IFAD to offer USD 36 million of loans for Myanmar's farm sector development

NAY PYI TAW, 9 May—President U Thein Sein looked into thriving Paethwe hybrid summer paddy at mechanized farming (3000 acres) plantation irrigated by Ngalike dam near Hotel Zone in Deikkhinathiri Township, Nay Pyi Taw Council Area at 6:30 am today.

Owner charged over plywood factory food poisoning

in Waw Township of Bago Region on 5 May, but the third light truck fled the search.

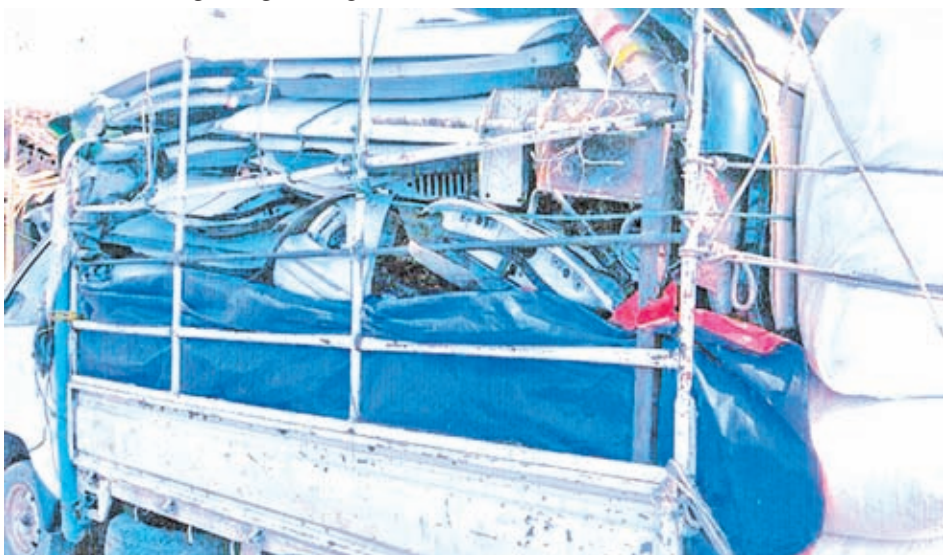
Drivers of the seized light truck with illegal goods also fled the scene.

Finland ranked the best place for being mothers

HELSINKI, 9 May—Finland was considered to be the country where mothers enjoy the best conditions in the world, according to a worldwide report released on Tuesday. The annual report — State of World's Mothers 2013 — was issued by an international NGO "Save the Children" before the Mother's Day in mid-May.

The report was featured by a ranking list of Mothers' index, showing the conditions of mothers in 176 countries— where mothers fare better and where they face more hardships. Among the reviewed countries, Finland was ranked the best country for being mothers followed by Sweden, Norway, Iceland and Holland, and Democratic Republic of Congo was considered to be the toughest place. The mothers' well-being was assessed under five indexes, including maternal health, child mortality, education, working income and political status.

According to the

annual report, one in thirty pregnant women in DR Congo died from maternal causes, while in Finland the ratio was only one in 12,200. As for education, women in DR Congo were likely to be educated for 8.5 years, compared with 17 years in Finland. Nearly 43 percent of Finnish parliamentary seats were held by women, whereas the ratio in DR Congo was only 8 percent.

Although Finland did not perform the absolute "best" in each index, it became the only country with all five indexes ranking among the top 12. China ranked the 68th place, the best ranking among the major emerging developing countries. The international NGO "Save the Children", established in Britain in 1919, is devoted to promote rights, provide relief and give support for children in developing countries. It has published the annual report of State of the World's Mothers since 2000.

UN Security Council condemns detention of peacekeepers in Golan

NEW YORK, 9 May—The UN Security Council on Wednesday issued a statement strongly condemning "armed elements" of the Syrian opposition for holding four peacekeepers in the Golan Heights.

"The members of the Security Council strongly condemned the detention of four United Nations Disengagement Observer Force (UNDOF) peacekeepers from the Philippine Battalion within the Area of Limitation in the vicinity of Al Jamla," the Press statement said, referring to the area where the peacekeepers were monitoring a 1974 cease-fire agreement between Syria and Israel. The 15 member council also demanded

their "unconditional and immediate release" and called on the parties "to cooperate with UNDOF in good faith."

The four were detained on Tuesday while out on patrol. They are still being detained, but there are indications that "the four peacekeepers have not been harmed and efforts are still underway to secure their release," UN Secretary General Ban Ki Moon's spokesman, Martin Nesirky, told reporters at a briefing on Wednesday.

The latest incident following the abduction of 21 UNDOF peacekeepers, also from the Philippines, on 6 March, who were later released.

Putin says satisfied with Russia-US cooperation

MOSCOW, 9 May—Russian President Vladimir Putin said on Tuesday he was satisfied with the level of cooperation between Russia and the United States. "It is good that our contacts with colleagues from the United States are maintained at all level regularly," Putin said during his meeting with visiting US Secretary of State John Kerry.

Recalling two recent telephone talks with his US counterpart, Putin expressed his hope that

the contacts with President Barack Obama could be even closer. "I hope to meet him personally in the near future," Putin said, adding he and Obama "have several possibilities for a meeting this year." According to Putin's Press secretary Dmitry Peskov, a meeting between Putin and Obama is planned during a Group of Eight (G8) summit in Northern Ireland scheduled this June.

Kerry confirmed that Obama is looking forward to meeting with Putin on the sidelines of the G8 summit

over major international issues including the Syrian crisis, the Iranian nuclear programme and the situation around the Korean Peninsula. As for the reply of a message from Obama to Putin delivered

by US National Security Adviser Tom Donilon who visit Moscow last month, Peskov said the letter was still under preparation and would not be given to Kerry during his visit here.

Chinese Premier meets Israel PM, urging cooperation

BEIJING, 9 May—Chinese Premier Li Keqiang on Wednesday underscored the country's commitment to seek stronger cooperation with Israel and boost the Middle East peace process. Li made the comments in an hour-long talk with Israel Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu in the Great Hall of the People.

He reviewed the robust

growth of China-Israel relations since the two countries forged diplomatic ties in 1992, citing rapid development of bilateral cooperation in various fields.

The premier said the new Chinese government has placed great importance on developing ties with Israel, calling on the two countries to step up exchanges between governments, parliaments, parties and non-governmental organizations, and work more closely in education, tourism and other people-to-people fields.

I said the Palestinian issue is at the core of factors influencing peace and stability in the Middle East, stressing dialogue is the only effective way to finding peaceful solutions.

He told his guest that China expects Israel and Palestine to work together, take substantive measures to remove obstacles and

create conditions for the restoration and progress of peace talks between Palestine and Israel, which is in the interests of Israel and Palestine and works for regional and world peace and stability. Friends of Israel and Palestine, China has always take an objective and fair stance and would like to make joint efforts with all parties to promote the Middle East peace process, Li said.

On the economic front, he called on the two countries to expand two-way trade, and add value to it. To deepen science and technology cooperation, Li proposed the two countries jointly build industrial zones and technology-transfer centres to make the best of their advantages. The premier welcomed more Israeli investment in China's cutting-edge technology fields.

Bangladesh factory fire kills eight; collapse toll tops 900

DHAKA, 9 May—Eight people were killed when a fire swept through a clothing factory in Bangladesh, police and an industry association official said on Thursday, as the death toll from the collapse of another factory building two weeks ago climbed above 900.

The fire, in an industrial district of Dhaka, comes amid global attention on safety standards in Bangladesh's booming garment industry following the catastrophic collapse of Rana Plaza, on the outskirts of the city, in the world's deadliest industrial accident since the Bhopal disaster in India in 1984.

"It is not clear to us how the accident happened, but we are trying to find

out the cause," Mohammad Atiqul Islam, president of the Bangladesh Garment Manufacturers and Exporters Association (BGMEA), told Reuters.

On Wednesday the Bangladesh government

said it had shut down 18 garment factories for safety reasons following the 24 April collapse of Rana Plaza, which housed five garment factories making clothes for Western brands.

China opposes US report on Chinese military

BEIJING, 9 May—Chinese Foreign Ministry spokeswoman on Tuesday expressed "firm opposition" to a Pentagon report that misrepresents China's military development. "We firmly oppose the report and have made representations to the United States," Hua Chunying said at a daily Press briefing.

Her comments came after the US Department of Defence on Monday released its annual report on China's military, expanding its coverage to include more aspects, while still overlooking the country's peaceful defence policy.

The 83-page report, titled Military and Security Development involving the People's Republic of China 2013, includes more information on China's cyber capabilities and activities. While recognizing that China has increased diplomatic engagement and advocacy for the issue of cyber security, the report claimed some of the cyber attacks against US government computer networks in 2012 "appear to be attributable directly to the Chinese government and military."

Hua said the Pentagon report unjustly criticizes China's justified and normal military development, plays up China's military threat and damages trust and cooperation between the two countries. The spokeswoman stressed China has always adhered to the path of peaceful development, pursued a military strategy which is defensive in nature and become a staunch force in safeguarding peace and stability in Asia, the Pacific region and the world.—Xinhua

US court scrutinizes class suit against Google e-book project

NEW YORK, 9 May — A US federal appeals court on Wednesday questioned the reasoning behind a class-action lawsuit against Google Inc over its effort to digitize millions of books, suggesting that many authors could benefit from the project.

Billions of dollars are at stake in the long-running dispute, in which The Authors Guild as well as groups representing photographers and graphic artists argue that the Google Books project amounts to massive copyright infringement.

US returning looted Tyrannosaurus skeleton to Mongolia

WASHINGTON, 9 May — A 70-million-year-old dinosaur skeleton from the Gobi Desert that was smuggled to the United States in pieces and auctioned for more than \$1 million was returned on Monday by the US government to Mongolia.

The huge Tyrannosaurus bataar's skull was on display at a repatriation ceremony near the United Nations in New York, where officials of the US Attorney's Office in Manhattan and the US Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) formally turned over the nearly complete skeleton to Mongolian officials.

Mongolia demanded the return of the 8-foot-tall (2.4 metre), 24-foot-long (7.3 metre), mostly reconstructed cousin of the Tyrannosaurus rex last year after commercial paleontol-

ment.

Google is appealing a lower court's ruling allowing the plaintiffs to pursue a class-action lawsuit rather than file claims individually.

If the 2nd US Circuit Court of Appeals bars the plaintiffs from suing collectively, it likely would be much harder for them to win a large damages award against Google.

Circuit Judge Pierre Leval, one of three judges hearing Google's appeal, said the company's project could benefit many authors.

ogist Eric Prokopi sold it at a Manhattan auction last spring for \$1.05 million. Prokopi, based in Gainesville, Florida, bought and sold whole and partial fossilized dinosaur skeletons.

US authorities filed charges against Prokopi in October and seized the skeleton, which is comprised of fossilized bones welded to a metal frame.

"This is one of the most important repatriations of fossils in recent years," ICE Director John Morton said in a statement. "We cannot allow the greed of a few looters and schemers to trump the cultural interests of an entire nation."

Morton said the repatriation would "undo a great wrong by returning this priceless dinosaur skeleton to the people of Mongolia."

It could particularly help writers whose works are more obscure, by telling readers where they could buy their books, he said.

"A lot of authors would say, 'Hey, that's great for me,'" Leval said.

Robert LaRocca, a lawyer for the plaintiffs, argued that a survey of class members that Google conducted was flawed. That survey, plaintiffs said in court papers, showed that 500 authors, or 58 percent of those surveyed, approved of Google's project.

"We think the vast majority of the class support us," he said. The case derives from the Mountain View, California-based company's 2004 agreement with several research libraries to digitize books with a goal of helping researchers and the general public find material.

Google has since scanned more than 20 million books and posted snippets of more than 4 million online. The project could have "enormous value for our culture," said Circuit Judge Barrington Parker.

Target tests if Facebook-driven deals bring shoppers into stores

NEW YORK, 9 May—Target Corp is rolling out Cartwheel, a service that combines social networking and discounts, the latest attempt by a US retailer to lure shoppers into its physical stores rather than seeing them buy from online rivals. Target said its new programme relies on shoppers using their Facebook accounts. However, shoppers can only redeem the offers they choose in Target's US stores, not online.

With Cartwheel, shoppers select the deals they want online and then bring a barcode — either on paper or on a mobile phone — to a Target store to get the discounts. Shoppers can see what offers their Facebook friends have chosen, and earn more offers by having their Facebook friends sign up.

This service comes as traditional retailers try to keep shoppers buying from them rather than from Amazon.com Inc and other online-only retailers, especially as shoppers use their smartphones to compare prices.

Twenty percent of

cellphone owners research products using their phones before they buy, and 18 percent of them compare prices on their phones before making a purchase, according to Bill Tancer, general manager of global research for Experian Marketing Services.

Cartwheel follows efforts such as Wal-Mart Stores Inc letting shoppers in some of its US stores scan their goods with their iPhones while they shop and then more quickly proceed through a self-checkout lane. Sears Holdings Corp's "Member Assist"

programme gives its loyal shoppers the ability to get personalized shopping advice from in-store personnel without even stepping foot in a Sears or Kmart store. "It is very fascinating to see the very different approaches that retailers are taking to achieve the same goals," said Carol Spieckerman, president of newmarketbuilders, a retail strategy firm.

Retailers are using digital tools to better cater to shoppers who love to comparison shop while in their stores.—Reuters

Looking for a comeback, Zynga embraces austerity and FarmVille

SAN FRANCISCO, 9 May — In the past twelve months, Zynga Inc has struggled with a contracting player base, a deflated stock price and waves of layoffs. Now it is coming to terms with downsized ambitions.

As Chief Executive Mark Pincus, 47, leads the online games developer he founded in 2007 through perhaps the most crucial year of his tenure, he is pushing to restore revenues by doubling down on

"FarmVille," the franchise that took Facebook users by storm four years ago and launched Zynga to stardom.

Though some industry observers had declared farm simulation games a fad and predicted FarmVille 2's early demise, the sequel to Zynga's best-known title has defied expectations at its San Francisco headquarters, Pincus said in an interview. FarmVille 2 has clung to its perch near the top of Facebook charts and the number of people who play the game each day still hovers near all-time highs of 8 million, even six months after launch.

Given a glaring weakness in mobile games, however, one of Zynga's current priorities is porting FarmVille 2 to mobile devices so players can move from PCs to smartphones and back without losing their data. That presented technical challenges that the company is ironing out, Pincus said.

"The ideal is to make that one seamless experience between Web and mobile so you can take your farming experience from work to home," Pincus said. "We're having to retool and reinvent around our process and technology."

Pincus badly needs a reliable hit franchise. In the past nine months, Zynga has shuttered 20 titles and closed offices in Baltimore, Boston and Tokyo. It has trimmed 5 percent of its workforce, though its headcount of nearly 3,000 still dwarfs that of fierce rivals like Supercell, a Finnish company with 100 people that claims an equivalent amount of revenue, or the 600-strong Rovio, the publisher behind the "Angry Birds" games.

Gone is the swagger

that defined the early years, when Zynga's army of developers flooded the market with dozens of new titles from cooking games to bingo variations, its dealmakers splashed money to snap up smaller rivals, and its managers opened studios in cities around the world.

Wall Street is viewing Pincus' shift with cautious approval, having been singed by Zynga's abysmal stock performance — an 80 percent decline over the past year that began around the time it invested \$180 million in then-promising game studio OMGPOP.

Almost 18 months after going public, Zynga is staving off fierce competition from newer or nimbler rivals that mimic its games.

Supercell, founded in 2010, has scored with "Hay Day," an iPad game that contains elements resembling FarmVille. With just one other game under its belt, Supercell says it is on track to make more than \$800 million in revenue this year, roughly equal to the \$860 million that Wall Street expects from Zynga in 2013.

Tim Hortons names new CEO; profit and stock drop

TORONTO, 9 May — Tim Hortons Inc (THI.TO) named a long-time Nestle executive as its new chief on Wednesday, a job that will be no easy task given drooping demand at the Canadian coffee and doughnut chain and a push by a US hedge fund for better returns.

Shares of Tim Hortons, which boasts that it sells eight of every 10 cups of coffee sold in Canada, fell more than 2.5 percent after the company posted its first decline in established store sales since its 2006 initial public offering.

The company, under pressure from hedge fund

Highfields Capital to boost shareholder returns, said it is considering the Boston-based fund's key demands. But any change will await its new CEO, Nestle (NESN.VX) veteran Marc Caira, a 59-year-old Canadian. Highfields wants the chain to take on new debt to buy back shares and believes that Tim Hortons' US returns do not justify further investment there.

It also wants the company to enter into less capital-intensive franchise deals in the United States or scrap its US expansion plans, according to documents seen by Reuters. Interim CEO Paul House said Tims won't pull back from

the US market, but is studying a plan to work with well-funded franchisees who could operate multiple locations there.

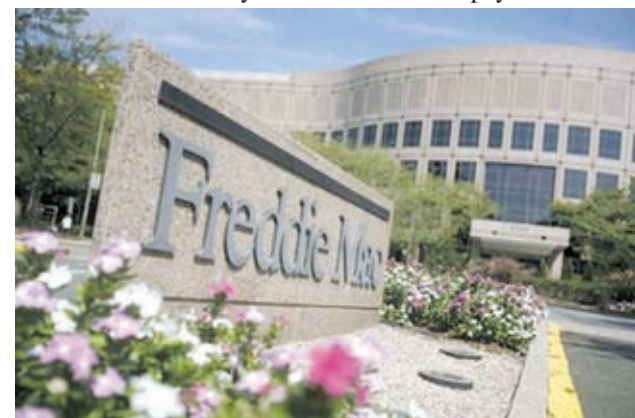
Tim Hortons said it will also consider taking on additional debt and study what would be its "optimal" capital structure considering historically low interest rates. Increased debt could affect its tax rate and investment grade credit rating, it warned. But executives said they had already considered and rejected a Highfields proposal to create a real estate investment trust to house Tim Hortons property assets because it would not create significant value.—Reuters

Freddie Mac posts second-biggest profit in its history

WASHINGTON, 9 May — Freddie Mac (FMCC.OB), the No 2 provider of US mortgage money, on Wednesday said it reaped its second-largest profit ever in the first quarter, a reflection of housing market gains that have taken the steam out of efforts to revamp the nation's home loan system.

Freddie Mac, which faced insolvency when it was seized by the US government in 2008 along with its larger rival Fannie Mae (FNMA.OB), paid \$5.8 billion to the US Treasury in the first quarter as a dividend payment under

Tesla first-quarter profit tops forecast, lifts sales outlook

DETROIT, 9 May — Tesla Motors Inc (TSLA.O) reported its first-ever quarterly profit on Wednesday, trouncing Wall Street estimates, as the 10-year-old automaker delivered nearly 5,000 Model S electric cars during the first three months of the year.

surprised analysts, suppliers and even Tesla executives.

The automaker reported adjusted first-quarter earnings of 12 cents per share, triple the 4 cents per share expected by analysts, on average, according to Thomson Reuters I/B/E/S.

Tesla also reported higher-than-expected revenue of \$562 million. The company sold 4,900 cars in the first quarter, topping its initial forecast of 4,500.

The first-quarter results sent Tesla shares up 17 percent to \$65.50 in after-hours trading on the Nasdaq. Tesla shares have risen more than two-thirds this year.

The Model S, Tesla's second model after the more expensive Roadster, is Tesla's effort to reach a

broader group of buyers. A Model S equipped with a 60 kilowatt battery starts at around \$70,000 before a \$7,500 tax credit.

gins of 25 percent in the fourth quarter of 2013.

Tesla's profit stands in sharp contrast to other green car startups that have struggled over the last year, particularly its luxury rival Fisker, which makes the Karma plug-in hybrid.

News Corp results beat estimates, spin-off on track

NEW YORK, 9 May — Rupert Murdoch's News Corp reported quarterly earnings that beat Wall Street expectations, aided by growth at its cable networks, and said it is on track to split off its slow-growing publishing business by the end of June. Its revenue rose 14 percent from a year earlier to \$9.5 billion in the quarter, ended 31 March, News Corp said on Wednesday. The company posted adjusted earnings of 36 cents per share, just beating the 35 cents expected on average by analysts, according to Thomson Reuters I/B/E/S.

Deutschland and the sale of an ownership stake in New Zealand's Sky Network Television, helped lift net income to \$2.85 billion, a jump from \$937 million a year earlier.

The New York-based company said it is on track to separate its cable channels, movie studio and other fast growing entertainment assets from its newspapers, including *The Wall Street Journal*, near the end of its fiscal year in June.

Its entertainment assets helped boost revenue and earnings for the quarter, led by its cable networks business, which includes the Fox News Channel, FX and regional sports networks. Operating income at the cable network programming unit rose 17 percent from a year earlier to \$993 million, as channels in the United States and abroad commanded higher fees from cable operators and more advertising revenue.—Reuters

Could vaginal delivery be safer for preemies?

NEW YORK, 9 May — Very premature babies have fewer breathing problems when they're born through vaginal delivery compared to cesarean section, a new study of more than 20,000 newborns suggests.

Based on those cases, researchers found that regardless of why a C-section was performed — whether because of pregnancy-related complications or the mother's medical problems, for example— vaginal delivery tended to be safer.

"My suspicion is that the labour process, the contractions, that natural squeezing probably does something to clear out the lungs so that when babies are born they have a better breathing status," said Dr Erika Werner, who led the new study at Johns Hopkins School of Medicine in Baltimore.

"If a vaginal delivery is safe, it's something that should be attempted," she said. The rate of C-sections in the United States has been rising for all pregnancies, leading some to worry about possible complications for mothers and babies. According to the US Centres for Disease Control

and Prevention, C-sections accounted for almost 1 in 3 births in 2010 — up from 1 in 5 in 1996.

There are certain circumstances — such as when a woman is bleeding or a baby has a drop in heart rate — when a C-section is required, Werner said.

Public announcement on actions of ministries concerned on letters of suggestion sent to Public Service Capacity Assessment Committee

Undertakings over the question about customs and port clearances of the Ministry of Finance and Revenue

1. Starting from 4-3-2013, it takes 20 minutes to handle a container at the port through green channel, 30 minutes through yellow channel and 50 minutes through red channel under Risk Management system.
2. Port clearance procedures were eased from seven steps to six steps.
3. To avoid loss of files submitted by agents and companies to Customs Department, steps are taken systematically with the use of Acknowledgement Receipt from E-Customs, documents together with ID from Noting Section and Time Sheet.
4. Office works of the Customs Department are being carried out by fulfilling the needs of manpower and work procedures were eased from six steps to five steps. C.M.P and exports cases are completed in a single day.
5. Regarding overage vehicle substitution program and import of vehicles through individual special permit, fines exemption is awarded to the vehicles which are one model year old.
6. Regarding changes in orders and laws of Customs Department, adequate time for the change will be taken into consideration if an order or directive is issued.
7. While conducting checks on goods at Yangon International Airport by customs staff, directives have been always given to them to do their jobs humbly

through close supervision.

Undertakings over the question about banking service

1. Relaxation of restrictions at Myanmar Economic Bank started on 2-4-2013 and officials themselves are monitoring the banking service at the counters.
2. In accord with anti-money laundering law, all banks across the country have been informed by the Central Bank of Myanmar that recommendations of two people who have savings accounts at bank are need to open a new savings account. Now officers and other ranks of Myanmar Economic Bank are allowed to give recommendations to the customer who is willing to open a new savings account in order to facilitate the process of opening a savings account at bank.
3. No questions will be needed to open a new savings account if all necessary requirements are fulfilled while documents are under scrutiny for opening of a new savings account at Myanmar Investment and Commercial Bank.
4. It is required to translate B.O.D Resolution (Board of Director Resolution), among documents submitted by companies, written in Russian, Japanese, Chinese and other languages into English to make Notary. Another recommendation of Myanmar embassies concerned in respective countries is needed. The document written in English is not required to make Notary and the account is opened quickly.
5. E-Pension system with fewer restrictions is a very quick system that saves a lot of time in drawing pensions through E-Pension cards. Only those who are unable to draw pension in person are to use certificate of general power.

Undertakings over the question about the Department of Road Transport Administration

1. Since March 2012, short-term driving courses (three-day course for motorbike driving and five-day course for vehicle driving) have been organized at region/state/district offices of the department, aiming at emergence of qualified drivers and developing awareness of traffic rules.
2. Only the driving licence is a valid document that allows driving vehicles and it is irreplaceable. Traffic rules enforcement agencies cannot accept temporary or permanent substitutions with other documents. Office Order was sent to all offices under the department that are allowed to conduct driving courses that only Myanmar Driving Licence officially issued by the Directorate of Road Transport Administration is a valid driving licence to show at the time when the vehicle

is checked.

1. With respect to the suggestion letter on delay in importing gas lighters by Zulu Alpha Co., Ltd, Myanmar Petrochemical Enterprise of the Ministry of Energy has formed an inspection team comprising an officer from Mining Department on 24-1-2013 to inspect whether or not company's workplace is safety.
2. The Ministry of Energy has inspected it in line with the procedures. It is known that the Ministry could not take any actions against the company as the company informed that they has already got import license from Ministry of Commerce and refused to get inspected.

AMMAN, 9 May—The Syrian army captured a strategic southern town from rebel fighters on Wednesday after a ferocious two-month bombardment, in an advance

the Hauran Plain on the highway to Jordan, came after a Jordanian-backed Syrian opposition military council failed to supply weapons to the town's defenders.

This raised resentment among opposition fighters over what they saw as a lack of Jordanian support for their efforts to defeat Assad's forces in the region, according to rebel commanders and activists in the area. The Hauran Plain, which extends to the Israeli occupied Golan Heights, is the birthplace of the revolt against four decades of family rule by Assad and his late father, which erupted in the city of Daraa in March 2011.

Azevedo looks to resurrect WTO with patient diplomacy

BRASILIA, 9 May—Roberto Azevedo, picked on Tuesday to head the World Trade Organization, is in every respect the quintessential Brazilian diplomat: a well-spoken, competent and smooth negotiator with a knack for wooing adversaries into his corner. A career diplomat with two decades of experience dealing with trade disputes, Azevedo will need those qualities more than ever to bridge the gap between developed and developing nations if he wants to reboot stalled global trade negotiations and breathe new life into the Geneva-based WTO.

It is a huge task. With the global economy still

struggling, protectionism is on the rise and faith in free trade — and the WTO itself — is running low in many countries. Azevedo has built his career advocating for a country with a less-than-stellar record when it comes to free trade. Brazil is the most closed major economy in the Americas, according to International Monetary Fund data, and it played a key role in derailing talks last decade to create a hemisphere-wide free trade area. But Azevedo insists that Brazil's oft-criticized trade policies won't influence his actions as director-general of the WTO when he succeeds France's Pascal Lamy on 1

Japan aiming to develop 100 times faster supercomputer

TOKYO, 9 May — Japan's science ministry has decided to develop a next-generation supercomputer by 2020 that will operate 100 times faster than the country's fastest supercomputer "K" amid tough global competition, ministry officials said on Wednesday.

The Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology will seek funding for the design of the new supercomputer in its budget request for fiscal 2014, the officials said. The K supercomputer, jointly developed with Fujitsu Ltd and the state-backed Riken research institute, was the first in the world to perform 10 quadrillion computa-

tions per second. But as of November, it has slipped into third place globally in computing speed. It now ranks behind the Titan and Sequoia supercomputers in the United States.

According to a biannual ranking of the world's 500 fastest supercomputers, the K supercomputer ranked first in 2011 but slipped to second place in June 2012. The ministry is hoping to use the next-generation supercomputer to develop drugs and contribute to disaster prevention by predicting earthquakes and tsunami, among other purposes, the officials said. It is envisioned that the new supercomputer will achieve

an exaflop capability, performing a quintillion computations per second.

With supercomputers regarded as a barometre of a nation's scientific and technological capabilities, other countries such as the United States and China as well as some European nations are planning to develop exaflop-capable supercomputers by around 2020. The science ministry is hoping to keep the cost of developing the new supercomputer below the 110 billion yen required for the development of the K supercomputer, the officials said, adding where the supercomputer will be built has yet to be determined.

TOKYO, 9 May — Sultan Hassanal Bolkiah of Brunei will visit Japan on 12 to 17 May, with plans to meet with Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe next Monday, the Japanese Foreign Ministry said on Wednesday.

During the meeting, the two leaders are expected to discuss strengthening ties between Japan and Brunei, a country rich in natural gas that is chair of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations this year.

The sultan is also expected to meet with Emperor Akihito and Empress Michiko during his stay.

New Zealand government rules out patents on computer software programmes

WELLINGTON, 9 May — The New Zealand government on Thursday backed down from plans to allow the patenting of computer programs in the face of fierce opposition from the high-tech industry, which feared it would be opened up to harassing lawsuits from foreign multinationals. Commerce Minister Craig Foss released a supplementary order paper to the Patents Bill currently before Parliament, which clearly stated that computer programmes should not be patentable.

"I would like to thank the New Zealand software and IT sector for their engagement over the last few months. I'm confident

we've reached a solution where we can continue to protect genuine inventions and encourage Kiwi businesses to export and grow," Foss said in a statement. The main opposition Labour Party called it a humiliating backdown from plans that had caused uproar in the country's burgeoning IT industry and threatened to smother innovation.

"Last year Craig Foss gave in to patent lawyers and multinational software players and sought to impose a software patents system on our IT sector," Labour's communications and IT spokesperson Clare Curran said in a statement. "Now, finally Craig Foss has fessed up and admitted

he got it wrong. This is a victory for our industry, which is worth around 11 percent of our GDP." The Institute of IT Professionals (IITP), New Zealand's largest IT representative body, said the clarification had removed a major barrier to software-led innovation.

"It is in New Zealand's best interests for software to continue to be covered through the provisions of copyright in the same way movies and books are, rather than through the patent system, which has significant problems," IITP chief executive Paul Matthews said in a statement. "The patent system doesn't work for software."

Twice-defeated political aspirant challenges Imelda Marcos in polls

ILOCOS NORTE PROVINCE, (Philippines), 9 May — Ferdinand Ignacio portrays himself as engaged in a "David and Goliath" battle with former Philippine First Lady Imelda Marcos ahead next Monday's mid-term elections. The 47-year-old lawyer sees himself as David, the courageous boy in the popular Bible story who defeated the giant Philistine warrior Goliath by a single stone slung at the latter's forehead.

But whether Ignacio can duplicate David's feat by prevailing over 83-year-old Marcos will be determined by voters in this northern Philippine province, known as "Marcos country" for being a stronghold of the family of the late dictator Ferdinand Marcos, who died in exile in 1989.

Ignacio, who ran unsuccessfully for a provincial post in the 2007 and 2010 elections, is challenging the former president's widow, known the world over for her

vast collection of shoes and jewelry, for her seat in Congress. A third candidate, Lorenzo Madamba, is also in the race, though he appears to have much smaller support among the electorate.

"Everybody has a right to run, so let the people choose. After all, the voice of the people is the voice of God," Marcos said last Sunday while preparing to campaign in about a dozen towns here. Marcos was first lady of the Philippines for over two decades until the so-called People Power Revolution of 1986 ended Marcos supremacy in the country and forced the family to flee into exile.

Marcos family members reentered politics in the late 1990s and has been winning elections in Ilocos Norte ever since. She is seeking for a second term as representative of Ilocos Norte's second district at the House of Representatives to fulfill what she called her desire to be a "mother" to all.

Azarenka boils over in surprise Madrid Open

MADRID, 9 May—Victoria Azarenka lost her temper and was

docked a point for smashing her racket on the way to a surprise 1-6, 6-2, 6-3 defeat by unseeded Russian Ekaterina Makarova in the Madrid Open second round on Wednesday.

The Belarussian world number three, runner-up in the last two editions of the premier clay event and

coming back from an injury layoff, appeared firmly in control against her 24th-ranked opponent after cruising through the first set.

However, Makarova raised her game to take the second set and after Azarenka smashed her racket on the ground at 3-3 in the decider the Australian Open champion's game fell apart and she suffered her first defeat of the year.

The umpire had already warned Azarenka at the end of the first set and when she took out her frustration on her racket she was given a point penalty.

"I just felt it was a weird call for me because I had no idea I had a code violation," she told a news conference.

"But, I mean, it happened. It didn't help, for sure, but it's okay. It's my own fault," added the 23-year-old.

Azarenka's vanquisher in the 2011 Madrid final, Czech Petra Kvitova, was another high profile casualty on Wednesday.

Seeded eight in the latest edition, Kvitova surrendered a one-set lead to fall 2-6, 6-2, 6-3 to Slovakian wildcard Daniela

Hantuchova.

British teenager Laura Robson failed to build on her fine win against fourth-seeded Pole Agnieszka Radwanska in the second round when she lost 5-7, 6-2, 7-6 to former world number one Ana Ivanovic of Serbia in the night session.

Seeded 16th, Ivanovic was a break down to the 19-year-old in the deciding set but the former French

Open champion fought back to take the tie break 7-5 as Robson double faulted on match point to miss out on a place in the last eight.

"I'll definitely take the positives out of the match," Robson said. "It's been a good week of ten-

nis for me and my level has picked up a lot since Estoril last week," added Robson, who is currently without a coach after splitting with Zeljko Krajan just before the Madrid event.

"It's not all bad and I've still got Rome to look forward to next week. It was a great match from her and hopefully we'll have some more great matches in the future."

SINGAPORE, 9 May—Singapore will host the glittering annual finale of the women's tennis season from 2014 until 2018, the WTA said on Wednesday.

The Southeast Asian city-state beat Tianjin in China and Mexico's Monterrey for the right to stage the WTA Championships after

Turkey's Istanbul ends its three-year stint in October.

"Your sensational city, the amazing city of Singapore, has won the right to host the WTA Championships for the next five years from 2014," WTA chairman and chief executive Stacey Allaster told reporters.

From red carpet to testy challenge for Woods at Players

PONTE VEDRA BEACH, (Florida), 9 May—Tiger Woods may get the red carpet treatment wherever he goes but that will be of little help to the world number one at TPC Sawgrass, site of this week's Players Championship.

Woods won his only Players title in 15 starts in 2001 and in addition to a field that includes the world's top 30 golfers, and 38 of the top 40, there is the diabolical Pete Dye layout that has frustrated contenders for four decades.

The 14-times major winner measures success by only the biggest championships, but he grudgingly admits that next in line after the Masters, US Open, British Open and PGA Championship would be the Players Championship.

"I think we have our four major championships, and that's that," Woods said when asked if the Players could be considered the fifth major. "But if there was going to be another one, this would be it. This is the best field that we have."

Woods could be primed to become only the fifth golfer to win the tournament more than once since he is currently the hottest player in the world with three wins this season that helped him regain the world number one ranking from Rory McIlroy.

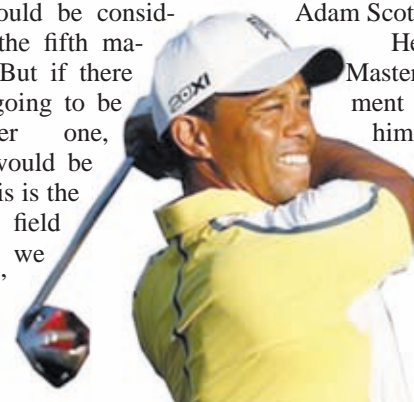
He was also in the lead at Augusta National before his third shot at the par-five 15th in the second round of last month's Masters hit the flagstick and ricocheted into the water.

The next morning he was hit with a controversial two-shot penalty—some called for his disqualification—for taking an improper drop following a review that was prompted by a phone call from a TV viewer.

Woods, who carded a triple-bogey on the hole, eventually finished tied for fourth, four shots out of a playoff won by Australian Adam Scott.

He said the Masters disappointment stayed with him for about a week.

Man United fans digest shock, ponder Fergie-less future

MANCHESTER, 9 May—Shock, uncertainty and an air of inevitability hung in the air on the red side of Manchester on Wednesday as fans digested Alex Ferguson's retirement announcement.

Some milled around Old Trafford, where the "Sir Alex Ferguson" stand and statue of the Scot are the very visible reminders of just how important he has been for Manchester United, while others calmed their nerves with a pint in the pub.

While many former players had spoken of their shock at Ferguson's decision, for a lot of supporters there was a sense that with the manager aged 71 and with the club having just reclaimed the Premier League

title from Manchester City, the news was not entirely unexpected even if it was unwelcome.

"I'm gutted he's going. But all the signs have been there—the fact (manager) Jose Mourinho looks like he's going to be free from Real Madrid and also the rumours

of Cristiano Ronaldo (coming back) tie in with that," pub landlord Dave Pawson said.

While former Chelsea boss Mourinho is among those being mentioned as a possible successor to Ferguson, the hot favourite is Everton manager David Moyes.

"I have

been a season-ticket holder for 32 years but I will not be renewing it if we get Moyes," Pawson added. "I've got a friend who has eight executive seats at 5,000 pound-seach and he's not renewing them either. "It's the right time, wrong replacement. He has no real Champions League experience, he is unproven, it's a massive risk to spend 1,500 pounds on a season ticket."

Not everyone was as pessimistic about Ferguson's fellow Scot Moyes.

"We don't want an ego to come in for two years and then leave us in the lurch. Mourinho would bring instability. I'd settle for Moyes," retired Andy Hamilton said.

Real thump nine-man Malaga to delay Barca title

MADRID, 9 May—Real Madrid made sure Barcelona will have to wait at least until Sunday to wrap up a 22nd La Liga title when Cristiano Ronaldo scored his 200th goal for the club in a 6-2 win at home to nine-man Malaga on Wednesday.

Barca need two more points to wrest the league crown back from their arch

rivals and secure a fourth title in five years and a win at third-placed Atletico Madrid on Sunday would be enough for Tito Vilanova's side. Barca have 88 points from 34 of 38 matches, with Real in second on 80 from 35. Atletico, eight points further back in third, secured a berth in the Champions League group stage with a 3-1 win at strug-

gling Celta Vigo earlier on Wednesday.

Both matches had been brought forward due to the King's Cup final between Real and Atletico on Friday 17 May. Real coach Jose Mourinho, who seems certain to leave after a disappointing season, was again whistled by a significant section of the home support at

the Bernabeu when his name was read out before kickoff.

The Portuguese has clashed with several members of the squad in recent weeks, including club captain Iker Casillas, who was again left out of the team, and fans cheered when the Spain goalkeeper's name was read out in the list of substitutes.

Old Trafford set to give Ferguson emotional sendoff

LONDON, 9 May—Emotions will be running high at Old Trafford on Sunday for Alex Ferguson's last home game as Manchester United manager with his retirement overshadowing the presentation of the Premier League trophy to the champions.

Ferguson will take his seat in the dugout for the final time with Swansea City the visitors for his home farewell after the Scot announced on Wednesday that he will step down at the end of the season following more than 26 trophy-laden years at the helm.

Fans unable to get a ticket will be able to line the streets and toast the Scot on Monday evening when United embark on an open-top bus parade through the city.

After that, Ferguson will bow out at West Bromwich

Albion on the final day of the season.

While there is nothing at stake from Swansea's visit, United having long since sealed a 20th English title and their opponents set for a top-10 finish, the battle for the remaining two Champions League places and one relegation spot is guaranteed another twist or two in the dying embers of the season.

Chelsea (69 points), Arsenal (67) and Tottenham Hotspur (66) remain in the mix, with last season's European champions Chelsea missing the chance to all but guarantee a top-four finish when they were twice pegged back by Spurs in a 2-2 draw on Wednesday.

They get another chance when they visit resurgent Aston Villa on Saturday (12:45 pm), Paul Lambert's

side having revenge firmly on their minds after an 8-0 mauling by Chelsea in December.

Spurs visit Stoke on Sunday (1:30 p.m) while Arsenal, not in action at the weekend, face relegation-threatened Wigan Athletic at the Emirates on Tuesday.

Wigan's build-up to their first FA Cup final appearance against Manchester City on Saturday would have been far more relaxed had they managed to hold on to a 2-1 lead against Swansea on Tuesday. Instead, Roberto Martinez's side imploded to lose 3-2 and their perennial Houdini act of escaping the trapdoor is now in serious jeopardy.

Wigan's defeat, which kept them third from bottom on 35 points, will have been greeted by relief by the teams above them with Newcastle, Norwich and Sunderland holding a three-point cushion with two games to play.

Southampton, on 39, and Aston Villa and Fulham with 40 are not yet assured of safety. One win from their last seven games has plunged Newcastle into a dogfight that has left fans contemplating the spectre of a second demotion in five seasons after they were demoted in 2009.—Reuters
