Villagers near Nay Pyi Taw pin hopes on census for jobs

As Myanmar's first census in over three decades is under way, people in Wegyi Village near Nay Pyi Taw are waiting for the arrival of authorities to question them with mixed feelings, with many villagers saying they feel depressed and hopeless about their future as most cannot find a job and rely entirely on their vegetable garden ent's small hut. for survival.

holds in Wegyi Village, only a few lucky ones have found jobs in town-and they have left the village a long time ago. Making a living is a major struggle for all residents, with the census not even a topic of discussion for them.

"I didn't see any pamphlets or posters about the census. I am not interested in it anyway, because I am too busy trying to survive. It is very difficult to survive here," said Ko San Myint, a 35-year old smallscale farmer with a weath-

"I depend on my parents, so I really hope to get a job as a result of the census," said 37-year old Daw Win Mar, while cradling her child outside her par-

Of the 300 house- Kyaukse University, Ma said. And like all the oth-Zu Zin Hnin, 22, said he hopes for electrification as an outcome of the census.

> "I want electricity supply not only for our village but also the other villages. And I wish the officials would open a library here and renovate the primary school," he said.

While the last census in Myanmar was taken in

1983, the older generation in the village cannot remember it, like U Myint Than, who is now 59.

"I don't remember anyone coming. And now...there is basically no knowledge on the census in this village, although the officials distributed pamphlets and put a poster on the tree. I know about the census through educational A graduate from programmes on TV," he ers he hopes the officials will create job opportunities for people, at least for those who have graduated. "But some parents do not even want their children to go to universities. They do not want to pay the fees for an education because here in our village none of the graduates managed to get

a job. The youth feels depressed about this," he said. And there is much doubt that the census is going to change this.



JA eyes appointing entrepreneurial farmers as key co-op officials

Токуо, 3 April — The governing body of agricultural cooperatives in Japan said on Thursday it will appoint entrepreneurial farmers as senior officials of local agricultural cooperatives as part of efforts to rejuvenate its organization.

JA-Zenchu, or the Central Union of Agricultural Cooperatives, also said it will enable food manufacturers with ties to farmers to take part in the management of agricultural cooperatives as quasi-members.

Albania approves bills on employment promotion programmes

TIRANA, 3 April The Albanian Council of Ministers approved on Wednesday a series of bills on employment promotion according programmes, to Albanian Telegraphic Agency(ATA). The programmes are intended to assist women, unemployed, young and unskilled people, those who receive financial assistance, long-term unemployed, people with disabilities. Albanian Deputy Minister of Social Welfare and Youth Bardhylka Kospiri said that thanks to these changes, every private subject will have the right to apply and benefit from the funds of these programmes.

She said these changes will bring innovation with the introduction of electronic means of communication and application for employment promotion programmes. —Xinhua

While the initiatives represent the JA governing body's readiness to preempt the reform debate taking place on a government panel and within the ruling Liberal Democratic Party, the absence of an effort to rethink the group's financial service expansion plan could leave the latest initiatives open to future review, observers say.

Many farmers who play a central role in local farming are very entrepreneurially minded and are eager to reduce costs by increasing

production in a bid to make their businesses profitable. But because many of the "full cooperative members" who have a say in running local agricultural cooperatives come from households that earn part of their income from nonagricultural sources, some people say those who play a leading role in local farming have encountered problems having their views taken into account.

JA-Zenchu hopes to rejuvenate local agricultural cooperatives by tapping

such farmers as senior cooperative officials and increasing opportunities for the farmers to take part in the cooperatives' management. The plan to involve food manufacturers reflects the JA governing body's efforts to bring in corporate viewpoints and strengthen the capacity of individual farm cooperatives in devising business strategies entailing not just food production but processing and distribution.

US offers rewards for information on key figures of Turkish terror group

Washington, 3 April The United States on Wednesday announced rewards up to 3 million dollars each for information on three key figures of an alleged terrorist group in Turkey.

The State Department is trying to locate Musa Asoglu, Zerrin Sari and

Seher Demir Sen, central committee members of the People's Revolutionary Party/Front Liberation (DHKP/C), a group branded as terrorist organization by both Washington and Ankara.

The agency said the group has targeted US interests, including US military

and diplomatic personnel and facilities, NATO personnel and facilities, and Turkish targets since the 1990s. In February 2013, a suicide bomber linked to the group attacked the US embassy in Ankara, killing a Turkish security guard, the department said.

Key deals signed during Xi's tour of Europe

Beijing, 3 April, — During his four-nation tour of Europe, President Xi signed a number of agreements covering wide range of areas.

China's dairy industry is set to receive expertise from the Netherlands, the two countries having signed a deal allowing Dutch experts to help China increase its annual milk production to 40 billion kilograms. A food security system will be jointly built by Yili Group, one of China's largest dairy producers, and Wageningen University.

China and France signed agreements worth 18 billion euros. This

included the purchase of 70 airbus planes from France. The two countries will also produce 1,000 civilian helicopters over 20 years.

During Xi's visit in Germany, the car company Daimler signed deals with Beijing Automotive Industry Corporation to expand the production capacity in Beijing. The two countries' central banks also inked an agreement, allowing RMB-dominated payments to be cleared and settled in Frankfurt. During the visit in Brussels, China and EU agreed to accelerate the talks on Free Trade Pact, increase bilateral trade and investment.

Pentagon pledges continued aid for MH370 search

Honolulu, 3 April US Defence Secretary Chuck Hagel on Wednesday pledged to continue providing US assistance for the search for missing Malaysia Airlines Flight

Speaking at a Press conference aboard USS Anchorage in Honolulu, Hagel told reporters that the United State has been complying with "every request made by the Malaysian government" to assist in the search in the last several weeks.

laysian Defence Minister and acting Transport Hishammud-Minister din Hussein during the US-ASEAN Defence Forum that is being held here, and the latter did not ask him for "any specific new

Hagel pledged that the United States will "continue to do everything we need to do" in assisting the Malaysian and other people in

the Asia-Pacific region that have been affected by the "very mysterious flight" to seek out what happened.

The multi-national massive search for the missing flight has emerged to be one of the topics that the Pentagon chief planned to discuss with his fellow defence chiefs during the US-ASEAN Defence Forum in Hawaii.

Hagel told reporters en route to Hawaii on Tuesday that the massive search has "big limitations to how much we can do" He said he met with with "the huge amount of unknowns"

> Like other tragedies, there is always "lessons to be learned," Hagel said.

> "We're going to go back, the Malaysians will go back, all the ASEAN nations will go back and walk through this — what could have been done, maybe what should have been done, what needs to be done better," he added.

Soldier kills three, wounds 16 before taking own life at Texas Army base

FORT HOOD, (Texas), 3 April — A US soldier with mental health issues shot dead three people and injured at least 16 on Wednesday before taking his own life at an Army base in Fort Hood, Texas, the site of another deadly rampage in 2009, US military officials said.

The soldier, who was being treated for depression and anxiety, went to two buildings on the base and opened fire before he was confronted by military police, Fort Hood commanding officer Mark Milley said.

The gunman, whose motive remains unknown, then shot himself in the head with a .45-caliber pistol, he added.

'The shooter is dead from a self-inflicted gunshot wound," Milley told a news conference. "At this

time there is no indication that this incident is related to terrorism."

Security officials said preliminary information identified the gunman as

Ivan Lopez but Milley declined to identify the shooter, who is married, until his family was noti-

served for four months in Iraq in 2011, Milley said, and was also undergoing a diagnosis for post traumatic stress disorder.

The Scott & White

Hospital in Temple, Texas, where some of the wounded were taken, said nine patients were in intensive care, three in critical condition.

President Barack Obama said he was "heartbroken" that another shooting had occurred at the Fort Hood Army base.

"We are going to get to the bottom of exactly what happened," Obama said. "We're heartbroken that something like this might have happened again.'

The shooting, the third such incident at a military base in the United States in about six months, started at about 4 pm local time (2100 GMT) and put Fort Hood on immediate lockdown.

Milley said the shooter walked into one of the unit buildings, opened fire,

then got into a vehicle and fired from there. He then went into another building and opened fire again, until he was engaged by Fort Hood law enforcement.

When confronted by a female military police officer, he killed himself with his semi-automatic weapon in the parking lot.

"He was approaching her at about 20 feet. He put his hands up, then reached under his jacket, pulled out the (.45) and she pulled out her weapon and then she engaged, and he then he put the weapon to his head," Milley said.

One of the buildings housed medical brigade day-to-day operations and the other, nearby, served the administration of the transportation battalion. All the killed and wounded were military personnel.

Armed men abduct Chinese, Philippine women from Malaysia dive resort

April — Armed men abducted two women, a Chinese tourist and a Philippine hotel worker, from a Malaysian diving resort off Borneo island, Malaysian security forces said on Thursday.

The two women were taken at around 10.30 pm (1430 GMT) on Wednesday night from Singgahmata island off the coastal town of Semporna in Malaysia's eastern state of Sabah, Eastern Sabah Security Command Director

Kuala Lumpur, 3 Mohammad Mentek said.

"We have handed this to the police to quickly investigate and come up with full report," Mohammad said in a statement.

Some Malaysian media reports said the 29-year old tourist from was in her room when the gunmen forced her out into a waiting boat, but it was unclear where the hotel worker, aged 40, was when she was abducted. Other reports said both women were on the jetty when they were

An employee at the news agency said Chinese Singamata Reef Resort, contacted by Reuters, confirmed an abduction had taken place, but declined to provide details. Malaysian police could not immediately be reached for com-

Malaysia's image has been battered in China over the handling of the investigation into the disappearance of a Malaysia Airlines flight with 239 people aboard, most of them Chinese nationals, on 8 March.

PERTH/KUALA LUMPUR, 3 April — Malaysia's prime minister visited the Australian search base for missing Flight MH370 on Thursday as a nuclear-powered submarine joined the near-four week hunt that has so far failed to find any sign of the missing airliner and the 239 people on board. Najib Razak joined his Australian counterpart Tony Abbott at RAAF Base Pearce, near Perth, where aircrews from seven countries have been flying dozens of missions deep into the southern Indian Ocean looking for debris from the Malaysia Airlines

"The world expects us to do our level best, and I'm very confident we will indeed show what we can do together as a group of nations; that we want to find answers, that we want to provide comfort to the families and we will not rest until answers are

indeed found," said Najib, as the two leaders spoke to search and recovery team at the air base. The Boeing 777 lost communications and disappeared from civilian radar less than an hour into an overnight flight from Kuala Lumpur to Beijing on 8 March.

It was briefly picked up on military radar on the other side of Malaysia and analysis of subsequent hourly electronic "pings" sent to a satellite led investigators to conclude the plane crashed far off the west Australian coast hours later. Retired Air Chief Marshal Angus Houston, the head of the Australian agency coordinating the operation, said an international air crash investigation team with analysts from Malaysia, the United States, Britain, China and Australia was continuing to refine the search area.

Bangkok, 3 April government said on Thursday it fears a violent backlash if Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra is removed from power as figures for March show consumer confidence

slipped to a new low, illustrating the heavy toll of months of unrest. The Constitutional Court on Wednesday accepted a case lodged by 27 senators who say Yingluck's transfer of the national security chief

in 2011 was politically motivated. If she is found to have violated the constitution, the court could remove her from power.

It remains unclear when the court will rule but Yingluck has been given 15 days to defend herself.

'If the prime minister is removed from her position, a power vacuum will occur and chaos will definitely ensue," Foreign Minister Surapong Tovichakchaikul told reporters. "Thais are hot-tempered and a confrontation could take place,".

Over the past five months, protesters have shut state offices and disrupted a 2 February election which was nullified by a court on 21 March. They want to remove Yingluck

and rid the country of the influence of her brother, ousted former premier Thaksin Shinawatra, to make way for broad political reforms before a new general election takes place. Protesters have stepped up their activities in recent days, bolstered by a series of legal challenges piling up against Yingluck.

The end game near! All will be over by the end of April!" shouted one protest leader to thunderous applause at protest headquarters in Bangkok's Lumpini Park. Twenty-four people have been killed in politically related violence since late November, including a protester shot in the head on Tuesday after weeks of calm in the capital.—Reuters

Liu Han, the former chairman of unlisted Hanlong Group and once ranked the 230th richest person in China, went on trial on Monday in central Hubei Province along with the other members of his "mafia-style" gang.

The probe marks one of the highest-profile cases against a private businessman since President Xi Jinping took power last year, vowing to crack down on corruption.

Liu, who was arrested last year, faces charges ranging from extortion and carried out in southwestern Sichuan Province. His gang is accused of nine murders.

Two sources told Reuters that Liu was also a business partner of Zhou Bin, the eldest son of Zhou Yongkang, who is at the centre of China's biggest corruption scandal in more than six decades.

"The defendant Liu Han questioned the evidence presented against him by prosecutors," the Xianning Intermediate Court said in an account of the proceedings released on its microblog late on Wednesday.

On Tuesday, Liu denied leading a gang,

according to the court.

Liu told the court that many of the alleged gangsters are his own or his family's drivers, according to state media.

He said that even though he knew nothing about the murder cases, he was sorry for the victims and their family members, adding that he wished to compensate the victims' families "out of sympathy and humanity", according to state media reports.

Liu said he had not killed anybody and denied allegations prosecutors' that he held and traded guns illegally, the reports added.

Haitian government announces major cabinet reshuffle



It saw the return of former Minister of Economy and Finance Marie Carmelle Jean-Marie, who resigned last year, complaining of a lack of support from other ministers to make public finances more transparent.

The ministries of Education, Culture, Defence and Communications were also reassigned. In a sign of openness, the Ministry of Youth and Sport was entrusted to Himmler Rébu, a frequent critic of the government.—Reuters

The coordinator of the federal government's data processing service (Serpro), Marcos Mello, said the system uses passwords and digital markers to safeguard emails from snooping, as well as certifying the authenticity of the email's origin.

"All the security tests were done" on the system, including "a simulated break in," Mello added. Government intelligence worked on developing the software with the help of the Federal University of Santa Catarina (UFSC).—Xinhua

Nay Pyi Taw, 3 April —Deputy finance ministers and vice-governors of central banks of ASE-AN+3 countries exchanged views on assessment of macro-economy of the countries, taking a step for preventing impacts of uncertainties from global economy on the group.

UN envoy urges Afghans to actively participate in upcoming elections

United Nations, 3 April — A senior United Nations official on Wednesday urged Afghans to actively participate and use Saturday's presidential and provincial council elections to shape the future of the country through peaceful, democratic means.

"This is your chance, this is your right; you should not allow anyone to deprive you of your right to go and vote and determine, by peaceful democratic means, the future of your country," said the UN secretary-general's special representative for Afghanistan, Jan Kubis.

His comments came ahead of the official campaigning period that ends on Wednesday night for candidates in the upcoming polls on Saturday, which will lead to the country's first democratic transfer of

The elections come at a crucial time for the country, which will see the withdrawal of the majority of allied international military forces this year, with the country's national forces to assume full responsibility for security countrywide.

"The election will mark yet another indispensable step in moving forward in building democracy, but also in providing the necessary legitimacy to the next leadership," said Kubis, also head of the UN Assistance Mission in Afghanistan (UNAMA).

He briefed reporters on the preparations for the elections in Afghanistan, which are led and managed by Afghans, as well as his recent meeting with the UN Security Council at UN Headquarters in New York.

Kubis also noted that

there was a hope on the part of the Security Council that the Afghan people will come through the elections "with flying colors," given that the country is much better prepared for these polls than they were during the elections in 2009.

"Yes, there might be difficulties and security problems," said the envoy. "Nevertheless, the overall preparations, the overall atmosphere is much better."

Kubis has also urged Afghan women to maintain and build on the momentum behind a recent petition, signed by more than 250,000 women and girls, calling for peace and a cease-fire.

In early March, the women's committee of the High Peace Council, an Afghan body leading the country's peace efforts, petition submitted the

Deadly bombings target Egyptian police outside Cairo University

Cairo, 3 April — A new extremist Islamist group called Ajnad Misr (Soldiers of Egypt) has claimed responsibility for a series of blasts that rocked the area outside Cairo University on Wednesday.

"The three explosive devices that targeted the criminal security authorities are among a retaliation campaign," the group said in the statement, attributing the reason behind the attacks to "the increasing arrest campaigns" against Islamist women.

The group is believed to be among the supporters of former Islamist President Mohamed Morsi, who was ousted by the military last July following mass protests against his oneyear rule.

Meanwhile the government held an urgent security meeting Wednesday to discuss the security situation after recent terrorist attacks. The meeting decided to present an anti-terrorist legislation to the cabinet on Thursday to enhance security around universities and to condense police and military patrols.

Earlier on Wednesday twin blasts targeting police posts outside Cairo University killed the head of Giza's security headquarters and injured five others, including an assistant interior minister. A third bomb went off near the campus' main gates with no casualties reported.

Just hours before the blasts, security forces arrested seven suspected members of the banned Muslim Brotherhood and found 11 bombs and various automatic weapons in their possession, according to state-run al-Ahram newspaper.

The three blasts hit the security posts outside the university in Nahda square, one of the main sit-in venues for Morsi supporters.

A security source said that "primitive bombs" were behind the blast that aimed to assassinate the security chiefs at the scene.

The bombs were concealed in trees surrounding the campus' main gate between two small police posts. Online footage of the bombings showed policemen running out from a cloud of smoke and dust sent up by the first explo-

Security forces halted traffic and sealed off streets leading to the university with barbed wires after the

incident.

Meanwhile, the dean of Cairo University said the blasts have not "affected the educational process," as other gates were still open for students.

Cairo University has been the scene of intense clashes between security forces and students who believe Morsi's ousting was a " coup." Since the start of the school year, Egyptian universities have witnessed violent confrontations that have led to the detention of hundreds of students and the deaths of several others.

Security conditions have further worsened since Morsi's ouster last year, especially after the interim government blacklisted his Muslim Brotherhood as a "terrorist organization" in late December.

Boat capsizes in Lagos, killing eight

Lagos, 3 April — At least eight people were killed and 12 others rescued after a boat capsized on Wednesday in Nigeria's largest city Lagos, the country's emergency agency said.

The accident occurred around 6 pm local time when the boat, carrying about 25 passengers, capsized after departing the Ebute Ero jetty in the business hubs on the city's islands, Ibrahim Farinloye, spokesperson for the National Emergency Management Agency, told Xinhua.

Rescuers rushed to the scene after receiving the report, Farinloye said. "We have recovered eight bodies from the water, 12 have been rescued alive while six others are missing."

According to him, the ill-fated boat owned by Bell Marine services was heading for Majidun area of the

The cause for the accident and the condition of those rescued were not immediately known.

Overloading on such vessels is common in Nigeria, Africa's most populous country, as operators often seek to maximize their profits while neglecting safety measures.


Last month, an overloaded wooden boat with some 20 passengers capsized in Lagos, killing 13, two of them children.

Road accidents kill 576 people in Cambodia in first 3 months

PHNOM PENH, 3 April — The number of road fatalities in Cambodia rose to 576 people in the first three months of 2014, up 3.5 percent from the 556 deaths for the same period last year, said a report by the Interior Ministry's public order department on Thursday. Some 1,273 cases of road accidents were reported during the January-March period, up 10 percent from 1,159 cases recorded the same period last year, the report said.

Besides the deaths, the accidents had injured 2,115 others, a rise of 13 percent on year, it said. "Main causes of the accidents are over-speed driving, alcohol driving, neglect driving and traffic law violation," Preap Chan Vibol, director of the transport department at the Ministry of Public Work and Transportation, said on Thursday. He said the country currently has about 410,000 registered cars, trucks and buses, and 2 million registered motorcycles.—Xinhua

New 'geologic clock' resets date for moon's formation

Canaveral, CAPE (Florida), 3 April — Earth's moon started forming up to 65 million years later than some previous estimates, according to a study released on Wednesday that uses a new way to calculate the birthday of the 4.47 billion-year-old planet's only natural satellite.

smashed into Earth, launching debris that later became the moon, happened about 95 million years after the birth of the solar system, research in this week's issue of the journal Nature showed.

The finding disputes, with a 99.9 percent degree of accuracy, some pre-The mega-asteroid that vious estimates that the moon-forming impact occurred as early as 30 million to 40 million years after the solar system's formation, some 4.58 billion years ago.

The new study is based on 259 computer simulations of how the solar system evolved from a primordial disk of planetary embryos swirling around the sun. The programs simulate the crashes and mergers of the small bodies until they meld into the rocky planets that exist today.

By that geologic clock, Earth's last big chuck came from a Mars-sized body that hit about 95 million years after the solar system's formation, the study showed. "We think that the thing that hit Earth and ended up forming the moon, the lion's share of it stayed on Earth.

small fraction mass and some its material from Earth was pushed off into space to form the moon," astronomer John Chambers, with the Carnegie Institution for Science in Washington DC, said in an interview.

"That was probably the last big event," he added. The previous assessment was based on measuring the naturally occurring radioactive decay of telltale atoms inside lunar rocks.

The same process, however, also led to findings that the impact happened between 50 million and 100 million years after the solar system's formation. "Our new method ... is independent of radiometric techniques and so we break through the controversy," lead researcher Seth Jacobson, with Cote d'Azur Observatory in Nice, France, wrote in an email.

The results also open another even bigger mysabout why some tery planets, like Mars, form relatively quickly, while others, like Earth and possibly Venus, take far longer.

Analysis of Martian meteorites and the computer simulations indicate Mars was finished in just a few million years.

There are no known Venus meteorites, and spacecraft so far have not been dispatched to either Mars or Venus to collect samples.

"Discovering that the moon-forming impact occurred late is surprising ... because we know from Martian meteorites that Mars formed relatively quickly. How this discrepancy arises is another big question for the future,' Jacobson said.

Microsoft to offer Windows for free on phones, tablets

San Francisco, 3 April — Microsoft Corp is to give away its Windows operating system to makers of smartphones and small tablets for consumers as it seeks to make more of an impact on those fast-growing markets and counter the massive success of Google Inc's free Android plat-

Microsoft's move, announced at its annual developers conference in San Francisco, is an attempt to broaden the small user base of mobile versions of Windows, in the hope that more customers will end up using Microsoft's money-making, cloud-based services such as Skype and Office.

Up to now, Microsoft has charged phone and tablet makers between \$5 and \$15 per device to use its Windows system, as it has

done successfully at higher prices for many years with Windows on personal computers. Hardware makers factor the cost of that into the sale price of each de-

That model has been obliterated in the past few years by the fast adoption of Google's Android system for phones and tablets, which hardware makers quickly embraced and now accounts for more than 75 percent of all smartphones sold last year. Apple Inc's iPhone and iPad account for most of the rest of the mobile computing market.

By contrast, Windows-powered phones held only 3 percent of the global smartphone market last year. Windows tablets have only about 2 percent of the tablet market, according to tech research firm Gartner.

Apple, Facebook, Google Web data centers getting greener San Francisco,

April — Apple Inc, Google Inc and Facebook Inc have made significant progress in adopting renewable energy sources to power their Web services, the environmental group Greenpeace said in a report on Wednesday. But energy-hungry data centres operated by some of the Internet industry's top companies remain overly reliant on carbon-emitting coal and gas, the report said.

Apple Inc, which built an on-site solar panel farm and fuel-cells at its North Carolina data center and has procured renewable energy directly at its other three facilities, earned the highest marks on the "scorecard" of Internet company data centres that Greenpeace issues every two years.

Greenpeace rated Apple's efforts in transparency, renewable energy policy and renewable energy deployment with an A grade in each category, compared with a mix of D and F grades two years ago when the group released its last report.

At the other end of

the spectrum, Amazon. com Inc's Web Services business, which Greenpeace said operates at least 18 data centres around the world, was singled out for being among the least committed to renewable energy, earning F grades in three out of Greenpeace's four categories.—Reuters

Two killed, 15 injured in rail mishap in northern **India**

New Delhi, 3 April — At least two persons were killed and more than 15 others sustained injuries after two trains collided in the northern Indian state of Uttar Pradesh on Thursday, a senior railway official said.

"The mishap happened early this morning when Katni passenger train collided with Varanasi-Shaktinagar Intercity Express train near Obra station in the state's Sonbhadra District. While two persons died on the spot, those injured have been rushed to a nearby hospital," he said, on condition of anonymity.

The impact of the collision was so much that some of the coaches of both trains got mangled, local TV channels reported. Senior railway officials have rushed to the spot, the official said, adding that a probe has been ordered into the incident.—Xinhua

Philippines, Singapore to strengthen bilateral ties

Manila, 3 April — Philippine President Benigno Aquino III and visiting Singaporean President Tony Tan Keng Yam agreed on Thursday to bolster bilateral relations between their countries. Aquino welcomed Tan, who is on his four-day state visit here, in Malacanang, the presidential palace.

"Our two countries share a history of friendship and common ideals. The president and I engaged in fruitful discussions on how our relations can be further strengthened, towards expanding areas of cooperation and solidarity," Aquino said after his meeting with Tan. He said the Philippines proposed the holding of a "Defence Dialogue" to strengthen the two countries' defence and security cooperation.

believe strengthening defence and security cooperation between the Philippines and Singapore is key to maintaining regional stability," Aquino said, adding that the country welcomes the opportunity to host this year's Asian Defence and Security exhibit on 16 to 18 July. The two leaders also discussed the revival of the Philippines- Singapore Action Plan, as a mechanism for expanding bilateral

discussions between the two countries.

The Action provides a consolidated framework for strengthening bilateral cooperation, covering expansive areas including trade and investments, information education, technology, culture, defence, and people-to-people exchanges.

Indonesia issues warning on impacts of Chilean tsunami in its 19 provinces

Jakarta, 3 April — The Indonesian authorities on Wednesday a warning on the impact of tsunami wave generated by 8.2 magnitude earthquake in Chile.

The warning, issued by Indonesia's Tsunami Early Warning Center (InaTEWS) task force after studying and analyzing the tsunami wave movement, said that waves of tsunami generated by the earthquake would affect at least 19 provinces across the country.

the coordination of Indonesia's Meteorology, Climatology and Geophysics Agency (BMKG) estimated that tsunami waves from Chilean earthquake would arrive in Indonesian waters on Thursday between 05.11 am to 19.44 pm Indonesian Western Region (WIB) time.

The agency said that the tsunami waves with heights between 0 to 0.5

meter would arrive in 115 coastal areas located in 19 provinces across the country, including Papua, North Maluku, Maluku, East Java, Yogyakarta, Central Java, Banten, West Java, Lampung, West and East Nusa Tenggara, Bali and several provinces in Sulawesi, Kalimantan, among

"The BMKG has reported the warning to the National Disaster Mitigation Agency (BNPB). As the warning was issued in alert status, regional ad-The task force under ministrators affected by the tsunami were ordered to avert people from coastal and river bank areas," BNPB Spokesperson Sutopo Purwo Nugroho told Xinhua by phone.

> He added that the tsunami wave generated by the earthquake as high as 1.92 meters now have swept coastal areas in Chile, Peru, Equador, Colombia, Panama, Costa Rica and Nicaragua.—Xinhua

Los Angeles, 3 April Hip-shaking Colombian singer Shakira was no match for Disney's animated princesses on the weekly Billboard 200 album chart on Wednesday as the "Frozen" movie soundtrack continued its reign at the

The "Frozen" soundtrack, released in November 2013, sold 161,000 copies last week, bringing its total US sales to 1.8 milfrom Nielsen SoundScan.

Billboard said 1.5 million of "Frozen" soundtrack sales were in 2014, making it the year's biggest selling album so far. Beyonce's self-titled album that she released in December comes in second with 604,000 copies sold so far in 2014.

"Frozen," about two Nordic princess sisters who

from an everlasting winter, has also become the top-grossing animated film in box office history, topping \$1 billion in worldwide sales.

The "Frozen" soundtrack, which features the Oscar-winning song "Let It Go," is the 20th album to spend eight weeks at No 1, coming in behind Adele's Grammy-winning record "21," that clocked the longest chart-topping run with 24 non-consecutive weeks at the top of Billboard 200. Whitney Houston's soundtrack for 1993's "The Bodyguard" movie notched 20 weeks at No 1.

Shakira led six new albums in the top 10 of the Billboard 200 this week, debuting at No 2 with her latest self-titled album selling 84,000 copies, almost

Veteran crooner Barry Manilow came in at No. 8 with his latest album "Night Songs," while punk rockers My Chemical Romance, who split up last year, released greatest hits compilation "May Death Never Stop You" that debuted at No 9 this week.

For the week ended March 30, overall album sales totalled 4.7 million, down 28 percent from the comparable week in 2013, Billboard said.

Ronaldo knee problem a concern for Portugal

Madrid, 3 April However much Real Madrid coach Carlo Ancelotti insisted there was no cause for concern, the sight of Cristiano Ronaldo limping off near the end of Wednesday's Champions League match will have set alarm bells ringing in his native Portugal.

The national team captain, the leading marksman in both La Liga and the Champions League this term, will need to maintain his scintillating goal-scoring form if Portugal are to advance to the later stages of the World Cup finals in Brazil starting in June.

However, the 29-yearold former Manchester United player has been complaining of discomfort in his left knee in recent weeks and has been playing on while receiving treatment from Real medical staff.

He netted a record-equalling 14th goal of the latest edition of the Champions League in Wednesday's 3-0 quarter-final, first leg win at home to Borussia Dortmund before asking to come off 10 minutes from

"It's a slight knee problem and I'm not worried about it," Ancelotti told a news conference.

"If the niggle, which at the moment is not a worry, continues we can rest him, but the player is relaxed," added the Italian.

"I took him off 10 minutes before the end and there is no reason to worry." Real have a busy schedule in the final weeks

won balls," Ancelotti said.

"He also demonstrated his attacking ability with a goal. He had a fantastic game, really helping his team and demonstrating that he has that passion."

The Real fans, who have at times made clear their frustration with some of Isco's below-par performances, chanted his name when he was substituted in the 72nd minute.

"I'd like to thank the Santiago Bernabeu for the ovation and the support they gave us during the match," Isco told reporters.

"I was a little surprised to play, Di Maria came down with something, but you have to be prepared and that's what happened," he added. "I have to show people and the coach that I can play in any system and position and I'm happy."

Shizuoka governor rejects using plutonium-mix fuel at nuclear plant

Tokyo, 3 April Shizuoka Gov Heita Kawakatsu said during a recent interview with Kyodo *News* he cannot stick to his predecessor's decision to allow one of the nuclear reactors in the prefecture to commercialize the Monju use a controversial type of prototype fast-breeder refuel created through spent fuel reprocessing.

'We will take back (the decision)," Kawakatsu said, referring to a project called "pluthermal" in Japan, in which ordinary reactors use plutonium-uranium mixed oxide fuel, or MOX fuel. The fuel is created by plutonium and uranium extracted from reprocessing conventional

Implementing the project is important for Japan to consume its stockpiles of weapons-grade plutonium, as the country is facing increasing difficulty to actor, which was expected to use plutonium as fuel.

Before the 2011 Fukushima Daiichi nuclear power plant disaster, power utilities planned to conduct pluthermal at 16 to 18 reac-

The state permitted pluthermal to be conducted at the No 4 unit at the Hamaoka plant in 2007. The Shizuoka prefectural

Kawakatsu, however, said, "When thinking about conducting pluthermal now, there would be is very tough."

After the Fukushima crisis, the governor expressed his intention to review the pluthemal project, but he has not gone so far as to say the plan should be retracted.

Kawakatsu also warned that Japan is not in a situation to allow the restart of nuclear power plants, given that the counspace to keep spent nuclear

All of the country's 48 commercial reactors have remained offline amid heightened concerns over no place that will allow the use of nuclear power such moves. The situation after the Fukushima crisis. Those seeking to restart are waiting for the state safety assessments to finish.

Paris St Germain sink Chelsea, Real ease past Dortmund

London, 3 April — Paris St Germain and Real Madrid took big steps towards the Champions League semi-finals on Wednesday as the French club beat Chelsea 3-1 and the Spaniards dismantled Borussia Dortmund 3-0 in the quarter-final first legs.

PSG opened the scoring at the Parc des Princes after four minutes when John Terry's headed clearance fell to Ezequiel Lavezzi and the Argentine forward thumped a half-volley past Petr Cech.

Eden Hazard grabbed a crucial away goal for Chelsea from the penalty spot after 27 minutes after Brazilian defender Thiago Silva fouled compatriot Oscar.

PSG restored their advantage on 61 minutes, however, thanks to a David Luiz own goal before Javier Pastore waltzed into the area and fired a shot past Cech at his near post in stoppage time.

Real flew out of the traps against Dortmund and took the lead on three minutes when Gareth Bale collected Daniel Carvajal's pass and poked the ball under goalkeeper Roman Weidenfeller.

C a r l oAncelotti's side continued to swarm all over last season's beaten finalists and Isco's precise strike from the edge of the box doubled Real's advantage on 27 minutes.

The fleet-footed Cristiano Ronaldo added a third on 57 minutes as he skipped round Weidenfeller to give Real a comfortable cushion and equal Lionel Messi's record of 14 goals in the competition in one season.

In Tuesday's quarter-final first legs, holders Bayern Munich were held to a 1-1 draw at Manchester United and Barcelona

Barcelona to appeal FIFA transfer ban, club says

—Barcelona will lodge an appeal to try to overturn a ban on participating in the transfer market for breaching rules on the international transfer of foreign under-18 players, the club said on Wednesday.

FIFA, soccer's world governing body, announced earlier on Wednesday that it had banned Barca from the transfer market for two consecutive windows and fined the club 450,000 Swiss francs.

"FCB will present the corresponding appeal to

BARCELONA, 3 April FIFA and if necessary will submit the resulting resolution to the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS)," Barca said in a statement on their website (www. fcbarcelona.es).

> "Appropriate precautionary measures to preserve the rights of the club" would be taken to ensure they were not kept out of the transfer market, the statement added.

> Barca said the rule they had been accused by FIFA of infringing was designed to prevent minors from being denied a proper

education.

The club argued that their academy, "La Masia", has been held up as a model of good practice and they had not breached any civil law. They had also been trying to get FIFA to reform the rules to make them more efficient at protecting minors, they said.

"FCB creates people before they create athletes, a fact that has not been considered by FIFA, which has applied a penalty ignoring the educational function of our training programme," they said.—Reuters
