warren Sapp all were elected in their first year of being nominated while wide receiver Cris Carter, defensive tackle Curley Culp and linebacker Dave Robinson were voted in after missing out previously.

to reach their decision and spent an hour alone debating whether to include Parcells, who led the New York Giants to two Super Bowl titles in a 19-year coaching career where he coached four teams, all to the playoffs.

“This is long overdue,” Giants co-owner John Mara said in a statement. “He’s one of the best coaches in NFL history. He turned our franchise around. We went through a long period in the 1960s and 70s when we were a laughing stock.—Reuters
