Embassy attack spreads Libyan instability to capital

TRIPOLI, 25 April—Libya's central government has long had only a tenuous grip on the eastern city of Benghazi, but the bombing of the French Embassy in Tripoli shows its control of the capital may now also be under threat. The early morning car bomb devastated France's Embassy, wounding two French guards, in the most significant attack against foreign interests in Libya since September's deadly assault on the US diplomatic mission in Benghazi.

The US Ambassador and three other Americans were killed in the Benghazi attack leading to a lingering

political row in Washington with Republicans accusing President Barack Obama's administration of withholding information and the White House defending its handling of the issue. In a blow to the Libyan government's hope of asserting its authority after the 2011 war that ousted Muammar Gaddafi, the French embassy bombing, was the first of its kind in Tripoli. Both France and Libya called the attack a "terrorist act",

"Given the events in Benghazi in the last year, it may not be that surprising that even areas where there is more state control are not immune," a Western

diplomatic source in Tripoli said. "People can't just point to the east now." In the capital, the presence of state security forces is more evident than elsewhere — pick-up trucks bristling with weapons protect ministries or

stand guard at roundabouts. But the city of around 1.7 million people is not immune to violence — gunfire still often rings late into the night as armed brigades fight pitched battles against rival groups.—Reuters

US seeks to ease Afghanistan-Pakistan tensions in Brussels talks

Afghanistan combat mission. Afghanistan has grown increasingly frustrated with Pakistan over efforts to pursue a peace process involving the Taliban, suggesting that Islamabad is intent on keep Afghanistan unstable until foreign combat forces leave

ASEAN leaders plan roadmap to boost competitiveness

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, 25 April—Leaders of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations will task their ministers to develop a roadmap to boost the region's economic competitiveness as the 10 member states rush to meet the deadline of an economic community by the end of 2015, according to an ASEAN document obtained on Wednesday.

"Given the current regional and global economic landscape, we recognized the need to enhance ASEAN competitiveness by better facilitating trade and investment, leveraging upon ongoing work to establish the ASEAN Economic Community, to put ASEAN

in a more strategic position," said the draft of the chairman's statement to be issued by the host country at the end of the summit on Thursday.

"Therefore we tasked our Ministers to develop a roadmap that will set out initiatives to ease the way of doing business, address investment impediments, institutionalize discussions on regulatory improvement and incorporate innovation policies into ASEAN's efforts," it said. Since 2007, ASEAN has already achieved 77.5 percent of the measures in its blueprint designed to achieve the economic community.

Kerry is hosting the talks in Brussels involving Karzai and Pakistani Army chief General Ashfaq Kayani and Foreign Minister Jalil Jilani, with the aim of calming tensions over border disputes and the stalled peace process. Kerry told reporters at the start of the meeting at the residence of the US Ambassador to NATO on the outskirts of the Belgian capital that Afghanistan was in "a critical transformational period". "(I am) very, very pleased the president could travel, General Kayani and Secretary Jilani could take the time to be here," he said. "We are very, very hopeful for a productive series of discussions."

Karzai called it an important meeting and said he was glad Kayani and Jilani had found the time to travel to Brussels. "Let's hope forward for the best," he told reporters.—Reuters

Italy's newly named PM vows coalition gov't to enact reforms

ROME, 25 April—Road for forming the new government was finally opened on Wednesday after Enrico Letta, a centre-left politician named

by President Giorgio Napolitano as the new Italian Prime Minister, said he will get started immediately to overcome impasse. Soon after meeting Napolitano, Letta told journalists he would hold a round of consultations with party leaders on Thursday, a national holiday celebrating liberation day from fascist rule, and then return to the presidential palace "as soon as possible" to fully accept the mandate.

Napolitano said a "broad coalition" that can ensure a majority in both houses of parliament was the only possible step to break

Boston bomb suspect's name was on classified government watch lists

WASHINGTON, 25 April—The name of one of the Boston Marathon bombing suspects, Tamerlan Tsarnaev, was listed on the US government's highly classified central database of people it views as potential terrorists. But the list is so vast that this did not mean authorities automatically kept close tabs on him, sources close to the bombing investigation said on Tuesday.

Tsarnaev, 26, was killed in a police shootout early Friday, while his younger brother Dzhokhar, 19, was captured later that day. Prosecutors say the brothers, ethnic Chechens who had been living in the United States for more than a decade, planted two bombs that exploded

tip-off that he had become a follower of radical Islamists. The FBI found nothing to suggest he was an active threat, but all the same placed his name on the "Terrorist Identities Datamart Environment" list. The FBI has not said what it did find about Tsarnaev. But the database, which holds more than half a million names, is only a repository of information on people who US authorities see as known, suspected or potential terrorists from around the world.

Because of its huge size, US investigators do not routinely monitor everyone registered there, said US officials familiar with the database. As of 2008, TIDE contained more than 540,000 names,

near the finish line of the marathon on April 15, killing three people and wounding more than 200.

The sources said Tamerlan Tsarnaev's details were entered into TIDE, a database maintained by the National Counterterrorism Centre, because the FBI spoke to him in 2011 while investigating a Russian

although they represented about 450,000 actual people, because some of the entries are aliases or different name spellings for the same person. Fewer than 5 percent of the TIDE entries were US citizens or legal residents, according to a description of the database on the NCTC website.

the unbearable stalemate Italy has been locked in since general elections produced a hung parliament two months ago. Letta, a former member of the European Parliament with an advanced degree in European legal studies, served as minister for community policy at age of 32, the youngest ever to hold such a post in the country's history.

Despite the fact he has been deputy head of the Democratic Party (PD) for the past four years, he is seen as a moderate endowed with political adaptability. His uncle Gianni is a key political advisor of three-time prime

minister and PD opponent Silvio Berlusconi who leads the center-right. Letta is expected to head a cabinet of ministers selected from the entire political spectrum and technical world, which is likely to win parliamentary approval though faced with a series of obstacles in seeking cross-party consensus.

The PD, the main group in parliament, Berlusconi's People of Freedom (PdL) and the centrist Civic Choice of outgoing Prime Minister Mario Monti said the 46-year-old is very young by Italian standards but is enough experienced.—Xinhua

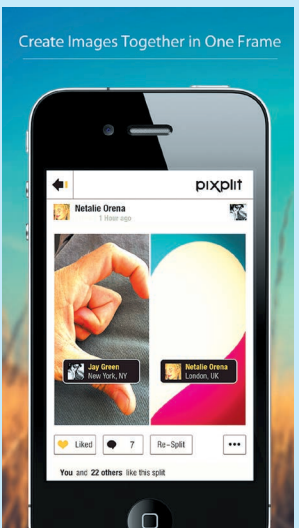

Israeli iPhone app for collaborative photo collages

Snap a picture with your iPhone. Then upload it to a split template via the new Israeli mobile app Pixplit (<http://www.pixplit.com>) and invite friends to add related photos to the open areas. Voila, a finished composite.

“There are almost 13,000 photo apps on the App Store but ours is the only one that lets you collaborate with others in a visual dialogue,” says Pixplit co-founder Yovav (Jay) Meydad. “A photo typically has one area of content, while on Pixplit it’s divided into two to four parts.”

One example he recently showed visiting journalists was a three-part image on the theme of underground trains.



A two-frame Pixplit creation

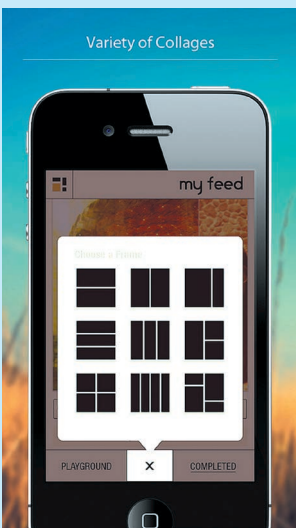
The originator uploaded a picture of the London Underground. A friend added a shot of New York City’s subway, and a friend of that friend completed the split with a photo of the Milan Metro.

“People are becoming architects and blending all kinds of images, like the Dizengoff Tower in Tel Aviv with one of New York’s skyscrapers, and applying a filter to build something really cool,” says Meydad.

The free app, run on Google Cloud Storage, is a social network complete with user profiles and the ability for friends to follow each other. “We have a feed showing all the completed splits,” says Meydad.

“I can comment and ‘like’ just like on Instagram. But we’re different because we have a ‘playground’ where I see the splits that have at least one open slot waiting to be populated. I can join with the tap of a button: Snap photo, add filter, upload. All followers will now see the completed split in their feed and they can interact with me around it.”

Pixplit’s founders started development in May 2012, attracted angel funding and officially opened on 17 October when the company was named best new startup at StartTWS (www.StartTWS.com) startup launch competition in Tel

A new form of consumer engagement

Meydad and his co-founders have a business model in mind for Pixplit.

Premium features such as additional templates may be downloaded for a fee, but the main money-making concept is recruiting corporate sponsors in order to take social marketing to a different level. In each user’s feed, every few splits will be sponsored ones roughly matched to the user’s age, gender and location.

“We have communicated with top ad agencies and they are excited about new ways to engage with users,” says Meydad.

“Brands measure the number of likes or tweets

or retweets concerning their product or service. That is not as strong as starting a campaign on Pixplit,” he says. “Let’s say Nike could begin with the Nike swoosh in the first frame, and friends will add variations – maybe a kid playing basketball wearing Nike sneakers. It allows brands and users to create campaigns together.”

What if any of the added photos are offensive or counterproductive to Nike’s marketing strategy?

“If the creator of a split isn’t happy about a specific photo, we provide a mechanism to delete it,” assures Meydad. “We also have a mechanism to report usage of copyrighted materials and will delete that split. We want to keep Pixplit a safe place to collaborate.”

Not for couples only

Pixplit’s origin was a student project at Shenkar College of Engineering and Design in Tel Aviv. Adi Binder, now the company’s director of product and design, developed the concept of an app for couples to manage their communication in one space with chat, video, messaging and co-created photos.

His serial-entrepreneurial friends Jay Meydad and Nir Holtzman Ninio thought about adding a viral aspect.

“After some brainstorming, Adi, Nir and me, and Gil Barzilay — a fourth co-founder no longer a member of the team — decided not to limit ourselves to couples, but to make it something anyone could participate in,” says Meydad. “On social networks such as YouTube, only a small percentage of users are creators, because creating content is hard. With Pixplit, it’s easy to be an active user,” says Meydad, who previously was VP-product at a US company that runs 30 dating sites and then at Snap.com. Most recently, he and Nir started Hitpad, a top iPad news application.

“At some point Nir and I said, ‘Hitpad is nice, but

it’s not growing to tens of millions of users.’ We need a service where virality is in its DNA.”

What he especially relishes is the ability to span degrees of separation. “When I create a three- or four-part split, the first degree is those directly connected to me, the second degree of separation is those connected to the people I’m connected to, and the third is the friends of my friends’ friends. Pixplit is the first app that uses the concept of connecting with people in the third degree of separation.”

He reports that CTO Holtzman Ninio is busy working on an Android version of the app.—NLM

Fukuoka official in Myanmar as water adviser on JICA mission

YANGON, 25 April—Masaru Matsuoka, a 34-year-old Japanese official of the Fukuoka city government, has been in Yangon since April 2012 to teach local people how to improve the municipal water system in Myanmar’s largest city.

Soon after joining the municipal government of Fukuoka in 2002, the university graduate in civil engineering was tasked with managing the water distribution facilities of the southwestern Japan city.

And since Matsuoka had often been described by his boss as “energetic and proactive in everything,” the city government picked him when the Japan International Cooperation Agency asked the city to provide a water supply adviser for its mission in Myanmar.

Campaigners call for ban on “killer robots”

LONDON, 25 April—Machines with the ability to attack targets without any human intervention must be banned before they are developed for use on the battlefield, campaigners against “killer robots” urged on Tuesday.

The weapons, which could be ready for use within the next 20 years, would breach a moral and ethical boundary that should never be crossed, said Nobel Laureate Jody Williams, of the “Campaign To Stop Killer Robots”.

“If war is reduced to weapons attacking without human beings in control, it is going to be civilians who are going to bear the brunt of warfare,” said Williams, who won the 1997 peace prize for her work on banning landmines.

Weapons such as remotely piloted drones are already used by some armed forces and companies are working on de-

veloping systems with a greater level of autonomy in flight and operation. “We already have a certain amount of autonomy,” said Noel Sharkey, professor of Artificial Intelligence and Robotics at the University of Sheffield.

“I think we are already there. If you asked me to go and make an autonomous killer robot today, I could do it. I could have you one here in a few days,” he told reporters. But the technol-

ogy is a long way off being able to distinguish between a soldier and a civilian. “The idea of a robot being asked to exercise human judgment seems ridiculous to me,” Sharkey told Reuters.

“The whole idea of robots in the battlefield muddies the waters of accountability from my perspective as a roboticist,” he added.

The British government has always said it has no intention of developing

such technology. “There are no plans to replace skilled military personnel with fully autonomous systems,” a Ministry of Defence spokesman told Reuters. “Although the Royal Navy does have defensive systems, such as Phalanx, which can be used in an automatic mode to protect personnel and ships from enemy threats like missiles, a human operator oversees the entire engagement,” the spokesman added.

But the organizers of the Campaign to Stop Killer Robots say Britain’s rejection of fully autonomous weapons is not yet watertight. “We’re concerned that there is a slide towards greater autonomy on the battlefield and unless we draw a clear line in the sand now, we may end up walking into acceptance of fully autonomous weapons,” said Thomas Nash, director of non-governmental organization Article 36.—Reuters

Arms makers boost earnings, but revenues weakening

WASHINGTON, 25 April—Top weapons makers reported higher-than-expected profit and improved margins for the first quarter, even as revenue began to taper off after more than a decade of sharp growth in US military spending.

Boeing Co's defence division, Northrop Grumman Corp and General Dynamics Corp on Wednesday followed the lead of top Pentagon supplier Lockheed Martin Corp in reporting higher earnings and lower revenue.

Operating margins remained steady or improved across the sector, ranging from 10.3 percent to 12.4 percent.

"Weaker revenues and strong earnings are typical of this point in the defence spending cycle. However, the erosion in revenues is

probably a leading indicator of where earnings are headed," said defence analyst Loren Thompson of the Virginia-based Lexington Institute.

"Earnings eventually will erode as the impact of sequestration is fully felt," he said, referring to across-the-board federal spending cuts.

Northrop Grumman, which builds unmanned planes and a range of other defence equipment, said it was focused on executing programmes, cash deployment and tweaking its portfolio as US defence budgets start to feel the bite of the mandatory spending cuts.

The company reported net earnings of \$489 million, or \$2.03 a share, compared with \$506 million, or \$1.96 a share a year earlier. Revenue dipped to \$6.1 bil-

lion from \$6.2 billion.

"Looking ahead, we recognize that we are operating in an uncertain and constrained budget environment," said Northrop Chief Executive Wes Bush.

General Dynamics, which builds ships, tanks and Gulfstream business jets, reported slightly higher first-quarter earnings, far exceeding analysts' forecasts, but revenue fell short of expectations. General Dynamics said net earnings rose to \$571 million, or \$1.62 per share, from \$564 million or \$1.57 per share, a year earlier. Revenues dipped to \$7.4 billion from \$7.58 billion.

Boeing, the second-largest US weapons maker, said its defence earnings rose 12 percent to \$832 million, while revenue slipped 1 percent to \$8.1 billion.

WHO says new bird strain is "one of most lethal" flu viruses

BEIJING, 25 April—A new bird flu strain that has killed 22 people in China is "one of the most lethal" of its kind and transmits more easily to humans than another strain that has killed hundreds since 2003, a World Health Organization (WHO) expert said on Wednesday.

The H7N9 flu has infected 108 people in China since it was first detected in March, according to the Geneva-based WHO.

Although it is not clear exactly how people are being infected, experts say they see no evidence so far

of the most worrisome scenario — sustained transmission between people.

An international team of scientists led by the WHO and the Chinese government conducted a five-day investigation in China, but said they were no closer to determining whether the virus might become transmissible between people.

"The situation remains complex and difficult and evolving," said Keiji Fukuda, the WHO's assistant Director-General for health security.

"When we look at influenza viruses, this is an

unusually dangerous virus for humans," he said at a briefing.

Another bird flu strain — H5N1 — has killed 30 of the 45 people it infected in China between 2003 and 2013, and although the H7N9 strain in the current outbreak has a lower fatality rate to date, Fukuda said: "This is definitely one of the most lethal influenza viruses that we've seen so far."

Scientists who have analyzed genetic sequence data from samples from three H7N9 victims say the strain is a so-called "triple reassortant" virus with a mixture of genes from three other flu strains found in birds in Asia.

Recent pandemic viruses, including the H1N1 "swine flu" of 2009/2010, have been mixtures of mammal and bird flu — hybrids that are more likely to be milder because mammalian flu tends to make people less severely ill than bird flu.

Pure bird flu strains, such as the new H7N9 strain and the H5N1 flu, which has killed about 371 of 622 the people it has infected since 2003, are generally more deadly for people.—Reuters

Japan to introduce countermeasures against H7N9

TOKYO, 25 April—A health ministry panel on Wednesday compiled countermeasures against the H7N9 strain of bird flu.

Under the steps, prefectural governors will be authorized to recommend that patients or suspected patients be hospitalized and to impose restrictions on work.

The Health, Labour and Welfare Ministry aims at introducing the measures in early May by revising government ordinances under the Infectious Disease Law and the Quarantine Law, ministry officials said.—Kyodo News

Japan's top 3 automakers log record overseas output in FY 2012

TOKYO, 25 April—Japan's top three automakers — Toyota, Nissan and Honda — all produced record high numbers of vehicles overseas in the past business year through March, due partly to increased production in North America and emerging Asian countries on robust demand, according to data released on Wednesday.

Toyota Motor Corp, Asia's largest automaker, produced a record 5.20 million vehicles overseas, up 17.8 percent from the previous year. Toyota group global production — which includes output by small-car maker Daihatsu Motor Co and truck-making unit Hino Motors Ltd — also hit an all-time high of 9.72 million vehicles, up 13.4 percent. Nissan Motor Co's production outside Japan expanded 2.6 percent to a record 3.73 million vehicles, reflecting a 16.3 percent increase in production in the United States.—Kyodo News

Ford profit beats estimates as North America shines

DETROIT, 25 April—Ford Motor Co posted a higher-than-expected first-quarter profit on Wednesday as its North American unit posted its best quarter in more than a decade on the strength of new models.

Revenue in North America, the company's largest market, shot up by one-fifth during the quarter and Ford added that its European restructuring was on

track. The second-largest US automaker reported a pretax profit of \$2.1 billion, or 41 cents per share for the quarter, down from about \$2.3 billion a year earlier. But the results exceeded the analysts' average estimate of 37 cents per share, according to Thomson Reuters I/B/E/S.

The strong performance in North America was the result of "recovering vehi-

cle demand in the US, lower wage costs, and factories that are running close to capacity," Edward Jones analyst Christian Mayes said in an email.

"A recovering housing market is also helping to spur demand for F-Series trucks, which carry higher profit margins than some of the smaller cars Ford sells," Mayes added.

Ford still expects to

lose \$2 billion in Europe this year. Chief Financial Officer Bob Shanks told reporters that recent economic data in the region painted a cloudy picture of when Europe would eventually rebound.

He added that automakers "seem to be running along the bottom now" in Europe. The industry may see some stabilization toward year-end or early 2014, he added.—Reuters

Russia plans to deploy fighter jets, base in Belarus

MINSK/MOSCOW, 25 April—Russia plans to deploy fighter jets in Belarus this year and eventually establish an air base in the former Soviet republic, Russian Defence Minister Sergei Shoigu said on Tuesday. The moves would increase Russia's military presence in Belarus, viewed by Moscow as a buffer between Russia and NATO, and could unnerve neighbouring members of the Western alliance.

Russia agreed in 2009 to set up a joint air defence system with Belarus and talks were held before then on establishing an air base there, but few concrete steps have been taken. "We have begun considering the plan to create a Russian air base with fighter jets here,"

for the first fighter jets to arrive in Belarus this year. Russian aviation regiments normally consist of roughly 60 warplanes. While Russian and NATO officials say armed conflict between the former Cold War adversaries is all but unthinkable, relations are strained and former Soviet satellites are particularly wary of the Russian military. An anti-missile shield the United States is deploying in Europe together with NATO nations is a chief source of tension.

Shoigu's remarks coincided with a meeting in Brussels at which Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov told NATO that Moscow still wants guarantees the system would not be used

Shoigu said at a meeting with Belarusian President Alexander Lukashenko in the capital, Minsk. "We hope that in 2015 there will be a regiment of warplanes (in Belarus) which will serve to defend our borders," Shoigu said in a portion of the meeting shown on Russian state television.

Shoigu said the plan is

against Russia, despite a recent decision to scale it back. Ruslan Pukhov, director of the Moscow defence think-tank CAST, said the deployment of fighters in Belarus would do little to increase security and would be seen by Russia's Western neighbours "as a display of hostility".

Ex-Australian POW to apply for A-bomb health-care certificate

NAGASAKI, 25 April—A former Australian prisoner of war, who survived the 1945 US atomic bombing of Nagasaki, will apply for a special health-care certificate for victims of the attack that will entitle him to medical allowances, a group supporting atomic-bomb survivors abroad said on Wednesday.

Allan Chick, 93, who lives in the state of Victoria, southern Australia, is believed to be the last living atomic-bomb survivor among former Australian POWs, according to

66-year-old Nobuto Hirano, co-head of the support group. He will seek the certificate through the Japanese Consulate General in Melbourne.

So far, 10 former POWs who survived the atomic bombing of Nagasaki in southwestern Japan have been given the health-care certificate, according to the Nagasaki city government. Most recently, a former Dutch POW was granted the certificate in 2009. Chick told Hiroko Sakaguchi, a 63-year-old member of the support

group, that he hopes to be certified as an atomic-bomb survivor. According to Sakaguchi, who visited the former POW last week, Chick was taken prisoner in Southeast Asia and moved to a camp in Nagasaki in 1944 during World War II.

He was among 24 Australian POWs at the prison camp who were exposed to the atomic bombing on 9 Aug, 1945. Sakaguchi said it is significant to support Chick, who had a "double whammy" as a POW and atomic-bomb survivor.

First, there is not a clear vision for running the country and planning the future of Egypt," state-run Al-Ahram news website quoted Gadallah as saying. Besides, there is persistence

China eyes cyber security cooperation with US

BEIJING, 25 April—China hopes to cooperate with the United States on cyber security, a Foreign Ministry spokeswoman said on Wednesday. Cyber security is a global problem, Hua Chunying said at a daily news briefing after media reports that the US government is considering more aggressively confronting China over cyber security issues.

"We hope the international community will make joint efforts to safeguard peace, security, openness and cooperation regarding cyberspace in the spirit of equality and mutual respect," said the spokeswoman. Cyberspace should be a new field where China and the United States cooperate rather than face conflict with each other, she said. Hua said the recently announced establishment of a China-US cyber security working group is designed to increase dialogue and boost cooperation between the countries. Earlier this month, China and the United States agreed to set up this group when US Secretary of State John Kerry visited Beijing.

as an Islamists' attempt to control the judiciary by appointing Islamist-oriented judges to replace more than 3,000 judges above the age of 60. "It is unsuitable at this critical stage to attempt to pass an amended law concerning the judicial authority," added Gadallah in his resignation letter to Morsi.

Iranian held in Nepal for possible terror links

KATHMANDU, 25 April—Nepalese police are investigating an Iranian national's possible terror links after he was frequently spotted around the Israeli Embassy in Kathmandu and later also found to be holding a fake Israeli passport, police said on Wednesday. Police arrested the man identified as Mohsin Khosravian last week after officials at the Israeli Embassy in Kathmandu alerted the police of his suspicious movements in the embassy area.

Khosravian, who initially showed police an Israeli passport, was later found to be holding an Iranian passport as well. "Investigations revealed that he is Iranian. His Israeli passport does not have security features, and is therefore a fake," Kesh Bahadur Shahi, chief of Nepal's Central Investigation Bureau that is investigating Khosravian, told *Kyodo News*. "We have asked Interpol to provide us with information about this man," Shahi added.

Quoting investigation sources, the *Himalayan Times daily* reported that Khosravian entered Nepal on 3 April using a fake Israeli passport that he acquired in Kuala Lumpur, which he entered on 31 March using his Iranian passport. Khosravian has reportedly told police that he has lived in Bangkok since 2004. Last year, there were a series of attempted attacks on Israeli embassies and tourists in several Asian cities. Israel has blamed the attacks on Teheran.

Boston bombs were detonated by remote used for toy cars

WASHINGTON, 25 April—The two bombs that went off at the Boston Marathon, killing three people and wounding 264, were detonated with the kind of remote device used to control a toy car, US investigators told a House of Representatives panel on Wednesday. "It was a remote control for toy cars," US Representative Dutch Ruppersberger, the top Democrat on the House Intelligence Committee, told

reporters after officials from the Department of Homeland Security, FBI and National Centre for Counterterrorism briefed the committee.

"Which says to me, and brother number two has said, they got the information on how to build the bomb from *Inspire* magazine," Ruppersberger added. *Inspire* was created by the American-Yemeni preacher Anwar al-Awlaki, a leader of al-Qaeda's af-

filiate in Yemen who was killed in a US drone strike. Ruppersberger said the article on bomb-building in *Inspire* was headlined: "How to build a bomb in your mom's kitchen."

Police say two brothers, Tamerlan and Dzhokhar Tsarnaev, planted and detonated two pressure-cooker bombs near the finish line of the Boston Marathon on 15 April. Tamerlan Tsarnaev, 26, was killed in a shootout with police. Dzhokhar Tsarnaev, 19, lies wounded in a Boston hospital and has been providing some information to authorities.

Ruppersberger also confirmed that at least some of the explosives used in the attack had come from a fireworks shop in New Hampshire. "One of the brothers, the oldest brother, went to a shop in New Hampshire ... and asked for the most volatile explosives, so that you'd 'get the best bang,'" Ruppersberger said.—Reuters

(from page 16) Today. Though the head of Monywa District police force warned the crowd off the land about three times because the land is the area under curfew, they continued staying there.

Some of Yangon Public Service Network members instigated the villagers to commit harsh acts against security forces assigned duties. Due to their instigation, the crowd started throwing stones at the security forces. Therefore, three were arrested for throwing stones at the security forces. But, due to non-stop throwing stones, three warning shots were fired to stop throwing stones at them. After the warning shots, the villagers withdrew about 100 feet

back. The violence left a total of 10 members of the security forces injured.

Furthermore, around 20 villagers including some members of Yangon University of Arts and Science Students Union from Moegyobyin Ale Village harrowed in their farms to the west of the Block No. 8 MCC around 9.15 am. Policemen headed by the township Police Force chief and the head of immigration and national registration department then tried to settle dispute peacefully just to face their hostile responses. Five policemen were injured as they were beaten by the villagers while attempting to detain them.

Nearly 200 Sete villagers

armed with sticks, swords stones and culprits gathered

in the east of Block N 8 MCC around 10 am to grab back the detainees. Though the division Police Force chief called them to disperse, the villagers advanced to the police forces and the two villagers even attacked with stick and sword. Though the policemen fired warning shots, the crowd even made harsher attacks toward the policemen.

While unrest and violence were rife, a police member was captured by three villagers and taken away by force, but he was rescued after firing four shots in the air. As villagers attacked throwing handmade fire bombs against police, three shots were fired using rubber bullets. So the

villagers moved back and left for Hsete old village and the mob was dispersed at about 10.40 am. Three villagers were wounded in the incident and they are being treated at Monywa People's Hospital, but they are not in critical condition.

The investigation commission chaired by Daw Aung San Suu Kyi was formed by the government to expose real situations regarding Latpadaungtaung

unrest and violence emerged to jeopardize communality peace and tranquility, law and order and the rule of law. Officials concerned warned them to abide by law while implementations are underway in accord with the report, but the situation has worsened. So, warning shots were fired. Regarding the incidents, punitive actions will be taken against those who were taken into custody for their anarchic acts and

The President expressed his delight for the ASEAN's special focus on family values and sharing in setting up the ASEAN Community, calling for reducing the development gap among ASEAN countries.

He stressed the need for close cooperation in combating illegal drug

trafficking, piracy, human trafficking and addressing the issues of immigrant workers. He also spoke of his support for six basic principles of South China Sea and agreements between ASEAN and China as well as his concerns of a new flu virus strain in China, calling for preventive measures.

Senator John Joseph Hogg is as follows:-

John Joseph Hogg (born 19 March 1949) is an Australian politician, and has been a member of the Australian Senate for the state of Queensland since July 1996, representing the Australian Labor Party. He was elected the 23rd President of the Senate on 26 August 2008.

Hogg was born in Brisbane to Francis Patrick and Catherine Frances Hogg. He attended St Joseph's College, Gregory Terrace and then the University of Queensland, where he graduated with a Bachelor of Science. He later completed a Diploma in Primary Teaching at Kedron Park Teachers College, part of the Queensland University of Technology, and he has taught at both primary and secondary schools. He was

an official with the Shop, Distributive and Allied Employees Association (SDA) from 1976 to 1996. The SDA is one of the leading unions supporting the right-wing faction of the Labor Party. In 1978 he married Susan Mary Lynch, and subsequently raised two daughters and a son.

Hogg joined the ALP in 1976 and became an active member in the organization, attending the Queensland State Conference as a delegate in 1981 and the National Conference in 1984. He became a member of the ALP's Administrative Committee in 1982 and eventually a representative on the National Executive. He continued to rise within the party, eventually becoming the Chair of the ALP National Policy Committee (Government Administration) in 1991. He was preselected as first candidate on the ALP ticket for the Queensland Senate to replace retiring Gerry Jones in 1996. A member of the Labor Right faction, he defeated the Socialist Left candidate Jeff Slowgrove 76 to 72. He was elected and took office as Senator on 1 July 1996. In August 2002 Hogg was elected Deputy President of the Senate and Chairman of Committee. After the ALP won government in 2007, Hogg was elected to replace Alan Ferguson as President of the Senate. On 10 August 2012, Senator Hogg said that he would be retiring from politics at the end of his current term in June 2014, and not contesting the 2013 federal election.

Senior US military officer visits Chinese Army

Indonesia signs investment MOU with China's Anhui Province

JAKARTA, 25 April—Indonesia's Investment Coordinating Board (BKPM) on Wednesday signed an investment memorandum of understanding (MOU) with China's Anhui Province, in an effort to promote the investment cooperation between the two sides.

Under the MOU, the east China province with 60 million populations agreed to establish an economic and trade cooperation zone in Indonesia to accommodate factories and companies from Anhui Province.

However, neither BKPM nor Anhui mentioned the total investment value. Speaking at the signing ceremony, BKPM deputy chairman Achmad Kurdiani said the signing of the MOU marks the establishment of investment promotion partnership between Anhui Province and Indonesia. “It will be an effective endeavor in increasing investment activities of Chinese investors from Anhui Province into Indonesia and vice versa,” Achmad said.

Cao Yong, Director-General of the Department of Commerce of Anhui Province of Commerce of Anhui Province, said In-

donesia is a very dynamic country with huge natural resource and the Anhui government encourages its companies and entrepreneurs to invest in Indonesia. “The establishment of the economic and trade cooperation zone in Indonesia will surely promote more companies from Anhui to invest here and get developed with Indonesia,” Cao said.

According to Cao, the economic and trade cooperation between Anhui Province and Indonesia has been experiencing a rapid increase in recent years, with the total import and export trade volume reaching 1.07 billion US dollars in 2012, up 106 percent from a year earlier.

Zhang Baoshun, secretary of Anhui Provincial Committee of the Communist Party of China, attended the signing ceremony, who led an economic and trade delegation to investigate Indonesia's investment environment.

Anhui Conch Cement Co, China's largest cement manufacturer has also reached an investment intention with South Sulawesi's Maros County government at the signing ceremony.—Xinhua

Student to walk 700 km for post-disaster park reconstruction survey

ISHINOMAKI, (Japan), 25 April—A Waseda University student has walked some 400 kilometres through northeastern Japan on a field survey to choose a path for a Sanriku Fukko (Reconstruction) National Park, to be created by rebuilding parks damaged by the earthquake and tsunami of 11 March, 2011. “I wanted to contribute to support for disaster-damaged areas one way or another,” Shunsuke Goto, 22, said, explaining why he had applied for participation in the survey solicited by a consulting firm in Tokyo on behalf of the Environment Ministry.

The selection of the 700-km coastal path, called “Tohoku Kaigan Trail,” from Hachinohe, Aomori Prefecture, to Soma, Fukushima Prefecture, is a core project for the national park scheme as a symbol of reconstruction in the disaster-ravaged northeastern Japan region of Tohoku. Goto began walk-

ing with ministry officials and others from Kabushima in Hachinohe on 1 December last year. While commuting between his whereabouts on the route and Tokyo, he has walked 400 km thus far.

“A fisherman let me stay at his home and I talked with construction workers I met at an inn,” Goto said. “I really enjoy getting to know people.” On a Monday in mid-February, Goto left Minamisanriku, Miyagi Prefecture, under powder snow at 9 am. He dropped by a restaurant in the town and ate a bowl of noodles and other local meals served by Eiko Narisawa, 58, even though it was before she opened her restaurant. “People in Tohoku are very warmhearted and help me at all times,” Goto said. Goto kept walking on the coastal national road with mountains of rubble set aside.

At one point, he turned into a forest trail covered with knee-high snow and

reached a mountain path, with an altitude of around 300 meters, on the border between the town and the city of Ishinomaki after two hours of walking. From the snow-blanketed path, he looked down at the port and residential areas still show-

ing scars of the disaster. Descending from the mountain path, Goto reached his goal for the day at the mouth of the Kitakami River in Ishinomaki. He walked 16 km for seven and a half hours including break time.

Philippine military augments forces in south to pursue leftist rebels

MANILA, 25 April — The Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) has recently sent a Marine battalion to southern Province of Misamis Oriental to augment the local government troops who have been pursuing the leftist rebels there, a senior

government official said on Wednesday.

Philippine Presidential Spokesperson Edwin Lacierda, in a news briefing, said that the government forces have intensified their operations against the New People's Army (NPA) who

ambushed the convoy of Gingoog City Mayor Ruthie Guingona last Saturday. Gingoog City is part of Misamis Oriental. “There was a Marine battalion that's moved to the 4th Infantry Division, which covers Misamis Oriental.—Xinhua

Japan may see nuclear reactors resume operating from fall

TOKYO, 25 April—Industry minister Toshimitsu Motegi said on Tuesday that some of the country's idled nuclear reactors might resume operating this autumn at the earliest after undergoing a new safety assessment process. The Nuclear Regulation Authority plans to introduce new safety requirements for nuclear power plants in mid-July, opening the door for utilities to apply for permits to put their reactors back online.

Motegi told reporters the new requirements will take effect “in the summer,” so the schedule for the resumption of reactors will be “autumn at the earliest.” It is the first time that the economy, trade and industry minister referred to the timing of the restart of a reactor.

Of the 50 commercial reactors in Japan, only two are currently online amid safety concerns over the use of nuclear power in the wake of the 2011 Fukushima Dai-ichi plant disaster. Utilities hope to restart idled reactors once the new regulations come into force as they are struggling with increasing fuel costs for thermal power generation to make up for the loss of halted nuclear power generation.—Kyodo News

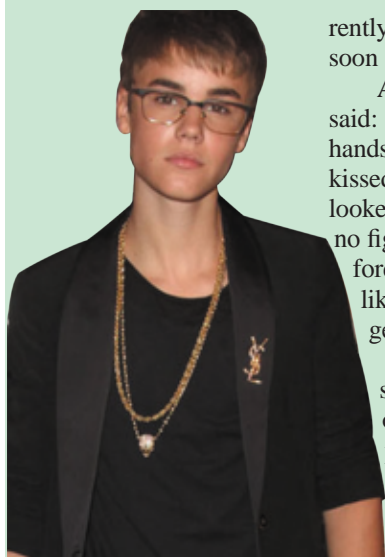

Frankfurt, Kaufmann, Stemme top opera honours

LONDON, 25 April—Frankfurt Opera was crowned the world's best opera company on Monday at the inaugural International Opera Awards which were set up to promote opera to a wider audience as it comes under increasing financial pressure.

The award was one of 21 prizes announced at a ceremony in central London to kick off "The Operas", annual awards set up by Opera Magazine and British businessman Harry Hyman.

German Jonas Kaufmann, often described as the "new king of tenors", was crowned the best male singer after strong reviews from productions of "Carmen" and with his solo albums, Verismo Arias and Wagner, becoming bestsellers within weeks of release.

Swedish soprano Nina Stemme, who received raves in Munich, Milan and Paris for her Wagner, beat five others including Joyce DiDonato and Sarah Con-

nolly to be named best female singer.

Briton Antonio Pappano, music director of Britain's Royal Opera House, won the award for best conductor.

The winners list said that under its intendant Bernd Loebe, the Frankfurt Opera had established itself as one of Europe's best, with houses almost regularly filled to capacity for a mix of rarely performed works and more mainstream repertoire.

Opera Magazine editor John Allison said he hoped the awards would bring more recognition to opera at an economically tough time when many opera houses were struggling

due to a drop in private sponsorships and state subsidies.

"Very few opera companies in the world are immune to the financial pinch," Allison said, adding that this could stifle creativity and tempt opera companies "to play it safe".

Hyman said the awards were intended to broaden the audience for opera and encourage new talent by creating bursaries.

"I hope they will become the Oscars of opera," he said.

Clippers' Paul calls late-game heroics "just basketball"

LOS ANGELES, 25 April—Chris Paul drove right, stumbled forward, leaned back and banked in a game-winning shot that lifted the Los Angeles Clippers to a crucial playoff win on Monday and elevated his status as one of the game's top closers.

While Kobe Bryant, Kevin Durant and LeBron James are often noted as fourth-quarter assassins, it is the diminutive six-foot (1.83m) Paul who provided the signature moment of the National Basketball Association (NBA) playoffs thus far.

Paul's last-second jumper gave the Clippers a 93-91 victory and a 2-0 lead in their best-of-seven first-round series with the Memphis Grizzlies that left the home crowd buzzing.

"He's so stubborn and strong-willed. There's not too many players like that," Clippers forward Lamar Odom told *Reuters*, likening Paul's clutch play to former team mate Bryant.

"It's all about their mentality. He just didn't take no for an answer."

Paul finished with 24 points and nine assists, and got the final say in a duel

with Grizzlies guard Mike Conley, who had a playoff-career-high 28 points and nine rebounds, but it was the timing of his points that made all the difference.

As Los Angeles let a 12-point advantage slip away in the fourth quarter, Paul scored the last eight points for his team in what has become a familiar occurrence for the Clippers.

Blake Griffin's scene-stealing athleticism is the high point of a deep and exciting roster, but when it comes to the last 12 min-

utes of a close game the offense begins and ends with point guard Paul.

"Any time we get in those positions, he's our closer and we look for him to close games out," said Clippers guard Chauncey Billups, nicknamed 'Mr. Big Shot' for his own ability to make crucial buckets during his career.

"All great players are not clutch. Chris has proved to be one of the best clutch players in the NBA."

It is that intangible of Paul's that has resuscitated

the Clippers franchise and helped them steal some billing from the crosstown rival Lakers.

When the Clippers traded for the All Star guard prior to the 2011-12 NBA season they were looking to reverse a painful history of losing.

Paul quickly cured that with his fierce competitiveness and fearlessness in the closing stages of games. The Clippers beat the Grizzlies to reach the second round of the playoffs last year and captured a maiden Pacific Division crown this season.

"I don't think it's that dramatic," said Paul, of the big moment. "It's just basketball."

It certainly felt that dramatic to everyone else Monday when Paul blew past Memphis defender Tony Allen, lofted a shot over Darrell Arthur and raised his reputation to yet a new height.

Even opponent Conley felt the weight of the play.

"That's what great players do," Conley said. "We did our best to defend him. He just hit a tough shot."

England's Pietersen ruled out of Champions Trophy

LONDON, 25 April—England batsman Kevin Pietersen will not be ready for the one-day series with New Zealand and June's Champions Trophy after a further scan on his injured knee on Wednesday, fueling speculation he could be an Ashes doubt.

"Kevin Pietersen has been ruled out of the ICC Champions Trophy following a repeat MRI scan on his right knee earlier today," the England and Wales Cricket Board said in a statement, adding he would also skip the New Zealand one-dayers which precede the tournament.

The 32-year-old had already been told he would miss the two-match test series against New Zealand next month because of the injury.

He suffered the knee problem during fielding practice in the away series in New Zealand last month and was unable to play in the third and final test.

The home five-test Ashes series against Australia starts in Nottingham on 10 July with the Champions Trophy one-day tour-

namment taking place from 6-23 June, also in England.

Pietersen remains England's most explosive batsman and any sign he will miss all or part of the Ashes offers encouragement to Australia, who named their squad earlier on Wednesday and are seen as underdogs after losing the last two series.

"Pietersen will now start a graduated rehabilitation programme with a view to resuming full training by the middle of June," the ECB statement added.

The Spaniard lost 7-5, 3-6, 6-1 to the Russian but seven-time champion Rafa Nadal eased past Carlos

Berlocq 6-4, 6-2.

Four-time finalist Ferrer had pulled out of the Monte Carlo Masters event last week with a thigh muscle injury picked up when losing in the Miami final to Andy Murray last month.

"It was a game to forget, one of the worst I have played," a downcast Ferrer told reporters after his defeat in blustery conditions.

"I wasn't good in tennis terms, mentally, or with

my attitude. It affects me personally because my opportunities to win here are getting fewer as I get older," said the 31-year-old.

"Tursunov's been very good, better than me, and in the end that's why he won."

Second seed Nadal, who beat Ferrer in last year's final, started his bid for an eighth Barcelona title with a tough workout against Argentine Berlocq.

Liverpool's Gerrard faces likely shoulder surgery

LONDON, 25 April—Liverpool and England captain Steven Gerrard is likely to need shoulder surgery at the end of the season, the Premier League club said on Wednesday.

If the 32-year-old, who has been ever present in this season's league campaign, has surgery in the close season he could miss England's friendlies against Ireland at Wembley on May 29 and away to Brazil on 2 June.

"It's looking more and more likely that he might require surgery," first team coach Mike Marsh told the club's website (www.liverpoolfc.com).

"He has been playing with a shoulder injury for quite a while now. We'll try to find the right time for him to get it fixed properly."

"It's not ideal timing, it's going to take quite a while for him to heal... If it

He has made 628 appearances for the Merseyside club where he has spent his entire career after coming through the youth ranks, scoring 159 goals.

Rare breakage blamed for Alonso wing problem

LONDON, 25 April—The rear wing problem that wrecked Fernando Alonso's hopes of winning in Bahrain last weekend was due to a rare component failure within the DRS

system, Ferrari said after an investigation.

"It's the first problem of its kind on this system seen on the three years dur-

ing which it has been used," the Italian team said on their website. "The failure is not something that causes concern for the long term."

The DRS (drag reduction system) is a driver-oper-

ated adjustable flap that can be opened to provide more speed for overtaking in certain designated zones on the circuit.

Ferrari team principal Stefano Domenicali said Sunday's failure had prevented the Spaniard, who had been in second place, from fighting Red Bull's eventual winner Sebastian Vettel for the victory. Alonso, who won the previous race in

China, finished the Bahrain Grand Prix in eighth place and is fourth overall in the standings and 30 points behind Vettel.—Reuters

Early flying dinosaur can catch fish

VANCOUVER, 25 April— Microraptors, a flying dinosaur about the size of a modern-day hawk, could catch preys in the water as well as on land, according to a Canadian research. The research, published earlier this week in the journal *Evolution*, challenged previous belief that microraptors lived in trees and preyed exclusively on small birds and mammals about the size of squirrels.

The new evidence of Microraptor's hunting ability came from fossilized remains in China, in which the stomach content of fish was easily identified, said Scott Persons, a paleontology graduate student at the University of Alberta.

"Now we know that Microraptor operated in varied terrain and had a varied diet," said Persons. "It took advantage of a

variety of prey in the wet and forested environment" in the current China terrain during the early Cretaceous period, or 120 million years ago.

Further analysis of the fossil revealed that its teeth were adapted to catching slippery, wiggling preys like fish. Dinosaur researchers have established that most meat-eaters had teeth with serrations on both sides, which helped the predator saw through meat like a steak knife.

But the Microraptor's teeth were serrated on just one side, and were angled forward. It is another evidence that shows Microraptor's adaption to impale fish on its teeth. "With reduced serrations, the prey wouldn't tear itself apart while it struggled," said Persons. "Microraptor could simply raise its head back; the fish would slip off the teeth and be swallowed whole, no fuss, no muss."

At Cannes, Kawase won the Camera d'Or for the best new director award in 1997 for "Moe no Suzaku," her first film made for theater screening, and won the Grand Prix in 2007 for "Mogari no Mori" (The Mourning Forest).

Director Steven Spielberg will serve as head of the jury for the 66th Cannes film festival

to be held from 15 to 26 May in the southern French city, while the jury will also include actress Nicole Kidman and director Ang Lee.

Brazil booted by own fans in 2-2 draw with Chile

LONDON, 25 April— Brazil were booed by their own fans after stumbling to a 2-2 draw with Chile in their first friendly at a 2014 World Cup stadium on Wednesday.

The match at the newly refurbished Mineirao in Belo Horizonte was coach Luiz Felipe Scolari's last test before naming his squad on 14 May for the Confederations Cup to be held at six venues in Brazil in June. The friendly, in which Chile were attempting to win in Brazil for the first time in 26 appearances, was also a chance for the local World Cup organising committee to test the venue, the second to be ready for the 15-30 June tournament.

Despite a good turnout with a crowd of over 53,000 and a pre-match party, the demanding home fans booed their team and shouted 'Ole' when the Chileans exchanged a string of passes.

"One day you're booed, the next you're praised, football's like that," said striker Neymar, who put

Brazil 2-1 up in the 54th minute from a pass by substitute striker Alexandre Pato. Defender Marcos Gonzalez, who plays his club football in Brazil for Flamengo, headed Chile into the lead from a free kick in the

eighth minute. Centre back Rever equalised for Brazil midway through the first half heading home Neymar's corner. Striker Eduardo Vargas, who plays for Brazilian side Gremio, gave Chile the draw with a superb shot

into the top corner from outside the box in the 64th.

"It's difficult with a team that only trained once. We tried but everyone knew it was going to be tough," Brazil captain Ronaldinho said. Brazil, who as World Cup hosts have been limited to playing friendlies, have won one, drawn three and lost one of their five games under 2002 world champion coach Scolari in his second spell in charge.

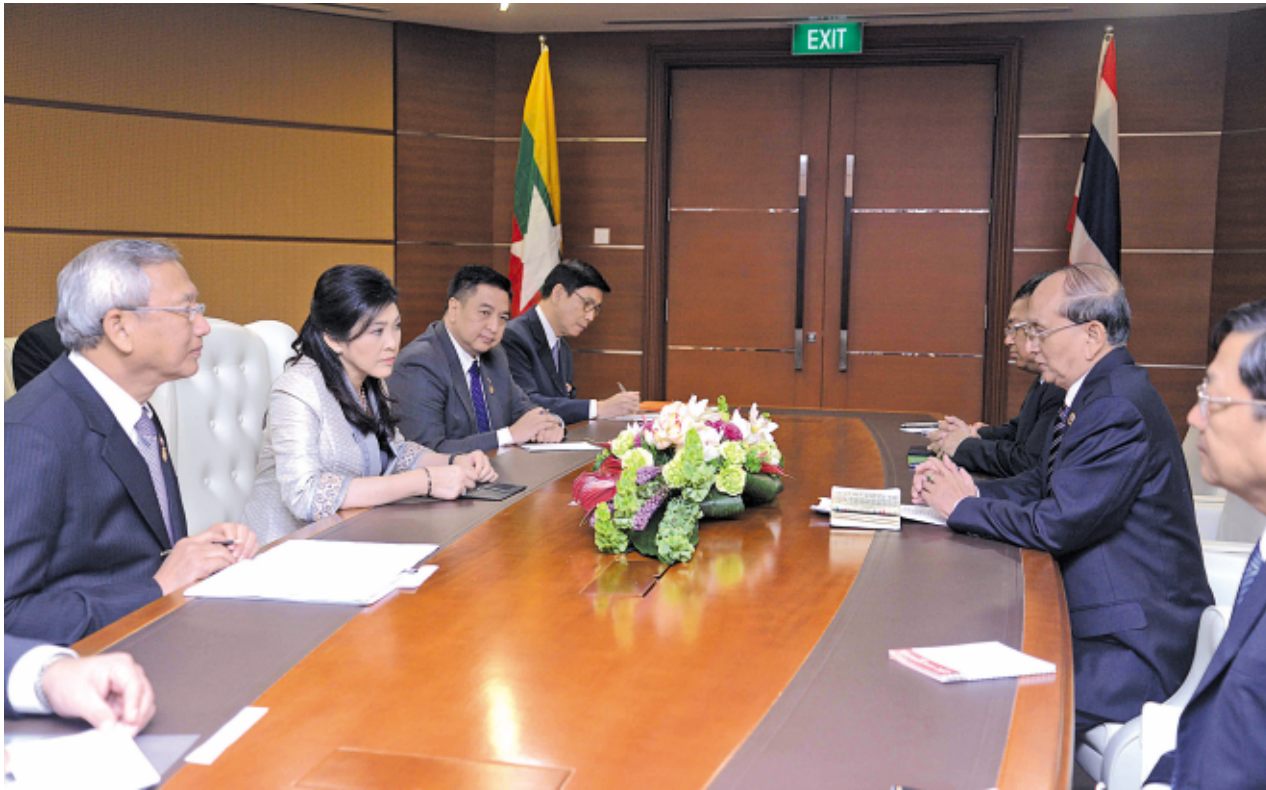

NAYPYI TAW, 25 April— Nearly 30 villagers from Zidaw and Moegyobyin villages headed by Aung Soe, Ko Htet (Yangon Public Service Network), Thaug Htaik Oo (Yangon University of Arts and Science Students Union), and Zaw Naing and Win Kyaw of Moegyobyin Aleywa Village harrowed the cropland with eight cows to the north of Block No. 8 MCC of Letpadaungtaung
