Myanmar, Brunei agree to cooperate in peace and stability in ASEAN region

NAY PYI TAW, 25 March—President U Thein Sein rolled out the red carpet for the visit of Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah, His Majesty King of Brunei, on the lawns of the Presidential Palace, in Nay Pyi Taw on Wednesday.

At a meeting held at the Credentials Hall, leaders of both countries discussed cooperation in energy and agriculture sectors between the two countries, prospects of Myanmar's rice export to Brunei, and harmony in diverse societies in Myanmar.

At the talks, the leaders of both countries agreed to cooperate in peace and stability in ASEAN region. The Sultan of Brunei expressed his attitude that current issues of Myanmar are its internal affairs.

Myanmar and Brunei established diplomatic relations on 21 September 1993. Being ASEAN member countries, both countries focus on strengthening friendly relations.

The Sultan of Brunei Darussalam paid a goodwill visit to Myanmar in 1998 for the first time, and now is the second time.

In the time of new government, President U Thein Sein paid his first goodwill visit to Brunei in 2012 and attended the ASEAN Summit held in Brunei in 2013.

He made clarifications on raising rate of electricity charge for the customers.

G7 warns Russia of more sanctions if Ukraine crisis escalates

THE HAGUE/FEODOSIA, 25 March—US President Barack Obama and major industrialized allies warned Russia on Monday it faced damaging economic sanctions if President Vladimir Putin takes further action to destabilize Ukraine following the seizure of Crimea.

Leaders of the Group of Seven nations, meeting without Russia, agreed to hold their own summit this year instead of attending a planned G8 meeting in the Russian Olympic venue of

Sochi, along the Black Sea coast from Crimea, and to suspend their participation in the G8 until Russia changes course.

On a day when Kiev ordered its remaining troops to withdraw from Crimea and Russian forces

captured a Ukrainian marine base and a landing ship in the region, leaders of the United States, Germany, France, Britain, Italy, Japan and Canada condemned what they called "Russia's illegal attempt to annex Crimea in contravention of international law".

They also agreed their energy ministers would work together to reduce dependence on Russian oil and gas and increase energy security.

"We remain ready to intensify actions including coordinated sectoral sanctions that will have an increasingly significant impact on the Russian economy, if Russia continues to escalate this situation," they said in a joint statement. The G7 leaders, who met on the sidelines of a nuclear security summit in The Hague, said they would convene again in Brussels in early June, the first time since Russia joined the G8 in 1998 that it will have been shut out of the annual summit of industrialized democracies.

US to pressure Israel to release Palestinian prisoners

RAMALLAH, 25 March—Top US officials have promised to pressure Israel to release 26 long-term Palestinian prisoners, an official Palestinian source said on Monday.

The promise was made to Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas as the US intensifies its efforts to avoid a collapse of the faltering peace talks.

In a telephone conversation on Monday, Abbas and US Secretary of State John Kerry discussed the issue of Palestinian prisoners and ways to revive the peace process.

Kerry's phone call came during Abbas' meeting with the US Special Envoy for Peace, Martin Indyk, in the Jordanian capital of Amman, the source told *Xinhua*. "Abbas discussed with Kerry and Indyk the US proposals to push the peace process forward," the official said.

Kerry and Indyk told Abbas the US would pressure Israel to release 26 long-term Palestinian prisoners in Israeli jails who are supposed to be freed later this month.

According to the Palestinian official source, the US is now intensifying its efforts to avoid a collapse of the Palestinian-Israeli peace talks it has been mediating since last July. He added the US has proposed to extend the negotiations, which are set to end late in April. When the peace talks between the two sides resumed in July, Israel originally agreed to release 104 prisoners chosen by an Israeli ministerial committee. Seventy-eight prisoners have been freed so far.

Israeli officials say if the Palestinians refuse to extend the peace negotiations, the remaining prisoners will not be released.

However, the Palestinians reject linking the prisoners' release with the extension of the peace negotiations, and threaten to approach international organizations to sue Israel for not meeting its commitments.—*Xinhua*

World leaders gather for nuclear security summit for discussions on preventing nuclear terrorism

THE HAGUE, 25 March—The third Nuclear Security Summit (NSS) kicked off here on Monday, aimed at preventing nuclear terrorism around the globe.

Leaders from more than 50 countries and international organizations have gathered here to assess past achievements in safeguarding global nuclear security and to seek more actions in preventing nuclear material falling into the wrong

hands. On the first day of the event, participating countries presented their

national statements on nuclear security, and then proceeded to discuss what

they would do and how they would cooperate at the international level.

A plenary meeting was held after the two-day event officially opened Monday afternoon.

Addressing the opening session on Monday afternoon, Dutch Prime Minister Mark Rutte stressed the goal of the summit is to discuss how to prevent nuclear terrorism during the summit.—*Xinhua*

Israeli troops fire at infiltrators on Egypt border, one injured

JERUSALEM, 25 March—An Israeli military patrol opened fire at two men who attempted to infiltrate the security barrier along Israel's western border with Egypt on Monday, wounding one of them.

An army spokeswoman said the patrol spotted the suspects climbing the border fence and initially called them to turn back according to the rules of engagement. The troops opened fire at the men when their calls were ignored.

One suspect was hit in the leg and seen fleeing toward Sinai, while the other crossed into Israel, who was apprehended and handed over to security forces for questioning, the spokeswoman added.—*Xinhua*

Russian, Ukrainian foreign ministers to hold talks

MOSCOW, 25 March—Russian Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov is to meet his Ukrainian counterpart Andriy Deshchysya on the sidelines of a nuclear security summit now under way in the Hague, a Russian diplomatic source said on Monday.

The source cited by Russian news agencies *RIA* and *Interfax* said the Ukrainian delegation had asked for the meeting.

The nuclear security conference runs through on Tuesday.

Search for debris linked to Flight MH370 halted due to poor weather

SYDNEY, 25 March—Australian authorities on Tuesday suspended the search for debris linked to missing Malaysia Airlines Flight MH370 in the southern Indian Ocean due to poor weather conditions on Tuesday, after Malaysia announced overnight that experts have concluded that the *Boeing 777* crashed into the sea in the remote area.

The Australian Maritime Safety Authority said waves of up to two meters and an associated swell of up to four meters are expected in the search area, some 2,500 kilometers southwest of Perth, while strong gale force winds of

up to 80 km per hour and periods of heavy rain are also forecast.

"Current weather conditions would make any air and sea search activities hazardous and pose a risk to crew. Therefore, AMSA has suspended all sea and air search operations for today due to these weather conditions," the AMSA said in a statement.

It said search operations are expected to resume on Wednesday "if weather conditions permit."

Malaysian Prime Minister Najib Abdul Razak told a press conference Monday night that satellite data analysis experts have

concluded that MH370 "ended in the southern Indian Ocean," while the airline reportedly texted relatives of the victims to say it has to be assumed that nobody on board the flight survived.

Najib said British air accident investigators and experts from Inmarsat, the British company that earlier provided satellite data indicating two possible flight corridors, concluded on the basis of new analysis that the last position of the *Boeing 777-200* was a remote area in the middle of the Indian Ocean, far from any possible landing sites.

Abe, Park to meet in US-brokered trilateral summit

THE HAGUE, 25 March — Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe and South Korean President Park Geun Hye will have their first formal encounter on Tuesday in a trilateral summit arranged with the help of US President Barack Obama.

The three-way summit was arranged in the hope that face-to-face talks between Abe and Park will help the two countries ease tensions and work together with the United States on dealing with regional problems such as North Korea's nuclear ambitions.

North Korea in a rare move fired as many as 46 rockets into the Sea of Japan over the weekend despite repeated calls from other countries including the United States to cease provocative acts.

Ben Rhodes, deputy US national security adviser, described the trilateral meeting as "a very important message to show the United States aligned with our two most important allies in Northeast Asia."

But relations between Japan and South Korea remain unsettled with a remark by an aide to Abe on Sunday with regard to the history of Japan's colonial rule of the Korean Peninsula sparking fresh controversy. The trilateral meeting has drawn attention as the first formal occasion for Abe and Park to meet, albeit not bilaterally, since the Japanese and South Korean leaders took office in December 2012 and February 2013, respectively. They only chatted on the fringes of past international events.

20,000 affected by serious flooding in Brazil

RIO DE JANEIRO, 25 March — Some 20,000 people have been affected by devastating floods as the Madeira River in northern Brazil burst its banks, state media said on Monday.

Madeira's water level rose to a record high of 19.52 meters due to heavy rainfall, which caused monsoon floods that affected communities along the river, including several neighbourhoods in Porto Velho, capital of the state of Rondonia, Brazilian news agency *Agencia Brasil*

reported.

In Porto Velho alone, 3,262 families have been displaced after various rivers and their tributaries, including the Mamore River along the Brazil-Bolivia border, burst their banks.

The BR-364 federal highway, which is an overland route between Rondonia and the Atlantic coast, has been inundated, causing supply problems as trucks are unable to enter the flood-hit region.

Syrian forces battle rebels near Turkey border crossing

BEIRUT, 25 March — Syrian troops backed by war planes battled on Monday to dislodge Islamist rebels from a border crossing and northern town in the coastal province of Latakia, heartland of President Bashar al-Assad's Alawite minority.

Fighters from the Islamic Front and al-Qaeda-linked Nusra Front seized the Armenian Christian town of Kasab on Sunday after taking the nearby border crossing in an offensive which follows a string of recent rebel defeats further south.

Video footage released by activists showed fighters driving through the largely

deserted Kasab, passing a municipal building and a shattered statue of Bashar's father Hafez, who ruled Syria for 30 years until 2000. While the rebel advance has gained only a small pocket of territory, it has put Assad on the defensive and deprived him — at least for now — of the last border crossing from Turkey into government-held territory. It follows months of advances by Assad's troops and Lebanese Hezbollah fighters near the capital Damascus and the Lebanese border, choking rebel supply lines and reasserting control of central Syria as the civil war enters a fourth year.

More than 140,000 people have been killed in the conflict and nearly half the population has been displaced but the coastal provinces of Latakia and Tartous have so far remained largely loyal to Assad and relatively unscathed.

Activists said authorities have sent reinforcements to the Kasab area to stem the rebel advances. State media said the army and National Defence Force militia were surrounding the rebels close to the border.

The Syrian Observatory for Human Rights monitoring group said there was heavy fighting on the eastern edge of Kasab and

other areas near the border.

War planes were bombarding rebel positions and causing forest fires, it said, while television images showed smoke rising from the wooded border region.

Rebel fighters have also struck deeper into Latakia province, attacking the town of Solas to the south and firing rockets overnight into Latakia city, killing eight people. Latakia port is the main transport hub for the international operation to ship Syria's chemical weapons out of the country for destruction, but the Observatory said the rockets did not land close to the port area.

US to help in 'elimination' of sensitive Japanese nuclear stockpile

THE HAGUE, 25 March — Japan will turn over hundreds of kilograms

(pounds) of sensitive nuclear material of potential use in bombs to the United

States to be downgraded and disposed of, the two countries' leaders said as

a nuclear security summit began on Monday.

China had voiced concern earlier this year about regional rival Japan's holding of plutonium but Washington and the United Nations nuclear agency have made it clear they are not worried about the way Tokyo is handling the issue.

Still, US President Barack Obama and Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe said that all highly enriched uranium (HEU) and separated plutonium would be removed from the Fast Critical Assembly at the Japan Atomic Energy Agency, a facility used for studying the nuclear physics of so-called fast reactors. The announcement followed what the White

House said were technological advances since the 1960s launch of this type of research plant that would allow it to be converted to run on fuel not potentially usable for bombs, unlike HEU or plutonium.

Japan, the world's only target of atomic bombs, during the final stages of World War Two, does not have nuclear weapons and has long said it will not seek to obtain them.

Like uranium, plutonium is used to fuel nuclear power plants and for research purposes, but can also serve as the fissile material for the core of a nuclear bomb.

"This effort involves the elimination of hundreds of kilograms of nuclear material, furthering our

mutual goal of minimizing stocks of HEU and separated plutonium worldwide, which will help prevent unauthorized actors, criminals, or terrorists from acquiring such materials," said a joint US-Japanese statement released by the White House. "This material, once securely transported to the United States, will be sent to a secure facility and fully converted into less sensitive forms."

The announcement was made in The Hague shortly before leaders from 53 countries, including Obama and Abe, began a two-day summit aimed at agreeing steps to help prevent al-Qaeda-style militant groups from obtaining nuclear bombs.

Job-trainings at Industries

Time is flying swiftly across mid-summer days, towards water festival coming soon in April. Kindergarten-kids are now under shelter of summer schools for various training courses including religion-based cultural courses, to the like of parents. Matriculation students are now free from the yoke of exam-load and about to indulge themselves in what they have been bearing in mind during the whole academic year. Here, we would like to spotlight the vacations of technical students either from technical colleges or from universities.

There had once been a jointly-organized training program between Yangon Institute of Technology in Gyogone and industry related ministries, for engineering students to undergo practical trainings for relevant field of technologies, generally starting from fourth year. Particularly in summer vacations, mechanical students were fielded to manufacturing industries, electrical students to power generation plants and projects, civil engineering students to construction sites (not very much in those days), chemical engineer-would-be to chemical-based factories like paper mills, sugar mills. It is like medical students compulsorily required to study in operation theatres at hospitals. Factory officers-in-charge gave fraternal welcome and were in readiness to impart knowledge they gleaned, through years of experiences. As they were also previously learners from the same institutions they knew and understood shortcomings in pursuing

practical practices at major faculties. So, they usually suggested trainees to exploit chances of studies at factories and plants on real ground where theories are put into practices. Hearing how they started service life, how they had to absorb practical lessons from their predecessors and also from partner-technicians, how they had to tackle problems unexpectedly faced, etc. are valuable lectures not obtainable in the classrooms.

Apparent feature of today is, private industries, locally owned and F.D.I based, are growing in number tremendously and outnumber the state-owned industries, indicative of wider-than-before-training ground for interested trainees. Newly installed machineries at private industries can provide modern technology and mechanism whilst students can learn basic science and technology at old factories, mostly in state sector. For an example, a student who wants to see inside structure and know the function of an engine, he had better go to old locomotive workshop, like that in Insein, or Dala shipyard, where he can see engines of simple design and old model, read manuals and hand books, instead of going to computer-controlled engine mounted hybrid-car workshops. As these industries can be sources of job opportunities for the students after graduating from the institutes, they should avail themselves of the opportunities they have in hand to study the environment of industry in which their careers will have to be engrossed in future. Who dare says, one day, students of today cannot be

successful and resourceful entrepreneurs and key developers of Myanmar SME sector, identified now as spring-board of industrial productive forces.

Job training program mentioned in title, can provide not only subject-wise know-how, but also noteworthy information such as, specification and sources of raw materials used in production process and also as to locally available or imported. As a matter of fact, factories and worksites can be likened to big technical books. Seeing, touching every hand tool and power tool, machine, instrument; study of production process from start to end of producing a good; interview with technicians, chemists, engineers; listening to challenges they encountered; rules of thumb and conventional methods old mechanics and fitters used, and so and so, are like reading technical books in a library.

Furthermore, this way of learning enables the students to put the facts into memory easily and sustain for long. Technical books, leave alone latest edition, are scarce, expensive in market, and in library are of only a few not meeting the needs of book-worms. Limited work-shop facilities at technical institutions are also incommensurate with what the students need to be trained practically according to prescribed sandwich course. What is being highlighted here is not to reveal weakness, but to fill up this blank. It will pay to do. Students are students as well as youths. They may be willing to have part of vacation as spree. However, on return to campus, new data and concept will follow them, being unconsciously stored in mind.

In the present era, we are tempted to say that girls get the better of boys in the art of sitting for examination with proof that when results are out, girls' marks are higher. More girls get admitted to favorite universities. Number of women-Master Degree holders and doctorates are on the rise. It is a good indicator woman resource persons are powerful in developing nation. But, women cannot be in such a position that, after passing entrance examination for public service work sponsored by Union Civil Services Board, they just drive desk and push pen at the office. They must have well-preparedness, strengthening capacity mentally and physically. For that, this kind of field studies can be a good supporting means. In terms of U.N vocabulary, "empowerment" of women can be upgraded by this means.

While serial meetings on education reform process are now going on, this is an activity that should not be overlooked. This will require inevitably coordination among education authorities, Industrial Zone Management Committees, UMFFCCI, proprietors of industries, plants and companies followed by participation of students and staff of host industries concerned. Pertaining to this, if a question as to whether job-trainings are to be conducted only in summer days is raised, the answer is "Absolutely not." It is not non-flexible and can be arranged at any time favorable, but with the aim of gaining tangible results, not in the name only.

Pyidaungsu Hluttaw passes National Planning Bill, Union Budget Bill

NAY PYI TAW, 25 March—Pyidaungsu Hluttaw, (Union Parliament) session continued in Nay Pyi Taw on Tuesday, with members of Union level organizations responding to suggestions of parliamentarians on the National Planning Bill for 2014-2015 FY and the 2014 Union Budget Bill and the parliament approved the two bills.

Deputy Minister for Transport U Zin Yaw quoted an instruction of the President Office saying that the total cost of K 1000 million for construction of an airport in Chin State should

be spent on other infrastructure developments as the project will cost about three times more than an estimated cost due to constraints of various factors including high transportation cost for construction materials and machinery.

He assured Pyidaungsu Hluttaw of the ministry's plans to build more airports within coming 30 years in accord with a Transport Master Plan being formulated in cooperation with Japan International Cooperation Agency.

Regarding the electricity-generating projects, Deputy Minister for Electric Power U Aung Than Oo gave an account of the projects to be implemented with the use of foreign loans during 2014-2015 FY and the upgrade of power lines and sub-power stations in Mandalay, Magway and Sagaing Regions and the systems of power distribution in 23 townships in

Yangon.

The targeted projects are construction of Upper Yeywa, Thahtay and Upper Kengtaung hydropower projects, installation of 500 KV Toungoo-Kamanat power grid, 230 KV Upper Yeywa-Shwesayan power line, 230 KV Athok-Pathein power grid, 230 KV Biluchaung (2)-Shwe Myot power line, 230 KV Hlaingthaya-Kyaiklat power line, 230 KV Mawlamyine-Ye-Dawei power line, infrastructure development in Thilawa Area Japan ODA Phase-1, urgent rehabilitation and upgrade project Japan ODA Phase-1, Myitthar hydropower project and related infrastructure development, 285-mile long Bhamo-Nabar-Hngetyaw Daing-Ohndaw power line and sub-power station project, 120 MW Thaton power plant project that will be funded by World Bank and 50 MW Gas Turbine in Kyaukpyu with the use of

Chinese loan.

Upon completion of the projects, there will be betterment of distribution system and production of more electricity, thereby minimizing power losses and contributing towards increased productivity and higher living standard, he added.

After seeking approval of parliamentarians, Pyidaungsu Hluttaw passed the two bills.

During today's session, Pyidaungsu Hluttaw documented matters related to adding one more ward to Monywa Township in Sagaing Region and formation of Indakaw town by combining Indaw village-tract with Thayakon village-tract in Bago Township of Bago Region and President's message on matters related to allocation of special fund in accordance with 2013 Union Budget.

Before approving the

President's message on joining the UNESCO's Convention for Safeguarding of the Intangible Cultural Heritage, Union Minister for Culture U Aye Myint Kyu elaborated on benefits of signing the convention that there will be more technically and financially assistance of international community to develop the conservation of traditional livelihoods and cultural heritages of Myanmar. It can thereby contribute towards promotion of Myanmar's tourism industry, improving the image of the country.

During today's Q and A session of Pyithu Hluttaw, Deputy Minister for Sports U Thaung Htaik assured that necessary assistance are being provided to hold competitions in respective regions for emergence of younger generation in some sports that are not listed in SEA Games. He has spoken of summer sports courses and advanced courses to be

conducted in cooperation with the Ministry of Education and a plan to promote sports standard in basic education schools and universities.

Responding to a question about health sector, Deputy Minister for Health Dr Than Aung elaborated on measures being taken to provide primary health care to the people and mobile medical units giving health care services to workers at factories and industries. He continued that specialists from the people's hospitals are making field trips to give free health care services to local people. He vowed to increase the number of mobile medical units through the pilot projects.

At the today's Pyithu Hluttaw session, the Bill Committee presented a report on the Bill amending the Political Parties Registration Law (State Peace and Development Council Law 2/2010). —MNA

US sends black box locator, underwater vehicle to Australia

WASHINGTON, 25 March — Pentagon spokesman John Kirby said on Monday the US has sent a towed pinger locator, an autonomous underwater vehicle and trained personnel to Australia in case the equipment is needed to search for the black box of the missing Malaysia Airlines jetliner.

A towed pinger locator and a Bluefin-21 autonomous underwater vehicle were flown out of JFK Airport in New York to Perth, Australia earlier the day, and expected to arrive there on Tuesday, Kirby confirmed at the Pentagon Press briefing. “There will be a small number of people going along with them,” he added. “I think there are two on the flight with the gear itself, and then another eight folks will be flying separately to Perth to prepare the equipment.”

The towed pinger locator could be used to locate the missing airliner’s black box, while the Bluefin-21 autonomous underwater vehicle has sophisticated sonars that could be used to locate wreckage, he said. The underwater unmanned vehicle can dive to 14,700 feet, and if needed, the vehicle will operate off an Australian commercial ship, he said.—Xinhua

Italy watches nervously at French far-right forces’ advance, as next elections loom

ROME, 25 March — Italian media and analysts paid a great deal of attention to the French local elections, the day after far-right forces showed a surprising good performance. Anti-immigration and anti-European National Front, led by Marie Le Pen, achieved a significant result in the voting for 36,000 local councils on Sunday. It took the majority of votes in historical leftist stronghold, such as the city of Henin-Beaumont, and made gains in many other towns.

The news dominated the front pages of major Italian news outlets on Monday, and triggered much speculation by political analysts. French president Francois Hollande and his socialist party were seen as big losers of the contest, and the high rate of voter abstention was perceived as a sign of disaffection especially towards Europe.

“The jump of Marie Le Pen, a signal for Europe,” headlined the Corriere della Sera leading newspaper. “National Front’s success is a message of populist exasperation, rejection of politics, and fear of Europe. The French ‘disease’ is severe and it may spread to other European societies,” analyst and Paris correspondent Massimo Nava elaborated.

Xi’s visit opens new chapter for China-France ties upon golden jubilee

BEIJING, 25 March — At the annual Chinese Spring Festival gala on 30 January, French star Sophie Marceau, in an elegant red long dress, performed Edith Piaf’s La Vie En Rose with Chinese musician Liu Huan.

The beautiful duet is a vivid embodiment of the blossomy China-France relationship.

Just three days before the show was the 50th anniversary of the establishment of the diplomatic ties between the two countries. Fifty days after that, Chinese President Xi Jinping is now set to further consolidate bilateral amity by visiting the

first major Western country that forged formal ties with the People’s Republic of China in 1964.

Indeed, the friendship between the two permanent members of the UN Security Council is an example of candid and constructive relations between Eastern and Western countries in the modern world. Frequent high-level visits, various people-to-people exchanges and prolific cooperation in such areas as nuclear energy, aviation and automobile manufacturing have bonded the two countries and peoples closer.

In a historical rari-

ty, France’s president and prime minister both visited China last year. In April, President Francois Hollande signed with China a major Airbus jets deal. Eight months later, Prime Minister Jean-Marc Ayrault vowed in China to facilitate bilateral cooperation in civilian nuclear power and to simplify visa procedures for Chinese citizens travelling to France.

As Xi arrives in Lyon on Tuesday and kicks off a state visit to France, the China-France relationship is presented with a golden opportunity to move further forward.

In order to achieve a more friendly, fruitful and resilient relationship, the two sides need to bear in mind that mutual respect is an indispensable component of friendship.

China-France ties went astray when Paris decided to sell arms to Taiwan in the early 1990s, and when former French President Nicolas Sarkozy met the Dalai Lama in 2008 while his country chaired the European Union.

Fortunately, the overall development of the China-France relations has been kept in the right direction.

Thai protesters hope vote for Senate will tee up PM’s impeachment

BANGKOK, 25 March — Anti-government protesters marched in Bangkok on Tuesday to drum up support for a rally at the weekend, just before Thailand holds elections for the Senate, which will play a central role in their aim of removing Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra.

The demonstrators led by Suthep Thaugsuban disrupted a general election for the lower house in February, which was annulled by the Constitutional Court on Friday, but they have no problem with Sunday’s vote for the upper house.

“We will not block Sunday’s Senate election, because we need to reform the executive and legislative branches and the Senate is key to our reform

plans,” Wittaya Kaewparadai, a protest leader, told Reuters.

Thailand has been in crisis since former premier Thaksin Shinawatra, Yingluck’s brother, was ousted in a 2006 coup. The conflict broadly pits the Bangkok-based middle class and royalist establishment against the mostly poorer, rural supporters of the Shinawatras.

The turmoil entered a fresh phase in November, when anti-government protesters first took to the streets, with 23 people killed during the political violence over the following months.

Sunday’s vote is to elect 77 senators for the 150-seat Senate. The rest are appointed, and a gov-

ernment attempt to make it a fully elected body was one of the sparks that set off the latest unrest in November.

The non-elected Senators are picked by judges and senior officials from agencies such as the National Anti-Corruption Commission (NACC), members of an establishment whom government supporters see as viscerally anti-Thaksin.

The protesters appear confident that Sunday’s vote will deliver a Senate majority likely to impeach Yingluck after an investigation under way by the NACC.

Yingluck has until the end of the month to answer a charge of dereliction of duty over a ruinous

rice-buying scheme that has run up huge losses and left hundreds of thousands

of farmers unpaid. The prime minister is unlikely to attend the NACC hearing,

and Yingluck’s lawyers will probably present her defence.—Reuters

Cyber fugitive Dotcom mocks authorities: “From 0 into a \$210m company”

WELLINGTON, 25 March—Kim Dotcom, one of the world's most wanted cyber fugitives, on Tuesday gloated over a deal that will see a cloud storage firm he founded while on bail listing on the New Zealand stock exchange and valued on paper at NZ\$210 million.

The flashy internet mogul, who also goes by the name Kim Schmitz, is fighting a bid by US authorities to extradite him from the lavish estate he lives in New Zealand to face online piracy charges over the now closed file sharing site Megaupload.

The New Zealand government in early 2012 arrested Dotcom at his mansion near Auckland in a SWAT-style raid requested by the Federal Bureau

of Investigation. Dotcom is free on bail as he fights extradition although his movements are restricted.

After a reverse takeover deal was announced between Mega Ltd and TRS (TRS.NZ), an inactive local investment firm, Dotcom tweeted: “Indicted. Raided. On Bail. All assets frozen without trial. But we don't cry ourselves to sleep. We built #Mega from 0 into a \$210m company.”

TRS said in a statement to the New Zealand stock exchange it had a conditional agreement to buy Mega Ltd through a share issue to Mega's shareholders, which will result in them holding 99 percent of TRS.

The plan, expected to be completed by the end of May, would see the issue

of 700 million new TRS shares at 30 NZ cents each, after which TRS's current 1.1 billion shares would be reduced to about 7 million.

Mega Ltd, launched in 2013 by Dotcom and several other people involved in Megaupload, offers encrypted, cloud-based data storage. It claims about 7 million registered users.

New Zealand company records show Mega Ltd's shareholders include Dotcom's wife, through a trust, with a 26 percent stake. Dotcom is not listed as a shareholder nor a director, but on the Mega website he is called principal strategist.

Dotcom, a large, ebullient German national with New Zealand residency, could not be reached for comment.

Luxottica, Google clinch Glass eyewear deal

MILAN, 25 March—Ray-Ban sunglasses maker Luxottica (LUX.MI) said on Monday it had sealed a strategic partnership with Google Inc (GOOG.O) over its Glass eyewear that could pave the way for a new market in smart glasses.

In a statement, Italy's Luxottica said it would design, develop and distribute a new kind of eyewear for the US group's Internet-connected Glass eyewear.

Google Glass is a small stamp-sized screen attached to a pair of eyeglass frames. It can record video, access email, and retrieve information from the Web by connecting wirelessly to a user's cell phone.

Luxottica said the two groups would work together to create innovative wearable devices for the

iconic Glass brand.

No financial terms were disclosed.

Luxottica said its two major brands, Ray-Ban and Oakley, would be part of the deal with Glass but it gave no further details.

“We believe that a strategic partnership with a leading player like Google is the ideal platform for developing a new way forward in our industry and answering the evolving needs of consumers on a global scale,” Luxottica Chief Executive Officer Andrea Guerra said.

Many believe wearable computers such as Google Glass represent the next big shift in technology, just as smartphones evolved from personal computers.

But some concern has been expressed over possible privacy intrusion issues the device might entail.

China's President challenges Obama on telecoms spying report

BEIJING, 25 March—China's President Xi Jinping questioned his US counterpart Barack Obama about reports that Washington had secretly tapped Chinese telecoms giant Huawei for years, a top security aide said on Monday.

“President Xi did raise that recent report in the context of their discussions on cyber-security,” Ben Rhodes, Obama's deputy national security adviser, told a press briefing.

Obama “made clear” to Xi that “the United States does not engage in

espionage to gain commercial advantage,” Rhodes said after the two leaders met on the sidelines of a major summit on nuclear security in The Hague.

The New York Times and Germany's Der Spiegel said that the NSA had accessed Huawei's email archive, communications between top company officials, and even the secret source code of some of its products.

At an official press briefing in Beijing earlier Monday, a foreign ministry spokesman said China

was “seriously concerned” about the reports, which were based on documents provided by fugitive NSA contractor Edward Snowden.

Spokesman Hong Lei told reporters that Beijing had on “many occasions” asked Washington for answers on reports of US surveillance activities in countries across the globe.

“We ask America to give a clear explanation and stop such behaviour,” he said.

Beijing itself has repeatedly been accused of

large-scale cyber-espionage, which it vehemently denies.

The Chinese reprimand came after a top Huawei official similarly denounced the NSA.

Rhodes said that both the US and China “engage in intelligence activities on matters of national security”. “But there's a clear distinction in our view between intelligence activities that have a national security purpose and intelligence activities that have a commercial purpose,” he said.—Reuters

Australian PM aiming for free trade “trifecta” in north Asia tour

CANBERRA, 25 March — Australian Prime Minister Tony Abbott on Tuesday said he would be working for the “trifecta” of free trade with the country’s three biggest trading partners when he leads trade missions to Japan, the Republic of Korea (ROK) and China next month.

“This will be my first official visit to north Asia and it’s happening very early in the new government’s term,” Abbott said in a speech to the Asia Society in Canberra.

“There is, of course, no law of nature saying that the Asian middle class must buy the products of Australian manufacturers,

must use our services, must study at our colleges, or must visit our tourist destinations,” he said.

“Just because Asian countries have found Australia a good supplier in the past, doesn’t mean they will inevitably do so in the future. That’s why this government is doing everything it can to complete free trade agreements with our top three export markets.” He said he hoped to witness the signing of the ROK-Australia free trade agreement (FTA), to finalize the Japan-Australia FTA, and to announce substantial progress towards freer trade with China.

S Korea, New Zealand to hold talks on FTA

SEOUL, 25 March — South Korea and New Zealand will hold talks on the bilateral free trade agreement (FTA) this week to reach a compromise on remaining issues, Seoul’s Trade Ministry said on Tuesday.

The sixth round of FTA negotiations will be held in Seoul from Wednesday to Friday, according to the Ministry of Trade, Industry and Energy.

The bilateral talks had been suspended for around four years since May 2010 as South Korea sought the delay of liberalization in the agricultural sector, but the negotiations were resumed last month.

The ministry said it will seek, at the upcoming talks, to reach a compromise on the lingering

issues in the service, investment, rule of origin and customs.

The upcoming round was expected to make great progress in concluding the long-stalled negotiations given that South Korea signed a separate FTA with Canada earlier this month only about five months after the talks were resumed following a five-year suspension.

Seoul has sought to come to agreement in FTA talks with members of the Trans-Pacific Partnership (TPP) to join the multi-lateral trade pact, which include Canada, Australia and New Zealand as well as the United States, Brunei, Chile, Japan, Malaysia, Mexico, Peru, Singapore and Vietnam.

Fukushima fishermen OK dumping groundwater from Fukushima plant

FUKUSHIMA, (Japan), 25 March — A local fishermen organization on Tuesday decided to allow Tokyo Electric Power Co to dump groundwater at the crippled Fukushima Daiichi nuclear complex into the sea on condition that the water is clean enough for release.

The measure is expected to slow the pace of increase of toxic water at the plant, as groundwater will be pumped up before it gets mixed with highly radioactive water accumulating at the basement of reactor buildings and will be directed to the Pacific Ocean.

Amid concerns that the move could harm the marine environment, TEPCO said in February that it will set stringent safety criteria for the water release. For example, the density of

radioactive tritium in the water should not exceed one-fortieth of the legal limit.

But it is not clear whether the so-called groundwater bypass system will operate smoothly, with the plant plagued by various problems linked to the toxic water management.

On Tuesday, the Fukushima Prefectural Federation of Fisheries Co-operative Associations handed a petition that calls on TEPCO and the government to make sure that the water released into the sea is below the required radiation levels.

Highly radioactive water is increasing by about 400 tons daily at the plant because the same volume of groundwater is seeping into the basement of

reactor buildings and mixing with water used to cool three reactors that suffered meltdowns in the 2011 accident.

By operating the groundwater bypass system, TEPCO says it can reduce the amount of water seeping into the reactor buildings by about 100 tons per day.

TEPCO finished installing a dozen wells in March last year to pump up uncontaminated groundwater. But the utility has not been able to discharge groundwater up to now amid local reluctance.

TEPCO also plans to start building from June a huge underground ice wall around the reactor buildings to block the entry of groundwater.

3 cops injured in landmine blast by left-wing rebels in eastern India

NEW DELHI, 25 March — At least three policemen sustained serious injuries in a landmine blast triggered by suspected left-wing Naxalite rebels in the eastern Indian state of Jharkhand on Tuesday, a senior police official said.

“A police team was coming back to a local police station in the state’s Khunti District this morning from a remote place when the blast took place. The three injured have been rushed to a hospital where their condition are said to be serious,” he said on condition of anonymity.

A manhunt has been launched to track down the rebels, the official added.

Thai bus accident kills 27

BANGKOK, 25 March — A bus plunged into a valley in northern Thailand’s Tak Province at around 10:30 pm local time on Monday, leaving at least 27 people dead and 24 others injured, local media reported.

The accident happened after the bus’ brakes failed, the Spring News reported, adding that 24 people died on the spot and three others were later pronounced dead at the hospital.

Two road accidents kill 20 in China

CHONGQING / KUNMING, 25 March — Twenty people were killed and dozens more injured in two separate road accidents in southwest China, authorities said on Tuesday.

Fifteen people have died and 56 others were injured in a multiple pileup early Tuesday on an expressway section in Chongqing Municipality. The accident happened just after midnight when a truck hit an overturned coach, and vehicles behind plowed into the back of the truck at a section of the Baotou-Maoming Expressway.

S Korea urges N Korea to halt ‘provocative words and actions’

SEOUL, 25 March — South Korea urged North Korea on Tuesday to abide by international obligations.

“North Korea should halt provocative words and actions increasing tensions on the Korean Peninsula and abide by UN resolutions and other international obligations,” South Korea’s Foreign Ministry spokesman said during a press briefing.

Cho Tai Young’s remarks were made after a North Korean envoy at the United Nations slammed the United States for conducting military drills

with the South that he said exacerbate regional tensions, warning Pyongyang will take “additional measures.”

In a Press conference in New York, Deputy Ambassador Ri Tong Il did not elaborate on what the additional measures would be but said, “I think the meaning is clear to you, the additional measures are ready, but we are keeping ourselves restrained.”

The Foal Eagle combat field training between the United States and South Korea started in March and runs through 18 April.

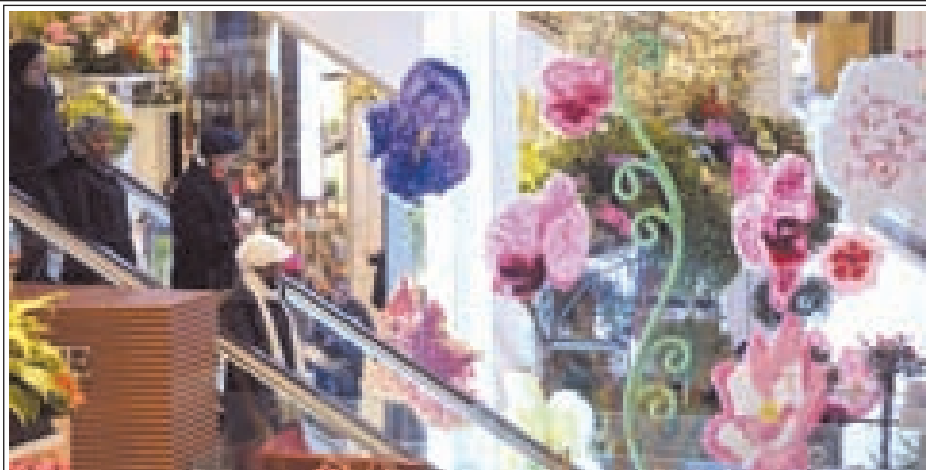

China should facilitate inclusive, sustainable urbanization: WB

BEIJING, 25 March — While urbanization has been good for growth and economic transformation, China now needs a new model, World Bank Managing Director Sri Mulyani Indrawati, said here on Tuesday.

"China has avoided some of the common ills of urbanization, notably poverty, unemployment and slums, but despite the success, the strain is starting to show," she said at the International Conference on Urban China: Toward Efficient, Inclusive and Sustainable Urbanization.

China's growth has been driven by investment rather than productivity, but investment has become less effective in generating growth both in cities and nationwide. Urbanization has relied on land conversion and land financing, which is causing urban sprawl and, on occasion, ghost towns and waste, she noted.

Barriers to migration have kept China's urbanization rate artificially low, curbing economic opportunities and widening urban-rural income inequality. Citizens without urban

household registration (hukou) do not enjoy equal access to public services in cities, another barrier to mobility, said Indrawati.

Through better allocation of land, labor, and capital a new model of urbanization can help China share the benefits of urbanization more widely than in the past, and it can be environmentally sustainable while ensuring China's food security, she said at the release of a joint report by the World Bank and the Development Research Center of the State Council.

Three Russian warships pass Dardanelles Strait in Turkey

ISTANBUL, 25 March — Three Russian warships passed Dardanelles Strait in Turkey and headed towards the Mediterranean Sea on Monday morning.

Local Dogan News Agency (DHA) reported that the Russian warships made the movement after a Syrian warplane was shot

down by Turkish military on Sunday.

Russian warships Minks, Olenegorsky and Kaliningrad are sailing in the Marmara Sea from the Black Sea. A Turkish coast guard ship escorted the warships during their passage from the Dardanelles Strait.—Xinhua

Indonesia extends heartfelt condolence to MH370 plane tragedy

JAKARTA, 25 March — Indonesian President Susilo Bambang Yudhoyono on Tuesday on behalf of the Indonesian people extended his heartfelt condolence to the accident of Malaysian airline plane MH370 that crashed into southern Indian Ocean and killed all 239 people on board. President Yudhoyono made the statement on his twitter account following the announcement by Malaysian Prime Minister Najib Razak on Monday night that the plane losing contact on March 8 crashed into the ocean with none of passengers and crew alive. "Indonesia is mourning on the tragedy of MH370 plane," President Yudhoyono said on his twitter account. "To the people of Malaysia and Prime Minister Najib Razak, we extend heartfelt condolence to this tragedy," said Yudhoyono.—Xinhua

‘Divergent’ teen warriors defeat ‘Muppets’ at box office

LOS ANGELES, 25 March — Dystopian thriller “Divergent,” the story of a society that divides people based on personality traits, dominated weekend movie charts with \$56 million in US and Canadian ticket sales, kicking off a new franchise for “Hunger Games” producer Lions Gate Entertainment Corp (LGF.N).

Walt Disney Co (DIS.N) family comedy

“Muppets Most Wanted” finished in second place, nabbing \$16.5 million from Friday through Sunday, according to estimates provided by Rentrak. Animated “Mr Peabody & Sherman,” produced by Dreamworks Animation Inc (DWA.O), took the No 3 slot with \$11.7 million.

“Divergent” is adapted from a popular series of young adult novels by

newcomer author Veronica Roth. Ahead of the weekend, forecasters had predicted the film would debut with between \$50 million and \$68 million in North American (US and Canadian) ticket sales.

Shailene Woodley stars in “Divergent” as Tris Prior, a teenager who doesn’t fit in to a faction because she has multiple dominant personality traits, making her a threat

to the government. She chooses to join the Dauntless faction of warriors who defend the society’s inhabitants. British actor Theo James plays Four, Tris’ mentor and love interest.

The debut of “Divergent” fell short of the box office heights of two other young adult franchises. “Hunger Games” started with a massive \$152.5 million in March 2012 while

“Twilight” opened with \$69.6 million in November 2008.

Lions Gate said Friday it was confident “Divergent” would become an important franchise for the company and it was moving ahead with the second film in the series, called “Insurgent,” which will reach theaters in March 2015.

Noting that the “Divergent” opening was shy of blockbusters “Hunger Games” and “Twilight,” Jeff Bock, senior box office analyst at Exhibitor Relations Co, said “\$56 million is a great opening for any film, and virtually locked down the proposed trilogy.”

“This is something to build on for the series, and with the cast expected to be in high demand, the ‘Divergent’ legacy will continue to grow,” Bock added.

Richie Fay, the studio’s president of domestic distribution, said, “We’re very pleased with the outcome for the franchise launch.”

The movie’s A+ CinemaScore grade from the under-18 audience bodes well for the coming weeks as spring break and Easter school holidays approach, Fay said, noting, “The young adult audience has been underserved in the last couple of weeks.”

My family takes up a lot of my time and my creative energy, but I’m lucky to have worked enough already to allow myself to take time off,” said Julia Roberts, who made her acting debut in late 1980s.

“When I see my friends struggling to juggle both, I feel very privileged. I act less, but better; I’ve always been demanding (of a role), now I’m difficult,” she added.

Angelina Jolie, Stella McCartney create Maleficent-inspired children’s clothing

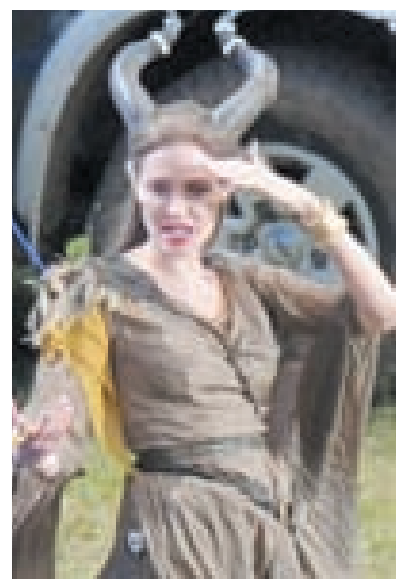

David Beckham unveils proposal for waterfront Miami soccer stadium

MIAMI, 25 March — A group led by English football star David Beckham unveiled plans on Monday to build a 25,000-seat football stadium on Miami's waterfront for the Major League Soccer team he will own, but the proposal is already facing some opposition.

The open-air stadium would be built in an

area known as PortMiami, which hosts the world's busiest cruise ship terminal. Long-term plans for the island port have never included the possibility of being home to a sports arena, port officials have said.

PortMiami Director Bill Johnson declined to comment on the stadium proposal. "The important part for us is getting

everybody on side, getting everybody to realize why we want to bring the team here, and why we want to have the stadium in a certain place," Beckham told reporters in Miami.

Royal Caribbean Cruises, whose headquarters are located at the port, has expressed concern about the proposed stadium, citing traffic concerns

and its own plans to develop the land the Beckham group hopes to lease for the stadium. "We have shared our serious reservations about the suitability of PortMiami as a location for a stadium," Cynthia Martinez, Royal Caribbean's director for global corporate communications, wrote in an e-mail on Monday.—Reuters

Ruthless Nadal continues Miami rampage

MIAMI, 25 March — World number one Rafa Nadal continued his ruthless rampage through the Sony Open on Monday, crushing Uzbekistan's Denis Istomin 6-1, 6-0 to reach the fourth round at Crandon Park.

Also through to the next round is Australian Open champion Stanislas Wawrinka, who looked sharp in a no-nonsense 7-5, 6-4 win over Frenchman Edouard Roger-Vasselin.

Nadal, who has reached the final three times but never lifted the Miami

title, blew past Lleyton Hewitt in the second round before overwhelming Istomin in less than an hour in a centre court master class.

Next up for the Spaniard is a fourth round meeting on Tuesday with Italian 14th seed Fabio Fognini, who advanced with a 4-6, 6-3, 6-3 comeback win over Spain's Roberto Bautista Agut.

Further down the road is a possible semi-final meeting with third seed Wawrinka, who beat the Spaniard in the final of the Australian Open to claim

his first grand slam title.

Nadal has shown no signs of losing focus, however, and broke Istomin twice to open the match and grab a 4-0 lead.

The 57th ranked Istomin finally held serve at 4-1 but that would be the only time as Nadal thundered through the next eight game to complete the rout.

"I played a very complete match," said Nadal, who was given a warning for slow play. "No match is perfect but I did a lot of things very well. No mistakes, serving with good percentage, and playing a lot of winners.

"My movements were better than what I did last event events.

That's a very important thing for me."

Wawrinka, who has admitted to suffering something of a grand slam hangover, has already matched his best effort in six visits to Miami. His win set up a last 16 meeting with Ukraine's Alexander Dolgoplov, a 3-6, 6-0, 7-6(5) winner over Serb Dusan Lajovic.—Reuters

Water buffaloes escape Sydney film set, race down busy street

SYDNEY, 25 March — Two water buffaloes startled residents of an inner-Sydney suburb on Tuesday morning, as they pelted 2 km (1.2 miles) down a city street past disbelieving pedestrians, while car drivers scurried to get out of the way.

Eyewitnesses told local media the buffaloes looked agitated, having escaped from a city park where an advertisement was being filmed.

"I was just waiting for the bus and instead of a bus, two random buffalo ran past," Abril Felman, a student at the University of Sydney campus nearby, told Reuters by telephone.

Firefighters rounded up the animals and live-tweeted the operation, saying they used ladders and firefighting gear to corral the animals into a makeshift pen, until handlers from the film set took them away.—Reuters

NEW YORK, 25 March—Tiger Woods is still no closer to knowing whether he will be able to play in next month's Masters as he struggles with back pain.

The world number one withdrew from last week's Arnold Palmer Invitational in Florida because of his aching back and remains unsure if he will be fit for this year's first major, starting on 10 April at Augusta National.

Woods has been plagued by back problems since last year but his condition worsened over the

past month. The 38-year-old American failed to finish the Honda Classic at Palm Beach Gardens earlier this month, quitting after 13 holes in his final round.

Then he tweaked his back again on the last day at the WGC-Cadillac Championship in Miami a week later, tumbling out of contention with a final-round 78 to finish tied for 25th.—Reuters

Referee retained despite Arsenal red-card blunder

LONDON, 25 March—Referee Andre Marriner will remain a part of next weekend's Premier League games despite his high-profile gaffe in sending off the wrong Arsenal player at Chelsea on Saturday.

Marriner will take charge of Southampton against Newcastle United on Saturday, the Premier League said.

The referee caused uproar when he awarded a penalty against Arsenal for Alex Oxlade-Chamberlain's handball and then sent off Kieran Gibbs by mistake despite the real

culprit owning up at the time.

Arsenal went on to lose 6-0 at Stamford Bridge but Marriner's blunder was the talk of the afternoon, with the referee later expressing his 'disappointment' to Arsenal.

Former World Cup referee Clive Thomas told BBC radio the referee had made a "disgusting, shocking decision" and suggested Marriner should be stood down for the rest of the Premier League season.

Wenger urges shattered team to respond in the right way

LONDON, 25 March—Arsenal manager Arsene Wenger promised the club's stunned supporters they would do everything they could to "respond in the right way" to Saturday's 6-0 defeat at Chelsea when they play Swansea City at the Emirates on Tuesday.

Wenger, who only spoke to TV reporters at Stamford Bridge and did not hold his routine pre-match news conference before a game, sent out his message in an email to supporters and later expanded on his thoughts in a written statement to the media.

Saturday's defeat in his 1,000th match in charge of the club was Arsenal's joint-worst defeat in the Premier League era and their heaviest defeat in London since a 6-0 loss at West Ham United in 1960.

Wenger, who described the day as "a nightmare"

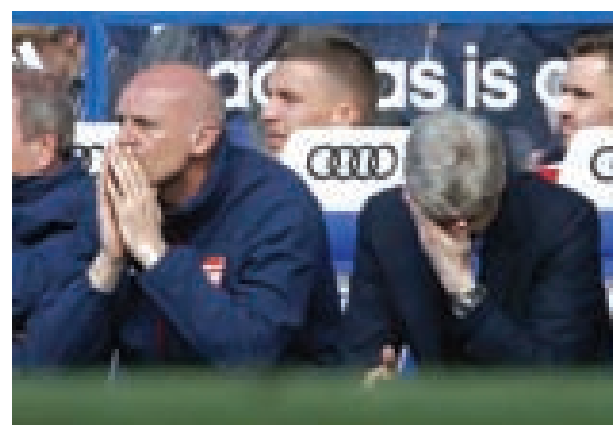

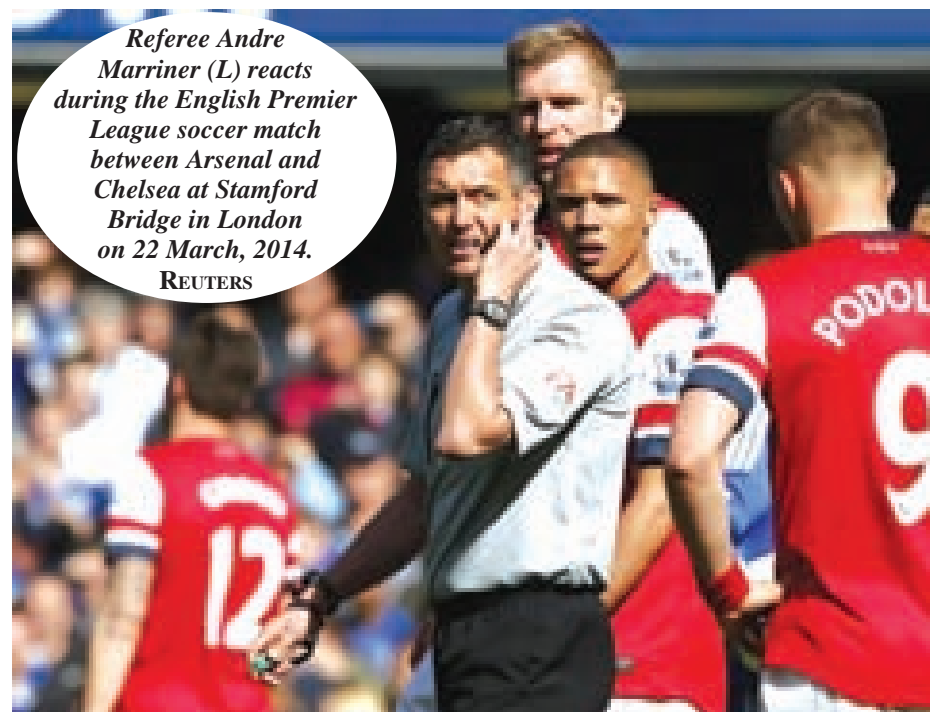
