Tianjin becomes latest Chinese city to restrict car ownership

Shanghai, 16 Dec— China's northern city of Tianjin will restrict issuance of new car licences, the latest city to clamp down on car ownership in a bid to ease traffic congestion and combat air pollu-

The city government

will issue new plates via auction and lottery from Monday, it said in a notice posted on its website on Sunday.

It will also introduce a quota system similar to Beijing's traffic restriction scheme, which allows cars access to the city on certain

days depending on the last digit of their plates, the official Xinhua news agency quoted Miao Hongwei, head of the city's traffic management bureau, as saying.

The capital Beijing, infamous for its choking smog, announced last

month it will slash the city's new car sales quota by almost 40 percent next

Other major cities such as Shanghai and Guangzhou have also implemented measures to restrict car ownership.

Frequent attacks cause heavy casualties in Libya

Tripoli, 16 Dec—A Libyan army colonel was killed and three soldiers were injured on Sunday in two separate attacks in the eastern city of Benghazi, security and medical sources told Xinhua.

A medical source told Xinhua on condition of anonymity that Saad Masood Ostal Jamal, an army colonel working in the artillery unit, was shot by unknown assailants in Humaida near Meshaal al- Huaida in Benghazi as he was taking his son to

Spokesperson of Jalaa Hospital in Benghazi confirmed that Jamal was hit by seven bullets, including five in his head.

Also in a separate attack on Sunday afternoon, three soldiers belonging to Libyan Special Forces' 319 Brigade and Thunderbolt were injured after an improvised explosive device targeted them while they were participating in a campaign to clean up Benghazi streets after garbage collectors went on strike over salary complaints. A security officer said that the three soldiers were injured by fragments after the explosive device was thrown at them by unknown assailants in the Laithi area. The eyewitness added that a man driving a Mitsubishi car stopped in front of a garbage collection point and threw a bag on top of the stack, leaving the bag to explode shortly after his departure. Al-Barghati said the victims Mohamed Salem Warfali, Abdullah Faraj Alakora and Ali Ambar Awami were injured by shrapnel from the explosive device. She added that three soldiers are currently recovering in Jalaa Hospital's intensive care unit.—Xinhua

Death toll in Syrian bombing raid on Aleppo rises to 76

BEIRUT, 16 Dec-Sev- of causing widespread casuenty-six people, including 28 children, were killed on Sunday when Syrian army helicopters dropped "barrel bombs" on the northern city of Aleppo, the Syrian Observatory for Human Rights said on Monday.

Barrel bombs are explosive-filled cylinders or oil barrels, often rolled out of the back of helicopters with little attempt at striking a particular target but capable alties and significant dam-

The Britain-based Observatory said that rebel groups in Aleppo issued a statement asking civilians in government-held parts of the city to move away from state security buildings, which they said would be targeted in retaliation for the bomb-

rebels in a 2-1/2 year conflict that has killed more than 100,000 people, frequently deploy air power and artillery against rebel-held districts across the country.

They have been unable to recapture eastern and central parts of Aleppo, which rebels stormed in the summer of 2012, but they have driven rebel fighters back from towns to the southeast of the city in recent weeks. The conflict has grown sectarian, with majority Sunni rebels battling Assad's own Alawite sect and Shi'ite militia. The Observatory which has a network of opposition, pro-government and medical sources - also said on Monday that rebels in northern Aleppo province were threatening to strike two Shi'ite villages they have surrounded with missiles if barrel bombs were used again by the army.

Iran committed to continuing nuclear talks: foreign minister

Dubai, 16 Dec — Iran will continue nuclear negotiations with world powers despite "unsuitable actions" which led to it halting technical talks in Vienna, Foreign Minister Mohammad Javad Zarif said on Sunday.

The United States on Thursday blacklisted additional companies and people under existing sanctions intended to prevent Iran from obtaining the capability to make nuclear weapons. Iran says its nuclear programme is for electricity generation and medical purposes only.

Iran's negotiators on Friday interrupted talks in Vienna on how to implement a nuclear agreement because, its officials said, the US decision was against the spirit of the deal.

"In the last few days

unsuitable actions have been taken on the part of Americans which we have responded to in an appropriate manner," Zarif said in a posting on his Face-

"We will continue with negotiations in Geneva with seriousness and we will certainly show a

correct, measured and targeted response to any unsuitable action," he said.

The development has highlighted potential obstacles negotiators face in pressing ahead with efforts to resolve a decade-old dispute between the Islamic Republic and the West.

Thai opposition debates whether to run in **February election**

BANGKOK, 16 Dec — Thailand's main opposition party opened a meeting on Monday to decide whether to take part in a snap election called by the government to defuse street protests but one senior member said reforms demanded by the protesters should be implemented first.

Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra called the election after weeks of protests against her and her brother, ousted ex-prime minister Thaksin Shinawatra, and his influence on Thailand's political sys-

The protesters, backed by Bangkok's elite, have rejected the election and want to set up a "people's council" that would eradicate the

influence of the "Thaksin regime" and introduce reforms following a decade of election wins by Thaksin or his allies with support from the urban and rural poor. The protests have also been supported by the main opposition Democrat Party, Thailand's oldest party. All Democrat lawmakers resigned from parliament this month and some joined the protests, including leader Abhisit Vejjajiva, who was prime minister from late 2008 until 2011.

But the party has yet to announce its stand on the 2 February election. A boycott by the Democrats would rob the vote of much of its legitimacy and prolong political uncertainty.

US seeks Okinawa's unconditional OK for base replacement landfill

Washington has told Tokyo government for the landfill that the Okinawa prefectural work needed to relocate the government should unconditionally allow work to begin on reclaiming land needed to relocate a US military base within the prefecture as planned, Japan-US relations sources said on Sunday.

The move appears aimed at putting more pressure on Okinawa Gov Hirokazu Nakaima, who will decide within this month whether to approve the

Washington, 16 Dec — application from the central Marines' Futenma Air Station from the densely populated Ginowan to the less populated coastal Henoko area in Nago. A senior US official conveyed the view on the long-stalled issue as Washington is worried the stalemate might persist if Nakaima attaches conditions in approving the work, the sources said.

Google removes privacy feature from Android mobile software

block apps from collecting personal information such as addressbookdataandauser's



San Francisco, 16 Dec — Google Inc has removed an experimental privacy feature from its Android mobile software that had allowed users to the world's most popular

location.

The change means that owners of smartphones using Android 4.4.2, the latest version of operating system for mobile devices released this week, must provide access to their personal data in order to use certain apps.

A company spokesman said the feature had been included by accident in Android 4.3, the version released last summer.

'We are suspicious of this explanation, and do not think that it in any way justifies removing the feature rather than improving it," said Peter Eckersley, technology projects director at the Electronic Frontier Foundation. The digital rights website first publicized the change in a blog post on Friday.

Android users who

wish to retain the privacy controls by not upgrading to Android 4.4.2 could be vulnerable to security risks, Eckersley said. "For the time being, users will need to chose between either privacy or security on the Android devices, but not

Many third-party apps for Android devices, such as music-identifying service Shazam and popular smartphone flashlight apps, require access to personal information that does not always have an obvious connection to the app's functionality, such as phone call information and location data.

Iran says it sends second monkey into space, brings it back safely

Dubai, 16 Dec — Iran said on Saturday it had sent a second live monkey into space and brought it back safely, the latest demonstration of the country's missile capabilities, state news agency IRNA reported.

"President Rouhani ... congratulated Iranian scientists and experts on successfully sending a second living creature into space," the news agency said.

Iran said it launched its first monkey to space in January. Rouhani used Twitter to mark the latest event, a demonstration of rocket power that is likely to cause concern in the West and among some Gulf states, which are worried about Iran's nuclear ambitions.

He said the monkey was named Fargam and had been returned to earth "safe

and sound".

"In total, this is the second monkey sent into space and returned in perfect health to Iran," Rouhani said in another Twitter mes-

In November, the world's six powers made a breakthrough deal for Teheran to curb its nuclear pro-

gramme in return for limited sanctions easing. The agreement appeared to face its first major difficulty on Friday with Russia warning that expanding a US sanctions blacklist could seriously complicate the deal's implementation.

The Islamic Republic denies seeking weapons capability and says it seeks only electricity from its uranium enrichment so it can export more of its considerable oil wealth.

The West worries that long-range ballistic technology used to propel Iranian satellites into orbit could be put to use dispatching nuclear warheads to a target.

Iran's Gulf Arab neighbors view Iran missile capabilities as a threat. Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates have spent heavily in the past few years on advanced US-made missile defence systems.

Iran's efforts to develop and test ballistic missiles and build a space launch capability have contributed to Israeli calls for pre-emptive strikes on Iranian nuclear sites and billions of dollars of US ballistic missile

BlackBerry Ltd, which recently concluded a \$1 billion convertible debt offering, said it has agreed with its debtholders to extend an option deadline attached to the deal, giving potential investors a chance to buy up to a further \$250 million in convertible debt.

The struggling smartphone maker last month shelved plans to sell itself and instead opted to raise funds via a \$1 billion notes offering led by Fairfax Financial Holdings, its largest shareholder.

In a brief statement late on Thursday, Black-Berry said the earlier announced investor option to purchase up to an additional \$250 million of convertible debentures, as part of the offering, has now been extended to 13 January.

BlackBerry, which reports quarterly results next on Friday, has been in quiet period since the closing of the initial offering.

The company said the defence spending.—Reuters extension will enable it to

provide updated financial information to prospective investors after its thirdquarter 2013 results have been released on 20 December.

If the option is exercised, the purchase of the additional convertible debentures will be completed on or before 16 January, the company said.

Investors that bought into the initial debt offering include Canso Investment Counsel, Mackenzie Financial, Markel Corp, Qatar Holding, Manulife Financial and Brookfield Asset Management.

BlackBerry shares on the Nasdaq are hovering around 10-year lows, on concerns of further erosion of the company's sales. Investors fear the company's three-month-long review of strategic options may have led to subscriber losses in the quarter ended 30 November.

Shares of BlackBerry were up 10 cents at C\$6.00 in early trading on the Nasdaq on Friday.

Amazon pressed on gun accessory sales, a year after Newtown

Boston, 16 Dec — Activist investors have asked Amazon.com Inc to review its sales of firearms accessories, concerned that the online retailer offers products that could

be used to convert semi-automatic rifles into weapons that fire too rapidly to be legal.

The shareholder scrutiny of the world's largest online retailer comes a day before the anniversary of the school massacre in Newtown, Connecticut, where a gunman killed 26 people. The incident led to extensive debate over US gun-control laws and pressure on gunmakers and traditional retailers.

The activists include the managers of funds that promote themselves as socially responsible investors, and a deputy of New York State Comptroller Thomas DiNapoli, who manages the state's retirement fund. They sent Amazon Chief Executive Jeff Bezos a letter on 25 November and showed it to Reuters on Thursday.—Reuters

Twitter backtracks on block feature after users revolt San Francisco, 16 Dec but that activity would have

— Twitter Inc was forced to nix a change to its "block" feature on Thursday after attracting a wave of protest from users who said the new policy empowered perpetrators of online abuse.

The humbling reversal on one of the most sensitive policy issues facing the social network came as Twitter encountered user revolt for the first time as a public company.

Under the short-lived change on Thursday, a blocked Twitter user could view or tweet at the person who blocked him or her, been rendered invisible to the victim as if the offending account did not exist.

Under the re-instated policy, users could prevent their harassers from following them or interacting with their tweets. Users are also explicitly notified if they are blocked.

Before it backtracked, Twitter had said Thursday that the change was meant to protect victims of harassment who wanted to filter out abusive messages but feared that the act of blocking a user would prompt retaliation.—Reuters

Healthy eating costs an extra \$1.50 per day

That healthy foods cost more has become conventional wisdom, but a new study is the most thorough yet in calculating how much more: about a dollar and a half.

"Before now, we've seen studies looking at prices of one or a few foods or diets, in one city and from one store," said Mayuree Rao. "And the results have been mixed, with some studies finding that the healthier options cost more and some studies finding they don't."

Rao is a junior research fellow at the Harvard School of Public Health and a medical student at the Warren Alpert Medical

NEW YORK, 16 Dec School of Brown University in Providence, Rhode Island. She led the study that was published in BMJ Open.

> The research team identified 27 previous studies from 10 countries that met their inclusion criteria and reviewed each of them. Fourteen studies were conducted in the US, two in Canada, six in Europe and five in other countries including South Africa, New Zealand, Japan and Brazil.

> Twelve of the studies were market surveys that evaluated the prices of anywhere from two to 133 foods each and included up to 1.230 stores.

Fifteen studies were dietary surveys that ranged

from 30 participants to more than 78,000.

The researchers compared the costs of the healthiest eating patterns with the least healthful and found that the healthiest diets cost on average \$1.47 more per day based on actual food intake, or about \$1.54 more per day for every 2,000 calories consumed.

The studies in the review used various definitions of "healthy" - including comparing the amount of fat or sugar in similar products, or comparing whole grain versus refined carbohydrate versions, or looking at total fruit and vegetable intake or overall calories.

AbbVie drug shows promise against difficult type of breast cancer

New York, 16 Dec — Women with an especially deadly type of breast cancer who received a treatment regimen containing an experimental AbbVie Inc drug prior to surgery are likely to have a significantly better response than those who get a standard chemotherapy regimen, according to data from a clinical trial.

Patients with so-called triple negative breast cancer, toward developing more personalized treatments. Its design allows researchers to continuously monitor how patients respond as the trial progresses and move patients into arms of the study testing drugs from which they are more likely to gain benefit.

This type of trial should help companies select the right group of patients to enroll into larger, more traditional late stage clinical trials, potentially

Beijing, 16 Dec — Bitcoin, the virtual currency, has created something of a frenzy in China, with its value surging more than 80 percent in a year. Until last week, that is, when it plunged more than 30 percent after the central bank banned financial institutions from involvement in bitcoin trading.

The majority of Chinese investors, who seem to love speculation, know little about the mechanisms surrounding the currency. They can't hold one in their hands nor use bitcoin in their normal daily lives.

Beijing/Shanghai, 16 Dec — Renault SA (RENA. PA) clinched full access to China's auto market on Monday by sealing a joint venture agreement with Dongfeng state-owned Motor Group (0489.HK) in Wuhan, a city fast shaping up as China's own Detroit.

Nine years the two companies first announced plans for the joint venture, they finally inked a \$1.3 billion 50-50 partnership to introduce the French carmaker's own locally assembled models in the world's biggest auto market.

The deal allows Renault to fully tap demand in China, something it has been unable to do until

now because of the lack of a strong local partner. China's central government requires all foreign automakers to have a local partner to be allowed to produce cars in the country.

To build a Chinese presence, Renault has been forced to rely on imports from South Korea. Now with Dongfeng, it will invest 7.76 billion yuan (\$1.28 billion) to build a factory in the central city of Wuhan, with the first car due to roll off the production line in 2016.

Renault, which has long-standing alliance with Japan's Nissan Motor Co (7201.T) with whom it shares technology, plans to manufacture 150,000 cars a year in Wuhan and set up a jointly run network of retail stores.

New Zealand economy to take off despite exchange rate challenge

Wellington, 16 Dec — The New Zealand economy is expected to grow strongly in the next two years, despite the country's currency remaining stubbornly high, according to a report from a leading economic think-tank on Monday.

Economic growth would pick up from 2.8 percent in the March 2014 year to 3.1 percent the following year, according to the Consensus Forecasts, an average of economic forecasts from financial and economic agencies, compiled by the New Zealand Institute of Economic Research (NZIER).

Exports this year were 3.2 percent a year in the next three years, said the report. The New Zealand dollar would gradually ease from current highs, "but the level will remain high compared to history," it said. The labour market would improve, with more jobs, unemployment easing from the current 6.3 percent to about 5 percent, and wages rising by an average 3

percent over the next three



Italy to provide port for Syrian chemical weapons transfer

Rome, 16 Dec — Italy has agreed to provide a port for use in the transfer of Syria's chemical weapons arsenal between ships on the way to its destruction at sea, its Foreign Ministry said on Sunday.

Syria is due to hand over deadly toxins which can be used to make sarin, VX gas and other lethal agents under an

international agreement forged in the wake of an attack on the outskirts of Damascus which killed hundreds last August.

Danish and Norwegian ships will collect the toxic arsenal from the Syrian port city of Latakia. The chemicals will be destroyed at sea on board a specially adapted US ship because they are too dangerous to import into a country.

Until now, it was not clear how the containers of chemicals could be transferred from the Scandinavian ships onto the US vessel.

An Italian Foreign Ministry official said the use of the port was the maximum role Italy was prepared to serve in the operation, and that the chemicals would not touch Italian

territory at any point.

The official would not identify which port would be used.

Syria's 2-1/2-year civil war has killed at least 125,835 people, according to Syrian Observatory for Human Rights, and over 2 million refugees have fled, often overwhelming neighbouring countries.

In the albums chart, British singer Robbie Williams pushed One Direction's "Midnight Memories" out of the top slot into second place with his

latest album "Swings Both Ways".



Mourinho plays down Chelsea trophy chances

London, 16 Dec -Jose Mourinho has played down Chelsea's chances of winning silverware this season, because they lack a killer "selfish" striker. The London side missed a series of scoring chances in their 2-1 win over strugglers Crystal Palace on Saturday but still moved within two points of Premier League leaders Arsenal, whom they meet on 23 December.

"I don't think we are the big contenders of any competition," Mourinho told BBC radio. "We don't have the striker who is going to score 30 goals in the league." Chelsea's 50 million pound (\$81.39 million)

striker Fernando Torres scored his second league goal of the season on Saturday. He and fellow strikers Demba Ba and Samuel Eto'o have contributed only five of Chelsea's 32 Premier League goals so far.

Belgian attacking midfielder Eden Hazard is top league scorer with six. "We don't have that striker we used to call the killer, the selfish one, the one that gives the last touch," Mourinho said. On Friday Mourinho said his strikers' hard work helped the attacking midfielders to get on the scoresheet but he and they were frustrated by their lack

"The number of goals is quite frustrating not just for me but also for them," he had said after training.

"Do I expect a little bit more? Yes. Do we want them to do a little more?

Mourinho repeated after Saturday's game that he did not expect to buy a striker in the January transfer window as there were unlikely to be any good ones available.

"They are in the big clubs, they are in the clubs with big ambitions and big clubs with big ambitions don't sell their top selfish ones," he said.

Wild elephants terrorizing people in Nepal

Kathmandu, 16 Dec — Wild elephants have been creating havoc in the southeastern and eastern parts of Nepal that share borders with India, local media reported on Sunday. People in the border districts of Rauthat, Bara and Jhapa have been living in a state of terror, fearing possible attacks by wild elephants, which have claimed the lives of dozens of people, Nepal 's state news agency RSS reported. Wild elephants also destroyed the local people's houses and properties.

Though the locals have deployed mahouts to capture the elephants, no progress has been made so far.

According to the RSS, newly elected Constituent Assembly member from the CPN-UML party, Rabin Koirala, has said that the problem of elephant terror in Jhapa district would be solved after holding talks with the Bengal government of India. Koirala said attention of Bengal chief minister would be drawn to minimize the elephant men-

A task force would be formed to this regard very soon, he assured people.
