China-Myanmar corridor to emerge as trade facilitator

Myanmar has been building all-weather motor links with neighbours as smooth transportation is an essential driver of economic development and the latest road to link

with neighbor China will be the China-Myanmar corridor connecting Ruili of China with Kyaukpyu of Myanmar.

Feasibility study is said to have been conducted

for construction of Ruili-Kyaukpyu Road, for which China will provide financial help to Myanmar. Linking Muse with Kyaukpyu, the road will also be the China-Myanmar corridor.

Personnel of the two sides have held a number of discussions and are negotiating over the proposed alignments of the road in two countries.

The two sides also have reached an agreement over some alignments, one of which is from Panglong to Namhkam through Namtu. The road section will also link Hsipaw, Kyaukme, Nawngkhio, PyinOoLwin and Mandalay. Another one is from Kyauksauk to Padan in Rakhine State. The road will pass through Mai and An.

Myanmar has proposed the alignment from Padan to Panglong of Shan State to pass through Salin, Seikpyu, Yezagyo, Myaung, Madaya, Mandalay, Nawngkhio, Kyaukme, Hsipaw, with a view to bringing about rapid development of the towns

along the road.

The proposed alignment from Chinese side will pass through Saku, Yenangyoung, Kyaukpadaung, PyinOoLwin, and Hsipaw, linking Padan and Panglong. The alignment is straighter than the proposed alignment Myanmar prefers.

The road if constructed and completed will emerge as China-Myanmar corridor, boosting border trade between the two neighbours. Moreover, it will also become a part of road networks of ASEAN and Asian roads, facilitating Myanmar's trade activities with both neighbours and regional countries.

Stimulant tablets, heroin seized in Mabein

MABEIN, 8 June—Stimulant tablets worth K 200 million and heroin worth K 7.6 million were seized in Mabein on 2 June.

A combined team led by IP Ko Khaing of Mabein Police Station and Kyaukse District Police Force searched two motorbikes on Pauknet Bridge of Mogok-Bhamo Road driven from Pinkyein to Mabein.

But, the motorcyclists

did not obey to the search of the team and went away. The team searched the motorbikes and seized 119,000 WY brand stimulant tablets worth K 238 million from the motorcycles and 425 grams of heroin from soap cups worth K 7.65 million.

Houses lost in landslide at Sittoung River



WAW, 8 June—The bank of Sittoung River are facing landslides due to

changes of water courses yearly. This year, a total of 19 houses were lost in the landslide at Tanawkyun Village of Waw Township.

The village is located near the Sittoung Bridge (Old) sharing border with Mon State. It was bustle with freight handling at the jetty in the past. The village could overcome bank erosion thanks to the embankment of Sittoung River in the past. After the embankment broke down,

the bank erosion was worse to the village. That is why a total of 48 houses near the bank of the river are likely to be lost this year.

“Yearly, about 20 feet wide of area along the bank were eroded. In the future, the village may disappear within five years. So, some houses moved themselves to the safe places but some lost in the accident,” said an official of the village.

SUNNYLANDS, United States, 8 June—Chinese President Xi Jinping and his US counterpart, Barack Obama, met on Friday in this picturesque estate in Rancho Mirage, California, to exchange views on major issues of common concern.

Obama received Xi

upon his arrival, and the two heads of state greeted each other.

At the beginning of the meeting, Xi thanked Obama for his invitation, saying that he was glad to hold talks with the US president at Sunnylands.

“Sunnylands is close to the Pacific Ocean, and

China is just on the other side of the ocean,” Xi said.

Xi recalled his visit to the United States last year when he said that the vast Pacific Ocean has enough room to accommodate the development of two great powers in the world, namely China and the United States.

“Today I meet here with President Obama to map out a blueprint for the development of China-US relations and conduct cooperation across the Pacific Ocean,” the Chinese president said.

More than four decades ago, Xi said, the then leaders of the two countries opened the door for China-US interactions with political courage and wisdom, making a “handshake across the Pacific Ocean.”

Since then, the Chinese president said, the China-US relations, despite ups and downs, have achieved historic progress and brought huge benefits to the two peoples.

China bus fire suspected “serious criminal case”

XIAMEN, 8 June—Initial investigation has suggested on Friday evening’s bus fire that has claimed 47 lives and hospitalized 34 in east China’s Fujian Province is a suspected “serious criminal case,” the local government said at a press conference on Saturday morning.

Investigation by experts and police has cast doubt on technical failure being the cause of the blaze. The tires and oil tank of the BRT (bus rapid transit) bus, which caught fire in Xiamen City at about 6:20 pm on Friday, were not damaged before the fire. The combustion improver was gasoline while the bus was equipped with a diesel

engine.

A spokesman from the municipality government said further investigation is under way.

Two troubled California reactors to be shut down for good

LOS ANGELES, 8 June—Two California nuclear reactors taken offline in early 2012 due to faulty steam generators made by a Japanese manufacturer will be shut down for good, electric utility Southern California Edison announced on Friday.

The two reactors at San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station have been idled since January 2012 when a leak of radioactive water from one of four steam generators led to

the discovery of tubes that were vibrating against each other and wearing thin at an unusual rate.

Southern California Edison said the decision was an economic one since proceedings by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission looked to draw out past the point when restarting the plant would be profitable. Mitsubishi Heavy Industries Ltd. manufactured the steam generators that were installed as replacements in 2009 and 2010. MHI

said in a statement that it was “disappointed” by the decision.

The manufacturer maintained that the plant could still be run safely, but acknowledged the “complex and challenging factors that may have driven this decision.”

Continuing uncertainty about when or if the plant might return to service “was not good for our customers, our investors, or the need to plan for our region’s long-term electricity needs,” Ted

Iran not UN nuclear watchdog’s only headache, report shows

VIENNA, 8 June—Iran may be the UN nuclear watchdog’s biggest headache but it is not the only country stalling inspectors’ requests for atomic-related information, a new IAEA report suggests. Tasked with preventing the spread of nuclear bombs in the world, the UN’s International Atomic Energy Agency inspects reactors and related sites globally to ensure that sensitive fissile material is not diverted for military

purposes.

In 2012, several states “did not provide sufficient cooperation to clarify or resolve agency questions,” said the IAEA’s annual report on nuclear safeguards implementation, which was discussed at a meeting of its 35-nation board this week.

For 71 of 159 member states, the IAEA “was not able to get timely responses to agency requests for, or clarification of, safeguards relevant information,” it

said, without naming them.

Nuclear expert Mark Hibbs said he did not believe it was a question of grave violations of IAEA safeguards rules, or that any of these countries was engaging in covert nuclear activity with potential military intentions.

“But states are always trying to see what they can get away with” in carrying out atomic-related activities without intrusive inspections and added bureaucracy, said Hibbs, of the Carnegie Endowment think-tank. Several countries did not provide design information about nuclear facilities or advance notification of nuclear material transfers, the IAEA report said.

Proliferation experts said that in terms of gravity, such cases should not be compared with Iran, which the West suspects of seeking the capability to make nuclear weapons.

Two Koreas to hold working-level talks at Panmunjeom on Sunday

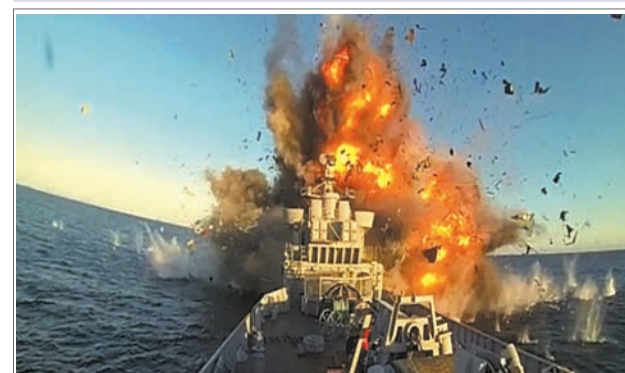
SEOUL, 8 June—North Korea and South Korea will hold working-level talks at the South Korean side of the truce village of Panmunjeom on Sunday morning, South Korea’s Unification Ministry said Saturday. The talks scheduled to start at 10 am, if realized, will be the first official dialogue since September 2011, according to the ministry.

North Korea notified South Korea around 10 am by a channel through Panmunjeom of its acceptance of the South’s offer to hold the talks at the South Korean side of the truce village, not at the North’s border city of Kaesong. A three-member delegation, to be headed by a director general from the

Unification Ministry, will attend the meeting with North Korea.

The two sides are expected to discuss details such as the agenda, size of delegation and other administrative specifics regarding the inter-Korean ministerial talks proposed by the South on Thursday to hold next Wednesday in Seoul. On Friday, South Korea’s Unification Ministry, which handles Seoul’s relations with Pyongyang, said its partial acceptance and counterproposal were contained in a message from the South’s Unification Minister Ryoo Kihl Jae that was conveyed to Kim Yang Gon, the chief of the United Front Department of North Korea’s ruling party.

Intel offers to pay up for Internet TV programming deals

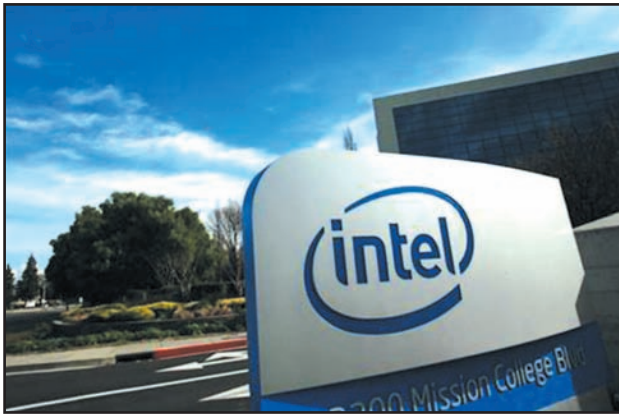
NEW YORK, 8 June—Intel Corp's talks to buy content from media companies for its new TV service are advancing, and the chipmaker is offering to pay as much as 75 percent more than traditional cable rates, people familiar with the talks said.

But Intel has yet to close any programming deals, said the sources, who requested anonymity because they were not authorized to comment.

CBS, News Corp and Viacom have reached agreements with Intel on certain details over how their content would be distributed on the service the chipmaker plans to begin later this year, one person familiar with the situation

said. Comcast's NBC Universal is continuing its talks with Intel but its negotiations are not as advanced as others companies, said another source familiar with the matter. Intel has moved substantially on subscriber fees it is willing to pay since the negotiations began, one source said. It has also suggested preventing viewers from skipping commercials on the first run of a show, said another source.

Representatives for Viacom, NBC, CBS, News Corp, Disney's ABC and Time Warner declined to comment. Media companies typically give better prices to operators with more viewers, such as large cable companies, and

charge higher prices to smaller or newer entrants. Since Intel's TV service has yet to start, and therefore has no viewers, it can expect to pay a premium, all the sources said.

SNL Kagan, a research firm that measures and publishes the average subscriber fees cable and satellite TV operators pay for television networks, recorded

last year's highest fees were \$5.15 per subscriber per month and were charged by Disney's ESPN.

While it was not clear exactly what amounts Intel had originally offered for specific channels, sources said the tech company was basing its 50 to 75 percent premium on listed average SNL Kagan subscriber fees.

Kenya to increase broadband access to 20% by 2017

NAIROBI, 8 June—Kenya plans to increase the country's broadband access to 20 percent by the year 2017, the country communication regulator said on Tuesday.

Communication Commission of Kenya (CCK) Director General Francis Wangusi said that currently only 3 percent of the population has access to broadband.

"This has hindered many development objec-

tives and so the government has set a target of 20 percent broadband access by the year 2017," Wangusi said during a workshop on the role of women in Information Communication Technology (ICT).

The two-day conference brought over 100 delegates to discuss ways to encourage the development and use of ICT among women and girls. Wangusi noted that despite Kenya's high mobile pen-

etration rate, the broadband access remains low.

"However as more and more people use the technology, the cost of broadband will reduce," he said. Wangusi noted that the country's fixed telecoms infrastructure is minimal compared to the size of the population.

"Most of broadband access will be achieved through wired infrastructure," he said. The CCK said that wireless

technology is easy to deploy but speeds achieved are usually lower compared to fixed lines.

He added that most of the country has been connected to the national fiber network. "What is remaining is the last mile connection to the consumers," he said. The government's broadband expansion plans will rely on multiple measures.

"One of the options is to use proceeds from the Universal Service Fund (USF)," Wangusi said adding that USF will receive 0.5 percent of revenues from of all licensed telecoms.

The industry regulator said it will also inject seed capital of 11.7 million US dollars, adding that 25 percent of CCK's surplus funds will also go the kitty.

Micron deal for Elpida Memory appears to clear legal hurdle

WASHINGTON, 8 June—Micron Technologies Inc's planned acquisition of bankrupt Japanese chipmaker Elpida Memory Inc appeared to move closer to completion on Friday after a key deadline passed without a legal challenge.

US creditors had until 4 pm on Friday to object to the request by Elpida to have a US Bankruptcy Court in Delaware issue orders that would enforce its Japanese restructuring, according to court records.

At the center of the restructuring is the pro-

posed sale to Micron for 200 billion yen (about \$2.1 billion), which will create the world's second-largest maker of memory chips.

Micron, based in Boise, Idaho, has been losing money as smart phones and tablets gain in popularity at the expense of personal computers. Acquiring Elpida will create economies of scale and the combined company will rank second only to Samsung Electronics in the memory chip market. While the sale proceeds will be used to repay Elpida's creditors, US bond-

holders argued Elpida was worth up to 300 billion yen.

In May, the bondholders exhausted their legal challenges in Japan. The only avenue left to them was in U.S. Bankruptcy Court in Delaware, where Elpida had sought recognition for its bankruptcy plan under Chapter 15 of the US bankruptcy code.

The creditors had been actively resisting the deal last year and earlier this year. However, they suffered a setback in January when US Bankruptcy Judge Christopher Sontchi approved a technology deal with Micron that the creditors warned would make the merger inevitable.

The bondholders are led by hedge funds Linden Advisors, Owl Creek Asset Management and Taconic Capital Advisers.

Messages left with the funds and their attorney, Christopher Shore of White & Case, were not immediately returned on Friday.

Second rover finds hint of a life-friendly ancient Mars

CAPE CANAVERAL, 8 June—A Martian rock analyzed by NASA's rover Opportunity contains clays formed in non-acidic water, an environment potentially suitable for the chemistry of ancient life to brew.

The solar-powered Opportunity landed on Mars in January 2004 for what was expected to be a 90-day mission to look for signs there was once water. It, and a twin rover, Spirit, which succumbed to the harsh Martian environment three years ago, had both found rocks altered by highly acidic water.

While acid-loving microbes exist on Earth, scientists suspect the chemical building blocks for life need more neutral conditions to evolve into life.

"The tough thing

to a neutral pH at a time very, very early in Martian history," he added.

"What we have here is a very different chemistry. This is water you can drink," Squyres said. "This is the most powerful evidence for neutral (non-acidic) chemistry water that has been found by Opportunity," he added.

Opportunity took three years to reach the rim of a large impact basin called Endeavour Crater, where it examined, among other objects, a small rock called Esperance.

It took seven tries before Opportunity got itself positioned properly to scratch the rock's surface and see what lies beneath. Unlike NASA's follow-on Mars rover Curiosity, which landed on the oppo-

about an acid environment is that it's very, very hard, we believe, to get pre-biotic chemistry, the kind of chemistry that can lead to the origin of life," Cornell University's Steve Squyres, lead scientist for the Opportunity and Spirit missions, told reporters during a conference call on Friday.

"What's exciting about this discovery is that it points

site side of Mars in August, Opportunity has no drill or onboard chemistry lab to obtain and analyze samples.

Instead, it uses its instruments to determine basic mineralogy. Esperance, scientists determined, contains aluminum-rich clays, a telltale sign that neutral water flowed through the rock.

Long-lived Mars rover heading to new destination

WASHINGTON, 8 June—US space agency NASA said Friday its veteran Mars rover Opportunity is on the road again, heading to a new study area on the surface of the Red Planet.

The destination, called "Solander Point," offers Opportunity access to a much taller stack of geological layering than the area where the rover has worked for the past 20 months, called "Cape York," NASA said. Both areas are raised segments of the western rim of Endeavour Crater, which is about 22 kilometres in diameter. The new area also offers plenty of ground that

is tilted toward the north, which is favorable for the solar-powered rover to stay active and mobile through the coming Martian southern-hemisphere winter, said the space agency.

"We're heading to a 15-degree north-facing slope with a goal of getting there well before winter," John Callas, project manager for the Mars exploration rover project, said in a statement. The minimum-sunshine days of this sixth Martian winter for Opportunity will come in February 2014.

NASA said Opportunity, approaching its 10th an-

niversary of leaving Earth, shows symptoms of aging, such as loss of motion in some joints, but continues to accomplish groundbreaking exploration and science.

NASA launched Opportunity and its twin, Spirit, in 2003. Both rovers found evidence of wet environments on ancient Mars, and Spirit has already ceased operations for about three years. Earlier this week, NASA said that its Mars rover Curiosity, which landed on the planet last August, is also to drive toward a new destination: a mountain known as Mount Sharp.—Xinhua

'Just right' jobs data could help equities

NEW YORK, 8 June—The US May jobs report came in just right for investors — neither too weak nor too strong to rock the boat — but market participants are now questioning what's next for stocks.

The equity market is on nebulous middle ground. The S&P 500 is just 1.5 percent away from its all-time closing high, but other than Friday's rally on the jobs data, it has been stuck in a period of uncertainty.

The Labour Department added 175,000 jobs in May, slightly higher than expected, but at a level that indicates the status quo should hold for the Federal Reserve's stimulus programme.

Some had worried that if job growth far exceeded expectations, the Fed

Janney Montgomery Scott in Philadelphia, adding that the May payrolls figure could "prime market participants to be more positive toward equities leading into next week's trading."

The programme is widely cited as a major contributor to the S&P 500's (.SPX) surge of 15.2 percent in 2013, when it has hit a repeated series of record highs.

Wall Street's performance has been closely tethered to the Fed's stimulus programme, benefiting from the belief that the economy is just weak enough to keep the Fed buying bonds.

When Fed Chief Ben Bernanke said on 22 May that the central bank may decide to reduce purchases if the economy shows signs

would reduce bond-buying sooner than expected, while others were concerned that an exceptionally weak number would reveal a fundamentally soft labor market. The data's ability to relieve both fears may benefit stocks.

"The number had a little something in it for everybody, in terms of those who suspect tapering might begin sooner and those who think it might start later," said Mark Luschini, chief investment strategist of

of significant improvement, stocks fell and bond yields surged.

The uncertainty has also increased volatility, with the S&P 500 frequently making daily moves of 1 percent or staging dramatic midday reversals. The CBOE Volatility Index (.VIX), or VIX, has risen more than 20 percent over the past three weeks, although at a level of 15.14, it is still at a level associated with a relatively calm environment.

FDA grants priority review status to Gilead's hepatitis C drug

NEW YORK, 8 June—Biotechnology company Gilead Sciences Inc said the US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) granted priority review to its experimental hepatitis C drug sofosbuvir.

The FDA grants priority reviews to medicines that are considered potentially significant therapeutic advancements over existing therapies.

The FDA set a review date of 8 December for the drug, Gilead said.

Gilead's oral drug is considered the most advanced and high-profile of treatments free of interferon, a standard hepatitis C drug which has side effects including colds and muscle fatigue.

Drugmakers AbbVie and Bristol-Myers Squibb are also developing such

SoftBank eyes T-Mobile US as 'Plan B'

NEW YORK, 8 June—SoftBank Corp (9984.T) is in talks with Deutsche Telekom AG (DTEGn.DE) over a possible deal for T-Mobile US Inc (TMUS.N), as the Japanese company looks for alternatives to enter the US wireless market if its deal with Sprint Nextel Corp (S.N) falls apart, three sources familiar with the matter said on Friday.

SoftBank and Deutsche Telekom were in talks last year about a deal for T-Mobile USA and have had periodic discussions since then, but those conversations have intensified in recent weeks after Dish Network Corp (DISH.O) made a \$25.5

billion counterbid for Sprint, two of the sources said. SoftBank has a deal to buy 70 percent of Sprint for \$20.1 billion.

Deutsche Telekom owns 74 percent of T-Mobile US and one possibility is for SoftBank to buy that stake instead, the sources said. T-Mobile US has a market value of about \$15 billion.

SoftBank still wants to do the Sprint deal after spending months on it, and is looking at a possible T-Mobile transaction only as "Plan B", the sources said who declined to be named because the talks are private.

Drugs kept in ambulances can be unusable in weeks

NEW YORK, 8 June—Drugs that are often used in emergencies and typically kept in ambulances may deteriorate beyond a safe level in a few weeks or months, according to a new study from Belgium.

That's because — unlike drugs stored in the controlled settings of hospitals — drugs stored in ambulances are exposed to temperature variations, sunlight and motion, said Dr Mark Merlin, who studied drug deterioration but wasn't involved in the new research.

"It's a very different concept and we're learning that expiration dates are very different (in ambulances)," said Merlin, an emergency physician at Newark Beth Israel Medical Centre in New Jersey.

He added that because few studies have looked at the subject, emergency physicians and technicians tend to throw out drugs before their printed expiration date.

"We don't know when

to throw them out and as a result we're usually very conservative," he said.

For the new study, Sabrina De Winter and her colleagues at the University Hospitals Leuven compared commonly used injectable drugs stored for one year at room temperature, in the back of an emergency response vehicle and in a

The drugs included muscle relaxers cisatracurium and succinylcholine, the seizure drug lorazepam, methylergonovine to stop women from bleeding after birth, and the heart, allergy and asthma drug epinephrine.

The researchers check-

ed how much the drugs deteriorated weekly during the first month of storage and every other month after that.

As expected, none of the refrigerated drugs degraded to below 90 percent potency — a commonly used benchmark for usability.

Crash diet tied to increased gallstone risk

NEW YORK, 8 June—People who go on an extremely low calorie diet are more likely to develop gallstones than people on a moderately low calorie diet, according to a new study.

Dr Michael Jensen, a professor of medicine at the Mayo Clinic, said dieters typically end up with similar weight loss in the long run whether they use extreme calorie restriction or more moderately restricted diets.

"You're going to end up in the same place (weight-wise), so why take the risk of ending up in the hospital with a gall bladder problem just to lose weight

faster?" said Jensen, who was not part of the study.

Gallstones affect as many as 20 million people in the US.

Dr Kari Johansson, the lead author of the study and a researcher at the Karolinska Institute in Sweden, said quick weight loss from very low calorie diets is thought to impact the salt and cholesterol contents of bile and the emptying of the gallbladder, both of which can contribute to gallstones.

To see how these diets affect gallstone risk in a real-world setting, Johansson and her colleagues collected information on customers' progress from a weight loss company in Sweden called Intrim.

Some of the study authors have worked for the company or serve on its scientific advisory board.

Their study included 6,640 dieters, half of whom went on a crash diet and the other half of whom went on a low calorie diet.

The crash diet involved liquid meals of just 500 calories a day for six to 10 weeks, followed by the gradual introduction of normal food, and then nine months of a weight maintenance regime of

exercise and healthy eating.

The other dieters ate 1,200 to 1,500 calories a day, including two liquid meals, for three months, followed by the nine month weight maintenance period.

Health coaches at Intrim collected weight and body size information, which the researchers linked to a national health database that has records on gallstone treatments.

After three months in the weight loss programme, the crash dieters lost about 30 pounds, compared to roughly 17 pounds lost among people on the low calorie diet. One year out from the start of the diet, the extremely low calorie group had lost an average of 24.5 pounds, while the other group lost about 18 pounds.

Among those on the crash diet, 48 people developed gallstones requiring hospital treatment, and 16 people in the other group developed gallstones, Johansson and her colleagues report in the International Journal of Obesity. They could not determine why gallstones were more common among people in the extremely low calorie group.—Reuters

US approves anti-dumping probes of steel wire from China, Mexico, Thailand

WASHINGTON, 8 June—The US International Trade Commission (ITC) Friday approved anti-dumping investigations on prestressed concrete steel rail tie wire from China, Mexico and Thailand, paving the way for the Department of Commerce to set preliminary duties in September.

All six commissioners of the trade panel voted in the affirmative that there was a reasonable indication that a US industry was materially injured by imports of these products, the ITC said in a statement.

The US Department

of Commerce will continue the investigations, launched on 14 May, on imports of these products and is expected to make its preliminary anti-dumping duty determinations in September.

The investigations are in response to the petition filed by the Insteel Wire Products Company based in North Carolina and Davis Wire Corporation based in Washington.

The two companies claimed the steel wire imported from China, Mexico and Thailand were sold in the U.S. market with dumping margins of 67.43 percent, 159.44 percent

and 53.72 percent, respectively.

The United States imported in 2012 an estimated 35.57 million US dollars of the steel wire from China, 14.69 million from Mexico and 373,000 from Thailand, according to US official data.

The Chinese Commerce Ministry has repeatedly urged the United States to abide by its commitment against trade protectionism and work together with China and other members of the international community to maintain a free, open and just international trade environment.—Xinhua

First US drone strike under new Pakistan prime minister kills seven

DERA ISMAIL KHAN, 8 June—A US drone strike killed seven people and wounded three in northwest Pakistan late on Friday, security officials said, in the first such attack since the swearing-in of Nawaz Sharif as prime minister this week.

In his inaugural address to parliament, Sharif called for an immediate end to US drone strikes on militants, which many view as a breach of Pakistan's sovereignty.

The bombing comes 10 days after a similar US drone attack killed the Pakistani Taliban's second-in-command, Wali-ur-Rehman, and six others in a major blow to the militant group.

President Barack Obama said last month the United States would scale back drone strikes, only using them when a threat was "continuing and imminent".

Friday's attack was on a compound near the Afghan border in North Waziristan region, 45 km (25 miles) west of the regional capital Miranshah. At least two missiles were fired from the unmanned aircraft and the death toll could rise, the sources said.

Drone casualties are difficult to verify. Foreign journalists must have permission from the military to visit the Pashtun tribal areas along the Afghan border. Taliban fighters often seal off the sites of drone strikes immediately.—Reuters

UN launches record appeal for victims of Syrian war

BEIRUT, 8 June—The United Nations warned on Friday half of all Syrians would need humanitarian aid by the end of 2013 and launched what it said was the biggest emergency appeal in history to cope with the civil war crisis.

"Syria as a civilization is unravelling," said the UN High Commissioner for Refugees, Antonio Guterres, announcing the call for some \$5 billion before the end of the year.

The joint statement by UN agencies coincided with heavy fighting on numerous fronts, as rebels attacked

an air base in northern Syria while forces loyal to President Bashar al-Assad sought to capitalise on their own recent gains.

Clashes continued on the Golan Heights, close to the ceasefire line between Israel and Syria, a day after rebels briefly seized the sole crossing between the two foes. Austria, a major contributor to a UN monitoring mission in the Golan, announced on Thursday it was withdrawing from the area because of the violence, jeopardising an operation that has helped keep the Israeli-Syrian war quiet

for four decades.

Russian President Vladimir Putin, who has backed the Syrian government since the start of the unrest in March 2011, said Moscow was ready to replace the Austrian peacekeepers.

A UN spokesman said however the four-decade-old agreement on the mission in the Golan did not allow permanent US Security Council members like Russia to send troops.

Highlighting the scale of the crisis, UN humanitarian agencies in Geneva said 10.25 million Syrians would need aid by the end of the year at a cost of \$5 billion.

"The funds we are appealing for are a matter of survival for suffering Syrians and they are existential for the neighbouring countries hosting refugees," Guterres said.

The appeal comprises \$2.9 billion for refugees, \$1.4 billion for humanitarian aid and \$830 million for Lebanon and Jordan, the biggest recipients of Syrian refugees.

WHO calls for global collaboration to combat hepatitis

SINGAPORE, 8 June — The World Health Organization on Friday launched a network to fight hepatitis, which caused chronic disease in hundreds of millions of people. The network is an "international collaboration platform" to raise awareness about hepatitis, exchange information and knowhow, boost national, regional and global capacity, mobilize resources and improve patient care, the WHO said in a statement released at a news conference in Singapore.

The network is expected to bring together the WHO, UN agencies, universities, research institu-

tions, regional laboratories, collaborating centers, civil society organizations and patient groups.

The WHO estimates that around 500 million people are chronically infected with hepatitis B or C.

"Although the burden of viral hepatitis is extremely high, the problem has not been globally addressed in a comprehensive manner," the WHO statement said.

Charles Gore, president of the World Hepatitis Alliance, said at the news conference that hepatitis kills as many people as HIV does, and more than tuberculosis and malaria, yet the departments within the WHO for

tackling TB, HIV and malaria are 20 to 30 times bigger than the hepatitis programme.

A study by the University of Washington cited at the news conference showed that about 1.44 million people die from hepatitis annually compared to the 1.47 million deaths due to HIV and AIDS.

"In order to continue our fight we need countries that are going to champion the cause at the global level," Gore said, referring to the fact that access to diagnostics and drugs needs to be improved, particularly for the poor.

Uruguayan leader sees China's interest in investing in Uruguay

MONTEVIDEO, 8 June—Uruguayan President Jose Mujica said Friday that his recent visit to China confirmed the interest of China's public and private sectors in investing in Uruguayan public projects.

During Mujica's visit last month, Chinese President Xi Jinping said China will encourage its companies to participate in the construction of Uruguayan ports and railways.

In a radio address on Friday, Mujica said an agreement has been reached on the participation of Chi-

nese companies and banks in the building of a deep-water port on the Atlantic coast and reconstruction of a railway which has much geographical importance.

"We already have the will, money and capacity to start building. We have to resolve some concrete legal matters," he said. "Now the ball is in our court."

At the invitation of Xi, Mujica paid a visit to China from 25 to 28 May. The two leaders agreed to further cooperation in various fields to step up bilateral relations.—Xinhua

Lebanese army warns against country being embroiled in civil war

BEIRUT, 8 June—The Lebanese Army Command warned on Friday against any schemes that aim to drag the country into a civil war, or embroil it in the conflict in neighbouring Syria.

Counterfeit drugs: a growing global threat

Counterfeit drugs pose a serious risk to public health. Taking ineffective medicines can threaten the lives of patients.

Last week, the US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) warned that 19 medical practices had bought counterfeit versions of Roche's cancer drug bevacizumab (Avastin) from an overseas supplier. This was not the first alarm over counterfeit drugs this year. In January, the FDA warned health-care providers about direct-to-clinic promotions and sales of potentially counterfeit injectable cancer medications, such as fulvestrant, from unlicensed sources.

The contamination of heparin by Chinese counterfeiters in 2007 and 2008, killed 149 patients in the USA. Counterfeit anti-infective drugs might also increase the risks of drug resistance.

Counterfeit drugs have traditionally been more of a concern in developing regions (mostly Africa and Asia), and millions of people from the developing and under-developing countries are using affordable drugs.

Regulatory and enforcement systems for medicines are weak in those countries. However, counterfeiting has become more and more prevalent in developed countries as drug supply chains increasingly cross continents.

In 2009, the European Union seized 34 million fake tablets in just 2 months.

WHO has stated that, "counterfeit drugs may erode public confidence in health care systems, health care professionals, the suppliers and sellers of genuine drugs, the pharmaceutical industry and national Drug Regulatory Authorities". So what should be done to tackle the growing problem of counterfeit medicines?

What especially needed in those countries is drug regulatory authorities which should be responsible not only for improving drug standards but also providing effective recognition of counterfeit drugs and assisting other agencies in stopping their trade.

Additionally, enactment and enforcement of new laws for prohibiting counterfeit drugs is vital.

The fight against counterfeit drugs must be strengthened without further delay. It needs consensus among all countries and interested parties, and requires wise and bold leadership from WHO and governments. An indispensable goal of the campaign is ensuring the availability of genuine and affordable essential medicines in developing countries.

Royal Ploughing Ceremony (Le Htun Mingala) in Nayone

Maha Saddhamma Jotika dhaja Sithu Dr. Khin Maung Nyunt

Nayone, the third month of Myanmar lunar calendar of twelve months (corresponding to June) is the transitional month between Geinman (Summer) and Wathan (Monsoon or rainy season). From the south-west direction comes in monsoon, not always peacefully. It comes as cyclonic storm bringing strong wind, heavy showers, lightning and thunder, damaging and destroying everything, every life in its path. But traditional belief is that when monsoon comes, it must come with force and energy. Strong wind, heavy showers, lightning and thunder and all consequences are the typical characteristic of monsoon that could really give sufficient water for the good harvest of the year. It is humans who must prepare themselves to encounter these natural phenomena as best they could.

There is a Myanmar saying about rain in Nayone "နယုန်မိုးပြေး၊ မြက်သားမွေး" [Running rain in Nayone nurtures tender grass]. The scorched earth in Kasone turns into a green carpet, emitting refreshing earthy scents.

Mithuna [Gemini] or May Htone [မေထုန်] is the zodiacal name of this month. It is derived from a Pali word မိထုန [Mi-htu-na] meaning a couple of a man and woman holding a long rod and a harp. In day time the sun and Migathi star and at night the moon and Jetha start together reach noon time. Jasmine, a star-like white bloom with pleasant fragrance is the designated flower of this month.

Nayone is the month with three significances—(1) economic (2) religious and (3) socio-cultural. Firstly economic significance is that in this month Myanmar farmers begin ploughing their fields. It is the first month of wet cultivation. Secondly, religious significance is that it was on the fullmoon day of this month that Gotama Buddha delivered the famous Maha Thamaya Sutta to all deities of all universes. So the fullmoon day of Nayone is designated and celebrated "Maha Thamaya Sutta Day". Thirdly socio-cultural significance is that it is in Nayone that religious examinations are held with ceremonies and festivities by the communities.

In this article the writer wishes to present the economic significance of the month. The economic activity of ploughing fields, especially royal ploughing event in the time of Myanmar kings.

နွားကြန်စုံအင်။ Steps on the plough in royal field,
ပျိုးခင်းကိုဝင်။ To plant for a good year's yield.
ကောင်းတင်က၊ ရွှေပိန်ညင်းရယ်။ Pulled by handsome bullocks twain,
မိုးခေါ်လိုဆင်း။ To harvest plenty of paddy grains.
Let from the sky golden bird kingfisher,
Bring down all heavy showers.

The above folk song we have learnt by heart in our primary school epitomises the gracious ploughing event of Myanmar king in royal field in the month of Nayone. It emphasizes that Myanmar is an agricultural country, that the main economy is cultivating and producing crops particularly paddy, and that the king, as head of the State leads this economic activity for religious, political, and socio-cultural purposes.

The royal ploughing ceremony was one of traditional rites to invite good rain for good harvest. The king himself was obliged to perform ploughing to prove that he was a noble king. It was believed that drought would be averted, good showers would come and a good yield be resulted, if the king begins ploughing. Besides, royal ploughing created the image of a "Peasant King" in the minds of the peasants and people who would thus regard the king as one of them, and peasants would be inspired to labour manifold in their cultivation.

Myanmar royal ploughing ceremony has Buddhist

tradition. Myanmar kings claimed that they were descendants of the Setkya clan of Gotama Buddha. So they regarded themselves as solar kings who were entitled to perform ploughing ceremony. It was at the royal ploughing ceremony of King Thudawdana the Bodhisattha's royal father that young baby prince Sidhattha (Bodhisattha) showed one of the early miracles. With eight hundred noblemen, the King was ploughing the royal field. The whole court and the capital city were at the scene to watch the grand ceremony. The maids in charge of the little baby prince, laid him down under the shade of Zabu-Thabyey Tree and went to watch the ceremony. In their absence, the baby Prince rose up and sat cross-legged to be absorbed in meditation. After the ceremony the maids rushed back to the tree to witness the miracle—the shadow of the Tree remaining in the same position, shading the baby prince, sitting in deep meditation.

Myanmar chronicles have records of ploughing ceremonies. But not all kings performed it and not every year. Only when court astrologers and guru Brahmins advised and gave auspicious date in Nayone, such ceremony was performed. In Bagan dynasty of 55 kings, only three kings were associated with the ploughing ceremony, namely Htun-taik the 17th king (569-582 A.D.), Htun Pyit, the 18th king (582-598 A.D.) and Htun Chit, the 19th king (598-613 A.D.). Their names bore the word "Htun" meaning plough.

In Konbaung dynasty [1752-1885 A.D.] four kings were recorded to have held this ceremony. The first was King Bodawpaya [1782-1819 A.D.] The record runs thus:

"On Friday the first waning moon of Nayone [June] in Myanmar Sakayit year 1152 [1790 A.D.] King Bodawpaya built a grand royal pavilion by the side of the Lake Aungpinle for the ceremony of royal ploughing. Gold gilt and silver gilt ploughs, gold gilt and silver gilt yokes, gold and silver trapping, and reins and gold and silver whips were placed in the royal field. Crown Prince, royal sons, noblemen, ministers, men of wealth, Brahmins were present. The King performed the ploughing ceremony. Crown Prince's queen summoned the superintendent—General of Royal Treasury Maung Min Aung to compose a Tarachin Verse to record the ceremony."

The second king was King Bagyidaw [1819-1837 A.D.] the chronicle says:-

"The sacramental ploughing of the fields in June each year, wearing his crown, riding the Lord White Elephant from the palace to the field, and using a gilt harrow drawn by milk-white oxen which were harnessed in gold trappings, studded with rubies and diamonds."

The third king was King Thayawaddy (alias King Shwebo or King Konbaung) (1837-1846 A.D.). The following is the recount given in the chronicle:-

"In the Myanmar Sakarit year 1202 (1841 A.D.) by the side of Lake Aungpinle, a great royal pavilion was constructed to hold royal ploughing ceremony. Their Majesties progressed in state, attended by royal sons, brothers and relatives, noblemen, ministers, army officers, and men of wealth, guarded by four armed forces, infantry, cavalry, elephantry and chariotry. The King performed the ploughing with pomp and ceremony. Minister U Sa, Lord of Myawaddy was ordered to compose a new Tarachin verse to record the event."

The fourth King was King Mindon (1853-1878 A.D.) the founder and the builder of Mandalay Ratanapon Capital and Mya Nan San Kyaw Palace and the holder of the 5th Buddhist Synod.

The ploughing ceremony took place in the royal paddy field of about two acres, north of Thayetkon village near Lake Aungpinle. A royal pageantry came out from the Palace city, with His Majesty wearing a bejeweled gold crown and robe shaded by two white umbrellas each on either side. Royal family members, courtiers, noblemen and ministers in their rank colours attended on the King who performed the ceremony.

Mindon's ploughing ceremony was recorded by two eye witnesses—one was a famous Myanmar court artist Saya Chone who recorded the ceremony in his painting. The other was a British writer-diplomat named Sir George Scott (pen name Shway Yoe) who wrote "Gracious Ploughing" essay in his book *The Burman: His Life and notions*. The following is a short excerpt:-

"... Ploughs stand ready in a long row, extending way as far as one can see; for all the princes and ministers must plough as well as the king. The royal plough is thickly covered with gold-leaf; the part on which His Majesty stands... is gold, roughened with pearls and emeralds. The milk-white oxen that drew it rival the Lord White Elephant in the splendor of their harness. Crimson and gold bands hook them on; the reins are stiff with rubies and diamonds; heavy gold tassels hang from gilded horns. The gold tipped ox-goad His Majesty wields is covered with jewels and flashes like a rod of fire in the sun."

"The King ploughs a couple of furrows or, rather passes the big rakes once up and down the rain-sodden field and then stops; for he is portly and short of breath now. The ministers, no matter how fat they are, have to go on ploughing as long as the Arbiter of Existence chooses to look on. At last he declares that enough has been done and preparations are made to go back again. He duffs his royal robes, burdensome and long surcoat with its thousands of precious stones is said to weight about a hundred pounds ..."

"... Pwes (entertainments) begin with startling suddenness at every corner. Bands strike up, long lines of candles illuminate the streets at nightfall, rockets are let off, fire balloons ascend and everything is given up to rejoicing, for the Leadawgyi (great royal field) has been graciously ploughed and Le Htun Mingala (Auspicious royal ploughing) is a presage of abundant crops."

Pros and cons of PSM draft law discussed

YANGON, 8 June—Deputy Minister for Information U Ye Htut clarified the purpose and nature of public service media draft law, publication of the draft law for public knowledge, plans for transformation of State-owned media into public service media, at Printing and Publishing Enterprise here this morning.

The deputy minister said media transformation was carried out by international organizations including UNESCO and local and foreign experts, adding that the public service media was prepared to deliver better service with people-centered approach.

The deputy minister pointed out the basic principles of PSM as representation of all citizens, presentation of different views and interests within the society, informing accurate and credible news and presenting good programmes, editorial independence, financial independence, contribution to innovative and efficient human resources, professional accountability, and strategic cooperation with other organizations, adding that PSM will be run on the foundation of the basic principle of representing all citizens.

Mr Sardar Umar Alam, Head of Project Office Myanmar of UNESCO, and Mr Rophael Rawn, legal expert from Germany, expressed their opinions about the draft law in comparison with international media norms, concluding that PSM should be established and the law enacted.

Next, the attendees spoke of their different views. Members of Myanmar Press Council (Temporary) Dr Myo Thant Tin and U Thiha Saw said: public service media draft law is not in the form of a law but the collection of an individual's requirements and goes against certain existing laws; it should serve as a monitoring system but instead is rather tends to be commercial thus in variation from original meaning; the Information Ministry has agreed to change the name of the department described in Section 5 (d) of the Chapter (3) of the draft law as Copyright and Registration Department into Copyright

and Archives Department as asked by Myanmar Press Council; The proposed establishment of PSM Council described in Chapter (5) is inappropriate as it appears like the organization against the Press Council to be prescribed in press media law; It is assumed that the draft law needs not to formulate the journalistic ethics, duties and rights separately as the press law being drafted by Myanmar Press Council has written in sector-wise detail, it is because the responsibilities and rights of the journalists should be on equal terms as well as the punishment the same to all; PSM which will have access to public fund, transportation and other preferences should pay the same tax as the public media businesses; it is totally rejected that PSM would spend 70 per cent its production cost from the public fund and it should stand on its own revenues and advertisement earnings; as there is no public-funded printing business in international countries, inclusion of the print media in PSM is rejected; PSM needs not to form any more council and committees at the huge cost of State budget.

The deputy minister replied that it is right that the PSM draft law is detailed because it is like something new, but it does not affect any existing laws; it is not intended to control other private media outlets, the suggestion of the Press Council to change the name of the department into Copyright and Archives Department has been submitted to Pyithu Hluttaw Bill Committee; it is wrong that PSM Council and Press Council go

against each other and they are different in principle; through there have been journalistic ethics, duties and rights written by Press Council, there are specific points PSM media men need to observe.

It is seen that international public services media also have detailed ethics and directives. PSM means that media men would have to follow the points that included in the Bill in addition to media ethics. Taking a look at international countries, PSMs run their works with the State's finance and revenue. Some PSMs got 97 percent of government's fund. How much percentage will the government allow for PSM depended on Hluttaw's decision. Asia regions saw progress of print media while some countries had to face a decline in print media, he added.

"PSM Law is to interrelate with the press council. Check and balance is a key point. There will be competitions in all aspects as reforms are taking place in Myanmar," said Mr Alam from UNESCO.

"There will be fair competitions and relations between PSM and private media. Private media have the duty to cover investigative reports," said law expert Mr Rophael Rawn.

Chief Editor U Wai Phyo of the Daily Eleven Media Group said, "I remonstrate about that PSM bill. PSM seems to compete with private sectors in term of market competition and freedom. It appears to indirectly control freedom of expression. Dose it take advantage for 2015?"

Deputy Minister U Ye Htut said that all inclusiveness is practical in accord with media pluralism.

It is difficult for the private media to do publishing and distribution which can satisfy the public and the Public Service Media will have to do it. The PSM does not control the press freedom and it will stand as a the voice of the people. As the PSM does not influence any person, party and organization, it should not be considered as a preparation for the 2015.

Mr Rophael Rawn, the legal expert from Germany, discussed international public service media and private media.

The participants of the meeting also exchanged their views on the PSM.

U Zin Lin from Myanmar Peace Centre expressed his support to the PSM law and suggested that the PSM law should be in conformity with the current laws.

U Kyaw Win (Manutha Kyaw Win), Vice-Chairman of Myanmar Writers Association, said he supported the PSM law and suggested to think how to cooperate because it is sure that PSM law would gain support from the people as it the public service one.

Deputy Minister for Information U Ye Htut and officials concerned has a discussion with the participants.

The meeting was attended by 337 personnel representing UNESCO, international organizations, Myanmar Press Council (Temporary), media at home and abroad and social organizations.

At least one killed in cross-sea bridge ramp collapse in Malaysia

KUALA LUMPUR, 8 June —A body was found on Friday under tons of concrete rubble and steels after a interchange ramp to a cross-sea bridge that is under construction in northern Malaysia collapsed a day earlier.

Police said rescue team found a man in a car that was buried under the debris.

Fighter jet crashes in India, no casualties

NEW DELHI, 8 June —A fighter jet belonging to the Indian Air Force crashed on Friday in the country's western state of Rajasthan during a routine sortie, an IAF spokesperson said.

There were no casualties as both pilots ejected safely minutes before the crash.

According to the spokesperson, the "MiG-21

Bison" fighter jet crashed near the IAF's Uttarlai airbase in Rajasthan's Barmer District early on Friday.

A rescue mission was immediately sent from the nearby Jodhpur airbase and an inquiry has been ordered by the IAF to investigate the cause of the crash.

The MiG fighter jets have had a very poor flying history in India, earning

them the nickname "flying coffins." According to official figures, over the past four decades the country has lost more than half of its MiG combat fleet of 872 aircraft in as many as 482 accidents. Over 171 trained pilots of India's defense force, 39 civilians and eight people from other services have died in MiG fighter jet accidents.

Geothermal power plant to be built on Hokkaido's Okushiri Island

TOKYO, 8 June—Planning is under way for a 500-kilowatt geothermal power plant on Okushiri Island in the Sea of Japan off Hokkaido, with the launch of operation as early as fiscal 2016, local and central governments sources said.

If realized, it would be the first geothermal plant on a remote island that takes advantage of the country's feed-in tariff programme for renewable energy, according to the Natural Resources and Energy Agency.

The plant's output would cover up to 25 percent of electricity consumption on the island, which now relies on burning fuel oil for energy, and will be fully bought by Hokkaido Electric Power Co at a fixed rate.

The expected improvement in the island's energy self-sufficiency will help reduce its fuel transportation and subsequent power generation costs as well as the risk of fuel supply disruption in a natural disaster, the sources said.

According to the plan, the plant will utilize hot steam taken from two wells in western Okushiri that were test-drilled around 2008 by the semigovernmental New Energy and Industrial Technology Development Organization and will be offered by the town office. The use

of existing wells will keep construction costs low, the sources said.

A local oil distributor will be involved in power generation, and the geothermal energy may also be used for a hot spring facility, they said.

Although NEDO found it unprofitable after drawing roughly 200 C steam from the wells about 1,600 metres deep, the town and business will survey the situation of the wells from September at the earliest, with support from the energy agency, they said. "It will lead not only to a stable supply of electricity but also town-building around the concept of a renewable energy island," a town official said.

Under the feed-in tariff system begun in July last year, utilities are obliged to buy electricity generated from solar, wind, geothermal heat and other renewable sources at a fixed rate.

The only existing geothermal power plant on a remote island in Japan is run by Tokyo Electric Power Co on Hachijo Island, south of Tokyo, and has been in operation since 1999. China continues press entities' market-oriented reorganization

BEIJING, 8 June —China's Press and publication watchdog on Friday vowed to forge ahead with the market-oriented reorganization of state-run press and publication entities. Jiang Jianguo, deputy director of the State General Administration of Press, Publication, Radio, Film and Television, made the vow during a Friday meeting.

The official urged authorities to rapidly transform government-sponsored non-political newspapers and periodicals into commercial enterprises. He said all state-run, for-profit Press and publication entities will be transformed into enterprises.

The official said civil capital should be encouraged to run small- and micro-size Press and publication service

firms. China started restructuring its government-funded Press and publication organizations in different phases after central authorities called for deepening cultural system reform in 2005.

By introducing a modern corporate system to the organizations, the move is intended to stimulate their creativity and improve their competitiveness.—Xinhua

Lebanon unable to host more Syrian refugees

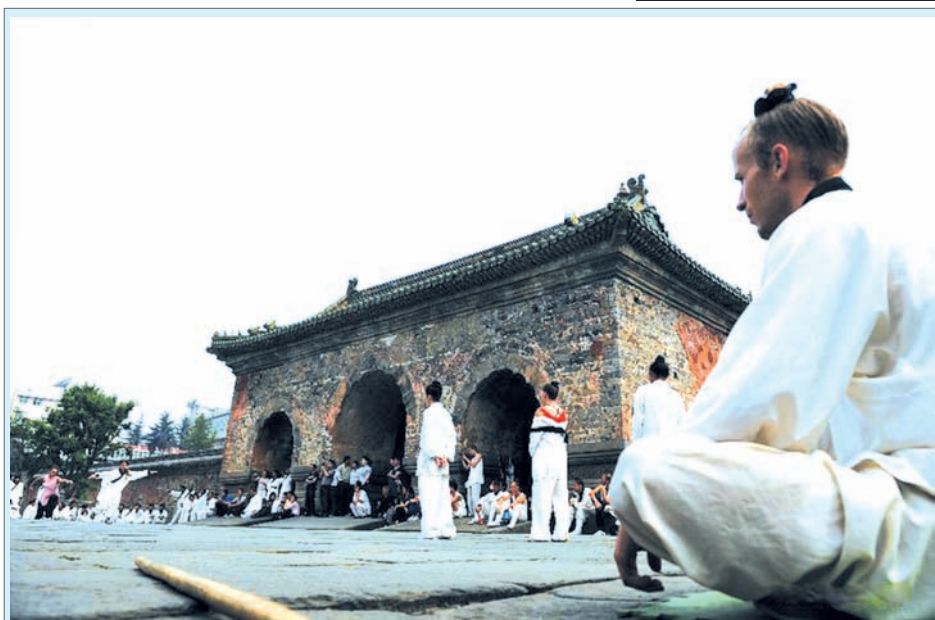
BEIRUT, 8 June—Lebanon's President Michel Sleiman warned on Friday that his country is unable to host any more Syrian refugees who are fleeing the violence in their home country in massive flows.

Sleiman, who met Friday with the ambassadors of the permanent members of the UN Security Council, called upon the international community to recognize the burden the Syrian refugees have inflicted upon Lebanon.

He also proposed a plan in tackling this issue, urging sharing the responsibility of receiving the refugees, tightening the control of refugee status, hosting refugees inside Syria, and increasing the international aids to the Lebanese government in this regard.

The UN Higher Council for Refugees said Monday that the Syrian refugees in Lebanon had exceeded half a million.

China's foreign trade growth slows in May

BEIJING, 8 June—China's foreign trade growth slowed sharply in May, partly as a result of new government rules to curb capital inflows disguised as trade payments, new data has showed.

Total foreign trade volume grew 0.4 percent year on year last month to 345.1 billion US dollars, a significant pullback from the 15.7-percent gain in April, the General Administration of Customs said on Saturday.

Exports inched up merely one percent year on year to 182.77 billion US dollars, while imports declined 0.3 percent to

162.34 billion US dollars, leaving China with a surplus of 20.43 billion US dollars.

The export data came in much lower than market expectations, even considering the effect of the government rules to curb hot money.

Rising momentum in China's foreign trade in recent months has raised suspicions that companies may have misreported exports to obtain tax rebates or to bypass the country's capital controls to move money into the mainland, prompting authorities to release new rules to check the flows.—Xinhua

“Kung Fu Panda 3” continues as tribute to Chinese culture

CHENGDU, 8 June—The “Kung Fu Panda” franchise will continue to be a tribute to Chinese culture with the creation of its third installment, Jennifer Yuh Nelson, director of Kung Fu Panda 2, said at the ongoing 2013 Global Fortune Forum being held in southwest China’s city of Chengdu.

“Chinese audiences

will have a film that is set in China and a tribute to China. We certainly want to continue to do that. I’m hoping this will create a full circle in that it could actually come back to China, be made in China and also seen in China,” she said. “Kung Fu Panda 2,” released in 2011, brought in worldwide box office earn-

ings of over 660 million US dollars. Nelson is set to direct “Kung Fu Panda 3,” which is scheduled to debut in 2015.

The film will be made in China as a co-production between DreamWorks Animation and Oriental DreamWorks, a Shanghai-based entertainment company that opened its doors in February. The two partners said previously that they will make up to three motion pictures per year. They will also invest over 20 billion yuan (3.1 billion US dollars) to build an animation studio and an entertainment complex in Shanghai that will include theaters, restaurants and tourist attractions. Nelson said the third “Kung Fu Panda” film is still in early development.

“There’s a huge talent base here in China. We’re trying to get everybody involved and making movies like this,” Nelson said. “This is being made by people who love the history of China; these are people who love the appearance and the beauty of the culture of China. We want to show it to the world,” she said. The 2013 Fortune Global Forum will run from 6 to 8 June.

Justin Bieber books space voyage on Virgin Galactic

LOS ANGELES, 8 June—Canadian pop star Justin Bieber is the latest celebrity to reach for the stars, signing up to go into space with Richard Branson’s Virgin Galactic. British entrepreneur Branson announced on Twitter on Wednesday that Bieber, 19, and his manager, Scooter Braun, were the latest “future astronauts.” Bieber tweeted in response, “let’s shoot a music video in SPACE!!”

Virgin Galactic commercial space flights, which are slated to begin next year, have reportedly already drawn high profile passengers including physicist Stephen Hawking as well as actors Tom Hanks, Brad Pitt and Angelina Jolie. At a charity auction during the Cannes film festival

last month, one guest paid \$1.2 million to purchase a seat next to actor Leonardo DiCaprio on Virgin Galactic. Last year, “Two and a Half Men” actor Ashton Kutcher became the 500th person to sign up.

A seat on Virgin Galactic’s SpaceShipTwo, a six-passenger, two-pilot spaceship, costs \$250,000 and will take passengers to an altitude of about 68 miles, giving them a few minutes to experience zero gravity and glimpse Earth from space. The SpaceShipTwo rocket is currently undergoing vigorous tests in preparation of its first space trip with Branson and his family, scheduled for the end of this year. Virgin Galactic is a division of Branson’s Virgin Group.—Reuters

Archie comics spins into first live-action film



LOS ANGELES, 8 June—Comic book teenagers Archie, Veronica, Betty and Jughead are coming to the big screen for the first time in a new live-action feature film based on the long-running “Archie” comic series, its publisher said on Thursday. The comedy will be produced by Warner Bros. Pictures and will feature the lead “Archie” characters in a high school in present-day Riverdale, the fictional backdrop of the series, Archie Comics said in a statement on its website.

“Archie” began in 1941 and became a comic book empire for Archie Comics, which has produced numerous series featuring the main characters. The comics have been adapted for television in

animated and live-action series in the past, as well as a television movie featuring an adult Archie, but this is the first time in the comic book’s 72-year history that a feature film will be made.

Red-haired Archie Andrews is well-known in American pop culture, along with his long-running love triangle with the brunette Veronica Lodge and blonde-haired Betty Cooper and antics with best friend Jughead Jones, the publisher said. “We are thrilled to be working with Warner Bros. on this project and have complete faith in their ability to bring Archie to the big screen in a way the fans will love,” Jon Goldwater, publisher and co-CEO of Archie Comics, said in the statement. The

new film will be directed by Jason Moore, the filmmaker behind 2012’s musical comedy “Pitch Perfect,” the publisher said. Roberto Aguirre-Sacasa will write the screenplay.

No additional details were provided. Superheroes from Marvel and DC Comics have been dominating the global box office as new films featuring Batman, Spider-Man, Iron Man, Captain America and superhero collective The Avengers have grossed billions of dollars worldwide. Warner Bros., a unit of Time Warner Inc, is releasing Superman reboot “Man of Steel” in theaters on 14 June as a darker spin on Clark Kent and his heroic counterpart.

THE HAGUE, 8 June—Robin van Persie has been appointed as permanent first captain by Dutch head coach Louis van Gaal, instead of Wesley Sneijder, Van Gaal told Dutch media after the friendly match

against Indonesia in Jakarta on Friday.

When Louis van Gaal started his second term as head coach he appointed Sneijder as first captain, Dirk Kuyt as second and Kevin Strootman as third. However, Sneijder was not playing at Inter in the first half of the season and was not fit during the second half at his new club Galatasaray.

“When I was appointed last year I had all the confidence in Sneijder,” Van Gaal told Dutch TV channel SBS6. “Now I have that in Van Persie. Sneijder has not been fit for a whole year.

He should focus on his own fitness first.” (Sneijder was only able to wear the captain’s armband during four matches in the past year. Van Persie wore the band for the first time in Jakarta.

The Netherlands beat Indonesia 3-0 through two goals by Siem de Jong and one by Arjen Robben. The Dutch will fly to China on Saturday for next Tuesday’s friendly in Beijing. “The coach asked me last Monday,” Van Persie told Dutch TV channel SBS6. “I felt very flattered and really wanted to do it. I felt very honored. Yes, it is intended that I stay captain.”—Xinhua

Alonso sets fastest lap in Canada practice

MONTREAL, 8 June—Fernando Alonso, desperate to get his Formula One championship bid back on track, signaled his intentions to start with this weekend’s Canadian Grand Prix by setting the fastest lap in practice on Friday. The Spaniard posted the day’s fastest overall time when he lapped the Circuit Gilles Villeneuve in one minute 14.818 seconds during the 90-minute afternoon session.

Briton Lewis Hamilton, a three-time winner at the Montreal street circuit, was second fastest overall in his Mercedes, just 0.012 behind Alonso’s Ferrari. Frenchman Romain Gros-

jean was third quickest for Lotus, while his Finnish teammate Kimi Raikkonen, currently second in the championship standings, was 11th.

Australia’s Mark Webber was fourth for Red Bull while his teammate, triple world champion Sebastian Vettel, could only manage seventh best and was expecting a close race.

“It felt pretty good. It’s always difficult to know what other people are doing, but all in all it was a good run,” Vettel told reporters. “Mercedes was very quick, Ferrari looked very competitive in both long and short

runs, so I think those will be the main two rivals. “But never forget the Lotus.

They can be a surprise in the race by going further than everyone else.” Britain’s Paul Di Resta was the surprise leader for Force India after the morning session, which began in light rain with puddles of water still on the track.

But he tumbled down the timesheets to 13th place in the afternoon session, when he had an electrical problem and all the cars went much quicker after the track had dried and they switched to softer tires.

Nadal inexhaustible, Ferrer ruins French party

PARIS, 8 June—Deep down below the dusty red clay of Chatrier Court at Roland Garros lies a rich seam of mettle and inspiration that only Rafa Nadal seems able to bore into in times of trouble. More often than not during his seven title runs at the French Open the insatiable Spaniard has not required it.

On Friday, however, he almost exhausted it completely before beating world number one Novak Djokovic 6-4, 3-6, 6-1, 6-7(3), 9-7 in a semi-final epic lasting four hours and 37 minutes. There was none of that precious raw material left for Jo-Wilfried

Tsonga whose hopes of becoming the first French player to reach the men’s singles final here since 1988 ended dimly in a 6-1, 7-6, 6-2 defeat by Nadal’s compatriot David Ferrer.

Tsonga’s trouncing of Roger Federer in the quarter-finals had fuelled French hopes but 31-year-old fourth seed Ferrer ground them into the dirt with a ruthless display to reach his first grand slam final after five semi-final defeats. Ferrer has not lost a set on his way to becoming the oldest man to reach the French final since Andre Gomez in 1990, but faces a gargantuan task trying to stop Nadal

becoming the first man to win a single grand slam title eight times.

Only once has Nadal been beaten at Roland Garros in nine years and he proved again on Friday that it will take a super-human effort to prise his hands off the Musketeers’ Cup. Trailing for much of a compelling, almost primal, fifth set, defeat was looming but Nadal dug deeper and deeper to pull away from the brink and claw his way to victory.

“I learned during all my career to enjoy suffering, and these kind of matches are very special,”

Nadal, who lost a near-six-hour Australian Open final against Djokovic in 2012, said. “Sometimes I can play and I have the impression I have no limits. This is really important for me.” If he beats Ferrer, over whom he holds a 19-4 record, Nadal will become the most prolific male player at Roland Garros with 59 match wins, one more than Guillermo Vilas and Roger Federer. All this four months after taking his first tentative steps back on tour after seven months off with a knee injury.—Reuters

Jackie Chan leaves imprints in Hollywood for the second time

LOS ANGELES, 8 June —Chinese action film star Jackie Chan on Thursday became the first person to twice leave the imprints of his hands and feet in cement at Hollywood's famed Chinese Theatre. Chan, who has starred in some 150 films in a career spanning more than 40 years, first left imprints in the forecourt of the theater in 1997, adding to the collection that features screen legends from Clark Gable to Marilyn Monroe.

But over the years, as ownership of the theater changed hands, the cement slab featuring Chan's prints was lost. Slabs are changed often to make room for new entries in the collection.

Representatives at the newly named TCL Chinese Theatre confirmed that Chan was the first two-time inductee. They said they did not know when the prints vanished but were sure that the slab was

not stolen from the forecourt. On Thursday Chan left imprints of his hands, feet and nose in cement, accompanied by his "Rush Hour" co-star Chris Tucker and

"The Karate Kid" co-star Jaden Smith. Chan, 59, told a crowd gathered for the occasion that he had always dreamed of having his prints in cement at the theater.

"My first time in the Chinese Theatre, I walked on the red carpet ... and I see that there are so many stars doing the interviews. And at that time I had nothing to do, standing there looking around," he said. "During all those years I dreamed. Slowly, slowly, I got there," the actor said. Chan has become one of China's biggest film stars, crossing into Hollywood movies with his Kung Fu fighting skills and ability to do his own action stunts.—Reuters

Three killed in C China torrential rain

CHANGSHA, 8 June—Torrential downpours in central China's Hunan Province have left three people dead and one missing, affecting 669,000 people since Thursday, local authorities confirmed on Saturday.

Heavy rain began to affect Hunan on Thursday and continued into Saturday morning, with over 7,390 residents forced to evacuate the worst-hit areas including the cities of Zhangjiajie and Changde, an official at the provincial flood control

and drought relief headquarters said. The rainstorm has triggered landslides in Cili County in Zhangjiajie, killing three local residents and forcing the temporary closure of two provincial highways, according to the

official. The province's 103 reservoirs have seen the water level brimming over danger marks and the water level of Shimen station on Lishui river recorded a rise of 4.78 meters in one day. Xinhua

Serena beats Sharapova to win second French Open title



PARIS, 8 June—World number one Serena Williams clinched her second French Open title when she beat defending champion Maria Sharapova of Russia 6-4, 6-4 in the final on Saturday.

The 31-year-old American, who won her first Roland Garros title in 2002, became the oldest player since tennis turned

professional in 1968 to lift the Suzanne Lenglen Cup after overpowering the second seed on Court Philippe Chatrier.

Williams, who now has 16 grand slam titles to her name, recovered from a slow start to take the opening set after breaking three times.
