NAY PYI TAW, 12 Sept -Pyidaungsu Hluttaw session on Friday focused on foreign loans and resettlement of Myanmar migrant workers and refugees in Thailand.

The Ministry of Health is drawing plans to implement the Myanmar Essential Health Services Access Project with US\$ 100 million international development aid credit of the World Bank to provide affordable healthcare services to the public.

Another US\$ 100 million loan from the World Bank will be spent on Ayeyawady Valley management project, according to Deputy Minister for Transport U Han Sein.

in Thailand, Deputy Minister for Labour, Employment and Social Security U Htin Aung told the Pyidaungsu Hluttaw that measures will be taken to provide jobs to Myanmar migrant workers in Thailand in accordance with their skills when they come back to Myanmar.

The deputy minister is confident of providing jobs to Myanmar migrant workers as a total of 1.263

million jobs were created during first four months of 2014-2015 fiscal year and arrangements are underway to create job opportunities in cooperation with foreign companies investing in Mvanmar. The deputy minister also said that Thilawa Special Economic Zone and Dawei Special Economic Zone will also create jobs for Myanmar workers.







China opens trial of Kunming train station attackers

BEIJING, 12 Sept — Four people accused of participating in an attack at a train station in southwestern China went on trial on Friday, charged with murder and organizing a terror group, a case that triggered a sweeping crackdown on what Beijing calls militant violence.

The government has said knife-wielding militants from the unruly western region of Xinjiang launched a premeditated attack in March at the Kunming station in Yunnan Province, in which 31 people were killed and 141 injured. Police shot dead four of the attackers.

China's leaders have vowed to strike hard at religious extremists and separatist groups, which they blame for a series of violent attacks in Xinjiang, the traditional home of the Muslim Uighur ethnic minority.

State television showed the four suspects — three men and one woman — sitting in the court in Kunming, watched over by heavily armed policemen dressed all in black.

The court, announcing the opening of the trial on its official microblog, named the four as Iskandar Ehet, Turgun Tohtunyaz, Hasayn Muhammad and Patigul Tohti, all of whom are Uighur, to judge by their names.

Patigul Tohti was shot and wounded by police at the station, while the other three were arrested a few days before the attack while

trying to flee the country, the court said.

In total eight people were involved in the plot, though only five carried out the attack, it added.

The eight were "influenced by extremist religious thinking" and began meeting in December to plan their attack, the court said. Five more people were involved in forming their terror group, a case which is baeing handled separately, it added.

Some of the people who were attacked, as well as relatives of the dead, were in the courtroom, it said.

The court did not say how long the trial would last, but typically it will be completed in a single day. The defendants are likely to get the death penalty.

Courts in China are controlled by the ruling Communist Party, making it unusual for those accused of crimes — particularly in politicised cases — to have a fair trial.

The Kunming attack was one of the single deadliest incidents attributed by the government to militants. A suicide bombing in May killed 39 people at a market in Xinjiang's capital, Urumqi. Xinjiang, resource-rich and strategically located on the borders of central Asia, is crucial to China's growing energy needs. Analysts say most of the proceeds from the sale of its resources have gone to the majority Han Chinese, stoking resentment among Uighurs.—*Reuters*

Thai PM aims to broaden tax base, bring in inheritance tax

BANGKOK, 12 Sept — Thailand's Prime Minister, Prayuth Chan-ocha, said on Friday his military-backed government aimed to broaden the tax base in the new fiscal year from October, bringing in an inheritance tax among other changes.

In his first speech to an appointed parliament after seizing power in a military coup in May and becoming prime minister in August, Prayuth said that only 20 million people out of Thailand's population of about 68 million pay taxes.

"The tax collection in this new fiscal year will be broadened to new tax bases to boost revenue to the country and promote fairness.

SINGAPORE, 12 Sept — of 18 and 29. A latest survey shows that It also s

It also shows that the young people have some financial awareness, but lacked a deeper understanding of proper financial planning.

Asked how much cash should be set aside for emergencies, 80 percent responded that they need at least three months of their income for emergencies. An insurance industry professional said that this falls far short of what financial planners recommend and that it is better to have a buffer that is enough to last six to 12 months in case one loses his or her job.

The survey also finds

that the average expected retirement age is 57, and that the respondents expect to be retired for 23 years. On average, they believe slightly more 1 million Singapore dollars (800,000 US dollars) is needed for retirement expenses.

However, the survey found that the mean projected savings by the time of retirement is less than 400,000 Singapore dollars (320,000 US dollars).

Luca Griseri, Nielsen's head of financial services in Singapore and Malaysia, was quoted as saying that the amount of the shortfall is surprising.

He was also surprised by the pessimism youth had about the future.

"... young people are normally positive, and people in South-east Asia are the most confident, and we track confidence too," he said.

"We certainly need to do something to help them help themselves."

The medical condition of 20 of the 95 affected was stated to be critical and all the patients complained of stomach pain and started vomiting after eating the food.

Mongolia has huge potential in nontraditional energy


ULAN BATOR, 12 Sept — Mongolian Prime Minister Norovyn Altankhuyag has said that his country owns huge potential in nontraditional energy resources, such as oil shale and methane.

"Mongolia has huge potential in nontraditional oil. Recently, a new reserve of coal bed methane gas was discovered ... and the chemical compound of the methane is the same as Russian natural gas," Altankhuyag told an international investment conference on Wednesday.

Altankhuyag said Mongolia has a favourable legal environment for the energy sector and the government supports contractors in research, extraction and processing phases through exemption of value-added tax and customs tax.—*Xinhua*

Iran says "difficult road to go" to reach nuclear deal

VIENNA, 12 Sept — Iran and world powers remain far apart over Teheran's nuclear programme, and they face a "difficult road" to reach a deal by a late November deadline, a senior Iranian negotiator said on Thursday.

Deputy Foreign Minister Abbas Araqchi spoke after a day of talks in Vienna with the three European members of the group of six major powers that is seeking to negotiate an end to a decade-old nuclear dispute with Iran.

The discussions between Iran and Britain. France and Germany took place less than a week after Iran and the United States held a bilateral meeting in Geneva.

Asked how big the differences were, Araqchi told reporters: "Still big." He added: "We are always optimistic ... but we have a difficult road to go."

The six powers, also

including Russia and China, will hold their first full negotiating round with Iran since July on 18 September in New York, seeking to narrow gaps over the future size of Iran's uranium enrichment infrastructure and other issues.

Iran denies Western allegations that it is refining uranium to develop the capability to assemble nuclear weapons, saying it is doing it to help generate electricity.

The United States and its allies have in recent years imposed ever tighter financial and others sanctions on Iran, a major oil producer, to make it scale back its nuclear programme.

After years of escalating tension and fears the stand-off could lead to a new Middle East war, the election last year of Hassan Rouhani, widely seen as a pragmatist, as Iranian president on a platform to end the country's international isolation raised hopes for a peaceful settlement.

Araqchi said the talks with the European officials had been useful ahead of what he called next week's real negotiations.

Ahead of the meeting in the Austrian capital, Araqchi called on the powers to abandon their "illogical demands", Iran's Fars news agency reported.—Reuters

US wins Arab support for Syria/ Iraq military campaign

JEDDAH, 12 Sept The United States signed up Arab allies on Thursday to a "coordinated military campaign" against Islamic State fighters, a major step in building regional support for President Barack Obama's plan to strike both sides of the Syrian-Iraqi frontier.

After talks in Saudi Arabia's summer capital Jeddah, Secretary of State John Kerry won backing from 10 Arab countries -Egypt, Iraq, Jordan, Lebanon and six Gulf states including rich rivals Saudi Arabia and Qatar — for a coalition to fight the Sunni militants that have seized swathes of Iraq and Syria. "Arab nations play a

critical role in that coalition, the leading role really across all lines of effort: military support, humanitarian aid, our work to stop the flow of illegal funds," Kerry told a news conference

Non-Arab Sunni power Turkey also attended the Jeddah talks but two other major regional players -Shi'ite Iran and Syria itself

were excluded, a sign of the difficulty of building a coalition across the Middle East's sectarian battle lines. The Arab states agreed

in a communique to do more to stop the flow of funds and fighters to Islamic State and help rebuild communities "brutalised" by the group.

Kerry met the Arab leaders to drum up support a day after Obama announced his plans to strike fighters in Iraq and Syria.

U.S. officials said Kerry also sought permission to make more use of bases in the region and fly more warplanes overhead, issues that were not mentioned in the communique. Kerry said none of the countries in the coalition would send ground troops.

In a hopeful sign of outreach across the sectarian divide that has spread war across the Middle East and fed Islamic State's militancy, Sunni Saudi Arabia said it might open an embassy in Shi'ite-ruled Iraq after decades of suspicion.

The Saudis, who support other Sunni armed movements in Syria but consider Islamic State a terrorist group, have also promised to help Obama's campaign by providing training camps for moderate Syrian Sunni fighters.

But Iran, the main Shi'ite power in the Middle East and supporter of Syria's President Bashar al-Assad, said it had severe reservations over the new US-led coalition, and doubted it would fight "the root causes of terrorism", which it blames squarely on Sunni Arab states like Saudi Arabia.

Obama announced his plans in a prime time address on Wednesday to build an alliance to root out Islamic State in both Syria and Iraq, plunging the United States into two conflicts in which nearly every country in the Middle East has a stake. The region has been galvanised since June when Islamic State fighters, already in control of much of Syria, swept through northern Iraq, seizing cities, slaughtering prisoners, and proclaiming a "caliphate" that would rule over all Muslims.

The White House says the group is a threat to the West as well, attracting fighters from around the world who could return to carry out attacks at home. Reuters

Golan Heights, 12 Sept — Dozens of Fijian UN peacekeepers, released by al-Qaeda-linked group Nusra Front in Syria, arrived in Israeli-held territory on the Golan Heights on Thursday, an Israeli military spokeswoman said.

'We opened the border and they entered," the Israeli military spokeswoman said, without giving numbers.

A Reuters witness said after the peacekeepers crossed over they were driven away in a convoy of UN minibuses.

Some 45 Fijian soldiers were taken hostage

UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon welcomed their release and, according to a spokesman, demanded that all parties in the area respect the UN force's "mandate, freedom of movement and the safety and security of its personnel." Nusra initially said it held the peacekeepers because they were aiding soldiers loyal to President Bashar al-Assad. Later, sources close to Nusra said

it demanded the removal of who was not identified, the group from the West's terrorist list.

The Nusra group on Wednesday posted a video on its Twitter and YouTube accounts in which the hostages said they expected to be freed soon.

A UN source earlier told Reuters the militants had insisted on such a video as a condition of the peacekeepers' release.

"We are all safe and alive, and we thank Jabhat al-Nusra for keeping us safe and keeping us alive. I'd like to assure you that we have not been harmed in any way," one hostage,

said in the footage.

We understand that with the limited resources that they have, they have provided the best for us and we truly appreciate it and we thank them. We are thankful that Jabhat al-Nusra has kept its word and that we will be going home." A UN spokesman said in New York on Thursday no ransom had been requested for the Fijian peacekeepers and none was paid. He said the UN mission in the region remained viable and would continue to fulfil its mandate.

Australia raises threat level to 'high' on Iraq, Syria

SYDNEY, 12 Sept— Australia on Friday raised its terror threat level to 'high' for the first ever time, citing the likelihood of terrorist attacks by Australian citizens radicalised in Iraq or Syria, despite stressing there was no knowledge of a specific attack plan.

Australia is concerned over the number of its citizens believed to be fighting overseas with Islamist militant groups, including a suicide bomber who killed three people in Baghdad in July and two men shown in images on social media holding the severed heads of Syrian soldiers.

David Irvine, the director general of the Australian Security Intelligence Organization (ASIO), flagged the prospect of lifting the threat level on Tuesday, citing the growing risk posed by the returning fighters.

"Last night the director general of security raised the terror threat to high, consequently today the government is raising the public awareness level to high," Prime Minister Tony Abbott said in a news conference in Melbourne.

"I want to stress that this does not mean that a terror attack is imminent. We have no specific intelligence of particular plots. What we do have is intelligence that there are people with the intent and capability to mount attacks here in Australia."

Australia had been at the "medium" alert level since a four-tier system was introduced in 2003. A "high" alert level is used when officials believe an attack is likely, while a "severe" level means they believe an attack is imminent or has occurred.

He tapped out the code to communicate to her what she was to tell the engineers who continued building the bridge. For 13 years, Washington tapped out his instructions with one finger until the spectacular Brooklyn Bridge was finally completed.

IMF says Ebola hits economic growth in West Africa

WASHINGTON, 12 Sept — Economic growth in Liberia and Sierra Leone could decline by almost 3.5 percentage points as the world's worst outbreak of Ebola has crippled mining, agriculture and services sectors in the two West African states, the IMF said on Thursday.

Growth in Guinea, where industrial mining has been unaffected so far, could fall by more than 1 percentage point, said Bill Murray, spokesman at the International Monetary Fund.

"Particularly in the cases of Sierra Leone and Liberia, the largest sectors of these already fragile economies ... are being affected," Murray said. "This is in turn engendering signifi-

He said the crisis had exposed financing gaps totalling \$100 million (61.64 million pounds) to \$130 million in each of the three countries, and that the IMF was working with authorities to figure out additional funding. All three countries are already getting IMF loans under programmes that predate the Ebola outbreak. The IMF said economic growth in Sierra Leona was likely to fall to 8 percent from 11.3 percent this year, Liberia's growth might decline to 2.5 percent from 5.9 percent, and in Guinea, economic output could fall to 2.4 percent from 3.5 percent.—Reuters

"Our priority is not to cut spending for the sake of it. Our priority is to control inflation in order to create an environment that will allow Brazil to grow more," he said in an interview that provided some of the most specific guidance yet about Silva's financial policies.

Silva, an environmentalist whom polls show is running neck-to-neck with President Dilma Rousseff in a likely runoff next month, has encouraged many investors with her market-friendly economic platform, which includes giving the central bank full independence.

Brazil's Silva would cut spending, end forex

intervention programme

A sluggish economy and growing fiscal deficits during Rousseff's four years in office has cost Brazil a downgrade of its debt rating and scared off some investors who say the leftist leader is too interventionist.

Rands said Silva would eliminate many of the economic distortions that have dragged the once-booming Brazilian economy into recession. He mentioned the cen-

tral bank's currency intervention scheme, which has kept the real stronger since last year, as one of those distortions that will be corrected under Silva.

"That does not mean that you cannot carry out small, temporary actions to eliminate volatility," Rands said. The real weakened

slightly in late trading due to Rands' comments, traders said.

Since last August, Brazil's central bank has intervened daily in the foreign exchange market by selling currency swaps, derivatives designed to support the real.

Rands, who runs an economic consultancy in the northeastern state of Pernambuco, is part of Sil-

va's team of economic advisers, which also includes well-known economist Eduardo Giannetti da Fonseca.

He said the budget cuts would spare initiatives such as the Bolsa Familia welfare programme for poor families, focusing instead on pork-barrel spending for projects in lawmakers' districts.

"There is a lot of fat that can be cut and the Marina (Silva) camp is sending positive signals on that fiscal front," said Alex Agostini, chief economist with Austin Rating. "It could generate a confidence shock that will allow the economy to grow more in the future."

Rands said a Silva administration would also aim to lower the centre of Brazil's official inflation target below the current 4.5 percent.

Economists complain that such a wide target range has allowed politicians to keep inflation high, hurting retailers and dragging down investments in Latin America's largest economy.

He said the campaign's economic team is debating whether to keep the current leadership at the central bank or opt for a new team during the transition toward full independence if she is elected.

Rands was a macroeconomics classmate of current central bank chief Alexandre Tombini at the University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign. —*Reuters*

St Louis grand jury weighs charges in Ferguson shooting

ST LOUIS, 12 Sept — The white officer who shot dead unarmed black teenager Michael Brown in August, spurring a wave of violent protests, would be the first policeman charged for killing a suspect in St Louis County in more than two decades.

For weeks, protesters in the mostly black St Louis suburb of Ferguson have piled pressure on authorities, demanding that the officer, Darren Wilson, be charged and Prosecutor Bob McCulloch be replaced with a special prosecutor.

The prosecutor opted not to press charges and presented the case to the grand jury because of conflicting testimony from witnesses, his office said.

"It's not even a question about whether there will be unrest, people have made it very clear. We have a very fragile peace right now. If people don't feel like they get justice, it will be very hard to hold these folks back," said St Louis Alderman Antonio French.

The embattled Mc-Cullough, whose office has prosecuted more than 700 murder cases since 1991, has overseen 33 prosecutions of police officers during his 23-year term but has never pressed charges against an officer accused of killing a suspect.

His spokesman, Edward Magee, said prosecutors review several police shootings each year but rarely pursue charges, largely because laws give police a broad latitude to defend themselves and use deadly force if they believe they are in imminent danger.

McCulloch's office said there were four cases of police shootings he has brought to a grand jury. None resulted in criminal charges, including a much publicized 2000 case of two law enforcement officers who shot and killed two unarmed black men during a drug bust.

In a process much different from a trial, a grand jury is guided by the prosecutor, who determines what evidence to present and instructs members on what charges may apply.

The prosecutor's office is asking for patience as

forensics and autopsy evidence are presented to the grand jury, which is meeting four to eight hours each Wednesday. Witness testimony is still being gathered, Magee said.

Two attorneys at the prosecutor's office,


Kathi Alizadeh and Sheila Whirley, are presenting the evidence to the grand jury, Magee said. Alizadeh, with 26 years on the job, including 22 murder cases, is leading the presentation.

"People just need to wait," Magee said. "People are still coming forward and we are still waiting for the investigation to be completed." In the 33 cases prosecuted by McCulloch's office, police officers were charged with a range of crimes that included allegations of rape, assault and murder. In most of those cases, McCulloch's office levelled charges directly and did not take the cases to a grand jury. Charges are brought directly when there is a "clear-cut probable cause," Magee said. adding that there is no such clarity in the Brown shooting.

Accounts of the altercation between Wilson and Brown differ. Some witnesses have said Brown posed no threat to the officer and had his hands raised in surrender when he was shot, while friends of the officer have said Brown injured Wilson before the shooting. An autopsy showed the teenager was shot at least six times, including twice in the head.— *Reuters*

Double solar storms headed to Earth raise disruption concerns

CAPE CANAVERAL, 12 Sept — A rare double burst of magnetically charged solar storms will hit Earth on Thursday night and Friday, raising concerns that GPS signals, radio communications and power transmissions could be disrupted, officials said on Thursday.

Individually, the storms, known as coronal mass ejections, or CMEs, wouldn't warrant special warnings, but their unusu-

al close timing and direct path toward Earth spurred the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's Space Weather Prediction Centre to issue an alert. The first CME, which burst from a magnetically disturbed region of the sun on Monday night, should reach Earth on Thursday night, center director Thomas Berger told reporters on a conference call. The same patch of solar real estate produced a second, more powerful storm about 1:45 pm EDT on Wednesday."We don't expect any unmanageable impacts to national infrastructure from these solar events at this time, but we are watching these events closely," Berger said. The sun currently is in the peak of its 11-year cycle, though the overall level of activity is far lower than a typical

NASA Mars rover Curiosity reaches base of target mountain

Sept - NASA's Mars rover Curiosity has arrived at the base of a mountain of layered rock that scientists suspect holds clues about whether the planet most like Earth in the solar system had the ingredients to support and preserve signs of microbial life.

The 1-ton rover touched down inside an ancient impact basin in August 2012. It quickly discovered a region inside the Gale Crater landing site that was chemically and geologically suited for the same kind of rock-eating microbes commonly found on Earth. With the primary goal of the mission met, scientists set about the more daunting task of finding environmental niches that not only could have hosted life, but also preserved signs of its existence — a tricky prospect since the same processes that make rock tend to de-

CAPE CANVERAL, 12 stroy organic carbon. Scientists figured their best chance for success lay inside rocks on Mount Sharp, a 3-mile (5-km) high mountain rising from the centre of Gale Crater.

After 18 months of driving, scientists on Thursday announced that Curiosity had arrived at the base of Mount Sharp ahead of schedule, thanks to a somewhat serendipitous decision to take an alternative path that would be gentler on the rover's damaged wheels. Within two weeks, Curiosity will reach an outcrop of rock called Pahrump Hills, where the first drill samples of Mount Sharp real estate will be made, California Institute of Technology geologist John Grotzinger told reporters on a conference call on Thursday. Scientists previously expected to cross the boundary between the cratered plains of Gale Crater and the relatively smooth

rocks of Mount Sharp in a region called Murray Buttes. "Curiously, because of the wheel damage it drove us on a pathway further south to be safer to the wheels and once we got to the location ... we recognized that in fact this was an even better place to go across the boundary than it would be to keep traveling toward Murray Buttes,' Grotzinger said. The decision to stop driving and start drilling should please a NASA oversight panel

that earlier this month criticized the Curiosity team for short-changing the mission's science goals.

"When the senior review proposal was written in February and March the base of Mount Sharp looked kilometers away. In reality, we really cut out some of the drive time ... We're going to be starting to do much more science along the way," said Jim Green, director of NASA's planetary science division. Reuters

Huawei Technologies uncovers corruption in internal probe

BEIJING, 12 Sept— Huawei Technologies Co Ltd [HWTUL], China's largest telecom equipment maker, found four employees in violation of the company's policies on corruption as part of an internal inspection, a source familiar with the matter said.

In response to the findings, Huawei has held training sessions to educate employees on how to steer clear of possible bribery, the source said, declining to be identified because he was not authorized to speak about the matter to the media. The internal probe coincides with a government crackdown on corporate misbehaviour within both foreign and domestic firms. Chief Executive Ken Hu told the Financial Times on Thursday that graft inspec-

tions were done every year and "nothing new," adding that it only attracted media attention this year.

Huawei has declined to address the exact nature of the cases. Local financial news outlet Caixin, which first reported the inspection last week, said a total of 116 employees were implicated in soliciting and accepting bribes from outside sales agents in exchange for rebates. WASHINGTON, 12 Sept Some of the most visually stunning sequences from director James Cameron's blockbuster movie "Avatar" involved graceful flying creatures that were ridden by blue human-like beings facing ecological destruction on a moon called Pandora.

It turns out that an animal very similar to those "Avatar" creatures, called Ikran, actually did exist here on Earth long ago.

Scientists on Thursday announced the discovery of fossils in China of a new species of flying reptile called a pterosaur that lived 120 millions years ago and so closely resembled the creatures from the 2009 film that they named it after them. It is called Ikrandraci avatar, meaning "Ikran dragon" from "Avatar." And this pterosaur is noteworthy for more than just its resemblance to a movie creature.

The scientists said it appears that Ikrandraci avatar had a throat pouch similar to that of a pelican. It probably fed on small fish from freshwater lakes, flying low over the water and catching prey by skimming its lower jaw into the water, they said. It may

have stored the fish in the pouch, they added. This Cretaceous Period pterosaur boasted an unusual blade-like crest on its lower jaw like the one on the movie creatures. "The head structure is similar in this pterosaur to the Ikran in 'Avatar,'" said one of the researchers, paleontologist Xiaolin Wang of the Institute of Vertebrate Paleontology and Paleoanthropology, Chinese Academy of Sciences in Beijing.

"Of course, nobody and nothing can ride this pterosaur," Wang added. Another of the re-

searchers, paleontologist Alexander Kellner of Brazil's National Museum

at the Federal University of Rio de Janeiro, joked: "Please, (there were) no blue hominids during the Cretaceous."

Ikrandraci avatar, whose fossils were uning Province, boasted a wingspan of about 8 feet (2.5 metres), Kellner said.

It did not have a crest on the top of its elongated head as many pterosaurs did. Behind the lower jaw crest was a hook-like structure that appears to have been the anchor point for the throat pouch, Kellner said. It had relatively small teeth good for snaring small fish.

It lived in a warm re-

gion teeming with life, with feathered dinosaurs, birds, mammals, frogs, turtles and other animals along with a variety of trees and other plants, Wang said.

The researchers studearthed in China's Liaon- ied fossils of two specimens of Ikrandraci avatar.

Pterosaurs were Earth's first flying vertebrates, with birds and bats making their appearances later. They thrived from about 220 million years ago to 65 million years ago, when they were wiped out by the asteroid that also doomed the dinosaurs.

The study was published in the journal Scientific Reports.

Third US Ebola patient showing 'remarkable

improvement'

CHICAGO, 12 Sept-The third American to be treated for Ebola in the United States is showing "remarkable improvement" after receiving an infusion of plasma from US Ebola survivor Dr Kent Brantly, as well as an undisclosed experimental drug, his doctors said on Thursday.

Dr Rick Sacra, 51, who is being treated in a special biocontainment unit at the University of Nebraska Medical Centre in Omaha, received two doses of plasma from Brantly, which doctors are calling a convalescent serum, and has been given nightly doses of an undisclosed experimental drug, Dr Phil Smith, one of Sacra's doctors, said in a news briefing.

"I don't know how much of his recovery is due to the drug, how much is due to the convalescent serum and how much to the aggressive intravenous fluids," Smith said.

Brantly's blood likely contains protective antibodies that may help buy Sacra some time while his body tries to fight off the infection, Smith said. The hospital tried a number of potential donors, but Brantly's blood type turned out to be a match for his friend and fellow missionary Sacra.

"It really meant a lot to us that he was willing to give that donation so soon after his recovery," Debbie Sacra, the patient's wife, told the briefing. "I spoke to his (Brantly's) wife. We marveled that they had the same blood," she said.

The worst-ever Ebola outbreak, which has already killed at least 2,296 people in West Africa, has triggered a scramble to develop the first drug or vaccine for a deadly disease that was discovered nearly 40 years ago in the forests of central Africa.

She said Sacra contracted Ebola on 29 August while working at a hospital in Liberia on behalf of the North Carolina-based Christian group SIM USA. Sacra had worked in the obstetrics ward at the ELWA Hospital of SIM in Monrovia.

Gov to lift evacuation order on Fukushima village **1 October**

FUKUSHIMA, 12 Sept-The Japanese government decided on Friday to lift an evacuation order on 1 October for part of a Fukushima Prefecture village within 20 kilometres of the disaster-struck Fukushima Daiichi nuclear plant.

It will lift the order for a portion of the village of Kawauchi, the second such case following the lifting in April of an evacuation order for an area of the city of Tamura.

Some municipalities in the prefecture remain subject to evacuation orders imposed following the March 2011 nuclear disaster.

BEIRUT, 12 Sept—By striking Islamic State in Syria, the United States would be weakening one of President Bashar al-Assad's major enemies. But the new US strategy may still unnerve Assad by helping other opponents determined to overthrow him.

The US strategy for tackling Islamic State in Syria is unlikely to yield quick results. Unlike in Iraq, where US air strikes were able to quickly roll back some Islamic State advances, Washington has no strong partner on the ground.

But in a war that has already lasted over three years and killed more than

Eventually, a unified opposition better able to stand its ground could create new momentum for a stalled diplomatic track involving both the West and Assad's main allies, Russia and Iran which are also alarmed by the rise of Islamic State.

President Barack Obama, in a major policy speech on confronting Islamic State, said on Wednesday he would not hesitate to strike the group in Syria, where it has taken over swathes of territory in

the east and northeast. He also ruled out the idea of cooperation with the Syrian government which some analysts thought would be an eventual outcome of the fight against Islamic State. Some still believe indirect cooperation through third parties may be possible.

"The Assad regime and the Iranians are natural bookends to this in the east and west, but he (Assad) is not going to get to deal with the West as he had hoped," said Andrew Tabler, a senior fellow at the Washington Institute and an expert on Syria.

"The United States has decided this is going to be a very long war, and they are going to support the opposition.'

Obama said the United States had already ramped up military assistance to the Syrian opposition — a possible reference to aid delivered through an ostensibly covert CIA training programme. He also asked Congress to approve additional resources of \$500 million to help the opposition.

Mainstream rebel groups say they have already started to reorganise themselves. One, the Hazem movement, has reported receiving new supplies of anti-tank missiles in recent weeks.-Reuters

FAW-Volkswagen gets antitrust ticket in central China province

BEIJING, 12 Sept-FAW-Volkswagen has been fined 249 million yuan (40.7 million US dollars) for price fixing by Hubei Provincial pricing bureau. FAW-Volkswagen Automotive Co Ltd, a joint venture between Chinese automaker FAW Group and Germany's Volkswagen Group, signed agreements with car dealers in Hubei between 2012 and 2014 on prices for car sales and repairs, according to the National Development and Reform Commission on Thursday.

In addition to the fine, eight of its car dealerships in Hubei will receive antitrust tickets with a combined value of 29.96 million yuan.

Regulators have recently focused on anti-monopoly enforcement in the luxury car market. Both automobiles and spare parts can cost significantly more in China than in other countries.

Chinese Premier Li Keqiang on Tuesday spoke out against the perception that China is targeting foreign firms with its antitrust activity. Speaking at Summer Davos in Tianjin, Li told business people and entrepreneurs that only 10 percent of all such probes have examined the practices of foreign firms in China.

'Pawn Sacrifice' film captures chess drama of **Fischer-Spassky face-off**

There might have been something more nerve-wracking than being an opponent to world chess champion Bobby Fischer, and that was being the mercurial man's minder.

"Pawn Sacrifice," a film

TORONTO, 12 Sept premiering at the Toronto International Film Festival on Thursday, chronicles not only the rise of the young American grandmaster but how hard it was to get him to his crowning moment, the famous "Match of the Century" in 1972 against

Soviet rival Boris Spassky. Fischer, played by Tobey Maguire, is rude, inappropriate, anti-Semitic, unpredictable, brilliant, and as director Edward Zwick says, "probably paranoid and delusional." He is also a cultural hero ill-equipped to handle his celebrity.

Spassky is, on the other hand, a cool cat who enjoys the privileges as an icon of the Soviet state. He is played by Liev Schreiber, who speaks Russian in much of the film in what the actor called "one of the scariest things I have ever done." Spassky, the world champion, and Fischer, the challenger, find themselves in a Cold War proxy battle when they agree to the "Match of the Century" to be played in Iceland. On the newscasts, their showdown upstages the Vietnam War and the break-in at

the Democratic National Committee headquarters in what would become the Watergate scandal.

"I don't think it was about America or the Russian programme for either of them," said Schreiber. "I think it was about being No 1." The irascible Fischer threatens to upend the competition at every turn, demanding more money and going missing right before he is to fly to Reykjavik, much to the frustration of his handlers, a savvy lawyer and a patient priest played by Michael Stuhlbarg and Peter Sarsgaard.

Once there, Fischer doesn't show for one match and won't proceed unless he and Spassky play in a ping-pong room away from the crowd.Spassky agrees even though he could win the championship by forfeit. Reuters

As music sales fall, sax player Kenny G turns to stockpicking

NEW YORK, 12 Sept — Kenny G, the best-selling jazz musician who once played at President Bill Clinton's inaugural ball, wakes up every morning to Starbucks.

The saxophonist doesn't drink coffee. Instead, the man whose real name is Kenny Gorelick obsessively checks the company's stock price. Gorelick was one of the first investors in the Seattle-based chain. He was introduced to Starbucks chief Howard Schultz through an uncle, before the company went public, and soon bought a stake. Shares are up more than 12,000 percent since beginning public trade.

That success helped spark a stockpicking habit that consumes his attention as his music earning potential is eaten away by digital music, which pays less than physical album sales, and online piracy.

These days, Gorelick spends his mornings in front of his computer screen, trading blocs of shares of the approximately 30 companies in his portfolio. Over the last decade, he has earned about as much money from stock trading as from music, he said.

"Most people in the music business don't make as much money as we used to," said Gorelick, who

topped the contemporary jazz sales charts for several years running in the 1990s and whose 2010 album cracked jazz's top ten. "You have your 1 percent of Beyonce and U2, who are playing stadiums, who are going to make tons of money. I'm going to put myself in the normal category of a music person who has been successful."

Gorelick, who holds a degree in accounting from the University of Washington, keeps his assets in two main accounts: one for his own trading and one that is overseen by Todd Morgan, a founder of Los Angeles-based firm Bel Air Investment Advisors.

Morgan said that it was common for his clients, all of whom must meet the firm's \$20 million (12.3 pounds) minimum in investable assets, to keep a portion of their portfolios for stock trading. "We encourage them that if they are active traders to open an account away from us. Why get in the middle of it?" Morgan said. Wealthy investors with more than \$1 million in their accounts are unusual in their affection for trading individual shares, according to new data from E*Trade and other brokers.

The wealthy typically keep 30 percent of their portfolios or more in in-

dividual stocks, said Lena Haas, senior vice president of Retirement, Investing and Saving at E*Trade. Investors with accounts below the \$1 million mark typically hold 10 percent or less of their assets in individual shares, about half of the amount typically seen before the 2008 financial crisis, she said. That reflects a rush by small investors into index funds that passively track the performance of the broad market.

Picking stock winners is not easy. Only 30 percent of professional fund managers outperformed the benchmark Standard & Poor's 500 index over the last decade, according to data from Lipper, a Thomson Reuters company. -Reuters

US ease past Lithuania into basketball World Cup final

BARCELONA, 12 Sept Holders United States showed no sign of missing their top players as they breezed into the basketball World Cup final with a commanding 96-68 win over Lithuania on Thursday.

The Americans, competing in Spain with a second-string team, will head confidently into Sunday's showdown against either European champions France or upstarts Serbia who clash in the other semi-final on Friday.

The champions had steamrollered into the last four and their athletic outfit, even without top NBA players such as LeBron James and Kevin Durant, enjoyed another largely effortless evening.

"Lithuania are a great basketball country and were more than worthy opponents," US coach Mike Krzyzewski, one of America's biggest admirers of top European teams, told a news conference.

"I'm confident with my physical form and I'm comfortable with my knee."

Van Gaal, appointed after United finished in an unaccustomed seventh last season under David Moyes, has been criticised for splashing out 150 million pounds on new players.

Confident Welbeck is 'ideal' Arsenal signing, says Wenger

LONDON, 12 Sept - England striker Danny Welbeck is the "ideal" signing for Arsenal and could make his debut against Manchester City this weekend, manager Arsene Wenger said on Thursday.

Welbeck joined the Gunners from Manchester United for 16 million pounds (\$26.00 million) on transfer deadline day, after United manager Louis van Gaal signed Colombian forward Radamel Falcao on a season-long loan.

"I was happy to take a permanent transfer with Danny Welbeck," Wenger told reporters. "He is ideal because when you analyse his game he can play through the middle — I think his best position — but as well on the flanks."

Welbeck, who had become fifth-choice striker at Old Trafford under Van Gaal, scored twice to lead England to a 2-0 win over Switzerland in their Euro 2016 qualifier on Monday.

Wenger said: "Welbeck brings quality and a team attitude and, as you can see with England, his goalscoring.

"I cannot tell you if Welbeck will start (against City) but it's a possibility. I have to assess the



squad. Welbeck is young and I feel he can improve his career here - he is confident."

Welbeck backed himself to succeed at the Emirates when he told British media on Thursday: "Once I get into the box and get the opportunities I have got faith in my ability.'

"Before (for much of his time at United) I wasn't getting into the box because I wasn't playing too much as a striker and I had to worry about my defensive work."

"Once I get the opportunity and a run of games up front I will do my best."

Welbeck is likely to start against City, as Wenger needs cover for injured French striker Olivier Giroud.—Reuters
