US Republican Rubio backs Abe's push for collective self-defence

Токуо, 21 Jan — US Sen. Marco Rubio, a Republican rumored to be a major candidate for the next presidential election, on Monday threw his support behind Prime Minister Shinzo Abe's initiative to enable Japan to exercise the right of collective self-defense, or defending an ally under armed attack.

Rubio, the ranking member of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee's East Asian and Pacific Affairs Subcommittee, voiced his support in a meeting with Defence Minister Itsunori Onodera in Tokyo, according to a Defence Ministry official.

Rubio was quoted as saying that Japan and the United States must cooperate in "minimizing friction" with Okinawa Prefecture in connection with the planned relocation of the US Marine Corps' Futenma Air Station within the island prefecture.

The meeting came a day after the re-election in Okinawa of the mayor of Nago, who is opposed to a Japan-US accord to relocate the base to the city from densely populated Ginowan, generating a political headache for the Abe government.

Suicide bomb kills four in Hezbollah area of Beirut

suicide bomber killed four people on Tuesday in a residential neighborhood of southern Beirut known for its support of Shi'ite military and political group Hezbollah, security sources said.

A Reuters reporter said she saw the remains of what appeared to be the suicide attacker at the site of the blast as emergency workers transported wounded people from the area, where a similar bombing occurred earlier this month.

Images broadcast on Hezbollah's Al Manar channel showed flames erupting from a building and a thick plume of smoke billowing over a street near the charred remains of cars as a crowd gathered at the site of the blast.

It was not immediately clear what the blast had targeted. The explosion went off on a busy street of small shops and restaurants in the

> Tensions from the nearly three-year conflict in Syria have increasingly infected neighboring Lebanon, which is still struggling to recover from its own 1975-1990 civil war and has been without a fully functioning government since March.

Hezbollah has sent fighters and advisers across the border to help its ally President Bashar al-Assad, a member of the Shi'itederived Alawite minority, in his fight against mainly Sunni rebels.

Hezbollah's strongholds in Lebanon have meanwhile been hit by a string of rocket and bomb attacks claimed by hardline Sunni militants.

The Cabinet is expected to endorse the action plan later in the day.

The economic growth strategy is the "third arrow" of the premier's policies dubbed "Abenomics," The government also along with aggressive monetary easing by the Bank of Japan and massive public spending.

> In June last year, the Cabinet endorsed its growth strategy in an attempt to beat nearly two decades of deflation by beefing up private-sector investment and rebuilding businesses.

To realize the strategy, the government pledged in the action plan to secure

passage of a bill to strengthen the corporate governance system, believing it will help invigorate investment in Japan from abroad.

In the agriculture field, the government said it will end its decadeslong policy of protecting rice farmers by limiting their production from 2018, aiming to stimulate the highly protected sector with an eye on the launch of the US-led Trans-Pacific Partnership free trade framework.

It also decided to set up the US-style National Institute of Health, while allowing companies to enter the retail electricity market from around 2016.

16 Asia-Pacific nations discuss tariffs at 3rd round of free trade talks

Jan — Sixteen Asia-Pacific countries began their third round of free trade talks Tuesday, with tariff-related issues on the agenda.

Negotiators from the 10 ASEAN member states and their six regional partners — Australia, China, India, Japan, New Zealand and South Korea - will hold working group meetings on trade in goods, trade in services, and investment during their four-day gathering.

The Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership framework negotia-

China's chief negotiator Sun Yuanjiang, in his opening remarks as "facilitator" of the six non-ASE-AN countries, said, "We will try to work in very practical and efficient ways so that we can soon achieve our goal." The RCEP negotiation partners aim to wrap up talks by 2015. They held their first round in May last

year in Brunei and the second one in Brisbane, Australia, last September.

The six non-ASEAN comprised of Brunei, Cambodia, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar, the Philippines, Singapore, Thailand and Vietnam.

The latest session comes after the 12 countries involved in the Trans-Pacific Partnership free trade talks, led by the United States, missed a 2013 deadline for sealing a pact.

Abe leaves for Davos to join World **Economic** Forum

Токуо, 21 Јап Prime Minister Shinzo Abe left for Switzerland on Tuesday to attend the World Economic Forum in Davos, where he will brief other leaders and business people on Japan's policies to revive the economy by ending its nearly two decades of deflation.

Abe will become the country's first prime minister to join the opening session of the annual forum on Wednesday, delivering a keynote speech.

He will speak about his structural reforms particularly aimed at wooing foreign investment to Japan, according to Japanese officials.

Tokyo is stepping up efforts to end persistent deflation through the socalled "Abenomics" policy mix of monetary and fiscal stimulus as well as a growth strategy including deregulation and corporate tax easing.

Abe is also expected to hold talks with some other participants on the sidelines of the event, such as prominent international investor George Soros. Abe will return home Thursday.

Kerry to meet Israeli, Palestinian

WASHINGTON, 21 Jan— US Secretary of State John Kerry will meet Israeli negotiators in Washington on Monday and Palestinian officials later next week in US-brokered peace talks to end their decades-long conflict, the State Department said.

Kerry and US negotiator Martin Indyk will meet with Israeli justice minister Tzipi Livni and envoy Itzik Molho later on Monday "to continue the discussion on a framework for negotiations," the State Department said in a statement.

Meetings between Indyk and Livni, who heads the Israeli negotiating team, will continue on Tuesday when Kerry travels to Switzerland for a Syria peace conference. "We expect the Palestinian negotiating team to travel to Washington early next week," the State Department said.

Israeli-Palestinian negotiations resumed in July after a three-year halt, with Kerry leading the push

US offers to send envoy to North Korea to free jailed missionary

SEOUL, 21 Jan — The United States has offered to send a special envoy to North Korea to win the release of a jailed missionary, but signaled that any meaningful resumption of denuclearization talks required Pyongyang to give up its pursuit of nuclear weapons.

Kenneth Bae, 45, has been held for more than a year by the North which convicted him of trying to overthrow the state and sentenced him to 15 years hard labour. Bae, a Korean American, was paraded in front of a group of foreign and local reporters on Monday and asked Washington to help him get home, the North's state news agency and foreign media based in Pyongyang reported.

"We hope this decision by DPRK (Democratic People's Republic of Korea) authorities to allow

Kenneth Bae to meet with reporters signals their willingness to release him," a US official, speaking on condition of anonymity, told Reuters on Monday.

"We have offered to send Ambassador King to Pyongyang to secure Mr. Bae's release. We have asked the North Koreans this, and await their early response," the official added.-Reuters

Palestinians see a major obstacle in Israel's settlements of the occupied West Bank where they seek statehood. Many Israelis doubt Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas's credibility as a peace partner, especially as Gaza, the

other Palestinian territory, is governed by rival Hamas Islamists who oppose peacemaking.

While details of the talks have been kept secret, Kerry has often said progress is being made in the talks. But both Israel and the Palestinians have predicted the nine-month target date for a deal will not be met.

Vitamin D could slow multiple sclerosis

WASHINGTON, 21 Jan — Patients in the early stages of multiple sclerosis (MS) could "stave off disease symptoms" by increasing their vitamin D intake, US researchers said on Monday. The study, published in the US journal JAMA Neurology, found that levels of vitamin D were strongly associated with disease severity and speed of progression in early-stage MS patients.

"Because low vitamin D levels are common and can be easily and safely increased by oral supplementation, these findings may contribute to better outcomes for many MS patients," said lead author Alberto Ascherio, professor of epidemiology and nutrition at the Harvard School of Public Health.

Multiple sclerosis is a central nervous system disease that causes problems with muscle control and strength, vision, balance, feeling, and thinking. The World Health Organization estimated that roughly 2.5 million people in the world have the disease. The researchers analyzed data from 465 MS patients from 18 European countries, as well as Israel and Canada who enrolled in 2002 and 2003 in a trial looking at the

effectiveness of the drug interferon beta-1b in treating the disease.

D Vitamin levels were measured at the onset of their symptoms and at regular intervals over a 24-month period. The results were then correlated with their disease symptoms and progression over a period of five years. They found that early-stage MS patients who had adequate levels of vitamin D had a 57 percent lower rate of new brain lesions, a 57 percent lower relapse rate, and a 25 percent lower yearly increase in lesion volume than those with lower levels of vitamin




D. Loss in brain volume, which is an important predictor of disability, was also lower among patients with adequate vitamin D levels. The results suggest that vitamin D has a strong protective effect on the disease process underlying MS, and underscore the importance of correcting vitamin D insufficiency, which is widespread in Europe and the US, the researchers said.

"The benefits of vitamin D appeared to be additive to those of interferon beta-1b, a drug that is very effective in reducing MS activity," said Ascherio. "The findings of our study indicate that identifying and correcting vitamin D insufficiency should become part of the standard of care for newly diagnosed MS patients." —*Xinhua*

Saliva reveals asthmatic kids' smoke exposure

New York, 21 Jan — Asthmatic children who are exposed to cigarette smoke are more likely to make repeat trips to the hospital for breathing problems. But researchers say asking parents about kids' smoke exposure may not yield the most reliable information. In a recent study, saliva revealed exposure to tobacco smoke in roughly 80 percent of children brought to the hospital for asthma or breathing problems. But only about a third of parents said their children came in contact with smoke.

What's more, finding evidence of nicotine, a chemical in tobacco, in chil-

ing cessation tools while the child is hospitalized. For the new study, the researchers assessed data from 619 children admitted to Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center for asthma or other breathing problems between August 2010 and October 2011.—*Reuters*

FDI attraction to Vietnam's HCM City hits over 2 bln USD in 2013

Ho CHI MINH CITY, 21 Jan — Foreign direct investment (FDI) inflows to Vietnam's southern economic hub Ho Chi Minh (HCM) City increased 52 percent in 2013, reaching over 2 billion US dollars, reported the City's Department of Planning and Investment on its website on Tuesday.

Of this, 1.05 billion dollars was invested in 477 new projects, an increase of 76.7 percent from the previous year, and another 305 million dollars went to 102 science and technology projects. Despite challenges facing the real estate sector, 147 million US dollars was invested in 10 property projects. Meanwhile, 67 FDI projects, with a total registered capital of 436.7 million dollars, were relocated to other provinces and cities or shut down.

There are 4,924 operational FDI projects in the city now, with a total registered capital of 33.5 billion dollars. Singapore accounted for the largest amount of investment in 2013, followed by Malaysia and South Korea.

China an example of stability leading to industrial development



VIENNA, 21 Jan — Stability is vital for industrialization, economic development and prosperity, United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO) Director General Li Yong said in Vienna on Monday.

He made the statements as part of UNIDO's 2013 report at the National Bank of Austria (OeNB), and made particular reference to his home country of China, where GDP growth has risen sharply over the past 40 years.

He said the Chinese government has contributed to stability with its economic policy, and combined with cooperation with international organizations and foreign direct investment, China's economy has been propelled forward.

That areas of industry had moved from China to other Asian countries such as Bangladesh and Cambodia were good things, he added, and fell in line with the 2013 report, which mentions that all countries should strive for production with higher complexity and value-added in the course of industrialization.

OeNB governor Ewald Nowotny said industry contributes significantly to the growth of countries, and that the most recent economic crisis showed countries with less industrialization fared worse than those with more such as Austria and Germany.—Xinhua

SYDNEY, 21 Jan — Abraxane, a chemotherapy drug for breast cancer, can be used in combination with the standard treatment to help pancreatic cancer patients live longer, an Australian study revealed on Tuesday. Aus-



trials of the drug combined with the standard treatment are encouraging.

The research found four percent of patients with advanced pancreatic cancer treated with the combination had survived for three years, compared with zero survival for those on only the standard treatment, gemcitabine.

The trial conducted at sites around the world involved 861 patients, including 120 Australians. Each year, around 2,500 people are diagnosed with the deadly disease in Australia, with only six percent of them surviving five years. Pancreatic cancer is hard to detect early and people diagnosed after it has spread are likely to die within six months.

Spacecraft Rosetta roused from slumber on comet-chasing quest

Frankfurt, 21 Jan — Comet-chasing spacecraft Rosetta woke from nearly three years of hibernation on Monday to complete a decade-long deep space mission that scientists hope will help unlock some of the secrets of the solar system. Rosetta, which was launched by the European Space Agency (ESA) in 2004, is due to rendezvous with comet 67P/

Churyumov-Gerasimenko a chance to understand how and land a probe on it this year in an unprecedented maneuver. Scientists hope data the probe gathers will allow them to peek into a kind of astronomical time capsule that has preserved for millions of years clues as to what the world looked like when our solar system was born. "Since comets are so primitive, they can give scientists

the solar system formed, where it came from," Rosetta spacecraft operations manager Andrea Accomazzo told Reuters ahead of the wakeup call.

On its way to the comet, a roughly 3 by 5 km-large rock discovered in 1969, Rosetta has been circling the sun on a widening spiral course, swinging past Earth and Mars to pick up speed and adjust its trajectory. The mission will perform several historical firsts, including the first time a spacecraft orbits a comet rather than just whizzing by it to snap some fly-by pictures, and the first time a probe has landed on a comet's nucleus. Rosetta is also the first mission to venture beyond the main asteroid belt relying solely on solar cells for power generation, which is also why it had to be put into a deep sleep for 957 days. "It has been so far away from the sun that the solar

rays were not able to generate enough energy to safely operate the spacecraft," said Accomazzo, who has been working on the Rosetta mission since 1997. Accomazzo is based at the ESA's satellite operations in the German town of Darmstadt, south of Frankfurt.

Having neared the sun again as it tracks the comet on its elliptical orbit around the sun, Rosetta was gently awakened by its internal alarm clock at 1000 GMT on Monday. It then warmed up its systems and transmitted a sign of life — a radio signal - to its creators on Earth. Once it is fully up and running, it will start to approach the comet. By August, it should catch up with it and land its probe on it in November. Until the end of 2015, the probe will gather data on the comet's surface and examine how it changes as its nears the sun.

Phone-free Nokia under pressure to boost network sales

Helsinki, 21 Jan — Nokia is expected to show a steep fall in network equipment sales in its results this week, highlighting the challenge facing management after selling its once mighty handset division to Microsoft for 5.4 billion euros (\$7.3 billion). Improved profitability at Nokia Solutions and Networks (NSN) due to cost cutting have helped cushion the company's declining handset business in recent quarters.

But with major projects in South Korea and Japan coming to an end, the NSN business, the bulk of Nokia's entire business after the handsets sale, is expected to report a 19 percent fall in fourth-quarter sales to 3.2 billion euros and a 17 percent fall for the whole of 2013 to 11.4 billion euros.

Results are due on Thursday. The decline for NSN would follow a 26 percent fall in third-quarter sales and come as scale has become increasingly crucial to competing against the industry leader for wireless networks, Ericsson, and China's Huawei, particularly due to high

research and development costs. NSN's chief Rajeev Suri, in an interview with Reuters in November, confirmed the company was now prioritizing revenue growth even if it meant a trade-off in profit.

Analysts said NSN must demonstrate that shift in coming quarters, and that markets will accept a dip in margins as long as they don't fall too far below 8 to 10 percent. NSN's fourthquarter adjusted operating margin is still likely to be high.

The company forecast it will be around 12 percent, plus or minus 4 percentage points, compared with 8 percent in the third quarter.

That's higher than most rivals such as Ericsson, which reported an 8 percent operating margin last quarter as NSN's restructuring programme launched in late 2011 cut a quarter of its workforce and took the business out of low-margin projects.

"It is possible that we won't be seeing such high margins this year, but I'd rather see them starting to grow again," said Inderes Equity Research analyst Mikael Rautanen.—Reuters



Moreover, there were growing concerns about insecurity while going out at night and acts that could lead to a conflict between ward dwellers and squatters. So, there had been a number of public protests held by locals to take measures for ensuring the rule of law and community peace and tranquility.

Before launching the clearance campaign, local authorities announced removal of squatters by pinning a public notice to the wall, making an announcement over loudspeaker and setting up signpost saying to stop squatting for illegal settlement. Some were demolished in their own ways, but about 102 squatted huts remained up to date.-MNA

West Virginia looks to tighten rules after chemical spill contaminated water

New York, 21 Jan — West Virginia's governor on Monday proposed legislation to regulate aboveground storage tanks, a move that comes after a spill of coal-processing chemicals shut off drinking water to about 300,000 people.

Governor Earl Ray Tomblin said the proposed rules would regulate above-

ground tanks, including those near public water supplies and distribution systems.

"The discharge of chemicals or other contaminants into our water supply is unacceptable and will not be tolerated," Tomblin, a Democrat, said in a joint statement with US Senator Joe Manchin, also a Democrat, and the heads of the

Sarajevo, 21 Jan — Police in Bosnia and Herzegovina (BiH) on Monday arrested a man suspected of sending a threatening letter to BiH institutions.

The man, born in 1976, was arrested in Zavidovici in eastern part of BiH, police said. He admitted sending a letter to BiH institutions with a threat to attack BiH and international organizations in the country, local media reported.

Tomblin said the legislation would in part assure that above-ground tanks were built and maintained in line with safety standards. About 300,000 people around Charleston, the state capital, were banned from using tap water for anything but flushing toilets following the January 9 spill 4-methylcyclohexane of methanol, or crude MCHM, into the Elk River.

The spill from a Freedom Industries tank was about a mile upriver from the area's main water plant, West Virginia American Water, a unit of American Water Works Company Inc.

Tomblin declared a state of emergency while the chemical, used in coal processing, was flushed out of the water system.

West Virginia authorities completely lifted the ban on the use of tap water on Saturday, but advised pregnant women to continue using alternative water sources.

Tomblin said the legislation would allow the state Department of Environmental Protection to implement an above-ground tank regulation program that would require operators to report tanks' location, construction and maintenance.

It also requires annual inspections and certifications and allows the head of the environmental agency to order a plant to take corrective action when storing potentially harmful material. Plants also would have to submit spill prevention plans for each tank.

Tomblin said the legislation would not duplicate state and federal regulations. Freedom Industries, a maker of specialty chemicals, filed for Chapter 11 bankruptcy protection on Friday.-Reuters

Syria's oil production drops amid long-standing crisis

DAMASCUS, 21 Jan rorist attacks dramatically increased in 2013 on oil and gas infrastructure, causing a retreat in production and a difficulty in transporting oil to areas of consumption.

The minister added that the total crude gas produced in Syria in 2013 was estimated at 17 million cubic meters a day.

Meanwhile, the Minister of Domestic Trade and **Consumer Protection Samir** Qadhi Amin said recently that despite the rising prices of oil derivatives, these oil and gas materials are still subsidized by the govern-

He was quoted by the pro-government al-Watan *newspaper* as saying that Syria now only produced

four percent of its former productive capacity, adding that the government imports the remaining required quantity from abroad.

He said that Syria has remarkably increased the real government subsidy for these oil derivatives, revealing that the value of the government's support of oil derivatives amounted to 226.18 billion Syrian pounds, or two billion US dollars, in 2013.

The oil sector was a pillar of Syria's economy ahead of the outbreak of events, with the country producing about 380,000 barrels, exporting around 130,000 barrels a day and putting the rest under domestic use.—Xinhua

The UN chief said in a statement that he congratulates Samba- Panza on her election and "looks forward to the nomination of a new Prime Minister in the coming days." "The change of leadership in the CAR offers a critical opportunity to put the transition process back on track," Ban said.

In the meantime, Ban remains "extremely concerned" about the ongoing sectarian violence in the country, where some 2.6 million people need humanitarian assistance. He urged countries to immediately deliver on international pledges made earlier in the day. Nearly half a billion US dollars were pledged for the CAR on Monday at militia.—Xinhua

Japan gains consent to extend oil rights for offshore oilfield in UAE

Abu Dhabi, 21 Jan — Japan on Monday secured the consent of the United Arab Emirates to extend oil rights for an offshore oilfield for 15 years beyond their expiration in 2026, Japanese officials said. The agreement on the Upper Zakum Field, owned by one of the group companies of Inpex Corp, was reached during talks between Japanese Economy, Trade and Industry Minister Toshimitsu Motegi and Abu Dhabi's Crown Prince Sheikh Mohammed bin Zayed Al Nahyan.

The United Arab Emirates is the second-largest crude oil supplier to resource-scarce Japan, after Saudi Arabia. Of Japan's imports of oil produced at overseas fields in which Japanese companies have rights, 40 percent is produced off the coast of Abu Dhabi.

Singapore to give police temporary powers specific to riot-hit neighbourhood

SINGAPORE, 21 Jan -Singapore government introduced a new bill in the parliament on Monday that will give police officers specific temporary powers needed to maintain law and order in a neighbourhood that was hit by a riot of foreign workers in December.

The temporary bill seeks to give law enforcement officers the power to search and interview individuals entering the area for alcohol and prohibited items, and give officers the power to ban individuals from being in the area during specified times if their presence is deemed to potentially threaten public order.

Officers will also be granted the power to swiftly cancel or suspend the business license of licensees suspected to have flouted the law.

The legislation is pro-

posed to last for up to one year, and it covers only the Little India area where an alcohol ban has been enacted following the riot.

"This will provide sufficient time for my ministry to enact longer term legislation to take into account the findings and recommendations of the Committee of Inquiry (COI), and recommendations arising from public consultations on the review of the liquor licensing regime," Deputy Minister and Minister for Home Affairs Teo Chee Hean said in the parliament.

The Committee of Inquiry was appointed in December following the riot in Little India to investigate into the cause of the incident. It was also tasked to make recommendations to prevent such incidents from happening again.



'Gravity,' 12 Years a Slave' share Hollywood producers' top prize

BEVERLY HILLS, 21 corruption caper "Ameri-Jan — Hollywood producers injected drama into the race for Oscars on Sunday by choosing not one but two movies as their best films of the year, the space thriller "Gravity" and the slavery drama "12 Years a Slave".

It is the first time the Producers Guild of America has declared a tie in the 25-year history of its awards. The PGA has correctly chosen the eventual Academy Award winner for best picture for the last six years, including Iranian hostage drama "Argo" a year ago.

The PGA decision clashes with that of the Screen Actors Guild (SAG), which on Saturday chose the 1970s-set

can Hustle" from director David O Russell for its top prize, best film ensemble cast.

But SAG has a mixed record on foreshadowing the Oscar best picture with its ensemble cast award, correctly predicting the Academy Award in six of the last 10 years.

Nevertheless, after an intense week of awards, the Oscars are shaping up to be a three-way race between these films. "American Hustle", with its strong performance, and "Gravity", with its technical innovation, lead nominations with 10 nods a piece, while "12 Years a Slave" and its brutal depiction of pre-Civil War slavery in the United States has nine.



"I'm glad I looked (calm)," she said, when asked how she dealt with the delay. "We'd just had a tough game. I tried to keep fighting and play aggressive and I think I stepped it up in the third set."

Having upset Williams, Ivanovic went into the match as favorite but looked to be feeling the pressure as she tried to reach her first grand slam semi-final since she won the French Open in 2008.

A missed smash by Bouchard handed Ivanovic the break for 4-3 and though they then traded two more breaks apiece, Ivanovic clinched her fourth set point to go ahead.—Reuters

China to boost education for disabled children

BEIJING, 21 Jan — The Chinese government has vowed to ensure that at least 90 percent of children with visual, hearing and intellectual disabilities receive primary and middle school education by the end of 2016, according to a plan publicized on Monday.

According to a 2014-2016 plan on improving education for learners with special needs, the country will increase investment, build more infrastructure, foster more quality teachers and reform special education curricula.

The plan was jointly mapped out by seven departments, including the ministries of education, civil affairs and finance, based on inspections and surveys across the country.

"Despite obvious development in recent years, our country's special education work in general is still at a low level and suffers from regional imbalance," the Ministry of Education (MOE) said in a statement accompanying the plan.

Official figures show that compulsory education, which includes primary and middle school, only covered 71.9 percent of disabled children as of the end of 2012, compared with 99.5 percent of stand-

ard primary schools and 98 percent of middle schools.

The three-year plan stipulates that disabled children should attend the nearest possible standard schools, special education knowledge should be incorporated into exams for teachers' certificates, and that higher education institutes should not refuse admission for learners because of their disabilities.

According to the MOE, government departments will review the progress of local authorities in improving special education as well as the implementation of related policies.

Cyclone causes chaos across New Zealand's **North Island**

WELLINGTON, 21 Jan — Thousands of households and businesses across New Zealand's largest city of Auckland were left without power on Tuesday as the tail of Cyclone June swept across the upper North Island. Severe gales hit the city on Tuesday, with thunderstorms and heavy rain take extreme care and to forecast to strike other parts of New Zealand later in the day, Radio New Zealand reported.

Radio New Zealand reported there had been no reports of injuries.—Xinhua

Melbourne, 21 Jan China's Li Na allowed herself a small smile of satisfaction after she advanced to her fourth Australian Open semi-final on Tuesday, mindful that an inquisition from coach Carlos Rodriguez earlier in the tournament had helped her get there.

The 31-year-old, who has reached two of the last three finals at Melbourne Park, blasted the 28th-seeded Flavia Pennetta off the court with a 6-2, 6-2 win on Tuesday with a strong first serve and barrage of powerful ground strokes.



Thai government declares state of emergency as protests drag on

BANGKOK, 21 Jan— The Thai government on Tuesday declared a 60-day state of emergency to start on Wednesday, saying it wanted to prevent any escalation in more than two months of protests aimed at forcing Prime Minister Ms. Yingluck Shinawatra from power.

The decree, which applies to Bangkok and surrounding provinces, gives security agencies the power to impose curfews, detain suspects without charge, censor media, ban political gatherings of more than five people and declare parts of the capital off-limits.

"We need it because the protesters have closed

government buildings, banks and escalated the situation, which has caused injuries and deaths. The government sees the need to announce the emergency decree to keep the situation under control," Labour Minister Chalerm Yoobamrung told a nationally televised news conference.

The government had no plans to try to disperse protesters during the night, he added, without elaborating.

He was speaking after a cabinet meeting which had to be held at air force headquarters in the north of Bangkok because the protesters have for weeks prevented Yingluck using her offices in Government
