Australia to grant 100 million Australian Dollars to Myanmar's educational reform this year

NAY PYI TAW, 10 July— President U Thein Sein received a delegation led by Senator The Hon Bob Carr, Foreign Affairs Minister of the Commonwealth of Australia, at the Credentials Hall of the Presidential Palace, here this morning.

The President said that Myanmar is placing special emphasis on socio-economic development of people in rural areas. The government is implementing micro credit schemes in cooperation with the private sectors as those people's major requirement is capital. Aus Aid is carry-

ing out rural development tasks in Indonesia and the African countries. He expressed thanks for Aus Aid's assistance to Myanmar. He requested the FM to convey his invitation to the Australian Prime Minister to visit Myanmar.

The Australian Foreign Minister said that both Myanmar and Australia would promote trade and investments thanks to trade commission office in Yangon. The Australian companies are making investments in Myanmar. He pledged that Australia would grant 100 million Australian

Dollars to Myanmar's educational reform this year. And Australia has provided five million Australian Dollars for peace-making process with national race armed groups, he added.

They also held talks on education and health care programme for victims in Rakhine State.

It was also attended by Union Minister U Wunna Maung Lwin, U Aung Kyi and U Soe Thane, departmental heads, the Australian Ambassador to Myanmar and high-ranking officials.

Thetkalchaung river crossing bridge enables Ngaputaw dwellers to reach Pathein within 30 minutes drive

All townships in Ayeyawady Region except Ngaputaw Township can be reached easily by road and local people of 25 townships are able to travel from one place to another by car. But, Ngaputaw Township which is dotted with a large number of rivers and creeks is accessible only by waterway and the township is used to be away from strategic road network for many years.

So, the government has designated the 21-mile long Pathein-Ngaputaw motorway as road network No (11) and it was upgraded to tarred one, enabling Ngaputaw township to connect other strategic roads. The Thetkalchaung river crossing bridge on Pathein-Ngaputaw road in Pathein District was commissioned into service on 8 July. It is the 38th facility emerged in the time of the

government of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar. In his address at the opening ceremony, Union Minister for Construction U Kyaw Lwin said that the bridge would enable Ngaputaw dwellers to travel to other places at any time.

Construction of the newly-opened bridge started on 1-1-2011 and was completed on 26-6-2013, taking two years, five months and 25 days. Thanks to the bridge, there will be smooth and speedy flow of local commodities from one place to another in the region, thereby contributing towards improvements in economic, social, education, health and administrative sectors of the region. Although it took three hours to reach Pathein from Ngaputaw by boat in the past, now Pathein can be reached within 30 minutes drive.

Ayeyawady Region Chief Minister U Thein Aung spoke words of thanks on the occasion, calling for constant maintenance for durability of the bridge.

The newly-inaugurated Thetkalchaung bridge linking between Kangyidaunt Township and Ngaputaw Township in Ayeyawady Region is situated at mile post No

(12/0) on Pathein-Ngaputaw road. It is 1880 feet long and each approach road is 4630 feet long. It has a 24 feet wide motorway flanked by three feet and six inches wide pavement each on both sides. Its water clearance area is 215 feet wide and 40 feet high and it can withstand 60 tons of load.

Mandatory evacuation for two villages to escape from escalation of riverbank erosion

NAY PYI TAW, 10 July — “This is third time for us. No more farmlands are left. We are in a difficult time for food and shelter as there is nothing we can work due to erosion,” says a villager of Theingon village.

It was learnt that hundreds of people from Theingon, Mayoegon, Shadaw and Htanaunggon villages near Ayeyawady Bridge (Pakokku) had been evacuated to safety to be free from escalating erosion along the river. Theingon and Mayoegon have been worst hit by riverbank erosion, it is learnt.

As the sloughing is expected to worsen and the bank along Ayeyawady River in Pakokku Township is becoming an increasing worry, especially for Mayoegon village with the population of 380 from 94 houses and Theingon village with 390 from

95, Tatmadawmen, police members, departments concerned, members of auxiliary fire brigade, social organizations and political parties gave a helping hand in the mandatory evacuation for the residents of the two villages on 4 July.

The Theingon village administrator said that every household had to save K 500 per month as a preparation for possible danger of erosion since four or five years ago; that they put all their savings including donations into buying four acres of farmland to relocate the households; that one acre cost K 3.6 million; and that it was difficult to buy more lands for nearly 200 households as each acre was divided into only 10 plots.

The erosion-stricken two villages are situated about four miles far from each other.

All villagers have to go to Pakokku to do odd-jobs as their farmlands were eroded. Besides, No (88) Basic Education Primary School where 64 school children from the two villages attend to is under demolition due to erosion. It was learnt that officials concerned visited there on 5 and 6 July and vowed to provide necessary assistance.

“Nothing is left due to erosion. Fire and storm victims can get assistance, but it is hard to see donation for us,” Ko Myo Nyunt of Mayoegon village gives voice to his worry about the future.

Pilots in Asiana crash relied on automatic equipment for airspeed

SAN FRANCISCO, 10 July — The pilots aboard the Asiana Airlines Boeing 777 that crashed in San Francisco relied on automatic equipment—an auto-throttle system—to maintain airspeed and did not realize the plane was flying too slowly until it was just 200 feet (60 metres) above the ground, the head of the US National Transportation Safety Board said on Tues-

day.

In her third detailed briefing on Saturday's crash that killed two Chinese passengers and injured more than 180 other people, NTSB Chairwoman Deborah Hersman also said two flight attendants were ejected from the plane after its tail hit a seawall in front of the runway and was torn off. Both were found injured but alive on the side

of the runway.

Hersman said many questions remained about the incident. The South Korean airline's flight crew members were not tested for drugs or alcohol after the crash, a requirement for pilots of US-based carriers involved in accidents, she said.

The accounts given to investigators by the pilots, as relayed by Hersman, con-

firmed information from the plane's flight data recorder that showed the plane was travelling 25 percent below its target airspeed as it came in for landing.

While she has declined to speculate on the cause of the crash, much of the information released by the NTSB suggests pilot error as a main focus of the investigation.

The pilot in charge of landing the plane on Saturday was in training on the 777 and was roughly halfway through the process, while seated next to him was a co-pilot on his first flight as an instructor. Both were experienced pilots, although they had not flown together before, Hersman said. "At about 500 feet, he realized that they were low," Hersman told reporters, referring to the instructor pilot's account of the failed last-second attempts to avoid Saturday's disaster. "Between 500 and 200 feet (150 and 60 metres), they had a lateral deviation and they were low.

Cesium readings further climb in groundwater at Fukushima plant

TOKYO, 10 July —Radioactive cesium readings in groundwater samples taken from an observation hole by the sea at the Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Station increased further on Tuesday compared with the samples taken the day before, Tokyo Electric Power Co said early Wednesday.

Tuesday's samples showed 11,000 becquerels of cesium-134 per liter and

22,000 Bq/L of cesium-137. They were 111 times and 105 times greater than the samples on Friday.

Monday's samples registered 9,000 Bq/L of cesium-134 and 18,000 Bq/L of cesium-137.

The reason for the spike in readings remains unknown. TEPCO said it will intensify the monitoring.

Syria rebels likely behind Aleppo chemical attack

SAN FRANCISCO, 10 July— Russian scientific analysis indicates a deadly projectile that hit a suburb of the Syrian city of Aleppo on 19 March contained the nerve agent sarin and was most likely fired by rebels, Russia's UN envoy said on Tuesday. The incident at Khan al-Assal in the northern Province of Aleppo killed more than two dozen people. Both the government and rebels have blamed each other for what they say was an attack involving chemical weapons. Both sides also deny using chemical weapons.

Russia, alongside Iran, is Syria's closest ally and chief arms supplier. The United States cast doubt on the Russian analysis and along with France called for full UN access to Syrian sites where chemical weapons use was suspected.

Moscow's UN Ambassador, Vitaly Churkin, said Russian experts visited the location where the projectile struck and took their own samples of material from the site. Those samples, he said, were then analyzed at a Russian laboratory certified by the Organization for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons.

"It was established that on 19 March the re-

bels launched an unguided Basha'ir-3 projectile towards Khan al-Assal controlled by the government forces," he said. "The results of the analysis clearly indicate that the ordnance used in Khan al-Assal was not industrially manufactured and was filled with sarin." "The projectile involved is not a standard one for chemical use," Churkin said. "Hexogen, utilized as an opening charge, is not utilized in standard ammunitions. Therefore, there is every reason to believe that it was armed opposition fighters who used the chemical weapons in Khan al-Assal."

Churkin said he had informed UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon of the Russian findings. Ban is scheduled to meet Ake Sellstrom, the Swedish scientist heading a UN team estab-

lished to investigate allegations of chemical weapon use in Syria, in New York this week.

Czech President swears in cabinet in showdown with parliament

PRAGUE, 10 July— Czech President Milos Zeman swore in a cabinet led by a longtime ally on Wednesday that faces almost certain rejection by parties in parliament, raising the prospect of prolonged political uncertainty in the central European nation.

The leftist president confirmed economist Jiri Rusnok as prime minister, hoping that he can pull the Czech economy out of a recession now into its

second year and lead the country into an election due next year.

But the cabinet is likely to lose a vote of confidence, due within 30 days, as Rusnok's appointment has infuriated both the three parties of the outgoing center-right coalition and the leftist opposition, who all view it as a power grab by Zeman.

Rusnok, who served as finance minister in a Zeman-led cabinet a decade

ago, replaces Petr Necas, who resigned last month after a close aide was charged with bribery and abuse of office. Prosecutors have asked parliament to lift the center-right former premier's parliamentary immunity.

If Rusnok loses the parliamentary vote of confidence, Zeman is meant to appoint another prime minister. But there are no time limits and politicians fear Zeman could drag

mutual suspicion, managing disputes and expanding cooperation. The two sides agreed to hold an informal meeting at an appropriate time before the next strategic security dialogue. The strategic security dialogue is within the framework of the fifth China-US Strategic and Economic Dialogue (S&ED) which kicks off on Wednesday. The S&ED covers a wide range of political, security, economic and financial topics as well as major regional and international issues of common concern.

Top on the agenda are discussions on the implementation of the consensus

reached by Chinese President Xi Jinping and US-President Barack Obama at their summit in California last month on building a new type of major-country relationship based on mutual respect and win-win cooperation.

Acting as special representatives of Xi, Vice Premier Wang Yang and State Councilor Yang Jiechi will co-chair the fifth S&ED with US Secretary of State John Kerry and Treasury Secretary Jacob Lew — special representatives of Obama. Wang and Lew will co-chair the economic track talks, while Yang and Kerry will co-host the strategic track talks.—Xinhua

out the process, leaving Rusnok's team in place for many months to carry out the president's wishes. Such a course would increase the risk of gridlock in policymaking which could hold up a 2014 budget plan and rattle investors, who have long viewed the Czech Republic as a safe haven among emerging economies.

Rusnok's new cabinet includes several people who have worked as advisers to Zeman and former members of the opposition Social Democratic party, which Zeman led until 2002.

France eliminates threat to cut off internet pirates

PARIS, 10 July—France has put an end to the most controversial element of a copyright piracy law that allowed the government to cut off the Internet subscriptions of repeat offenders.

The Socialist government of Francois Hollande published an official decree on Tuesday to erase the provision in the law that allowed courts to deprive copyright violators of their internet connectivity if they transgressed on three occasions. However, other sanctions, such as fines, will remain in place.

The tough anti-piracy law championed by previous President Nicolas Sarkozy was embraced by the music and movie industries but came under fire from critics who said it threatened civil liberties.

“This measure is necessary because it ends a penalty that is not suited to today’s world, and because it illustrates the new orientation of the government’s efforts to fight online piracy,” Minister of Culture Aurelie Filippetti said in a statement on Tuesday.

She added that France would now focus its efforts

on websites that profit from illegal downloading rather than individual users.

France was one of the first countries to adopt a “three-strikes” law to protect artists and intellectual property owners from copyright violations. But the law, passed in 2009, has barely made a dent in online piracy as consumers moved to new technologies such as the streaming of video or music instead of downloads.

Only one person actually had his Internet access cut off in a ruling that came in June.

The French law was similar to those in place in

Australia, New Zealand and South Korea. Users are sent a series of notifications to warn them that they have allegedly infringed copyright and information on legal alternatives. Repeat offenders then face fines or the removal of their internet access. Music and entertainment companies lobbied hard for these types of laws, which eventually required Internet service providers and telecoms companies to identify their customers by the IP addresses where alleged illegal downloads occurred. The practice was opposed by privacy advocates and Internet activists.

China’s Alibaba on hunt for acquisitions after IPO

SHANGHAI, 10 July—China’s e-commerce giant Alibaba Group Holding Ltd’s will use proceeds from its potential IPO to fund acquisitions, media reported on Wednesday, as the firm looks to broaden its mobile services.

The group will not include most of its financial businesses, such as the Alipay online payment platform and its micro-loan services, in the potential IPO, Chief Executive Officer Jonathan Lu was quoted as saying in the *China Daily*.

Alibaba has not officially announced that it will hold an IPO, but people familiar with the matter say the company has intensified

its meetings with investment banks over the past few weeks. The issue is expected to value Alibaba at \$60-\$100 billion, and could raise \$15 billion, making it one of the world’s biggest internet IPOs and a much sought-after prize for bankers and stock exchanges.

Lu, who succeeded founder Jack Ma in May, said the timing of Alibaba’s listing would depend on whether he had a good acquisition target.

Alibaba paid \$294 million to buy a 28 percent stake in Chinese digital mapping company AutoNavi in May. It also invested \$586 million to buy an 18 percent stake in

Sina Corp’s Weibo business.

Most of Alibaba’s revenue comes from its e-commerce platforms such as Taobao and only its profitable businesses will be sold in the IPO, the paper said.

The group posted a 171.1 percent jump in net profit in the fourth quarter as its revenue rose 84 percent to \$642.2 million, according to a regulatory filing by major shareholder Yahoo Inc. Alibaba last year split Taobao into three units: Taobao Mall, Taobao Marketplace and eTao. The first two units had total transaction value of about 1 trillion yuan (\$163.15 billion) last year.—Reuters

Next US Mars mission could help bring back rocks, soil to Earth

WASHINGTON, 10 July—The next US rover to Mars should look for signs of past life, collect samples for possible future return to the Earth, and demonstrate technology for future human exploration of the Red Planet, a team of scientists and engineers in charge of defining the US 2020 Mars mission said on Tuesday.

The recommended science goals are highlighted in a 154-page document, which was submitted by the US government-appointed Mars 2020 Science Definition Team after five months of work.

The report said the National Aeronautics and Space Administration

(NASA) plans to re-use much of the design of *Curiosity*, which landed on Mars almost a year ago, to build the rover to ensure mission costs and risks are as low as possible.

It detailed how the rover would use its instruments for visual, mineralogical and chemical analysis down to microscopic scale to understand the environment around its landing site and identify biosignatures, or features in the rocks and soil that could have been formed by past life.

“The Mars 2020 mission concept does not presume that life ever existed on Mars,” said Jack Mustard, chairman of the Sci-

ence Definition Team and a professor at the Geological Sciences at Brown University. “However ... past Martian life seems possible, and we should begin the difficult endeavor of seeking the signs of life.”

The team, which is composed of 19 scientists and engineers from universities and research organizations, is also proposing the rover collect and package as many as 31 samples of rock cores and soil for a later mission to bring back for more definitive analysis in laboratories on the Earth.

It said that a retrieval mission could occur as early as the mid-2020s or wait until the 2030s but such timing would be determined by future budget availability and the technology capabilities that are developed in the coming years.

NASA intends to send humans to Mars by the 2030s, and samples collected and analyzed by the rover will help inform future human exploration missions to Mars, the team said.

The rover could make measurements and technology demonstrations to help designers of a human expedition understand any hazards posed by Martian dust and demonstrate how to collect carbon dioxide, which could be a resource for making oxygen and rocket fuel, it said.

Improved precision landing technology that enhances the scientific value of robotic missions also will be critical for eventual human exploration on the surface, it added.

“Crafting the science and exploration goals is a crucial milestone in preparing for our next major Mars mission,” said John Grunsfeld, NASA’s associate administrator for science in Washington.

“The objectives determined by NASA with the input from this team will become the basis later this year for soliciting proposals to provide instruments to be part of the science payload on this exciting step in Mars exploration,” Grunsfeld said.—Xinhua

Microsoft to unveil big management reorganization on Thursday

SAN FRANCISCO, 10 July—Microsoft Corp will unveil on Thursday its biggest management reorganization in at least five years, to better compete in a world of mobile devices and Web-based services, according to the technology blog AllThingsD.

The changes will shift the duties and responsibilities of many top Microsoft executives and are intended to eliminate overlap within the 98,000-employee company, AllThingsD reported on Monday, citing anonymous sources.

A new cloud comput-

ing and business-focused products unit would be headed by Satya Nadella, who currently oversees Microsoft’s server business, according to a Bloomberg report last week. Julie Larson-Green, the current co-head of Microsoft’s Windows operating system business, will lead the company’s hardware efforts, including the Xbox video game console and the Surface tablets, Bloomberg said.

Microsoft declined to comment. Chief Executive Steve Ballmer remains under pressure to ramp up Microsoft’s presence on mobile devices as the computer industry steadily declines.

Ballmer announced in his annual letter to shareholders last October that Microsoft now sees itself as a “devices and services” company, rather than a software maker.—Reuters

Soy doesn't prevent prostate cancer return

NEW YORK, 10 July—Men who took soy supplements after having their prostate cancer removed were just as likely to see their cancer return as men who didn't take soy, in a new study.

"I think this study clearly demonstrates men in this particular situation... will not benefit," said Maarten Bosland, the study's lead author from the University of Illinois at Chicago.

According to the American Cancer Society, prostate cancer is the second most common cancer among men after skin cancer. It's estimated that one in every six men will be diagnosed with it.

Some doctors believed compounds found in soy—known as isoflavones—might help prevent prostate cancer, but more recent studies have found those and other nutritional supplements don't reduce the risk of developing the disease.

For the new study, published in the *Journal of the American Medical Association*, Bosland and his colleagues randomly assigned 177 men who'd had their cancerous prostates surgi-

cally removed less than four months earlier to drink either a soy or placebo beverage every day for up to two years between July 1997 and May 2010.

Although the vast majority of the participants reported following the instructions, the study was stopped during an early evaluation because there was no benefit seen with soy, Bosland said.

He and his colleagues found that 27 percent of the participants in the soy group ended up having their cancer return according to prostate-specific antigen (PSA) blood tests, which are used to check for evidence of cancer.

That compared to about 30 percent in the placebo group. "When we did the analysis and there was an absolute absence of the effect, I was a little surprised. But in a way, it was good because the outcome was clear," Bosland told Reuters Health. "This adds to the evidence that nutrition supplements really aren't beneficial," said Dr Eric Klein, chairman of the Cleveland Clinic Glickman Urological and Kidney Institute.

UBS once again the world's largest private bank as assets surge

ZURICH, 10 July—UBS (UBSN.VX) won back the title of largest private bank in the world as inflows of fresh client funds surged last year, indicating restored confidence following the financial crisis, according to a study.

The Swiss bank displaced Bank of America Corp (BAC.N) from the top spot in an annual benchmark compiled by London-based wealth management consultant Scorpio Partnership. It edged out the US bank with 9.7 percent growth in overall assets to \$1.705 trillion, compared with 5.9 percent at Bank of America.

The ranking is a coup for scandal-tarnished UBS, which in October said it would axe 10,000 staff and scale back its riskier investment banking division in favor of its private bank.

Activist fund Knight Vinke in May launched a campaign to break up UBS, though a forecast-beating first quarter and the highest wealthy customer inflows in six years took some of the sting out of the share-

holder's demands. Overall, private banks won 24 percent more net new money, which represents a dramatic turnaround. Financial providers to the wealthy had struggled to win back client confidence in the wake of the global financial crisis.

However, the inflows have not yet translated to greater profits, which rose only 5.3 percent, according to Scorpio. This means private banks must still cut costs to lift profitability. "The analysis of the data shows there are still signs of weakness in the model for many operators," Scorpio said in the study. Pri-

United Nations Secretary-General's Message on World Population Day 11 July 2013

As a staunch advocate of the education, health and rights of girls and an enduring believer in the power of young women to transform our world, I welcome the focus of this year's World Population Day on adolescent pregnancy. This sensitive topic demands global attention.

Far too many of the estimated 16 million teenage girls who give birth each year never had the opportunity to plan their pregnancy. Complications from pregnancy and childbirth can cause grave disabilities, such as obstetric fistula, and are the leading cause of death for these vulnerable young women. Adolescent girls also face high levels of illness, injury and death due to unsafe abortion.

To address these problems, we must get girls into primary school and enable them to receive a good education through their adolescence. When a young girl is educated, she is more likely to marry later, delay childbearing until she is ready, have healthier children, and earn a higher income.

We must also provide all adolescents with age-appropriate, comprehensive education on sexuality. This is especially important to empowering young women to decide when and if they wish to become mothers. In addition, we must provide comprehensive sexual and reproductive health services that cover family planning and the prevention and treatment of sexually transmitted infections, including HIV. And we must guarantee the maternal health services that women need.

When we devote attention and resources to the education, health and wellbeing of adolescent girls, they will become an even greater force for positive change in society that will have an impact for generations to come. On this World Population Day, let us pledge to support adolescent girls to realize their potential and contribute to our shared future.—UNIC, Yangon

Dr. Babatunde Osotimehin UNFPA Executive Director's Message on World Population Day 11 July 2013

There are over 600 million girls in the world today, more than 500 million of them in developing countries. They are shaping humanity's present and future. The opportunities and choices girls have during adolescence will enable them to begin adulthood as empowered, active citizens.

With the right skills and opportunities, they can invest in themselves, in their families and their communities. However, pregnancy jeopardizes the rights, health, education and potential of far too many adolescent girls, robbing them of a better future.

About 16 million girls aged 15-19 give birth each year, and complications from pregnancy and child birth are the leading cause of death among girls in this age group, especially in developing countries.

Adolescent pregnancy is not just a health issue, it is a development issue. It is deeply rooted in poverty, gender inequality, violence, child and forced marriage, power imbalances between adolescent girls and their male partners, lack of education, and the failure of systems and institutions to protect their rights. To bring these issues to global attention, this year's World Population Day is focusing on adolescent pregnancy.

Breaking the cycle of adolescent pregnancy requires commitment from nations, communities and individuals in both developed and developing countries to invest in adolescent girls. Governments should enact and enforce national laws that raise the age of marriage to 18 and should promote community-based efforts that support girls' rights and prevent child marriage and its consequences.

Adolescents and youth must be provided with age-appropriate comprehensive sexuality education to develop the knowledge and skills they need to protect their health throughout their lives. However, education and information are not enough. Good quality reproductive health services must also be readily available in order for adolescents to make informed choices and be healthy.

At the local level, communities should provide the infrastructure to deliver reproductive health care in a youth-friendly and sensitive way.

Underlying all these efforts is the understanding that the dignity and human rights of adolescent girls must be respected, protected and fulfilled. Today, we call on governments, the international community and all stakeholders involved to take measures that enable adolescent girls to make responsible life choices and to provide the necessary support for them in cases when their rights are threatened. Every young girl, regardless of where she lives, or her economic circumstances, has the right to fulfil her human potential. Today, too many girls are denied that right. We can change that, and we must.—UNFPA

US regulators propose higher capital standards for big banks

WASHINGTON, 10 July — Federal regulators proposed on Tuesday the eight largest US banks have to boost their leverage ratio to five percent, higher than the three percent benchmark by the Basel III rules. The Federal Reserve Board, the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC), and the Office of the Comptroller of the Currency (OCC) proposed that those most systemically significant US banks should maintain a tier one capital leverage buffer of at least five percent. In addition, the bank's deposit-holding subsidiaries would have to increase that ratio to

six percent.

The federal regulators believe a strong capital base at the largest banks can shrink their risk to the economy in the light of a repeat of the 2008 crisis. The proposal, if adopted, would take effect on 1 Jan, 2018. The rule will apply to the eight biggest US banks, including Goldman Sachs, Citigroup, Bank of America, JPMorgan Chase, Wells Fargo, Morgan Stanley, Bank of New York Mellon and State Street Bank.

In a separate rulemaking, The FDIC and OCC also adopted the three percent benchmark set by the

27-nation Basel Committee on Banking Supervision in 2010. The Federal Reserve approved the final rule last week. "With the new capital rule, the federal banking agencies are taking an important step to strengthen the banking system and protect it from future financial crisis," said Comptroller of the Currency Thomas Curry.

Most US banks are required to abide by the three percent leverage ratio on 1 Jan, 2015, but the largest internationally active banks are required to apply the rule on January 1, 2014, according to the final rule.—Xinhua

Berlusconi's final tax fraud appeal hearing set for 30 July

ROME, 10 July— Former Italian Prime Minister Silvio Berlusconi's final appeal against a prison term and a ban for tax fraud is expected to be heard in court on 30 July, much earlier than expected, his lawyers said on Tuesday.

The speeded-up timetable heightened the pressures on Prime Minister Enrico Letta's fragile coalition government, which depends on the 76-year-old Berlusconi's centre-right People of Freedom party (PDL).

Berlusconi was sentenced last year to four years' jail with a five-year ban on holding public office, for complicity in tax fraud at his Mediaset television em-

pire, a decision that was upheld on appeal in May.

Although he may avoid jail due to his age if the sentence is confirmed, a ban on public office, depriving him of his seat in parliament, would deepen the problems bedevilling a government already divided over key elements of tax and economic policy.

Berlusconi, who often says leftist magistrates want to destroy him politically, is not a minister but plays a big behind-the-scenes role ensuring the stability of the coalition with his rivals in the centre-left Democratic Party (PD).

However Letta insisted that whatever the result of

the hearing, the government would continue.

"I am convinced there will not be any consequences for the survival of the government," he told a talk show on RAI state television.

A final appeal had been expected at the end of the year with reports in Italian newspapers speculating that the court could run into the statute of limitations at least on some of the charges, potentially curbing any sentence against Berlusconi.

However the decision to schedule the final appeal hearing before the normal summer break caught his legal team off guard and drew a furious reaction.

Republicans press White House to delay key Obamacare mandate

WASHINGTON, 10 July— Congressional Republicans pressed President Barack Obama on Tuesday to delay a requirement under his healthcare law that Americans obtain insurance next year after the administration gave employers a one-year reprieve from having to provide it to staff.

The US Treasury and White House announced last week that businesses would not be required to of-

fer health coverage, or pay a fine, in 2014 because the administration had yet to issue final regulations in time for employers to comply.

The move sparked a new wave of Republican efforts to discredit Obama's healthcare reform law and raised questions over whether the effort will be launched as planned.

In a letter on Tuesday signed by House of Representatives Speaker John

Boehner and 10 other leading House Republicans, they asked Obama for a detailed explanation of the delay of the "employer mandate," asking for a reply from the president by 1 August.

"Please ... provide to Congress your justification for only delaying the employer mandate at this time and not the new mandate on individuals and families," they wrote. "We agree with you that the burden was overwhelming for employers, but we also believe American families need the same relief."

But White House spokesman Jay Carney said the individual mandate would go forward because Obama's Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act provides financial assistance to help lower-income people pay for insurance while exempting those who cannot afford coverage.

"Next year, millions of Americans will get the help they need to purchase quality health insurance they

currently cannot afford," he said.

That financial assistance, coming in the form of refundable tax credits, will continue to be available to individuals in 2014, the Internal Revenue Service said on Tuesday in a three-page ruling, which confirmed the administration's reprieve.

Businesses, spared from penalties for not reporting employee healthcare information to the IRS next year, are encouraged to comply voluntarily, the agency said. The agency will publish details on how to report that information later this summer.

Carney also criticized Republicans for failing to produce their own alternative to "Obamacare", instead voting 37 times to repeal or defund the president's law. Most of those measures died in the Democratic-controlled Senate. Carney said the Republicans would have denied benefits to the elderly, the sick and others.

Egypt looks forward to new elections, back to week of bloodshed

CAIRO, 10 July— Egypt's interim authorities, boosted by \$8 billion in Gulf aid, start work on forming a cabinet on Wednesday, a week after the elected Islamist president was ousted by the army leading to a wave of violence in which at least 90 people were killed.

Wrangling between political groups over a decree setting the rules for the transition, designed to usher in parliamentary elections within about six months, could point to a bumpy road ahead.

Events of the last seven days are sure to overshadow the normally festive start to the fasting month of Ramadan, which begins on Wednesday, with Egypt's 84 million people more divided than at any time in their modern history.

Thousands of Islamists rallied outside a mosque in northeast Cairo overnight, where they have braved the heat and dust in a 12-day vigil, refusing to budge until toppled President Mohamed Mursi is returned to power. Just a few hundred metres away, outside the

military barracks where he is believed to be held, 55 Mursi supporters were killed at dawn on Monday when troops opened fire.

The movement says the victims were praying in peace. The government says the Islamists provoked the violence by attacking the soldiers.

The authorities announced an investigation into 650 suspects for offences from "thuggery" to murder and terrorism. Egyptian state media praised the army and denounced Monday's violence as the work of terrorists.

Amnesty International said that whether or not the security forces acted in response to provocations, they were guilty of using "grossly disproportionate force". Egyptians are still reeling a week after Mursi's overthrow, which initially sparked wild celebrations in Cairo and beyond by millions of people who wanted him gone, fed up with economic stagnation and what they saw as an Islamist power grab.

Egypt summons Tunisian Ambassador over

"interference in internal affairs"

TUNIS, 10 July— Egypt's Deputy Foreign Minister in charge of Arab affairs, Nasser Kamel, has summoned Tunisia's ambassador in Cairo, to express "surprise" at Tunisia's statements about the situation in Egypt, Shems FM reported late Tuesday night.

"These statements are

not in line with the privileged relations between Tunisia and Egypt," Kamel said, adding that his meeting with the Tunisian ambassador is in the framework of Egypt's refusal of any interference in its internal affairs.

On Sunday, the head of Tunisia's ruling Islamic party Ennahdha, Rached

Ghannouchi, condemned the ouster of Egypt's Islamist Mohamed Morsi, calling on Egypt's Muslim Brotherhood to "resist the decision."

In a statement issued last week, Ennahdha also condemned the ouster of Egypt's "first democratically elected president."

Embark on fact-finding mission

Myanmar has nearly 60 million population. According to 2012 figures, it has more than 0.5 million Internet subscribers which constitutes merely 1% of the entire population and most of them access World Wide Web via mobile devices.

Virtually all Internet users in Myanmar have a Gmail account and a Facebook account. It is said in Myanmar that a person without a Facebook identity is like a person without a home address. So, it could be assumed that Myanmar has more than 500,000 active Facebook users. But it would be wrong to assume that every Facebook user honestly own one account or identity on the world's largest social networking site. It would not come as a surprise if the number of active Facebook subscribers in Myanmar is larger than the number of Internet users in Myanmar.

Myanmar's Facebook users is a tiny pool compared with 1.11 billion Facebook subscribers worldwide. But it is more than a social networking site in the country and is often politicized. It also has a considerable influence on social behaviours and opinions of the users and their communities.

An ancient Myanmar saying goes, "Each single word is equal to a pagoda." The sheer respect for texts force the ordinary people of Myanmar to often blindly accept anything what is worded. There is no such mission of finding fact and fiction in Myanmar. When it meets floods of information that have broken open the long-locked gate, there arise rumours, spread hate speeches, and follow other adverse impacts of social media.

The netizens of the country should embark on the fact-finding mission from every piece shared on the social networking sites to prevent rumours and hate speeches from overwhelming the public opinions.

Media development and Printing and Publishing Bill**Banya Aung**

One of the characteristics of democracy is the development of media. In our country, just press freedom usually refers to a characteristic of democracy. Such ideology is now outdated due to development of information technology, new types of media and media market. It is found that development of media along with press freedom and reviewing the remaining factors is considered a characteristic of democracy in international community in the 21st century.

A country which is carrying out democratic reforms must draw a media policy which can ensure media development and above indicators. To be able to adopt the plan, we should use four approaches and the first approach is Media Institution.

As part of efforts for media reforms in conformity with democratic system, it is necessary to establish institutions which are suitable for future media environment and to draw laws related to the media institutions. For the development of printing and publishing enterprises, Printing and Publishing bill, one of the media institutions, has been put forward to the parliament.

At this juncture, it was found that some questions arouse as to if the Printing and Publishing Law is not necessary. In Myanmar, out of current 1399 registered publishers, only 633 are registered for publishing newspapers, journals and magazines. There are 8433 printing press registrations, and out of them, only hundreds are running for printing of journals, newspapers and periodicals while the remaining printing press are used for printing pamphlets, posters, novels etc. Therefore, while journalists are working professionally following the codes and ethics of journalism, the publishers should run their business in accordance with the basic principles for printing. Besides, it is necessary to revoke the 1962 Printing and Publishing Registration law which is not in conformity with the democratic norms and to enact a new law which is adaptable to the democratic reforms. Hence,

the Printing and Publishing bill has been brought before the parliament.

Drafting the bill has followed the principles of the international convention not to cause restricting the development of printing and publishing and to ensure development of the printing and publishing on the right way. Besides, the bill is also aimed at bringing about co-existence among Myanmar's societies, its specific characteristics and creating a socially responsible media which is in conformity with the country's cultural standard and values.

Therefore, the Article 7 of the bill which has been approved by Pyithu Hluttaw and has been put forward to Amyotha Hluttaw says:

As part of efforts for building a democratic society which is free, equitable and where the rule of law is established and for emergence of qualified print media which follow code of ethics, a printer or a publisher shall not print or publish the periodicals in which one of the following facts is involved.

- (a) **Expression that cause inflicting harm between national races or among national races and religions**
- (b) **Expression that instigates deterioration in the rule of law and violence**
- (c) **dirty expression**
- (d) **Expression that encourages and instigates crimes, atrocities, rioting, gambling and using narcotic drugs and psychotropic drugs**

The above principles can be seen as ethics even and even an ordinary citizen should follow them, and there is no difficulties for a printer or a publisher to follow them. Besides, the principles do not restrict the expression of expression, the right given by the law.

To decide the Printing and Publishing bill during the seventh regular session of Pyithu Hluttaw, the bill committee of Pyithu Hluttaw held meetings on 1 and 2 July to discuss the Printing and Publishing bill which has been submitted to Pyithu Hluttaw since its six regular session held.

The bill committee meeting was participated by representatives of the Ministry of Information, representatives of the Sports, Culture and Public Relations Development Committee, representatives of Pyithu Hluttaw Legal Affairs and Special Cases Assessment Commission and MPs who registered at the Hluttaw to discuss the bill. During the meeting, the committee discussed not only the bill but also suggestions of the Press Council (Temporary) made through the Ministry of Information and reviewed the discussion of the representatives of the Sports, Culture and Public Relations Development Committee and advices of the MPs who registered to discuss the bill at Pyithu Hluttaw.

The amended Printing and Publishing Enterprise Laws was approved at Pyithu Hluttaw Session on 4 July after the Bill Committee, Sports, Culture and Public Relations Development Committee and those MPs held discussion on the bill.

It is seen that the Press Council (Temporary) severely remonstrated about the bill after Pyithu Hluttaw has approved it. As a matter of fact, Pyithu Hluttaw not only took Press Council's suggestions into account but also omitted Information Ministry's suggestions. A new section is added to the bill, assuming that Hluttaw should do it. It can be said that it is Hluttaw's principle, not Ministry's or the Council's. I assumed that those who have held views of objecting all they don't agree on should be aware of the legislative nature in democratization process.

Ambassador U Tint Swe (1906-1953) wrote a book on democracy spirit in 1946. In his book, he explained **the spirit of democracy is broad-minded one. The MPs should have broad-minded views when their motions have failed at the parliament and lost the elections.**

It can be seen that in democratic countries including US and UK, there are serious discussions between the parties, a variety of interest groups and inside

and outside of the parliaments before the bills are approved.

It can be seen that all have to follow the majority's wishes after the bill has been approved at the parliaments. Those dissidents and organizations continue to make efforts for making amendments to the bill in a democratic way at proper time. Those dissidents are never angry about it even though they lose it. This is the democracy spirits and practices.

In fact, nobody would enjoy cent-per-cent wishes in legislation of the democracy system. There will be gives and takes between the majority party and the minority party, considering that the majority should pay attention to the wishes of the minority. British Prime Minister Gladstone (1809-1898) said that **British legislative system can not fully make people fulfill their dreams and wishes. They could get the practical things they can do. In this regard, we would do the best for the British.**

It can be seen that there are much differences between the bill which was approved by Pyithu Hluttaw and the 1962 Law. The core point is that Section 20 of the 1962 Law says that under the law, those who fail to follow an authority's order would face one to seven years sentences. This caused the emergence of manuscripts scrutinizing policy. And under this policy, the press media were supervised. That is to say, the 1962 law had given more power to the director of Press Scrutiny and Registration Division.

This bill has no such authority and power. And the sufferers can lodge an appeal. For instance, only the minister can revoke printing and publishing enterprise licenses and certificates. Those sufferers would have rights to lodge their appeal to the President. Similarly, it is impossible to designate the rules and regulations to be followed by printers and publishers in the forms of notifications. It needs to obey four international standards prescribed in the section 7. The minister or those who are vested by the minister only can make necessary

Myanmar fishermen return home

YANGON, 10 July—A total of 123 Myanmar fishermen who were charged with intruding into India's water territory returned from Port Blair of India this afternoon.

A delegation led by Deputy Director-General U Aung Khaing of the Ministry of Social Welfare, Relief and Resettlement and Myanmar Airways International (MAI) chairman U Khin Maung Latt left Yangon International Airport by MAI charter flight for Port Blair of India to scrutinize and bring back those fishermen there. Officials from Myanmar embassy accepted the handing over of 123 fishermen from Indian government.

Ministry of Social Welfare, Relief and

Resettlement made cooperation with the Ministries of Foreign Affairs, Immigration and Population, Transport, Livestock and Fisheries, Information, Health, Region/State governments and Myanmar Fisheries Federation on returning of those fishermen. Officials from the Ministry of Social Welfare, Relief and Resettlement, Yangon Region Government, Livestock and Fisheries, Myanmar Fisheries Federation, Yangon, Ayeyawady and Taninthayi Region and Mon and Rakhine States welcomed and encouraged the fishermen at the Airport.

Under the arrangements of the respective region/state governments, the fishermen left for their respective

regions by car. It is learnt that 107 fishermen are from Ayeyawady Region, five from Rakhine State, nine from Taninthayi Region, one from Mon State and one from Yangon Region, totaling 123.

U Aung Ko Win sponsored MAI charter flight fare for the fishermen. Myanmar Fisheries Federation donated K 3 million for those from Ayeyawady and Taninthayi Regions and Rakhine State for their return expenses. For those from Yangon Region and Mon State, respective governments donated cash for their return.

Since 2000, 4398 Myanmar fishermen have been brought back to their families.

(from page 8) investigation and announce it as illegal one when someone files a complaint about the violation of these four standards. But, publishers have the rights to apply their publications to Region or State Court so as to decide whether their publications are legal or not. Under the Section 97 of the Constitution, Pyidaungsu Hluttaw has to monitor appendixes of regulations, notification, rules, regulations, bylaws, directives and procedures whether or not they are in accord with the Constitution and respective laws. Then, Pyidaungsu Hluttaw is to amend and revoke them if necessary. The 1962 Law is totally different from the new one.

In addition, Pyithu Hluttaw Bill Committee has added a new crucial section to it. The Section 27 says that **action taken in accord with this law shall not hamper citizens' freedom of expressions and freedom of press.** It is obvious that Pyithu Hluttaw paid more emphasis on development of printing and publishing in a systematic

way without putting limits on it.

Here, I noticed that there are accusations that the Ministry has submitted the Printing and Publishing Bill by taking advantages of the media bill being drafted by the Press Council (Temporary) as a zero draft. In reality, the Ministry wanted to submit press law or media law which are considered as professional laws ahead of institutional law: business laws.

That's why, Union Minister U Aung Kyi, shortly after formation of Press Council (Temporary) on 17 September 2012, told the Press Council (Temporary) to formulate Zero Draft, and draw First Draft after seminars and workshops, jointly conducted by the ministry and local and foreign media, and Second Draft after holding discussions with the participation of experts from media world including parliamentarians and submit it to the parliament in accord with rules and regulations. The Union minister elaborated on the process while he was interviewed by BBC, and his clarification of the process

was carried by state-owned dailies issued on 25-10-2012. It can be witnessed that the Union minister explained the process again and again while giving interviews to local media—the News Watch, Luhtu Ponyeik and Mizzima journals.

But, the printing and publishing bill and public service media bill were submitted to the parliament first as the Press Council officially sent the Zero Draft on 31 May, 2013. After holding discussions with international organizations including UNESCO, the ministry sent back the zero draft with its amendments and suggestions to the Press Council on 7 June, 2013. The council accepted some suggestions of the ministry and sent the Second Draft to the ministry on 26 June, 2013. The ministry accepted 51 out of 68 points shown in the second draft of the council and sent back it to the council, giving reasons for each point on 3 July as 17 points are not agreed with the international standards and they are not required to be embodied in the law.

Although the Press Council released its Second Draft to media, it is found that it did not make the

media known the 17 points unaccepted by the ministry as they don't meet international standards. If the council had informed the media of the letter from the ministry and the reason why it cannot accept the 17 highlighted points of the ministry in a transparent way, the media and the public would have made a Public Debate on the remarks of the two sides to know which points are agreed with international standards.

With the aim of creating a Socially Responsible Media environment, the Ministry of Information is striving for emergence of media laws meeting international standards. Media laws are not only to protect the freedom of expression but also to be added necessary limitations into it in accord with the provision of **Article 29 (b) of The Universal Declaration of Human Rights that says "In the exercise of his**

rights and freedoms, every one shall be subject only to such limitations as are determined by law solely for the purpose of securing due recognition and respect for the rights and freedoms of others and of meeting the just requirements of morality, public order and the general welfare in a democratic society".

According to today's state-of-the-art technology, it is impossible to cover all things under the media law alone. It can be witnessed that even democracies promulgated different laws like press law, broadcasting media law, public service media law, electronic law, cyber law, film law, etc based on the situations of the countries. So, formulation of more media laws is a must for our country. Collaborative efforts will be needed to enact the laws in support of media development. The process cannot be accomplished by

the government alone. It calls for participation of media persons and the entire people.

It is sure that there will arise different views according to with the nature of democracy. But such differences cannot hamper media reform in Myanmar. What kind of mindset will we need to establish to deal with it? In his book entitled "Democratic Mindset" written by Ambassador U Tint Swe, he suggests **"You can break the dishes you own if you want to do like this while argue with your spouse. Do not attempt to do like this when you getting into an argument with others over matters of the association, the community and the nation. Take the interest of the majority into consideration. Pay your respects to your own country"**.

Opposition parties lack strategies to stop another LDP election victory

TOKYO, 10 July —With the ruling Liberal Democratic Party poised for another victory following big wins in the lower house election last December and the Tokyo metropolitan assembly election in June, opposition parties are finding it difficult to map out strategies to stop the LDP.

The upcoming House of Councillors election will be the only national election in the next three years, unless the House of Representatives is dissolved during its current four-year term through December 2016. With many parties, including small ones, contesting the upper house election, votes are likely to be split among the opposition parties, making it difficult for them to expand their influence. The main opposition Democratic Party of Japan is facing an uphill battle. Party leader Banri Kaieda has repeatedly used the phrase “great peril” in describing the situation.

Although the DPJ swept to power for the first time in the 2009 lower house election, ending more than 50 years of almost uninterrupted rule by the LDP, it has failed to rebuild since being ousted from power last December.

The DPJ's three years in government were marked by public dissatisfaction with its handling of key issues, including the relocation of a key US Marine base in Okinawa and the nuclear crisis triggered by the massive March 2011 earthquake and tsunami. In February,

5.6-magnitude quake hits Kepulauan Mentawai region, Indonesia

HONG KONG, 10 July—An earthquake measuring 5.6 on the Richter scale jolted Kepulauan Mentawai region, Indonesia at 1704 GMT on Tue (0104 Beijing Time), the US Geological Survey said.

The epicenter, with a depth of 10.30 km, was initially determined to be at 3.3165 degrees south latitude and 100.4740 degrees east longitude.

the party cited poor governance and its failure to keep its 2009 campaign pledges as the causes of its defeat in the lower house election, pointing to a lack of unity within the party.

“What the DPJ has to learn is party discipline,” said Steven R Reed, professor of political science at Chuo University. “Everybody has to be on message.” After the upper house election, “people against the LDP will look for the best place to vote, it may well still be the DPJ,” said Reed. “The election campaign has just started. We will fight to secure as many seats as possible,” Kaieda told re-

porters early in the election campaign. But his resignation would appear to be inevitable if the DPJ suffers another defeat in the 21 July election.

The Japan Restoration Party, which created a flurry of attention when it was launched in Osaka last September, has lost momentum and is facing a public backlash following controversial remarks by co-head Toru Hashimoto about Japan's wartime military brothels, which he described as “necessary” for maintaining army discipline. The party won 54 of the 480 seats in December's general election, significantly boosting

its pre-election total of 11, but in sharp contrast only two of its 34 candidates won seats in the Tokyo metropolitan assembly election in the wake of Hashimoto's remarks.

“I knew the popularity of the Japan Restoration Party was just like a bubble. In the process of trying to spread nationwide, the vulnerability of the party was exposed,” said Masahiro Iwasaki, professor of political science at Nihon University. Members of the party had banded together just to survive elections, without sharing the same vision or political positions, he added.

Wall collapse kills 12, injures 7 in N China

TAIYUAN, 10 July—Twelve construction workers were killed and seven others injured after their make-shift house was buried by a collapsed wall in north China's Shanxi Province, local authorities said on Wednesday.

The accident occurred

around 7:30 pm on Tuesday at a construction site of a coal cleaning plant of Dacheng Liyuan Coalification Co, Ltd in Pingshu Village, Shouyang County, according to sources with the government of Jinzhong City, which administers the county.

An initial investigation indicated that the wall was toppled as a result of rainstorms, sources said.

Rescue work has ended by Wednesday morning. A further investigation into the cause of the accident is under way.

Vietnamese, Lao PMs hail completion of border marker project

HANOI, 10 July—Prime Ministers of Vietnam and Laos on Tuesday hailed the completion of the border marker project, saying it is of great significance in traditional friendship between the two countries. The appreciation was made at the grand ceremony to celebrate the completion of border marker planting held at border gate separating the Vietnamese town of Thanh Thuy in central Nghe An Province and the Lao town of Nam On in Bolykhamstay Province.

This is the joint achievement of the two countries in building a peace, stable and cooperative borderline, contributing to facilitating economic and trade exchange, said Vietnamese Prime Minister Nguyen Tan Dung.

Lao Prime Minister Thoongsing Thammavong, for his part, said that the border marker planting project plays an important role in building mutual trust and understanding, creating favourable conditions for travel, tourism, trade and investment from the central to localities, boosting poverty reduction in border areas. The two PMs proposed to continue working closely to-

gether to finalize legal documents to fully complete the project in 2014.

Vietnam and Laos have 2,067 km common borderline shared by 20 provinces, ten on each side. In 1977, the two countries signed a border demarcation treaty for the 1978-1987 period under which they were committed to finalizing the planting of 214 land border markers in 119 places. The result was recognized in the protocol on border demarcation and border marker planting signed by the two neighbours in October 1987.

In 2003, both sides completed a project to draw a 1:50,000 scale map of the Vietnam-Laos borderline. In January 2008, governments of Vietnam and Laos agreed to implement the joint project on upgrading and embellishing border markers.

According to head of the Lao Border Committee Bun Kot Sang Som Sak, after five years of working, the two sides finished positioning of 835 border markers in 793 locations and 20 benchmark pillars in a borderline of 2,067 km, sharing by 20 provinces, ten in each side.

In the 5:00 pm weather forecast, the Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and

Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA) said that the typhoon was located at 1,570 kilometers east of Basco in northern province of Batanes with maximum sustained winds of 130 kilometers per hour near the center and gustiness of up to 160 kph. It was forecast to move west at 20 kph.

Severe floods affect 16,900 in SW China quake-hit region

CHENGDU, 10 July — Rainstorm-triggered floods have affected about 16,900 people in Ya'an City, southwest China's Sichuan Province, which was shaken by a 7.0-magnitude earthquake in April, local authorities said on Tuesday.

Heavy rain started to batter Ya'an early Monday morning, causing river water levels to rise in excess of

warning levels and flood in three of the worst-hit townships in the city's Yucheng District, according to the district government.

At least 16,900 people in 4,920 households in the district have been affected, and direct economic losses are estimated at 768 million yuan (about 125.18 US dollars).

Eight killed in suicide attack in NW Pakistan

ISLAMABAD, 10 July — At least eight people were killed and nine others injured when a suicide bomb blast rocked Pakistan's north-western District of Hangu on Monday. According to local Urdu TV Channel Dunya, the attack took place at about 4:15 pm local time when a suicide bomber targeted a vehicle carrying the brother and companions of pro-government tribal elder Malik Habib in Torawari area of Doaba town in Hangu District. Eyewitnesses said that the suicide bomber rammed his explosive-laden motorcycle into the vehicle near a taxi stand. The blast de-

stroyed the vehicle, killing six people and injuring at least 11 others on the spot. Two of the injured who were admitted to the district hospital in Hangu succumbed to their injuries, bringing the death toll to eight.

The loud explosion also incurred damages to nearby shops and cars, local media reported. Pakistani President Asif Ali Zardari condemned the attack and directed the authorities to provide best available treatment to the injured people. Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif slammed the bomb blast and expressed sorrow over the loss of lives.

Bollywood's Barfi wins at Indian film awards in Macau

MACAU, 10 July—The film Barfi scooped top honours in India's version of the Oscars at a ceremony in the Chinese gambling haven of Macau on Saturday that also celebrated a century of Bollywood, which makes up a big chunk of a multi-billion-dollar film industry.

Barfi is a romantic comedy about a mute and deaf man and his relationship with two women. The movie was praised by critics for its positive portrayal of physically disabled people, a somewhat unusual theme for Bollywood screenplays.

India, the world's biggest film producer, makes more than double the number of Hollywood movies on an annual basis. Already popular in countries with sizable Indian populations, Indian films are also

a growing hit with Chinese audiences as well as in Russia and Germany.

Hosted by Bollywood heartthrobs Shah Rukh Khan and Shahid Kapoor, the four-hour ceremony of pulsating dance routines and colourful costume changes was attended by an audience of over seven thousand screaming fans.

Some of Indian cinema's biggest names including Deepika Padukone set the Macau arena alight with high octane performances, while older generation actors like Boman Irani and modern pin ups such as Vidya Balan graced the green carpet.

Known for catchy songs, whimsical backdrops and raven-tressed actresses, Bollywood films typically transport viewers away from reality to a

world where good triumphs over evil and love reunites everyone, themes that resonate well in China.

"We make musicals. I think every film is a musical. Every film has at least six to seven songs," said Ayushmann Khurrana, nominated for best actor after his debut in "Vicky Donor", a romantic comedy about sperm donation. "So that is how Bollywood is completely different from Hollywood."

Best actress was won by Vidya Balan for Kahani while Ranbir Kapoor for Barfi took home the award for best actor. Barfi also won the award for best film.

India's film entertainment sector is booming and estimated to generate revenue of close to \$5 billion by 2015.

"If you can control the celebrity side of celebrity, then it (being super famous) is worth it. I look at Brad — and I have for years — and when I'm with him I see the intensity of that other side of it," *Esquire* magazine quoted the 42-year-old as saying, reports femalefirst.co.uk.

"And the paparazzi and the insane level of aggression they have and their willingness to break the law and invade his space — well, I wonder about that trade," he added. Damon feels bad for his celebrity friend as he

is not able to even walk his children to school.

"I remember telling him that I walk my kids to school, and his face just fell. He was very kind, but he was like, 'You b**tard'. Because he should be able to do that, too. And he can't," said Damon. Damon said that he is able to maintain a low-key life outside work as he is married to a non-celebrity, a former bartender Luciana Barroso. "I got lucky, I fell in love with a civilian. list which features no defenders or goalkeepers.

Barcelona's Messi, the 2011 award winner, and Real Madrid top-scorer Ronaldo are also joined by Robin van Persie (Manchester United), Zlatan Ibrahimovic (Paris Saint-Germain) and Gareth Bale (Tottenham).

The award is presented on 29 August at the Champions League group-stage draw in Monaco.

Dissatisfied Shinji Kagawa vows to improve next season

MANCHESTER, 10 July—Japan playmaker Shinji Kagawa has vowed to improve in his second season at Manchester United after a stop-start first campaign in England.

Kagawa joined from Borussia Dortmund a year ago and finished the season with a Premier League winners' medal but a knee injury mid-campaign meant he was only intermittently a regular starter.

"It was great to win the title with United," Kagawa told Inside United.

"But I feel I still have work to do."

"I would say I am half

satisfied, half unsatisfied."

The 24-year-old has won three league titles in a row having claimed back-to-back Bundesliga crowns with Dortmund before moving to Old Trafford.

He played a pivotal role in the Dortmund attack but has not enjoyed the same impact at United, although he still expects to prove his worth.

"You have to believe in yourself," he said.

"If you don't, things can go wrong both on and off the pitch."

"Being positive and believing in yourself is important, not only in football

but also in improving as a person."

Sometimes last season he was picked above Wayne Rooney, who allegedly has become disgruntled at the loss of his guaranteed first-team berth at United.

Alex Ferguson claimed before retiring at the end of last season that Rooney had asked for a move away from Old Trafford but Kagawa is hopeful the England international will remain and rekindle a successful partnership with Robin van Persie that wreaked havoc in opposition defences at the start of last season.

Lebanese manager kidnapped in south Nigeria

ONITSHA, 10 July—Gunmen have kidnapped a Lebanese manager from a construction company in southern Nigeria after an attack in which three soldiers were wounded, the military and a security source said.

The man was seized from the premises of the Nigerian-owned but Lebanese-run construction firm Setraco in Benin city on Monday, military spokesman Captain Roseline Managbe said. She had earlier suggested the attack had taken place on Tuesday.

The company was not immediately available for comment.

The security source said two of the three soldiers shot in the kidnapping later died of their wounds, although Managbe denied this. The military rarely admits significant casualties on its own side.—Xinhua

Three Somalis convicted of piracy, murder in yacht attack off Oman

NORFOLK, 10 July—Three Somalis were convicted on Monday of piracy, kidnapping and murder in the 2011 shooting deaths of four Americans sailing in the Indian Ocean off of Oman and could face the death penalty, according to court documents.

The three men — and eleven others who previously pleaded guilty — boarded the Americans' yacht armed with assault rifles and planned to sail it to Somalia

and hold the Americans for ransom. Instead, the hostages were killed by the pirates as they were being trailed by US military forces.

A federal jury, which has been hearing the case since early June in US District Court in Norfolk, found Ahmed Muse Salad, Abukar Osman Beyle and Shani Nurani Shiekh Abrar guilty on all 26 counts against them, according to court records.

The jury will be hear-

ing more evidence during the sentencing phase of the trial later this month.

Scott and Jean Adam, retirees from Marina del Rey, California, and their friends Phyllis Macay and Robert Riggle, both of Seattle, were killed aboard the California couple's 58-foot sloop, Quest. Prosecutors have said all four passengers were asleep when the boat was boarded on 18 Feb, 2011, by the armed assailants.—Reuters

Belarus, Bangladesh to boost trade in coming years

MINSK, 10 July—Belarus and Bangladesh will boost bilateral trade in the coming years, Belarusian Prime Minister Mikhail Myasnikovich said on Tuesday.

"There are real opportunities to increase our bilateral trade many times in the next few years," Myasnikovich said at the Belarusian-

Bangladesh Business Forum in Minsk.

According to the official, the economies of Belarus and Bangladesh do not compete with each other but complement each other and create many opportunities for mutually beneficial projects.

Bangladesh is a prom-

ising market for Belarus' potash fertilizers, chemical fibers, machinery and educational services, he added.

The two countries are expected to sign nine cooperation agreements during the forum, covering the financial sector, nuclear energy, education and culture.

NAY PYI TAW, 10 July—At today's Pyithu Hluttaw session, MP Daw Dwe Bu of Ingyanyan Constituency raised the question on remedies for the losses due to the fake

contracts.

Regarding this question, Supreme Court of the Union Judge U Mya Thein replied that authority concerned should disseminate knowledge

on laws and issue the notifications which prohibit making fake contracts.

With regard to the question of Dr Nay Linn of Seikkan Constituency on criteria for allowing

of clinics and medicines advertisements, Deputy Minister for Information U Pike Htwe replied that putting traditional medicine advertisements on Myanmar Radio and Television (MRTV) is allowed only with official documents from the Ministry of Health. Western medicines, clinic, hospitals and medical equipment advertisements are allowed with Companies' registration certificates, Import & Export Licenses, Drug Registration Certificates of FDA (Myanmar Food and Drug Board of Authority).

In the past, Press Scrutiny and Registration Division under the Ministry of Information allowed inserting of advertisements in journals

and magazines in accord with the designated rules and regulations. Copyrights and Registration Division (former Press Scrutiny and Registration Division) has no longer scrutinized the advertisements in journals and magazines after easing its rules. The Ministry made coordination with Myanmar Press Council (Temporary) and the Ministry of Home Affairs to supervise and control alcohols and beers adverts and the excise licensed companies. The daily newspapers under News and Periodicals Enterprises (NPE) allow clinics, hospitals and traditional drugs adverts along with related documents and certificates.

Yangon Region

Private Health Care Supervisory Committee of the Ministry of Health is making coordination with Yangon Region government to take legal actions against adverts with no medial ethics and unlicensed private clinics/hospitals, he added.

"My question is not aimed at damaging other's interests. It is seen that few adverts of such kinds are seen in State-owned newspapers, but many still seen in journals and magazines," MP Dr Nay Linn said.

Hluttaw approved Myanmar Special Economic Zone Law which was discussed on 25 June.
