President calls for political dialogues before elections

NAY PYI TAW, 8 April— Political dialogues are needed before the 2015 general elections, while unity is fundamental for building a new democratic state, President U Thein Sein told political leaders, ethnic affairs ministers and ethnic leaders at a meeting on Wednesday.

While meeting with the political stakeholders at the Presidential Palace, U Thein Sein said the transition period is a critical time for Myanmar, and dialogue is a crucial step for all political forces of the country, adding that he is arranging talks proposed by Pyidaungsu Hluttaw.

The president also said the democratization process directly relates with peace-making efforts, saying the recent signing of a draft ceasefire agreement had been met with congratulations from the international community.

He also noted the need for the signing of the final stage of the agreement after holding talks with stakeholders before the up-

coming elections.

U Thein Sein said almost all of the negotiations for the potential nationwide ceasefire agreement were based on the proposals of ethnic armed groups, with the government's Union Peace-making Working Committee firmly focused on a peace deal.

He expressed his belief that all registered political parties will contest upcoming elections, making it a historic event.

In his concluding remarks, U Thein Sein said that while stakeholders may have differing views, they also have common interests which should be implemented for the development of the country.

He finally emphasized that the 2015 general election is slated for October and November, and the Union Election Commission is making systematic preparations to show the international community a free and fair election.

The president also stated that the upcoming election is related to the



dignity of the country, and national duty must be jointly performed by all

Weather expert warns of thunderstorms in Chin, Sagaing, Kachin

Nay Pyi April—Myanmar's mer top weather official on Wednesday warned people in Chin State, the upper part of Sagaing Region and Kachin State to be alert to the possibility of thunderstorms over the next few days.

Lightning, thunder, isolated heavy falls, gale force winds and hailstones may occur due to cumulus clouds in those areas, with a 60-percent likelihood of such events in the next few days, said U Tun Lwin, a former director-general of the Department of Meteorology and Hydrology, in a Facebook post.

Thunderstorms mostly happen in April and May in Myanmar. Since 1980, the country has seen an increase

in the number of thunderstorms, with more than 100 people killed by lightning strikes in some years, the weather expert said.

YANGON, 8 April— Three foreign banks, two from Japan and one from Singapore, announced plans to open branches in Yangon later this month.

Their plans to commence operations on 23 April follow the Central Bank of Myanmar's announcement earlier this month that the three banks had been awarded final licenses.

The three banks—The Bank of Tokyo Mitsubishi UFJ, Ltd (BTMU), Sumitomo Mitsui Banking

Corporation (SMBC) and Oversea-Chinese Banking Corporation Ltd (OCBC) became the first to clear the final hurdle among nine foreign lenders awarded preliminary approval last October.

According to the announcement, the three banks met all requirements of the stringent entry process as defined by the CBM last November.

Mr. Koichi Kyono, manager of the Yangon Representative Office of BTMU, confirmed the 23 April opening date of the BTMU Yangon branch

with the Global New Light of Myanmar on Wednes-

It will provide full banking services, including deposits, loans, and foreign exchange, to foreign companies and domestic banks operating in Myanmar.

In a 7 April media release. SMBC's representative office in Yangon said the bank, with the opening of Yangon branch on 23 April, will operate in Myanmar in conjunction with local partner KBZ Bank.

Parliament stops accommodation for MPs at state-owned guesthouse

Nay Pyi Taw, 8 April — MPs asked Pyidaungsu Hluttaw on Wednesday for Hluttaw's accommodation as the parliament has stopped its arrangement for their staying at the guesthouse owned by the guesthouse of Nay Pyi Taw Development Committee during Hluttaw sessions.

U Mahn Tin Aung Myint, an MP of Kayin State constituency 12, proposed construction of buildings for parliamentarians by 2016 when they come for Hluttaw sessions. Daw Nang Sae Awa, an MP of Hpa-an Township constituency, also said MPs agreed in 2012 on transferal of budget for building temporary accommodations to the peace-making works, and submitted that proposal for review.

Daw Dwe Bu, an MP of Injanyan Township constituency, also said accommodation for parliamentarians should be located near Hluttaw buildings for easy access.

In response to the proposals of parliamentarians,

Union Minister for Finance U Win Shein said MPs are provided with free accommodation arranged by the Parliament during the period of Hluttaw sessions, however, using any state-owned buildings for the affairs of their parties is deemed breaching political party registration law.

Union Minister for National Planning and Economic Development Dr Kan Zaw said submission of these proposals are quite late as Pyidaungsu Hluttaw has approved the whole

national planning for 2015-2016 fiscal year last month, but serious consideration will be needed to amend the planning by law.

NAY PYI TAW, 8 April — The government is taking measures to prevent child labour and the employment of children in

Nay Pyi Taw, 8 April — President U Thein Sein met with political leaders, ethnic affairs ministers and leaders of national races at Ngu Shwe War Hall of the Presidential Palace in Nay Pyi Taw on Friday and almost all participants are hopeful of better outcomes for the future.

Three topics including peace and nationwide ceasefire agreement, 2015 general election and stability of the country before the election were discussed at the meeting and viewpoints at the meeting were not very different, according to participants.

Almost all participants at the meeting are hopeful of better out-

dangerous or illegal work, including the recruitment of minors into armed forces, Deputy Minister for Home Affairs Brig-Gen Kyaw Zan Myint told the Pyithu Hluttaw session on Wednesday.

Those who abandon or traffic children, or force them to beg, will also be targeted, the deputy minister said, in accordance with criminal and juvenile laws.

Those who abandon a child under 12 are liable to a maximum seven-year sentence. Trafficking children for forced labour is subject to a life sentence under the anti-human trafficking law, according to the deputy minister.

The ministry of health is also trying to issue birth certificates when newborns are discharged from hospitals to prevent abandonment of children, the deputy minister added.

Concerning child soldiers, the deputy minister said that armed forces have their own rules and regulations for recruiting new soldiers who are required to be between the ages of 18 and 25.

Armed forces have released 594 child soldiers who were recruited improperly, while action was taken against 50 officers and 277 other personnel who recruited child soldiers.—*MNA*

Nay Pyi Taw, 8 April—President U Thein Sein inspected men's and women's wards at Khamti People's Hospital and comforted patients on Wednes-

After giving presents to patients, the president met with doctors and health workers at the hospital, telling them the health sector is essential to the development of human resources

The president pointed out that doctors and health workers are required to hold talks on health education and disease prevention for ethnic communities and urged them to give treatment to local people warmly. Hkamti Hospital was built in 1948 with government funds on land donated by Chieftain Sao Mya Sein. It was upgraded into a hospital after renovation of the former building with government funds in 1953. Due to floods in 1954, the hospital was moved to the current site and was upgraded into a 100-bed district hospital in 2010.

Afterwards, the president and party inspected a new 50-bed hospital in Zeephyugon Ward and the Government Technical Institute in Hkamti.

The principal of the institute spoke about computer courses offered in cooperation with local authorities.

Union Minister U Soe Thane and U Tin Naing Thein reported to the president on measures being taken for education development. The president said the institute has been established for local people in border areas who have passed matriculation and cannot afford university education. Students at the institute are required to learn useful skills and serve the interests of the state, the president said.

He pointed out that although Myanmar has to depend on the agriculture sector for economic development, the country needs to be an industrial nation in the long run and urged the teachers to instruct students properly.

Hkamti Government Technical Institute was established in June 2009 and courses on civil engineering, electronic communication and mechanical power are being taught.

Later, the president and party paid homage to Sayadaw Bhaddanta Viccitara of the Central Theravada Missionary Monastery and monks and offered provisions to them.

The president and party also paid homage to Buddha images at Mya Theintan Pagoda and offered flowers, water and lights before donating cash for the pagoda.

In the evening of 7 April, the president and party enjoyed traditional dances of local cultural troupes at Khamti Township Yeiktha, where the president was dressed with traditional costumes by the cultural troupes. The president and party arrived back in Nay Pyi Taw in the afternoon.

Indian PM comes to rescue of distressed farmers hit by unseasonal rains

New Delhi, 8 April — Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday came to the rescue of distressed farmers hit by unseasonal rains and hailstorm by announcing higher compensation for crop damage and easing criteria for them to avail government support.

The prime minister told a local public function that he has also asked banks to restructure loans of affected farmers and instructed insurance companies to pro-actively settle their claims.

Modi said farmers would be eligible for input subsidy if 33 percent of their crop has been damaged against the prevailing

According to the prevailing yardstick, the farmers are eligible for such subsidy over crop damage of 50 percent or more.

Modi said the input subsidy given to distressed farmers would be enhanced by 50 percent of the existing amounts.

Expressing concern over the problems faced by farmers due to abnormal weather conditions over the past year, the prime minister said helping farmers in such time of distress was the government's responsibility.

The government has sent teams of central ministers to affected areas to assess the extent of damage, he added.

The union and state governments, the banks and insurance companies would all do their utmost to provide relief to the farmers, said the prime minister.

Some parts of India, especially in the northern provinces, have been subject to abnormal weather phenomenon over the past one month like rains and storms, which have inflicted heavy losses to the farmers.—Xinhua

MRJ maiden flight likely postponed to summer

Nagoya, 8 April — Mitsubishi Aircraft Corp is considering postponing the maiden flight of its newly developed small passenger aircraft, dubbed the Mitsubishi Regional Jet, from the previously scheduled late May to June at the earliest, sources close to the matter said on Wednesday.

It will be the fourth postponement of the first flight by the first-ever Japanese-built small passenger jet. Mitsubishi Aircraft had initially said that it expected the maiden flight to take place between April and

The company, based in Aichi prefecture, then set a date of late May, ahead of a leading aerospace trade show in Paris in mid-June, hoping to boost the number of orders.

Mitsubishi Aircraft has already received a total of 407 orders from US and Japanese airlines, including Japan Airlines Co and All Nippon Airways Co.

Senior Japan, S Korea, US diplomats to meet next week

Токуо, 8 April — Senior diplomats from Japan, South Korea, and the United States are arranging to meet next week in Washington, a diplomatic source said on Wednesday.

The meeting at the vice-ministerial level will allow the three countries to exchange views ahead of the expected release in late April of revised US-Japan defence cooperation guidelines and work toward bolstering

trilateral ties, the source South Korean First Vice said.

During the talks, the officials could also discuss cooperation to deal with North Korea's nuclear and missile development programmes. The source said they could also take up the sensitive issues of wartime history and territory, which have soured bilateral relations between Japan and South Korea, both major US allies in Asia.

Japan's Vice Foreign

Foreign Minister Cho Tae Yong, and US Deputy Secretary of State Antony Blinken are expected to attend the meeting.

In recent days, South Korea has stepped up criticism of Japan for reasserting its territorial claims over disputed islets in the Sea of Japan in Tokyo's annual foreign policy report and newly approved Japanese school textbooks.

Senior defence minis-Minister Akitaka Saiki, try officials from the three

countries are also scheduled to hold two-day talks from 16 April in Washington to promote trilateral defence cooperation.

The first update since 1997 of the US-Japan defence cooperation guidelines is designed to strengthen cooperation between the US military and the Self-Defence Forces to address security threats without being bound by pre-set geographical operational limits.—Kyodo News

Explosion occurs near police station in Jakarta, injures four

Jakarta, 8 April — An explosion occurred near a police station in Tanah Abang of Central Jakarta on Wednesday, injuring four people, local media reported here.

All the victims have been rushed to a nearby hospital, local Metro TV said. The police is investigating the cause of the explosion.

Television footage showed that the victims suffered some cuts on their bodies, some of whom have to be shifted to another hospital for better treatment.

Japan envisages possible contribution of \$1.5 bil to China-led bank

Токуо, 8 April — Japan does not rule out the possibility of joining a Beijing-led development bank to be launched by the end of the year and the country envisages a possible contribution of up to \$1.5 billion to the institution in the event of its participation, according to a draft government paper on the bank.

Despite what would be the second-largest contribution after China's, Japan is concerned that such a fiscal burden will not guarantee its influence in the Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank given opaqueness in its governance standards, says the draft paper, a copy of which was obtained on Tuesday by Kyodo News.

But Japan, in close coordination with the United States, which is also staying out of the AIIB, will urge China to ensure fair governance and transparent management of the

AIIB in line with international standards, the draft

Japan will continue to file demands "from outside" the AIIB, it says, arguing possible Japanese involvement in negotiations for the Articles of Agreement, or the basic rules governing the bank, "will be the biggest card against China."

Prime Minister Shinzo Abe will carefully consider whether to join the China-led initiative while taking into account the pros and cons of Japan's participation as spelled out in the draft paper.

Assuming that \$10 billion of the AIIB's initial capitalization of \$50 billion would be financed by actual payments by potential members, the envisaged Japanese share of \$1.5 billion was calculated based on the size of the nominal gross domestic product of potential participants and on the assumption that Asian economies account for 75 percent of the payments and non-Asian members hold the remaining 25 percent.

confirming After "founding members" on 15 April, China aims to agree on the AIIB's Articles of Agreement by the end of June through negotiations involving more than 50 countries and territories that have signed up for the institution.

While even European members of the Group of Seven industrialized nations and US allies in Asia such as Australia and South Korea hope to take part in the negotiations, Japan and the United States — which see the AIIB as a challenge to the World Bank and Asian Development Bank that they lead — are standing back from

According to the draft paper, the positive points of joining negotiations to set up the AIIB are that Japan can be directly involved in the rule-making process of the bank and that a Japanese entry could lead to improved relations between Tokyo and Bei-

Negative points for entering the talks are that it will hurt ties with the United States and that Japan may end up giving "legitimacy" to a Chinese tool that critics say intends to bring developing countries in Southeast, Southwest and Central Asia into Beijing's economic sphere of influence.

ministers Cabinet have said Japan had asked China about whether it will be possible to establish fair governance in the AIIB and whether carrying out lending that ignores debt sustainability will inflict harm on other creditors, but that Tokyo has yet to obtain a clear explanation

from Beijing.

Japan will also call for transparency in the screening process for the provision of AIIB loans.

Looking ahead, Japan will continue to gather information about the AIIB such as relations between the subscription of shares among members and their voting rights, schedules in the coming months and the compatibility of the bank's operations with international standards, according to the draft.

While increasing cooperation with other G-7 members — Britain, Canada, France, Germany, Italy and the United States — as well as Australia and New Zealand in dealing with the AIIB, Japan will also consider sending senior officials from the Finance Ministry and the Foreign Ministry to China to promote dialogue on the bank, it says.

US defence chief warns against militarization of territorial rows in Asia

TOKYO, 8 April — US Secretary of Defence Ash Carter kicked off his first Asian tour on Wednesday with a stern warning against the militarization of territorial rows in a region where China is at odds with several nations in the East and South China Seas.

Carter's visit to Japan coincides with growing US concern over China's land reclamation in the Spratly archipelago of the disputed South China Sea, where Beijing has rival claims with several countries including the Philippines and Vietnam.

Tokyo and Beijing have a separate row over Japanese-controlled islets in the East China Sea.

US and Philippine troops will take part in annual military exercises this month near the Spratlys in the largest such drills since the allies resumed joint activities in 2000.

Asked whether the beefed up US-Philippine exercises were a response to China's moves, Carter said Washington and Manila had shared interests in the region, including a desire to ensure there were no changes in the status quo by force or that territorial rows were militarized. "We take a strong stance against the militarization of these disputes," Carter told a news conference

after talks with his Japanese counterpart, Defence Minister Gen Nakatani.

Chinese reclamation work is well advanced on six reefs in the Spratlys, according to recently published satellite photographs and Philippine officials. In addition, Manila has said Chinese dredgers had started reclaiming a seventh.

While the new islands won't overturn US military superiority in the region, Chinese workers are building ports and fuel storage depots as well as possibly two airstrips that experts have said would allow Beijing to project power deep into the maritime heart of Southeast

The commander of the US Pacific Fleet, Harry Harris, told an Australian think tank last week that China was using dredges and bull-dozers to create a "great wall of sand" in the South China Sea. China claims most of the potentially energy rich waterway, through which \$5 trillion in ship-borne trade passes every year. The Philippines, Vietnam, Malaysia, Brunei and Taipei also have overlapping claims.

Carter also welcomed progress toward the first update in US-Japan defence cooperation guidelines since 1997, a revision that will expand the scope for interac-

tion between the allies in line with Prime Minister Shinzo Abe's push to ease the constraints of Japan's pacifist constitution on the nation's military.

"It's going to give first of all Japan, but also our alliance, much greater scope to provide security in the region, and for that matter elsewhere outside of the region," Carter said as the talks began. Abe's move to allow Tokyo to come to the aid of an ally under attack would pave the way for closer cooperation between US and Japanese forces across Asia, Admiral Robert Thomas, commander of the US Seventh Fleet, said last month.

In January, Thomas said the United States would also welcome Japanese air patrols in the South China

Nakatani told the news

conference with Carter, however, that the new guidelines did not target any particular region including the South China Sea.

Neither Tokyo nor Washington have territorial claims in the South China Sea, but the US Seventh Fleet operates in the area and any Japanese presence would irritate Beijing.

In a written interview with Japan's *Yomiuri* newspaper published on Wednesday, Carter expressed concern about China's land reclamation in the South China Sea.

"We are especially concerned at the prospect of militarization of these outposts. These activities seriously increase tensions and reduce prospects for diplomatic solutions," the newspaper quoted him as saying.

"We urge China to limit

its activities and exercise restraint to improve regional trust."

Carter also repeated Washington's opposition to any "coercive unilateral" actions by China to undermine Japan's administrative control of disputed islands in the East China Sea, known as the Senkaku in Japan and the Diaoyu in China.

China's Foreign Ministry spokeswoman Hua Chunying told a regular news briefing in Beijing: "We hope the US side can respect the wishes of China and relevant countries to resolve the problem via dialogue, say more responsible things and make more responsible moves, so it can genuinely play a constructive role in maintaining regional peace and stability."

Abe's government plans to submit bills to parliament in the coming months to ratify his cabinet's decision last year to allow Japan to exercise its right of collective self-defence, the biggest shift in Japanese security policy in decades.

Carter, Nakatani and the two countries' foreign ministers are expected to unveil the new defence guidelines in late April, before Abe meets US President Barack Obama on 28 April for a summit in Washington.

N Korea has 1,000 missiles able to reach Japan, S Korea

Washington, 8 April
— A group of US-based researchers warned on Tuesday that North Korea has some 1,000 ballistic missiles that can reach Japan and South Korea.

The potential capability of delivering weapons further makes North Korea appear more advanced than other countries at a similar early stage of the development of their nuclear arsenals, the group said in a report published by Johns Hopkins University's US-Korea Institute.

"The current force is more than able to accommodate any future growth in the North's nuclear weapons arsenal, including a worst-case projection of 100 nuclear weapons by 2020," the report said.

The ballistic missiles that are capable of reaching Japan and South Korea included the Nodong missiles with a range of 1,200-1,500 kilometres and the Scud missiles with a range of 300-600 km, according to the report posted on the institute's website 38 North.

North Korea may be able to launch a Taepodong long-range ballistic missile, which is said to be able to reach the US mainland, the report said.

"However, such a weapon would represent more of a political statement than an operational capability," as it has problems such as vulnerability to preemptive attacks due to its installation on a launch pad on the ground and low technical reliability, it said.

North Korea only has "a limited ability" to deliver a nuclear warhead to its target due to a lack of testing, it said.

Meanwhile the chief of the US military's command in change of mainland defence said North Korea already has the ability to miniaturize a nuclear warhead to be delivered by an intercontinental missile called

"Our assessment is that they have the ability to put a nuclear weapon on a KN-08 and shoot it at the homeland," Adm. Bill Gortney, commander of the Northern Command, told reporters at the Defence Department.

A third of Republicans support Iran nuclear deal

Washington, 8 April — Thirty-one percent of Republicans favour a new nuclear deal with Iran, creating a challenge for their party's lawmakers who largely oppose the framework accord sealed between Teheran and world powers, a Reuters/Ipsos poll showed on Wednesday.

Another 30 percent of Republicans oppose the pact, while 40 percent are not sure, according to the poll, which revealed a sharp split in the party as its leaders ramp up opposition to the deal championed by President Barack Obama, a Democrat.

The White House has launched a broad effort to convince US lawmakers and other critics to embrace the framework agreement reached last week between Iran, the United States, Britain, France, Germany, Russia and China.

Many details remain to be worked out for a final deal to be completed by the end of June. Public support will be critical to the White House effort to sway skeptical members of the Republican-controlled Congress, many of whom see the deal as a dangerous concession to a country that sponsors terrorism.

The nuclear deal foresees lifting US and international economic sanctions on Iran in exchange for compliance with restrictions on its nuclear programme.

The poll showed Obama has some selling to do among members of his own party, too. Though 50 percent of Democrats supported it, 10 percent were opposed and 39 percent were not sure.

Among independents — an important constituency group for both parties ahead of the 2016 presiden-

tial election — 33 percent voiced support, 21 percent registered opposition, and 45 percent said they were unsure about the deal.

People from both parties diverged substantially in their views of a US rapprochement with Iran.

Sixty percent of Republicans said the United States should hold a hard line with its longtime foe and maintain or expand current sanctions, compared with 23 percent of Democrats who said the same.

Meanwhile, 48 percent of Democrats said Washington was right to improve diplomatic relations with Teheran, compared with 18 percent of Republicans.

The poll showed little support among members of both parties for using military force as a sole method for preventing Iran from developing a nuclear bomb. Five percent of Democrats

supported such an option, along with 11 percent of Republicans and 6 percent of independents.

Support for the combined use of diplomatic channels along with military force was higher, however. Fifty percent of Republicans favoured that combination, along with 35

percent of Democrats and 42 percent of independents. The Reuters/Ipsos online poll surveyed 2,291 American adults between 3 April and 7 April, after the Iran deal was announced. Among those polled were 893 Democrats, 803 Republicans and 320 independents.—Reuters

Fire on Russian nuclear submarine fully extinguished — shipyard

The spokesman said the dock has been flooded with water. The firefighters continue filling the scene with water, he added.

Russia's Ministry of Industry and Trade and the Defence Ministry have set up a commission to investigate the circumstances of the accident and assess the damage, earlier reports

There were no armaments or fuel and lubrication materials onboard the submarine, and the nuclear reactor had been shut down long before the fire. As a result, there is no threat of environmental or radioactive contamination.

Ahead of Britain's election, Labour takes two percent point lead — YouGov poll

London, 8 April — Ahead of Britain's on 7 May election, the opposition Labour Party has taken a 2 percentage point lead over Prime Minister David Cameron's Conservatives, according to a YouGov poll for The Sun newspaper.

The poll put Labour on 35 percent, the Conservatives on 33 percent,

the UK Independence Party on 14 percent, the Liberal Democrats on 8 percent and the Greens on 5 percent, The Sun newspaper said.

Cameron's Neither Conservatives nor Ed Miliband's Labour Party is forecast to win an overall majority, according to most opinion polls.

France's Hollande to declassify Rwanda genocide documents

Paris, 8 April — French President François Hollande has decided to declassify documents related to the Rwanda genocide that killed over 800,000 people in 1994, a source close to the president's office told Reuters on Tues-

The documents from between 1990 and 1994 include minutes from secret defence meetings and files from advisers to then-president Francois Mitterrand relating to the genocide in the central African state, the source said

The documents will be available to researchers and historians if they make a request to Dominique Bertinotti, a former minister and custodian of Mitterrand's archives.

More than 800,000 minority Tutsis and politically moderate Hutus were killed in a three-month rampage by ethnic Hutu extremists in 1994 while the world largely stood by.

France — an ally of the Rwandan government that ruled before the genocide -stayed away from last year's 20-year commemoration after rebel-turned-President Paul Kagame renewed accusations of a direct French role in the killings.

While Paris has acknowledged mistakes in its dealings with Rwanda, it has repeatedly dismissed accusations that it trained militias to take part in the 1994 massacres.—Reuters

Indonesian man survives nearly two-hour flight in wheel well

Jakarta, 8 April — A 21-year-old Indonesian man survived a nearly two-hour domestic flight to Jakarta after hiding in the plane's wheel well, media reports said on Tuesday.

United Nations, 8 April — Gulf Arab countries and Jordan want the United Nations Security Council to blacklist the son of Yemen's former president and a Houthi militia leader and effectively impose an arms embargo on the rebels that rule most of the poor Arabian peninsula country.

Experts from 15-council members met on Tuesday for the first time to discuss a draft resolution that would impose a global asset freeze and travel ban on Ahmed Saleh, the former head of Yemen's elite Republican Guard, and Abdulmalik al-Houthi, a top leader of the Iran-allied Shi'ite Houthi group.

Saleh's father, former Yemen President Ali Abdullah Saleh, and two other senior Houthi leaders, Abd al-Khaliq al-Huthi and Abdullah Yahya al Hakim, were blacklisted by the Security Council in November. Yemeni soldiers loyal to the former president are fighting alongside the Hou-

Saudi Arabia launched air strikes against the Houthis in neighbouring Yemen nearly two weeks ago with a coalition made up mainly of four Gulf Arab allies. The United States said on Tuesday it is speeding up arms supplies to the coalition.

Saudi-backed Yemen President Abd-Rabbu Mansour Hadi was forced to flee

late last month.

The UN resolution, seen by Reuters, was drafted by Jordan and the six-mem-

the southern city of Aden ber Gulf Cooperation Council. It would impose an arms embargo on the five men and "those acting on their behalf or at their direction

in Yemen" - effectively the Houthi militia and soldiers loyal to Saleh.

The resolution also "calls upon Member States, in particular States neighbouring Yemen, to inspect ... all cargo to Yemen" if they have reasonable grounds to believe it contains weapons.

Jordan and the Gulf Arab states had been negotiating with the council's veto-wielding powers the United States, Russia, France, Britain and China - for more than a week before circulating a draft text to all 15 council members on Monday.

Diplomats, speaking on condition of anonymity, said Russia suggested last

week that an arms embargo should also cover the Yemen government. But Saudi Arabia's UN ambassador, Abdallah Al-Mouallim, said such a move would be

Russia on Saturday put forward its own draft resolution demanding "regular and obligatory humanitarian pauses in the air strikes by the coalition" to allow for the evacuation of foreigners.

The Jordanian and Gulf Arab states draft resolution "calls on all parties to facilitate the evacuation by concerned States and international organizations of their civilians and personnel from Yemen.'

Fighting in central Aden, mosques call for jihad — residents

Aden, 8 April — Dozens of Yemeni Houthi fighters clashed with local militiamen in the central Aden district of Crater on Wednesday and mosques broadcast calls for jihad to combat the Houthi forces trying to take over the southern Yemeni port city, residents said.

They said several houses were on fire after being hit by rockets, and families stayed indoors as fighting raged from street to street.

The Houthis, who are allied to soldiers loyal to former president Ali Abinto Crater on Wednesday morning with a tank and two armoured vehicles, one resident said.

Mosques in Crater called on the population to wage holy war against the Houthis, their loudspeakers, usually reserved for sermons and the call to prayer, broadcasting: "God is the greatest! Rise for ji-

The battle in the old centre of Aden came a day after fighters from the city said they had pushed the Houthis and allied troops from positions in northern Aden neighbourhoods, dullah Saleh, advanced which they said cut Houthi

supply lines into the centre.

One fighter, Yasser Mahmoud, said the Houthis had been pushed from the Dar Saad neighbourhood at the northern approach to Aden. He said 22 Houthi fighters were killed when a tank and an armoured vehicle were destroyed.

Three explosions shook northern areas of Aden on Wednesday, in what residents said were air strikes by the Saudi-led coalition which is two weeks into a campaign to stem Houthi advances. They said the attacks appeared to target weapons depots.

Burkina law bars ex-president's allies from running for office

Ouagadougou, 8 April Lawmakers in Burkina Faso modified the electoral code on Tuesday to prevent people from standing for office if they had supported a failed move last year to allow then-President Blaise Compaore to seek a new

The country is run by a transitional government ahead of elections in October, and current ministers are also not authorised to run for president.

Compaore was ousted from power last October in the face of mass protests against the bid by his supporters to revise article 37 of the constitution. He seized power in a coup in 1987 in Burkina Faso, a country that produces gold and cotton.

Under the new law, "anybody is ineligible (to run) who supported the unconstitutional change that threatened the principle of democratic choice and especially the principle of presidential term limits."

The law applies to all elections in 2015 and 2016

and effectively bars members of Compaore's government and the leaders of his Congress for Democracy and Progress (CDP) party as well as the former president's allies.

Deputies from the previous parliamentary majority who supported Compaore said the law could weaken social cohesion. The CDP rejected the law and said it was an attempt by a small group of activists to confiscate power.

Tuesday dispersed youth supporters of Compaore outside the headquarters of the transitional national

Separately, police said on Tuesday that they had arrested eight members of Compaore's regime including former minister for mines and energy Salif Lamoussa Kabore for offences including embezzlement, disturbing the peace and illegal political activi-

Spain arrests nine in operation against Islamists in Catalonia

Madrid, 8 April — Spain arrested nine people in the northeastern region of Catalonia early on Wednesday as part of an operation against Islamist militants, local po-

"The arrested are accused, amongst other crimes, of belonging to a terrorist organization," a spokeswoman for the Catalan police said.

Spain has arrested around 30 people in rela-

tion to suspected militant activity this year as part of efforts to stop the radicalisation of young Muslims and prevent them joining jihadists in Syria or Iraq or attacking targets at home.

Pakistan MPs speak out against intervention in Yemen

Islamabad, 8 April — Pakistani members of parliament spoke out against getting involved in Yemen on Wednesday as they resumed a one-sided debate on a Saudi request to join a campaign against Iran-allied Houthi forces in Yemen.

Iranian Foreign Minister Mohammad Javad Zarif was due in Pakistan later on Wednesday when he is like-

ly to urge Pakistan to reject the Saudi request.

"The Yemen war is not our war...Our advice to the government is that the army should not go (to Yemen)," said opposition member of parliament Shireen Mazari.

"As Muslims, we are duty bound to counter any threat to holy shrines but there is no such threat today."

Opposition Senator Ta-

hir Hussain Mashadi said the "aggressors" were the Saudis and the victims were the Yemenis.

"Now the aggressors are asking another sovereign state, Pakistan, to come to provide military aid to Saudi Arabia."

The Sunni royal family of Saudi Arabia and Iran's Shi'ite theocracy are rivals for power in the Middle East. Their competition fre-

quently fuels sectarian violence.

Last month, a Saudi-led coalition began conducting air strikes in Yemen against Houthi rebels. Saudi Arabia and Yemen share a border and Saudi Arabia says it is afraid that instability might spill over to its territory.

Saudi Arabia wants its staunch ally, Sunni-majority Pakistan, to join the coalition, and has requested

ships, aircraft and troops.

Pakistan's parliament began debating the request on Monday and no legislator has spoken in support of sending troops for Saudi to use in Yemen.

Although there are many groups in the complex Yemen conflict, Pakistani lawmakers fear it could develop into a proxy war between Saudi Arabia and Iran, and inflame already

simmering sectarian tension at home.

Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif has said he will defend Saudi Arabia's "territorial integrity" but not spelled out what, if any, commitments he has made. On Tuesday, Sharif told lawmakers Iran should be part of the debate and urged parliament to take its time in coming to a decision.

German orders mark weak start to 2015 with unexpected February fall

BERLIN, 8 April German industrial orders unexpectedly dropped in February, partly because companies got fewer major contracts, after bookings already plunged in January, suggesting manufacturers had a subdued start to 2015 in Europe's largest econo-

Orders for goods made in Germany — a highly volatile indicator — decreased by 0.9 percent on the month, data from the Economy Ministry showed. A Reuters poll had forecast a 1.5 percent rise.

It was the first time since last summer that orders have slipped for two months running.

"Today's drop in new orders shows that after a series of almost euphoric news and indicators from Germany and euro zone, some caution is clearly justified," said Carsten Brzeski, senior economist at ING. But he said the weak euro should help German industrial firms: "Judging from earlier episodes with similar exchange rate weakness, order books are currently only moderately

filled. If past performances are any guide for the future, German exporters can start rubbing their hands."

The decline in new contracts was driven by a drop in demand for capital and intermediate goods. Bookings for consumer goods, which rose by 2.9 percent on strong demand from abroad, were the only bright spot. A breakdown of the data showed domestic demand was stagnant, while demand from abroad

dropped by 1.6 percent.

The Economy Ministry said the basic trend in industry was likely to remain "pointed moderately upwards" though.

Other evidence has painted a rosier picture of the sector, with a purchasing manager's survey last week showing German manufacturing expanded at the fastest pace in almost a year in March as output gained momentum.

Germany Overall,

looks set for a decent performance in the first quarter, with business and investor morale improving, unemployment falling and the private sector gaining traction. Consumer sentiment is at a 13 1/2-year high as shoppers benefit from rising wages and cheap oil.

The orders data for January was revised up to a fall of 2.6 percent from an originally reported 3.9 percent plunge.—Reuters

With diabetes, fewer meals may mean less hunger, depression

New York, 8 April — People with type 2 diabetes may have less depression and fewer hunger pains if they opt for a big breakfast and lunch rather than six smaller meals throughout the day, suggests a new

"Eating large breakfasts and lunches may be more beneficial than the usual snacking model," said Dr Hana Kahleova, the study's lead author from the Institute for Clinical and Experimental Medicine in Prague.

"However, further larger-scale, long-term studies are needed before offering clear recommendations," she told Reuters Health in an email.

The analysis used data from a previous study that compared two restricted-calorie diets in 54 people with type 2 diabetes. Each study participant spent 12 weeks eating six small meals a day, and then another 12 weeks eating a large breakfast and lunch, with no dinner.

With both diets, people reported fewer depres-

quality of life compared to how they felt at the beginning of the study, but the improvements in mood were significantly greater when they ate larger meals twice a day.

Disinhibition, which is the tendency to overeat in certain situations, improved more on the twomeal diet. People also reported feeling less hungry when they ate just twice a day, researchers reported in the European Journal of Clinical Nutrition.

People who eat less frequently may feel fuller

sive symptoms and better and more satisfied when they do eat, rather than feeling hungry all day long from eating small meals, said Kahleova, who added that people need to eat 30 to 40 grams of fiber per day to be successful.

"Eat a hearty breakfast: eat breakfast like a king, lunch as a prince and dinner as a pauper," she said. "If you feel hungry in the evening you can have a vegetable salad."

"I think it's fascinating research," said Margaret Powers of the International Diabetes Centre at Park Nicollet in Minneapolis in

a telephone interview.

By looking at the effect of eating patterns on patients' depressive symptoms, the new research is starting to take into account the "big emotional component to eating," said Powers, who wasn't involved with the new study but is president-elect of healthcare and education for the American Diabetes Association.

The most important thing for people with type 2 diabetes is to have a plan in terms of when they eat and how they spread out their intake of carbohydrates throughout the day, Powers said, adding that the goal is to maintain steady blood sugar levels and a healthy

"There's no one right way or wrong way, but I think this says that we do have to pay attention to this emotional side of eating," she said. "If somebody's eating two large meals a day and they want to eat at other times and they can't and that's making them miserable, that's not the right plan."—Reuters

Risk of breast, ovarian cancer may differ by type of BRCA mutation

Women who have inherited mutations in the BRCA1 or BRCA2 genes have an increased risk of breast and ovarian cancers, but the impact varies depending on the type and location of the mutations, researchers said on Tuesday.

The results, published in the US journal JAMA, may lead to more effective cancer risk assessment, care and prevention strategies for health care providers and BRCA1 or BRCA2 carriers.

'We've made a lot of progress toward understanding how to reduce the cancer risks associated with inherited mutations in BRCA1 or BRCA2 mutations, but until now, little has been known about how cancer risks differ by the specific mutation a woman has inherited," first author Timothy Rebbeck, professor of the University of Pennsylvania said in a statement.

"The results of this study are a first step in understanding how to personalize risk assessment around a woman's specific mutation, which can help guide carriers and providers in the cancer prevention decision making process," said Rebbeck, also associate director for Population Science at Penn Medicine's Abramson Cancer Centre.

Rebbeck and colleagues analyzed more than 31,000 women from 33 countries who had mutations in the BRCA1 or BRCA2 genes.

Of the over 19,000 women with a BRCA1 mutation, 46 percent were diagnosed with breast cancer, 12 percent with ovarian cancer, 5 percent with breast and ovarian cancer, and 37 percent with no cancer.

Of the nearly 12,000 women with a BRCA2 mutation, 52 percent were diagnosed with breast cancer, 6 percent with ovarian cancer, 2 percent with breast and

Washington, 8 April — ovarian cancer, and 40 percent with no cancer.

> Within the BRCA1 and BRCA2 genes, the researchers identified certain mutations that significantly increased or decreased a person's risk of breast or ovarian cancer.

Previously, a woman with a BRCA1 mutation would have been thought to have a 59 percent risk of breast cancer and a 34 percent risk for ovarian cancer, up until age 70.

However, the new research suggested that women who carry a specific subset of BRCA mutations most commonly present in the Ashkenazi Jewish population have a 69 percent risk of breast cancer and a 26 percent risk of ovarian cancer, for example.

The important question that remains is whether these differences will change the decisions a woman makes about preventive surgery or other behaviors, the researchers said.

"Additional research is needed to determine the absolute risks associated with different mutations, and how those differences might influence decision making and standards of care, such as preventive surgery, for carriers of BRCA1 and BRCA2 mutations," said senior author Katherine Nathanson, associate professor of Medicine and director of Genetics in the Basser Research Center for BRCA at Penn's Abramson Cancer Centre.

BRCA1 and BRCA2 were thrown into the spotlight two years ago after film star Angelina Jolie, who carried a BRCA1 mutation, revealed her decision to get a preventive, bilateral mastectomy. Last month, Jolie announced she had undergone a second preventative surgery to have her ovaries and fallopian tubes removed.

Analysts believe that although the price cut is bigger than expected, the tax on repair and maintenance costs, car accessories, car insurance and Ron97 gasoline almost offset the attractiveness of buying a car.

Obama has 'diminished' US power, Cheney says in new book



Former US vice-president Dick Cheney

WASHINGTON, 8 April — Former Vice President Dick Cheney, already a fierce critic of President Barack Obama, accuses him in an upcoming book of allowing American power to become "significantly diminished" even as the threat of terrorism rises. Chenev renews his criticism of Obama in "Exceptional: Why The World Needs a Powerful America," a book co-authored with his eldest daughter, Liz Cheney, due to be published on 1 September by Threshold Editions, which has backed books by conservative authors. Threshold is part of publishing house Simon & Schuster, which is owned by CBS Corp (CBS.N).

"Unfortunately, as we face the clear and present danger of a rapidly growing terrorist threat, President Obama has significantly diminished our power, abandoned America's allies and emboldened our enemies," Cheney said in a statement released by his publisher.

As vice president for eight years under Republican President George W Bush, Cheney advocated a muscular American foreign policy and championed the Irag war.

He was back in the news in December after a Senate Intelligence Committee report detailed CIA torture of detainees during the Bush administration.

Cheney strongly defended the CIA's use of aggressive interrogation techniques on foreign terrorism suspects, saying the practices did not amount to torture. "I'd do it again in a minute," Cheney said. In an interview published in Playboy magazine last month, Cheney escalated his criticism of

"I look at Barack Obama and I see the worst president in my lifetime, without question — and that's saying something," Cheney said. "I used to have significant criticism of Jimmy Carter, but compared to Barack Obama and the damage he is doing to the nation — it's a tragedy, a real tragedy, and we are going to pay a hell of a price just trying to dig out from under his presidency."

Liz Cheney, a former State Department official, last year dropped her bid to unseat a Republican incumbent senator from Wyoming, Michael Enzi, ending her first foray into national politics because of what she said were family health issues.

Power line break puts out the lights in Washington, D C

WASHINGTON, 8 April -A power line broke loose at an electrical substation near Washington on Tuesday, briefly dimming the White House, emptying museums and cutting electricity to government buildings and the US Capitol for hours.

The Justice Department and State Department were among thousands of customers whose power was cut in the early afternoon, along with the University of Maryland and some World Bank

The outage was caused by a power line breaking loose in Maryland state south of Washington, causing a drop in voltage, electrical company officials said.

There were concerns that militant groups might be responsible, but the Department of Homeland Security said there was no indication of malicious activity. The outage was centred in the heart of Washington before power was largely restored a few hours later.

White House offices and the press room went dark briefly before backup sources kicked in. President Barack Obama was in the Oval Office and did not notice the power failure, spokesman Josh Earnest told a news briefing.

"Things are slowly but surely returning to normal here in the White House complex," he said.

The State Department's daily briefing was suspended

after power was lost. At the US Capitol complex, where lawmakers were absent for an Easter recess, a backup generator switched on, keeping most lights and appliances running.

At least four Smithsonian museums were evacuated, including the Natural History Museum on the National Mall, where the power failure left hundreds of visitors milling around outside.

"It was just dark and a lot of people there and it was dark and it was awkward. Because, like you couldn't see anything, you're just standing there and the lights are off," tourist Karina Coulter told Reuters Television.

Power also went out as media tycoon Oprah Winfrey was speaking at a Postal Service ceremony marking the issuance of a stamp honouring poet Maya Angelou.

Some subway stations in the United States' second-busiest mass transit system ran on backup power. Buses were deployed to shuttle passengers from one station to another.

Power supplier Pepco Holdings Inc (POM.N) said its crews were repairing transmission equipment in Charles County, Maryland. The company's website showed a handful of customers without power by early evening, mostly in the District of Columbia.

The Southern Maryland Electric Cooperative (SME-CO) said in a tweet that a Pepco transmission conductor broke loose at a SME-CO substation, causing the outages. A spokeswoman for Pepco, Courtney Nogas, said a broken insulator had

caused a fallen transmission

Thomas Popik, founder of watchdog group the Foundation for Resilient Societies, said the outage "is an excellent example of the grid's fragility and why physical security is so important."

He said federal regulations on the electric grid failed to address worries about physical security.

Admiral Bill Gortney, commander of North American Aerospace Defence Command and US Northern Command, said at a Pentagon news briefing he had been told all backup systems had kicked in.

But Gortney said he will be checking to see "did they perform as advertised? Do we need to strengthen in some areas?" —Reuters

Narita airport opens new terminal for budget airlines

Сніва, (Japan), April - Narita International Airport, Japan's largest international gateway, opened a new terminal for budget airlines on Wednesday in a bid to court a growing number of low-cost carriers for domestic and short-haul international flights.

The airport, serving the greater Tokyo area, inaugurated its third terminal at 3:30 am with a countdown and applause by a crowd of around 100 terminal users.

"I hope the new terminal will help LCCs grow and increase our traveling options," said Sosuke Nakano, a 24-vear-old company employee from Saitama Prefecture on a sight-seeing trip to Kagoshima in southwestern Japan.

Narita International Airport Corp, the operator of the airport, is urging passengers to arrive earlier, as it takes roughly 10 to 15 minutes on foot or bus to get to the new terminal from Terminal 2, which hosts the nearest train sta-

Terminal 3 comprises a three-story main building and a two-story satellite facility, including a 24-hour open rest area available for passengers for early morning flights, with a total floor space of roughly 66,000 square meters, the company said.

Efforts were made to reduce construction costs in order to curb facility

usage charges paid by airlines and passengers at the terminal, which is the first addition to the airport since the December 1992 opening of Terminal 2, the company said.
