Russia willing to consider making it easier for Libya to buy arms

UNITED NATIONS, 5 March —Russia is prepared to consider ways of making it easier for Libya's government to buy arms, but voiced serious concern about lifting an embargo on the North African state already awash with weapons, Russia's UN ambassador said on Monday.

Libya's Prime Minister Ali Zeidan said last week he planned to ask the UN Security Council to lift the embargo, which was imposed at the start of an uprising in 2011 that culminated in the ouster of dictator Muammar Gaddafi.

Russia's UN Ambassador Vitaly Churkin, who is president of the Security Council this month, said there were concerns about the Libyan government's lack of authority in the vast desert country and the spread of weapons its borders.

He said Libya had not yet made an official request for the arms embargo to be lifted, but the issue would likely be discussed by the 15-member council before a meeting on Libya later this month. "Some council members do have reservations about lifting the arms embargo," Churkin told re-

porters, noting that Libya's government was already able to purchase weapons with the approval of a Security Council sanctions committee.

"Of course it can be regarded as a somewhat cumbersome procedure even though it's supposed to happen rather quickly," Churkin said. "I think we will also be looking at ways maybe to facilitate the possible acquisition of arms by the Libyan government short of full fledge lifting of the arms embargo."

UNITED NATIONS, 5 March—Israel warned the UN Security Council on Monday that it could not be expected to "stand idle" as Syria's civil war spills over its border, while Russia accused armed groups of undermining security between the states by fighting in a demilitarized zone.

At least five die in plane crash in Congolese town of Goma

GOMA, 5 March—At least five people were killed on Monday when a twin-

propeller plane crashed as it tried to land in bad weather in the eastern Congolese

town of Goma, the airline said.

CAA, the airline operating the Fokker 50 plane, said five crew members were killed while another was still missing after the crash.

"The (three) passengers were injured but their lives are not threatened," David Blattner CEO of CAA, told Reuters.

"There are conflicting reports that there might be one person dead on the ground," he added. The flight was arriving from the town of Lodja, some 700 km (440 miles) to the west.

Democratic Republic

of Congo has one of the world's worst air safety records.

There have been numerous crashes in Goma, the main town in the east, where the runway has not been fully repaired after a volcanic eruption in 2002 left it covered in lava.

Government spokesman Lambert Mende earlier said nine people had been killed in the crash but he later confirmed the figures provided by CAA.

A Reuters reporter at the scene saw four bodies removed from the wreckage of the plane, which was lying in several pieces.—Reuters

UN nuclear chief presses Iran on access to military base

VIENNA, 5 March—The UN nuclear watchdog raised pressure on Iran to finally address suspicions that it has sought to design an atomic bomb, calling for swift inspector access to a military base where relevant explosives tests are believed to have been carried out.

Airing frustration at the lack of progress in his agency's investigation, Yukiya Amano told its 35-nation governing board on Monday that negotiations with Iran must "proceed with a sense of urgency" and be focused on achieving concrete results soon.

Because Iran is not providing the necessary cooperation with inspectors, the International Atomic Energy Agency "cannot conclude that all nuclear material in Iran is in peaceful activities", said Amano, the IAEA's director-general.

His message that Iran must act now was echoed by the United States and its top Gulf ally Saudi Arabia. They declared on Monday that separate but related talks between Teheran and world powers on a wider diplomatic solution to the nuclear dispute could not go on indefinitely.

Israel, Iran's arch-enemy and convinced Teheran is secretly trying to

develop a nuclear weapon, has grown impatient with the protracted talks and has threatened pre-emptive war against Teheran if it deems diplomacy ultimately futile.

"There is a finite amount of time," US Secretary of State John Kerry, in Riyadh, said of the talks between a group of six world powers and Teheran, Saudi Arabia's main regional adversary.

Six million facing hunger in southern Africa

GENEVA, 5 March—More than 6 million people across Angola, Lesotho, Malawi and Zimbabwe are at risk of severe food shortages because of repeated cycles of drought and flooding, the global humanitarian body IFRC said on Monday.

The International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies said the crisis was passing largely unnoticed in the outside world and its appeals for financial support had won limited support.

"This is a chronic crisis in which cycles of drought and flooding are destroying crops, livestock and safe drinking-water supplies. People don't have enough to eat or clean water to drink," said IFRC official Alexander Matheou.

"Malaria, cholera and diarrhoea are common," said Matheou, the Geneva-based body's regional representative in southern Africa, in a statement distributed to a news briefing.

The IFRC said four countries were suffering

particularly badly, with 725,000 people in Lesotho — about 40 per cent of the country's population — hit by the crisis.

Nearly 2 million were at risk in Malawi, more than 1.8 million in Angola, and 1.6 million in rural areas of Zimbabwe. In all four, rates of child malnutrition were soaring, reaching 50 percent more than last year in some areas. An additional complication, Matheou said, was the prevalence of HIV across southern Africa.—Reuters

At least 40 Syrians killed on road home from Iraq

BAGHDAD, 5 March—Unidentified gunmen killed at least 40 Syrian soldiers and government employees who were being taken to the Syrian border by Iraqi authorities on Monday after fleeing into Iraq from a Syrian rebel attack last week, Iraqi officials said.

A convoy carrying the Syrians was ambushed in Iraq's western Province of Anbar, where thousands

of Iraqi Sunnis have been protesting daily for more than two months against the Shi'ite-led government and the perceived marginalization of their sect.

The conflict in neighbouring Syria, where mainly Sunni Muslim rebels are fighting to overthrow a leader backed by Shi'ite Iran, is whipping up sectarian tensions in Iraq and the wider

Middle East.

That has raised concerns of a return to the kind of sectarian strife that killed tens of thousands in Iraq in 2006-2007.

"The incident took place in Akashat when the convoy carrying the Syrian soldiers and employees was on its way to the al-Waleed border crossing," a senior Iraqi official told Reuters.

Google search results 'hacked' over Malaysia-Filipino standoff

BARCELONA, 5 March— Supporters of an armed bid by Filipino intruders to lay claim to a Malaysian state took their campaign to cyberspace on Monday, manipulating Google search listings to show a message backing the incursion.

A Google search for the word "Sabah", the state at the centre of Malaysia's biggest security crisis in years, came back with a search results

andissaidtobeitseasternmost state but in fact, it is part of the Sultanate of Sulu," the passage read, shown in a box previewing the Wikipedia entry for Sabah.

Malaysians have been shocked by the militant incursion, which began when an estimated 100-300 people landed on the shores of Sabah on 12 February, claiming the state for the heir to a former Philippine sultanate.

"Sabah is owned by the Philippines, you illegally (sic) claiming it," it said.

Philippine news portals have said a number of sites in the country were hit by pro-Malaysia hackers.

A tense stand-off between the intruders and security forces who have them pinned down in the farming village of Tanduo erupted in a bloody firefight on Friday that left 12 gunmen and two police officers dead.

Another gun battle erupted on Saturday in Semporna, hours away from Tanduo by road, dramatically escalating tensions and raising the overall toll of reported dead to at least 18 militants and eight police officers.

Followers of the 74-year-old Manila-based Islamic leader, Jamalul Kiram III, say the gunmen are ready to die to defend his claim to Sabah, which was once controlled by the now-defunct sultanate.

K-12 student database jazzes tech startups, spooks parents

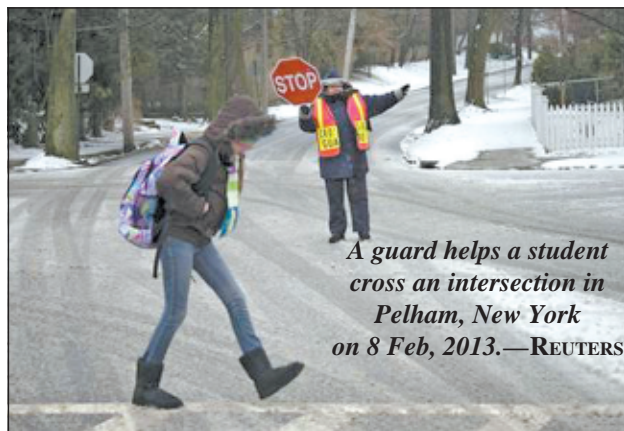
NEW YORK, 5 March— An education technology conference this week in Austin, Texas, will clang with bells and whistles as startups eagerly show off their latest wares.

But the most influential new product may be the least flashy: a \$100 million database built to chart the academic paths of public school students from kindergarten through high school. In operation just three months, the database already holds files on millions of children identified by name, address and sometimes social security number. Learning disabilities are documented, test scores recorded, attendance noted. In some cases, the database tracks student hobbies, career goals, attitudes toward school—even homework completion.

Local education officials retain legal control over their students' information. But federal law allows them to share files in their portion of the database with

private companies selling educational products and services.

Entrepreneurs can't wait. "This is going to be a huge win for us," said Jeffrey Olen, a product manager at CompassLearning, which sells education software.

China's first jumbo jet to debut in 2014

BEIJING, 5 March— China's first jumbo jet, the C919, is expected to make its maiden flight in 2014 as planned, its chief designer told Xinhua on Monday.

The design of C919's airframe has been completed and the ground tests of the jet's major equipment will start in 2013, said Wu Guanghui, the jumbo jet's chief designer and vice general manager of the Commercial Aircraft Corporation of China (COMAC), the aircraft's

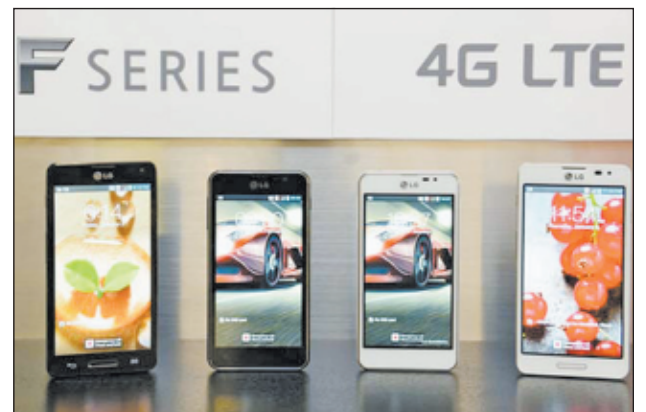
manufacturer.

The company had overcome a lot of difficulties, including insufficient experiences and technological reserves, weak industrial foundation and fierce competition, and had made new progresses in 2012, he said.

The COMAC will complete a series of technical review work and conduct over 40 wind tunnel tests in 2013, said Wu, who is in Beijing to attend the first session of the 12th National Committee of the Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference.

SEOUL, 5 March—LG Electronics said on Monday that it has sold more than 10 million smartphones based on the high-speed long-term evolution (LTE) technology. LG's global LTE smartphone sales topped the 10 million mark last week as the company made an aggressive push into the fast-growing fourth-generation (4G) market, according to an e-mailed statement.

The result came as the LTE smartphone market is expected to grow rapidly. According to Strategic Analytics, global shipments of LTE smartphones are forecast to increase to 275

million units this year, reported Xinhua.

The company rolled out its LTE smartphones last year in around 10 countries such as the US, Germany, Japan and South Korea. LG planned to launch its Optimus G smartphone in about 50 nations by the end of this month. "Aggressive pushing forward with 4G LTE technology allows LG to satisfy the needs of consumers and is a huge factor in our growing success in global LTE smartphone sales," said Park Jong-seok, president and chief executive of LG's mobile communications division.

Philippine bourse slips on profit-taking

MANILA, 5 March—Lack of positive leads prompted investors to sell their positions on Monday.

The bellwether Philippine stock exchange index lost 0.07 percent, or 4.71 points, to 6,637.56, while the broader all-share index slipped by 0.03 percent, or 1.48 points, to 4,172.07.

Trading volume reached 3.87 billion shares worth 10.74 billion pesos (263.85 million US dollars) with 98 stocks declining, 62 advancing and 49 unchanged. Of the six counters, only the financials and

the services sector bucked the trend.

“The Philippine stock market has faced a strong challenge to rise above 6,720 as well as to sustain levels above 6,700,” analyst Justino Calaycay of Accord Capital Equities Corp. said in his daily stock market comment.

Investors, he said, are struggling to balance political concerns in Italy and the approach of a 1 March sequestration in the US on one hand and a slew of generally inspiring economic numbers both here and

abroad.

Calaycay said what is keeping investors hooked on the local equities is the fact that it still offers investors the “best balance between return and risk.”

The Philippine equities went to as low as 6,564.77 on Monday, providing a window of opportunity for investors to start accumulating stocks.

Stock in the 30-company index closed mixed. Among those sold down were Ayala Corp., Ayala Land, Inc. and SM Prime Holdings, Inc.—Xinhua

Alibaba eyes up to \$8 billion jumbo loan

HONG KONG, 5 March—Chinese e-commerce giant Alibaba Group is back in the loan market with an eye on a jumbo financing of up to \$8 billion to refinance existing debts, barely a year after borrowing \$4 billion in loans, according to sources.

The borrower is said to have approached lenders seeking proposals for the loan, proceeds from which will refinance US\$4bn in loans put in place last year as well as fund Alibaba’s obligations under a \$7.1 billion share buyback deal it struck with Yahoo Inc (YHOO.O) last May.

The Chinese Internet company is refinancing its outstanding loans with a new borrowing to free itself from covenants that capped its borrowings to \$4 billion.

The additional \$4 billion it is raising from the latest borrowing will finance its share buyback deal with Yahoo.

As reported earlier, the buyback, agreed by Alibaba and Yahoo on 21 May 2012, will cost \$7.1 billion and will be funded by \$6.3 billion in cash and \$800 million through a new issue of preferred stock by Alibaba to Yahoo.

Sources expect Alibaba to pay lower pricing than on its loans signed last year, which were well received.

The \$4 billion in loans completed last year comprised a \$1 billion four-year facility signed in July by eight banks and three other loans of \$1 billion each signed in June.

The three other loans

include two bilaterals of three and four years from China Development Bank (CDB) CHDB.UL, and a \$1 billion three-year facility from a group of 19 lenders. The three-year facility from 19 banks was part of a \$3 billion dual-tranche debut which also comprised a \$2 billion bridge that was taken out by CDB’s bilaterals.

The \$1 billion three-year loan from the 19 banks paid a top-level upfront fee of 300 basis points, while the \$2 billion 12-month bridge paid 175 basis points.

The \$4 billion in loans last year funded the privatization of Hong Kong-listed Alibaba.com and financed the buyback of half of the 40 percent stake Yahoo held in Alibaba.

Mongolia called on to create own brands

ULAN BATOR, 5 March—Senior officials attending the opening of the Mongolian Economic Forum on Monday called on their country to create its own brands to enter into the international market.

Prime Minister Norov Altanhuyag said “Mongolian brand, Mongolia creates” has always been the Mongolian people’s dream.

Although Mongolia’s per capita possession of resources ranks among the world’s highest, most of its mineral products, meat, leather and cashmere are exported as raw materials with no added value, he said.

Mongolia should promote an upgrade and transformation of its economic structure, create

its own brands and enter into the international market, the prime minister said.

Deputy Prime Minister Dendev Terbishdagva also urged Mongolian enterprises to join forces to create their own brands to sell abroad.

Mongolian cashmere made under minus 40 degrees could be able to produce highest grade cashmere, but Mongolian cashmere products were not well-known in the international market, he said.

The two-day economic forum was mainly aimed at providing suggestions for vigorously developing deep processing of Mongolian cashmere, leather, dairy and other products, local media reported.—Xinhua

Sequestration not favoured method to cut budget deficit

WASHINGTON, 5 March—A sound plan is needed to reduce the budget deficit over the next 10 years, but wholesale government spending cuts should not be the core of the programme, according to a new survey of economists.

The National Association for Business Economics’ poll of 196 members found more than 70 percent

opposed the full implementation of \$85 billion in federal budget cuts known as the “sequester” that were set to start taking hold last Friday. The International Monetary Fund last week warned that the spending cuts, if fully implemented, could shave at least 0.5 percentage point off gross domestic product this year.—Reuters

NEW YORK, 5 March—Can crunches create six-pack abdominal muscles? Do weight-lifting women risk bulging biceps? Is stretching always a good idea?

Experts say disentangling folklore from fact is not easy in fitness, where misconceptions are as pervasive as push-ups and as stubborn as love handles.

Jennifer Burke, a fitness manager at a Crunch gym in West Hollywood, California, said many women still worry that weight training will create big and bulky muscles.

“Women say ‘I don’t want to get bulky,’ but unless you take in extra calories or testosterone supplements, that’s just not going to happen,” said Burke, who eases reluctant clients into resistance training gently,

with body-weight exercises.

“When they see their bodies getting long lean muscles, getting toned, they trust you a little more and you can start adding in dumbbells and machines,” Burke said.

The US Centres for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends that adults engage in muscle-strengthening activities that

work all major muscle groups—legs, hips, back, abdomen, chest, shoulders and arms—two or more days a week.

“A lot of people think if they want to lose a lot of weight they should do cardio, but the best thing is to add in resistance training as well,” Burke said.

“You’ll get bigger, faster results because you’re working on lean muscle

tissue which burns more calories in the long run.”

While it’s true that muscle weighs more than fat, it’s also more compact.

“Five pounds (2.3 kilograms) of muscle is the size of your fist.

Five pounds of fat is the size of your forearm” she said. Burke added that another misconception is that lower-intensity exercise such as the fat-burning setting on most cardio machines is better for burning calories.

“That’s absolutely not true,” said Burke. “If you increase the intensity you’ll burn more calories.”

The CDC’s rule of thumb is that one minute of vigorous-intensity activity is about the same as two minutes of moderate-intensity activity.

NATO expects decision on post-2014 Afghan force by mid-year

KABUL, 5 March— NATO expects a decision by the middle of this year on the size of a training force to be kept in Afghanistan once most foreign troops leave in 2014, alliance Secretary-General Anders Fogh Rasmussen said on Monday.

The Pentagon has said a NATO-led training force of between 8,000 and 12,000 was under consideration. Questions remain over how well Afghan security forces being built up by NATO will be able to tackle Islamist Taliban insurgents in the face of intensifying violence and how Western states can justify financial support for a force that has been saddled with accusations of torture by the United Nations.

"It takes some time to

stand up a new training mission, of course, and we will need the clarification within the next few months," Rasmussen told *Reuters* after talks with President Hamid Karzai in the Afghan capital Kabul.

"I would expect it (the size of the force) to be finalised very soon because we also need to start planning," he said.

Many Afghans eagerly await a firm decision on the number of foreign troops who will stay in their country once NATO's military operation officially ends at the end of next year.

"President Karzai assured me today that Afghanistan wants a NATO-led training mission to stay, to train, to give advice, to assist the Afghan security forces after 2014," Rasmus-

sen said of the training mission, which is called "Resolute Support".

An earlier suggestion of a "zero option" by White House officials — a complete US withdrawal after 2014 — spooked some Afghan lawmakers, who

warned this could lead to full civil war. But troop numbers are also politically sensitive in many NATO countries where voters have tired of the increasingly unpopular and costly 12-year war against Taliban insurgents.—*Reuters*

OSLO, 5 March— A Pakistani schoolgirl who was shot in the head by the Taliban for advocating girls' education is a wild

card entry for this year's Nobel Peace prize, with the leaders of Colombia and Myanmar among likely candidates for the award.

Colombian President Juan Manuel Santos was certain to be on the list for his efforts to end half a century of conflict with the FARC guerrillas, alongside Myanmar's Thein Sein, who has led a transition from decades of dictatorship, people familiar with the committee's deliberations said. Former US President Bill Clinton was once again a possible candidate for his charitable work.

However, Russian punk rock band Pussy Riot, which gained international notoriety when three of its members were jailed for performing a "punk prayer" against President Vladimir Putin in a Moscow cathedral, were

not seen as likely winners. The Norwegian Nobel Committee, which announces its decision on 12 October, received a record number of nominations for this year's award.

"The prize keeps gaining importance and attention," said its Director Geir Lundestad. "Presidents, prime ministers, former laureates submitted many of the nominations ... and we have plenty of new names as well as 'old' ones on the list." The 15-year old Pakistani schoolgirl Malala Yousufzai has become an internationally recognized symbol of resistance to the Taliban's efforts to deny women education and other rights.—*Reuters*

Snowstorm hits north-central US, heads to mid-Atlantic

MINNEAPOLIS, 5 March—A blizzard roared into North Dakota on Monday and was expected to dump up to a foot of snow in neighbouring Minnesota before moving east over the mid-Atlantic states, where it could bury the Washington area with its biggest snowfall of the winter, the National Weather Service said.

Blowing snow and drifts up to three feet (0.9 metre) left parts of Montana and the northwest North Dakota oil region with visibility at a quarter of mile under blizzard conditions that were expected to last into Monday night, the

weather service said.

The North Dakota transportation department was recommending "no travel" on roads across the northwestern part of the state where there is a blizzard, stretching along the northern edge of the state across to roads north of Grand Forks. Up to 15 inches of snow was expected in northwestern North Dakota and 9 inches in the Grand Forks area, on the eastern border with Minnesota. But the state took the latest storm in stride.

"It's a normal late winter storm for us," said Adam Jones, a meteorologist with

the National Weather Service in Bismarck.

The Minneapolis and St Paul metropolitan area was dusted by an inch or two of snow on Monday from a separate storm system, and up to 10 inches was expected from the main winter storm, mostly overnight into Tuesday morning, the weather service said.

The storm was expected to dump heavy snow along the Minnesota and Wisconsin border, with up to a foot in the far southeastern corner of Minnesota, before heading across southern Wisconsin and into Illinois.—*Reuters*

Neighbour killed trying to save three seniors in Tennessee fire

NASHVILLE, 5 March— Authorities are investigating whether an explosion caused a fast-spreading house fire in Tennessee that killed three senior citizens and a neighbour who tried to save them.

"I've seen a lot of things that are bad, but here something happened real bad, real fast," said Macon County Fire Chief Keith Scruggs on Monday, his voice cracking.

Scruggs, a firefighter for 39 years, said he knew all four victims of the fire, which happened on Sunday night just outside the city

limits of Lafayette, a close-knit rural community about 55 miles northeast of Nashville. All were overcome by smoke inhalation.

"Everybody knows everybody," Scruggs said of the community of 8,000. "This is the most that have ever died in a house fire that I remember." Firefighters reached the house four minutes after being called but found it already engulfed in flames. Firefighters encountered several explosions while trying to extinguish the blaze. Scruggs said the fire could have been caused by an oxygen or propane

tank explosion. The cause is under investigation.

The dead include Robert Solomon, 80, an Alzheimer's and dementia patient, and his wife, Barbara Solomon, 73, who had recently retired as the charge nurse at Macon County General Hospital, Scruggs said. She recently had both hips and a knee replaced, and was not very mobile, he said.

Alice Cockrill, 65, Barbara Solomon's sister, also died, Scruggs said. She had spent most of her time in bed with chronic pain and other issues, he said.

France says will meet its deficit target in 2014

BRUSSELS, 5 March—France, the euro zone's second-largest economy, will miss its budget deficit target this year but can reach the goal in 2014, the country's Finance Minister Pierre Moscovici said on Monday.

Under pressure to show budgetary discipline to the rest of the euro zone and reassure financial markets, Moscovici pleaded for understanding from the European Commission, the EU executive that is policing countries' debts and deficits.

"We need to be intelligent and find a balance between fiscal consolidation and growth... France can bring its budget deficit to below 3 percent in 2014," Moscovici told a news conference after a meeting with his euro zone counterparts in Brussels.

"We will not meet our deficit forecast for 2013 and I don't want to deepen austerity at a time of recession and stagnation," Moscovici said, referring to the euro zone's economy, which the Commission expects to

shrink 0.3 percent this year.

"We don't have any more adjustment plans for 2013," he said of France.

France is expected to show almost no growth this year—a 0.1 percent expansion—the Commission said in its latest forecast last month. Partly because of the lack of growth, the Commission has forecast that France's deficit will be 3.7 percent of gross domestic product (GDP) this year, well short of the 3 percent target under European rules.—Reuters

Twelve pro-army militiamen killed in Yemen

ADEN, 5 March—A suicide bomber killed at least 12 members of a pro-government militia that helped the Yemeni army to drive al-Qaeda-linked Islamist militants out of southern strongholds in a US-backed campaign last year, a commander said on Monday.

Nizar Jaafar said 15 other people had been wounded in the attack on an office of the Popular Committees in the town of Lawdar in the southern province of Abyan.

Residents said the force of the blast shook the centre of Lawdar. No one claimed responsibility for the attack, but Islamist group Ansar al-Sharia has previously said it carried

out similar bombings, often in reprisal for the tribal fighters' role in driving the militants out of their strongholds.

Yemen has been grap-

pling with multiple challenges since a popular uprising forced President Ali Abdullah Saleh out of office in 2011 and brought Abd-Rabbu Mansour Hadi

in his place.

Apart from the Islamist militant insurgency, the US-allied country which is next door to the world's top oil exporter, Saudi Arabia, is fighting a separatist movement seeking to revive the Socialist state that merged with North Yemen in 1990, as well as a potential challenge from Shi'ite Muslim rebels known as Houthis in the north.

Ansar al-Sharia has carried out a campaign of suicide attacks against the Yemeni army and its militia allies after they were forced to quit cities they captured in 2011, during the turmoil that accompanied the popular protests against Saleh.

Turkey, Greece seek to boost economic ties amid tensions

ISTANBUL, 5 March—More than 250 businessmen from Turkey and Greece met here on Monday to explore the possibilities of broadening economic and trade relations between the two neighbours despite differences in some areas.

"Turkey and Greece aim to reach the 10 billion US dollars trade volume by the year of 2015," Turkish Prime Minister Recep Tayyip Erdogan, who also attended the Turkish-Greek Business Forum, said during the event. Tourism is one of the promising areas of cooperation between Turkey and Greece. Rifat Hisarcikliglu, president of Foreign Economic Relations Board of Turkey (DEIK), suggested at the forum that Turkey and Greece could develop tourism packages together to attract tourists from the Middle East and Asia.

Before the forum, the two governments headed

by Erdogan and his Greek counterpart Antonis Samaras signed 25 agreements in a bid to boost cooperation on education, press, energy, tourism and sports.

However, some long-standing problems between the two neighbouring countries cast shadow on the future development of bilateral economic relations—one of the disputes being the gas exploration rights in the Eastern Mediterranean, and

another, the Cyprus issue.

"I think the increasing trade volume between Turkey and Greece can erase political tensions and conflicts. Turkey and Greece could cooperate with each other to solve the gas exploration disputes," said Alexander Karapiperis from Greek company Ergani, who believed that trade with Turkey helps Greece to solve domestic financial crisis.

South African official says BRICS summit preparations at advanced stage

"At this point, preparations are at advanced stage for the 5th BRICS Summit. From the substance and logistic perspective, we are satisfied with the state of readiness," said Ebrahim Ebrahim, South Africa's Deputy Minister of International Relations and Cooperation.

The official stressed that the South African

government is confident that "the summit will be a great success."

The 5th BRICS Summit will be held in the southeastern port city of Durban from 26 to 27 March under the theme "BRICS and Africa: Partnership for Development, Integration and Industrialization."

It will be the first time for South Africa to hold the BRICS summit since it officially became a membership of the group on 24 Dec, 2010, following formal invitation by the BRIC nations to join the group.

Locust reached Gaza Strip, not dangerous

GAZA, 5 March—The government of Islamic Hamas movement said on Monday that the swarms of locust which stormed the Gaza Strip earlier Monday evening were not big and not dangerous or harmful.

The swarms of locust were very little and only reached the fields in some parts of southern Gaza Strip, Saleh Bakheet, director general of plant protection department in the ministry of agriculture, said in a Press statement.

He said the swarms of locust came from Egypt and crossed into the south-

ern area of the Gaza Strip, adding that little swarms had reached the farms and green fields of Abassan village, east of the city of Khan Younis.

"It represents no kind of danger or harms to people and plants," Bakheet said, adding that "the situation is under full control and protection of the ministry of agriculture."

Farmers said that 10 locusts were founded in each dunum (1,000 square metres). Officials of the agriculture ministry said it would be dangerous if huge swarms of locust cover an

area of 30 dunums (30,000 square metres).

Meanwhile, Israeli Radio reported that the swarms of locust covered various green fields and areas in southern Israel, mainly near the borders between Israel and Egypt.

The radio said that farmers in the area said swarms of locust were not that huge and do not represent any danger to their farms.

However, they expressed concerns that within the coming few days, swarms of locust would increase.—Xinhua

Kenyatta takes early lead as Kenya counts votes

NAIROBI, 5 March—Uhuru Kenyatta opened an early lead as Kenya continued the count on Tuesday in a presidential election that brought out millions of voters despite pockets of violence that killed at least 15 people. Kenyans, who waited patiently in long lines, hope the vote will restore the nation's image as one of Africa's more stable democracies after tribal blood-letting killed more than 1,200 people when the result of the 2007 vote was

disputed by rivals.

Early tallies from Monday's broadly peaceful voting gave an edge to Kenyatta, the 51-year-old deputy prime minister, over rival Prime Minister Raila Odinga, 68. That lead could still be overhauled because it was based on a count from just over 20 percent of polling stations, provisional figures from the election commission indicated. Final results are likely to be announced later on Tuesday. Election officials had said

turnout was more than 70 percent of the 14.3 million eligible voters but have not given a precise total. The United States and Western donors have watched the vote closely, concerned about the stability of a nation seen as a regional ally in the fight against militant Islam.

They also worry about what to do if Kenyatta wins, because he faces charges of crimes against humanity at the International Criminal Court (ICC) related to the violence five years ago.

For an outright victory, a candidate needs more than 50 percent of votes cast, otherwise the top two face a run-off, provisionally set for April. Odinga may be facing his last crack at the presidency after narrowly missing out in 2007 to now-outgoing President Mwai Kibaki. Losing to Kenyatta, the son of Kenya's first president after independence, would mark another defeat in the family's ambitions after Odinga's father also failed to secure the top post.—Reuters

Bersani ultimatum may bring new Italy election closer

ROME, 5 March—Italy could be inching closer towards another election within months after centre-left leader Pier Luigi Bersani issued an ultimatum to anti-establishment comic Beppe Grillo to support a new government or return to the polls.

Last week's election, in which Grillo's 5-Star Movement won a huge protest vote, left no group with a working majority in parliament, making an alliance with a rival the only way out. On RAI state television late on Sunday, Bersani underlined his opposition to two of the options floated—another technocrat government like the outgoing one led by Mario Monti or a coalition with Silvio Berlusconi's centre-right.

That would leave only one possibility to avoid elections—Grillo's backing for the centre-left, which won the lower house in the election but does not have enough support in the Senate.

“Now (Grillo) must say what he wants, otherwise

we all go home, including him,” Bersani said.

Grillo has repeatedly said his populist movement, which he refuses to call a party, would not give a vote of confidence to any government of established parties, although it could support individual laws.

“We have already said it several times: we won't give a vote of confidence to a government of political parties,” the movement's newly named Senate leader, Vito Crimi, told its novice lawmakers on Monday during a meeting in Rome

streamed on Grillo's blog.

He said the party could consider supporting a technocrat government such as the one headed by outgoing prime minister Monti.

The uncertainty in Italy, during a long limbo before talks to form a government begin after 15 March, has unsettled international markets. The spread between Italian 10-year benchmark bonds and German bunds—a measure of investor confidence—widened on Monday to an almost three-month high.

Banks offer 16.7 bln dollar loans for SMEs in Poland

WARSAW, 5 March—Polish Prime Minister Donald Tusk on Monday said five banks have signed deals with the Polish state-owned bank Bank Gospodarstwa Krajowego (BGK) to offer loans worth up to PLN 50 billion (16.7 billion US dollars) to small and medium-sized Polish enterprises. Local media reports said the BGK estimated that some PLN 30 billion would be made available in two years, and that about 50 small and medium-sized enterprises might benefit

from the programme.

But Tusk said that the ultimate value of the loans could reach PLN 50 billion, adding that the lack of capital during an economic downturn is one of the most acute problems for companies. Established in 1924, BGK is Poland's only state-owned bank. The primary business objective of the bank is to provide banking services for the public finance sector, in particular through the support of the government's economic programmes.—Xinhua

From shirt store to multi-billionaire: Inditex founder Ortega rises to number 3 in Forbes rich list

MADRID, 5 March—Armancio Ortega, the founder of the textile group Inditex, is now the third richest man in the world according to the magazine *Forbes* which published its rich list on Monday.

Ortega has moved up two places over the last year from being the fifth richest man in the world and has a fortune estimated at 57 billion US dollars, up 19.5 billion dollars since the start of March 2012.

He is only beaten by Mexican Carlos Slim and Microsoft founder Bill Gates.

Although he stepped down as the chairman of Inditex in 2011, Ortega still owns 60 percent of the shares of the group whose most famous brand is Zara, which he founded in 1975 and which has grown since then to become a worldwide phenomenon, which by the end of October 2012 had

almost 2,000 stores and was represented in every continent on earth.

Key to Zara's recent growth has been its expansion in China, while last year also saw the store open up its website in Chinese in order to expand its market penetration beyond the 50 plus cities which currently have stores.

2012 was a good year for Inditex, which registered a 27 percent rise in profits in the first 10

months of the year as the group was able to withstand the effects of the economic crisis and see its volume of sales rise by 17 percent. This was partly due to the fact the group, which also includes marks such as Massimo Dutti, Pull and Bear, and Bershka, opened almost 400 new stores during the year, including the group's 6000th store, which is on London's emblematic Oxford Street.—Xinhua

Chavez's breathing problems worsen, has severe new infection

CARACAS, 5 March—President Hugo Chavez's breathing problems have worsened and he is suffering from a new, severe respiratory infection after undergoing cancer surgery in Cuba, Venezuela's government said in a sombre update on Monday.

Reading the latest official assessment of Chavez's health, Information Minister Ernesto Villegas said the 58-year-old socialist leader's condition was very delicate.

“Today there is a worsening of his respiratory function. Related to his depressed immune system, there is now a new, severe infection,” Villegas said.

“The president has been receiving high-impact chemotherapy, along with other complementary treatments ... his general condition continues to be very delicate.”

Chavez made a surprise pre-dawn return to Venezuela from Cuba two weeks ago. The govern-

ment said he is in a tightly guarded suite at a Caracas military hospital. He has not been seen in public nor heard from since his 11

December operation in Havana, his fourth cancer surgery since the disease was detected in his pelvic region in mid-2011.—Reuters

German car sales decline 10 pct in February

BERLIN, 5 March—Germany, Europe's biggest car market, saw a sharp year-on-year fall in sales of 10.5 percent in February, the Federal Motor Transport Authority (KBA) said on Monday, as the auto industry is still under the shadow of the eurozone debt crisis. About 66 percent of the 200,683 newly registered cars were for commercial use, the KBA said in a statement.

However, the February figure marked a 4.5-percent increase compared with

January. According to Germany's VDIK association of car importers, new car registrations in the first two months of this year totalled 392,000.

German car sales fell 2.9 percent in 2012 with a total of 3.08 million models, still outperforming other European markets like France and Italy.

German automakers' resilient performance during the debt crisis has been attributed to strong demand in North America and Asia.

Wen suggests new gov't expanding domestic demand

BEIJING, 5 March—Chinese Premier Wen Jiabao on Tuesday advised his succeeding government to “unswervingly” take expanding domestic demand as the government’s long-term strategy for economic development, given the “fundamental” role of consumption and the “key” role of investment in driving economic growth.

In his last delivery of government work report as China’s premier, Wen said

he made his suggestions based on an understanding of the work of the past ten years, especially of the past five years.

“The difficulty in and key to expanding domestic demand lie in consumption, and that is also where the potential lies,” Wen told nearly 3,000 national legislators at the annual session of the 12th National People’s Congress (NPC).

Consumption has become China’s primary driving force for economic growth, contributing to about 51.8 percent of China’s gross domestic product growth last year, while fixed-asset investment helped drive another 50.4 percent of the GDP growth, according to data from the National Bureau of Statistics (NBS).

Vietnamese, Portuguese communist parties boost ties

HANOI, 5 March—The Communist Party of Vietnam (CPV) wants to further boost friendship and cooperation with the Portuguese communist party and people, said Le Hong Anh, Politburo Member and permanent member of the CPV Central Committee’s Secretariat on Monday.

Anh made the statement in capital Hanoi during his reception of General Secretary of the Portuguese Communist Party Jeronimo de Sousa, who led his party’s high-ranking delegation to visited Vietnam from 1-4 March. Anh said the visit manifested new development of the friendship and cooperation between the two parties and countries.

The Portuguese party leader expressed his delight to re-visit Vietnam and wit-

ness the country’s renewals in socio-economic development, especially valuable experience of the CPV in building and developing the socialist country of Vietnam. He also informed the host of information about the country and party of Portugal, confirming that he would try to contribute to promoting the close relations and cooperation between the two parties in the coming years.

During his stay in Vietnam, Jeronimo de Sousa held talks with CPV’s External Affairs Commission Hoang Binh Quan, worked with the CPV’s Central Theory Council, the Ministry of Planning and Investment, and Ministry of Labour, Invalids and Social Affairs, and toured some economic sites in Hanoi.—Xinhua

Mongolian president meets Danish parliament speaker on cooperation

ULAN BATOR, 5 March—Mongolian President Tsakhia Elbegdorj met visiting Danish senior officials here on Monday on the two countries’ cooperation in energy, agriculture and culture.

“Mongolia is interested in promoting cooperation with Denmark in such fields as culture, education, science and so on,” Elbegdorj told the Danish parliamentary delegation

led by Parliament Speaker Mogens Lykketoft.

He also expressed his willingness to introduce Denmark’s environmentally friendly technologies to the Central Asian country.

The delegation, which started its official visit on Saturday, was also scheduled to hold talks with Mongolian Foreign Minister L Bold and Mining Minister D Gankhuyag.

Four killed, 18 injured in firing in Pakistan’s Karachi

ISLAMABAD, 5 March—At least four people were killed and 18 others injured when some unknown gunmen sprayed bullets in various areas of Pakistan’s southern port city of Karachi on Monday evening, local media reported.

Urdu TV channel ARY said that two people were killed and several others injured when some unknown gunmen opened fire at the people who were on their

way back home after offering funeral prayer of Sunday night’s bombing victims in Al-Asif Square area of the city.

Shortly after the attack, angry mob set four banks on fire and injured four people in National Highway area.

In a similar attack in Sohrab Goth area of the city, some unknown gunmen opened fire at a police mobile, injuring several

people including one policeman. The protesters also set four banks on fire in the area.

Later in Ancholi area of the city, two people were killed and several others injured in firing by unknown gunmen.

The Rangers’ spokesperson, said that four ranger personnel were injured in separate incidents of firing across the city.

New Zealand port decision opens access for large cargo ships

WELLINGTON, 5 March—The New Zealand government on Tuesday opened the way for larger foreign cargo vessels into the country, bringing estimated efficiency gains of more than 300 million NZ dollars (248.08 million US dollars), by approving expansion of one of its major port channels. Conservation Minister Nick Smith said in a statement he had granted consents for the dredging of the entrance and shipping lanes at the Port of Tauranga, on the east of the North Island, to accommodate “S” class vessels.

Port of Tauranga chief executive Mark Cairns said the dredging project will be carried out in several stages, with the first starting at the end of this year and taking six months to a year to complete. “Larger ships, both containerized and bulk, have relatively higher fuel efficiency and are therefore more carbon efficient, with lower operating costs per unit,” Cairns said in a statement.

“This will enhance the competitiveness of New Zealand exporters and provide lower freight costs for importers.” The New Zealand Shippers’ Council estimated the value to New Zealand of bigger ships operating on the Southeast Asia trade routes could be up to 338 million NZ dollars a year, increasing up to 391 million NZ dollars a year by 2020.—Xinhua

Malaysian security forces launch attack against Sulu gunmen

KUALA LUMPUR, 5 March—Malaysian security forces on Tuesday launched an all-out assault on Tuesday against the Sulu gunmen holed up in a village in Malaysia’s Sabah state, aiming at ending the three-week standoff.

The operation was started at 7 am, Prime Minister Najib Razak announced in a statement, in order to “defend the dignity and sovereignty of the country.”

Inspector General of police Ismail Omar told a Press conference before noon that the operation was conducted by police and the army.

The operation is still ongoing and the security forces have met some resistance, but there are no reports of any casualties on the security forces so far, he said,

The casualties of the intruders are also unknown, he added. Local media reported fighter jets were used in the aerial attack, followed by the artillery firing and a ground assault by the security forces to the Tando village, where more the 180 members of the Royal Army of the Sulu Sultanate, including some heavy armed, have holed up for three weeks.

Najib stressed that his government had tried to settle the situation without bloodshed. “The police had meetings and negotiations in the hope that the intruders will agree to leave peacefully, without suffering from any serious legal actions,” he said in the statement.

On Friday, a gun battle broke out between the security forces and the group, killing two special forces commandos and 12 gunmen. A day later, six police and six gunmen were killed during a shootout in the Semporna area.

Four soldiers wounded in mine blast in SE Turkey

ANKARA, 5 March—Four soldiers of the Turkish security forces were wounded in a land mine blast in southeastern Turkey on Monday, the semi-official *Anatolia* news agency reported.

The mine exploded while a military convoy was passing a road near Tavsan Tepe area in Lice town of

Diyarbakir Province at 08:00 pm local time (1700 GMT), leaving four Turkish soldiers injured, Diyarbakir Governor Mustafa Toprak was quoted as saying.

The injured were taken to Hani State Hospital for medical treatment, Toprak said, adding that an investigation into the blast is underway.—Xinhua

Vietnam receives 1.21 mln foreign tourists in first 2 months

HANOI, 5 March—Foreign visitors to Vietnam in the first two months of 2013 posted some 1.21 million people, down 9.6 percent over the same period last year, Vietnam's General Statistics Office reported on Monday.

Of the total figure, some 743,900 foreign visitors came to Vietnam for travel, down 8 percent year-on-year. Visitors coming for business purpose post-

ed 204,900 person-times, down 8.4 percent, while numbers of visitors coming for visiting relatives purpose down 14.3 percent to 200,600 person-times.

During the period, the country saw a growth in number of foreign visitors from Russia with 38 percent, New Zealand (up 24.8 percent), Indonesia (21.9 percent), Thailand (18.8 percent) and South Korea (10.4 percent).

Dragon boats make big splash across Australia

SYDNEY, 5 March—Often called the world's fastest growing water sport, Australians are also in on the dragon boat phenomenon, with about 3,000 paddlers competing in the popular Sydney Chinese New Year dragon boat races this year.

"I know there's lots of people here today who have been paddling for twenty or more years and just love it, because of the team work and friendships that they build. People make friends for life," she said.

UN meeting seeks to end all violence against women, girls

UNITED NATIONS, 5 March—The 57th annual meeting of the Commission on the Status of Women opened on Monday at UN Headquarters in New York with its focus set on eliminating all forms of violence against women and girls.

"Ending violence against women is a matter of life and death," Deputy UN Secretary-General Jan Eliasson told the opening session. "The problem pervades all countries, even in the most stable and developed regions."

"Violence against women pervades war zones as well as stable communities, capitals as well as the countryside, public space as well as the private sphere," Eliasson said. "Since it is an

unacceptable feature of daily life, we have to respond everywhere and on every level."

The executive director of UN Women, UN Undersecretary-General Michelle Bachelet, said, "The world can no longer afford the costs of violence against women and girls, the social and economic costs and the costs in deep human pain and suffering."

"Over the past few months, women, men, and young people took to the streets with signs that ask 'Where is the justice?'" she said.

"They declared solidarity with a Pakistani girl shot for defending the right to education," said Bachelet. "They pledged justice

for a young woman in India and another in South Africa who were brutally raped and later died. They demanded an end to the endless cases of rape and violence that threaten the lives of countless women and girls in every country but never make the headlines."

Marion Kamara, chair of the Commission on the Status of Women, said, "We are here to showcase achievements, and to speak frankly about gaps and challenges. Most importantly, we are here to deliver results for the women and girls around the world."

"The scourge of violence against women and girls is at the core of the gender equality," she said.

Stephen Chow's blockbuster continues box office conquest

BEIJING, 5 March—“Journey to the West: Conquering the Demons,” a period adventure comedy created by writer-director Stephen Chow, had raked in more than 1.1 billion yuan (176.7 million US dollars) as of Sunday, the film’s production company announced.

The film took in 80 million yuan when it debuted on 10 February, the biggest opening ever for a

domestic film. It pulled in a combined 1.08 billion yuan throughout February, the Huayi Bros. Media Group said. Chow’s 3-D action comedy, based on the classic Chinese novel “Journey to the West,” follows the adventures of a young demon hunter.

China’s current box office record is held by “Lost in Thailand,” a low-budget comedy that has earned



more than 1.26 billion yuan since it debuted last December. However, many

believe Chow’s movie will break that record before it leaves theatres.—Xinhua

Oprah Winfrey to deliver commencement address at Harvard

BOSTON, 5 March—Talk show host, entrepreneur and philanthropist Oprah Winfrey will deliver this year’s graduation address at Harvard University, the Ivy League school said on Monday.

“Oprah’s journey from her grandmother’s Mississippi farm to becoming one of the world’s most admired women is one of the great American success stories,” Harvard President Drew Faust said in announcing her selection.

Winfrey will join a long list of politicians, policy makers, captains of industry and authors — including George

d JK Rowling—who have offered their wisdom and advice to Harvard’s graduating classes. She will speak at the school’s 362nd graduation exercises on 30 May.

Long a fixture on *Time Magazine’s* 100 most influential people list, the 59-year-old Winfrey has been popular on the college commencement circuit, speaking at Stanford University, Duke University and Spelman College in recent years.—Reuters

Whitney Houston's FBI files show fan letters, possible extortion

LOS ANGELES, 5 March—The FBI on Monday released decades-old files on late pop singer Whitney Houston, detailing letters from obsessed fans and an alleged extortion attempt investigated by the bureau. The 128 pages from Houston’s files posted online on the FBI’s website showed one fan’s attention-seeking letters but did not divulge any new insights into the troubled singer’s personal life.

Houston, known both for her soaring ballads and well chronicled history of drug abuse, was found dead last year in a Beverly Hills hotel bathtub. She was 48. Authorities called her death an accidental drowning due to cocaine use and heart disease. The FBI cases were opened at the height of the singer’s career between 1988

and 1999. Names and several details were redacted from the files. Among the Grammy-winning singer’s FBI files, released through a Freedom of Information Act request, were love letters sent by a Vermont man, who wrote that he “might hurt someone with some crazy idea.”

The file shows the FBI interviewed the man but the bureau concluded no law was broken because the man said he would have only hurt Houston’s reputation by proclaiming his love publicly. An alleged \$250,000 extortion attempt was brought to the FBI’s attention shortly after Houston’s marriage to R&B singer Bobby Brown in 1992 and threatened to make public private information unless the “I Will Always Love You” singer paid.—Reuters

LONDON, 5 March—Producers of James Bond franchise reportedly want singer Adele to repeat her Skyfall success with a new smash-hit tune. The bosses want the 24-year-old to sing the theme song for the next 007 movie as well after she won an Oscar for Skyfall theme, reported Sun Online. “Producers are thrilled by how well the song has been received and hope Adele’s presence on the next film will replicate that success. They want her to become as synonymous with Bond as Dame Shirley,” a source said.

Welsh legend Shirley, 76, had Bond hits with Gold-

finger (1964), Diamonds Are Forever (1972) and Moonraker (1979). But none won awards or sold as many as Skyfall’s three million copies worldwide.

Meanwhile Adele’s aunt has told how relatives wept with joy as they watched the star at last week’s Academy Awards in Los Angeles. Anita Adkins, elder sister of the star’s mother Penny, said, “We streamed it live online through the night. When Adele burst into tears, we all did the same. We’re all quite strong but we’re also very emotional. Adele’s one of us. We feel what she feels.”

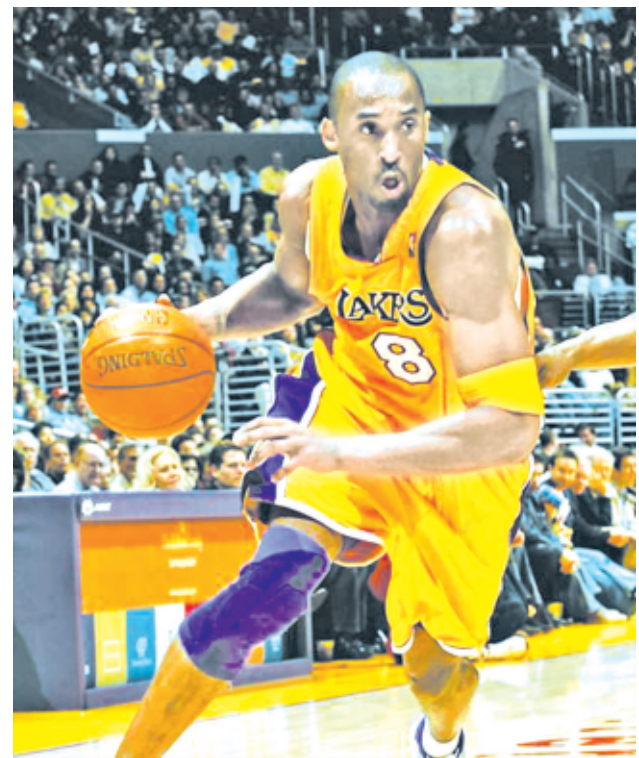

McIlroy regrets decision to withdraw from Honda Classic

was initially a mysterious explanation.

"It was a reactive decision," he told Sports Illustrated about quitting after he hit his approach shot into the water on the par-five 18th, his ninth hole of the day.

"What I should have done is take my drop, chip it on, try to make a five and play my hardest on the back nine, even if I shot 85." "What I did was not good for the tournament, not good for the kids and the fans who were out there watching me — it was not the right thing to do."

McIlroy has been struggling all year after switching clubs but reaffirmed his belief that his equipment was not to blame.

Ward was injured midway through the second period of Carolina's

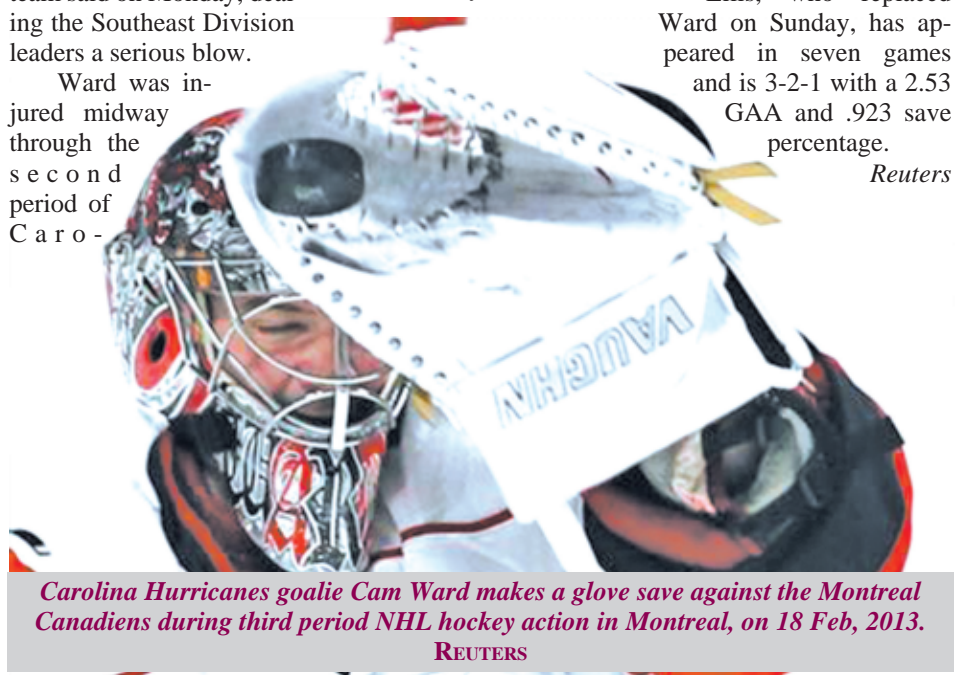
3-2 win over Florida on Sunday, and the injury could sideline him through the end of the regular season, which ends on 27 April for Carolina.

Yankees GM breaks leg in parachute jump for charity

NEW YORK, 5 March — New York Yankees General Manager Brian Cashman broke his right fibula and dislocated his ankle upon landing from a parachute jump for charity in Florida, the team said on Monday.

Cashman, 45, the main executive who decides which multimillion-dollar contracts to offer on Major League Baseball's highest paid team, was attempting to raise awareness for the Wounded Warrior Project, which aids US military veterans when they return from war. He was injured on the second of two tandem jumps with a parachutist

from the US Army Golden Knights at the Homestead Air Reserve Base outside of Miami, the team said in a statement.

Surgery was scheduled for later on Monday at Broward Health Medical Centre, the statement said. "I'm in great spirits and it was an awesome experience," Cashman said in the statement. "The Golden Knights are first class. While I certainly didn't intend to raise awareness in exactly this fashion, I'm extremely happy that the Wounded Warrior Project is getting the well-deserved additional attention."—*Reuters*

Flacco signs six-year contract with Ravens

NEW YORK, 5 March — Quarterback Joe Flacco signed a six-year contract to remain with the Baltimore Ravens, the team said on Monday in a deal that reportedly makes the Super Bowl MVP the highest paid player in National Football League (NFL) history.

Financial terms of the deal were not disclosed but various media reports said it was worth \$120.6 million, moving him past New Orleans Saints quarterback Drew Brees, and his six-year, \$120 million deal, as the league's top earner.

The laid back Flacco downplayed the importance of the record contract that kept him from shopping his talents around. "It was pretty uneventful, to tell you

the truth," Flacco, 28, told reporters at a news conference. "It's not really a big deal. "Our goal is to win the Super Bowl. That's always been one of my goals. It's never necessarily been a goal of mine to get paid like this, it's just what comes with the job."

The strong-armed Flacco, the only NFL quarterback to win at least one playoff game in each of his first five seasons, threw for 11 touchdowns and no interceptions in Baltimore's postseason run to the Super Bowl title. In last month's championship game, Flacco completed 22-of-33 passes for 287 yards and three touchdowns against the strong defence of the San Francisco 49ers in a 34-31

victory. Before the season, Flacco was derided in some circles for declaring himself one of the league's elite quarterbacks since his statistics were not particularly impressive on a team that played conservatively and relied on their staunch defence.—*Reuters*

Trust is a must to attract foreign investment: MP

NAY PYI TAW, 5 March—Six lawmakers discussed the pros and cons of signing Convention on the Recognition and Enforcement of Foreign Arbitral Awards 1958 (New York Convention) at Pyidaungsu Hluttaw session today.

The convention's principal aim is that foreign and non-arbitral awards will not be discriminated against and it obliges parties to ensure such awards are recognized and generally capable of enforcement in their jurisdiction in the same

way as domestic awards. An ancillary aim of the convention is to require courts of parties to give full effect to arbitration agreements by requiring courts to deny the parties access to court in contravention of their agreement to refer to the matter to an arbitral tribunal, according to United Nations Commission on International Trade Law (UNCITRAL).

“To make the economy a success, it all depends on trust. No matter what legislation is enacted and no matter what agreement is signed, no potential investor

would make investment unless they have confidence in (political) landscape of the country,” says Daw Aung San Suu Kyi of Kawhmu Constituency.

She called for preparing what is necessary, reiterating internal strength and competence as sine qua non to serve the interests of the citizens to the fullest.

She also stressed the need of local judicial system to meet the international norms, recommending that legal experts should improve their professional knowledge of arbitration.

Deputy Minister for National Planning and Economic Development U Set Aung warned against the over-reliance on donor countries and associations, calling for a focus on software development rather than hardware development.

Other MPs also spoke in favour of signing the convention with all agreeing it as a prerequisite to attract foreign investment. So, the Union Assembly agreed to sign the convention.

So far, 148 out of UN member countries have signed the convention, according to UNCITRAL.
