A motor road is being constructed on the route of the World War II's dead railway between Myanmar and Thailand and so far 37 miles and six furlongs in earthen type have been completed. The road which passes through mountain ranges in Kayin and Mon States would be 64 miles and five furlongs long and 40 ft wide. Work on construction of the road started in January, 2013. And, as it is near to the AH-112 ASEAN Highway, it would also be an international route.

"It is also the nearest route to link with Thailand," said Deputy Super-

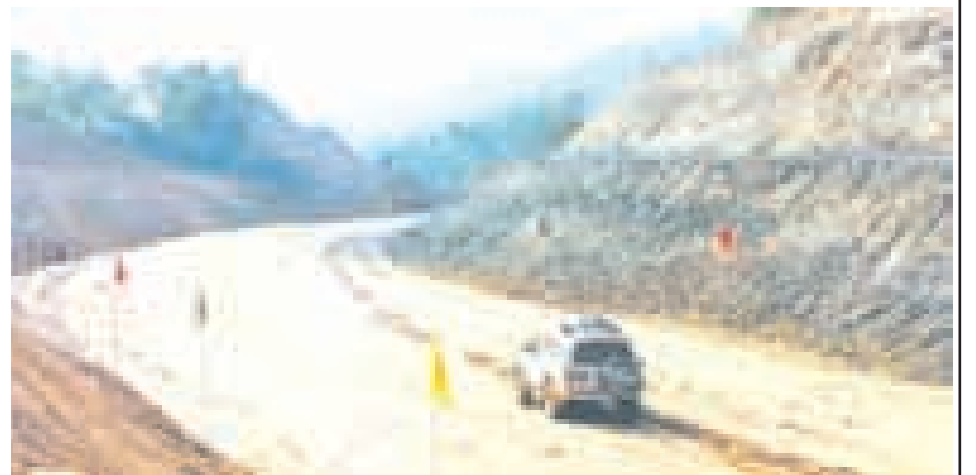
intending Engineer U Hsan Lwin of the Road Construction Special Group No. 9 under the Ministry of Construction. KNU peace group has also given their helping hands to the construction group to tackle the challenges with the construction, he added. "We heard that a foreign country would assist in the construction and I am not sure the road will be the concrete one and tarred one," U Hsan Lwin said.

"We had challenges to construct the road as it is on the route of the notorious dead railway and we tackled the challenges thanks to our strenuous efforts,"

said Ko Than Naing, an assistant engineer supervising the road construction. During the World War -II, Japanese troops constructed the 260 miles-long rail road linking Myanmar and Thailand to control the South East Asian region, and later it became notorious as "the dead railway".

On the road, there would be a total of 165 bridges and they are under construction in synchronization with the construction of the road. "The completed portion the road passes through the Karen

the road would be a facility that would contribute to development of Kayin and Mon States though it was

named as the dead road in the past.

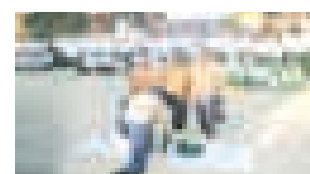

## Two file candidacy for Nago mayoral race, US base relocation in focus

NAHA, 12 Jan — Campaigning kicked off on Sunday for the 19 January mayoral election in Nago, Okinawa Prefecture, with the incumbent, who opposes the hosting of a new US military airport, facing a challenge from a pro-base candidate.

Susumi Inamine, the 68-year-old incumbent seeking a second four-year term, is recommended by the Japanese Communist Party, the People's Life Party and the Social Democratic Party, while Bunshin Suematsu, the 65-year-old former Okinawa prefectural assembly member, is recommended by the Liberal Democratic Party.

The outcome is expected to affect the Japan-US plan to relocate the US Marine Corps' Futenma Air Station from a crowded residential area in Ginowan to a coastal area in less densely populated Nago, both in Okinawa, after Okinawa Gov Hirokazu Nakaima approved last month landfill work to build a relocation facility.

## Egypt forecasts major milestone in future roadmap

CAIRO, 12 Jan — The referendum on Egypt's new draft constitution slated for 14-15 January represents a major milestone in the country's future roadmap, political experts said. The referendum marks the first time that Egyptians would go to the polls since the ouster of Islamist president Mohamed Morsi by the military last July, after mass protests against his one-year rule and his Muslim Brotherhood group.

On Saturday, army chief and defence minister Abdel-Fattah al-Sisi said the new constitution would represent "one-third of the future roadmap," calling on

all Egyptians to take part in the referendum and not to "embarrass" him and the army. The new constitution is a prior step to pave the way for presidential and parliamentary elections in the country which is now run by an interim president and a transitional government. Gamal Salama, head of political science department at Suez University, said the constitutional referendum would mark "a beginning for the establishment of new executive and legislative institutions to fill in the vacant leading posts in the country."

## New Bangladesh government to be sworn in after disputed polls

DHAKA, 12 Jan — Bangladesh's new government is set to be sworn in on Sunday, a week after the ruling party won a violence-plagued election that the opposition boycotted and amid growing international calls for a fresh and inclusive polls.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's Awami League ended with more than two-thirds of seats in a contest that was shunned by international observers as flawed and derided as a farce by the opposition Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP).

With fewer than half the seats contested, the outcome was never in doubt.

The new cabinet will be sworn in this afternoon, with Hasina, 64, taking oath as prime minister for the third term, said cabinet secretary Mohammad Musharraf Hossain Bhuiyan.

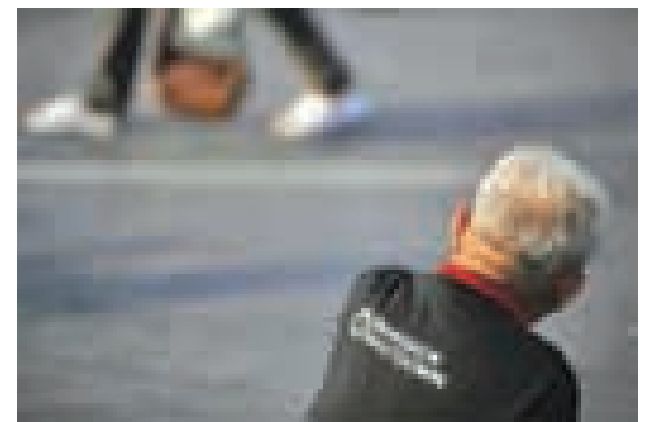
The BNP, led by former premier and Hasina's bitter rival Begum Khaleda Zia, said the new government was not legitimate, but an autocratic dictatorial government devoid of the representation of the people.

On Saturday, Khaleda,

68, left her residence for a meeting with Chinese Ambassador Lee Jung after two weeks of under virtual "house arrest", which the government denied.

Both heirs to political dynasties, Hasina and Khaleda have alternated as prime minister for all but two of the past 22 years.

The United States has called on the new government and opposition to engage in immediate dialogue to find a way to hold "free, fair, peaceful, and credible" elections as soon as possible.—Reuters

## Thai protest leader rejects compromise but says 'no civil war'

BANGKOK, 12 Jan — The leader of a movement trying to topple Thailand's government said he would call off his protest if civil war threatened to break out but rejected any compromise with the government ahead of a planned "shutdown" of the capital.

Supporters of Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra were rallying in her defence on Sunday but steered clear of Bangkok, where people went about their business as usual.

The anti-government protesters accuse Yingluck and her brother, former premier Thaksin Shinawatra, of corruption. She has called an election for February 2 but protesters want her caretaker government to step down immediately.

Protest leader Suthep Thaugsuban ruled out talks with the government in an interview published on Sunday, but said he would stand down his movement if, as some fear, violence escalates and civil war looms.

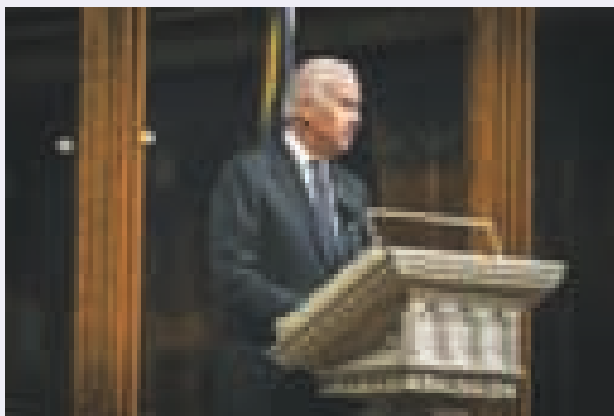
"If it becomes a civil war, I will give up. People's life is precious for me," he was reported as saying by the English-language Sunday Nation. "If someone instigates a civil war, I will tell the people to go home."

The eight-year conflict pits Bangkok's middle class and royalist establishment against the mostly poorer, rural supporters of Yingluck and Thaksin, who was overthrown in a military coup in 2006.

Their Puea Thai Party seems likely to win any new election, which the government says must be held on February 2 now parliament has been dissolved and the date endorsed by the king.

However, a member of the Election Commission said on Saturday the vote could be held on May 4, arguing that was permissible under the constitution because candidates had been prevented from registering in some districts, meaning there would be no quorum to open parliament after a February poll.—Reuters

## Obama honours Sharon's dedication to Israel, Biden to go to funeral

WASHINGTON, 12 Jan — President Barack Obama on Saturday lauded the late Israeli Prime Minister Ariel Sharon's dedication to the Jewish state and reaffirmed an "unshakable commitment" to Israel's security as Vice President Joe Biden prepared to attend the funeral.

Obama called Sharon

— who died at age 85 on Saturday and had been in a coma for the entirety of Obama's presidency — "a leader who dedicated his life to the state of Israel." He said he sent his "deepest condolences" to Sharon's family.

The United States has long been a critical ally of Israel. But Obama has had

a strained relationship with the current Israeli Prime Minister, Benjamin Netanyahu, on issues including Israel's settlement policies — championed by Sharon — and the current US diplomatic drive to prevent Iran from developing nuclear weapons capability.

At the same time, US Secretary of State John Kerry is leading a renewed effort to broker an agreement on a "two-state solution" in which Israel would exist peacefully alongside a new Palestinian state created in the West Bank and the Gaza Strip, lands seized by Israel in the 1967 war.

"We reaffirm our unshakable commitment to Israel's security and our appreciation for the enduring friendship between our two countries and our two peoples," Obama said in a state-

ment released by the White House. "We continue to strive for lasting peace and security for the people of Israel, including through our commitment to the goal of two states living side-by-side in peace and security," the Democratic president added.

Obama will not attend the memorial service for Sharon, with Biden instead leading the US delegation. Sharon had been in a coma since suffering a stroke at the height of his power as prime minister in January 2006. Obama took office in 2009. State Department spokeswoman Jen Psaki said Kerry also will not attend the funeral "due to previously scheduled meetings in Paris focused on the situation in Syria and the Middle East peace process."—Reuters

## McAuliffe sworn in as Virginia governor, as Clintons look on

RICHMOND, 12 Jan — Terry McAuliffe, a former chairman of the Democratic National Committee and a major party fundraiser, was sworn in as governor of

Virginia on Saturday, cheered on by his friends former President Bill Clinton and potential White House contender Hillary Clinton.

McAuliffe, 56, who led a Democratic sweep of the three top offices in the swing state, took the oath at the state Capitol, which was designed by Thomas Jefferson. The governor, who has never before held public office, in November narrowly defeated Republican Ken Cuccinelli, the outgoing attorney general and a favourite of the party's conservative Tea Party wing. For the first time in a quarter century Democrats hold the state's top elective posts: governor, lieutenant governor and attorney general.

McAuliffe once wrestled an alligator to get a campaign contribution, and he could face a similar challenge getting bills through a state legislature, where Republicans hold two-thirds

of the seats. "The next four years will be our moment to again show Americans what can be accomplished by mainstream leaders, and to show Virginians that we will live up their expectations of consensus-driver progress," McAuliffe told the audience at his inauguration.

Former President Clinton was cheered when he descended the steps of the state Capitol's south portico to sit in the front row. Former Secretary of State Clinton had earlier slipped in quietly, and she held an umbrella over her husband as he took his place. Hillary Clinton is the overwhelming favourite for the Democratic Party's presidential nomination in 2016, but she has not announced whether she will run. — Reuters

## Iran insists right of using advanced centrifuges

TEHERAN, 12 Jan — Carrying out researches and using advanced centrifuges are indispensable right of Iran, said head of the Atomic Energy Organization of Iran Ali-Akbar Salehi on Saturday. Salehi's remarks were a response to the reported disagreements between Iran and the world powers in recent nuclear talks on implementing the landmark nuclear deal on the country's controversial

nuclear programme as Teheran has announced that it will continue researches on the new generations of the centrifuges.

Iran's advanced home-made centrifuges have been a bone of contention in Thursday and Friday's talks between the Iranian and European Union (EU) negotiators, Salehi said.

"There were one or two issues for which the experts had gone to Geneva,

and one of them which was raised by the other side was the advanced centrifuges" whose possession and running is the indispensable right of the Islamic Republic of Iran, he said.

Salehi expressed the confidence that Iran and the P5+1 Group (the United States, Russia, China, Britain and France plus Germany) would eventually reach an agreement on this issue, but said raising such

an issue is not logical and wise and not the questions the West's respect for human rights since it means that "they expect us not to think." He hoped the differences between Iran and the world powers would be settled, saying that "Our position is very good now; we carry out enrichment, and continue our discoveries and nuclear technology applications," the report said.

## Tap water fix in West Virginia still days away after spill

CHARLESTON, 12 Jan — Tap water in Charleston, West Virginia, and nearby communities will remain unsafe in the coming days, an official said on Saturday as residents spent a third day unable to bathe, shower or drink from the faucet due to a chemical spill tainting the Elk River.

As much as 5,000 gallons (18,927 liters) of industrial chemical 4-methylcyclohexane methanol, or Crude MCHM, leaked into the river on Thursday, state officials said.

The spill came from a tank belonging to Freedom Industries, a Charleston company that produces specialty chemicals for the mining, steel and cement industries, authorities said.

Governor Earl Ray Tomblin on Friday de-

clared a state of emergency for nine counties, with the affected area including the state capital of Charleston, the state's largest city.

President Barack Obama has issued an emergency declaration. "Our teams are out and we have employees that have worked this (water) system that are extremely knowledgeable. (They are) out collecting samples and looking at flushing activities at this time," Jeff McIntyre, president of West Virginia American Water Co, told reporters on Saturday.

"But we are talking days" before water quality meets federally mandated quality standards, said McIntyre, whose company runs the state's largest water

treatment plant.

The regional ban on using tap water will be lifted one area at a time as officials work to meet the 1 part per million requirement set by the federal Centres for Disease Control and Prevention, McIntyre said.

Officials have said chemical levels in the water were declining, but the spill forced schools and businesses to close in Charleston and surrounding communities.

The Federal Emergency Management Agency

sent 75 tractor trailers full of bottled water to distribute, with National Guard assistance, to the over 300,000 people unable to use their tap water.

"As of Saturday, FEMA has delivered approximately 1 million liters of water from its distribution centers in Cumberland and Frederick, Maryland, to the area for use by the state," it said. "FEMA will continue to deliver supplies to the state for distribution, as needed."

## China offers Syria 3.3 m USD worth of humanitarian aid

DAMASCUS, 12 Jan — The Chinese Embassy in Damascus confirmed Saturday that China has pledged to provide Syria with 20 million RMB worth (3.3 million US dollars) of humanitarian aid, with the first batch of the aid having arrived on Friday.

The Chinese Ambassador in Syria said the relief mainly consisted of blankets and quilts, which are essential for the millions of internal displaced Syrians who are battling an exceptionally harsh winter.

A cargo plane arrived in the Damascus Interna-

tional Airport on Friday with the first batch of goods, while the second shipment is due to arrive early Sunday, Zhang Xun said.

According to Zhang, on the receiving end of the relief is the Syrian Arab Red Crescent, who will organize and oversee the distribution of the aid.

According to the latest statistics from the United Nations High Commission for Refugees, the number of Syrian refugees who fled to neighboring countries exceeded 2.3 million while 4.25 million are internal displaced. — Xinhua

## More foreigners visit Cambodia's two world heritage sites in 2013

PHNOM PENH, 12 Jan — Cambodia's two world heritage sites, the Angkor Wat temple and Preah Vihear temple, continued to see growth in the number of foreign tourists in 2013, tourism officials said on Sunday.

The Angkor Wat temple welcomed about 2.23 million international visitors in the year, up 8 percent year-on-year, according to Chhoeuy Chhorn, administration chief of the Siem Reap provincial tourism department.

He said South Korea, China, Vietnam, Japan and Thailand are the largest sources of foreign arrivals to the 12th century temple in northwestern Siem Reap Province.

The Angkor Archeological Park, inscribed on

the World Heritage List in 1992, is the kingdom's largest tourist destination.

"The exceptional beauty of the temple has attracted more and more visitors from year to year," he told Xinhua, predicting further growth this year thanks to broader promotion. Meanwhile, the Preah Vihear temple reported a 49 percent surge in foreign tourists in 2013.

You Sovan, deputy chief of the Preah Vihear provincial department, said some 10,650 foreigners visited the 11th century temple in the year, up 49 percent year-on-year.

He attributed the remarkable increase in foreigners to the temple to the temple's world heritage status and good security and safety. — Xinhua

## Russia says militants seized with bomb in south

MOSCOW, 12 Jan — Five members of a banned militant group were arrested in southern Russia on Saturday and a homemade bomb packed with shrapnel was defused, in another security scare weeks before the Winter Olympics in Sochi. Islamist militants have threatened to attack the games and suicide bombers killed at least 34 people last month in Volgograd, also in southern Russia.

President Vladimir Putin, who has staked his political and personal prestige on the success of the Olympics, has ordered safety measures beefed up nationwide after the attacks.

Russia's National Anti-terrorism Committee (NAC) said the latest arrests were in Nalchik, a town about 300 km (190 miles) from Sochi in the Caucasus region, where insurgents want to carve out an Islamic state.

"Security forces have detained five members of a banned international terrorist organization," the NAC said in a statement received by Russian news agencies. An NAC spokesman confirmed the statement to Reuters.—Reuters

## Renoir bought for \$7 at W Virginia flea market ordered returned to museum

ALEXANDRIA, (Virginia), 12 Jan — A napkin-size Renoir painting bought for \$7 at a flea market but valued at up to \$100,000 must be returned to the museum it was stolen from in 1951, a federal judge ordered on Friday. The 1879 Impressionist painting "Paysage Bords de Seine," dashed off for his mistress by Pierre-Auguste Renoir at a riverside restaurant, has been at the centre of a legal tug-of-war between Marcia "Martha" Fuqua, a former physical education teacher from Lovettsville, Virginia, and the Baltimore Museum of Art in Maryland.

Judge Leonie Brinkema, in a hearing in the US District Court for the Eastern District of Virginia, dismissed Fuqua's claim of ownership,

noting that a property title cannot be transferred if it resulted from a theft. "The museum has put forth an extensive amount of documentary evidence that the painting was stolen," Brinkema said, citing a 1951 police report and museum records. "All the evidence is on the Baltimore museum's side. You still have no evidence — no evidence — that this wasn't stolen," said Brinkema to Fuqua's attorney before ruling in favour of the museum.

Fuqua bought the unsigned "Paysage Bords de Seine," or "Landscape on the Banks of the Seine," at a Harpers Ferry, West Virginia, flea market in late 2009 because she liked the frame, she said in a court filing. She paid \$7 for the painting, along with a box

of trinkets. Although the frame carried the nameplate "Renoir 1841-1919," Fuqua was unaware the 5-1/2-by-9-inch oil painting was genuine and stored it in a garbage bag for 2-1/2 years, she said.

Her mother, an art teacher and painter, urged her in July 2012 to get the painting appraised. Fuqua took it to the Potomack Co, an Alexandria, Virginia, auction house, which veri-

fied it was as an authentic Renoir. After media reports about the painting, the Baltimore Museum of Art said in September 2012 it had been stolen while on loan to it. The Federal Bureau of Investigation then took custody of it. What happened to the painting in the time after the theft in November 1951 and the time it surfaced at a flea market is not known.

## EU's Ashton invited to visit Iran

TEHERAN, 12 Jan — Iran's Foreign Minister Mohammad-Javad Zarif has invited the European Union foreign policy chief Catherine Ashton to visit Teheran, an Iranian official announced on Saturday.

"Mrs Ashton has received an open invitation from Mr. Zarif to travel to Iran at any time she wants," Abbas Araqchi, Iranian deputy Foreign Minister and top nuclear negotiator, was quoted as saying by semi-official Mehr news agency.

Araqchi said that his two-day talks with Helga

Schmid, deputy of Catherine Ashton, which concluded on Friday in Geneva "were serious and were carried out in an atmosphere of mutual understanding."

"Solutions for three remaining disagreements have been found, but the capitals should decide on them" before they take effect, said Araqchi.

He added that in case of any rejection of the solutions, Iran and the powers will arrange other meetings for further discussions. Iran and the EU held a meeting in Geneva on Thursday and Friday to discuss remain-

ing issues pertaining to the implementation of an interim nuclear deal clinched between Teheran and the major world powers in November.

Under the interim nuclear deal, Iran agreed to curb parts of its nuclear program for six months in return for limited relief of western and international sanctions against the country. Nuclear experts from Iran and the six powers have held three rounds of talks to resolve various technical issues before the Geneva deal can be put into place. — Xinhua

## Former Israeli Prime Minister Sharon dies

JERUSALEM, 12 Jan — Former Israeli Prime Minister Ariel Sharon died on Saturday at a hospital near Tel Aviv eight years after a stroke left him comatose, Israeli media reported. He was 85.

The Jerusalem Post reported that Sharon died at Sheba Medical Center in Tel Hashomer, days after his condition deteriorated dramatically. Sharon had been in a coma since suffering a massive stroke in January 2006 while in office. He entered politics in 1973 after a distinguished, if controversial, military career.

After being elected prime minister in 2001, he mounted invasions into Palestinian communities. Under a unilateral disengagement policy, Sharon

controversially withdrew Israeli troops and settlers from occupied territories in Gaza and the West Bank in 2005, despite opposition from fellow members of his Likud Party.

Amid growing dissent, he left the party later that year and formed the centrist Kadima party. After his stroke, his deputy, Ehud Olmert, took over as interim leader, and Kadima went on to win the 2006 election under Olmert's leadership—Kyodo News

## France's Total to invest in Britain's shale gas quest

LONDON, 12 Jan — Total (TOTF.PA) is set to become the first major oil company to invest in Britain's nascent shale gas industry, boosting the industry's profile in a country seen as one of Europe's strongest prospects for unconventional oil and gas development.

The French group is set to commit 30 million pounds (\$50 million) to drilling for shale gas in Lincolnshire, in central England, sources familiar with the matter told *Reuters*. A Total spokesman would not

confirm any details, but said an announcement would be made on Monday.

The investment is tiny in oil industry terms - and especially small in the context of the tens of billions of dollars spent every year by Total, one of the world's top five investor-controlled oil and gas groups.

However, having such a large player as a partner will be a feather in the cap of industry minnows Dart Energy (DTE.AX), Egdon Resources (EGRE.L), IGas (IGAS.L) and eCORP, with which Total will partner on

two exploration licenses. The news will also allow Britain's coalition government to argue that its incentives for developing unconventional oil and gas reserves are working.

"It's hardly a drop in the pond really, but the government wants to get shale going and having the big boys in there helps," said Andrew Monk, chief executive of the resources-focused investment bank VSA Capital.

A new set of UK land auctions next year could be pivotal, he said, adding: "We'll see more deals and

a bit more positioning between now and then".

Geological studies show Britain to have large shale reserves, which could reverse a rising dependency on energy imports, but more drilling is needed to see whether the deposits are economical. Britain's government has thrown its weight behind shale gas exploration despite strong local and environmental opposition to the controversial extraction practice of hydraulic fracturing, or fracking — one of the techniques used to develop shale and

unconventional gas blocks.

Along with a handful of other countries including Poland, the UK is seen as a test case for the prospects

of unconventional gas and oil development in relatively crowded, wealthy, post-industrial western Europe.

## US FDA approves two-drug combination for advanced melanoma



WASHINGTON, 12 Jan — The US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) said Friday it approved a two-drug combination for the treatment of advanced melanoma, the deadliest form of skin cancer.

The safety and effectiveness of Mekinist (trametinib) in combination with Tafenlar (dabrafenib) were demonstrated in a clinical trial of 162 partici-

pants with melanoma that is late-stage or cannot be removed by surgery, the FDA said.

They are specifically indicated as a combination therapy for melanoma patients with gene mutations called BRAF V600E and V600K, it said.

Both drugs were approved last year for single-agent use.

"Mekinist and Tafenlar

are the first drugs approved for combination treatment of melanoma," said Richard Pazdur, director of the Office of Hematology and Oncology Products in the FDA's Centre for Drug Evaluation and Research, in a statement.

"Their development for combination use is based on the strong understanding of the biological pathways of the disease," Pazdur said.

According to the FDA, melanoma is the most aggressive type of skin cancer and the leading cause of death from skin disease.

The US National Cancer Institute estimated that 76,690 Americans would be diagnosed with melanoma and 9,480 would die from the disease in 2013.

## Price war in US mobile market raises fear of profit hemorrhage

NEW YORK, 12 Jan — New Year's rivalry among US mobile operators has Wall Street worried that the industry's profits could seriously decline.

After months of aggressive moves by T-Mobile US to lure customers from other carriers, No 2 operator AT&T Inc coun-

ter-attacked on 3 January by offering to pay consumers to switch from T-Mobile.

Days later, No 3 ranked Sprint Corp promised big discounts for family and friend groups. On Wednesday, T-Mobile upped the ante, saying it would pay hefty exit costs

for converts.

The moves by Sprint and AT&T come after No 4 US operator T-Mobile, a long-time industry straggler, was able to report three full quarters of customer growth after four years of losses.

While discounts are always welcomed by consumers, the intensifying competition is a new challenge to a US industry long used to imposing its will on consumers, and analysts fear it could result in the loss of billions of dollars of revenue.

Investors had hoped AT&T and market leader Verizon Wireless would be able to shrug off T-Mobile's moves, since they already control about two-thirds of the market.

## Parent involvement can help kids get more active

NEW YORK, 12 Jan — Very few kids get the amount of physical activity they need every day, but a new study from Canada finds that parental support may be the key to getting kids moving.

"Currently less than 10 percent of children accumulate the recommended 60 minutes of moderate-to-vigorous physical activity (approximately equivalent to 13,500 steps per day) at least six days per week," Kerry Vander Ploeg told *Reuters Health* by email.

Vander Ploeg, who led the new study, is with the School of Public Health at the University of Alberta in Edmonton.

"We previously demonstrated that physical

activity levels are lower on weekend days than on weekdays," she said.

Low levels of physical activity are concerning because insufficient physical activity is one of the greatest risk factors for overweight and obesity, Vander Ploeg said. Vander Ploeg and colleagues sent surveys and pedometers to 1,355 Alberta fifth graders and their parents in the spring of 2009 and 2011.

The parents were asked to rate how much they cared about exercising, how much they encouraged their children to be active and how often they exercised with their kids. The children wore the pedometers to count their steps as a measure of their physical activity levels over a nine-



For children six to 10 years old, their most active period of the day is lunch time.

day period.

In general, the daily step counts were higher on school days than on weekends and boys were more active than girls. The kids whose parents encouraged physical activity were more active, although parents tended to encourage boys more than the girls, the researchers note in their report, published in *BMC Public Health*.

Parents who said they cared about physical activi-

ty were more likely to have sons and to be active on weekends, and kids were more active when their parents were active with them.

"Parents play an important role in shaping the behaviors of their children, and therefore their belief in and support for physical activity may help to increase physical activity levels among children," Vander Ploeg said.

## Sacyr says has \$574 million at stake in Panama contract

MADRID, 12 Jan — Sacyr (SCYR.MC), the Spanish building company leading a consortium to expand the Panama Canal, said it risks losing \$574 million in guarantees and advance payments if a spat over cost overruns at the multi-billion dollar project is not resolved.

In an 8-page document sent on Friday to Spain's stock market regulator but which had not been made public until Saturday, the firm also detailed for the first time its claims of \$1.6 billion in extra costs and said the canal extension would not be completed until 30 June, 2015 at the earliest.

The consortium warned earlier this month it would

halt work from 20 January on a third set of locks for the century-old waterway, one of the world's largest building contracts, unless the Panama Canal Authority footed the bill.

In an interview with *Reuters*, Sacyr Chairman Manuel Manrique on Friday played down the row and said the company was making progress in talks with the canal operator over financing to avoid a damaging work stoppage.

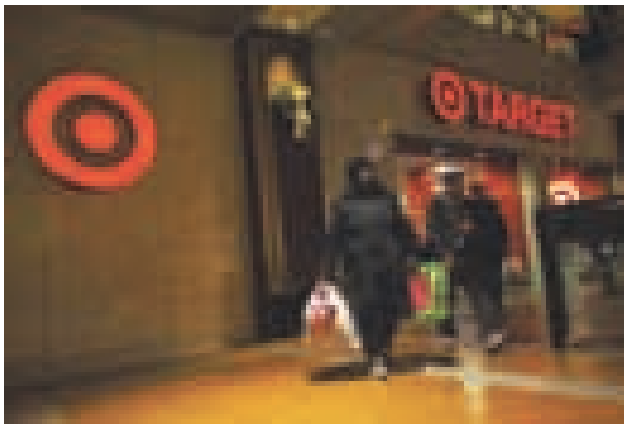
Sacyr said the guarantees it provided on the contract were worth \$445.5 million as of December 31, 2013 and it had also made advance payments worth \$128.4 million.

## More well-known US retailers victims of cyber attacks

BOSTON, 12 Jan — Target Corp and Neiman Marcus are not the only US retailers whose networks were breached over the holiday shopping season last year, according to sources familiar with attacks on other merchants that have yet to be publicly disclosed.

Smaller breaches on at least three other well-known US retailers took place and were conducted using similar techniques as the one on Target, according to the people familiar with the attacks. Those breaches have yet to come to light. Also, similar breaches may have occurred earlier last year.

The sources said that they involved retailers with outlets in malls, but declined to elaborate. They also said that while they suspect the perpetrators may be the same as those who launched the Target attack, they cannot be sure because they are still trying to find the culprits behind

all of the security breaches.

Law enforcement sources have said they suspect the ring leaders are from Eastern Europe, which is where most big cyber crime cases have been hatched over the past decade.

Only one well-known retailer, Neiman Marcus, has said that they too have been victim of a cyber attack since Target's 19 December disclosure that some 40 million payment card numbers had been stolen in a cyber attack. On Friday, Target said the data breach was worse than initially thought.

An investigation found that hackers stole the personal information of at least 70 million customers, including names, mailing addresses, telephone numbers and email addresses. Neiman Marcus said it was not sure if the breach was related to the Target incident.

BEIJING, 12 Jan — Xu Dazhe, the new chief of China's space industry, is seeking more international cooperation in Washington less than a month after his country's first successful soft landing on the moon.

Xu said China's space policy has always been very open. "We are willing to cooperate with all the countries in the world, including the United States and developing countries," he said on Thursday on the sidelines of the International Space Exploration Forum held at the US State Department.

A space scientist by training, Xu was promoted less than three weeks ago to head the China National Space Administration. Previously, he led China Aerospace Science and Technology Corp.

Xu said that his attending the meeting shortly af-

ter taking the new job was meant to send a signal to all his counterparts worldwide that China is willing to strengthen its cooperation with other nations.

Recently, China has been working with Russia and the European Union on space exploration, and the EU participated in the observation of China's moon landing.

China has also been launching satellites for other nations, including sending into orbit a telecommunications satellite for Bolivia on 21 December.

However, cooperation between China and US space agency NASA has been hampered by an exclusionary law passed by the US Congress in 2011. It prohibits NASA from using its funds to host Chinese visitors at NASA facilities, citing security concerns, and

also prohibits NASA from working bilaterally with Chinese nationals affiliated with a Chinese government entity or enterprise.

Xu praised the US for its advanced space technology and said China has cooperated with NASA before but it came to a halt after the law was passed.

He said that the US invitation of China to the forum, and his participation, have sent a positive signal.

Xu was also expected to attend a summit of heads of space agencies on Friday in Washington addressing exploration. The summit was organized by the International Academy of Astronautics.

China was in the spotlight at the Thursday forum, which gathered ministers and high-level officials from some 35 spacefaring nations to talk about the opportuni-

ties and challenges in space exploration.

US Deputy Secretary of State William Burns lauded China for becoming, in 2013, the third country in the world to complete a successful landing on the moon.

Other major events in the past year included India's launch of its Mars Orbiter Mission and the US' Voyager 1, which became the first man-made object to leave the solar system and enter interstellar space.

Burns emphasized the importance of international cooperation in space exploration.

"The question facing us today is whether we can muster the courage and political will to advance space exploration and ensure that cooperation continues to trump competition," he said at the forum.—Xinhua

## China succeeds in first-time 300-metre saturation diving

SHENZHEN, 12 Jan — China succeeded in its first 300-metre saturation diving on Sunday morning as three divers returned safe and sound from deep water to the living chamber on the ship.

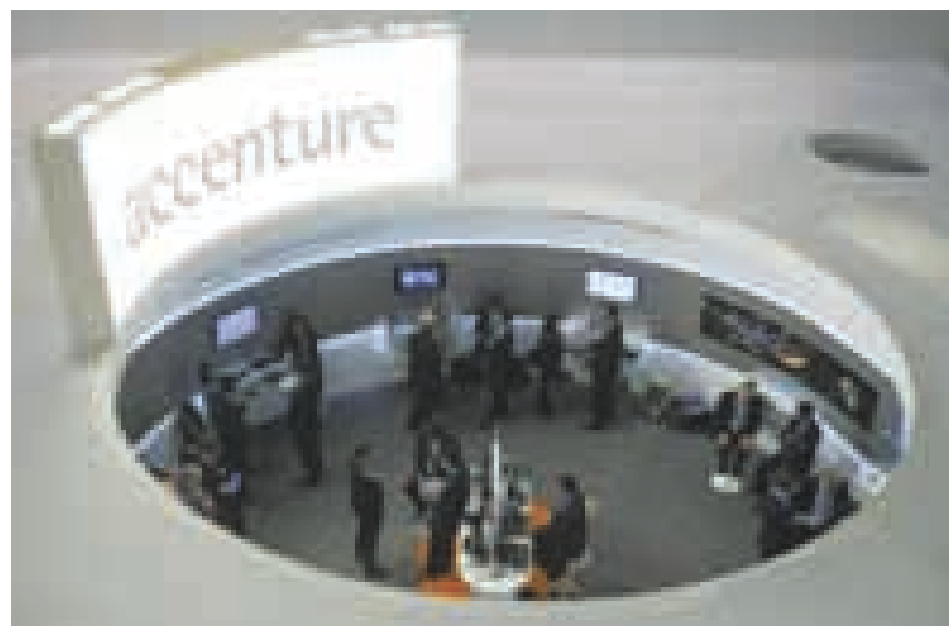
The diving bell actually reached 313.5 metres deep under the South China Sea, according to Guo Jie, on-site chief director of the experiment.

The three divers, Hu Jian, Guan Meng and Dong Meng returned to the deck of the ship at 5:09 am on Sunday.

The saturation diving technology enables human beings to withhold high deep water pressure by saturating the inert gas in human tissue fluid, according to Guo.

Three other Chinese divers planned to try again at 8 am on Sunday and are expected to return to the living chamber at about 2 pm and stay there until 24 Jan to let the inert gas in their tissue fluid to return to normal pressure, said Shen Hao, director of Shanghai rescue and salvage centre.

## Accenture named lead contractor for Obamacare website

WASHINGTON, 12 Jan — Accenture has been chosen to replace CGI Federal as the lead contractor for the Obamacare enrollment website, which failed to work when it launched in October for millions of Americans shopping for health insurance, the US Centres for Medicare and Medicaid Services said on Saturday.

CGI Federal, a subsidiary of CGI Group, built the website, HealthCare.gov, which was plagued by error messages and slow speeds for weeks after the launch. The glitches created a political crisis for President Barack Obama, threatening the roll-out of his signature

healthcare law and emboldening Republican foes to call for its repeal.

"As CMS moves forward in our efforts to help consumers access quality, affordable health coverage, we have selected Accenture to become the lead contractor for the HealthCare.gov portal and to prepare for next year's open enrollment period," the agency said in a statement. CGI Federal said on Friday that its contract, which was originally awarded in 2011 and is scheduled to end 28 February, would not be renewed.

Accenture said the contract was worth \$45 million for the initial phase of the project, and the Washing-

ton Post reported that the final value of the one-year contract would be about \$90 million.

"Accenture will bring deep healthcare industry insight as well as proven experience building large-scale, public-facing websites to continue improving HealthCare.gov," David Moskovitz, chief executive of Accenture Federal Services, said in a statement.

Obama has said the fit with the website has made him want to overhaul the way the federal government buys technology services. Critics say the system favors large, established contractors such as CGI.

Myanmar chronicle “Konbaung set Maha Yazawuntawgyi [the great history of the second Konbaung dynasty] records in detail the account of this Image it says that” altogether 5260 devotees took part in the transportation of the heavy load of monolith Image-4400 servicemen and 860 boatmen. The marble Image measures over 11 cubits in height, over 4 cubits of diameter between the two knees 8 cubits in circumference of the head and over 4 cubits in the width of the arm. Bagydaw's nephew Prince Bagan succeeded him. He reigned 7 years [1846-1853 A.D]. King Bagan moved his capital from Inwa, back to Amarapura. With him he moved the great marble Image to Amarapura. By the side of a great natural lake “Taung Tha Man In” not far from the capital, a beautiful Temple modelled on Ananda Temple at old Bagan was built in which the marble Image was housed. Because the Image was enshrined by the side of Taung Tha Man Lake, the public call it “Taung Tha Man Kyauk Taw Gyi Phaya [Great Stone

Buddha Image at Taung Tha Man In]. But its official name is “Maha Thet Kya Yanthi, literally meaning “The great Light of Setkya Muni Buddha”. The Temple itself is an art gallery of a sort. Beautiful frescoes adorning the interiors depict history of the Image, pagodas and monuments of the time,

life style of the people, as well as locations of planets, and constellations according to Myanmar astronomy.

(4) Maha Thetkya Marazein is sheltered in a uniquely designed temple at the foot of Mandalay Hill. There are two famous pagodas of historic importance namely Maha Loka Marazein and Sanda Muni in the vicinity. The history of this Image tells us that Prince Mindon, during his sojourn at Sagyin Village, found a gigantic stone on the hill. He made a wish that if he became King, he would sculpt it into a Buddha Image when he became king in 1853 he fulfilled his promise. Two reputed stone sculptor of that time U Toke Kyi and U Pike Htwe were assigned by royal order to carve the stone into a sitting Buddha Image. The two master sculptors with their 30 apprentices accomplished the task. In the said chronicle mentioned above, a detail ac-

count of the conveying of the big stone from the hill and carrying it on a specially build-bamboo raft, floated down on a special dug double canal during heavy monsoon, till it reached the tributary of the Ayeyawaddy River and from there the load was pulled by His Majesty's steam ship “Mya

Nan Setkya” to the site where it was fashioned into sitting Buddha Image, how King Mindon daily received the report of the progress of wake by a telegraphic line between his place and the Sagyin marble hills. The account inspires us and makes us marvel at the ingenuity of the then Myanmar engineers and managing skill of the king and his men.

When the big Image was completed, a grand ceremony of consecrating the Image was performed on May 16, 1865, King Mindon came out in state from his palace to the Image. It was a grand royal pageant, six battalions at the front and six battalions in the rear, featuring four elements of Myanmar traditional army such as infantry of swords men, spears men, lancers and archers, cavalry, elephantry, chariotry plus, gunnery and artillery. His majesty the king was carried either in palanquin, on hoes, on elephant or in chariot but not mentioned in the account when he reached, the king personally complete the face of the Image and a grand consecration of the Image was held according to traditional religious rites naming the Image “Maha Thet Kya Marazein [The Buddha of Sakya race, the Great victor of Mara the evil opponent]. The enlarged reproductions of the 12 original pictorial records of this royal pageant, done on folding papers called “yaungson parabikes” by court painter Saya Chone may be viewed in a zayat [pavilion] on the eastern side of the Temple.

The Sagyin marble Image and its pedestal are of one piece weighting 180

tons. The Image itself is 27 feet high, The length of the face from the forehead band to the chin is 6.75 feet. Other parts of the Image are in good proportion to the face. The image was sculpted in correct ratio of Buddha Image as prescribed in Buddhist iconography. How large the image is, can be gauged from the fact that one can comfortably lie down in the plan of its folded left hand.

Regarding the temple which shelters the image, King Mindon intended to construct it on the model of Ananda Temple at old Bagan. But his intention was frustrated by the outbreak of Myingun rebellion in 1866. Present roof of a special design was donated by Shan Chief of Yaunghe. In the spacious precinct are figures of 80 arahat disciples of the Buddha arranged around the central shrine, 20 on each side.

Geologists notice some unique qualities of this image the marble is almost flawless—there are only two small negligible blemishes—very unusual for a marble stone of super dimension. According to stone sculptors, it has five varieties of grain, three white grains and two black grains, which are easily visible on the image. Mandalay people call it Mandalay Kyauk Taw Gyi Phaya [Big stone Buddha Image of Mandalay] to differentiate it from Taung Tha Man Kyauk Tawgyi Phaya on the bank of Lake Taung Tha Man in Amarapura.

Continuing from the date of its completion in 1865, this marble image today [2014] is 149 years old. Luckily it escaped natural calamities, human vandalism and ravages of the Second World War. But 80 Sagyin marble images of 80 arahat disciple images were stolen and taken abroad. Mahasky-amarazein Image receives daily veneration of pilgrims and admiration of international tourists. The image is in the queue for entry into UNESCO World Cultural Heritage List.

## Basque protesters rally in support of ETA prisoners

BILBAO, 12 Jan — Tens of thousands of protesters marched through the streets of Bilbao in Spain's northern Basque Country on Saturday in support of jailed members of the Basque separatist group ETA, defying a court ban from Madrid. A high court judge had vetoed the march, which was initially organized by prisoners' supporters to call for inmates to be moved to jails closer to their homes.

But two of the region's main political parties — the Basque pro-independence party Bildu and the more moderate nationalist PNV (Partido Nacionalista Vasco) — joined forces to restyle the rally as a march for “hu-

man rights, understanding and peace”. The treatment of ETA prisoners is an awkward one for the Madrid government, which would be certain to anger victims' associations if it made any concessions to the prisoners.

ETA — or Euskadi Ta Askatasuna, which means Basque Homeland and Freedom in Basque — is accused of killing more than 800 people over more than four decades, many with car bombs. However, the group called a ceasefire in 2011, and speculation has grown that it might soon announce a full disarmament. “This is a unique opportunity to show the world our desire

for peace and the obstacles that the Spanish government is putting in the way,” said Jose Mari Agirre, 55, at the march.

ETA prisoners' demands to see out their jail terms in the Basque Coun-

try could advance after they said last month they would recognize Spain's criminal justice system. In a statement, the prisoners also acknowledged the pain caused by decades of violence. The group has already been

significantly weakened by hundreds of arrests in both Spain and France as well as a decline in political and social support in the Basque Country. About 600 ETA members are in prison in Spain.—Reuters

## Syrian troops kill 40 rebels in Aleppo

DAMASCUS, 12 Jan — At least 40 rebels were killed on Saturday by the Syrian troops in the country's northern Province of Aleppo, the official SANA news agency said.

More than 40 “terrorists,” most of whom are foreigners, were killed in a “special operation” carried out by the Syrian regular forces in Retyan village in the northern countryside of Aleppo, said SANA.

The rebels have been losing their momentum recently as they have become plagued with infighting between those who showcase themselves as “moderate” rebels and the Islamic State of Iraq and the Levant (ISIL).

The Britain-based Syrian Observatory for Human Rights said on Friday that the infighting that erupted between rebel groups in Syria have killed 500 people.

The battles started last Friday between various rebel groups and so-called Islamic State of Iraq and the Levant (ISIL), said the Observatory, adding that the death toll includes 85 civilians, 240 rebels from various groups and 157 fighters from the ISIL.

Several Islamist battalions have recently turned against the powerful ISIL, which has recently declared the establishment of an Islamic emirate in Iraq's Fallujah Province.—Xinhua

## Permit to hunt endangered rhino sells for \$350,000 despite protests

AUSTIN, 12 Jan — A permit to hunt a black rhino in Namibia sold for \$350,000 at an auction in Dallas on Saturday with proceeds going to protect the endangered animals despite protests from animal rights groups that saw the sale as immoral conservation. The license allows for the killing of a single, post-breeding bull, with Namibian wildlife officials on hand for the hunt to make sure an appropriate animal is selected.

The Dallas Safari Club had been expecting the permit to bring \$250,000 to \$1 million at an auction held during its annual convention. The hunt will help in managing the population and provide an underfunded Namibian government hard cash in the expensive battle to thwart poachers, it said.

“Biologists in Namibia were hopeful that a US-based auction would

produce a record amount for rhino conservation, and that's exactly what happened,” said club Executive Director Ben Carter. “These bulls no longer contribute to the growth of the population and are in a lot of ways detrimental to the growth of the population because black rhinos are very aggressive and territorial. In many cases, they will kill younger, non-breeding bulls and have been known to kill calves and cows,” Carter said this week.

More than 75,000 people signed an online petition at www.causes.com to stop the sale, saying black rhinos cannot be protected if they are allowed to be killed. There are about 25,000 rhinos in Africa — 20,000 white rhinos and 5,000 black rhinos — with the majority in South Africa. Namibia is one of the leading habitats after that.—Reuters

## 60 killed in ongoing clashes in Iraq's Anbar Province

BAGHDAD, 12 Jan — At least 60 people were killed and some 297 others wounded in clashes between the security forces and militant groups over the past two weeks, as the battles continued on Saturday, a local official and a police source said. “Many women and children were among the dead as the clashes and the shelling hit residential areas in the cities of Ramadi and Fallujah,” head of Anbar Health Directorate Khudeir Khalaf Shalal told reporters.

The battles between hundreds of Sunni tribesmen backed by the Iraqi security forces and al-Qaeda fighters continued Saturday in the eastern and

northeastern districts of Ramadi, a provincial police source told Xinhua on condition of anonymity.

Meanwhile, the tribesmen and the army re-took control of the town of Khaldiya, and pushed al-Qaeda militants to the edges of the town after several days of fierce clashes, the source said.

More clashes occurred in the town of Garma, some 10 km east of Fallujah, when the security forces and the tribesmen fought al-Qaeda gunmen who control large part of the town, the source added.

In addition, two children were killed and two people wounded in Garma late on Friday night when

several mortar rounds landed on residential areas in the town, the source said.

In Fallujah, several mortar rounds struck the al-Askari neighbourhood in the city and wounded two civilians, he added. Separately, Anbar's provincial council voted in the new mayor for the city of Fallujah to replace the former mayor who was shot dead by a sniper shot in central the city on 13 November, a source from Anbar's provincial council told Xinhua.

Anbar Province has been the scene of fierce clashes that flared up after Iraqi police dismantled an anti-government protest site outside Ramadi in late December last year.—Xinhua

## Fire in China's Shangri-la put out

SHANGRI-LA, (Yunnan), 12 Jan — A fire that started in the early hours of Saturday in an ancient town in Shangri-la, a resort county in southwest China's Yunnan Province, has been completely put out.

The fire broke out at 1:37 am at the Ruyi Inn in the Dukezong Ancient Town, where most houses are made of wood, a factor which added difficulties to firefighting, said a local government spokesman at a Press conference. Investigators have ruled out the possibility of arson, and further investigation is under way.

Around 2,000 people, including local firefighters, soldiers, police and residents, have participated

in the rescue work. Over 2,600 people were evacuated from three neighbourhoods of the town. No casualties have been reported. More than 240 houses were damaged and other 43 houses were dismantled so as to prevent the fire from spreading. Apart from the houses, shops and infrastructure facilities, the fire also burned some cultural relics, precious Tibetan thangka and other Tibetan art pieces. The economic loss is being calculated.

As of 6 pm, Department of Finance of Yunnan Province has allocated a relief fund of 5 million yuan (826,000 US dollars) to help with the relocation of the affected local residents and reconstruction

work after the fire. Local weather forecast departments said snow is expected on Saturday evening to Sunday. Dukezong, meaning “town of the moon” in

Tibetan, was built 1,300 years ago. Known for its well-preserved ancient Tibetan dwellings, it is one of the most renowned resorts in Shangri-la.—Xinhua

## Mitsubishi Materials president apologizes for fatal factory blast

Tsu, (Japan ), 12 Jan — Mitsubishi Materials Corp President Hiroshi Yao apologized on Saturday for

the explosion at the company's semiconductor silicon plant this week that killed five maintenance workers.

In his first news conference since the accident Thursday in the central Japan city of Yokkaichi, Mie Prefecture, Yao said although the cause of the explosion is still not known, the company will have to review maintenance work safety procedures at the factory.

"The fact that the accident occurred even if (the plant workers) followed the regulations means that there was a flaw" in the regulations themselves, Yao said.

The blast occurred when the cover of a heat exchanger at the plant was removed for cleaning. The plant did not have detailed guidelines as to when the

heat exchanger could be opened for cleaning, according to Mitsubishi Materials officials. Workers checked if the heat exchanger was cool enough to open by touching the surface of the equipment, they said.

Yao said a "more scientific method" may have been needed to determine if the heat exchanger was safe for maintenance work.

The company has not decided when to restart suspended operations at the factory, he added. Mitsubishi Materials is one of the three major domestic suppliers of semiconductor silicon.

## India says US could have avoided 'mini-crisis,' more to be done

NEW DELHI, 12 Jan — India on Saturday blamed the United States for a "mini crisis" over the arrest and strip search of an Indian envoy, and said more work was needed to repair ties a day after the withdrawal of diplomats seemed to draw a line under the dispute.

Devyani Khobragade, 39, who was India's deputy consul-general in New York, was arrested in December on charges of visa fraud and lying to US authorities about what she paid her housekeeper. Khobragade's arrest and strip-search provoked protests in India and dealt a

serious blow to US efforts to strengthen ties. Foreign Minister Salman Khurshid said the United States should have warned senior officials visiting Washington a day before Khobragade's arrest by State Department security in December.

"It wasn't even mentioned," Khurshid told the CNN-IBN television network. He called the row a "mini crisis" and said India should have been given the chance to withdraw Khobragade before she was arrested.

He said the core of the US-Indian relationship



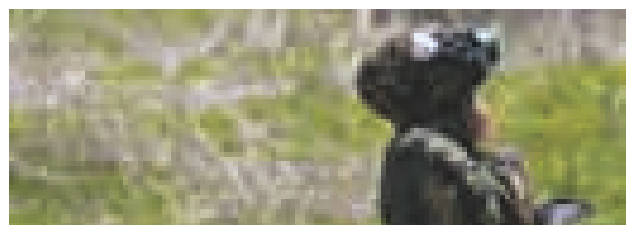

was very strong and that he didn't expect lasting damage from what has turned into the biggest rift in years. "I think we've found that at least the immediate, immediate concerns have been addressed," Khurshid

said. "But there's a lot more still to do."

He did not clarify what else must be done to avoid lasting damage to ties between the countries, who share some \$100 billion in annual trade. — Reuters

## South Korea to contribute \$867 million for US military forces in 2014

SEOUL, 12 Jan — South Korea said on Sunday it had agreed to pay 920 billion won (\$866.86 million) in 2014 towards the cost of the US military presence in the country, a rise of 5.8 percent from a year ago.

US and South Korean officials have struck a five-

year cost sharing plan for 28,500 US troops in the country after a series of negotiations since early last year.

The deal, subject to South Korean parliament's approval, comes after Washington's decision to send more soldiers and tanks to South Korea next

month as part of a military rebalance to Asia after more than a decade of war in Afghanistan and Iraq.

"The US side had demanded a large-scale hike, considering US Forces Korea's strengthened readiness due to serious security situation in the Korean peninsula and its budget situation, but the government put the utmost efforts and drew agreement to an extent to minimize our burden," South Korea's foreign ministry said in a statement.

Still technically at war with North Korea, Seoul has shouldered part of Washington's cost for stationing its troops since 1991, currently paying for about 40 percent of the cost. — Reuters

## China to establish real estate registration office

BEIJING, 12 Jan — China will set up a bureau for real estate registration to facilitate property management reform, China's top land and resources regulator said on Saturday.

The establishment of the bureau is designed to improve unified system design for registration as China will spell out related regulations this year, Xu Deming, vice minister of land and resources said at a work-planning meeting.

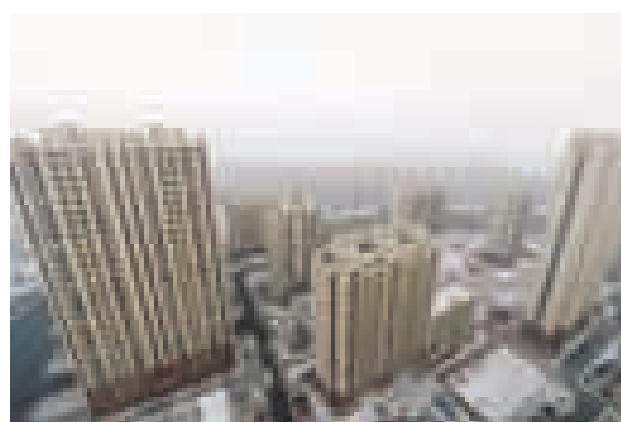
The unified system on real estate registration will include related regulations, registration and information service platforms, documents and survey standards.

Meanwhile, China will

accelerate rural land property surveying and registration and promote stockholding system reform in the countryside, Xu said.

Small cities and towns should highlight real estate registration in their organization and government

function reform while big cities should enhance cooperation with related departments and share their experience, the vice minister added. Real estate registration is an essential step if China is to levy property tax. — Xinhua

## One dead in Italian Matera building collapse

ROME, 12 Jan — One missing woman was found dead late on Saturday many hours after a residential building collapsed in the Italian ancient city of Matera.

The long search for the missing ended with the recovery of the 31-year-old woman's body, Rai television said. Earlier in the day, rescue teams rescued seven people, digging in the debris with their hands to prevent further collapse.

Among the survivors there was a 57-year-old man who remained in the debris for more than 12 hours.

Local authorities have opened an investigation to ascertain responsibilities, according to ANSA news agency. The building reportedly hosted four apartments in the old city centre.

"The whole house was shaking, there was a lot of dust, it looked like an earthquake and thought I would die," a 50-year-old disabled who survived in the collapse was quoted as saying by ANSA. Deputy Interior Minister Filippo Bubbico, who arrived in the southern city to monitor the situation, said some "inexperience" in the ongoing works at the ground floor could have caused the accident.

## Cargo charter flight links NW China, Kazakhstan

YINCHUAN, 12 Jan — A cargo charter flight linking northwest China with Kazakhstan was opened on Saturday with hopes that it can boost development of the Silk Road economic belt spanning the Eurasia continent.

cargo handling capacity of Hedong International Airport in Yinchuan, capital city of Ningxia Hui Autonomous Region, will be raised to 4,000 tonnes from the current 200 tonnes.

Huo Hongguang, deputy head of the region's commerce department, said an

increase of 300 million U.S. dollars' worth of exports could be expected annually from the direct flight. According to the local airport authority, the flight is jointly sponsored by Chapman Freeborn, a British charter aircraft company, and Ningxia Cargo Airlines.—Xinhua

## Heilongjiang-Russia trade posts increase amid pessimism

HARBIN, 12 Jan — Trade value between China's northeastern province of Heilongjiang and Russia reached 22.36 billion US dollars in 2013, up 5.8 percent, said the Harbin customs authority on Sunday.

Of the total volume that devoured a quarter of the year's China-Russia trade,

the province's imports from Russia accounted for 15.45 billion US dollars, an increase of 34 percent year on year. Meanwhile, exports stood at 6.91 billion US dollars, down 3.3 percent compared with the previous year, registering a cumulative trade deficit of 8.54 billion US dollars.

According to China's General Administration of Customs, China-Russia trade has downshifted, rising only 0.5 percent in January-November. 10 percentage points lower year on year, and concern is growing that trade for the whole year might not grow at all from 2012.—Xinhua

## At 80, the real Philomena works for British film's success

LOS ANGELES, 12 Jan — She is not an actress, but rather an 80-year-old Irish mother and former nurse, crisscrossing Los Angeles in the film awards season for screenings, interviews and even an afternoon tea party.

Philomena Lee takes the hullabaloo with good humour, knowing that the film she inspired — "Philomena" — not only has chances of winning awards but also helping women who, like her, had babies as teens and were forced to give them up.

"It is a challenge because I normally led a very quiet family life when all this happened," said Lee when she stopped by the Reuters newsroom this week in her whirlwind schedule.

But now she's fully aware of the power of her

story on film.

"I have brought something out that was buried for so long," said Lee, who now lives outside London. "And a lot of women like myself just could not tell the story because you were made to feel so bad about having a baby out of marriage."

Directed by Britain's Stephen Frears and co-written by comedic actor Steve Coogan, "Philomena" is up for a Golden Globe on Sunday for best motion picture drama. Judi Dench, who plays Lee, is a front-runner to win best actress in a drama, while Coogan and Jeff Pope are competing for best adapted screenplay. "Philomena" also received four nominations this week for Britain's top film honours, the BAFTAs.

And its box office performance, \$45 million worldwide, is considered buoyant for a film of its modest size. The Weinstein Company, run by impresario Harvey Weinstein and known for its aggressive promotion of films in awards season, has organized a full slate of events this week for "Philomena," as the race for the Oscars on 2 March heats up around the Globes.

"England is a very small country and a modest country," said Frears, perhaps best known for directing 2006's "The Queen," as he accompanied Lee around town. "You come over here, and the scale of things is amazing. It is very cheeky to come over here with a British film."

"It's the hero's journey — you have the wizard, you have the antagonist, that's the king, and you have the different missions he has to go through and the love interest in Princess Hebe. Story-wise, it's all there, that's what drew me to it," Lutz told Reuters.—Reuters

## Child singing star Jackie Evancho balances school, career

MIAMI, 12 Jan — Three years after a popular TV talent show launched child soprano Jackie Evancho on a meteoric career, she still has no singing coach, can't read music and sticks to a modest rehearsal routine.

As she makes the transition from pre-teen singing sensation to professional artist, Evancho, who turns 14 in April, is seeking to balance her school work — and play time — with a busy concert tour sched-

ule and recording her sixth album. "She has the challenge of going from child star to legitimate artist," said Lisa Evancho, who tours with her daughter, helping to steam-press her dresses before performances and supervising her rehearsal routine.

"It's no longer 'Let's go see the circus freak — the little girl with the grown-up voice.' It's more like wanting her to stand on her own ability and keep

## Moyes can smile at last as United sink Swansea

LONDON, 12 Jan — Manchester United returned to winning ways after three straight defeats with a 2-0 Premier League home victory over Swansea City on Saturday, avenging last week's FA Cup loss to the Welsh club. Without strikers Wayne Rooney and Robin van Persie, United laboured before halftime but Antonio Valencia and Danny Welbeck scored early in the second period to calm any jitters and put a smile back on the face of manager David Moyes.

United remained in seventh place with 37 points from 21 games, nine points behind leaders Chelsea, but victory at least improved the mood at Old Trafford, even if the performance was not memorable. "In the end we got the result we deserved," Moyes, who was charged with misconduct by the FA

on Friday for comments he made about officials after Tuesday's League Cup semi-final, first leg defeat at Sunderland, told Sky Sports.

"At halftime I said we had to work a bit harder and make more chances and they (the players) went about their jobs very well," Michael La-

udrup's injury-hit Swansea dominated possession with their patient passing style but apart from a Jonjo Shelvey shot easily held by David de Gea they created few chances.

United also struggled, however, with the game looking eerily similar to

last Sunday's FA Cup third round tie at Old Trafford that Swansea won 2-1 with a late Wilfried Bony goal.

There was to be no repeat on Saturday though as United, with teenager Adnan Januzaj switched from a central role to the wing at halftime, took the lead two

minutes after the interval.

Valencia was on hand to tuck away a rebound after Shinji Kagawa's header was parried by Swansea keeper Gerhard Tremmel.

"Not many have dropped for us in the box lately and sometimes you need that bit of luck," Moyes said. Welbeck glanced in Patrice Evra's shot on the hour to give United daylight and they should have added more goals late on. If Moyes was a relieved man after another week of intense scrutiny he was not showing it, however. Asked how big the victory was, the Scot simply said: "Same size as any other one. All you can get is three points." United visit Chelsea next week when they hope to have Rooney available after a "warm weather" break to heal a groin problem.

## Sunderland can survive says Poyet after win at Fulham

LONDON, 12 Jan — Sunderland can beat the odds and stay up despite being bottom of the Premier League at Christmas, manager Gus Poyet said after an emphatic 4-1 win at fellow strugglers Fulham on Saturday.

"It was an outstanding performance," the Uruguayan told the BBC. "If we can retain that level then we can stay up. We needed something special and got it today. "The lads were superb, you do not score four goals away from home many times in your life. "Adam Johnson was exceptional with his passing, his creativity and everything he did today. He needs the ball and the chance to pass it."

Johnson, signed in 2012 from Manchester City, has slipped from the limelight and is no longer talked about as an England player despite 11 caps for his country.—Reuters

## Barca angry after Rosell targeted over Neymar contract

BARCELONA, 12 Jan — Barcelona have reacted angrily to a request by the state prosecutor to open proceedings against club president Sandro Rosell for the alleged misappropriation of funds in last year's purchase of Neymar.

The Brazil forward signed for the Spanish champions in the close season for 57.1 million euros, of which 17.1 million euros went to his former club Santos.

Barca club member Jordi Cases filed a complaint seeking clarification over what happened to the remaining 40 million euros and on Friday the state prosecutor asked the judge overseeing the case to open proceedings against Rosell, who denies wrongdoing.

The judge has yet to

rule on the prosecutor's request.

"Barcelona Football Club wishes to express its most energetic indignation about the report by the state prosecutor on the signing of Neymar Da Silva Santos Junior," Barca said in a statement on their website (www.fcbarcelona.es) on Saturday.

"The operation to sign Neymar Da Silva Santos Junior was complex, an example of business engineering, and we have repeatedly expressed the confidential nature of some of its agreements," they added.

"Our rivals were prepared to conduct the same operation for much more money but (FC Barcelona) won through thanks to the skill and expertise of its negotiating team.

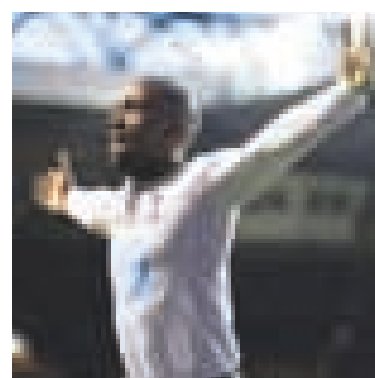
## Defoe begins long goodbye from Spurs with typical goal

LONDON, 12 Jan — England striker Jermain Defoe began his long goodbye from Tottenham Hotspur with his first Premier League goal of the season as the home side recovered from a poor first half to beat Crystal Palace 2-0 on Saturday.

Defoe, Spurs' fifth highest all-time scorer with 143 goals, will be joining MLS side Toronto FC in March in a six million pounds (\$9.89 million) deal and scored in the 72nd minute to guarantee all three

points at White Hart Lane.

Tottenham are unbeaten in five league matches since Tim Sherwood became manager last month after the sacking of Andre-Villas Boas and the win took them up to fifth in the table. Palace are now bottom of the standings despite having dominated an opening half in which Jason Puncheon blasted an eighth minute penalty high and wide into

the crowd.

Spurs were far better after the break, took

the lead through Christian Eriksen, who smashed the ball home from close range after 50 minutes, and sealed the points when Defoe replaced Roberto Soldado in the 58th and scored 14 minutes later.

He collected a clever through ball from winger Aaron Lennon, created space for himself and then fired past keeper Julian Speroni for the kind of typical poacher's goal he has been scoring throughout his career.

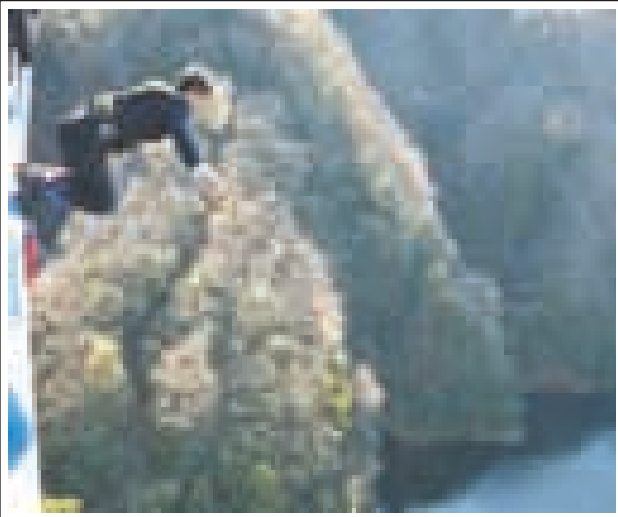

## 5.0-magnitude quake hits 136km NE of Hirara, Japan

HONG KONG, 12 Jan — An earthquake measuring 5.0 on the Richter scale jolted 136km NE of Hirara, Japan at 02:35:46 Hong Kong Time on Sunday (18:35:46 GMT), the US Geological Survey said.

The epicenter, with a depth of 35.97 km, was initially determined to be at 25.6833 degrees north latitude and 126.2338 degrees east longitude.—Xinhua

## Japan's Kasai becomes oldest World Cup winner

BAD MITTERNDORF, (Austria), 12 Jan — Japan's 41-year-old Noriaki Kasai became the oldest ski jumper to win on the World Cup circuit on Saturday with a victory in a ski flying event in Austria.

Kasai led the field with a 196-meter effort in the first round of jumps and added a leap of 197 meters in the second round to earn a winning total of 391.6 points, 10.1 ahead of runner-up Peter Prevc of Slovenia. Local favorite Gregor Schlierenzauer finished third with 380.3.

At the age of 41 years, seven months, Kasai beat the record held by compatriot Takanobu Okabe, who won a World Cup event in March 2009 at 38 years, four months. It was Kasai's first World Cup victory since February 2004 and 16th overall in World Cup individual events — also a record for Japanese ski jumpers.

"I can't remember what happened from the moment I leapt into the air, and I'm just pleased that I dealt well with anxiety and nervousness," Kasai said of

his second jump, which he faced with a slim lead of 0.2 point over Prevc.

"It was good a thing like this occurred to me before the (Sochi) Olympics, where the weight of pressure is going to be incomparable," he said, adding, "Now I think I can expect good results at the Olympics."

Kasai's latest victory came after his third-place finish in a large hill event in Germany and fourth-place standing in the Four Hills tournament earlier this winter. He won a team-event silver at the 1994 Lillehammer Games for his only Olympic medal.

## Armed tribesmen attack oil field in SE Yemen, three soldiers killed

ADEN, (Yemen), 12 Jan — At least three army soldiers were killed after armed tribesmen launched an attack on an oil field in Yemen's southeastern province of Hadramout on Saturday, a government official told Xinhua.

"The tribal gunmen in vehicles attacked an on oil installation operated by Norwegian DNO in the suburbs of Hadramout province," the local official said on condition of anonymity. They killed three soldiers and kidnapped an engineer and two workers, the official said.

An army officer near the scene confirmed to Xinhua about the incident, saying: "angered tribesmen attacked a military post guarding the oil field in Hadramout. Fierce armed

confrontations followed the attack."

Last week, attackers of a powerful tribe blew up a major oil pipeline in Yemen's Hadramout, halting the flow of oil.

Yemen has seen frequent attacks by al-Qaida militants and armed tribesmen on oil pipelines as well as the country's main electricity grid.

Yemen's oil production rapidly declined from 400,000 barrels per day at the beginning of the last decade to the current 270,000 barrels per day.

The country's transitional government, which depends on oil exports for up to 70 percent of its budget, has bolstered security measures to protect the pipelines and prevent future attacks.—Xinhua

## Hazard and Torres fire Chelsea to the top

LONDON, 12 Jan — Eden Hazard and Fernando Torres applied the gloss to a workmanlike 2-0 victory at Hull City that lifted Chelsea ominously to the top of the Premier League on Saturday. In true Jose Mourinho style, Chelsea first nullified the minimal threat posed by Hull, then cut through at will after the break when classy goals by Hazard and Torres earned the Blues a fourth consecutive league victory.

Mourinho's side have 46 points, one more than Arsenal who play Aston Villa on Monday and two more than Manchester City who travel to Newcastle on Sunday.

"Do we like to be leaders? Yes, we like, but maybe tomorrow we are second

and maybe Monday we are third," Mourinho said.

"The important thing is that we all know we are going in the right direction."

Everton are also on the up, rising to fourth with 41 points courtesy of a 2-0 home win over Norwich

City and Tottenham Hotspur have 40 in fifth after beating Crystal Palace 2-0.

With Sunderland winning 4-1 at Fulham and West Ham United 2-0 at Cardiff City, Palace now prop up the table.

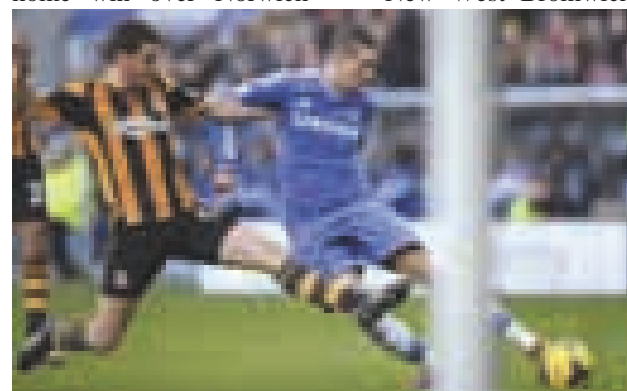

## Suspects for murder in Meiktila detained in police custody

NAY PYI TAW, 12 Jan—A murder occurred in a family in Meiktila in Mandalay Region on 11 January and those three involved were detained in police custody. According to the initial investigation of Myanmar police force, About 5:30 pm yesterday, Aung Zaw Htwe asked his wife Ma Khin Shwe Myint to come back home as she had been staying at the house of Pho Pyu (a) Win Ko Ko, No.1 Street, South Pyithayar Ward in Meiktila since two days ago after quarrelling with him. Pho Pyu scolded Aung Zaw Htwe and Zaw Myo Htwe, younger brother of Aung Zaw Htwe, catapulted Pho Pyu. While Pho Ni (a) Zaw Htet, elder brother of Zaw

Myo Htwe, tried to settle the quarrel, he was stabbed by Pho Pyu and got an injured in his right rib. Aung Zaw Htwe beat Pho Pyu with a stick and stabbed him in his left rib with knife. Pho Pyu died on the spot. Pho Ni is under medical treatment at Meiktila Hospital and Aung Zaw Htwe and Zaw Myo Htwe have been detained at Meiktila Prison.

Security measures are being taken in Meiktila and nearby areas systematically to prevent unwanted problems.

The local authority said it was just a case happened in the family and requested not to believe the rumors created by those who wish to resort to violence, according to the officials.—MNA
