Lawka Nanda wildlife sanctuary is situated on the area of 0.18 mile in Nyaung U Township and it was established in 1995. It offers visitors opportunities in wide variety to observe cultural heritages of central Myanmar and natural forests, extinct species of birds and other animals including golden deer and startortoises, to conduct surveys and researches on the wildlife and to enjoy relaxation and recreation.

Minsontaung wildlife sanctuary is situated in Natogyi Township and it has a total area of 8.71 square miles. It was established in 2001 and reestablished in 2012. It possesses dry deciduous forest ecosystem and extinct animals are protected there.

Maha Myat Muni Buddha Image, Mandalay Hill and Kyaukdawgyi pagoda, Kuthodaw Pagoda, Sandamuni Pagoda, Yankin Hill, Yaytagun Hill, Taungpyone, Yadana cave, Shwesaryan pagoda, Taungtaman lake and U Pein bridge are included in Mandalay Palace are included in places of interest in Mandalay.

Ecuador's Correa vows to make socialist revolution 'irreversible'

QUITO, 21 Feb — Ecuadorian President Rafael Correa said his party likely won three-quarters of the seats in Congress in last weekend's election and vowed on Wednesday to "steamroll" through reforms that will make his socialist model irreversible.

The 49-year-old economist was re-elected on Sunday with 57 percent of votes, some 34 percentage points more than the runner-up. During his six years in office he has won broad support with high spending on infrastructure and social welfare.

Results are still being compiled, but Correa said the ruling Alianza Pais party probably won about 73 percent of Congress' 137 seats. That means he will be able to push through reforms, although he said he would respect different political opinions.

"This is going to be a legislative steamroller to serve the interests of the

Ecuadorian people. ... In democracy, the winners rule, but the losers have to be respected," he told foreign reporters at the presidential palace.

"We're overwhelmed with the amount of support from people. ... We're going to deepen the citizen's revolution, build a new homeland and make it irreversible."

Final results from Sunday's congressional and presidential votes are expected to be published in the coming days.

Correa first took office in 2007 vowing to increase revenue from the OPEC nation's oil resources and cut debt obligations to fund spending on roads, hospitals and schools.

He also promised to press ahead with socialist reforms to empower the low-income majority and dismantle what he called an elitist system that controlled the state and neglected the poor.

He is also expected to pass a new mining law to ease investment terms that could pave the way for the development of some large and mid-sized projects that would let Ecuador diversify its economy away from a dependence on oil exports.

Correa said he did not want to play a leading role in the ALBA alliance of leftist Latin American presidents at a time when

the bloc's figurehead, Venezuelan President Hugo Chavez, has been silenced by his battle with cancer.

"No one is looking for anything for themselves," he said, referring to other leftist presidents in the region including Bolivia's Evo Morales. "We want to help people and if I can help by being Hugo's chauffeur, that's what I'll do," he said.

China to develop closer relations with Mexico

MEXICO CITY, 21 Feb — China attaches great importance to the development of a strategic partnership with Mexico, a senior official of the Communist Party of China (CPC) said here on Wednesday.

Qiang Wei, member of the CPC Central Committee and secretary of the CPC Qinghai Provincial Committee, made the remarks during a meeting with Francisco Arroyo Vieyra, President of the Chamber of Deputies of Mexico.

Bilateral ties have achieved considerable progress since China and Mexico established diplomatic relations more than 40 years ago, Qiang said, adding that this year also marks the 10th anniversary of the two countries' strategic partnership.

China is ready to work with Mexico to enrich their strategic partnership to promote the sustained and stable development of mutually beneficial cooperation between the two countries, he said.

Arroyo Vieyra said Mexico has consistently adhered to the one-China policy and respected China's political system and development path, stressing that the two sides

Afghan forces kill 14 Taliban including group commander

KABUL, 21 Feb — Afghan forces targeted Taliban hideouts and killed 14 militants including a group commander in the eastern Laghman Province 90 km east of the Afghan capital the Kabul city on Wednesday, Interior Ministry said.

"The security forces involving police and army targeted Taliban rebels in Gularam and Katasng villages outside provincial capital Mehterlam today during which 14 armed

militants including their commander Qari Almas have been killed," the statement asserted.

Qari Almas was involved in organizing anti-government activities in Mehterlam city and adjoining areas, the statement said, adding Almas elimination is major setback to the militants operating in Laghman Province. Taliban militants have yet to make comment.

EU executive gets national budget vetting powers

BRUSSELS, 21 Feb — The European Commission will check euro zone countries' draft budgets to verify if they are in line with EU rules and will ask for changes if they are not, under a deal struck on Wednesday with the European Parliament.

After months of wrangling, EU lawmakers backed the new powers for the Commission, the EU executive, to further strengthen euro zone budget discipline and prevent another sovereign debt crisis.

The new law, called in EU jargon the "two-pack", complements the existing budget rules, tightened at the end of 2011 through the introduction of swifter financial sanctions for those breaking deficit and debt limits.

It gives the Commission an extra level of oversight on member countries' budgets. Governments of course are free to ignore the commission's recommendations but risk EU legal action by doing so. "These new laws are a key element in building stronger economic governance for the euro area and boosting the EU's armor against further economic crises," European Parliament President Martin Schulz said.

Wednesday's deal is expected to become law in March and will oblige euro zone governments to send draft budgets for the following year, based on independent economic forecasts, to the Commission before 15 October for verification.

"This will mean that

the euro area can benefit from a more integrated and effective policy-setting framework already for the 2014 budgetary cycle," the EU Economic and Monetary Affairs Commissioner Olli Rehn said after the deal was reached.

Euro zone countries already agree, in a process that takes up the first six months of the year, on where their fiscal policy should be heading the following year. The Commission makes suggestions that must be approved by governments.

The additional step of vetting draft national budgets in October before they are submitted to national parliaments for approval is meant to catch any divergences from what governments themselves had already agreed to earlier.

The new law will allow the Commission to put a country that is "threatened with financial difficulties" under strict surveillance. That means the government would be under an obligation to deal with the problems that led to the difficulties and entail quarterly reviews of its progress.

The agreement ends a long deadlock between the parliament and the Commission over the new legislation.

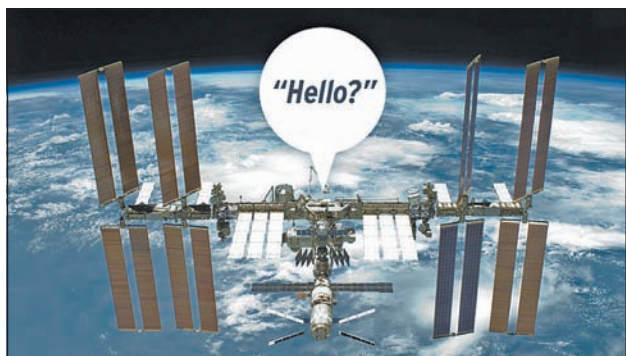

NASA loses regular communication with ISS



WASHINGTON, 21 Feb — The US space agency NASA announced on Tuesday that flight controllers lost regular communication with the *International Space Station (ISS)* in the morning, but the station was fine and the crew was doing well.

According to an alert from NASA, Houston's Mission Control was updating software of the space

station's onboard flight computers at 8:45 am EDT (1245 GMT) when one of the station's data relay systems malfunctioned. Although a backup computer took over critical station functions from the primary computer, the station lost all communication, voice and command from Houston. About an hour later, while flying over Russia, station commander Kevin

Ford was able to briefly radio Moscow that everyone was well and they were working on the problem.

"This is the same way they used to do it in the 1960s, with *Gemini* and *Apollo*," NASA spokesman Josh Byerly said. "The crew is working on this, and they'll get it back up and running." The *ISS*, which is carrying one American astronaut and two Russian cosmonauts, does not appear to be in danger. "It's not a panicked mood that takes over mission control," Byerly said. "Anybody who's been here has seen that." Byerly said the problem should be fixed later on Tuesday. Until then, astronauts can talk with Moscow control for a few minutes every 90 minutes.—Xinhua

Cloud computing chance and challenge for big firms

DUBAI, 21 Feb — Zaki Sabbagh, chief information officer (CIO) of Saudi Arabia's Zamil Industrial Investment Company, said here on Tuesday that cloud computing enables small and medium enterprises (SMEs) to operate like big players.

Speaking at the two-day Middle East CIO summit organized by global information technology (IT) research firm IDC, Sabbagh said Zamil Industrial Investment, as one of the largest Saudi industry conglomerates, started to implement cloud computing three years ago and the firm needed another three years to complete the implementation. Zamil Industrial Investment is a stock-listed blue chip firm and employs

8,500 people in 55 countries.

Besides the time challenge, Sabbagh added that it will be crucial for big firms to deliver better services and increase the unique selling proposition "because SMEs can provide the same IT-based services thanks to cloud computing and they need much less time for implementation in order to jump on the cloud wagon than a big market participant." Cloud computing describes the use of hardware and software resources through a network, mostly the internet.

Its advantages are increased economies of scale due to shared resources from many network participants. End-users can access cloud-based services

through mobile and smart phone applications.

Whilst most companies do not have to hire new IT staff because cloud computing is mostly based on web-driven solutions, "a key challenge is to involve the entire company into the cloud computing scheme."

Australian landscape soaked up one third of carbon emitted in 20 years

CANBERRA, 21 Feb — Australian landscape soaked up one third of the carbon emitted by fossil fuels in Australia over the past twenty years, a latest study from Australia's top science institution CSIRO found recently.

The 3-year study, the Australian Terrestrial Carbon Budget, published this month in the journal *Biogeosciences* and outlined on Wednesday at the Terrestrial Ecosystem Research Network symposium, Canberra. According to the

findings, Australia exported 2.5 times more carbon in fossil fuels in 2009-2010 than was emitted from fossil fuels burned within Australia.

In the study, scientists quantified how much land carbon is lost or gained through plant and soil "breathing" in response to variable climate and rising carbon dioxide. Effects of fires, erosion and deforestation were also considered. All these processes together with fossil fuel emissions are critical to domestic



carbon management and international reporting protocols." For Australia as a whole, increased carbon dioxide has caused a 15 percent increase in plant production over the last two decades, relative to pre-industrial times," Lead author Dr Vanessa Haverd said.

The study data will help the understanding of

how carbon stored in the Australian landscape responds to climate variability—the swings between drought and flood. "It is important to know that carbon stored in the land during periods of high plant growth may disappear again during the next drought." "Understanding any trends and changes in fire regime or intensity, particularly in the savanna fires of Northern Australia, is important for quantifying the impact of fire on the net carbon balance," she said.

Yahoo co-founder Jerry Yang joins Lenovo board as observer

HONG KONG, 21 Feb — Lenovo Group said Yahoo! co-founder Jerry Yang is to join its board as an observer, as the world's No 2 maker of PCs expands its mobile business to tap global demand for smartphones and tablets.

Yang, who co-founded Yahoo! in April 1995 and served as chief executive from June 2007 to January 2009, will not be able to vote or have any of the other rights of a director, Le-

novo said on Wednesday.

The Hong Kong-listed company will pay Yang \$61,875 per year and offer equity rights with a value of \$135,000 in return for attending board meetings and providing views.

Yang, 44, resigned from Yahoo's board last year when he also stepped down from the boards of Alibaba Group Holding and Yahoo! Japan.

Lenovo, the second-biggest smartphone vendor in China, is stepping up its expansion in the business. In its October-to-December third quarter, Lenovo shipped 9.4 million phones, including 9 million smartphones, mainly in China where its smartphone business was profitable for the first time.

Sony set to make pre-emptive strike on Microsoft with PS4

TOKYO, 21 Feb — Sony Corp is expected to showcase a new PlayStation console on Wednesday in a pre-emptive strike against Microsoft Corp's bid to make its Xbox the world's leading hub for household entertainment.

The rare PlayStation event in New York comes

amid industry speculation that Microsoft is set to unveil the successor to its Xbox 360, which beats the seven-year-old PlayStation 3's online network with features such as voice commands on interactive gaming and superior connectivity to smartphones and tablets. "Their focus is on establish-

ing a beachhead for the next generation of consoles, and that's what 20 February is all about," said PJ McNealy, CEO and founder of Digital World Research. "The reality is they have been playing catch-up."

Pushing ahead of Microsoft's Xbox and Nintendo Co Ltd's new Wii U could help Sony revive an electronics business hurt by a dearth of hit gadgets, a collapse in TV sales and the convergence of consumer interest around tablets and smartphones built by rivals Apple Inc and Samsung Electronics Co Ltd. Tablets and smartphones already account for around 10 percent of the \$80 billion gaming market. Those mobile devices, analysts predict, will within a few years be as powerful as the current slew of game-only consoles.

US researchers discover biological marker of dyslexia

WASHINGTON, 21 Feb — US researchers have found a biological mechanism that appears to play an important role in dyslexia, a constellation of impairments unrelated to intelligence, hearing or vision that make learning to read a struggle, according to a study to be published on Wednesday in *The Journal of Neuroscience*.

Recording the automatic brain wave responses of 100 school-aged children to speech sounds, the Northwestern University researchers found that the very best readers encoded the sound most consistently

while the poorest readers encoded it with the greatest inconsistency. Presumably, the brain's response to sound stabilizes when children learn to successfully connect sounds with their meanings.

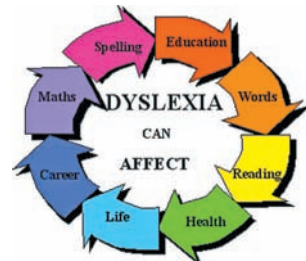
The researchers said that the results suggest that good readers profit from a stable neural representation of sound, and that children with inconsistent neural responses are likely at a disadvantage when learning to read.

According to the researchers, the good news is that response consistency can be improved with

auditory training.

Decades of research from laboratories worldwide have shown that reading ability is associated with auditory skills, including auditory memory and attention, the ability to rhyme sounds and the ability to categorize rapidly occurring sounds.

Boeing engineers split on contract, talks to resume

SEATTLE, 21 Feb — The largest group of engineers working at Boeing Co approved the planemaker's latest contract offer in a vote on Tuesday, likely paving the way for a full agreement as Boeing attempts to focus its resources on fixing battery problems on its 787 Dreamliner. However, members of the union representing about 23,000 engineers also authorized it to call a strike, giving the union some leverage as parties head back toward negotiations.

According to the Seattle-based Society of Professional Engineering Employees in Aerospace (SPEEA), its "professional" members — who perform the main engineering duties

on Boeing planes — voted narrowly in favour of accepting the contract, while a smaller group of "technical" members — who support the engineers — voted to reject it. Both groups voted in favour of authorizing the union to call a strike.

The groups negotiate together, but their contracts are separate. The partial resolution of the drawn-out labour talks is a chink of light for Boeing, which is struggling to get to the bottom of battery malfunctions on its 787 and needs engineers in its factories to carry out its planned production ramp-up. "There are pathways to a negotiated agreement available," said Ray Goforth, executive director

of SPEEA, in a statement.

"With this second rejection by technical workers of Boeing takeaways, it's time for the company to stop wasting resources and improve its offer to reflect the value and contributions technical workers bring to Boeing. That way, we can avoid a strike and focus on fixing the problems of the 787 and restoring customer confidence in Boeing." Boeing welcomed the professional members'

acceptance, but said it was "deeply disappointed" that technical employees rejected the offer and authorized a strike.

"Our goal throughout this entire process was to make sure SPEEA-represented employees were rewarded for the contributions they bring to this company every single day," said Ray Conner, head of Boeing's commercial airplanes unit.

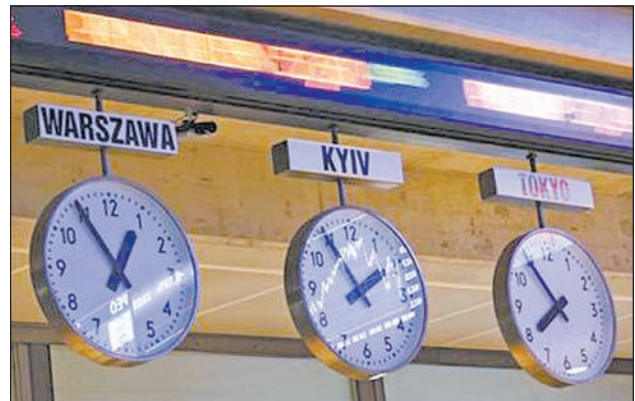

Yahoo takes cue from Facebook in website revamp

NEW YORK, 21 Feb — Yahoo Inc is rolling out a revamped look for its website aimed at making the Web portal more modern and attractive to users.

"We wanted it to be familiar but also wanted it to embrace some of the modern paradigms of the Web," Chief Executive Marissa Mayer said on NBC's "Today" show on Wednesday.

"One thing that I really like is this very personalized newsfeed, it's infinite and you can go on scrolling forever," she said. In a blog

post, Mayer said the company will begin introducing the changes over the next few days, with more changes and improvements expected in the coming months. The endless newsfeed containing stories, pictures or video is similar to feeds on Facebook Inc as well as Twitter.

Mayer also said in her blog that the website would feature newly designed applications, allow users to log in with their Yahoo or Facebook IDs and would work well on smartphones and tablets. Yahoo is one of the world's most-

visited online properties, but revenue has declined in recent years amid competition from Google and Facebook. Yahoo has also been beset by internal turmoil that has resulted in a revolving door of CEOs.

Mayer, 37, took over after a tumultuous period at Yahoo in which former CEO Scott Thompson resigned after less than six months on the job over a controversy about his academic credentials, and during which Yahoo co-founder Jerry Yang resigned from the board and cut his ties with the company.—Reuters

ICE, NYSE closer to combination

NEW YORK, 21 Feb — Leading commodity exchange operator IntercontinentalExchange (ICE) has made through a regulatory barrier to acquire NYSE Euronext. The two companies on Tuesday announced the expiration of the waiting period under the Hart-Scott-Rodino (HSR) Antitrust Improvements Act in connection with the proposed combination of the two companies.

Expiration of the HSR waiting period satisfies one of the regulatory requirements for completion of the merger. The waiting period expired

ICE announced the proposed acquisition of NYSE Euronext on 20 December to create a global exchange operator across diversified markets including both stocks and financial derivatives. The value agreed by the two companies was around 8.2 billion dollars.

The proposal raised an immediate question whether it can be approved by US and European regulators, as similar merger proposals among exchanges had been declined before, but analysts generally believe the deal of ICE and NYSE

China seeks extra testing of US pork for feed additive

CHICAGO, 21 Feb — China wants a third party to verify beginning on 1 March that US pork shipped to the country is free of a feed additive used to promote lean muscle growth, a US Meat Export

meat and the third-largest market for US pork, baffled analysts since Beijing has not recently reported finding ractopamine in any pork from the United States. The step does, however, come on the heels of Russia

that China's requirement for third-party testing could hurt US pork exports to the Chinese mainland and Hong Kong, valued at \$886 million last year. "We have just been notified (by US suppliers) and are checking details with the quarantine authorities," said a trader with a large state-owned pork importer in China. Beijing maintains that there are serious concerns about ractopamine, despite scientific evidence that it is safe. The United Nations has agreed on acceptable levels.

Federation spokesman told Reuters. The reasons for China's timing and motives for additional verification on the ractopamine additive were unclear, but stirred speculation ranging from a political agenda to protection of that country's pork industry.

barring imports of US meat worth \$550 million a year due to the same feed additive. Officials from the China's quarantine bureau, which oversees the safety of food imports, declined to make immediate comment, while a spokesman said the country's commerce ministry was unaware of the move.

Steve Meyer, president of Iowa-based Paragon Economics, said: "My guess is they are trying to protect the domestic industry. They are trying to throw up roadblocks. That is always a possibility when you are dealing with Russia and China." He said that any move by China to ban pork imports from the United States would benefit exporters such as Canada, Brazil and the European Union. — Reuters

Egypt adopts new tactic in curbing Gaza tunnels

GAZA, 21 Feb—The tunnels area on Gaza's southern border with Egypt was lively and busy with trucks mostly loaded with construction materials and food making their way through the unpaved roads out.

But smugglers said Egyptian security forces have started closing some tunnels with new tactic: flooding them with waste water, noting that dozens of underground passages were flooded with sewage water, causing severe damage that takes weeks to be repaired.

Ahmed Barhoum, a resident of the Rafah border town, noted that the Egyptian crackdown focused on the neighbourhoods of al-Salam and al-Barazil, to the west of Rafah crossing point.

The Egyptian army and security forces flooded the tunnels with waste water last week, according to the residents and tunnels owners who live near the borders.

Abu el-Bara'a, 41, who owns a tunnel used to bring in cement and gravel, said his tunnel was swamped with sewage water, but he did not give up. "From our side, we used our own pumps to get the waste and sewage water out," he said.

"If Egypt and Israel destroy the tunnels, we will dig more new tunnels," he said.

Asking about the easing of the Israeli blockade, the smuggler said they are insufficient. "We won't stop until Israel and Egypt lift the siege completely," he said.—Xinhua

Ukraine to resume gas imports from Turkmenistan in 2013

KIEV, 21 Feb—Ukraine plans to resume imports of natural gas from Turkmenistan to ease a dependence on expensive Russian supply, a senior Ukraine official said on Wednesday.

"We want to restart natural gas deliveries from Turkmenistan this year," Energy and Coal Industry Minister Eduard Stavvsky told a Press conference.

Ukraine plans to buy some 10 billion cubic meters of gas from Turkmenistan in 2013, Stavvsky said.

Turkmenistan supplied Ukraine with around 36 billion cubic meters of gas annually until 2006 when Ukraine switched over to Russian gas.

Currently, Kiev is seeking to slash gas imports from its northern neighbour, an intention that Moscow said violates their energy deal signed in 2009.

Under their contract, Ukraine agreed to buy 52 billion cubic metres of gas per year or pay for a minimum of 80 percent of that volume, regardless of the actual amount taken.

Kiev, which currently pays 432 US dollars per 1,000 cubic meters of gas, is reported to have imported 24.9 billion cubic meters from Russia last year.

Russia on 25 January demanded that Ukraine pay 7 billion dollars for failing to import the contracted amount of gas.—Xinhua

France calls on nationals to immediately quit northern Cameroon

PARIS, 21 Feb—French Foreign Ministry on Wednesday urged French nationals to leave northern Cameroon area where seven French tourists have been kidnapped a day before "as soon as possible."

"It's essential that French nationals who are currently in the far north of Cameroon to move to a safe place and leave the area as soon as possible," the ministry said.

The Quai d'Orsay also recommended French tourists to avoid northern parts of Cameroon near the Nigerian border until further notice.

On Tuesday, seven French expatriates including four children were abducted by a group of armed men on motorbikes near the Waza national park and Lake Chad where Westerners used to visit during holidays.

French President Francois Hollande said the French captives were held by a Nigerian-based "terrorist group" known to French authorities and the militant organization had taken the hostages towards Nigeria. French Foreign Minister Laurent Fabius, meanwhile, pointed the finger to the Islamist group Boko Haram to be behind Cameroon hostage taking.

Australia to expand ties with Laos

VIENTIANE, 21 Feb—Australia's Foreign Minister Bob Carr wrapped up meetings with senior Lao ministers in Laos' capital city of Vientiane on Wednesday, agreeing to deeper economic and political ties between the two countries.

During his four-day stay he met with his Lao counterpart Thongloun Sisalouth. After their talks, Sisalouth told a Press conference that both sides had discussed a broad range of issues and their extended cooperation and good relations were highly valued, according to state-run news-

paper *Vientiane Times*. The Australian delegation said they were pleased to continue their support of Laos' education, sustainable growth in trade and investment, rural development, clearance of unexploded ordinance (UXO), and infrastructure development in rural communities.

Laos, one of South East Asia's least developed nations, is expected to receive just under 50 million US dollars in aid from Australia over 2012-2013.

On Wednesday Carr also announced that Australia would provide around 5.5 million US dollars to

support UXO clearance efforts, as well as mine risk education, and survivor assistance.

This additional aid is expected to help in the clearance of around 2500 hectares of land which could then be used for agriculture and transportation.

Carr also announced a second Trade Development Facility for Laos, which would be designed to streamline trade regulatory frameworks, stimulate investment and create jobs. This would come as part of a wider plan to stimulate further engagement from the Australian business sec-

tor in Laos. After the meetings Bob Carr said, "this new round of Australian funding for the Trade Development Facility (TDF) is expected to halve the time taken to clear exports and imports through customs and halve the number of days taken to get an import licence," according to an AUSAID Press release.

Carr and Sisoulith also discussed Australia's priorities as a member of the UN Security Council, Laos' accession to the World Trade Organization, and Australia's aid contributions to Laos.

The MP said the number of vehicles would be doubled in 2015 with 13 cars in each 10,000 citizens, pointing out the need of more fuel supply.

The deputy minister said the ministry is seeking alternative energy sources to satisfy the growing demand.

The country's current energy demand per day is barrels of oil equivalent to 60,000 barrels of crude oil and about 500-600 cubic feet of natural gas, he added.

No plan to build nuclear power plant: Dy EP Minister

NAY PYI TAW, 21 Feb—Seven representatives held discussions on the proposal on urging the Union government to implement power generation from atomic energy in Myanmar as the country is not only a ASEAN member country as well as IAEA member, which is submitted by Dr Myint Kyi of Yangon Region Constituency No.8, at the 18th day session of Amyotha Hluttaw.

"Japan and the Republic of Korea have reached the developed countries status thanks to power generation from nuclear power plants. Myanmar should have at least one nuclear power plant

by taking the examples of other countries," said U Win Naung of Yangon Region Constituency No.5.

U Hla Swe of Magway Region Constituency No.12 pointed out that Myanmar should build a nuclear power plant so as to have static electric power and to keep abreast of neighbouring countries. In the long run, it has cost-effectiveness. And it should be implemented as quickly as possible.

Deputy Minister for Electric Power U Aung Than Oosaid that although Myanmar has hydropower, wind power and other renewable energy sources, building up a

industrialized country might face difficulties in fulfilling high power demand in the long-run. Preliminary study should be conducted for construction of nuclear power plant although there is no plan to build a nuclear power plant at present. That proposal was rejected with 29 "Yes" votes and 110 "No" votes. "It is not right time to carry out power generation from atomic energy. Priority should be given to establishment of industries and businesses and creation of job opportunities as it can cost a lot. Research on renewable energy and other energy sources should be conducted," said U Tin

Maung Win of Mandalay Region Constituency No.3.

Dr Myint Kyi said that he submitted that proposal assuming that it can contribute much towards political and economic development of the country.

With regard to the question of U Saw Taw Pa Lae of Kayin State Constituency No.7 on Thaukyaykhat (1) hydro-power project, Deputy Minister for Electric Power U Myint Zaw replied that the ministry has no plan to implement Thaukyaykhat (1) hydro-power project at present. The meeting continues at 10 am tomorrow.

NLM: Why the opium yield survey is important?

Based on this data, we will find better ways to combat and eradicate the problem. CCDAC cannot do the job alone. Demand reduction in other countries is also required. And there must be the cooperation of our people.

NLM: Any more

information for the readers?

MT: We had already conducted joint opium yield surveys for ten times with the US. Anyhow, the work was suspended after 2004. Now we have resumed the work. We hope we will have more such cooperation in the future.

NLM: As a MOFA official what is your message for the people?

HL: As our minister stated in his speech, the resumption of the bilateral cooperation with US is an encouraging sign. This anti-drug cooperation will lead to broader relations and deeper friendship between the two countries. This is my belief.

Brazil, Russia enhance ties in defence, agriculture

BRASILIA, 21 Feb — Brazil and Russia agreed on Wednesday to negotiate the purchase of Russia's anti-aircraft defence systems, jointly develop defence products and transfer technology to Brazilian defence companies without restrictions. The agreement was reached during the talks between Brazilian President Dilma Rousseff and visiting Russian Prime Minister Dmitri Medvedev, who arrived in Brazil on Wednesday for a three-day visit.

Brazil is interesting in buying Russia's medium-range surface-to-air *Pantsir S1* combined missile and artillery batteries and *Igla-S* shoulder-held missiles, in part to beef up security during the World Cup soccer tournament next year and the 2016 Olympic Games. Contract negotiations are expected to begin in March.

The two countries have sought to deepen defence cooperation since they signed a Strategic Partnership Action Plan in December during Rousseff's visit to Moscow. Under the document, Brazil and Rus-

sia will strengthen cooperation in defence industry and training while setting up partnership for the purchase of defence systems.

During their talks on Wednesday, the two leaders also agreed to exchange information on organizing major sporting events. Russia is to host 2014 Winter Olympics and the World Cup in 2018.

In addition, Russia agreed to collaborate with Brazil's "Science Without Borders" scholarship programme by opening slots in graduate and post-graduate courses for Brazilian students in Russia.

On agriculture, the two countries sealed two agreements to eliminate trade barriers for Brazil to sell soy bran for animal feed in Russia and establish phytosanitary measures for Russian wheat exports to Brazil.

During their talks, Medvedev and Rousseff also discussed the ongoing global financial crisis and the political unrest in Syria, according to official sources from the Brazilian presidency.—Xinhua

Twelve European foreign ministers meet in Poland on cooperation

WARSAW, 21 Feb — Twelve foreign ministers of the Visegrad Group countries, the Baltic States and the Nordic countries met in Gdansk (North Poland), the Polish foreign ministry said in a Press release on Wednesday.

According to local media reports, the meeting was to combat the economic crisis and ways of making Europe more competitive in the world and the Eastern Partnership agenda.

The Wednesday meeting in Gdansk was attended by foreign ministers of the Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, Hungary, Iceland, Latvia, Lithuania, Norway, Poland, Slovakia, and Sweden.

BEIJING, 21 Feb — Beijing is planning to further develop its public transportation network, and 46 percent of residents are expected to travel by subway and bus this year, authorities said. In 2012, more than 20 million daily journeys were made by public transport in the capital, and 44 percent of commuters used public transportation, according to the Beijing Commission of Transport.

The proportion was the highest in the country in 2012, and it is expected to reach 50 percent in 2015, *Beijing Daily* reported on 5 December. However, during bad weather and holidays, Beijing's traffic system often experiences delays.

The traffic congestion index within the Fifth Ring Road, Beijing's main urban area, will not rise above 5 in 2013, the commission said on Wednesday in a statement. The index, introduced in 2007, indicates the general traffic situation with a number from 0 to 10, with

said they are a very diverse group of countries but they have common interests.

Sikorski said that the year 2013 may prove to be groundbreaking for the Partnership. He hopes that they will sign an association agreement with Ukraine and possibly end

negotiations of agreements with three other Partnership countries Moldova, Azerbaijan and Armenia.

The Eastern Partnership programme embraces Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, Moldova and Ukraine.

Sweden's Foreign Minister Bildt assessed that the implementation of the Eastern partnership is difficult due to the diversity of the states covered by the programme.

They will help those countries to modernize their economies. Under the certain conditions—the countries involved must be governed by rule of law, open to the world and follow values observed in the EU.

10 indicating the heaviest traffic. On 28 December, snow caused heavy traffic on city roads in the late afternoon, and by 6 pm the traffic index within the Fifth Ring Road reached 9.5. To ease traffic congestion, Beijing will develop a rapid public transport network of more than 600 km including subway lines and a bus system, the commission said.

Tong Lihong, a manager at Beijing MTR Construction Administration Corp, said on Wednesday that at the end of 2013, extensions of lines 8 and 14 and a connection line between Line 8 and Changping Line will be opened.

Construction of the last two stations of Line 10 is scheduled to be completed in May, making it Beijing's second subway loop line and the longest in the city, Tong said.

According to Beijing Commission of Transport, the capital now has 442 km of subway lines, the longest in China. By the end of

2013, the length will reach 465 km. To make public transportation more attractive, Beijing will continue to develop park-and-ride lots, with up to 10,000 spaces for vehicles.

According to the plan, the parking lots will be mainly located around subway stations in the rural-

Texas college evacuated over bomb threat

HOUSTON, 21 Feb — A college in the US state of Texas issued a Code Maroon alert and closed a stadium and adjacent facilities on Wednesday after receiving a bomb threat. Texas A&M University at College Station, Texas, said on its website on Wednesday that university authorities were notified about 10:50 am that a threat was “written on a wall of a non-academic facility on campus.”

“An investigation was launched immediately, and a Code Maroon emergency message was subsequently issued,” the university said.

Approximately 700 people were evacuated from Kyle Field, Reed Building, G Rollie White, Neetum Steed, and the Bright Athletics complex, and those evacuated buildings will “remain closed the rest of the day,” it said.

Texas A&M authorities continue to investigate the incident, and federal agencies have been contacted to aid in the on-going investigation, the school said. Code Maroon is the university's emergency notification system, which uses multiple methods of contacting students, faculty and the community.—Xinhua

China's top microblog site boasts 500 mln users

BEIJING, 21 Feb— Sina Weibo, the Chinese equivalent of Twitter, had attracted over 500 million users by the end of 2012, a year-on-year increase of 74 percent, Sina Corp announced on Wednesday.

Sina Weibo's active daily users have exceeded 46.2 million, the company said.

The site's revenues totaled 66 million US dollars in 2012, of which 23 percent came from surging income from value-added services.

The other 77 percent came from advertising, the revenues of which exceed-

ed 50 million US dollars.

The company plans to further improve its user experience and expand its services while veering its focus to mobile Internet, said Cao Guowei, CEO and president of Sina.

Some 75 percent of Sina Weibo's active users log in using mobile devices.

Sina also issued financial reports for the last quarter and full fiscal year of 2012 on Wednesday, showing that its net revenues hit 529.3 million US dollars with a year-on-year increase of 10 percent.

Cambodia's listed water supplier records revenue up 25 pct last year

PHNOM PENH, 21 Feb— The listed Phnom Penh Water Supply Authority (PPWSA) earned total revenues of 36.9 million US dollars in 2012, up 25 percent year-on-year, according to the firm's unaudited financial statement on Wednesday.

The report said that the firm's net income after tax was 8.56 million US dollars last year, a 39 percent rise from 6.16 million US dollars in a year earlier.

Speaking during the 1st annual meeting of the PPWSA on Wednesday, the firm's chairman Meng

Saktheara said the remarkable growth in revenue was attributed to good management and increase in water supply to customers. The firm predicted that it would make revenue of about 37.5 million US dollars in 2013. The PPWSA is a state-owned enterprise.—Xinhua

SKorea to raise natural gas prices by 4.4 pct

SEOUL, 21 Feb — South Korea planned to raise prices of natural gas used by households and industries by 4.4 percent on average this week as debts of the state-run gas supplier increased amid a hike in costs of materials, the economy ministry said on Wednesday.

Prices of natural gas for household heating and cooking will rise by 4.3 percent, while those for industrial purpose will be hiked by 4.6 percent, according to the Ministry of Knowledge Economy.

The hike will be effec-

tive from 22 February.

Korea Gas Corp (KOGAS), the state-run gas provider, was in a financial distress as the gas prices have been frozen since July 2012 to help stabilize consumer prices. KOGAS's debt-to-equity ratio increased to 397 percent last year from 348 percent a year before.

The ministry said the hike was made to reflect rising costs of materials and sustain financial healthiness of the gas supplier, forecasting that it will lift the monthly gas bill of each household by 1,127 won

(1.05 US dollar).

The Knowledge Economy Ministry approved a request from the state-run Korea Electric Power Corp (KEPCO) to hike electricity rates by an average 4 percent in early January. The move was estimated to lift the consumer price inflation by 0.04 percentage point and the producer price growth by 0.105 percentage point. The country's producer prices rebounded 0.2 percent in January from a month earlier after falling 0.3 percent in the prior month due to the hike in electricity prices.—Xinhua

Vietnam ranks 7th worldwide in overseas remittances last year

HANOI, 21 Feb— Vietnam ranks 7th in the world in overseas remittances in 2012 when the country received over 10 billion US dollars, reported local *Vietnam News* on Wednesday quoting sources from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

Since 1991, overseas remittances to Vietnam have contributed 60 percent to 70 percent of the country's foreign capital

inflows, which contributed to the national economic development, supported foreign exchange rate stability and increased foreign currency reserves, said the report.

According to the Vietnam State Commission for Overseas Vietnamese Affairs, the remittances were sent home by over 4 million Vietnamese people living in more than 100 countries and territories worldwide.

A large proportion of remittances came from 400,000 Vietnamese guest workers working mostly in Japan, South Korea, Malaysia, China's Taiwan, the Middle East, the United States and Europe.

Overseas remittances to Vietnam in 2012 hit a four-year record high, with an increase of over 10 percent year on year, reported the commission.

China to close over 5,000 non-coal mines in 2013

BEIJING, 21 Feb— China's safety watchdog said on Wednesday it will suspend or shut down operations in over 5,000 non-coal mines that do not meet safety standards this year.

The government will take steps to reduce accidents in non-coal mines and keep the death toll below 900 this year, according to a document released on Wednesday by the State Administration of Work Safety.

The administration said it will order mines to enhance safety measures, improve their emergency response mechanisms and build monitoring systems.

China's hundreds of thousands of non-coal mines, most of which are operated at a small scale with poor safety conditions, are major targets of work safety campaigns.

To further regulate the sector, the administration said it will work with related departments to create policies stipulating operating standards, including minimum operation scales.—Xinhua

Civilian casualties in Afghanistan drop for first time in six years

UNITED NATIONS, 21 Feb—Civilian casualties in Afghanistan's armed conflict decreased for the first time in six years, the United Nations said here on Tuesday, but attacks on women and children, and threats on perceived government supporters, are on the rise.

UN spokesman Martin Nesirky made the remarks at a daily news briefing here, citing the annual re-

port of the UN Assistance Mission in Afghanistan (UNAMA) on the protection of civilians in armed conflict.

The report, which was released on Tuesday, was compiled in coordination with the UN Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights (OHCHR).

"The report says that there was a 12 percent drop in civilian deaths last year,

compared with 2011," Nesirky said.

"The report says that the reduction in civilian casualties in 2012 was the result, among other things, of fewer civilian deaths and injuries from ground engagement among parties to the conflict, as well as a decline in suicide attacks and reduced numbers of aerial operations."

Bulgaria bombers not transit through Romania

BUCHAREST, 21 Feb—There are no elements or indications so far that the persons identified in the attack in Burgas, Bulgaria would have carried out preparatory activities in Romania, the Romanian Intelligence Service said on Tuesday.

The agency underlined

in a Press release that Romanian authorities have no legal means to act preventively in case of people who have no travel restrictions, or those who do not appear on the international lists with terrorism suspects and who transit Romania.

Bulgarian Interior Minister Tsvetan Tsvetanov

said in a recent interview that it is believed that three accused would have come to Romania from different parts of Europe and entered Bulgaria crossing on foot the border between Romania and Bulgaria a few days ahead of the anti-Israeli attack on 18 July, last year.

Horsemeat found in beef lasagna in Slovenia's supermarket

LJUBLJANA, 21 Feb—Slovenia has found horsemeat mixed up in beef lasagna sold in local supermarket, a senior government official told reporters here on Tuesday.

Following a recent horsemeat food contamination scandal in some European countries, Slovenian food security authorities have checked all products in different retailers that could potentially contain horsemeat.

Of all 29 products tested at the National Veterinary Institute, 28 tested negative for horsemeat, while one sample was found positive in the testing, said Jernej Drogenik, acting director general of the Food Safety, Veterinary and Plant Protection Administration.

The sample in question is a 450-gram beef lasagna, manufactured by Trada, a company in Luxembourg, distributed by Croatian company Ledo, and found in local retailer Interspar, according to the official.

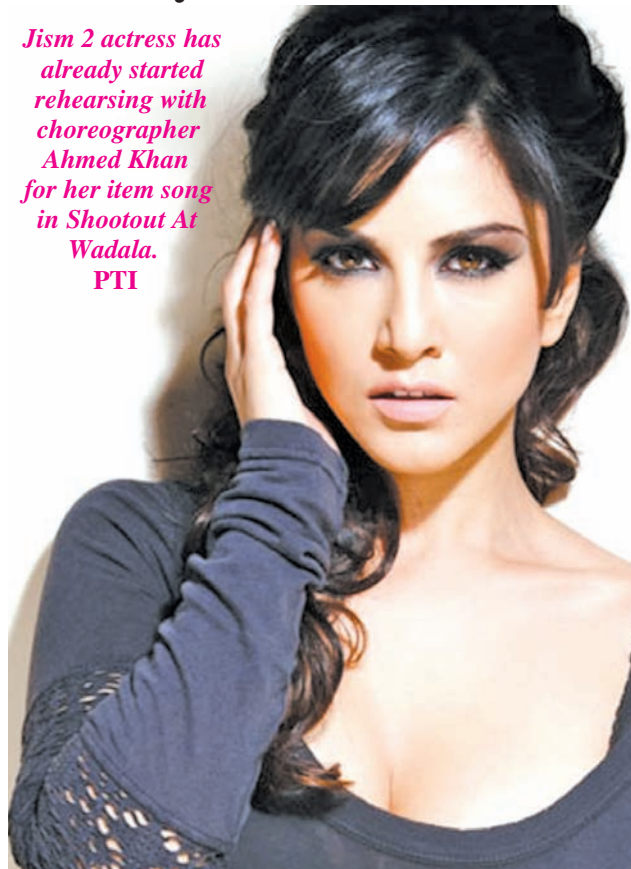
Further analyses are under way, he added.

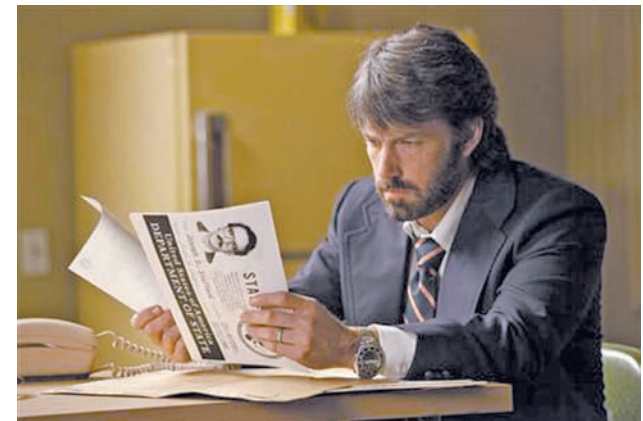
Oscars in Hollywood cliffhanger over Best Picture, Director

LOS ANGELES, 21 Feb — Sunday's Oscar ceremony is set for a cliffhanger ending after a topsy-turvy awards season that has left the two top prizes — Best Picture and Best Director — too close to call. With just days to go before the movie industry's highest honours are handed out on 24 February, awards watchers are keyed up for one of the most exciting nights in recent Academy Awards history. Despite entering the Oscar race with a leading 12 nominations in January, the front-runner Best Picture status of Steven Spielberg's presidential drama "Lincoln" has been undermined by a slew of awards picked up Ben Affleck's Iran hostage thriller "Argo." But an "Argo" win despite Affleck's omission from the Best Director shortlist would defy the conventional wisdom that says the Oscar

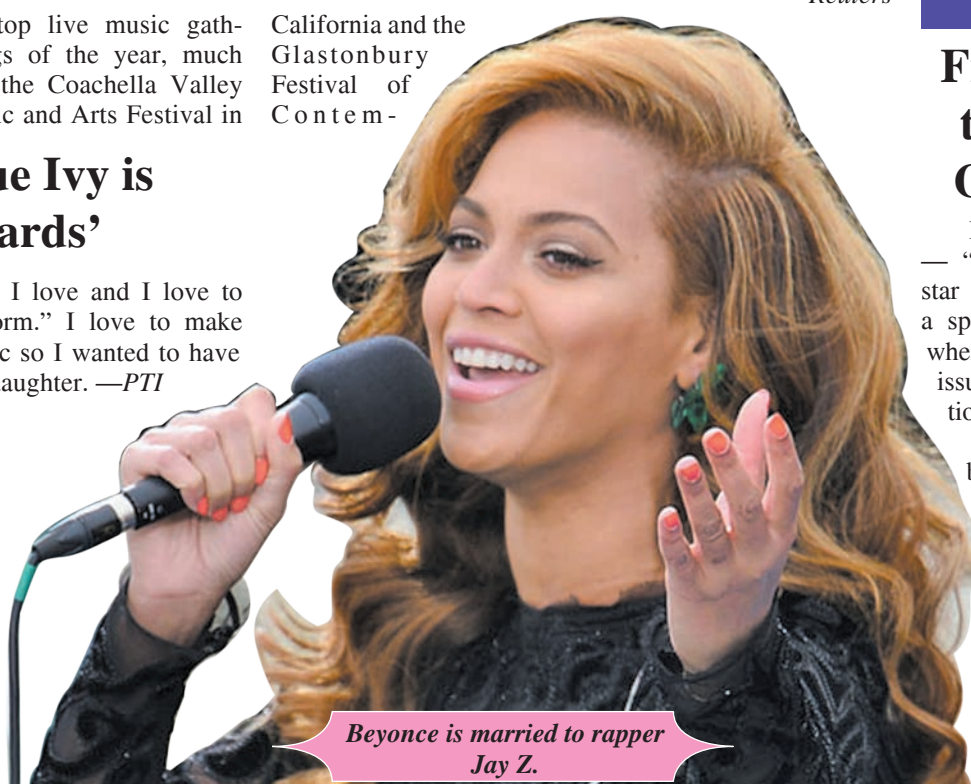
Beyonce reveals baby Blue Ivy is 'already reading flashcards'

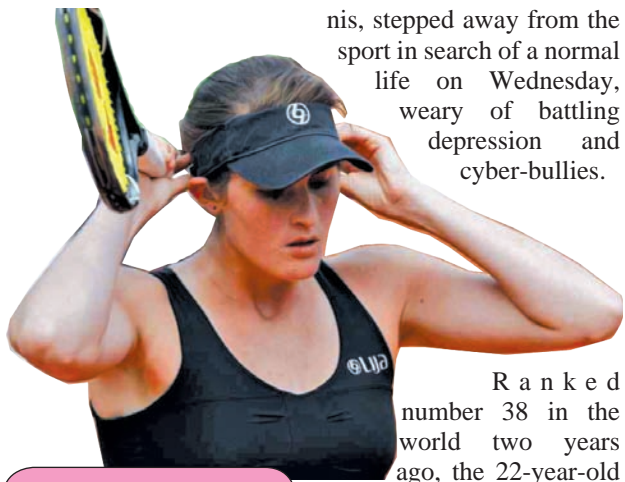

Weary Marino bids farewell to WTA and cyber-bullies

TORONTO, 21 Feb—Canada's Rebecca Marino, a rising star in women's tennis,

stepped away from the sport in search of a normal life on Wednesday, weary of battling depression and cyber-bullies.

Ranked number 38 in the world two years ago, the 22-year-old admitted she had long suffered from depression and was no longer willing to make the sacrifices necessary to reach the top.

"After thinking long and hard, I do not have the passion or enjoyment to drive myself to the level I would like to be at in professional tennis," Marino explained in a conference call. "I have previously been number 38 on the WTA singles rankings so I realize the amount of work and sacrifices that have to be put in and at this point I do not think it is worth sacrificing my happiness. I feel there is more to life than just tennis."

Big and powerful, Marino appeared destined for a promising career on the WTA circuit and under-

scored her potential in a hard fought second round clash with Venus Williams at the 2010 US Open. "Now I know what it's like to play myself," Williams told reporters after winning the match 7-6, 6-3. The following season, Marino backed up that potential by reaching her first career WTA final in Memphis and advancing to the third round of the French Open. But the climb up the rankings had already begun to take its toll on the Canadian and in February 2012 she took a seven month break from the sport citing mental and physical fatigue.—Reuters

Australia avenge Olympic defeat, Hammer wins fifth title

MINSK, 21 Feb—Australia got a measure of revenge for losing the Olympic gold to Britain by beating their arch-rivals in the men's team pursuit final at the world track cycling championships on Wednesday.

The Australian quartet of Glenn O'Shea, Alexander Edmondson, Michael Hepburn and Alexander Morgan completed the 4,000 metres

at the wooden velodrome in the Belarus capital in three minutes 56.751 seconds to clinch the gold medal.

However, the result was well short of the world record of 3:51.659, set by the British at the London Games last August. Britain only had two riders, Steven Burke and Ed Clancy, returning from London, with newcomers Samuel Harrison and Andrew Tennant replacing Geraint Thomas and Peter Kennaugh. The new quartet could only manage the time of 4:00.967 in the final.

Denmark beat Spain in the consolation final to win

the bronze in 3:59.821. Earlier, American Sarah Hammer won her fifth

Rival countries join forces in bid to reverse IOC decision

TEHRAN, 21 Feb—Officials from 10 of the world's top wrestling nations including Japan met on Wednesday in Iran in a bid to reverse the International Olympic Committee's decision to drop wrestling from the 2020 Games, The Associated Press reported.

Delegations from Azerbaijan, Belarus, Bulgaria, Georgia, Iran, Japan, Kazakhstan, the United States, Russia and Turkey will gather to discuss how to reverse the IOC's decision, the report said.

Neymar's agent hits out at Pele

RIO DE JANEIRO, 21 Feb—The agent of Brazil starlet Neymar has accused Pele of hypocrisy and jealousy after the football legend's stinging attack on the 21-year-old's attitude. In a controversial news-

paper interview published on Wednesday, Pele said Neymar had become an "ordinary player" for Brazil's

national team. He added the striker needed to be more of a team player and focus less on his haircut and public image.



Neymar's representative Wagner Ribeiro said Pele had no right to comment on the star's lifestyle. "He shouldn't stick his nose in other people's personal lives, because his

own is a mess," Ribeiro said. "He should worry about taking care of his grandsons instead of talking about Neymar's life. He has never been affectionate with them. This is jealousy. He should look after his own family."

Ribeiro said the three-

time World Cup winner would not be as good as Neymar if he played in the current era. "If Pele played today he would be inferior to Neymar because in his era defenders were slow and players' physical conditions were different. That's why he was Pele. Today the defenders fly and Neymar still manages to be one of the best in the world."

Normally a frequent user of social media, Neymar maintained his silence on Wednesday amid a gathering media storm.

His Santos teammate, Arouca, was charged with fielding questions from a throng of journalists at the club's training base. "Pele has his opinion, just like everybody else," Arouca said. "Neymar is mature enough to deal with it and overcome it."

Sabres fire head coach Ruff after 16 years in job

NEW YORK, 21 Feb —Lindy Ruff's long run as head coach of the Buffalo Sabres came to an end on Wednesday when the National Hockey League (NHL) team fired him after 16 years at the helm. Ron Rolston, coach of the Rochester Americans, Buffalo's American Hockey League affiliate, will serve as interim coach of the NHL team for the rest of the season starting with Thursday's game against Toronto, general manager Darcy Regier said.

Regier said allowing Rolston to coach the rest of the season "will provide us and him the opportunity to get to know each other, and if things go well, he'll have the opportunity to become the head coach." The moves followed a loss to the Win-

nipeg Jets on Tuesday that left the Sabres with a 6-10-1 mark and at the bottom of the Northeast Division with 13 points. Ruff, who also played most of his NHL career in Buffalo, began coaching the Sabres in 1997-98 and was the longest-tenured coach in

the league.

"The hockey world knows how I and the entire Buffalo Sabres organization feel about Lindy Ruff not only as a coach but also as a person," Sabres owner Terry Pegula said in a statement.

Federer plays big brother to village children

GOVHU, (South Africa), 21 Feb—"Big brother Roger," as the village schoolteachers call him, smiles at the small children and asks them to guess which sport he plays.

Most of the bright-eyed three-year-olds have no idea who their visitor is but one, quicker than the rest, pipes up: "You play tennis!". Delighted, Roger Federer turns his palms up to reveal a badly calloused right hand punished by 23

years of holding a racquet, showing the children the difference from the smoother left one.

There are few parts of the world where the man considered as the greatest ever tennis player and holder of a record 17 grand slam titles is not instantly recognized.

Here, in rural South Africa where he is visiting one of the village pre-schools his charitable foundation supports, the Swiss is unfamiliar to the children but commands their attention and curiosity.

In a small, cool, classroom, the toddlers sheltering from the heat stand with heads tipped upwards and eyes fixed on the towering champion as he hits a tennis ball against a wall, demonstrating how to swing a racquet.

Federer looks composed in the sweltering heat of Limpopo province, on the border with Zimbabwe, even though his bright red shirt, wet with sweat by noon, gives him away.

Deep in the densely vegetated village some 20 kilometres from the nearest paved road, the ground is parched and dust flies into the air as brightly-costumed Venda women dance to entertain their world-famous guest. "My heart is in South Africa, through my mum," Federer, the son of a Swiss father and a South African mother, told Reuters.

"My mum being from here, me spending a lot of time here as well, I feel most connected to this part of the world." The Roger Federer Foundation supports 40 pre-schools in the area and spends over \$3 million a year on educational projects in South Africa, Botswana, Zambia, Zimbabwe, Malawi, Ethiopia and Federer's home country Switzerland.

Over 50,000 children benefited from the foundation's efforts in 2012 to improve quality education in pre-schools and primary schools.

Serena pulls out from Dubai with back injury

DUBAI, 21 Feb—Serena Williams withdrew from the Dubai Championships because of a lower back injury just minutes before she was due on court for a second round match against Frenchwoman Marion Bartoli on Wednesday.

The American's withdrawal means that the world's two best players are both out of the tournament after Victoria Azarenka, who beat Williams in the Qatar Open final on Sunday, also pulled out earlier in the week with a foot injury. Williams, the newly installed world number one, aims to return

at the Sony Ericsson Open, which starts in Miami on 18 March. "I've just had some back problems the past couple weeks," Williams told a hastily arranged Press conference.

"I thought it would get better as the week went on but it didn't. I don't want to keep

Pele urges Neymar to choose Barcelona over Man City

RIO DE JANEIRO, 21 Feb—Brazil legend Pele has urged starlet Neymar to choose Barcelona over a move to Manchester City or Real Madrid. His comments followed reports the Premier League outfit was preparing a bid to offer Neymar's club Santos 55 million British pounds to sign the striker in the European summer. Usually a staunch supporter of Neymar's decision to resist offers from European

clubs, Pele claimed the 21-year-old's lack of top-level experience had made him a "regular player" for the Selecao.

"He is an excellent player but he doesn't have any experience outside Brazil," the three-time World Cup winner told Estado de S.Paulo on Wednesday. "In every game he plays outside Brazil, he doesn't do well. Everybody thinks Neymar can solve the Selecao's problems, but he isn't ready for that burden. We have a great deal of confidence in him but he has become a regular player for the national team."

When asked which

European club would be the ideal destination for Neymar, Pele replied: "The game is tougher in England, Italy and Germany because the referees usually let play go on. Barcelona would be ideal for him. Santos need him and for that reason I don't think he should leave but if he must go it should be to Barcelona." The 72-year-old said Neymar's long list of off-field commitments and celebrity status in Brazil have affected his form.
