Tension 'undeniable' as German and Turkish ministers meet

BERLIN, 23 June-Germany's foreign minister said tensions with Ankara were undeniable after he met his Turkish counterpart on Saturday amid a row over Berlin's criticism of a crackdown on protesters in Turkey and its reluctance to see Turkey join the EU.

Germany and Turkey on Friday summoned each other's ambassadors for tit-for-tat reproaches after Merkel said she was "appalled" by Ankara's response to the protests, and a Turkish cabinet minister accused her of blocking Turkey's accession to the EU because she was "looking for domestic political material for her elections".

Barring a last-minute change of heart by Germany, the EU looks set to postpone or cancel plans to open a new "chapter" in Turkey's membership talks next Wednesday.

Such a move would cast further doubt on the future of Turkey's already painfully slow negotiations to join the EU, and a senior Turkish official has said it would draw a "strong reaction".

German Foreign Minister Guido Westerwelle met his Turkish counterpart Ahmet Davutoglu on Saturday on the sidelines of a

The main focus is on how voters will evaluate "Abenomics," which combines massive fiscal stimulus, bold monetary easing and a growth strategy, and is aimed at pulling the world's third-largest economy out of chronic deflation.

Riding on relatively high popularity, the LDP headed by Abe aims to gain an overall majority in the 127-seat assembly with its junior coalition partner election in December last

Abe has described the election as a battle to be won "at any cost" as the outcome will set the tone for the nationwide polls next month when voters are expected to deliver a verdict on his handling of the seven-month-old government.

Political parties hope to inject momentum into their campaigns for the House of Councillors election set for 21 July.

Memories remain fresh within the LDP of the party's crushing defeat in the previous assembly election in 2009 that paved the way for the Democratic Party of Japan to take the reins of the central government for the first time. The LDP regained power in the general year. In Sunday's election of the DPJ-dominated assembly, the LDP is fielding 59 candidates, the DPJ 44, New Komeito 23 and the Japanese Communist Party 42

The Japan Restoration Party, taking part in the assembly election for the first time with 34 candidates, is also in the spotlight as coleader Toru Hashimoto has indicated he may step down depending on the outcome.

The Osaka mayor, in order to contain political repercussions, has apologized to candidates running on the party's ticket after facing a barrage of criticism for his recent remarks about Japan's wartime military brothels.

70,000 evacuated from flood-ravaged Indian state, death toll rises to 680

NEW DELHI, 23 June-Indian authorities have evacuated a total of 70,000 people from flood-ravaged areas in the northern state of Uttarakhand while 22,000 remained stranded and official death toll attained 680, officials said on Saturday.

Over 10,000 people were evacuated on Saturday from various upper reaches of flood-ravaged Uttarakhand, including the worstaffected Kedarnath, the Press Trust of India quoted officials as saying.

Flooding to close core of **Canada's oil capital for days** CALGARY, 23 June—

Some residents began returning to damaged homes on Saturday after recordbreaking floods in southern Alberta that killed at least three people, displaced more than 100,000 and will leave the core of Canada's oil capital, Calgary, without power for days.

Communities to the south and east of Calgary were on high alert as flood waters washed across the region. And even as Calgary lifted some evacuation orders, officials warned people not to become complacent.

"We have a situation across southern and particularly south-west Alberta of intense saturation, which means 20 millimeters (0.8 inch) of rain that would typically be absorbed could cause massive flooding and run-off," Alberta Municipal Affairs Minister Doug Griffiths told a news conference.

"Please do not assume because the clouds have cleared and the streets are not flooded with water it is perfectly safe to move back into your community." The floods followed 36 hours of unusually heavy rainfall which pushed the volume of water in local rivers to record levels. Some communities received six months of their normal rainfall in under two days.--Reuters

Shenzhou-10 completes manual docking with

space module

BEIJING, 23 June—China's Shenzhou-10 manned spacecraft successfully completed a manual docking procedure with the orbiting Tiangong-1 space module at 10:07 am on Sunday, according to the Beijing Aerospace Control Centre.

Launched on 11 June from northwest China's Gobi desert, the Shenzhou-10 successfully completed an automated docking procedure with the Tiangong-1 on June 13, with three astronauts aboard the Shenzhou-10 entering the space module. At 8:26 am on Sunday,

the spacecraft was manually separated from the Tiangong-1 module.

After the Beijing Aerospace Control Centre remotely examined the spacecraft and the module, the Shenzhou-10 approached the module, with astronaut Nie Haisheng piloting the spacecraft and the other two crew members, Zhang Xiaoguang and Wang Yaping, monitoring instruments and making sure the craft was on target.

At 10:00 am the spacecraft made contact with the Tiangong-1 and at 10:07, the two connected.

WASHINGTON, 23 June-The Pentagon has granted many exceptions, possibly numbering in the thousands, to allow staff members who administer secure computer networks to use flash drives and other portable storage devices, department spokesmen say.

The exceptions to policies barring the use of such devices could make it easier for rogue employees to remove sensitive documents. But officials say waivers go to people who update software and run helpdesk services for the Pentagon's vast computer network and are needed to run the system efficiently.

The US government's handling of sensitive documents has come under scrutiny since Edward Snowden, a systems administrator for a contractor with the National Security Administration, copied classified materials at a Hawaii installation and leaked them to the news media.

Snowden used a simple flash drive to store the materials, according to a government source close to the investigation.

Storage devices have been a concern at the Defence Department since the 2008 Buckshot Yankee incident, in which a malicious software worm known as agent.

About that same time, according to prosecutors, Private Bradley Manning, an Army intelligence analyst, copied thousands of documents onto CDs and a digital camera card and leaked them to the anti-secrecy website WikiLeaks.

Since then, the Pentagon has bolstered efforts to prevent removal of classified data, Lieutenant Colonel James Gregory said. The department is in 100 percent compliance with directives to disable or tightly control use of removable media devices on the Pentagon's secure network, he said. That means most users have restricted profiles and their computers do not recognize flash drives and other devices, like BlackBerrys, that may

The different military branches also have established programmes to control and track personnel authorized to download data from the secure network, they say. Automatic systems instantly report if someone connects an unauthorized device, or inappropriately uses credentials for accessing the system.

While use of flash drives is largely barred, exceptions are granted to systems administrators who install software and manage helpdesk services for the department's millions of computers and nearly 600,000 mobile devices in some 15,000 networked groups.

Lieutenant Colonel Damien Pickart, a Pentagon spokesman, said the department was unable to specify how many exceptions had been given because authority is delegated to smaller units within the service and is not tracked at the department level.

ZTE to churn out more 4G devices

HONG KONG, 23 June— China's ZTE Corp, the world's fifth largest smartphone maker, is aggressively moving into the higher end of the market for mobile gadgets with more 4G shipments.

The Shenzhen-based company has been trying to move away from selling lower end mobile phones, a strategy that has served it well in boosting its global market share, but at the expense of pressuring margins and profitability.

It plans to further raise its global profile by sponsoring a US National Basketball Association (NBA) team later this year, executives said.

"We're working towards a goal of 4G LTE (Long Term Evolution) gadgets making up 40-50 percent of our total consumer devices shipments 2015. The percentby age is quite small now — about 4 percent," Lv Qianhao, ZTE's head of handset strategy, told reporters in China's southern city of Guangzhou, where 4G LTE trials are being conducted.

ZTE is banking on products such as its Grand Memo phablet — a cross between a phone and a tablet, and its Grand S smartphone to battle the likes of Samsung Electronics Co Ltd, Apple Inc that have been dominating the market.

On Friday, ZTE executives showcased its LTE technology to reporters in a mini-van by driving through skyscrapers around a section of Guangzhou city while downloading video clips on its smartphones at speeds that are several tenfold faster than 3G.

ZTE has been working closely with China Mobile Ltd, the world's largest wireless carrier by subscribers, in 4G trials throughout the country that has more than a billion mobile phone users.

Even though ZTE's flagship telecom equipment business has hit stumbling blocks in entering the US market due to Washington's national security concerns, its mobile phones have been selling quite well, ZTE executives said.

"We have plans to sponsor an NBA team that Chinese consumers will say wow to, but we are still negotiating and nothing has been decided," ZTE spokesman David Dai said. Reuters

Sanofi's next-generation insulin shows edge over Lantus

PARIS, 23 June—An improved version of Sanofi's blockbuster insulin Lantus is better than the older drug at controlling blood sugar lows at night, a common side effect in diabetics treated with insulin, according two late-stage tests published on Saturday.

The results for the next-generation treatment, known as U300, could strengthen Sanofi's position as it defends its no. 2 spot in the \$43 billion diabetes market from rival drugs.

Lantus, a synthetic insulin developed in the 1990s, is currently Sanofi's top-selling product. Last year it grew almost 20 percent to generate 5 billion euros (\$6.6 billion) in sales —but is set to lose patent protection in 2015.

The new version has shown it could reduce night-time blood sugar lows by 21 percent compared with Lantus in patients treating their disease with insulin injections, without any additional side effects.

Prenatal exposure to pollution may increase autism risk in kids

WASHINGTON, 23 June

-Women exposed to high levels of air pollution while pregnant were up to twice as likely to have a child with autism as women who lived in areas with low pollution, according to a US study published on Tuesday.

Exposure to diesel particulates, lead, man-ganese, mercury, me-thylene chloride and other pollutants are known to affect brain function and to affect the developing baby.

Two smaller, regional studies in the US have found possible associations between air pollution and autism risk. The latest research, published in the journal Environmental Health Perspectives,

measure," said lead author Lauri Markowitz.

"This decline is encourhealth and economic burden of HPV-associated disease," Markowitz said.

In the United States, HPV vaccines are recommended for 11- or 12-yearold boys and girls, and they are given in three shots over six months. But the CDC said only one third of US girls aged 13 to 17 have been fully vaccinated against HPV.-Xinhua

however, is the first large national study to examine the links, according to researchers from the Harvard University.

"Our findings raise concerns since, depending on the pollutant, 20 percent to 60 percent of the women in our study lived in areas where risk of autism was elevated," lead author Andrea Roberts, a research associate at the Harvard School of Public Health, said in a statement.

The researchers examined data from a long-term study involving 116,430 nurses that began in 1989. Among that group, the authors studied 325 women who had a child with autism and 22,000 women who had a child without the disorder.

To estimate women's exposure to pollutants while pregnant, they used air pollution data from the US Environmental Protection Agency and adjusted for the influence of factors such as income, education, and smoking during pregnancy.

The results showed that women who lived in locations with the highest levels of diesel particulates or mercury in the air were twice as likely to have a child with autism as those who lived in areas with the

lowest levels.

Other types of air pollution, lead, manganese, methylene chloride, and combined metal exposure, were associated with higher autism risk as well. Women who lived in locations with the highest levels of these pollutants were about 50 percent more likely to have a child with autism than those who lived in areas with the lowest concentrations.

Most pollutants were associated with autism more strongly in boys than girls. However, since there were few girls with autism in the study, the authors said this finding should be examined further.

"Our results suggest that new studies should begin the process of measuring metals and other pollutants in the blood of pregnant women or newborn children to provide stronger evidence that specific pollutants increase risk of autism," said senior author Marc Weisskopf, an associate professor at the Harvard School of Public Health.

"A better understanding of this can help to develop interventions to reduce pregnant women's exposure to these pollutants," Weisskopf said.

According to documents prepared ahead of the meeting, catches of parent Japanese eels have declined by around 90 percent in Japan during the past 30 years, while their populations in Taiwan and the Philippines are declining.

The documents also note that the deterioration in river environment and fishing are the greatest threats to the Japanese eel, prompting expectations it will be designated

as an endangered species, although the possibility of non-designation remains due to limited data on inhabitant situations in places other than Japan. Currently, the European eel is listed on top of the IUCN's threecategory endangered list as a species that is highly feared to become extinct in the near future, and is subject to trade control under the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora, commonly known as the Washington Convention.—Kyodo News

Two people were killed when gunmen hurled a hand grenade at a gathering of laborers in Tikrit, 150 km (95 miles) north of Baghdad, and a roadside bomb near some restaurants in the center of the capital killed two more.

More than 1,000 people were killed in Iraq in May alone, making it the deadliest month since the sectarian bloodletting of 2006-07.

Turkish police break up protest, **PM lambasts opponents**

ISTANBUL, 23 June— Turkish riot police fired water cannon to disperse thousands of anti-government demonstrators in Istanbul on Saturday, as Prime Minister Tayyip Erdogan castigated those behind protests he said had played into the hands of Turkey's enemies.

The latest unrest in Taksim Square punctured six days of relative calm in Turkey's biggest city, although it was a long way from matching the ferocity of previous clashes there and in other cities that began more than three weeks ago. Demonstrators threw carnations at a phalanx of officers carrying shields who slowly advanced towards them, flanked by water cannon, to clear the square.

"Police, don't betray your people!" activists shouted after they had been scattered into streets leading to Taksim. Witnesses said police also used teargas to disperse protesters in nearby streets in cat-andmouse clashes.

In the capital Ankara, riot police fired water cannon and teargas to break up hundreds of protesters, some of them shouting anti-Erdogan slogans, and at one location they built barri-

US seeks Snowden's

June-The United States said on Saturday it wants Hong Kong to extradite Edward Snowden and urged it to act quickly, paving the way for what could be a lengthy legal battle to prosecute the former National Security Agency contractor on espionage charges.

Legal sources say Snowden, who is believed to be hiding in Hong Kong, has sought legal representation from human rights lawyers since leaking details about secret US surveillance activities to news media. "If Hong Kong doesn't act soon, it will complicate our bilateral relations and raise questions about Hong Kong's commitment to the rule of law," a senior Obama administration official told Reuters, speaking on condition of anonymity. US National Security Adviser Tom Donilon told

CBS News the United States had a "good case" to bring Snowden back to America to face trial and expected Hong Kong to comply with its extradition treaty. "We have gone to the Hong Kong authorities seeking extradition of Snowden back to the United States," Donilon said.

He added that US law enforcement officials were in a "conversation" with Hong Kong authorities about the issue. A senior US law enforcement source said extradition "can, of course, be a lengthy legal process" but expressed optimism that Snowden would be sent back to the United States. The South China Morning Post reported that Snowden was not detained or in police protection - as reported elsewhere — and instead he was in a "safe place" somewhere in Hong Kong.-Reuters

Cypriot vet services destroy thousands of chickens because of NDV Disease

NICOSIA, 23 June— Cypriot veterinary services are in the process of destroying tens of thousands of chickens after they established an outbreak of the highly contagious Newcastle Disease Virus (NDV).

A veterinary services official said on Friday that 80,000 birds were destroyed on Thursday and as many more will be destroyed by the end of the day.

The veterinary services have quarantined three poultry farms near the capital Nicosia and are disinfecting all outgoing cars and people.

"We have three flocks in quarantine," veterinary services official Yiannos Ioannou said.

Authorities have set up three-km quarantine around the farms and will also be

monitoring the situation in a 10-km radius as a precaution against the airborne disease.

"We'll continue the quarantine for at least 20 days, to make sure that the disease does not spread to flocks in other areas," he added. Health authorities said the disease posed no risk to public health as the virus is not normally transmitted to humans and is destroyed during normal cooking. The virus may affect people who come into close contact with sick birds in rare cases and may cause flu-like symptoms.

The disease was detected a week ago and units in the immediate area were stopped from putting their poultry and eggs on the market since.

However, authorities

waited for laboratory confirmation of the disease before destroying the flocks. NDV got its name

from Newcastle, United Kingdom, where it was first detected in 1926. It is described as a highly contagious viral disease of domestic poultry, cage and aviary birds and wild birds.

Signs of the disease are digestive and respiratory disorders and nervousness of the birds and depending on the strain of the virus it rapidly leads to their death.

Agriculture Minister Nicos Kouvialis has said the cause of the outbreak has not yet been determined and has asked for an investigation as to how and where the virus came from.

He said wrong vaccination may be a possible explanation.-Xinhua

Al-Qaeda says hostages in North Africa alive, open to talks Dakar, 23 June the hostages had been transferred to Algeria and were in the hands of AQIM's

Eight European hostages, including five from France, being held by al Oaeda in the Islamic Maghreb (AQIM) are safe, the Islamist group said in a statement posted on its Twitter account on Saturday.

The statement coincided with rallies across France organized by the families of French hostages who were seized in Niger in September 2010 to mark more than 1,000 days of captivity. French newspapers reported this week that new chief, Yahia Abou el Hamam. The French government declined to comment on the report. "We would like to as-

sure the family and relatives of the hostages of the safety of their children," said the message, posted by AQIM's Andalus Media arm. The message repeated previous statements by AQIM that it would kill the hostages if there were any new French military intervention in North Africa, but said it remained open to negotiations to free them. "Although we are near-

ing three years holding the hostages, we are open to negotiations. Our demands were clear and legitimate. But they were rejected," the statement said. The French government has said it does not negotiate with hostage takers. AQIM said it would soon release a video of the five French hostages and three other Europeans. At least eight French

Greece battles dozen small wildfires, firefighters complain of shortages

ATHENS, 23 June— Greece is battling a dozen small wildfires which broke out across the country on Saturday, authorities reported, as firefighters complain of shortages in personnel and equipment to address the summer's challenges

Only in Attica prefecture more than 100 firemen, assisted by seven firefighting aircrafts and four firefighting helicopter, have been deployed to extinguish three fronts.

According to the Fire Brigade the blazes have

scorched forested areas and approached inhabited zones, but no damages have been reported, and there is no cause for concern, despite the strong winds which are blowing.

Greece suffers each summer from destructive wildfires linked to scorching temperatures and arson in many cases.

As meteorologists forecast one of the hottest summers this year, the firefighters' union has expressed concern about shortages in staff and equipment due to the financial crisis which

Japan celebrates Mt Fuji's listing as world heritage site

Токуо, 23 June—From its prime minister to a trekker, Japan celebrated the inscription of the country's iconic Mt Fuji on UN-ESCO's prestigious World Heritage List on Saturday.

"I am happy from the bottom of my heart," Prime Minister Shinzo Abe said in a statement after the World Heritage Committee under the UN Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization decided in the Cambodian capital Phnom Penh to register Mt Fuji.

"I expect more people to visit Japan from overseas and see Mt Fuji," Abe said.

Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology Minister Hakubun Shimomura welcomed the move by the UNESCO committee, which inscribed the 3,776-metre-tall mountain under the name "Fujisan, sacred place and source of artistic inspiration." "I'm so glad Mt Fuji was recognized as a religious and artistic object," Shimomura said.

Eighty-year-old photographer Shiro Shirahata said he believes there is no other well-proportioned mountain like Mt Fuji.

Ten including nine foreigners killed in Pakistan's northern area of Gilgit

ISLAMABAD, 23 June— Ten people including nine foreign tourists and one local guide were shot dead by unknown gunmen in Pakistan's northern area of Gilgit in the wee hours of Sunday morning, said local police on Sunday.

Deputy Inspector General of Gilgit, Ali Sher, said that the ten killed include five from Ukraine, three from China and one from Russia with the tenth's nationality yet to be determined.

Latest news coming in quoted unidentied sources as saying that the tenth killed is a local guide.

Police said that the firing took place at about 12:30 am (local time) Sunday when unidentified gunmen opened fired at tourists living in a hotel at the foot of Nanga Parbat, the ninth highest mountain in the world.

There were an estimated 10 to 12 militants involved in the attack. local

media quoted eyewitnesses as saying. They woke up the tourists in sleep and ordered them to come out of the hotel and opened fire on them, said the report.

Most of the killed were tourists coming here to climb the mountain, police said, adding that the hotel is located at a base camp of Nanga Parbat in the remote Diamir area of Gilgit.

All the bodies have been airlifted by helicopter to the country 's capital Islamabad, said local media.

An official from the Chinese Embassy to Pakistan, who asked to remain anonymous, told Xinhua that they have learned about the news and are contacting the concerned Pakistani departments to know more details about the incident.

Both Pakistani President Zardari and Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif have condemned the attack. No group has claimed responsibility for the attack yet. Xinhua

Philippine gov't asks food importers, manufacturers to ensure absence of maleic acid

MANILA, 23 June — The Philippine Food and Drug Administration (FDA) ordered on Saturday all importers and manufacturers of starch-based food products to submit certificate of analysis of their goods to ensure the absence of maleic acid, a hazardous substance.

The order was contained in a memorandum circular and in accordance with the FDA's earlier public advisory banning food products contaminated with maleic acid, FDA Director General Kenneth Hartigan-Go said.

"All importers and manufacturers of starchbased food products such as starch powder, pearls and noodles are hereby required to submit certificate of analysis to confirm the absence of maleic acid on or before 31 July 2013," he said.

According to the FDA, maleic acid is not approved an additive for manufacturing food products.

He then took his hunting rifle hidden in his dormitory and asked a driver to ride him away to another district. He gunned down the driver on the way and then drove the vehicle back.-Xinhua

China, Britain signs agreement on currency swap

LONDON, 23 June-Mervyn King, governor of Bank of England (BoE) and Zhou Xiaochuan, governor of People's Bank of China (PBoC), have signed an agreement to establish a reciprocal 3-year sterling/ renminbi (RMB, or Chinese yuan) currency swap line, according to an announcement on the BoE' website on Saturday night.

The maximum value of the swap is 200 billion Chinese yuan/20 billion pounds. The swap line may be used to promote bilateral trade between the two countries and to support domestic financial stability, said BoE.



Public health officials agree on priority actions to control **MERS-CoV**

GENEVA, 23 June—Public health officials meeting in Cairo agreed that strengthening countries' abilities to control, detect, and treat cases of new coronavirus infection are needed to stem the growing outbreak of the disease, the World Health Organization (WHO) said on Saturday. More than 100 public health experts from all countries in the Middle East and North Africa and Europe which have confirmed cases of Middle East respiratory syndrome coronavirus (MERS-CoV) and from throughout WHO's Eastern Mediterranean Region (EMR) met from Thursday to Saturday.

They agreed that there is a list of priority actions which need to be agreed internationally and implemented nationally, according to the WHO. At an international level, fast and complete reporting of cases, with contact histories, clinical care and treatment outcomes

in as much detail as possible, and collected in a uniform manner across countries, is necessary, they said.

The meeting agreed that a series of actions in seven key areas were key to increasing member states' and the international community's ability to prepare for, control, detect, alert the world to, and treat cases of diseases caused by MERS-CoV. These areas are surveillance, mass gatherings preparation, clinical management of cases, laboratory diagnostics, infection control, communications, and International Health Regulation (2005) reporting, the WHO said.

WHO said on Saturday in its latest disease outbreak update that the Ministry of Health in Saudi Arabia has announced an additional laboratory-confirmed four cases with MERS-CoV, including three female health care workers who cared for two previously confirmed MERS-CoV cases.-Xinhua

Danish driver Simonsen dies at Le Mans

LE MANS (France), 23 June-Motorsport mourned Danish driver Allan Simonsen after his fatal crash at the Le Mans 24 Hours sportscar race on Saturday.

He was the first driver to die in the race for 27 years and the 22nd fatality linked to it since the first running on public roads near the cathedral city in western France 90 years ago.

The 34-year-old, driving an Aston Martin, spun into the barriers at Tertre Rouge on lap three after just 10 minutes of an endurance race famed the world over for its glamour and danger.

"In a serious condition, Allan Simonsen was transferred immediately to the Circuit Medical Centre where he died soon after due to his injuries," organizers said in a statement on the official website (www.24hlemans.com).

Simonsen, one of the world's more experienced endurance drivers at the La Sarthe circuit, was competing in the GTE Am class for

production-based sportscars which are slower than the LMP1 and LMP2 prototype categories.

Media reports said he was conscious and talking to doctors immediately after the accident, which led to a 58 minute safety car period to allow the destroyed barriers to be repaired.

Simonsen was attended at the scene of the crash by staff from the Automobile Club de l'Ouest's (ACO) medical service who transferred him to the Circuit Medical Centre where he died.

Aston Martin team chief David Richards said Simonsen's family had asked the team to carry on in the event GTE Am class) but we are before they returned to Copenhagen.

"Incidents like this are very rare but when they happen you have to make decisions based on a number of factors — in this case the wishes of the family were paramount," he said in a statement.
