Locals get knowledge on farmlend reclaimation in **Sagaing Region**

YINMABIN, 14 Sept — Under the supervision of Sagaing Region government, officials of Sagaing Region Agricultural Mechnization Department and departmental officials gave lectures on systematic reclamation of farmlands to the local people in Lettaunggyi and Kokkosu villages in Pale Township of Sagaing Region in the second week of September.

Head of Region AMD U Shwe Win explained that the farmlands must be close to the production roads, rectangular shape and adequate area for use of agricultural machinery. Moreover, the farmlands

must have drains, good dykes and use of fertilizers, he said.

Lashio, 14 Sept — An educative talk on public health knowledge was shared to the local people in Mongyai of northern Shan State on Saturday.


Township Medical Officer Dr Soe Lwin explained control and treatment of quick infectious disease and ways of controlling the Ebola disease.

Despite this, the region is still in a strategic position to gain numerous economic benefits from international shipping and foreign trade, he noted.

Rescue efforts still under way in search of missing climbers

Nay Pyi Taw, 14 Sept - Two climbers were reported missing on 31 August, following a mountaineering team successfully scaled Mount Khakaborazi in the northernmost part of Kachin State, which is said to be 5,881 metres in height.

Throughout the first

week of September, rescue teams, reinforced by military service personnel, exerted all-out efforts to find the missing climbers, but their attempts failed due to bad weather conditions.

The search resumed from 11 to 13 September, but the weather did not favour the rescue efforts.

On Sunday morning, a rescue team comprising local military service personnel, local authorities, mountaineering teams, international organizations and guides were using transport vehicles including helicopters to cooperate in the search for the missing climbers.—*Myawady*



China on track to develop Indian railways as Xi heads to S Asia

New Delhi/Beijing, 14 Sept — China will pledge to invest billions of dollars in India's rail network during a visit by President Xi Jinping this week, bringing more than diplomatic nicety to the neighbours' first summit since Narendra Modi became prime minister in May.

The leaders of Asia's three biggest economies

— China, India and Japan

— have crisscrossed the region this month, lobbying for strategic influence, building defence ties, and seeking new business opportunities.

Beijing's bid to ramp up commercial ties in India comes despite a territorial dispute that has flared anew in recent years, raising concerns in New Delhi, where memories of a humiliating border war defeat in 1962 run deep.

It follows a pledge by Japan to invest \$35 billion



in India over the next five years — including the introduction of bullet trains — and a drive to deepen security ties during talks earlier this month between Modi and Prime Minister Shinzo Abe in Tokyo.

India and China are expected to sign a pact that will open the way for Chinese participation in new rail tracks, automated signalling for faster trains and modern stations that India's British-built rail system desperately needs, having barely added 11,000 km of track in the 67 years since independence.

China, which added

Beijing is looking to invest another \$50 billion in building India's ports, roads and a project to link rivers, part of an infrastructure push that Modi has said is his top priority to crank up economic growth.

Chinese investment will also help narrow a trade deficit with India that hit \$31 billion in 2013.

From economic parity in 1980, China's growth has outstripped India's fourfold. Beijing is now seeking to recycle some of its vast export surpluses into foreign investment in resources and infrastructure in South Asia to feed its industrial machine.

Ferry sinks in Philippines, 3 dead, 110 rescued

Manila, 14 Sept — Three people were killed and more than 100 rescued after a ferry sank off the coast of central Philippines, disaster and coast guard authorities said on Sunday.

The Maharlika II left Liloan port in Southern Leyte province in the central Philippines at noon on Saturday with 26 crew and 58 passengers, including two children, on board, the manifest showed.

The ship was also loaded with 13 vehicles, but the drivers were not listed in the manifest.

"Based on our initial report, two people died and 102 others were rescued by three vessels, including two foreign commercial ships," Commander Armand Bali-

lo told reporters.

"We are not sure how many are still missing because it now appears there were more people on board."

An order to abandon the ship was given at around 9 pm (1300 GMT/9.00 am EDT) when it was buffeted by strong winds and huge waves hours after developing engine trouble in the late afternoon, he said.

Scores, sometimes hundreds, of people die each year in ferry accidents in the Philippines, an archipelago of 7,100 islands with a notoriously poor record for maritime safety. Overcrowding is common, and many of the vessels are in bad condition.

Four Turks, three locals nabbed in Indonesia over terror group link

Jakarta, 14 Sept — Four Turkish nationals were arrested along with three Indonesians on Saturday in central Indonesia as they were heading to join a group linked to Jemaah Islamiyah, a militant organization said to be the Southeast Asian wing of al-Qaeda, according to local authorities.


National Police spokesman Ronny Franky Sompie said via a text message that the seven were arrested early Saturday in the Central Sulawesi provincial capital of Palu after counterterrorism police unit Detachment 88 followed a car with the suspects inside.

The four Turks are believed to be members of an international terrorist network, Sompie said. A passport in the name of Ahmed Bozoglan, 27, a Turkish national, was found inside the car.

A Detachment 88 source said the Turkish men wanted to join a terrorist group led by Santoso, who allegedly heads a military section of a terrorist cell in the province's Poso Regency linked to Jemaah Islamiyah.

Last year, Santoso, one of the most wanted terrorist suspects in Indonesia, appeared in YouTube footage calling for a "holy war" against Detachment 88.

Poso, a regency with a population of around 215,000, was the scene of bloody clashes between Christians and Muslims that claimed about 1,000 lives and displaced 25,000 others between December 1998 and 2001.—Kyodo News

Sweden votes with center-left opposition holding narrow lead

STOCKHOLM, 14 Sept— Polls showed Sweden's opposition heading for a narrow election victory on Sunday, on a platform of increased

spending on job schemes, healthcare and schools after eight years of tax cuts under the center-right Alliance. The Social Democrats, the largest single

party and polling around 30 percent, hope to rule with the Green Party. But even if opinion polls are born out, they are likely to rely on winning support from the Left Party and possibly smaller parties in the Alliance to form a government.

Negotiations could be hard and protracted.

Many Swedes are worried that reforms under the Alliance government have gone too far, weakening healthcare, allowing business to profit from schools at the expense of results and dividing a nation that has prided itself on equality into haves and have-nots.

But a splintered opposition has failed to tap into voter unease and is unlikely to win a clear majority in parliament. The anti-immigration Sweden Democrats may hold the balance of power but other parties refuse to work with them.

"We need to re-find our values, those that say we take care of each other, that it is not all about the rich getting it better," said Sofia Bolinder, playing with her young daughter in a playground after voting in the suburb of Skarpnack in southern Stockholm. Bolinder, in her 30s, said she voted for a party "on the left." One poll late on Saturday put the gap between the center-left and the four-party Alliance government at just 3 percentage points. "All the signs point to the fact that the centerleft are going to be bigger than the Alliance, but that they won't get a majority," Mikael Sundstrom, a political scientist at Lund University, said.—Reuters

UNSG's message on the International **Day of Democracy**

15 September 2014

As we observe this year's International Day of Democracy, the world seems more turbulent than ever. In many regions and in many ways, the values of the United Nations, including some of the most fundamental rights and freedoms enshrined in the UN Charter, are being tested and challenged.

Recent outbreaks of violence reinforce a truth we have seen time and again: that where societies are not inclusive, and where governments are not responsive and accountable, peace, equality and shared prosperity cannot take hold. We need to do more to empower individuals, focusing on the billions of people who are underprivileged, marginalized, jobless, hopeless and understandably frustrated. We need to ensure they are heard and can take an active part in their future.

14 killed, 12 missing after boat sinks in eastern Indonesia

JAKARTA, 14 Sept—Huge waves capsized a passenger boat in waters off North Maluku Province in eastern Indonesia on Sunday morning, killing 14 people and leaving 12 others missing, officials here said. More than three metre waves caused by Tropical Cyclone Kalmaegi hit the boat at 08:30 am local time when it was passing waters in Falabisahaya sub-district, said Sutopo Purwo Nugroho, spokesman of national disaster management agency. "As many as nine people survived the accident, 14 were killed and 12 other remain missing,"he said via phone. Search and rescue operation was already underway, said Sutopo. "But extreme weather along with huge waves hampers the searching operation now," he added. Boat is a popular transport means in the vast archipelago country of Indonesia, a chain of about 17,500 islands, but lack of safety standard has often triggered sea accidents.—Xinhua

Islamic State video purports to show beheading of UK hostage David Haines

BAGHDAD, 14 Sept
— Islamic State militants
fighting in Iraq and Syria
released a video on Saturday that purported to show
the beheading of British aid
worker David Haines.

Reuters could not immediately verify the footage. But the images were consistent with that of the filmed executions of two American journalists, James Foley and Steven Sotloff, in the past month.

Haines, a 44-year-old father of two from Perth, Scotland, was kidnapped last year while working for the French agency ACT-ED

The video entitled,

"A Message to the Allies of America," opened with UK Prime Minister David Cameron talking about working with the Iraqi government and allied Kurdish Peshmerga forces to defeat Islamic State.

"This British man has to pay the price for your promise, Cameron, to arm the Peshmerga against the Islamic State," said a masked man dressed in black with a British accent, standing over Haines, who was shown kneeling and wearing an orange jumpsuit. The video then showed the beheading of the kneeling man.

At the end of the vid-

eo, another hostage, identified as Alan Henning, was shown and the masked man said he would be killed if Cameron continued to support the fight against Islamic State.

Cameron condemned the killing and said he would bring the killers to justice.

US President Barack Obama strongly condemned "the barbaric murder" of Haines and vowed to work with other countries to "destroy this threat to the people of our countries, the region and the world."

"The United States stands shoulder to shoul-

der tonight with our close friend and ally in grief and resolve," Obama said in a statement. "We will work with the United Kingdom and a broad coalition of nations from the region and around the world to bring the perpetrators of this outrageous act to justice."

In the video, Haines also spoke, saying Cameron was responsible for his execution. "You entered voluntarily into a coalition with the United States against the Islamic State, just as your predecessor, Tony Blair, did," he said.

"Following a trend amongst our British prime ministers who can't find the courage to say no to the Americans.

Unfortunately, it is we, the British public, that will in the end pay the price for our Parliament's selfish decisions."

Foley and Sotloff made similar speeches to Obama, which have been dismissed as scripted by Islamic State and delivered under duress.

The purported executioner appeared to be the same man who appeared in videos with Foley and Sotloff, and it showed a similar desert setting. In both videos, the captives wore orange jumpsuits.

UK's Cameron says will hunt down 'murderers' of David Haines

London, 14 Sept — British Prime Minister David Cameron said on Saturday the murder of aid worker David Haines by Islamic State was an act of pure evil and vowed to bring his killers to justice however long it takes.

"This is a despicable and appalling murder of an innocent aid worker. It is an act of pure evil. My heart goes out to the family of David Haines who have shown extraordinary courage and fortitude throughout this ordeal," he said in a statement released by Downing Street.

"We will do everything in our power to hunt down these murderers and ensure they face justice, however long it takes."

Iraq PM says he will protect civilians after US-Iraq air strikes against IS

BAGHDAD, 14 Sept — Iraq's Shi'ite Prime Minister Haider al-Abadi said on Saturday that he had ordered his air force to halt strikes on civilian areas, following attacks by both

Iraqi and US jets in large areas of the country held by Islamic State fighters.

The announcement, which comes as the United States tries to build regional support for deeper mili-

tary action against Islamic State in Iraq and Syria, may be aimed at winning Sunni Muslim support for Abadi's new Shi'ite-led government as it battles the group which controls one third of Iraqi territory.

US Secretary of State John Kerry has been touring the Middle East to coordinate a response to Islamic State's growing power in eastern Syria and western Iraq. In Cairo on Saturday, he said Egypt has a critical role to play in countering the group's hardline Sunni Islamist ideology.

Abadi said his order to protect civilians had been issued on Thursday, a day after he held talks with Kerry in Baghdad.

Sunni Muslim tribal figures, who the US hopes can be persuaded to turn against the jihadists, have demanded a freeze on military action on civilian areas as one of the conditions for their support of the Shi'iteled government.

But residents in two Sunni areas of Iraq said there had been indiscriminate air strikes during the past two days. "I have ordered the Iraqi Air Force to halt shelling of civilian areas even in those towns controlled by ISIS," Abadi said on his official Twitter account, using the former name for militant group Islamic State.

Herak, a Sunni opposition grouping which has led anti-government protests and has ties to armed Sunni groups, said they "positively welcomed" Abadi's comments, a rare break in their usually dissenting rhetoric.

The United Nation's representative in Iraq, Nickolay Mladenov, welcomed the comments, which were repeated by Abadi at a conference about refugees on Saturday in Baghdad. "Protection of civilians and ensuring their safety and security is a paramount priority for the United Nations," Mladenov said.—Reuters

Australia's military to help fight Islamic State: PM

SYDNEY, 14 Sept — Australia will send a military force within days to the United Arab Emirates to contribute to airstrikes against Islamic State (IS) militants in Iraq, Australian Prime Minister Tony Abbott on Sunday said in Darwin.

Australia would supply 600 personnel, including 400 from the air force and 200 from the army, along with equipment to the coalition force against the ISIS movement, Abbott said.

"In addition, the Australian Defence Force will prepare a special operations task group as military advisers that could assist Iraqi and other security forces that are taking the fight to the ISIL terrorists," Abbott said, adding that this decision was made after his speaking with US President Barack Obama, and the campaign of airstrikes could last for a few months.

Australia would send to the United Arab Emirates up to eight Royal Australian Air Force F/A18 Super Hornet or "classic" Hornet combat aircraft, an E-7A Wedgetail Airborne Early Warning and Control aircraft and a KC-30A multi-role tanker and transport aircraft.

Abbott, however, refused to say the deployment mean Australia was

"We are not deploying combat troops but contributing to international efforts to prevent the humanitarian crisis from deepening," said Abbott, "Nevertheless, Australia is prepared to engage in international operations to disrupt and degrade ISIL because of the threat that this murderous death cult poses not just to the people of Iraq, not just to the people of the Middle East, but to the whole world, including to Australia." Australia last Friday raised the national terrorism public alert level from medium to high after receiving advice from the Australian Security Intelligence Organization. It was the first such change in 11 years in the country.

Members of State and Regional Sanghanayaka Committees, Township Sanghanayaka Committee and Ward/Village-tract Sanghanayaka Committees shall be elected by majority of the members of the Sangha at their respective meetings. The main aims and objectives of those various Sangha Organizations are to carry out the noble tasks of the purification, perpetuation, propagation and promotion of the Buddha Sasana throughout the world. We all Buddhist know that altogether six Buddhist Synods had been held in order to purify, perpetuate and propagate the Buddha Sasana after the noble demise of the Buddha over 2557 years ago.

The Sixth Buddhist Synod was held in the Union of Myanmar in 1954 and attended by the learned and chief monks (Maha Theras) from Five Theravada Buddhist Nations, Thailand, Cambodia, Laos, Sri Lanka and Myanmar. Although the Buddhist Synod has been held, it was still found that some isms and views which were in compatible with and contradictory to the essence of the real teachings of the Buddha. And also, different sects and schools of the Sangha Orders appeared in the Republic of the Union of Myanmar. They were not united and parted

YANGON, 14 Sept — The Ministry of Health will implement the water safety plan (WSP) next year in Myanmar with the assistance of the World Health Organization (WHO) and the UNICEF, source said on Sunday.

Punjabi Taleban says it is ending activities in Pakistan

ISLAMABAD, 14 Sept The Punjabi Taleban, a group that split from Tehreek Taleban Pakistan, will cease operating in Pakistan and will restrict its activities to Afghanistan, group leader Ismat Ullah Moawia announced in a video received by Pakistani journalists on Saturday.

According to video clips shown on GEO TV, the decision to restrict its activities to Afghanistan was taken at a meeting of its shura (advisory council) four days ago at an undisclosed place.

The group, also known as Tehreek Taleban Punjab, is largely comprised of mujahideen who had took part in a jihad in Indian-administer Kashmir and is responsible for several acts of terrorism in Punjab and Gilgit-Baltistan bordering China. Moawia said in his video his group was mainly affiliated with the Afghan Taleban and would therefore limit its activities to Afghanistan.

He also advised other factions of Pakistani Taleban to follow suit.

Punjabi Taleban split with Pakistani Taleban on the question of talks for peace with the Pakistan Army and government, which it supported but was opposed by the parent group.

Recently, al-Qaeda chief Ayman al-Zawahiri designated Punjabi Taleban member Asim Umar as head of al-Qaeda operations on the Indian subcontinent.— Kyodo News

US Embassy in Uganda tells citizens to seek shelter amid anti-terror operation

Kampala, 14 Sept — The US Embassy in Uganda told its citizens to seek safety on Saturday, warning that local authorities had uncovered a "terrorist cell" run by Somali militant group al-Shabaab, which they believed was planning an imminent attack.

Ugandan police later said it had foiled an attack in central Kampala and was increasing security at hotels and other public places, but declined to say who was behind the attack.

The Embassy, in a statement published on its website, said it was not aware of specific targets but said the authorities had increased security at key sites including Entebbe International Airport.

"Today Ugandan authorities reported the discovery of an al-Shabaab terrorist cell in Kampala, Uganda," the Embassy said. "We remain in close contact with our Ugandan counterparts as investigations continue into what appears to have been planning for an imminent attack." At a news conference later, Ugandan police said they had seized explosives and arrested an unspecified number of foreigners after foiling an attack.

But Fred Enanga, a spokesman for Uganda Police, declined to say if he believed the cell was connected to Islamist militants al-Shabaab or to name the nationalities of those dethe countries that contribute forces to an African Union peacekeeping mission battling al-Shabaab in Somalia, has suffered militant attacks in recent years, and al Shabaab has threatened more. The US Embassy, shortly before issuing its announcement, told its citizens, in a message posted on Twitter, to stay at home or proceed to a safe location while Ugandan authorities completed operations against a suspected cell in Kampala.

The Embassy has said Uganda faces a "continued threat" and has issued other possible attacks.

Nigeria military says one of its warplanes missing in northeast

ABUJA, 14 Sept — The Nigerian military said on Sunday one of its fighter iets that was operating in a northeast state where the armed forces are fighting Islamist Boko Haram militants had gone missing.

A search and rescue operation was underway for the Nigerian air force Alpha jet which was on a routine operational mission on Friday over Adamawa state when contact was lost with the aircraft, the Nigerian armed forces said in a statement.

The statement gave no more details and there was no other information available on whether the plane, which had left an air base at the Adamawa state capital Yola and had a crew of two, had crashed or been shot down.

Nigeria's military, backed by war planes, has been fighting to push back recent advances by Boko Haram into the north of Adamawa state and also towards Maiduguri, the state capital of neighbouring Borno state. The army said it beat back an attack outside Maiduguri on Friday.

Boko Haram, which has killed thousands since it launched its anti-government insurgency in the northeast in 2009, has in recent weeks captured and held a string of towns and villages in the region, a departure from its usual hitand-run tactics. —Reuters

S Korean foreign minister Yun meets Japan envoy for 1st time

SEOUL, 14 Sept — South Korean Foreign Minister Yun Byung Se and Japanese Ambassador to Seoul Koro Bessho held talks on Sunday at a cultural exchange event in Seoul as the two countries struggle to mend strained relations.

It was Yun's first meeting with the Japanese ambassador since assuming the post in February last year, when the government of President Park Geun Hye was launched. The talks lasted around 20 minutes.

At the event, Yun watched a traditional stage performance.

Reflecting Park'stough stance on Japan, Yun has maintained a stern attitude as bilateral relations have deteriorated amid disputes over territory and perceptions of wartime history. Yun's participation in the event, however, was viewed as an attempt to demonstrate that South Korea is making efforts to expand cultural and economic exchanges with Japan and is not rejecting dialogue.

Liberian president appeals to Obama for US help to beat Ebola

Dakar, 14 Sept — Liberian President Ellen Johnson Sirleaf has appealed to US President Barack Obama for urgent aid in tackling the worst recorded outbreak of the deadly Ebola virus, saying that without it her country would lose the fight against the disease.

The outbreak, which was first discovered in March, has now killed more than 2,400 people mostly in Liberia, neighbouring Guinea and Sierra Leone, as understaffed and poorly resourced West African healthcare systems have been overrun.

The World Health Organization (WHO) has warned that the epidemic is spreading exponentially in Liberia, where more than half of the deaths have been recorded. It has said that thousands are at risk of contagion in the coming weeks.

Medical charity Sans Medecins Frontieres (MSF) has set up several treatment centres in the affected countries but has also repeatedly warned it has reached the limits of its capacity and appealed for foreign governments to

In a letter dated 9 September seen by Reuters, Johnson Sirleaf appealed to Obama to build and operate at least one Ebola treatment unit in the capital Monrovia, saying that US civilian and military teams had experience in dealing with biological hazards. With the Liberian government due to open a 100-bed treatment centre and MSF scaling up its Ebola facility in Monrovia to 400 beds, Johnson Sirleaf said there was still a shortfall of 1,000 beds in the capital as well as a need for 10 new centres in the rest of the country.

"Without more direct help from your government, we will lose this bat-

tle against Ebola," Johnson Sirleaf, who won the Nobel Peace Prize for her work on women's rights, wrote to Obama.

The US government has committed around \$100 million to tackle the outbreak by providing protective equipment for healthcare workers, food, water, medical and hygiene equipment.

The US military said this week it would build a 25-bed field hospital in Liberia to care for infected health workers but it would hand this to Liberians to run.

On Friday, the US Ambassador to Liberia Deborah Malac said Washington would train security forces in isolation operations, after a boy was shot dead last month when Liberian soldiers opened fire on a crowd protesting at a quarantine in a Monrovia neighbourhood.

Liberian officials have called the outbreak the greatest threat to national stability since a 1989-2003 civil war, which killed nearly 250,000 people. Many ordinary people in Liberia, a nation founded by descendants of freed American slaves, look for help to the United States.

Cuba on Friday announced that it would deploy 165 medical personnel to Sierra Leone next month, the largest contingent of foreign doctors and nurses committed so far.

Johnson Sirleaf said that Ebola treatment centres were full and were being forced to turn away the sick.

"We are sending them home where they are a risk to their families and the communities. I am being honest with you when I say that at this rate, we will never break

the transmission chain and the virus will overwhelm us," she wrote.

"Only governments like yours have the resources and assets to deploy at the pace required to arrest the spread," Johnson Sirleaf wrote to Obama, a fellow Nobel Peace Prize laureate.

In a country with large numbers of unemployed former child soldiers, Johnson Sirleaf said the outbreak threatened civil order. With healthcare workers staying away from work, after dozens of their colleagues contracted the virus, citizens were also dying of other, treatable illnesses, she said.

Johnson Sirleaf asked the United States to assist in restoring services in at least 10 non-Ebola hospitals. Liberia also asked for US help in establishing an air bridge to transport personnel and equipment after all but two private airlines have canceled their flights.—Reuters

Abe says 'neutral' on whether to raise Japan sales tax to 10 percent

Токуо, 14 Sept — Јараnese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe said on Sunday he remained "neutral" on whether to proceed with a hike in Japan's sales tax to 10 percent, adding that decision would hinge on the strength of economic indicators for the current quarter. "The economy is a living thing and we are thinking about this in a neutral way," Abe told public broadcaster NHK. Abe has to decide by the end of the year whether to proceed with a previously approved plan to raise the consumption tax to 10 percent from 8 percent in 2015 after a hike from 5 percent in April sent consumption into a sharp contraction. Abe said in an *NHK* interview he wanted to see how the economy performs in the July to September quarter after GDP contracted

by 7.1 percent in the April to June quarter as a result of the previous tax increase. "We would like to get economic indicators from the quarter and hear the views of economists. As part of that process, we will decide whether to proceed with the tax hike as now set by law or whether to wait. That's the discussion we need to have," Abe said.

Abe said his goal is to restore growth to the world's third-largest economy and end 15 years of deflation. At the same time, he has pledged to curb government debt, which is well over twice the size of GDP, the heaviest debt burden in the industrial world. "We have no alternative but to aim to spur growth even as we get public finance on a healthier footing," Abe told *NHK*.

UK banks slam leverage plans as too complex, may increase risk

London, 14 Britain's banks have slammed plans to impose new capital rules for lenders and said the "leverage ratio" proposals are far too complex and could encourage banks to take more

"There is a risk that the current proposals will increase costs for bank customers and conflict with other rules that seek to make banks safer," said Simon Hills, a director at the British Bankers' Association (BBA).

The Bank of England (BoE) has proposed changes to the framework for the leverage ratio — which is a measure of equity as a percentage of assets, without adjusting for riskiness.

The proposals put forward are expected to result in Britain lifting the minimum leverage ratio for banks in the future, possibly to 4 or 5 percent, bank industry sources told Reuters last week.

Banks currently need to have a leverage ratio of at least 3 percent, in line with the global standard.

The BoE's Financial Policy Committee (FPC) is due to reveal changes to the leverage ratio framework in November, and gave banks until Friday to respond.

China issues yellow alert for typhoon Kalmaegi

Beijing, 14 Sept — China's marine forecast station issued a yellow alert as typhoon Kalmaegi, packing winds of up to 126 km per hour, is expected to enter the South China Sea on Monday morning.

Kalmaegi is now moving toward the northern Philippines from the country's east coast. It is forecast to land at the northern Philippines island of Luzon around Sunday evening and will continue to approach the southern coast of China on Monday morning, according to China's state marine forecast station.

The typhoon could create waves up to seven metres high in the eastern part of the South China Sea and the Bashi Channel between Sunday noon and Monday noon, according to the forecast.—Xinhua

One killed in US offshore gas platform accident

Houston, 14 Sept— An accident killed one person and injured two others on Saturday on a Chevron natural gas platform off the coast of the US southern state of Louisiana, said local media.

A spokesman for the Chevron Pipeline Co confirmed the news, saying the accident happened around 11:10 am local time, while the victims were all maintenance workers on the platform.

The platform was part of a natural gas gathering system, according to local media reports.—Xinhua

World's 1st transplant surgery using iPS cells conducted

Kobe, 14 Sept — A Japanese research team on Friday successfully transplanted retinal cells grown from induced pluripotent stem cells to a woman in her 70s, marking the first time iPS-derived cells have been introduced into a human body through surgery.

The clinical test, conducted by researchers at the governmentbacked Riken research institute Research and Innovation Hospital in Kobe, made use of iPS cells, a type of stem cells developed by Nobel-winning Kyoto University professor Shinya Yamanaka that can grow into various human body tissue.

Friday's surgery was primarily aimed at checking whether any problems would develop, including cancer, after iPS-derived retinal cells were transplanted to the patient, who has wet-type age-related macular degeneration, a form of retinal degenerative disease that could lead to loss

"I'm relieved that (the surgery) ended successfully," said Masayo Takahashi, the leader of the research team that conducted the surgery, at a press conference in Kobe. "I hope it is a significant step forward.'

The research team plans to perform surgery on six patients. It is likely to take around a year of the transplant surgery, the research team said.

At a separate press conference in Kyoto, Yamanaka congratulated the team for the successful surgery, saying, "It was a result of long-lasting efforts that they (the research team) have made a big step in such a short time of seven years since human iPS cells were created. I'd like to pay my respects."

"The real part of the clinical study starts from now," Yamanaka said. "I feel huge responsibil-

and the Institute of Biomedical ity as the developer of the technology."

> Prior to the surgery, the research team of the Riken Center for Developmental Biology first created iPS cells by introducing control genes into skin cells taken from the patient.

The team then created a sheet of pigment epithelium, a kind of protective layer in the retina, by developing the iPS cells into retinal pigment epithelial cells.

During the roughly two-hour surgery at the hospital in Kobe, the retinal sheet was transplanted onto the patient's eye after removing abnormal vessels in her retina tissue, according to Riken.

The team said after the surgery that nothing serious or harmful happened to the patient, such as massive blood loss.

The patient, a woman from Hyogo Prefecture, is expected to be released from the hospital in three to seven days.

People with wet-type age-reexperience a distortion or decline in vision due to retinal damage caused by abnormal growth of blood vessels. In Japan, around 700,000 people are thought to suffer from the disease. The health ministry lists it as an intractable condition.

Kyoto University's Yamanaka won the 2012 Nobel Prize in physiology or medicine, along with fellow researcher John Gurdon, for his advanced research on iPS cells.

Competition at rotating sushi restaurants intensifying

Токуо, 14 Sept — Operators of conveyer belt sushi restaurants are vying to diversify their lineups and speed up delivery of dishes amid fiercer competition and rising costs.

"This restaurant offers a variety of food at low prices and we never want to stop coming here," said Yuki Suda, a 17-year-old customer at a Muten Kura Sushi restaurant in Tokyo's Itabashi

"This place is like a casual family restaurant for us," said the senior high school student who had stopped by the restaurant with friends after school.

On top of sushi, Muten Kura Sushi restaurants, operated by Kura Corp., also offer reasonably priced ramen using seafood stock, available for less than 400

The company has sold more to assess the safety and effects lated macular degeneration often than 10 million bowls of ramen since launching in the fall of or sports vehicles running on a

It also offers "tendon" bowls of rice topped with deep-fried shrimps, and for a limited time, "unadon" rice with grilled eel fillets. A rice bowl with top-quality Spain-produced Iberico pork was added to its menu in March this

Among other popular items at Muten Kura Sushi are cups of coffee brewed in an espresso machine billed as having cost one million yen and low-priced

sweets, according to the company. "We aim to become a general restaurant attracting a broad range of customers with a fullfledged food menu that can compete with any kind of restaurant," a senior official of Kura said.

The company plans to raise the ratio of sales from non-sushi dishes to 30 percent of overall revenues, according to the offi-

In the meantime, Uobei sushi restaurants, which are operated by Genki Sushi Co. mainly in eastern Japan, use no rotating conveyor belts, although their sushi is inexpensive.

At Uobei, customers place orders on a touch panel in front of their seats and sushi dishes are delivered in about 90 seconds on average, about 10 times faster than on a conveyor belt.

The dishes are delivered on miniature shinkansen trains track, a feature that helps attract children.

"Customers can enjoy fresh food without the stress of waiting," a Genki Sushi official said. "As a result, it has helped boost the turnover rate and shorten waiting time at the restaurant."

The official said that the company will replace conveyer belts at sushi restaurants of other brands with "high-speed tracks" as well.



"Well if George Clooney's come to London to tie the knot, no better place to do it than in Chelsea, so I'm very happy. We're here to congratulate him," Francesca Wellman, one of the hopeful crowd,

She and many others had hoped to catch a glimpse of the couple during a lunch break.

"George will never let us down. He chose Chelsea," she added.

When the couple failed to make an appearance, Suzanne, a local resident said, "We haven't really wasted our time ... it's a lovely vibe around here."

Nine other couples married during the day, many choosing to leave through the back entrance of the building to avoid the unexpected media attention.—Reuters

Costa, who now has seven goals from his first Premier League games, helped Chelsea come out on top against the only other team with a 100 percent record after Swansea had taken the lead with an early John Terry own goal.

New signing Loic Remy grabbed his first Chelsea goal before Jonjo Shelvey netted a consolation late on, leaving the west London side two points clear at the top and five ahead of title rivals Manchester City.

Martin Demichelis scored with a late looping header for City after moments of sublime skill from Jack Wilshere and Alexis Sanchez had briefly turned the match in Arsenal's favour, following Sergio Aguero's opener.

Elsewhere, unbeaten Aston Villa are second after they beat Liverpool the best strikers we have two weeks ago. 1-0 at Anfield, Newcastle United's sorry start continued with a crushing 4-0 defeat at Southampton and Tottenham Hotspur were held to a 2-2 draw at Sunderland.

Everton beat West Bromwich Albion 2-0, Leicester City grabbed their first win since promotion, beating Stoke City 1-0, while Burnley and Crystal Palace played out a

goalless draw.



ATLANTA, 14 Sept-Rory McIlroy spectacularly eagled the par-five 15th to join Billy Horschel in a tie for the lead in the Tour Championship on Saturday and set up a thrilling conclusion to the 2013-14 PGA Tour season

With the FedExCup playoff title and a bonus jackpot of \$10 million on the line at East Lake Golf Club, world number one McIlroy sank a 26-foot putt to draw level at the top, then parred the last three holes to card a three-under-par 67. That left the Northern Irishman at nine-under 201 in the fourth and final playoff event, level with his American playing partner Horschel, who had been three ahead at the turn before losing momentum over the closing stretch on the way to a 69. McIlroy has already enjoyed a superb 2014 campaign, clinching two major titles among four wins worldwide, and has set his sights on claiming the FedExCup crown for the first time after a season-long race.—Reuters


Mayweather outpoints Maidana to remain unbeaten

Las Vegas, 14 Sept— Undefeated five-division champion Floyd Mayweather Jr claimed a unanimous decision over Argentina's Marcos Maidana to successfully defend three world titles and push his perfect record to 47-0 on Saturday.

In just the second rematch of his 18-year career, the 37-year-old American came out on top on all three scorecards, retaining his World Boxing Association (WBA) and World Boxing Council (WBC) welterweight and light-middleweight belts.

The victory was another masterful display of evasion from Mayweather, widely regarded as one of the best defensive fighters of all-time, as he danced out danger and used his lightning counter punching to frustrate the Argentine brawler.
