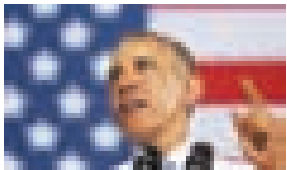

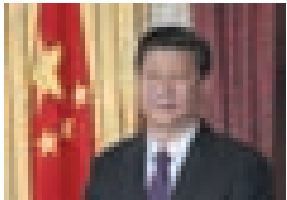

Thanks to purchase of new fire engines, it will enable to put fire outbreaks in time whenever fire break out and reduce damages that occur due to fire. The fire brigade also will have a chance to prevent the fire that can occur in any time or any season in advance.

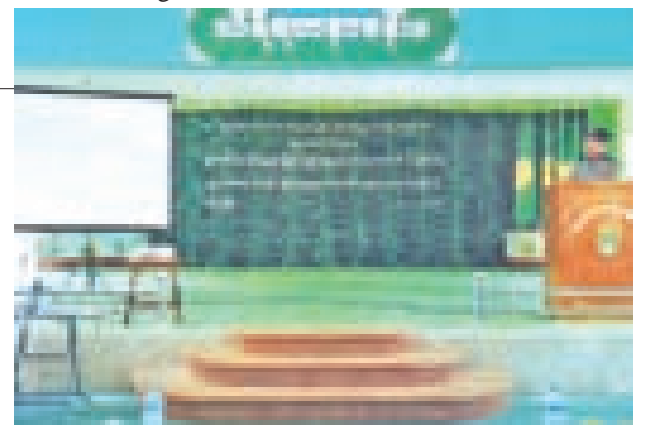

## White House: Obama awaits more Keystone reviews; timing unclear

WASHINGTON, 3 Feb — US President Barack Obama still wants to hear from other federal agencies before deciding whether to accept the State Department's finding that the Keystone XL pipeline would have no major impact on climate change, his top aide said on Sunday.

White House Chief of Staff Denis McDonough said Obama would decide once the Environmental Protection Agency, Energy Department and other fed-

eral experts offer their assessments of the State Department review, as well as their own analysis.

But McDonough offered no word how soon Obama may rule. Pressure on Obama to approve the project mounted on Friday with the release of the State Department report, which concluded the pipeline's impact on climate change would not be significant.

Backers argue that the State Department's find-

ings should clear the way for prompt approval of a bid by TransCanada Corp to build the \$5.4 billion project, which would transport crude from Alberta's oil sands to refineries on the US Gulf Coast.

Appearing on NBC's "Meet the Press" and CBS's "Face the Nation," McDonough said the president's top concern remains the environment, not election-year politics.

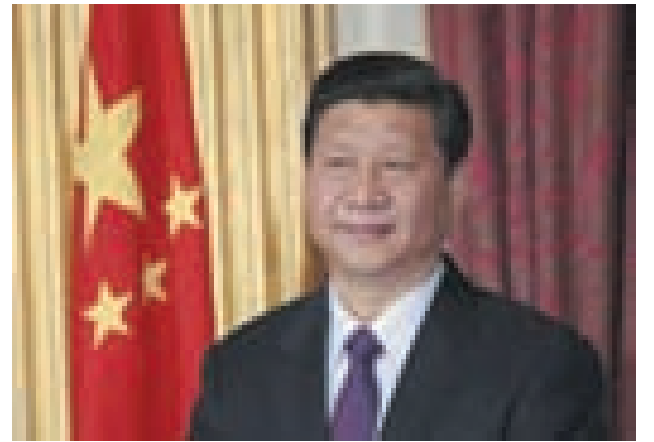
## Xi's Sochi visit to deepen Sino-Russian ties

BEIJING, 3 Feb — Russia, for the second time, will be Chinese President Xi Jinping's first foreign destination of a year.

In March 2013, Xi took a state visit to Russia a few days after he took office as Chinese President. Xi's announced Russian stay from 6 to 8 February and scheduled attendance to the opening ceremony of the Sochi Winter Olympic

ident and Russian President Putin met four times at international events.

They were the BRICS summit in Durban of South Africa, the G20 summit in St Petersburg of Russia, the Shanghai Cooperation Organization summit in Bishkek of Kyrgyzstan and the informal economic leaders' meeting of the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation in Bali of Indonesia.

Games will be his first foreign trip in 2014. It will also be the first attendance by a Chinese president at a major overseas sports event, signaling China's strong support for the Olympics and Russia's efforts to host the games.

Vladimir Putin, then Russian Prime Minister, attended the opening ceremony of the Beijing Olympics in August 2008.

Prof Yuri Tavorovsky at the Moscow-based Peoples' Friendship University of Russia, told *Xinhua* that it is a new step of bilateral ties that state leaders extend their interactions from traditional diplomatic occasions to less formal ones such as cultural and sports events.

Last year, besides Xi's state visit, the Chinese pres-

In addition, Russian Prime Minister Dmitry Medvedev visited China in October, holding meetings with President Xi and Premier Li Keqiang. Li Hui, Chinese ambassador to Russia, told *Xinhua* that President Xi's state visit last year opened a new page and brought the bilateral relations to a new height.

The two countries have displayed mutual support and understanding on issues that are vital to each other, Ambassador Li said.

As the two neighbouring countries mark the 65th anniversary of the establishment of their diplomatic relations in 2014, they are forging stronger and closer ties, under a comprehensive strategic cooperative partnership.

## Sri Lanka rejects 'reckless' US criticism of its rights record

COLOMBO, 3 Feb — Sri Lanka rejected US criticism of its human rights record as "grossly disproportionate" on Sunday, a day after a senior US official said Washington would table a UN resolution against Colombo.

Assistant Secretary of State Nisha Biswal expressed frustration on Saturday over Sri Lanka's

failure to punish military personnel responsible for atrocities in a civil war that the government won in 2009 against separatist Tamil rebels. Biswal, speaking in Colombo after a two-day visit, said the United States would table a third UN human rights resolution against Sri Lanka in March to address the war crimes allegations as its hu-

man rights climate has been worsening.

"The (US) claims... are unsubstantiated. Reckless and irresponsible statements without evidence have been resorted to in order to create an impact to give way to prejudged action," Sri Lanka's External Affairs Ministry said in a statement. In her criticism, Biswal also referred to attacks on mosques and churches on the island and said some Sri Lankans felt unable to practice their faith "freely and without fear". Sri Lanka's majority Sinhalese are largely Buddhist and its ethnic Tamil minority is mainly Hindu. The country also has small

Christian and Muslim minorities. The ministry said claims of religious intolerance were based on an attempt to present isolated incidents as commonplace."

Attributing blame to the government is totally unwarranted. While legal action has been taken with regard to some incidents, others have been settled amicably. Therefore, the criticism is grossly disproportionate and politically motivated," it said.

President Mahinda Rajapaksa's government, which finally crushed the 26-year rebellion by the Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE) in 2009, has rejected calls for an international inquiry, saying these were aimed at pleasing a large Tamil diaspora living in Western countries.

Senior US officials declined to say what would be in the planned UN resolution, but US embassy officials said it may repeat the call for an international investigation in Sri Lanka.

## Ukraine frees tortured activist as president returns to work

KIEV, 3 Feb — The Ukrainian government bowed to intense Western pressure on Sunday to let an opposition activist fly abroad for treatment after his abduction, torture and then attempted arrest by police outraged critics of President Viktor Yanukovich.

The embattled head of state, caught in a tug of war between Russia and the West and facing mass protests that have prompted fears of civil war, announced he would return from four days of sick leave on Monday. It was unclear whether he might resume hesitant moves toward compromise or hit back at his opponents.

Either way, he is under scrutiny from the European Union and United States, who want him to compromise, and from Moscow, which is holding back much

needed financing until he names a new government following last week's departure of his prime minister in a concession that failed to appease the protesters.

Dmytro Bulatov, 35, whose bloodied face and account of being "crucified" during a week in the hands

of mysterious kidnappers has dominated opposition media since Friday, flew to EU state Lithuania. Intense negotiations with Western diplomats had led to a court lifting a charge of "mass disorder" against him, on which police had tried to arrest him at a Kiev clinic.

## Nankai Trough quake could hit maximum on intensity scale in Nagoya

NAGOYA, 3 Feb — A powerful quake registering up to magnitude 9 predicted to occur in the Nankai Trough off central and western Japan could reach the highest intensity level of 7 on the Japanese seismic scale in areas surrounding the port of Nagoya, the city government warned on Monday.

The earthquake could measure upper 6 in the western half of the city, which includes JR Nagoya Station, and a tsunami up to 3.6 metres high could

engulf the port. The central Japan city with a population of 2.27 million also said ground liquefaction could occur in areas surrounding the station. The municipality released the worst-case scenario based on projections made earlier by the central government.

The city said a 3.6-metre tsunami could reach the port in as little as 96 minutes after the quake hits. A combined 7,700 hectares centering on the city's southwestern part, or about one-fourth of the city area,

could be flooded by water at a depth of 1 cm or over, the city cautioned. The estimated flooded area is larger than the central government projection.

The city is scheduled to release in March its estimates for the human and economic cost of a Nankai Trough quake. The Nankai Trough runs from Suruga Bay in Shizuoka Prefecture, central Japan, to Hyuganada off Miyazaki Prefecture in the southwestern Japan region of Kyushu.

## No evidence seen that Christie knew of traffic scheme

NEW YORK, 3 Feb — A New Jersey Democrat leading a probe of the bridge traffic scandal that has engulfed Governor Chris Christie said on Sunday he has seen no evidence to support claims that the governor had been aware of the apparently politically motivated traffic jams as they happened. The remarks by Assemblyman John Wisniewski, who co-leads the probe, came two days after a former Christie appointee at the agency overseeing the bridge who personally oversaw the lane closures said “evidence exists” that Christie had knowledge of the blockage when it happened.

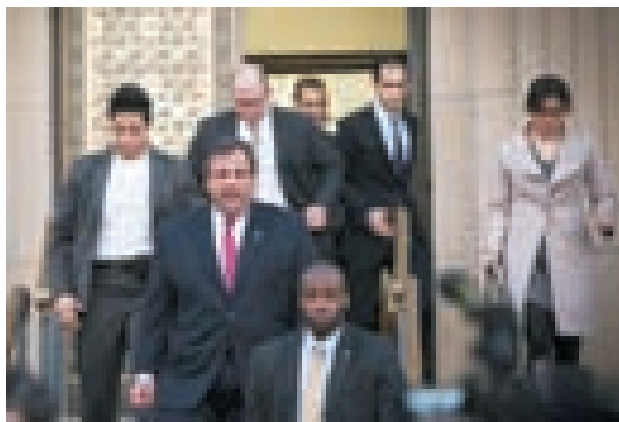
If such evidence does

exist, a state panel investigating the closures has not yet seen it, Wisniewski said. Separately on Sunday, Christie’s director of intergovernmental affairs, Christina Renna, resigned. Renna’s lawyer, Henry E Klingeman, confirmed to *Reuters* that she had resigned, effective on 31 January. Klingeman also said that Renna was among several top aides who have until Monday to respond to subpoenas in the scandal. However, in a statement provided by Klingeman, Renna said she had been considering leaving since shortly after Christie’s re-election last fall.

“I have spent almost

four years working hard for a Governor I continue to respect and admire,” Renna said in the statement. “The transition from term one to term two is a natural time to pursue an opportunity in the private sector.” Christie, who is considered a leading Republican candidate for the White House in 2016, has repeatedly denied any knowledge of a plan to snarl traffic last September in Fort Lee, New Jersey, near the busy George Washington Bridge that connects New Jersey and New York City and severed ties with several top aides over their role in the incident.

Christie has been dogged by scandal for

more than a month since it emerged that several of his top aides and appointees called for lane closures leading to the busiest bridge in the United States, apparently as retribution against the Democratic mayor of Fort Lee for not endorsing the governor’s re-election

campaign. Christie has repeatedly denied having any knowledge of the scheme and dismissed two of his top aides for their roles in it. Still, the scandal has hurt his image and recent polls show him losing ground as a potential presidential contender.—*Reuters*

## Dollar trades in lower 102 yen zone in early Tokyo deals

TOKYO, 3 Feb — The US dollar traded in the lower 102 yen zone early Monday morning in Tokyo, rising slightly from its levels in New York on Friday.

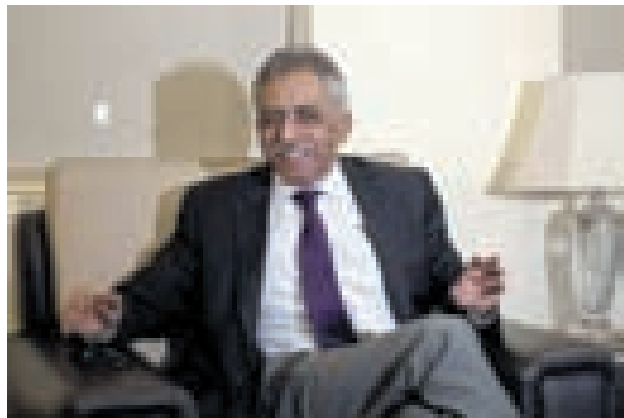
At 9 am, the dollar fetched 102.23-27 yen compared with 101.96-102.06 yen in New York and 102.48-50 yen in Tokyo at 5 pm on Friday.

The euro was quoted at \$1.3487-3487 and 137.88-90 yen against \$1.3481-3491 and 137.64-74 yen in New York and \$1.3542-3544 and 138.78-82 yen in Tokyo late Friday afternoon.

In New York on Friday, persistent concerns over instability in emerging economies prompted market participants to buy the yen for the dollar as a safe haven, dealers said.

A fall in US long-term interest rates also led to dollar selling on expectations that the interest rate gap between Japan and the United States will narrow, they said. — *Kyodo News*

## Pakistan’s privatization tsar embarks on quest to revive economy

ISLAMABAD, 3 Feb — Mohammad Zubair was on a cruise dinner with Pakistani Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif in Thailand when he was offered the hardest job of his life: privatizing a huge chunk of the economy while fighting resistance from the opposition and trade unions. When the prime minister left the table, a colleague of former IBM executive Zubair rushed to his side.

“Are you mad? Three privatization ministers have gone to jail and most have corruption cases hanging over their heads,” he said. “Don’t take this job.”

But Pakistan’s new privatization tsar is determined to find buyers for 68 public companies, most of them loss-making, including two gas companies, an oil company, about 10 banks, the national airline and power distribution companies — all within the next two years.

The government sees

the sell-offs as a life saver for Pakistan’s \$225 billion economy crippled by power shortages, corruption and militant violence. Successful privatization is Sharif’s top political and economic goal.

“We lose 500 billion rupees (\$5 billion) annually because of failing enterprises,” Zubair told *Reuters*. “Every day a file lands on a bureaucrat’s desk and he has to take a decision he isn’t qualified to.

This can’t go on, no matter what.” Pakistan can raise up to \$5 billion in privatization revenue in the next two years to ease pressure on strained public finance, Zubair said.

Last September, the International Monetary Fund saved Pakistan from a possible default by agreeing to lend it \$6.7 billion over three years. In return, Pakistan must make good on a longstanding promise to privatize loss-making state companies.—*Reuters*

## Iraqi army bombards Falluja in preparation for ground assault

BAGHDAD, 3 Feb — The Iraqi army intensified its shelling of Falluja on Sunday in preparation for a ground assault to regain control of the city, which has been under the control of militants for a month. Sunni Muslim anti-government fighters, among them insurgents linked to al-Qaeda, overran Falluja in the western province of Anbar on 1 January, against a backdrop of deteriorating security across Iraq.

Prime Minister Nuri al-Maliki, whose Shi’ite-led government many in the Sunni minority accuse of discrimination, had held off an all-out offensive to give local tribesmen a chance to expel the militants themselves. But security officials told *Reuters* on

Saturday that a decision had been made to enter Falluja on Sunday.

“Orders have been issued to start shelling the city with artillery and planes to detect the potential abilities of militants inside Falluja and try to find a gap to get into the city,” a top security official told *Reuters* on Sunday.

Troops and tribal fighters are stationed in their positions just 15 minutes outside Falluja.” The official said militants had planted roadside bombs along the main roads into the city, and the army would use different routes to enter.

Earlier on Sunday, security officials said Maliki had received phone calls from the ambassadors of several countries in the

region urging him not to storm the city, but preparations were going ahead nonetheless.

“We have finished all our preparations and are waiting for the final say, which must come from Maliki himself,” said a senior military commander.

## US immigration bill ‘in doubt’ this year, Republican Ryan says

WASHINGTON, 3 Feb — Republicans will be unlikely to compromise on immigration reform unless US borders are first secured, and the possibility of a broad immigration bill reaching President Barack Obama’s desk this year is “clearly

in doubt,” Representative Paul Ryan said on Sunday. “Security first, no amnesty, then we might be able to get somewhere,” Ryan said on ABC’s “This Week.”

Immigration reform legislation, which the Senate has already passed, has

stalled in the Republican-controlled House. Ryan’s comments follow a House document released last week that presents a path toward legal status for 11 million undocumented workers now in the United States. The plan, rolled out by House Republican leaders, outlines “principles” for immigration reform and embraces an agenda that gives their candidates a campaign message that goes beyond political attacks on Obama.

Asked if Obama would get a bill to sign this year, Ryan replied: “I really

don’t know the answer to that question. That’s clearly in doubt.” It remains unclear if the House principles will advance any further amid deep Republican divisions. The principles are seen as gauging the party’s willingness to tackle such a controversial issue during an election year, when all 435 House seats are at stake. Last June, the Senate passed a comprehensive bill that would provide a path to citizenship for the approximately 11 million immigrants living in the United States illegally and tighten border security.—*Reuters*

## New Orleans Mayor Mitch Landrieu wins re-election

NEW ORLEANS, 3 Feb — New Orleans Mayor Mitch Landrieu won re-election to a second term on Saturday bolstered by a public perception the post-Hurricane Katrina recovery has created jobs and improved the local economy. Landrieu had 64 percent of the vote, with all precincts reporting, according to preliminary results from the website of the Louisiana secretary of state.

Landrieu needed more than 50 percent of the vote to avoid a runoff election and win another four-year term. His nearest challenger,

state court Judge Michael Bagneris, had 33 percent of the vote. Race played a role in the election in the mostly black city, with Landrieu who is white, saying his policies have benefited all, while his opponents said the needs of impoverished blacks have been mostly ignored.

In the end, Landrieu, 53, a scion of one of the state's pre-eminent Democratic political families, appeared to have benefited from the strong base of support for his efforts to rebuild the Crescent City from the

destruction inflicted by Hurricane Katrina in 2005. Landrieu addressed his jubilant supporters at his election night headquarters on Saturday. "We have come a very, very long way together," Landrieu told the crowd. The mayor was surrounded by his family, which included his sister, US Senator Mary Landrieu, a Democrat, and his father, former New Orleans Mayor Moon Landrieu.

"Elections are America's peaceful pathway to the future. They give full voice to the will of the people,

and now the people of New Orleans have spoken again," Landrieu said. Landrieu, heading into the election on Saturday, had been the frontrunner to win. But his two African-American challengers accused the mayor of failing impoverished communities still affected by the aftermath of Katrina. The final candidate on the mayoral ballot was veteran civil rights lawyer Danatus King, who also is black. He had run a distant third in political polls and finished with 3 percent of the vote in preliminary results.—Reuters

## Cuban boat people land in Cayman, headed for Honduras

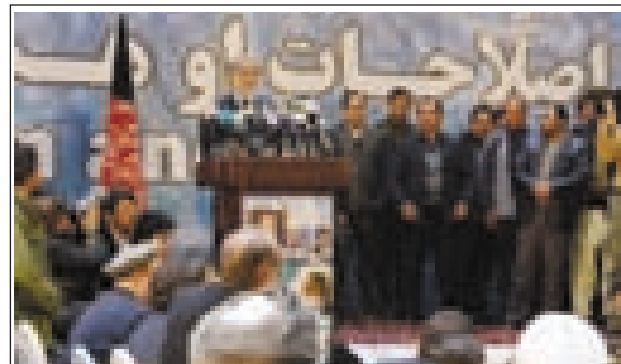
GEORGE TOWN, (Cayman Islands), 3 Feb — A 30-foot (9 metre) sailboat with about 30 Cuban refugees aboard docked in the Cayman Islands on Sunday and passengers said they were hoping to reach Honduras. The passengers told Reuters they were from Manzanillo in the southwestern province of Granma. Ranging in age from teenagers to retirees, said they decided to leave the island because of economic conditions in Cuba, and complained that recent private sector reforms had not been as broadly implemented in the eastern end of the island, far from the capital, Havana.

They were provided with supplies after landing in East End, on the island of Grand Cayman, and continued on their journey. Under an agreement between Cuba and the Cayman Islands signed more than a decade ago, Cuban migrant boats are allowed to pass through Cayman waters as long as they do not seek any assistance. Cayman and Cuban officials are due to meet soon to negotiate new terms of the 1999 migration agreement.

Cayman officials said last year that a growing number of Cuban migrant boats are being spotted in the their territorial waters, apparently in response to

possible changes in US immigration laws migrants fear could make it harder for them to enter the United States. Using makeshift boats or speed boats operated by smugglers, Cubans attempting to flee the communist-run island for the United States have long traveled through the waters of the Cayman Islands, a British territory located less than 100 miles south of Cuba.

The route offers favorable winds and sea currents for Cuban migrants trying to reach Honduras, from where they make the long journey overland to reach the US border with Mexico.—Reuters

## Afghan presidential campaign kicks off amid tight security

KABUL, 3 Feb — Afghanistan's third presidential election campaign since the collapse of Taleban regime in late 2001 formally kicked off in the conflict-plagued country on Sunday amid tight security as the militant group vowed to disrupt the polling process. Supporters of presidential runners have begun decorating walls and streets of the Afghan capital Kabul by installing billboards, gluing the posters and pictures of their favorite candidates to muster support.

Nevertheless, the voters, particularly ordinary citizens seem doubtful over the ability of candidates to act upon what they promise to the people. "I want

to use my suffrage, but I don't know to whom I should vote, because in the previous elections we had received a lot of promises by the candidates but have seen little change in our living conditions," Mohammad Sadiq, 38, told Xinhua. The poor balloon seller said that the candidates in 2009 had promised to create job opportunities for the citizens, improve security and ensure justice but all in vain.

"Security has been deteriorated since 2009. In 2009, I was able to travel around the country without any fear, but today, I am not able to visit my relatives in Hazar district of Logar Province.—Xinhua

## Missing girl in Sapporo found safe, man arrested for confinement

SAPPORO, 3 Feb — A 26-year-old man was arrested on Sunday for allegedly confining a girl in Sapporo who had been missing since late January, Hokkaido police said. Rina Hataya, 9, was found safe at the apartment of Hajime Matsui in the Hokkaido city.

The police plan to search the apartment on Monday, suspecting Matsui abducted the girl. The apartment is about 350 metres from the girl's home. Matsui denies confining the girl. The girl went missing after leaving home at around 3 pm on 27 January to buy stationery.

Matsui allegedly took her to his apartment from a parking lot near the girl's home at around 3:30 pm the same day. The Hokkaido police began soliciting information two days after the girl disappeared and had obtained 250 pieces of information as of Sunday.

## No more worries about parking in popular spots

TOKYO, 3 Feb — Finding a parking space near popular tourist spots and downtown areas in Japan is no mean feat, especially on weekends or holidays. On the other hand, only for a limited time, there are empty spaces at private housing or condominium parking lots near these locations, whose owners may wish to make good use of them. So, Nokisaki Inc offers parking lot rental service on a daily basis by connecting empty space owners with those looking for a place to park when driving to popular destinations.

Under the service named Nokisaki Parking, which means "parking under eaves," drivers can reserve a parking space before leaving their homes, while space owners can make money just by renting out their spaces when

they are not in use. "Our service has helped improve the surrounding environments as it alleviates traffic jams and reduces illegal parking," Akiko Nishiura, the 44-year-old president of the Tokyo-based company, said in an interview.

In the service, people who wish to rent out their spaces can set dates when their spaces become available. They can also decide fees at any rate they want, but the company recommends they set a price about 10 percent lower than those offered by parking lots in their neighborhoods. In locations near sports stadiums or concert venues, the rate will be higher when popular musicians are set to perform or major sports events are to take place, according to the company.

Drivers who sign up with the service can choose

a space and pay the designated fee on the company's website. Space lenders receive 65 percent of the payments, while Nokisaki takes the remaining 35 percent for commission. The company launched the service in October 2012 with parking spaces for about 10 cars near Tokyo Skytree, the world's tallest broadcasting tower that opened in May that year.

Nokisaki now has a total of nearly 1,000 parking spaces registered mainly in Tokyo and Osaka, while the number of member users has swelled to about 9,000. Nishiura, who founded Nokisaki in 2009, said securing a space was one of the biggest hurdles when she thought of starting a business, which helped her come up with the space sharing arrangements.

## Global automakers scour India's backroads in search of dream market

MUMBAI, 3 Feb — For global automakers, the dusty backroads of rural India could be the new El Dorado. As economic torpor suffocates demand for new cars in India's megacities, incomes are growing faster in small towns and country areas. That's pushing

the likes of General Motors (GM.N) and Honda Motor Co (7267.T) to fan out in search of buyers in places where fewer than 20 people in every thousand own a car — for now.

Standing firmly in the way are strong home-grown brands. With local services

plentiful and repairs cheap, Maruti Suzuki India Ltd (MRTI.NS), Mahindra and Mahindra Ltd (MAHM.NS), and Tata Motors Ltd (TAMO.NS) dominate the rural vehicle market where foreign automakers are seen as expensive and distant. Foreign companies showing cars at the Delhi auto show, starting on Wednesday, have already poured billions of dollars into factories, product development and marketing in India's once-booming car market.

Still, no foreign car maker has a share of more than 6 percent in India's passenger vehicle market aside from South Korea's Hyundai Motor Co (005380.KS) with 15 percent. Car makers see success in rural areas as vital, as slow economic growth, high interest rates and rising fuel prices

mean overall sales are headed for their second straight year of decline. Though the need for rural sales has been recognized, success could yet prove illusory.

Japan's Honda entered India nearly two decades ago but will still have only 170 dealerships by end-March, compared with market-leading Maruti's current 1,300. Of the 60 sales outlets Honda plans to open in India in the fiscal year that starts in April, 43 will be in small towns. "It's very easy to travel once in three-four years to a place 100 kilometers away to buy," said Jnaneswar Sen, senior vice president of sales and marketing at Honda India. "It becomes a bit of a hassle for the customer to travel 100 or 150 kilometers every few months to get the car serviced."

## GSK to launch late-stage clinical trials on 10 new drugs

BANGALORE, 3 Feb — GlaxoSmithKline is set to unveil plans to launch late-stage clinical trials on 10 new drugs over the next two years, the *Telegraph* reported, without citing sources. The new drugs, which have not been detailed to investors, will include cancer and respiratory disease medicines, the newspaper said on its website.

Britain's biggest drug-maker is also expected to report that fourth-quarter sales in China, where it is embroiled in a major bribery probe, took a smaller hit than when the scandal first blew up during the summer quarter, the report said. The investigation began in July 2013, after Chinese police accused GSK of funneling up to 3 billion yuan (\$495.05 million) to travel agencies to facilitate bribes to boost its drug sales.

## Cancer cases on rise in Singapore

SINGAPORE, 3 Feb — The number of cancer cases were on rise in Singapore in recent years, especially those associated with bad habits often seen in the modern lifestyle, local daily *Straits Times* reported on Monday. According to the latest available figures, 12,123 people were diagnosed with cancer in 2012, up nearly 15 percent from 10,576 in 2008, the report said. The ageing population is one of the reasons, said Soo Khee Chee, director of National Cancer Centre Singapore.

"In developed countries like ours, people are living longer. Previously, people would die before they got cancer," he said. But what is more worrying

is how "lifestyle cancers" such as prostate, breast and colo-rectum cancers are contributing to the rise. Prostate cancer cases went up by 52 percent from 2003 to 2012, when cases of breast cancer also rose by 25 percent. These cancers are, respectively, among the top three most common in men and women. They are also known as "developed world cancers" because they are associated with the lifestyle in these countries.

One factor that increases the chance of cancer is smoking, Soo said. "Overall, the rate of smoking is moving downwards, but there is a trend of more younger people here taking it up," he said. Health Promotion Board figures from

2010 showed that 16 percent of young people aged 18 to 29 smoked regularly, up from 12 percent in 2004. Other factors contributing to the rise of cancer here are poor diet and lack of exercise, because we are "overfed and eating the wrong food." Having fewer children and having them later also increase a woman's chances of getting cancer, he added.

Cancer remains the most often seen cause of deaths in Singapore, with 30 percent of deaths in 2011 caused by cancer. But the outlook is not all bleak. The chances of getting cancer can be lowered dramatically by modifying one's lifestyle.

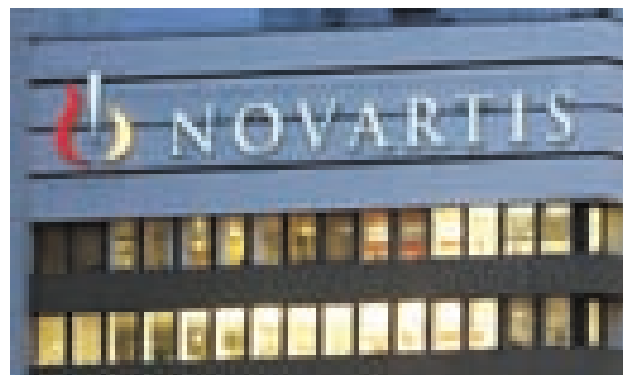
## Novartis to cut or transfer up to 4,000 pharma jobs

ZURICH, 3 Feb — Swiss drugs group Novartis (NOVN.VX) intends to cut or transfer up to 4,000 jobs, newspaper *NZZ am Sonntag* reported on Sunday, citing an internal email. The plan affecting up to 6 percent of its pharmaceuticals workforce comes on top of a program to reduce the number of production sites and is part of a larger drive to cut costs, the newspaper said.

Global drugmakers are under increasing pressure from investors to step up restructuring as patents on best-selling drugs expire and governments

try to keep a lid on health costs. Company spokesman Eric Althoff did not confirm the job numbers but issued a statement saying that Novartis intends to prioritize and reallocate resources primarily in pharmaceutical operations to focus on planned product launches and other growth areas. The measures "reflect the need to respond to a dynamically changing healthcare environment", it said, adding that Novartis expects group headcount to remain largely flat in 2014.

"We expect that an equal number of jobs will be created as are reduced," the

## Educated women driving China's Internet shopping: New Zealand study

WELLINGTON, 3 Feb — Internet retailers might want to give a bit of extra attention to China's educated, middle-class women because they're the future of on-line shopping in the world's biggest market, according to a New Zealand study. The Lincoln University survey of Chinese Internet consumers found that well-educated employees appeared more inclined to shop online than any other group, possibly indicating their computer literacy and ready access to Internet technology.

The online shopping behavior of friends and family also appeared to be a major influence on China's e-shoppers, especially among women. The research found that Chinese female consumers were more likely to shop on-line than their male counterparts a trend that was becoming increasingly pronounced, researchers said in a statement from the university on Monday.

With China's population spending about 1 billion hours on the Internet each day, it was important to understand the decision-making process and behav-

ior of on-line shoppers, senior lecturer in marketing Michael Clemes said in the statement. "What's particularly interesting about China, however, is not only how little is known about e-shopping behaviours, but how few Chinese consumers relative to the country's population actually use the Internet for their purchases," Clemes said. "The findings of the research are every bit as important to New Zealand businesses looking to attract Chinese consumers as it is to Chinese businesses themselves."

The researchers suggested that marketers consider providing computer training courses to prospective customers or increasing the provision of public computers, and to consider providing on-line forums and chat rooms for female consumers to share their experiences. They also found that high-income Chinese consumers were much less inclined to shop online, possibly because they preferred to physically examine the more upmarket products they were buying and take advantage of support services offered in a store.—Xinhua

needy people to get oxygen cylinders and blood when they need.

However, ads for alcohol in journals have posing hindrances to their efforts for putting the young people on right paths for their future.

"Some alcohol ads are

pretended as ads for bottled water and lucky draws," he says, "but, we will carry on our works to help them distinguish right or wrong. We hope the books in the library can attract young people," the man said.

## Abe considering visiting S Pacific nations over next two years

TOKYO, 3 Feb — Prime Minister Shinzo Abe is considering visiting South Pacific nations such as Palau and Papua New Guinea — grueling battlefields of World War II — over the next two years, a government source said on Sunday.

While promoting the recovery of the remains of Japanese war dead there, Abe is apparently aiming to strengthen Japan's ties with the countries through economic assistance at a time when China is working to increase its influence in the region, according to

the source. They will be the first trips by a Japanese prime minister to the South Pacific nations since Prime Minister Yasuhiro Nakasone visited Fiji and Papua New Guinea in 1985. Around 2.4 million Japanese died overseas during the war, and more

than 300,000 remains are believed to be buried in the region.

A meeting of Oceanian state leaders in Palau from late July to early August this year could provide an opportunity for Abe to make a trip.

## Cambodian, Vietnamese to discuss ties, cooperation next week

PHNOM PENH, 3 Feb — Cambodian Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Hor Namhong will meet with Vietnamese Foreign Minister Pham Binh Minh next week to discuss possibilities to further enhance bilateral ties and cooperation, the Cambodian Ministry of Foreign Affairs said on Monday.

The two top diplomats would co-chair the 13th meeting of the Cambodia-Vietnam Joint Commission for Economic, Cultural, Scientific and Technical

Cooperation to be held from 10-11 February in Phnom Penh, the capital of Cambodia, said a ministry's Press statement.

At the end of the talk, both sides will sign the agreed minutes of the meeting, the statement said. Besides, Pham Binh Minh will pay a courtesy call on Cambodian Prime Minister Hun Sen at the Peace Palace.

Cambodia shares 1,270 km of border with Vietnam to the east. The two neighbors have enjoyed good ties in trade, investment

and tourism. The two-way trade volume reached 3.5 billion US dollars last year, according to the Association of Vietnamese Investors in Cambodia. On the investment side, Vietnam is the fifth largest investor in Cambodia, with 128 projects worth over 3 billion US dollars by 2013.

For tourism, Vietnam ranked the largest source of tourists to Cambodia with 850,000 Vietnamese visiting the country last year, said the Cambodian Tourism Ministry.

## N Korea proposes talks on family reunions this week

SEOUL, 3 Feb — North Korea on Monday accepted South Korea's call for talks on another round of reunions of families separated since the 1950-1953 Korean War, proposing the talks be held on Wednesday or Thursday this week, according to South Korea's Unification Ministry.

The North Korean offer to hold the working-level talks at the truce village of Panmunjeom was conveyed to the South earlier Monday, spokesman Kim Eui Do said. He said the South welcomes the North's response and would soon respond as to which day it prefers. Last Wednesday, South Korea proposed talks on holding the reunions on 17-22 February at the North's Mt Kumgang, a resort on its east coast near the border with the South.

The exchange of proposals began last month when the North offered to resume the reunions, which were last held in late 2010, at Mt Kumgang, "at a convenient time" after the Lunar New Year. Earlier this month, South Korean President Park Geun Hye had proposed the two Koreas hold the reunions around the Lunar New Year, which fell on 31 January.

## Flowers in Malaysia to hike price by 10 to 15 percent for Valentine's Day

KUALA LUMPUR, 3 Feb — With the advent of the Valentine's Day, the flower prices in Malaysia will see a 10 to 15 percent increase this month due to the rising prices of goods, local media said on Monday.

According to a statement from the Malaysia Florist Association, it was the increasing overhead

costs, among other, that forced them to make the decision to raise price. Farming overheads, medicine and fertilizers were increasing, it said, adding that the decision to increase the price was made after discussions with florists.

According to the *New Straits Times*, an English-language newspaper pub-

lished in Malaysia, a flower trader in Kuala Lumpur's Petaling Street said a bouquet of eight stalks of roses prices at RM80 (23.91 US dollars) would cost RM100 (29.88 dollars) while 12 stalks with the price of RM100 would cost RM150 (44.82 dollars) on Valentine's Day.

This year's Valentine's Day on Feb. 14 also coincides with the Lantern Festival, is traditionally held on the 15th day of the Chinese Lunar New Year.

## New Zealand, Australian ministers to hold joint meeting on future cooperation

WELLINGTON, 3 Feb — The prime ministers and senior Cabinet ministers of New Zealand and Australia will hold a joint meeting in Sydney this week to discuss the future of the deepening integration of the two countries, New Zealand Prime Minister John Key said on Monday.

Key and Australian Prime Minister Tony Abbott, who was elected in September last year, would co-chair the talks from 6 to 8 February. "Australia is

New Zealand's closest international partner and our relationship is vitally important to New Zealand's trade and economic interests," Key said in a statement.

The meeting would also be an opportunity to thank Abbott in person for inviting New Zealand to join the G20 meetings, which Australia is hosting this year.

Key would be accompanied by Deputy Prime Minister and Finance Min-

ister Bill English, as well as Economic Development Minister Steven Joyce, Justice Minister Judith Collins, Health Minister Tony Ryall, Environment Minister Amy Adams and Immigration Minister Michael Woodhouse.

"The joint meeting of Cabinet ministers is a good opportunity to set the agenda for the trans-Tasman relationship, and allows ministers to engage directly with their counterparts on a range of issues and identify

areas where we can build on our close cooperation," said Key. "I will also be joined by a sizable New Zealand business delegation. Their participation recognizes the important role two-way trade and investment plays in the relationship between our countries and the integrated nature of our economies under our Closer Economic Relations agreement." The joint meeting of Cabinet ministers will be the third since 2009.

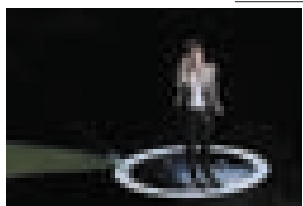

## McIlroy rues tricky greens as Euro title drought continues

DUBAI, 3 Feb — Rory McIlroy was left to rue some unreadable greens as his winless streak on the European Tour extended to 15 events following a two-over-par 74 in the final round of the Dubai Desert Classic on Sunday. The Northern Irishman was the early pacesetter on the Majlis course, a sizzling first round 63 putting him two strokes clear of the field.

But he never recaptured on Thursday's sparkle and the 24-year-old entered Sunday's final round two shots adrift of eventual winner Stephen Gallacher.

Gallacher blundered with successive bogeys on the first two holes to put McIlroy ahead, but that lead proved short-lived as the world number six registered four bogeys between the seventh and 13th to slip

back into the pack.

"Anything that could go wrong did — okay, I hit a couple of loose drives, but I didn't (get) away with them, stuff like that," McIlroy told reporters.

"I didn't get a couple of putts to go. I was struggling to read them for some reason, so I got (caddy) JP (Fitzgerald) to read them for me on the back nine and holed a couple more. "When the greens get this firm they change color a little bit and it was very hard to see. Everything I read was straight even though it wasn't — I just couldn't see any movement at all."

McIlroy's winless streak on the European Tour — his last victory was at 2012's DP World Tour Championships in Dubai, although he did triumph at December's Australian

Open — would not be troubling for most golfers.

But for McIlroy, who won his first tour title as a teenager and was a double major champion by the age of 23, it represents a steep decline from the glories of 2012. That year he became only the second golfer to top the money lists in both Europe and the United States in the same season as

he become world number one.

Since then McIlroy has found it harder going, although Dubai's joint-ninth placing means he has made the top 10 in five of his past six tour events and Desert Classic champion Gallacher had no doubt his playing partner would again challenge for golf's top honours.—Reuters

## Japan down Canada to make maiden Davis Cup quarters

TOKYO, 3 Feb — Hosts Japan sailed into the Davis Cup quarter-finals for the first time with a 4-1 victory against an injury-plagued Canada on Sunday. Japanese number one Kei Nishikori was leading 6-2, 1-0 on the indoor hard court at Tokyo's Ariake Coliseum when his opponent Frank Dancevic retired with injury, surrendering the tie in their first meeting since 1938.

Nishikori pocketed the first set in 29 minutes and broke Dancevic in the first game of the second when the world number 119 took an injury timeout but could not continue because of a stom-

ach muscle injury.

"The pressure is always on me to win both singles matches," said Nishikori, who won his opening singles against Peter Polansky on Friday before teaming up with Yasutaka Uchiyama to claim Saturday's doubles.

"This time I was able to help win three matches.

"The quarter-finals was our goal after getting back in the World Group. To do it in the first year is very rewarding." Back in World Group after a one-year absence, Japan now have a perfect 6-0 Davis Cup record against last year's semi-finalists, who were laid low by a spate of injuries. Their top-ranked player Milos Raonic withdrew on Thursday with a foot injury he sustained at last month's Australian Open, while world number 25 Vasek Pospisil also missed Saturday's doubles with an injury he picked up at Melbourne Park.—Reuters

## Giles would be 'very interested' in succeeding Flower

LONDON, 3 Feb — Former test spin bowler Ashley Giles confirmed on Sunday that he would be "very interested" in succeeding Andy Flower as England's team director following his resignation. Giles, who took over as limited-overs coach in 2012, was speak-

ing after England suffered an 84-run Twenty20 defeat to Australia, which meant they lost the series 3-0.

"I'd be very interested in doing the job, definitely," Giles said in an interview with Sky Sports.

"I'm not going to deny that and I'm sure I will be

applying for the post. "If I have to put an application in over the next couple of weeks then I'll think about that and get it done."

Giles has won 15 of his 38 matches in charge but he does not expect to be the only candidate interested in taking over from former Zimbabwe wicketkeeper-batsman Flower. "I'm not silly, if it goes out to a process other people are going to apply," added Giles who took 143 wickets during his test career with England.

"It's one of the biggest jobs in cricket and I'd apply for it because I want to do it. "As someone who was very proud to play for England I've been proud to coach the one-day side. To do the whole job would be a fantastic opportunity, but it's hard work as well."

## Arsenal back on top as Liverpool slip up

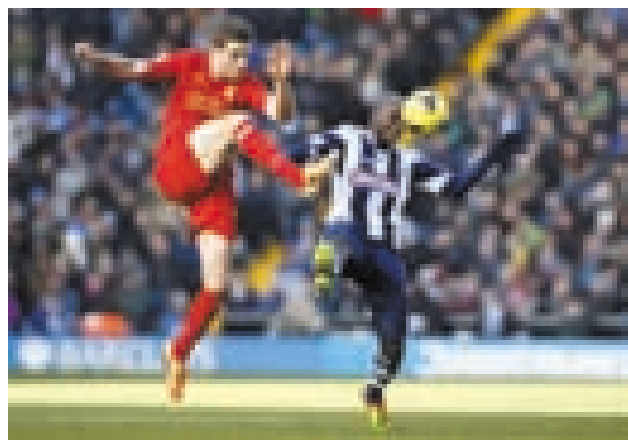

## Woods vows to work on putter after muted Dubai showing

DUBAI, 3 Feb — Tiger Woods vowed to improve his putting after another lacklustre showing at the Dubai Desert Classic on Sunday extended the world number one's troubled start to 2014.

The 14-times major winner birdied the last three holes for a one-under-par final round of 71 on the Majlis course, giving him an aggregate six-

under 282.

But such a score left Woods an also-ran at a tournament where he vied for top billing with Northern Ireland's Rory McIlroy.

"My iron game wasn't as sharp as I'd like, I had seven lip-outs today," Woods told reporters.

"I'm definitely going to work on my putting. My light putting needs to be better than it has been... I'm

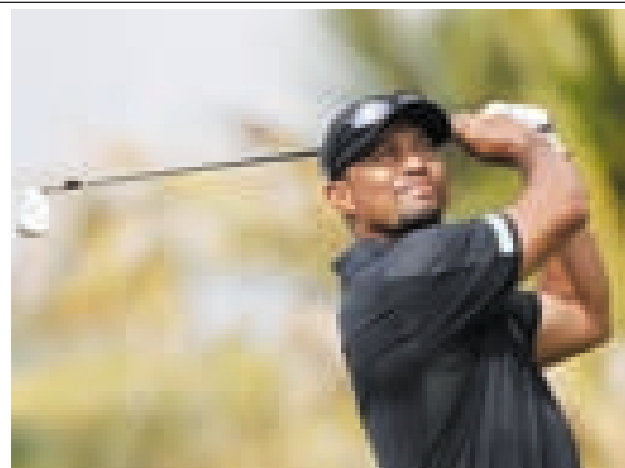
hitting my lines, I just don't have the speed right."

Woods began brightly in Dubai, racing to four-under after nine holes of Thursday's first round, seemingly showing few ill effects from a dire showing at California's Torrey Pines a few days earlier where he carded 79, the second-worst round of his professional career.

ing and then inconsistent putting saw the American make 10 birdies and eight bogeys over Dubai's final 63 holes as he slipped out of contention. ## Four killed in attacks in southern Thailand

BANGKOK, 3 Feb — Four people were killed in bomb and shooting attacks in the southern Thai province of Pattani, police said on Sunday.

Insurgents launched a disguised attack on a checkpoint in Kokpho District in the province late Saturday, luring a district officer and

village chiefs to inspect the incident.

When they arrived at the scene, the insurgents detonated an explosive device hidden under the road, killing the officer and injuring two village chiefs.

Three soldiers were also killed and two others injured in a separate bomb

and shooting attack when soldiers inspected the bomb blast. Since the insurgency broke out in 2004, nearly 6,000 people have been killed in Thailand's southernmost provinces of Pattani, Yala and Narathiwat, and four districts of Songkhla Province.

## Gallacher overcomes dire start to retain Dubai title

DUBAI, 3 Feb — Scotland's Stephen Gallacher struck a final round 72 to clinch the \$2.5 million (1.5 million pounds) Dubai Desert Classic on Sunday as he overcame a nightmare start to become the first player to retain the coffee pot trophy.

Gallacher, whose Dubai win 12 months ago was his first title in nearly a decade, skittered four bogeys on the front nine holes, but clawed back four shots after the turn in a gritty display to end on 272.

"My emotions are gone, I'm a nervous wreck," the world number 67 told reporters.

"I never really played the front nine that well all

week.

"No one was racing ahead, that was the key, if someone had come out of the traps maybe it would have been different."

His closest challenger was Argentina's Emiliano Grillo (66), who sunk a 60-foot eagle putt on the 18th for 273, while France's Romain Wattel (66) and Brooks Koepka (70) of the United States were tied on 274.

Gallacher, 39, began the day two shots clear of world number six Rory McIlroy and most of the 8,500 crowd must have anticipated a classic duel between the wily veteran and golf's great young hope.

But both players faltered on an overcast Majlis course, although that made for a thrilling finale as four different players - Gallacher, McIlroy, Koepka and Grillo - claimed outright leadership at some stage, while England's Robert Rock and Finland's Mikko Ilonen also shared top spot.

Gallacher hit his first two drives into the rough to begin with successive bogeys and gift playing partner McIlroy the lead.

Yet the Northern Irishman failed to capitalise. He slugged his tee shot at the par-three seventh into the water for a bogey and dropped three further shots between holes 10 and 13,

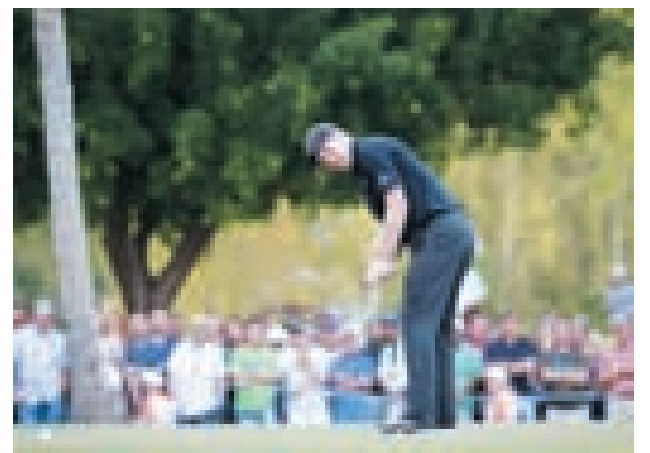
dooming his hopes of ending a 14-month title drought on the European Tour as he slipped to a share of ninth.

"The golf course played a lot differently today," McIlroy said.

"The greens were firmer. The rare times I did get the ball close I didn't make any putts. It was one of those days."

Gallacher, in contrast, was a man transformed after the turn, where a day earlier he had equalled a European Tour record with nine-under-par on the back nine.

"I think yesterday was the key - Saturday is when you're trying to get into contention, to get a lead,"

said Gallacher.

He did not quite reach the same heights on Sunday, but a chip from the rough on the 17th provided a one-foot birdie chance he duly converted to reclaim the outright lead, making par on the 18th with a

nervous three-foot putt to seal the title.

Gallacher is one of golf's late bloomers, rising from 461 in the rankings in 2010 to be on the cusp of the top 40 following back-to-back Dubai titles.

## Thai protesters head for downtown Bangkok in bid to topple PM

BANGKOK, 3 Feb—Thai anti-government protesters who have been camped out in north Bangkok packed their tents and marched downtown on Monday as they consolidated efforts to topple Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra, a day after a disrupted general election. Some joined protest leader Suthep Thaugsuban on foot and others followed in cars and six-wheel trucks as Thailand's long-running political conflict showed no sign of ending.

Others surrounded a

government office in north Bangkok where Yingluck and two senior ministers had been holding a meeting and cut through a barbed-wire fence. They did not enter the building and it was unclear if Yingluck was still inside. The protesters closed camps at two of the seven big intersections that they have blockaded since mid-January, at Victory Monument and Lat Phrao, and were heading for the fringes of the central oasis of Lumpini Park. A third camp run by an allied group

at a big government administrative complex may also be closed.

Suthep said on Sunday this was being done out of safety concerns, but it could also be because their numbers are dwindling. Reuters put the number of marchers at about 3,000, with hundreds surrounding the government office. "Suthep's movement is now crumbling, but it still has powerful unseen backers," said Chris Baker, a historian and prominent Thailand scholar.—Reuters

## Student kills two in Moscow school in possible revenge attack

MOSCOW, 3 Feb—A Moscow high-school student shot a teacher and a police officer dead and held more than 20 other students hostage in a classroom in a possible revenge attack on Monday, days before Russia hosts the Winter Olympics under tight security.

The student was disarmed and detained less than two hours after the shooting following negotiations aided by his father, Interfax news agency said. News agencies said he might have been seeking revenge over a conflict with a teacher.

Any such violence could rattle nerves at a time when athletes and spectators are arriving for the Sochi Games and the country is on

high alert over an Islamist militant threat of violence.

State-run media tend to portray school attacks as a largely US phenomenon and they are indeed rare in

Russia. However, separatist militants seized a school in the North Caucasus town of Beslan in 2004. More than 330 people, mostly children, were killed.—Reuters
