Myanmar decides to push future timber demand to limit

YANGON, 28 Dec — Despite an annual increase in both local and foreign consumption, the Myanmar Timber Enterprise has announced it will push the future timber demand to the limit set at 1.16 million tons a year.

The growing number of construction projects in the country is a major rea-

son for the increasing demand for timber, which is now used only for purposes of decoration and furniture production, Deputy General Manager U Win Naing told the Global New Light of Myanmar.

He said logging in the

previous financial year totaled 925,050 tons, adding the ministry has earmarked its annual production for this year at 730,000 tons, of which nearly 130,000 tons of teak and hard wood were extracted up to October.

Myanmar to expand its soft-shell crab breeding with advanced tech in future

YANGON, 28 Dec — Myanmar's soft-shell crab breeding farms will be expanded with advanced technology in the future so as to fulfill higher levels of both local and foreign consumption, the Ministry of Livestock, Fisheries and Rural Development said on Sunday.

According to Deputy Minister U Khin Maung Aye, the ministry is currently holding several meetings with both local and foreign experts to develop an aqua-culture production system for soft-shell crab.

In 2013 alone, total export of soft-shell crab was valued at over US\$50 million, with the Myanmar

Fisheries Federation (MFF) expecting the export value is likely to go up this year as well as coming years. This year's local consumption is also higher than the previous year.

Currently, local farmers are operating their breeding farms in Yangon, Taninthayi and Ayeyawady regions as well as Rakhine State on a commercial scale.

The developing of crab breeding can help locals earn more money and create more job opportunities. Some investors show their interest in soft-shell crab breeding as Myanmar uses its natural resources.

Since the government took office, the Myanmar Timber Enterprise under the Ministry of Environmental Conservation and Forestry has reduced timber production annually with the aim of ensuring a sustainable eco-system.

For the development of local wood-based industries,

Myanmar imposed a ban on log export in April this year. Currently, timber logs are sold in the country through an open tender system.

Myanmar exports timber to neighbouring countries as well as to South Korea and Japan. Myanmar has entered a one-year contract on timber trade with the United States, with the

US government allowing members of the International Wood Products Association (IWPA), a US-based organization, to buy timber from Myanmar.

According to the statistics provided by the ministry, the Myanmar Timber Enterprise earned US\$236.273 million and K48,832 million from timber sales till October.

contests to mark the sports month of December.

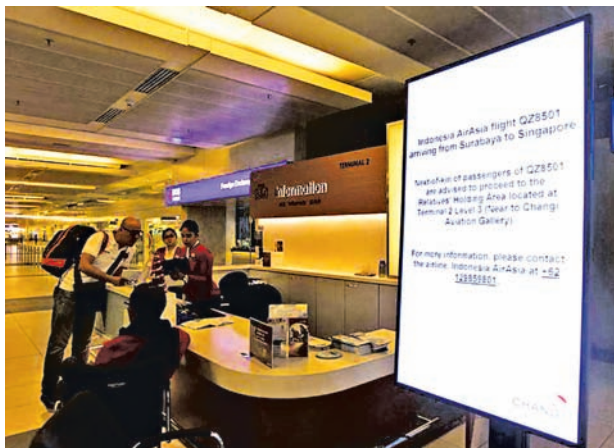
Township administrators of the district presented prizes to the winners in the traditional sports events.

AirAsia flight carrying 162 people goes missing in Southeast Asia

JAKARTA, 28 Dec — Indonesia's air force was searching for an AirAsia plane carrying 162 people that went missing on Sunday after the pilots asked to change course to avoid bad weather during a flight from the Indonesian city of Surabaya to Singapore.

Indonesia AirAsia

Flight QZ8501, an Airbus 320-200, lost contact with Jakarta air traffic control at 6:17 am (2317 GMT), officials said.

"The aircraft was on the submitted flight plan route and was requesting deviation due to enroute weather before communication with the aircraft was

lost," the airline said in a statement.

No distress signal had been sent, said Joko Muryo Atmodjo, air transportation director at Indonesia's transport ministry.

Indonesia AirAsia said there were 155 passengers and seven crew on board. It said 156 were Indone-

sian, with three from South Korea and one each from Singapore, Malaysia and France.

Both neighbouring Singapore and Malaysia had offered to help in the search, officials said.

Indonesia AirAsia is 49 percent owned by Malaysia-based budget carrier

AirAsia, with local investors holding the rest. The AirAsia group, including affiliates in Thailand, the Philippines and India, has not had a crash since its Malaysian budget operations began in 2002.

Flight QZ8501 was between the Indonesian port of Tanjung Pandan and the town of Pontianak, in West Kalimantan Province on Borneo island, when it went missing, Atmodjo told a news conference in Jakarta.

The aircraft had been flying at 32,000 feet and had asked to fly at 38,000 feet to avoid clouds, he added.

Tanjung Pandan is the main town on Belitung island, roughly half way between Surabaya and Singapore. There was bad weather over the island at the time. The plane had been due in Singapore at 8:30 am Singapore Time (0030 GMT).

An Indonesian woman at Singapore's Changi Airport said her sister and other family members, including two children, were on board.

"No one has told us anything. We heard the news and came to the airport," the woman said before entering

a cordoned-off area.

The airline said the captain and first officer were both experienced.

Tony Fernandes, chief of Malaysia's AirAsia, said on Twitter: "Thanks for all your thoughts and prayers. We must stay strong."

The incident comes at the end of a disastrous year for the region's airlines.

Malaysia's national flag carrier, Malaysia Airlines, lost two aircraft this year. Flight MH370 went missing on 8 March on a trip from Kuala Lumpur to Beijing with 239 passengers and crew on board and has still not been found.

On 17 July, Flight MH17 was shot down over Ukraine, killing all 298 people on board.

Indonesia AirAsia has a fleet of 30 Airbus A320s. The missing plane has been in service for just over six years, according to airfleets.net. All AirAsia-branded airlines operate aircraft made by Airbus, which has orders for several hundred planes from the group. AirAsia is considered one of the European planemaker's most important customers.

Floods in Malaysia and Thailand kill at least 24

KUALA LUMPUR, 28 Dec — The worst flooding in Malaysia in more than a decade has killed 10 people and forced nearly 160,000 from their homes and more rain is expected, authorities

said on Sunday.

Among the casualties, five were in the worst-hit state of Kelantan, in northeastern peninsular Malaysia. Over the border in southern Thailand, 14

people have been killed in the floods that began in mid-December.

Malaysian Prime Minister Najib Razak toured some of the worst-hit areas this weekend, following his

return from a vacation in Hawaii on Friday.

Najib was criticized for his absence during the calamity, after being photographed playing golf with President Barack Obama.

Northeastern Malaysia and southern Thailand are regularly hit by flooding during the annual northeast monsoon but this year the rain has been particularly heavy.

The Malaysian government said rain in Kelantan and southern Thailand would last for at least another week. An official in the southern Thai border town of Sungai Kolok said it would take up to two days for water levels to drop and for the border to be reopened. — Reuters

South Korea nuclear operator says cyberattacks continue, reactors safe

SEOUL, 28 Dec — South Korea's nuclear power operator said on Sunday that cyberattacks on non-critical operations at the company's headquarters are continuing but the country's nuclear power plants are operating safely and are secure from attack.

Korea Hydro & Nuclear Power Co Ltd has been intensifying its cyber security, President and CEO Cho Seok said. He gave no

details of the continued cyberattacks or the company's response, citing security reasons.

"We cannot let cyberattacks stop nuclear power operation," Cho told a news briefing. He added that a closed network used for reactor operations was inaccessible from external communication lines and impervious to cyberattacks.

"We will continue operating nuclear plants safely

against any attempted foul play, including cyberattacks," Cho said.

"Cyberattacks on KHNP's (headquarters) operations and administration are still continuing now," he added.

KHNP, part of state-run utility Korea Electric Power Corp, said last Monday that its computer systems had been hacked but only non-critical data had been stolen and reactor opera-

tions were not at risk.

Cho apologized for concerns that had been raised by the cyberattack and data leaks but said the nuclear plants themselves had not been affected. South Korea has 23 nuclear reactors which supply one-third of its electricity. Three are currently offline for routine maintenance or awaiting a license extension.

The operator and the government since last

Wednesday have been running emergency teams on stand-by until the end of the year as a precaution in case of any attempted cyberattacks on nuclear plants, after a hacker demanded the shutdown of three reactors by last Thursday and in Twitter messages threatened "destruction" if the demand was not met.

South Korean prosecutors are also seeking the co-operation of Chinese author-

ities in an investigation into the cyberattack, after tracing multiple Internet addresses to a Chinese city near North Korea. They have not ruled out possible involvement of North Korea in the attack.

Pyongyang denied any role in the cyberattacks, calling such suggestions part of a "smear campaign" by unpopular South Korean leaders. North Korea remains technically at war with the South. — Reuters

Angry police shun NYC mayor at funeral for slain officer

NEW YORK, 28 Dec — Tens of thousands of police from cities across the United States filled a New York City church and nearby streets on Saturday for the funeral of one of two policemen shot by a man who said he was avenging the killing of unarmed black men by police.

The service for Rafael Ramos was one of the largest police funerals in the city's history, with US Vice President Joe Biden among the dignitaries. But the tradition-bound ceremony was marked by an unusual protest against Mayor Bill de Blasio.

As he rose to deliver the customary mayoral eulogy, thousands of uniformed officers outside silently turned their backs on him in a pointed display of disrespect as his image filled the large screens broadcasting the service.

Angered by the mayor's qualified sympathy for nationwide demonstrations calling for police

reform, some New York police officers had similarly shunned de Blasio as he arrived a week ago at

the hospital where Ramos and his police partner, Wenjian Liu, were declared dead.

"He believed in protecting others," de Blasio said as he stood behind Ramos' coffin, which was draped in the police department's flag and bathed in blue light, "and those who are called to protect others are a special breed."

Singled out for their uniforms, the slaying of Ramos, 40, and Liu, 32, as they sat in their patrol car has become a rallying point for police and their supporters around the country, beleaguered by months of street protests accusing police of racist practices.

Offering a counter-narrative to the anti-police chants at many protests, Vice President Biden made the first of several speeches that touched on the marked increase in the racial diversity of the city's

police force, which only a few decades ago was almost entirely white.

"I believe that this great police force of this incredibly diverse city can and will show the nation how to bridge any divide," Biden said during the service at Christ Tabernacle Church in the suburban Queens neighbourhood in which Ramos lived with his wife, Maritza, and their two teenage sons.

New York Governor Andrew Cuomo said the department had officers hailing from more than 50 different nations and included speakers of 64 languages. He went on to criticize some of the protesters who have held rallies in the city on a nearly daily basis.

"The NYPD protected the right of free speech even though they themselves were the targets of false and abusive tirades by some," he said.—Reuters

Gov't, LDP to draw up permanent law on Japan's SDF dispatch overseas

TOKYO, 28 Dec — The government and the ruling Liberal Democratic Party plan to draw up a permanent law governing the dispatch of Japanese Self-Defence Forces overseas as needed and to boost logistical support for the US military, a government source said on Saturday.

The law, which would expedite the dispatch overseas of Japanese SDF personnel and provide logistical support to the troops of other allied countries, is part of moves to prepare a legal framework for changes to Japanese security policy under Prime Minister Shinzo Abe.

But the LDP still needs to convince its junior coalition partner Komeito party to support the plan as Komeito remains reluctant to enact such a law, according to the source.

The LDP hopes, by spring, to submit the law to parliament, together with other relevant security legislation, including legalization of the exercise of the

right to collective self-defence, or coming to the aid of allies under armed attack, the source said.

Expanding the scope of SDF activities and areas where they can operate has raised fears the SDF could become integrated in the use of force by other countries, which runs counter to the pacifist Constitution of Japan, critics of the security changes pushed by the Abe government say.

To counter those concerns, ruling coalition lawmakers are expected to discuss measures to apply restraints on SDF operations, the source said.

Abe, who wants to create the permanent law on the SDF dispatch abroad, on Wednesday instructed newly appointed Defence Minister Gen Nakatani to create a legal framework to enable a "seamless" response to security threats around the nation.

During a meeting on Saturday with Komeito deputy chief Kazuo Kitagawa, LDP Vice

President Masahiko Komura is believed to have also stressed the need to push for such a law, the source said.

It has been necessary for the Diet to pass special laws to authorize the dispatch of SDF personnel whenever sent abroad. Separate legislation was passed to allow refueling missions to support US-led antiterrorism operations in and around Afghanistan, and participation in humanitarian and reconstruction efforts in "noncombat areas" in Iraq.

But many LDP lawmakers said dispatching SDF through special legislation is time-consuming. Time-limited, case-specific special laws need to go to the Diet for approval.

However, Komeito is wary about enacting a permanent law out of fear SDF personnel may be dispatched abroad even in cases which have nothing to do with defending Japan.

In October, Shigeki Sato, who heads the party's panel on

diplomacy and security, said establishing a permanent law is not "the highest priority."

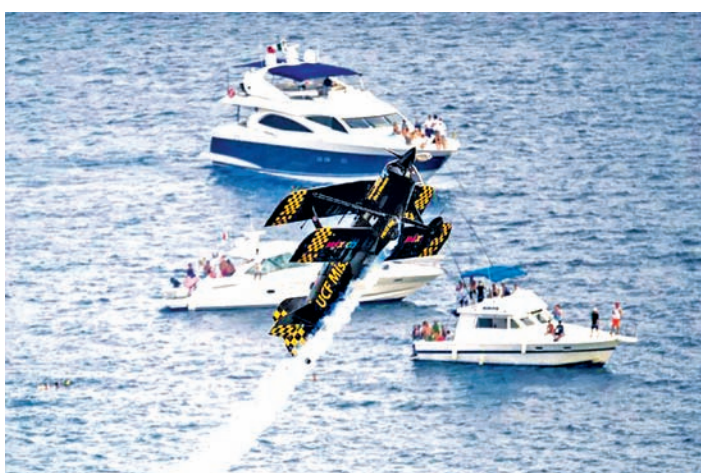
Japan's new security policy, adopted on 1 July by the Cabinet to enable to exercise of the right to collective self-defence, expands the SDF's logistical support for foreign troops.

Under the policy, dispatching the SDF to areas where combat is not taking place, for missions such as refueling, would not constitute integration into the use of force by other countries.

In preparing the new permanent law to expand the SDF's operations abroad, attention will be focused on such issues as providing weapons and ammunition to US and other allied troops, the source said.

Discussions will also include how the new law would work in relation to a separate law on UN peacekeeping operations, which currently serves as the legal basis for Japan's dispatch of its troops.

DPRK Internet, 3G mobile network suffer 2nd outage

PYONGYANG, 28 Dec — Internet and 3G mobile network of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (DPRK) were paralyzed again on Saturday evening amid bickering between the United States and the Asian country over an earlier cyber attack on Sony Pictures.

At Pyongyang Time 7:30 pm (1030 GMT) on Saturday, DPRK's Internet and 3G mobile network came to a standstill, and had not returned to normal at press time as of 9:30 pm (1230 GMT)

Saturday, according to Xinhua reporters and Chinese facilities based in the country.

Earlier in the day, the Policy Department of the National Defence Commission blamed the United States for enduring instability in the country's Internet and denied any cyber attack on Sony Pictures.

The United States groundlessly linked the unheard-of hacking at the Sony Pictures Entertainment to the DPRK, a spokesman for the department said in a state-

ment. The spokesman urged the United States to conduct a joint investigation with the DPRK.

The United States accused the DPRK of attacking Sony Pictures in late November to deter it from showing a comedy movie entitled "Interview" which features an assassination attempt on DPRK leader Kim Jong Un.

DPRK's Internet has been unstable since last weekend, including a complete outage of about nine hours on Tuesday.

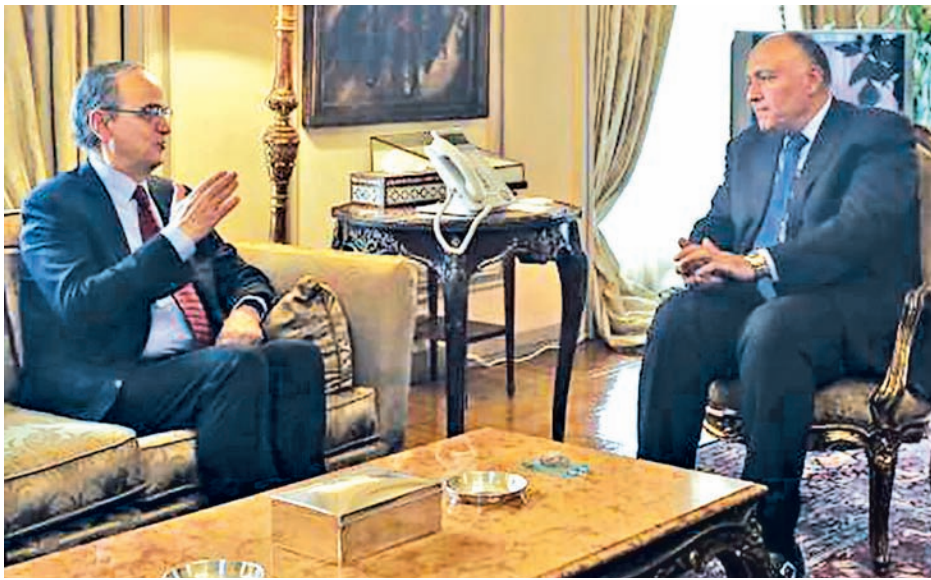
Syria ready to discuss Russia peace plan talks, opposition dismissive

BEIRUT/CAIRO, 28 Dec — Syria said on Saturday it was willing to participate in “preliminary consultations” in Moscow aimed at restarting talks next year to end its civil war but the Western-backed opposition dismissed the initiative.

Two rounds of peace talks this year in Geneva failed to halt the conflict which has killed 200,000 people during more than three years of violence and there was little sign of the latest move gaining traction.

Syrian state television quoted a source at the foreign ministry saying: “Syria is ready to participate in preliminary consultations in Moscow in order to meet the aspirations of Syrians to find a way out of crisis.”

But there are many ob-

stacles to peace. The most powerful insurgent group, the hardline Islamic State, controls a third of Syria but has not been part of any in-

itiative to end the fighting.

Other rebel factions are not unified.

The opposition is also suspicious of Russian-led

plans as Moscow has long backed President Bashar al-Assad with weapons.

Hadi al-Bahra, head of the Turkey-based oppo-

sition National Coalition, met with Arab League Chief Nabil Elaraby in Cairo on Saturday and told a news conference “there is no initiative as rumoured”.

“Russia does not have a clear initiative, and what is called for by Russia is just a meeting and dialogue in Moscow, with no specific paper or initiative,” he was quoted by Egyptian state news agency MENA as saying.

The opposition said after the failed “Geneva 2” talks in February that Damascus was not serious about peace.

Syrian state news agency SANA said on Saturday the Moscow talks should emphasise a continued fight against “terrorism”, a term it uses for the armed opposition.

Members of Assad's government say the opposition in exile is not representative of Syrians and instead says a small group of opposition figures who live in Damascus, and are less vocal against the president, should represent the opposition.

Russian Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov said this month that he wanted Syrian opposition groups to agree among themselves on a common approach before setting up direct talks with the Damascus government.

But Lavrov did not specify which opposition groups should take part.

Syria's civil war started when Assad's forces cracked down on peaceful pro-democracy protests in 2011.

In US-Cuba prisoner swap, mystery surrounds the unnamed 53

HAVANA, 28 Dec — Cuba's most prominent dissidents say they have been kept in the dark by US officials over a list of 53 political prisoners who will be released from jail

as part of a deal to end decades of hostility between the United States and Cuba. For years, dissident leaders have told the United States which opponents of Cuba's communist government

were being jailed or harassed, but they say they were not consulted when the list of prisoners to be freed was drawn up or even told who is on it.

The lack of information has stoked concern and frustration among the dissidents, who worry that the secret list is flawed and that genuine political prisoners who should be on it will be left to languish.

“We're concerned because we don't agree with the silence, because we have a right to know who they are. Who are they?” said Berta Soler, leader of the Ladies in White dissident group, which marches in Havana on Sundays to demand the release of prisoners. “There are not

just 53 political prisoners, there are more, and we are concerned that the US list might have common criminals on it,” she told Reuters in Havana.

US officials have so far been tight-lipped about how the list of 53 was assembled and who was consulted inside Cuba. It also is not clear if some prisoners were kept off the list because the Cuban government refused to release them.

A US official said on Saturday that Washington had asked Cuba to release a specific group of people jailed on charges related to their political activities, but declined to answer further questions.

Neither the US nor the

Cuban governments have said when the prisoners would be released. Cuba declined to comment on why more details have not been publicly released.

The dissident Cuban Commission on Human Rights and National Reconciliation, which keeps track of activists in the different opposition groups, counted in June a total of 114 political prisoners, although it includes 12 who are on parole after being released from jail plus several others who have since been released.

The group's veteran leader Elizondo Sanchez, who also spoke with Reuters, says at least 80 peaceful dissidents are on that list, including some whose

only crime was to demonstrate or scribble anti-government graffiti.

Others include soldiers who deserted with their weapons, former government officials, people who tried to hijack an airplane to the United States and eight militants jailed for entering Cuba from the United States and trying to start insurrections.

US President Barack Obama announced a new era in US-Cuba relations on 17 December, saying they would restore diplomatic ties broken more than five decades ago and he would begin to unravel economic sanctions that were aimed at forcing the communists from power.

Swedish centre-left do eight-year deal with opposition to avert snap election

STOCKHOLM, 28 Dec — Sweden's three-month-old minority centre-left government announced a deal with the opposition on Saturday to sideline the anti-immigration Sweden Democrats, who hold the balance of power in parliament, and avert a fresh election.

Sweden's normally stable politics were thrown into turmoil in December when Prime Minister Stefan Lofven said he planned to return to the polls after his budget was voted down by the centre-right opposition and the Sweden Democrats.

The Sweden Democrats had threatened to bring down any govern-

ment that did not curb rising immigration, and to turn a snap election — which would have been the first since 1958 — into a referendum on Sweden's liberal refugee policies.

The deal with the centre-right Alliance bloc extends right through the next parliament of 2018-22, setting aside differences with the aim of making sure that centrist parties hold a lock on power and shut out the far right.

“The agreement is a way to show that we take responsibility for making sure Sweden can be governed; that we put the country's future first,” Social Democrat Lofven said.

Far-right parties across Europe have been gaining ground in recent years, focusing voters' economic fears and frustration on immigration policy.

While right-wing, populist parties have found a voice in mainstream politics in Sweden's neighbours Denmark and Norway, Stockholm's established politicians have refused to have anything to do with the Sweden Democrats, who want to cut asylum seeker numbers by 90 percent. Finland and Denmark hold elections next year and the populist right are expected to do well.

Avoid Becoming Victims of ATM Scammers

The news of the arrests of five foreigners, who stole cash from six banks for 58 times, using 35 fake automatic teller machine (ATM) cards, which appeared in the 23 December issue of GNLM, prompted me to write this article. For me this is the first time I had ever heard of such crimes being committed in Myanmar. There may be, but I may have missed them. However, these sorts of crimes, involving large amounts of money had been going on in other countries, since very long time ago. I had noticed, they were committed by foreigners in most cases. The scammers were almost always from countries that are advanced in electronic and computer technologies. They traveled to different destinations, mostly in developing countries, in search of easy preys. Their simplest technique is to pose as tourists and hangout around shopping malls, entertainment complexes, banks and other busy public places on the lookout for their targets. When someone approached an ATM machine to draw money they will observe, from close range, what numbers that person entered as pass code. They may be able to see distinctly or sometimes they had to guess by the movements of the hand and make fake ATM cards with those numbers. They have two chances to try out the uncertain pass codes, that had to be guessed from the hand movements, before the ATM card is held back by the machine on the third wrong entry. Which, the issuing bank will only return it after thorough identification of the claimant. However, the scammers won't dare to reclaim as they are fakes. I had seen some cautious persons, in other countries, when drawing money from the ATM machines would survey the surrounding before approaching it and while entering the pass code they blocked the view of the keyboard by their bodies so that it would not be visible to others. It's best not to trust anyone who approached you while you are drawing cash from the ATM. This is not paranoia, but to safeguard your life's savings, from being stolen. Luckily in Myanmar, ATM cards are not linked with the saving accounts, but have to apply for a separate account that does not give interest on the cash deposited in them, so not many people are interested in using ATMs. In other words, the ATM culture had not caught up with the Myanmar public yet. Also as the ATM accounts are separate, and separate deposits had to be made, nobody will put all his money into that account. So the Myanmar ATM cards are unattractive to the scammers, thus sparing them from being hacked and scammed. Who would risk being arrested by scamming the ATMs that won't yield much cash. Naturally they went after the foreign ATMs.

For the benefit the readers, who are not familiar with the use of ATMs, I will briefly explain the procedures used in our country and in most other countries, so that they will understand my statement about the losses that are incurred due to scamming. In Thailand for instance, if you open a

saving account and deposit some cash, notwithstanding the amount, you will be provided with a bank pass book to draw money direct from the teller at the bank, and also an ATM card with which you can draw cash from any ATM machine belonging to any bank. Whereas in our country ATM is not linked to the saving account and had to make a separate deposit, thus they cannot be of much amount because the ATM deposits do not get bank interests. Thus they are not attractive to the scammers and that fact must have spared the people using the local ATM cards from being scammed, because the scammers must have done their homework thoroughly and found that they could not produce much cash. Whereas the foreign banks' ATMs served dual purposes, they can be used as credit cards too, so they must be more attractive to the scammers. That was a blessing in disguise for not being an advanced country.

The spying on the ATM users to get their pass codes for making fake ATM cards, using computer is the simplest method of scamming. Some foreign scamming gangs are using more and more sophisticated means based on electronic and computer technologies. One of them is to place an electronic gadget inside the ATM secretly and that gadget will read or sense the numbers entered and transmits them to the control computer, thus enabling them to make fake cards. This method affords them to obtain the information they need without exposing themselves, as in loitering around and spying. They had to take the risk only once, that is while placing the spying devices in position. By the term information, I meant every data on the card, including the amount of balance in the account and the pass codes. In some cases, tiny spy cameras are placed concealed from views of even the sharp-eyed individuals, let alone a casual observer, in the vicinity of the ATM machines to record the numbers punched into the machines by the users. There can be many more ways and means but I am sure, by now, the readers will have gained some ideas as to how the ATM scamming is done.

Myanmar is the latest target of the scammers and we should be wary of more scamming, because these crooks target the countries that are not well advanced and not yet familiar with such acts of stealing, so people are not aware that they are vulnerable to scamming. That made them easy preys. The news of the arrests of the five scammers may somewhat deter other would-be scammers, but I doubt they will shy away entirely. I had witnessed the continuing acts of scamming recurrently in the neighboring countries though there were frequent arrests.

To avoid being scammed, the followings are some precautions to be taken, which I had observed and learned from my frequent visits abroad:-

1. If possible don't use ATMs, as there are many bank branches today.
2. If you must use it, unavoidably, take precautions so as not to be spied upon.
3. Never trust anyone who approached you while you are drawing money from the ATM.

4. Make close observations of the ATM machines for any telltale signs of foreign objects, not usually found on such machines.
5. Watch out for tiny spy camera in the vicinity of the ATMs.
6. Change your pass code as often as possible to make it safe from scammers, especially when you suspect that the machine you just used, had been rigged with spying devices.
7. Be acquainted with the latest methods of scamming by keeping yourself informed through reading and watching foreign media.

I hope by now, the readers who had no idea of the ATM scamming before, know how to avoid from being scammed. My sole intention of writing this article is to share my experiences in such matter, so that people can take precautions against scamming.

Looking forward to a scam free ATM system.

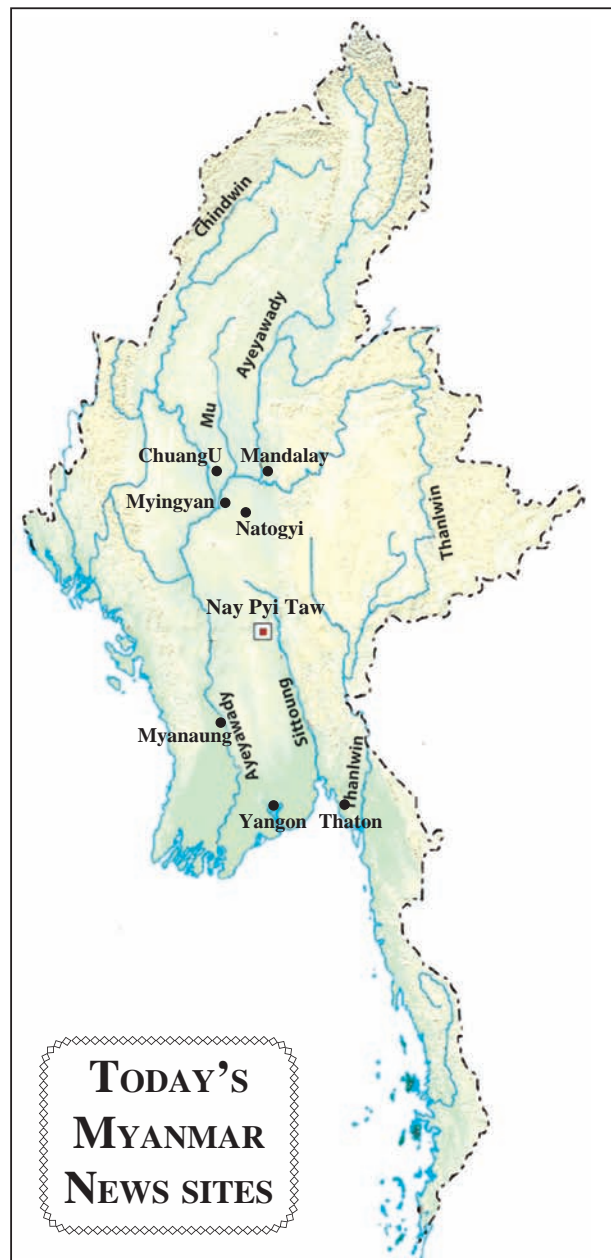
Natogyi Township's cooperative societies need to pay back over K700 million loans

Russia says to supply coal, electricity to Ukraine

MOSCOW / KIEV, 28 Dec — Russia has agreed on a new deal to supply coal and electricity to Ukraine, which is struggling with a lack of raw fuel for power plants due to a separatist conflict in the industrial east, Russian officials said on Saturday.

The move comes a day after Kiev said it would suspend train and bus services to Crimea, effectively creating a transportation blockade to and from the region annexed by Moscow in March this year. Kiev has briefly cut off electricity to Crimea before.

Russia will supply coal and electricity to Kiev without advance payment as a goodwill gesture from President Vladimir Putin, his spokesman Dmitry Peskov told TASS news agency. "Putin made a decision to start these supplies due to the critical situation with

energy supplies and despite a lack of prepayment," Peskov said. Russia plans to supply 500,000 tonnes of coal to Ukraine per month, Deputy Prime Minister Dmitry Kozak told Rossiya 24 television. It is ready to supply another 500,000 tonnes per month if an additional agreement is reached, he added. Ukraine's coal

reserves stand at 1.5 million tonnes compared with normal winter stocks of 4-5 million tonnes, according to energy ministry data.

The country used to be self-sufficient in electricity, but months of fighting a pro-Russian uprising has disrupted coal supplies to thermal power plants, which had generat-

ed around 40 percent of its power. Last week Ukraine's energy minister, Voldymir Demchyshyn, said he was holding talks with Russia's energy ministry on coal and power supplies. Earlier attempts to import Russian coal have been hampered by supplies being held up at the border.

Supplies will come at Russian domestic prices, Kozak said, adding that he hoped the move would help ensure reliable energy supplies to Crimea.

He did not say whether the transportation hold-ups at the border had been resolved. Russia will also supply electricity to Ukraine, Kozak said, without giving supply volumes.

Kiev's pro-Western government has accused Russia of orchestrating the rebellion in Ukraine's east, a charge Moscow denies.

Man who tried to kill Pope John Paul II puts roses on his tomb

VATICAN CITY, 28 Dec — The man who tried to kill former Pope John Paul II 33 years ago showed up at the Vatican on Saturday to put white roses on his tomb and said he wanted to meet Pope Francis.

Mehmet Ali Agca, a Turk, left John Paul critically injured after firing several shots in the failed assassination attempt in St Peter's Square on 13 May, 1981. The former pope forgave Agca, once a member of a Turkish far right group known as the Grey Wolves, and went to meet him in 1983 in the Rome prison where he had been sentenced to life imprisonment for the attack.

Agca called the Italian daily *la Repubblica* on Saturday to announce he had arrived in the Vatican, his first visit since the assassination attempt and exactly 31 years after John Paul met him in prison.

The visit was confirmed to *Reuters* by Father Ciro Benedettini, the Vatican's deputy spokesman,

who said Agca stood for a few moments in silent meditation over the tomb in St Peter's Basilica before leaving two bunches of white roses.

Agca, 56, was pardoned by Italy in 2000 and extradited to Turkey where he was imprisoned for the 1979 murder of a journalist and other crimes. He was released from jail in 2010.

The attack against John Paul, who died in 2005, has remained clouded by unanswered questions over who may have been behind it. An Italian investigative parliamentary commission said in 2006 it was "beyond reasonable doubt" that it was masterminded by leaders of the former Soviet Union.

The Vatican on Saturday gave a cool response to Agca's request to meet with Pope Francis. "He has put his flowers on John Paul's tomb; I think that is enough," Vatican spokesman father Federico Lombardi told *la Repubblica*.

Indonesian police detain seven people over link to Islamic State

JAKARTA, 28 Dec — Indonesian police have detained seven people for suspected links to the Islamic State extremist group fighting in Syria and Iraq, a senior police officer said late Saturday. Six of the seven were detained early on Saturday when they were about to board a Qatar Airways flight to Syria via Doha, Herry Heriawan, subdirector for crimes and violence at the Jakarta Police Headquarters, told reporters in a text message. Among the six, three were from one family — mother, father and their

10-year-old child — who told the police they planned to stay in Syria.

"After questioning, they admitted they planned to go to Istanbul via Doha and then continue to Syria to perform Islamic sharia," Herry said.

They were travelling to Syria using fake passports made by the seventh person, a nongovernmental activist who was detained separately in East Jakarta, according to Herry. The person was quoted as confessing that he had sent 10 people to Syria to fight.—*Kyodo News*

Rocket attack, blasts kill three Afghans, wounds nine

KABUL, 28 Dec — The ongoing Afghan militancy in the shape of rocket attack and bomb blasts have left three people dead and injured nine others since Saturday evening, sources confirmed on Sunday.

In the latest violent incident which happened in Afghan capital city Kabul, three people sustained injuries as a bomb struck a vehicle on Sunday morning. "A bomb planted on the vehicle of Mawlawi Aziz Rahman Sediqi, the head of religious council of Wardak Province, went off Sunday morning injuring three people including Sediqi, his son and driver," local television channel Tolo reported in its news bulletin.

Citing the police, the media outlet added that the device was a sticky bomb attached on the vehicle of Sediqi which exploded at 09:00 am local time and wounded him badly. In a similar violent attack, a motorbike bomb was exploded next to a police van in Hairatan district of the northern Balkh Province on Sunday morning injuring one

civilian, local media reported.

However, officials have yet to make comment.

Meanwhile, a rocket fired by anti-government militants presumably by Taliban outfit on a volleyball ground in Wardak province with Maidan Shahr as its capital 35 km west of Kabul claimed three lives and injured five others on Saturday evening, spokesman for provincial government Attaullah Khogiani said on Sunday. "Two groups of youths were playing volleyball in Omarkhil village of Nurkh district on Saturday evening when a rocket fired by militants slammed onto the ground killing three players and injuring five others including three players and two onlookers," Khogiani told reporters.

Two of those killed in the attack are students, according to the local people. Although no one has claimed responsibility for the attack, locals blamed Taliban insurgents for the offensive.

US, allies conduct 12 air strikes against Islamic State

WASHINGTON, 28 Dec — The United States and its allies carried out 12 air strikes against Islamic State militants in Iraq and Syria on Saturday, the Combined Joint Task Force said.

Six strikes near the Syrian town of Kobani on the Turkish border destroyed Islamic State buildings, fighting positions and vehicles, a task force statement said.

In Iraq, targets including buildings, vehicles and an Islamic State refinery were hit in six strikes near Al Asad, Mosul, Falluja, Al-Qaim and Baiji, it said.

Sony works for third day to restore PlayStation after attack

BOSTON, 28 Dec — Sony Corp worked for a third day on Saturday to restore services to its PlayStation network as the FBI said it was looking into the

disruption, which began on Christmas Day.

"We are aware of the reports and are investigating the Sony PlayStation matter," Federal Bureau of

Investigation spokeswoman Jenny Shearer said via email. She did not elaborate.

Meanwhile Sony said on Saturday that the attack had prevented some people who received consoles for Christmas from using their new machines on the PlayStation network, which lets gamers compete with people around the world via the Internet.

"If you received a PlayStation console over the holidays and have been unable to log onto the network, know that this problem is temporary and is not caused by your game console," Sony executive Catherine Jensen said on the company's US PlaySta-

tion blog.

Some customers posted complaints about the outage on the blog. "Three days without PSN. That's absurd," said one of them.

"We understand your frustration," Jensen responded early on Saturday afternoon. "Our engineers are working to restore service as quickly as possible!"

Later in the day she said the company had restored access for some users and would keep bringing more back online.

Sony declined to say how many of PSN's 56 millions users had been affected by the attack.

The blog said the problems were the result

of "high levels of traffic designed to disrupt connectivity and online game play," which is widely known as a distributed denial-of-service attack.

It was Sony's second recent high-profile encounter with hackers after an unprecedented attack on its Hollywood studio, which the US government attributed to North Korea and linked to the release of the low-brow comedy "The Interview."

A hacker activist group known as Lizard Squad said it was responsible for the PSN outage as well as delays on Microsoft's Corp's Xbox network; Microsoft quickly fixed the problem.

The group has claimed responsibility for previous attacks, including ones on PSN in early December and August.

The August attack coincided with a bomb scare in which Lizard Squad tweeted to American Airlines that it heard explosives were on board a Dallas-to-San Diego flight carrying an executive with Sony Online Entertainment. Sony has been the victim of some of the most notorious cyberattacks in history.

Besides the breach at its Hollywood studio, hackers stole data belonging to 77 million PlayStation Network users in 2011.

Suspected state hacking campaign used commercial software

SAN FRANCISCO, 28 Dec — A previously undisclosed hacking campaign against military targets in Israel and Europe is probably backed by a country that misused security-testing software to cover its tracks and enhance its capability, researchers said.

The attack programme relied on software usually sold by Boston-based Core Security to companies and other customers that want to test their own defences, said researchers coordinated by Israel's independent Computer Emergency Response Team, or CERT.

The researchers from CrowdStrike and startup Cymmetria will present their unusual findings at the annual Chaos Communication Congress security

conference in Hamburg on Saturday.

Criminal hackers have made use of penetration-testing tools such as Metasploit for years, other experts said, but most major government-sponsored hacks have specially written tools supplemented by free and widely available programmes. That is in part because commercial programmes could be traced back to specific customers.

Over time, however, the exposure of campaigns relying on the same tailor-made tools have made it easier for investigators to attribute those attacks to a specific government.

Using the Core Security programme, which typically costs \$10,000 or \$20,000, could help

muddy the waters, and CrowdStrike analyst Tillmann Werner said it could also help a second-tier cyber-power skip some of the work frequently undertaken by China, Russia and the United States.

"The most likely answer is they didn't have the capability to do it on their own," Werner said of the hackers, adding that "there is no risk of leaving tool-marks." Werner and Cymmetria Chief Executive Gadi Evron, who also chairs the Israeli CERT, said they did not know who was behind the campaign.

But Evron said that one suspect would be Iran, judging by the victims and other evidence. The researchers dubbed the new campaign Rocket Kitten,

following CrowdStrike's convention for naming all suspected Iranian hacking groups as Kittens.

Iran has beefed up its Internet operations in the years since its nuclear programme was attacked by Stuxnet, an unusually destructive virus developed by the United States and Israel.

Evron said the team had uncovered seven connected attacks so far since April, including attempts to steal information from an Israeli company "adjacent to the defence and aerospace industry," an Israeli academic institution, a German-speaking defence agency, and an Eastern European defence ministry. At least the Israeli attempts failed, he said.—Reuters

Next year crucial for fight against climate change, but hurdles remain

WASHINGTON, 28 Dec — The clock is ticking toward next year when world leaders will converge on Paris in a bid to hammer out a deal on climate change, but there are a number of hurdles that, if not overcome, could result in a flimsy agreement, US experts said.

At issue is whether the world can agree on a robust plan to cut carbon emissions and take measures to tackle climate change at a time when scientists fret the problem is getting worse amid rising world temperatures and an increase in sea levels and super storms.

Many governments appeared to put the issue on the backburner until recent months, which saw major summits in New York and Lima, Peru, as well as a November breakthrough deal between China and the United States — the world's two biggest economies and carbon emitters — to significantly cut harmful emissions. Although the deal sparked new optimism that a worldwide agreement on climate change could be reached, obstacles remain.

Indeed, attempts to tackle climate change are dogged by the same prob-

lem year after year — the split between developed and developing countries. While developed countries are historically responsible for decades of CO2 buildup that has heated up the planet, they argue that virtually all nations must cut emissions, and there are ongoing disagreements over how much each country should cut. However, many developing countries contend there is no way to lift millions of their people out of poverty other than the heavy use of fossil fuels to boost industry, grow the economy and create jobs.—Xinhua

Climate change threat to mussels: Study

LONDON, 28 Dec — The population of mussels could be threatened by climate change, as it has made oceans increasingly acidic, a team of British researchers revealed on Wednesday.

In a new paper published in the Royal Society's journal *Interface*, researchers from the University of Glasgow in Scotland found mussels' shells have become more brittle when they are formed in more acidic water.

According to Susan Fitzer, the leading researcher, this could mean mussels growing in the wild in the future could

be more vulnerable to attack from predators, as well as from the effect of ocean forces. The change in the oceanic water could also have an effect on the yields of mussels available for the fishing industry.

The research team housed common blue mussels in laboratory tanks, and altered the temperature and pH levels of the water to simulate four different types of ocean waters.

Those waters, which contained different levels of acidity, are expected to appear in the oceans in the coming decades.

"What we found was that the calcite outer shells

of the mussels past a certain threshold of acidity was stiffer and harder, making it more brittle and prone to fracture under pressure, and the aragonite inner shell became softer," Fitzer noted.

The world's oceans are becoming increasingly acidic as they absorb some of the atmospheric carbon dioxide which contributes to climate change.

The water reacts with the carbon dioxide to form carbonic acid. Scientists expect the pH of the world's oceans to drop from 8 today to 7.7 by the end of the 21st century.

media to promote love and support for anyone who is in need of it.

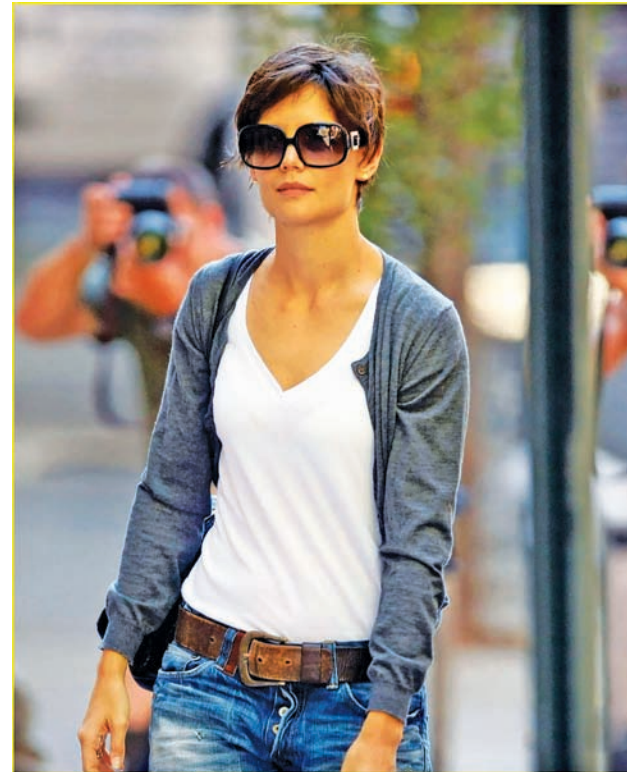
“When the suicides were starting to happen and kids were being bullied in schools, I felt really compelled to do something because I was bullied in school, and I didn’t really

Japan coach Aguirre denies involvement in match-fixing

TOKYO, 28 Dec — Embattled Japan coach Javier Aguirre on Saturday vehemently protested his innocence over match-fixing charges that have been leveled at him in Spain.

Speaking to the media for the first time since Spanish prosecutors named him among 41 individuals on 15 December in a report into the alleged rigging of a La Liga game in 2011, the 56-year-old said, “I worked in Spain for 12 years and have never done anything unethical or unprofessional.”

“I believe Spanish soccer is fair and clean. The only way to win matches is through effort. I have never been given gifts by anybody and never expected them. I will cooperate with prosecutors and defend myself until the end.”

Aguirre was manager of Real Zaragoza when the team beat Levante 2-1 away at the end of the 2011 season and as a result avoided relegation to the second tier. He could be asked to appear in Spain if the complaint is accepted by a Valencia court and a full-scale investigation is opened.

“I have coached over 450 matches in Spain and this is just one match and I happened to be there. I hope this becomes clearer over time and the situation will be calm. I am as surprised about this as everyone.” Asked what he would do if the case is accepted by the court and preliminary hearings start in January, he said, “My lawyer has told me that I would

be called at a time when it would not affect my job.”

“While the Asian Cup is going on I will be thinking about nothing except winning the championship. I will not waste a minute thinking about anything else.”

The Japan Football Association decided last week that Aguirre will remain in charge for the 9-31 January Asian Cup despite his alleged involvement in the scandal. He had already denied any wrongdoing in emergency talks with association officials.

Spanish prosecutors alleged that the Levante players were reportedly paid a total of 965,000 euros to deliberately lose the game. Zaragoza first made bank transfers to Aguirre and its players and officials, who then took the money from their accounts and passed it on to the Levante players, reports said citing the prosecutors.

Former Zaragoza president Agapito Iglesias and players from both teams are cited as defendants in

the complaint.

Aguirre, who refused to be drawn on details under lawyers’ advice, said he had no intention of stepping down as Japan coach.

“The players involved in the (Zaragoza-Levante) match are still continuing playing every weekend and the Zaragoza directors are still doing their jobs. The referee that officiated that match is still blowing his whistle.”

“Why can’t I carry on my job just as they are? Until I am proven guilty, I am innocent and have the right to work.”

“If my wallet, for example, disappeared in this room you would not stop everyone from leaving until it was found. Everyone has to do their own jobs. You would have to investigate where the wallet went but you have to carry on working.”

“There are players from that match that are playing in the Champions League now and I think that is good. I have done nothing that I regret and

want to keep working.”

He added, “In all my career in Mexico and the United States and Spain I have never quit while I am under contract. I am a professional. If you speak to the players and staff at the places that I have worked they would tell you that.”

Aguirre said he remembered the Zaragoza-Levante match like it was yesterday but did not recall anything untoward about the game.

“I prepared for that game the same way I have in the other matches, to try and win it. It was a tight match. The (Levante) goalkeeper could not have saved the two goals we scored. They pulled one back and there were some dangerous moments toward the end of the match and I remember it like it was yesterday.”

Aguirre, who has also coached the Mexican national team and had spells as manager at Atletico Madrid and Espanyol in Spain, was appointed Japan coach in late August. He replaced Italian Alberto Zaccheroni, who stepped down after Japan was eliminated in the first round of this year’s World Cup finals in Brazil.

Torres will make loan move to Milan permanent next month

LONDON, 28 Dec — Fernando Torres’ loan move from Chelsea to AC Milan will become a permanent transfer next month, the Premier League club said on Saturday.

The news came as a complete surprise because Atletico Madrid assistant coach German Burgos said earlier in the day that Torres was all set to rejoin his boyhood club.

“It is on the verge of completion and we are waiting for things to firm up,” Burgos said of the deal.

“He will be a very

important reinforcement for the second half of the season,” Diego Simeone’s number two told Spanish media.

Chelsea made the announcement about Torres’ permanent switch to Milan on their website.

“The striker moved to the San Siro on a two-year loan deal in August and on 5 January he will complete a permanent transfer to the Serie A side,” said the Stamford Bridge club.

“Chelsea Football Club thanks Fernando for his service during the past four seasons and wishes him the very best for the

future.”

Torres, who joined the Londoners for a British record fee of 50 million pounds (\$77.75 million) in January 2011, had a chequered spell at the club but helped Chelsea win the Champions League and the FA Cup in 2012 and the Europa League a year later.—Reuters

Terry's all gold for Chelsea and Mourinho

LONDON, 28 Dec — Former England captain John Terry is performing as well in central defence as he was a decade ago, according to Chelsea manager Jose Mourinho.

Terry scored for the second time in five days when his first-half goal, the 61st of his club career, paved the way for Premier League leaders Chelsea to beat London rivals West Ham United 2-0 on Friday.

Just as pleasingly for Mourinho, the 34-year-old gave a masterclass in the art of defending as he subdued West Ham's in-form striker Andy Carroll.

"He is full of confi-

dence," Mourinho told reporters after Chelsea kept up their 100 percent home record in the league this season to stay three points clear at the top.

"I see my John of 2004, 2005 and 2006, I don't see any difference. The only difference is seeing his twins when they go to the training ground, they had only just been born in that period but now they are running around and kicking balls.

"John is playing so good but I always say the same, when the team is playing so well it's easy for individuals," the Portuguese added.

Mourinho, who led Chelsea to the league title in 2005 and 2006 and returned for a second stint in charge 18 months ago, said the upbeat mood at Stamford Bridge was in stark contrast to the atmosphere that characterised the end of his time with previous club Real Madrid.

"Our results are good and the players are happy," he explained. "I'm happy as a coach because the team is playing well".

"I'm happy as a guy because I love my players. It's important to feel happy with the people that surround me, it's something I missed for a while."

Chelsea, who are also through to the Champions League last 16 and League Cup semi-finals, narrowly missed out on the Premier League title last season but Mourinho believes there is a big difference in his side now.

"We are a much better team when we have the ball," he added. "Last year we were very strong defensively and very well organized but we lacked a bit of creativity when we had the ball.

"The challenge this year was to bring that creativity and dynamic without losing the defensive qualities of the team."—Reuters

United bandwagon gathering pace under Van Gaal

LONDON, 28 Dec — While Chelsea and Manchester City slug it out at the top of the Premier League, Louis van Gaal's Old Trafford revolution gathers ever more momentum in the red half of Manchester.

The Dutchman endured a tricky start to his reign but seven wins in eight league games have put United hot on the heels of the pacesetters.

If the current United side can emulate the teams of Alex Ferguson who were renowned for a strong second half of the season, Van Gaal's men could yet have their say in the destiny of the title.

United visit Tottenham Hotspur in a lunchtime kickoff on Sunday as the games continue to flow thick and fast over the festive period. "The signs have been good in recent weeks," midfielder Michael Carrick told the club website (ManUtd.com).

"We were bitterly disappointed not to win last week (at Aston Villa) but we beat Newcastle and now have two big away games. They will be a good test for us to see where we are at."

After the trip to Spurs, United — seven points behind City and 10 adrift of Chelsea — are away at Stoke on New Year's Day.

"We're continuing to look up and will continue to try to catch them (City and Chelsea)," Carrick said. "We're not satisfied with third — it's obviously an improvement and we're getting better, but we want to keep looking up."

Seventh-placed Spurs have won three on the bounce with striker Harry Kane emerging as one of the stars of the season, his first-minute strike in the 2-1 victory over Leicester on Friday taking his tally to 15 in all competitions.

"We've built up some momentum now with some wins," he said.

"United have picked

up form. It's going to be a tough game but we are confident at the minute. We're ready for it."

Chelsea make the trip south to face a fourth-placed Southampton side who appear to have got over their blip following a flying start to the campaign.

"We have found the belief again," said Southampton manager Ronald Koeman after Saints followed up a 3-0 drubbing of Everton with a 3-1 success at Crystal Palace on Friday. "We know Chelsea are strong. It will be a challenge."

Manuel Pellegrini's City will set a club record of 10 wins in succession in all competitions if they can take three points at home to Burnley.—Reuters

Rampant Ronaldo looking to improve on outstanding 2014

MADRID, 28 Dec — Not content with four titles in 2014, including his second Champions League, prolific Real Madrid forward Cristiano Ronaldo is determined to make next year an even bigger success.

Ronaldo netted 51 goals in 47 appearances last season, setting a record of 17 goals for one edition of Europe's elite club competition, as Real secured a record-extending 10th continental crown and the King's Cup.

The Portugal captain continued where he left off in 2014-15 as the world's richest club by income claimed the European Super Cup and Club World Cup and he has amassed an incredible 32 goals in 25 games in all competitions.

His haul of 25 in 14 La Liga matches is a Spanish record and

he looks set to smash the biggest total for a season in Spain's top flight of 50 scored by Lionel Messi in 2011-12.

"It would be a dream if 2015 was like 2014 or even better," Ronaldo said in an interview published in sports daily As on Saturday.

"It is possible to do it because Madrid is always a candidate to win the competitions it is playing in," added the 29-year-old.

"We have a team spirit that can help us win the most titles possible and we will fight to the death to get them." Ronaldo attributed much of Real's recent success to the arrival of coach Carlo Ancelotti, who replaced the divisive

Jose Mourinho at the end of the 2012-13 season.

Italian Ancelotti immediately ended Real's 12-year wait for their 10th European title and using the club's millions has built a formidable side that is top of La Liga and one of the favourites to repeat their Champions League success this term. "The coach has a lot of importance," Ronaldo told As.

"He is a great trainer and a great person and we are all delighted with him. "Together we are a united family which will try to improve on the successes of 2014."

Ronaldo will find out whether he has won a third FIFA World Player of the Year award, and his second in a row, on 12 January when he is up against Argentina captain Messi and Germany goalkeeper Manuel Neuer.—Reuters
