## Basic education schools commence new academic year

YANGON 1 June — Schools throughout Myanmar commenced the 2015-2016 academic year on Monday, which also marked the start of the fee-free system across all basic education levels.

While thankful for the

government's free education policy, a mother of schoolchildren said there were many other costs throughout the academic year.

U Maung Aye, a father of a schoolboy, said it was important for teachers

to not only provide academic instruction, but also educate students on proper behaviour.

A teacher said educators will continue to instruct children as best they can despite changes in the education system.

Myanmar has 2,351 basic education high schools, 3,121 basic education middle schools, 6,553 basic education post-primary schools and 28,967 basic education primary Schools, with a total of 273,516 teachers and 8,200,595 students.

Some 21 private schools have already opened for the year.

UNICEF estimates more than 1 million children in Myanmar are still out of the school.

Myanmar's Quality Basic Education Programme is due to run until the end of 2015 with the support of UNICEF, with the aim of improving access to school and the quality of education for all children.

Thirty-four core townships identified as having the greatest level of need have been selected for the QBEP.

### Myanmar to return boat people rescued by Navy

NAY PYI TAW, 1 June — The Myanmar government will send 727 Bengali boat people recently rescued at sea near Haingyikyun, Ayeyawady Region, to the place where they recently departed, officials said Monday.

A Myanmar Navy patrol found the boat people adrift on 29 May and pro-

vided them with humanitarian aid, including food and drinking water.

Arrangements are under way to return the boat people to the place there they recently departed, in accordance with their wishes, after they were unable to reach their intended target countries, the officials said.—MNA

### Rotavirus vaccine set for distribution in Myanmar

YANGON, 1 June — The Health Ministry is planning to add rotavirus vaccine to the country's childhood vaccination programme, according to Dr Than Tun Aung, director of the Department of Health's Central Epidemiology Unit.

The new oral vaccine is expected to be distributed to infants under one year of age across the country in 2017, he told the local media at a health communication forum Saturday in Yangon.

Township constituency, asked the Union government's plan on Monday to add more engineering

subjects at the technological universities in Rakhine state and possibilities of students to learn some subjects in other universities out of this state.

Deputy Minister for Science and Technology Dr Ba Shwe said the four major subjects of civil engineering, mechanical engineering, electronic engineering and electrical power engineering have been conducted at 16 universities of this kind across the country.

Dr Ba Shwe also said conducting more engi-

neering subjects at the universities need to estimate the number of students, the requirement of respective areas and economic plans of these areas.

Daw Tin Tin Ye, MP of Kyunsu constituency in Taninthayi region asked the government's plan to set up a school for labor and delivery nurses and to resume training course on auxiliary nurse midwives in her constituency.

Regarding this, Deputy Minister for Health Dr Daw Thein Thein Htay

said that the ministry has conducted courses on auxiliary nurse midwives in Kyunsu Township beginning 1 October 2014 with the support of GAVI and the Rakhine state's government, turning out 30 trainees.

She also said the Department of Medical Science has established a school in Myeik and Dawei townships for labor and delivery nurses, adding that no plan for this school in Kyunsu Township yet.

MP of Yesagy Township constituency U Tin Htay Aung asked the substitutions for the trans-

ferred healthcare staff at the villages of his constituency.

The deputy minister answered that the ministry has assigned Dr Linn Htin from Pakokku People's Hospital for additional duty to take over Kyatsukyin village dispensary beginning 1 January 2015.

Pyithu Hluttaw also invited representatives for discussion on the boiler bill.

The Lower House then approved the amendment bill on Amyotha Hluttaw Law 2012 passed by the Upper House together with amendments.

Children in the country under 5 currently receive eight kinds of vaccinations for diseases.

Rotavirus is the most common cause of severe diarrhoea among infants aged below five and young children. Diarrhoea re-

mains a major health problem in the country.

"One-fourth of cases in children are caused by the virus," said the director, adding contaminated water was a major cause of outbreaks, common in the rainy season in heavily populated areas such as

Ayeyawady, Mandalay and Yangon regions.

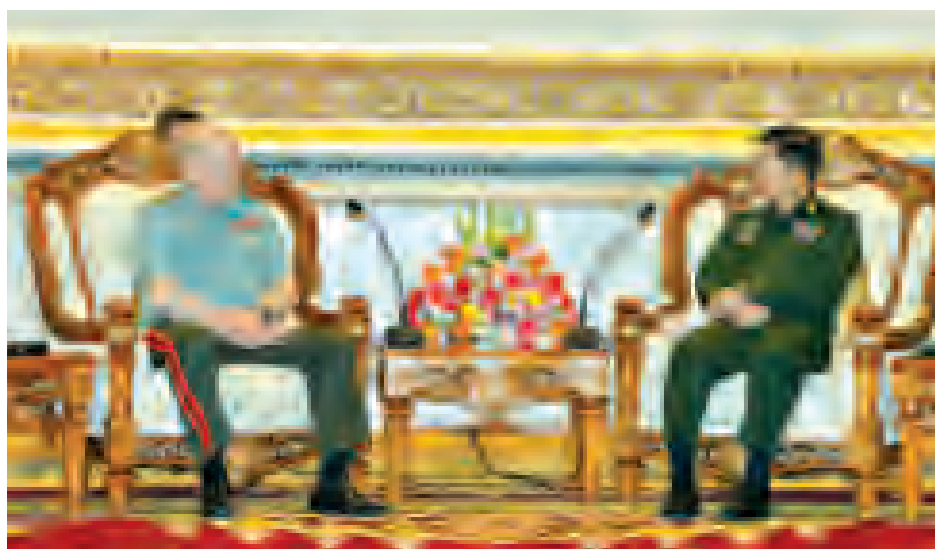

## Park hopes Abe's war anniversary statement advances Japan-S Korea ties

SEOUL, 1 June — South Korean President Park Geun-hye expressed hope on Monday that a statement Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe is scheduled to deliver on the 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the end of World War II would help advance relations between the two countries.

In her meeting with former Japanese Prime Minister Yoshiro Mori in Seoul, Park also urged Japan to make prompt efforts to restore the honour of former "comfort women" who were forced to work in Japanese military brothels before and during the war, according to a senior Japanese lawmaker who attended the talks.

The South Korean leader said she will make efforts to improve ties with Japan, but made no mention of a possible meeting with Abe, former Japanese Chief Cabinet Secretary Takeo Kawamura told reporters.

Amid strained bilateral relations over issues related to differences in historical perception and a territorial dispute, the two leaders have yet to hold formal bilateral summit talks since they took office — Abe in 2012 and Park in 2013.

Regarding Abe's war anniversary statement, countries such as South Korea and China are concerned that Abe may water down Tokyo's past apologies. Mori was in Seoul to attend a two-day meeting

of a consultative group of senior political and economic representatives from Japan and South Korea through Monday.

He said during Monday's session, "History has proven that Japan and South Korea must help each other. Political leaders should have the recognition that a new era in which people of young generations interact with each other has come."

From the South Korean side, former Prime Minister Lee Hong-koo expressed hope that the "closest neighbours" will share their experiences on how to deal with the challenges posed in the new era. The consultative group was created this spring to discuss ways to improve ties and met for the second round after its first gathering in late March in Tokyo. Members of the visiting Japanese delegation also met with South Korean Foreign Minister Yun Byung Se on Monday.

## Vietnam, US sign Joint Vision Statement on Defence Relations

HANOI, 1 June — The Vietnamese Ministry of National Defence and the US Department of Defence inked a Joint Vision Statement on Defence Relations here on Monday.

The statement was signed by Vietnamese Defence Minister Phung Quang Thanh and the US Secretary of Defence Ashton Carter.

Speaking at the press conference after the signing ceremony, the Vietnamese defence minister said the statement will guide defence relationship on the basis of the Memorandum of Understanding for Advancing Bilateral Defence Cooperation signed by the two parties in 2011, including cooperating in dealing with war legacies, sharing experience in search and rescue, and launching bilateral dialogues and discussions. The joint vision statement will enhance friendship, understanding and confidence building between the two countries, deepen the comprehensive partnership for the interests of the two peoples, and contribute to the maintenance of peace and stability in the South-

east Asia and Asia-Pacific region, Phung said.

Carter, for his part, claimed that the statement is to further strengthen the defence relationship between the two countries for the years to come, adding that the US will support the operation of UN peacekeeping center established in Hanoi and the participation of Vietnam in UN

peacekeeping activities. The legacy of war should be dealt with according to the statement, said Carter, while he returned two war remains, a diary and a belt of Vietnamese soldiers to Phung for Vietnam to keep. Echoing his keynote speech to the Shangri-La dialogue held in Singapore Saturday, the US Secretary of Defence stressed that the

US will work with Vietnam to ensure the regional security, peace and prosperity, so that every nation in Asia-Pacific region can win together and all the interested parties can benefit. Carter is on his official visit to Vietnam from 31 May to 1 June, at the invitation of Vietnamese defence minister Phung Quang Thanh.

## Thai King admitted to hospital for check ups

BANGKOK, 1 June — Thailand's king was admitted to hospital on Sunday for a health check up and will stay overnight, the palace said.

Examination of King Bhumibol Adulyadej, 87, showed a normal heartbeat and no respiratory infections, according to a statement from the Royal Household Bureau. Blood tests and body temperature measurement also showed no abnormalities.

Bhumibol is widely revered by Thais, most of whom have only experienced his more than six decade reign. The king is seen as a figure above the country's often violent political divisions.—Reuters

## Two Indian warships reach Indonesia

NEW DELHI, 1 June — Two Indian warships have reached Indonesia as part of their four-day deployment, sources said on Monday.

"INS Ranvir, a guided missile destroyer, and INS

Shakti, a fleet tanker and support ship, have reached Jakarta. During their visit, both the Indian Navy and the Indonesian Navy will conduct regular coordinated patrols," the sources said.

The visit by the Indian naval ships is aimed at bolstering the naval ties between the two countries, they said, adding that an annual naval exercise is also planned this year.

The ships came to Indonesia from Singapore and will visit Australia, Malaysia, Thailand and Cambodia after the deployment, the sources said.

## At least 64 Abu Sayyaf members killed in Philippines this year: military

MANILA, 1 June — A total of 64 Abu Sayyaf members were killed and 104 others were reportedly injured in the continuing military operations against the terrorist group in Sulu province since January this year, Philippine military said on Monday.

"Its due to our relentless operations, we've been looking for their hideouts. We've also gotten good

intelligence (information)," Col Allan Arrojado, commander of Joint Task Group Sulu said when asked to which he attributes their feat during the first five months of the year.

"We have coordinated, focused military operations involving the Marines, Army with the Navy, Air Force and the artillery units. Because of that, we were able to achieve this

feat," he added. However, 9 soldiers died and 69 others were injured in the campaign against the Abu Sayyaf Group (ASG) from January to May.

When asked how many Abu Sayyaf men are still operating in Sulu, Arrojado said the number could reach as much as 400. However, he said: "We have identified around

200, based on pictures and revelations of those captured."

Founded in the early 1990s by Islamic extremists, the ASG is a violent Muslim terrorist group operating in the southern Philippines. The ASG is notorious for a series of kidnappings, bombings and even beheadings in southern Philippines over the past decades.—Xinhua

## Tsipras says Greece not intransigent, urges EU leaders to reach deal

PARIS, 1 June — Greek Prime Minister Alexis Tsipras said Greece should not be blamed for not yet reaching a deal with its creditors and called on fellow European leaders to bypass technical talks and come to a political solution.

Athens and its creditors were continuing talks on a cash-for-reforms deal but were expected to miss a self-imposed on Sunday deadline for reaching an agreement to unlock aid, sources close to the talks

said.

“If we have not reached an agreement with our partners, it’s not because of our intransigence or incomprehensible positions from the Greek side,” Tsipras said in a column published on French daily *Le Monde*’s website on Sunday.

“It is rather because of the obsession of some institutional representatives who insist on unreasonable solutions and are being indifferent to the democratic result of recent Greek elections,”

he wrote, adding European and international institutions were ready to be flexible.

He said the Greek government had been ready to make compromises, for instance on privatisations, despite its party’s ideological opposition to them.

Tsipras also responded to criticism that Greece was holding up a deal with the lenders because it resisted pension reforms and insisted on restoring collective bargaining.

He said Greece has committed to integrating pension funds and cutting down on early retirement but opposed any further cuts in pensions which have been slashed by up to 48 percent in the last five years.

“Currently, 44.5 percent of pensioners receive a pension under the fixed threshold of relative poverty while approximately 23.1 percent of pensioners, according to data from Eurostat, live in danger of poverty and social exclusion,” he said.

“These numbers... cannot be tolerated — not simply in Greece but in any civilized country.”

Tsipras said he was against a two-speed euro-zone where the core would impose strict austerity rules via a “super euro zone finance minister” who would have the power to block any national budget not in line with extreme neo-liberal doctrines.

He is expected to have a teleconference with German Chancellor Angela Merkel and France’s President Francois Hollande later on Sunday — his second in four days — in a bid to help close the deal, a Greek government official said.

Tsipras has long sought a political push to end negotiations and get aid flowing to his cash-strapped country, though the lenders have insisted that Greece must wrap up talks at the technical level with adequate concessions on reforms so that its budget and debt numbers add up.—*Reuters*

## Abe says SDF could give US forces logistical support in Mideast

TOKYO, 1 June — Prime Minister Shinzo Abe said on Monday the Japanese Self-Defence Forces could provide US or other foreign troops logistical support in the Middle East and the Indian Ocean under new security bills.

Abe for the first time clarified that the SDF can engage in rear-area support such as provision of ammunition and refueling operation for foreign troops involved in combat activity in these regions far away from Japan and its vicinity under the envisioned bills that would remove geographical restrictions on SDF operations.

“If a serious military

tension or an armed conflict arises in the Middle East or the Indian Ocean with serious impacts expected on Japanese ships carrying goods to Japan and when the United States or any other country moves in response to the event, it may amount (to a situation where the SDF can offer logistic support),” he told the parliament.

Abe’s comments invalidated a 1999 statement by then Prime Minister Keizo Obuchi stating that any situation necessitating such SDF logistical support would be inconceivable in the Middle East or the Indian Ocean.

## Japan, China to hold extradition treaty talks in Beijing from Wednesday

TOKYO, 1 June — Japan and China will hold two-day talks from Wednesday aimed at concluding an extradition treaty in Beijing, resuming the negotiations for the first time in five years, the Japanese Foreign Ministry said on Monday.

The working-level talks would be the second round of discussions since they were held in February 2010 in Tokyo. The treaty, if real-

ized, will make it possible in principle for either country to hand over criminal suspects when requested.

The talks will resume amid a trend of a growing number of suspects in Japan fleeing to China and also at a time China is throwing its weight on catching senior officials embroiled in corruption scandals who escape overseas, Japanese officials said.

Japan’s delegation is set to be led by Makita Shimokawa, deputy director general of the ministry’s Asian and Oceanian Affairs Bureau, and includes officials from the National Police Agency and Justice Ministry.

China is expected to be represented by senior officials, including ones from the Chinese Foreign Ministry’s Department of Treaty

and Law, the Japanese ministry said.

Chief Cabinet Secretary Yoshihide Suga said in a Press conference that Japan hopes to negotiate with China for the “early conclusion” of a bilateral extradition treaty.

Japan has concluded criminal extradition treaties with the United States and South Korea.

## S Korea, Japan preparing talks on sharing military intelligence

SEOUL, 1 June — South Korea and Japan are preparing to hold talks this year on sharing military intelligence, South Korea’s Defence Ministry spokesman said on Monday.

“It’s my understanding that talks on sharing military intelligence between South Korea and Japan are being prepared,” Nah Seung Yong said during a press briefing.

Annual talks between military authorities of Japan and South Korea

could not be held last year “due to various situations,” he said, without providing further details as to when such talks will be held.

His comment was made in response to a news report on Monday that Japan has sent out a feeler to South Korea on the possible visit of Tadashi Miyagawa, chief of the intelligence bureau at the Japanese Defence Ministry, to South Korea in mid-June.

*The Hankook Ilbo* newspaper quoted a South Korean government source as saying, “It will be rare

for a chief of the Japanese military intelligence unit to make a visit to South Korea at a time bilateral military talks remain virtually suspended.”

The report said South Korea sees no particular reason to reject Japan’s such offer as it is deemed necessary to review the process of the trilateral military pact signed along with the United States last December.

In the latest development, Japanese and South Korean defence ministers on Saturday held their first

bilateral talks in four years on the sidelines of a regional security forum in Singapore and agreed to continue dialogue to improve strained relations.

Relations between South Korea and Japan have deteriorated to their lowest level in recent years due to conflicting views on their bitter shared history and a territorial dispute.

Japan ruled the Korean Peninsula from 1910-1945.

## S Korea navy to hold maritime exercise against N Korea’s submarines

SEOUL, 1 June — The South Korean navy plans to hold a three-day maritime exercise from Monday in waters off the south coast to better respond to North Korea’s infiltration by submarines, a Defence Ministry spokesman said on Monday.

Among the military hardware to be deployed for the exercise include a 7,600-ton Aegis-equipped destroyer, about 10 naval vessels, patrol seaplanes and Lynx anti-submarine helicopters, Nah Seung-hong said during a press briefing.

“The exercise will be held in waters east of Jeju Island for the purpose of strengthening capabilities to fight back North Korea’s submarine infiltrations,” he said. In a related development, South Korea’s army will also hold live-firing drills for two days from Monday. “The joint live-firing drills by the army will be held on sea, land and airspace to toughen the strong resolve against the enemy’s provocations,” he said. Tensions on the Korean Peninsula have spiked in recent weeks after North Korea announced that it had successfully test-fired a ballistic missile from a submarine. North Korea also claimed that it already has the capability of miniaturizing nuclear warheads.—*Kyodo News*

## US Senate lets NSA spy programme lapse, at least for now

WASHINGTON, 1 June — The legal authority for US spy agencies' collection of Americans' phone records and other data expired at midnight on Sunday after the US Senate failed to pass legislation extending the powers.

After debate pitting Americans' distrust of intrusive government against fears of terrorist attacks, the Senate voted to advance reform legislation that would replace the bulk phone records programme revealed two years ago by former National Security Agency contractor Edward Snowden.

Although the Senate did not act in time to keep the program from expiring, the vote was at least a partial victory for Democratic President Barack Obama, who had pushed for the reform measure as a compromise addressing privacy concerns while preserving a tool to help protect the country from attack.

But final Senate passage was delayed until at least Tuesday by objections from Senator Rand Paul, a libertarian Republican presidential hopeful who has fulminated against the NSA programme as illegal and unconstitutional.

As a result, the govern-

ment's collection and search of phone records terminated at midnight (0400 GMT on Monday) when key provisions of a post-11 September, 2001, law known as the USA Patriot Act expired.

In addition, US law enforcement and security agencies will lose authority to conduct other programmes.

Those allow for "roving wiretaps" aimed at terrorism suspects who use multiple disposable cell phones; permit authorities to target "lone wolf" suspects with no connection to specific terrorist groups, and make it easier to seize personal and business records of suspects and their associates.

Still, eventual resumption of the phone records programme in another form, and the other government powers, appeared likely after the Senate voted 77-17 to take up the reform legislation, called the USA Freedom Act.

"This bill will ultimately pass," Paul acknowledged after the procedural vote.

The Senate abruptly reversed course during a rare Sunday session to let the bill go ahead, after Republican Majority Leader Mitch McConnell reluctantly acknowledged that Paul had stymied his efforts to extend

the Patriot Act provisions.

Intelligence experts say a lapse of only a few days would have little immediate effect. The government is allowed to continue collecting information related to any foreign intelligence investigation that began before the deadline.

Obama strongly backed the Freedom Act, as have most Democrats. It passed the House of Representatives on 13 May by 338-88.

After the Senate adjourned, the White House issued a statement calling on the Senate to "put aside partisan motivations and act swiftly."

The measure could face more debate in Congress. Republican Senator Richard

Burr offered several amendments, including one to extend the existing programme for 12 months to provide more time to adopt changes mandated by the Freedom Act.

That could be a problem for some House members, because it doubles the transition period in their version of the bill.

Republicans have been deeply divided on the issue. Security hawks wanted the NSA programme to continue as is, and libertarians like Paul want to kill it altogether. The Senate debate was angry.

Paul said the Patriot Act provisions wasted resources better spent targeting those planning attacks. He even

accused some of his critics of wanting an attack on the United States "so they can blame it on me."

McConnell accused Paul, his fellow Kentucky Republican, and other Patriot Act opponents of waging "a campaign of demagoguery and disinformation" based on revelations from Snowden "who was last seen in Russia."

McConnell has endorsed Paul for president. But he wanted to extend the Patriot Act provisions, unchanged, for five years, and agreed only reluctantly to allow a vote on the Freedom Act despite what he called its "serious flaws."

Several senators accused Paul of using the issue to raise money for his presidential campaign.

"He obviously has a higher priority for his fundraising and political ambitions than for the security of the nation," Senator John McCain, the 2008 Republican presidential nominee, told reporters.

The Senate resumed consideration of the legislation at 4 pm EDT (2000 GMT), just as security officials said they had to begin shutting down the NSA programme to meet the deadline.

The Freedom Act would end spy agencies' bulk collection of domestic telephone "metadata" and replace it with a more targeted system.

The records would be held by telecommunications companies, not the government, and the NSA would have to get court approval to gain access to specific data. Neither the current nor proposed new system gives the government access to the content of phone conversations.

Many civil liberties groups feel the Freedom Act does not go far enough in protecting privacy.

"Congress should take advantage of this sunset to pass far reaching surveillance reform, instead of the weak bill currently under consideration," Michael Macleod-Ball, acting director of the American Civil Liberties Union's Washington Legislative Office, said in a statement. A review panel Obama established in 2013 concluded that the metadata collection programme had not been essential to preventing any terrorist attack.

Security officials counter that it provides important data they can combine with other intelligence to help stop attacks.—Reuters

"I think that this is enough to show how good the results are. We now have more room in the fiscal plan both for capital investment and for an increase in incomes in the coming period, but we will discuss that with our friends in the international financial organizations," said Vucic.—Tanjung

## Italy's Renzi faces tight battles in local election — exit poll

ROME, 1 June — Italian Prime Minister Matteo Renzi faces close races in two key regions at stake in local elections held on Sunday, according to an exit poll, with his centre-left party leading narrowly in one and trailing in the other.

Renzi's Democratic Party (PD) candidate was estimated to win 35.5 percent to 39.5 percent in the southern region of Campania, ahead of the centre-right candidate on 33.5 percent to 37.5 percent, according to the poll conducted by the EMG agency and broadcast on private TV station La 7.

In the north-western region of Liguria the centre-left was seen trailing in third place with 21.5 percent to 25.5 percent, behind the candidate from the anti-establishment 5-Star Movement with 25 to 29 percent and the centre-right candidate with 28 percent to 32 percent.

Exit polls have often

proved unreliable in previous Italian elections.

Liguria and Campania are seen as the two regions most in doubt among the seven being contested in the election. The centre-left is expected to win the central regions of Tuscany, Marche and Umbria and the southern region of Puglia.

Veneto in the north-east is expected to go to the euro-sceptic, anti-immigrant Northern League.

## Danish ruling bloc takes poll lead in countdown to vote

COPENHAGEN, 1 June — Centre-left parties backing Denmark's Prime Minister Helle Thorning-Schmidt edged into the lead in an opinion poll published on Monday in the countdown to a national election, their first time at the head of the pack in months.

More than half of respondents who had made up their mind, 50.5 percent, said they would vote for Thorning-Schmidt's bloc, in the first survey by polling agency Voxmeter since

she announced a \$5.7 billion spending package and then called the vote for 18 June.

Her group had trailed the centre-right bloc led by The Liberal Party's Lars Lokke Rasmussen in Voxmetre surveys since November 2013. The 'red bloc' only had 45.6 percent of the votes in a poll published on 25 May. But on 26 May, Thorning-Schmidt promised to boost spending on health-care, the elderly, children's day care, the environment and police and declared the

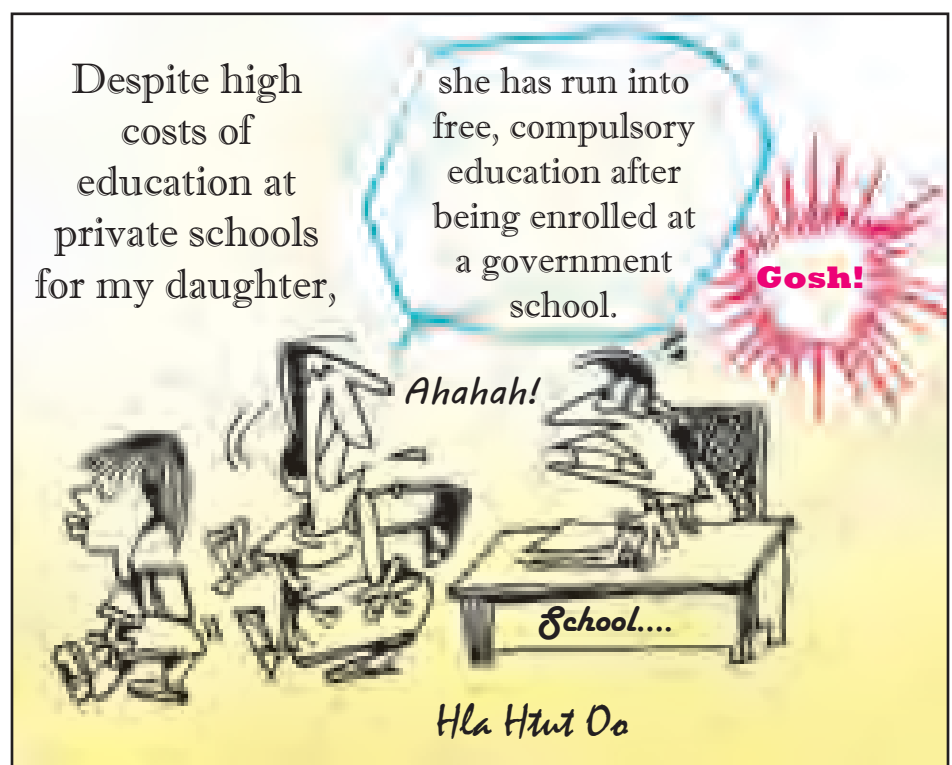

## Arab air strikes pound Houthi strongholds across Yemen

SANAA, 1 June— Warplanes from a Saudi-led coalition launched air strikes on Monday against Yemen's Houthi militia positions in the north, centre and south of the country, residents said.

Saudi planes and artillery bombed the Iran-allied group's northern stronghold province of Saada, which borders the Kingdom, and air strikes hit suburbs of the southern port of Aden on the Arabian sea.

An Arab alliance has been bombing the fighters

for more than two months in a bid to restore Yemen's exiled president Abd-Rab-bu Mansour Hadi, currently in exile in Saudi Arabia, to power.

The Sunni Muslim states are also concerned that the Shi'ite rebels are a proxy for the influence of their arch rival Iran in impoverished Yemen.

The Houthis, who swept into Yemen's capital Sanaa in September and fanned out across the country, say they are winning a revolution against corrupt

officials and hardline Sunni militants. Air strikes pounded military positions aligned with the Houthis in Sanaa on Sunday, and residents reported the sounds of constant explosions and anti-aircraft fire continuing into Monday.

Warplanes dropped bombs on groups of Houthi fighters on the outskirts of Aden, a bastion of support for president Hadi and scene of heavy street fighting between the militiamen and local fighters for over two months.—Reuters

## African leaders urge Burundi to postpone polls

DAR ES SALAAM, 1 June— African leaders meeting in Tanzania on Sunday to discuss a political crisis in Burundi triggered by the president's plan to run for a third term called for the postponement of elections by at least a month and a half. Protests erupted in Burundi in late April in response to President Pierre Nkurunziza's decision to run for another term in 26 June polls, a move critics say violates the constitution.

The heads of state of Tanzania, Uganda and Kenya, which together with Burundi and Rwanda form the East African Community (EAC) common market, attended the summit. They were joined by South African President Jacob Zuma.

"The summit called

for a longer postponement of elections in Burundi for a period not less than one and a half months," said Richard Sezibera, the secretary general of the EAC. The leaders had previously called for the vote to be postponed, to create the right conditions for voting, but to be held within Nkurunziza's current mandate that ends in August. Nkurunziza, who faced a coup attempt while in Dar es Salaam for the first summit on 13 May, did not attend the meeting. He was represented by the country's foreign minister, Alain Aime Nyamitwe. Rwanda also sent a minister rather than the head of state, a Tanzanian foreign ministry official said. The summit also called for the urgent disarmament of all youth factions allied to

political parties in Burundi.

Nkurunziza's ruling CNDD-FDD party's youth-wing, the so-called Imbonerakure, has been accused of carrying out some of the violence that has rocked Burundi for weeks.

"The leaders have been trying to navigate our way so we can help the people of Burundi to land safely under the current circumstances," Tanzanian President Jakaya Kikwete told a news conference after the summit.

Nkurunziza's decision to run for a third term unleashed Burundi's worst political crisis since an ethnically-driven civil war ended in 2005. The president's supporters say a constitutional court ruling allows him to run again. In the Burundian capital Bujum-

bura, low-key protests took place on Sunday in some suburbs of the city including Cibitoke, Buterere and Mutakura. One person was injured late on Saturday when a grenade exploded in the city centre. Rights groups say at least 20 people have been killed by police since protests began. There are fears violence could lead to renewed ethnic bloodletting between the Hutu and Tutsi communities. More than 90,000 Burundians have fled the country, according to new figures from the UN's refugee agency UNHCR. They have headed to Tanzania, Democratic Republic of Congo, and Rwanda, which shares a similar ethnic mix and suffered a genocide in 1994 in which 800,000 people were killed.—Reuters

## Islamic State drives back Syria insurgents near Turkey

AMMAN/BEIRUT, 1 June — Islamic State fighters advanced against rival insurgents in northern Syria on Sunday, capturing areas close to a border crossing with Turkey and threatening their supply route to Aleppo city, fighters and a group monitoring the war said.

Islamic State captured the town of Soran Azaz and two nearby villages after clashes with fighters from a northern rebel alliance, which includes both Western-backed rebels and Islamist fighters.

Islamic State will now be able to move along a road leading north to the Bab al-Salam crossing between the Syrian province of Aleppo and the Turkish province of Kilis, the Syrian Observatory for Human Rights said.

The town's loss is a blow to rebels grouped in the so-called Jabhat al-Shamiyya alliance (Levant Front), because it sits on an important supply

route to bring weapons into eastern Aleppo, two fighters said.

"The main supply line between Turkey and Aleppo will be severely affected," Abu Bakr, an alliance field commander, said in an online message.

The Levant Front was created in Aleppo in an effort to forge unity among factions in Syria that have often fought each other as well as the Syrian army and hardline jihadist groups, undermining the revolt against President Bashar al-Assad.

Rebels said the Islamic State gains had upset plans for a wider offensive that was being prepared ahead of the Muslim holy month of Ramadan to seize government-controlled parts of Aleppo. Residents in eastern Aleppo said convoys of rebel fighters were heading back to areas in the Soran countryside to repel Islamic State. Government forces hold the west of the city.—Reuters

## Suicide bombing claimed by Islamic State in western Libyan city kills five

MISRATA, (Libya) 1 June — Five people were killed and eight wounded in a suicide bombing claimed by Islamic State outside the Libyan city of Misrata on Sunday, security officials said. A suicide bomber rammed a car laden with explosives into the main security checkpoint west of Misrata, the officials said. Several cars and nearby shops were damaged by the blast. Islamic State claimed the attack, which it said had been carried out by a Tunisian, according to a statement on Twitter.

Islamic State militants have carried out several attacks in the Misrata area as well as other parts of Libya, exploiting a security vacuum as two rival governments battle for control of the oil-producing nation.

Misrata, located to the

east of Tripoli, is allied with the unofficial government that controls Tripoli. The internationally recognized government operates out of east Libya since losing control of the capital last August. "We will support all army, police and revolutionary forces to fight and chase those apostates who have come to Libya claim-

ing they are representing Islam," Libya's rival prime minister, Khalifa Ghwell, told Reuters at the scene of the blast.

"Islam disowns them," he said. Separately, a member of a rival parliament in Tripoli, Salim al-Hamali, who had been missing, was found dead south of the capital, Tripoli-based

al-Nabaa television said. Parliament's spokesman could not be reached for comment.

Libya's official government has been based in the east since losing control of the capital in 2014 at the hands of an armed faction which set up a rival administration and parliament.

## Jaguar Land Rover appoints new China sales head after Q1 drop

BEIJING, 1 June — Jaguar Land Rover has appointed a former Porsche executive as its new China head of sales, the automak-

er owned by India's Tata Motors Ltd (TAMO.NS) said on Monday, amid a slowdown in one of its key markets.

Mark Bishop, former managing director of Porsche China, will oversee sales and marketing for Jaguar, Land Rover and cars

made through JLR's joint venture with China's Chery Automobile in the country, the automaker said in a statement.

JLR's sales fell by a fifth year-on-year in China, the world's largest car market, for the first three months of the year as an economic slowdown weighs on the auto industry. Bishop succeeds Yi Lu, who resigned as president in mid-April citing personal reasons after serving in the position for roughly a year. James Hu, a current sales and customer services executive at JLR, will become deputy president of sales and marketing.

## Japan's May new auto sales down 7.6% as minicar sales sluggish

TOKYO, 1 June — Japan's new auto sales fell 7.6 percent in May from a year earlier to 335,644 units, as April's auto tax increase on minivehicles continued to weigh on demand, industry bodies said on Monday.

Sales of minicars plummeted 19.6 percent to 125,755 units, down for the fifth consecutive month, according to the Japan Light Motor Vehicle and Motorcycle Association.

Minivehicles, which have an engine displacement of up to 660 cc, account for around 40 per-

cent of new car sales in Japan.

Sales of cars other than minicars, meanwhile, rose 1.4 percent to 209,889 units, up for the second straight month, the Japan Automobile Dealers Association said, indicating the negative impact of the consumption tax hike in April last year has waned.

Demand for cars was sluggish in Japan during the previous fiscal year ended 31 March, against a backdrop of the 3-percent-age-point consumption tax increase to 8 percent — the first tax hike in 17 years.—Kyodo News

## Survey shows Australian adults experience more hangovers, often pressured to drink

CANBERRA, 1 June — Australia's affliction with alcohol sees its adults spending 91.5 million hours of every month hung-over, according to data released on Monday.

A survey of 1,030 Australian drinkers by fundraiser group Dry July, which encourages Australians to give up alcohol consumption for a month, showed Australians are being pressured to drink, and many considered alcohol integral to social gatherings.

More than half (52 percent) of the survey's respondents admitted they have felt pressure to drink alcohol in social situations, including with friends, at family gatherings and on public holi-

days. Half of drinkers consider it "un-Australian" not to drink at these occasions.

Five in six find it easy to resist peer pressure when they have a legitimate excuse not to drink, such as driving, being pregnant, training for a fitness event or being sick, but those who did pick up the bottle could affect the nation's productivity.

The figures showed Australian adults have 11 hangovers a year and one in five have taken multiple sick days to nurse a sore head. Three in five admitted they have experienced low productivity at work due to being hung-over.

Nearly half (44 percent) have skipped significant social events as a result of being hung over,

including dates, birthday celebrations and even weddings.

Brett Macdonald, co-founder of Dry July, which encourages Australians to give up alcohol consumption for a month, said the research had uncovered some sobering facts about social pressures faced by Australians when it comes to drinking.

"It also found that 21 percent of Australians have not gone for more than a week without drinking in the last five years," he said. "This is why we're encouraging everyone to take the Dry July challenge and see what can be achieved without a hangover."

## Food inspectors file case against Nestle over Maggi noodles

LUCKNOW, 1 June — Food safety inspectors in Uttar Pradesh have filed a criminal complaint against Nestle's Indian arm, after spot checks earlier this year found excess lead in some packets of Maggi instant noodles.

A court hearing has been set for 1 July, an official at the local Food and Drug Administration (FDA) said.

The Uttar Pradesh FDA had ordered a recall of a 200,000-pack batch of noodles at the end of April, after a spot check which said showed elevated levels

of monosodium glutamate (MSG), a flavour enhancer, and lead 17 times above the permissible limit.

Nestle, which says it does not add MSG to the noodles, disputes the order and has said the noodles are safe to eat.

The FDA official confirmed on Monday that the complaint included Nestle India, as well as the manufacturing unit, the retailer selling the tainted packs, two Nestle managers and even Bollywood stars who promoted the 2-minute snack.

Nestle has said the batch in question was man-

ufactured in February 2014, so was already past its sell-by date in April this year, and automatically collected from retailers by the time the recall was announced.

A spokesman for Nestle, which is now carrying out independent tests, said on Monday the company has not yet been notified of the complaint, and had no further comment.

The noodles, which sell at roughly a dozen rupees (\$0.20) per single-serving packet, are a hugely popular "homemade" snack in India, and Maggi has long been the market leader.—Reuters

## China HSBC PMI at 49.2 in May, contracts third month, export orders near two-year low

BEIJING, 1 June — Activity in China vast factory sector shrank for a third consecutive month in May as export orders contracted at the sharpest rate in nearly two years, a private survey showed on Monday, suggesting China remains locked in an economic cooldown.

The final HSBC/Markit Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI) stood at 49.2 in May, below the 50-point level that separates an expansion from a contraction in activity on a monthly basis. That is little changed from a preliminary reading of 49.1, and up a touch from April's 48.9.

In a sign that China's sputtering economy could face bigger headwinds in the short-term, a sub-index for new exports skidded to 46.7, a low unseen since June 2013, and well below April's 50.3. Factory output also shrank for the first time this year as the sub-in-

dex slipped under 50.

"A solid fall in new export work contributed to fewer new orders, which in turn led to the first contraction of output in 2015 so far," said Qu Hongbin, an economist at HSBC in Hong Kong. Add to that persistent job losses and reduced factory purchases, Qu said the data called for more stimulus measures to stoke domestic demand and economic growth. HSBC/Markit said companies had reported a broad weakening in overseas demand last month, which reduced factory production and fuelled job cuts among manufacturers. The PMI showed factory employment shrank in May for the 18<sup>th</sup> straight month, even though the pace of contraction eased from the rates seen in March and April. As the economy softened, deflationary pressure remained stubborn. The sub-indices for input and output prices were a good way under

50 points, though the rate of decline in input prices eased markedly.

China's economy has foundered this year as a cooling housing market and slowing growth in exports, domestic investment and consumption knocked growth to a six-year low of 7 percent in the first three months of the year.

Cooling inflationary pressure is especially problematic for China as it raises the real cost of borrowing for private firms, the biggest employers in the country but which are often denied of credit by banks.

Many analysts expect China's economy to grow 7 percent this year compared to 2014, the weakest rate in a quarter of a century and down from a 7.4 percent expansion last year. That has fuelled speculation that China's central bank, which has cut interest rates three times in six months, is likely to lower rates again this year.—Reuters

## G-7 to strengthen efforts to tackle plastic pollution in oceans

TOKYO, 1 June — Group of Seven leaders gathering in Germany next week are set to strengthen

next Sunday, the sources said. It will be the first time the G-7 has touched on the issue.

The total volume of plastics in the oceans, entering through dumping or insufficient regulation, is estimated to reach 4.8 million to 12.7 million tons a year, with global plastic production growing year by year, according to researchers.

While there have been reports of sea birds and other marine animals entangled in plastic waste, such as fishing lines, more recently researchers have pointed to the harm of microplastics — plastic waste that is broken into pieces measuring less than 5 millimeters by waves or ultraviolet radiation.

Such plastics have reportedly been found ingested by sea birds and fish. Researchers said the

particles are likely to absorb toxic substances in the waters. Their effects on the food chain and on humans are still being studied.

In the run-up to the summit, Germany, current G-7 chair, has been calling on member countries to address the issue of plastic pollution in oceans in the joint statement.

The leaders are set to discuss how to reduce plastic pollution and secure funds to collect the waste.

The G-7 groups Britain, Canada, France, Germany, Italy, Japan and the United States.

Also in connection with the marine environment, the G-7 leaders will also address the problem of ocean acidification, where the increase of carbon dioxide at sea is hindering the growth of coral reefs and shells, the sources said.

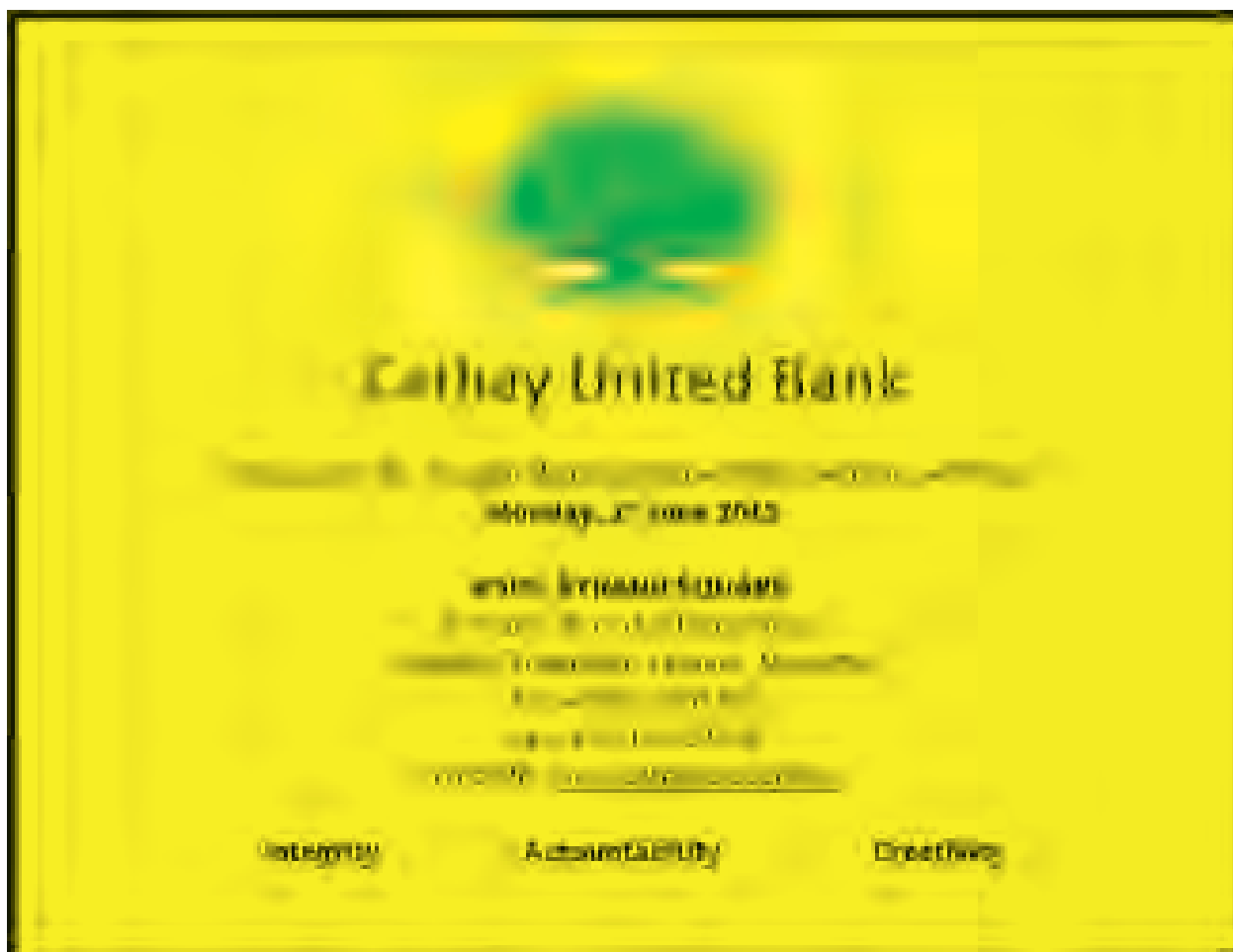

Vietnam reports  
16.7 pct rise in  
food poisoning  
cases in 5 months

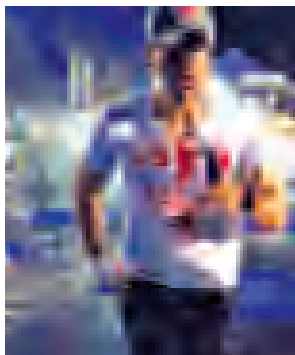
HO CHI MINH CITY, 1 June — Vietnam registered 42 serious food poisoning cases which affected 1,898 people, of whom 10 died, from January to May, while the respective figures were 36, 1,064 and 10 in the same period last year, the country's General Statistics Office announced on Monday. Last month, 824 people in Vietnam suffered in 10 food poisoning cases which claimed no lives. The country saw 10 food poisoning cases which affected 234 people, including three fatalities in May 2014. Vietnam detected 16,100 foot-and-mouth disease patients, 10,900 dengue fever cases and no new infections of bird flu virus A/H5N1 in the first five months of this year, the General Statistics Office said, noting that the country reported 20,800 cases of foot-and-mouth disease, 9,000 dengue fever and two A/H5N1 infections in the same period last year. Vietnam detected 1,800 HIV carriers in May, raising the total to 225,400, of whom 76,900 have become AIDS patients, the office announced. To date, 78,600 people in the country have died of AIDS-related causes.—Xinhua

The 40-year-old “Addicted” hitmaker was playing in front of 12,000 fans at the city’s Plaza de Toros de Playas when the

incident happened, but not even a few sliced fingers could stop him as he continued to play for another 30 minutes, reported Contactmusic.

Iglesias was playing the show as part of his ‘Sex and Love World Tour’, which kicked off last month.

In a statement, a representative for the singer, confirmed he was now on the mend following the accident.

After the concert some audience members shared pictures of the singer continuing to perform on social media, showing him nursing a bleeding, bandaged hand.—PTI

LOS ANGELES, 1 June— After earning a degree of his own earlier this month from School of the Art Institute of Chicago, rapper Kanye West returned to school to give an inspiring commencement speech.

West, 37, spoke to graduates at Los Angeles Trade Technical College and dished out some hard-earned advice, reported MTV online.

“When you’re the ab-

solute best, you get hated on the most. It’s a tough world out there. You’re going to prepare yourself for politics, bad bosses, hating employees... Even for me as a successful musician, to make the transition (into fashion), it was really all but impossible. People really try to box you in to what they know you best for,” he said.

The father of one continued by praising the budding designers for following

their lifelong dreams.

“The most successful artists are as close to who they were when they were five years old or four years old or three years old, or when my daughter wakes up and decides to change her career seven times a day,” he said. “So I feel extremely honoured to see new talent fighting for their voice that I can only imagine they’ve been fighting for since age three,” he added.—PTI

## ‘San Andreas’ Soars to \$53.2 Million Opening

LOS ANGELES, 1 June — Dwayne Johnson’s “San Andreas” has delivered a dominating \$53.2 million opening weekend at 3,777 US locations, soaring past recent forecasts of a \$40 million launch for the Warner Bros.-New Line 3D disaster pic.

“San Andreas” took in more than five times as much as the \$10 million opening of Sony’s romantic comedy “Aloha,” which arrived at 2,815 sites amid extensive negative buzz — despite the stardom of Bradley Cooper, Emma Stone and Rachel McAdams. Sony distribution chief Rory Bruer noted that “Aloha,” launched as a counterprogrammer to “San Andreas,” received a B+ CinemaScore among adults 25-34; the audience was 64% female with 57% of the audience over 30.

“San Andreas” underlines Johnson’s drawing power in the wake of being a key component of Universal’s “Furious 7” and

its \$1.5 billion worldwide gross. He’s been front and centre in the promotion for “San Andreas,” where he plays a heroic helicopter pilot seeking to rescue his daughter, played by Alexandra Daddario, amid the rubble of a mega-quake.

Paul Dergarabedian, senior media analyst at Rentrak, noted that “San Andreas” gained momentum throughout the weekend due to the film delivering what he called “pure popcorn movie excitement.”

“Johnson is clearly one of the most bankable stars working today,” he added. “Johnson’s versatility, charisma, humour and his imposing physical presence on the big screen has made him the go-to guy for filmmakers looking to ratchet up the excitement level and drawing power of their films.”

“San Andreas,” which also stars Carla Gugino and Paul Giamatti, earned an impressive A- Cine-

maScore from audiences, with 70% coming from the over-25 demo. Dan Fellman, Warner’s domestic distribution chief, said Johnson deserves much of the credit.

“He’s a four-quantant, larger-than-life movie star,” Fellman said. “This is going to have great legs.”

Village Roadshow Pictures co-financed and co-produced “San Andreas” with Warners for \$110 million, with most of the

film lensing in Australia to take advantage of government incentives.

Universal’s third weekend of “Pitch Perfect 2” led the rest of the pack, finishing with \$14.8 million at 3,660 locations. The comedy sequel, which carries a modest \$29 million price tag, has outperformed expectations with a total of \$147.5 million in 17 days in the US with another \$80 million-plus internationally.—Reuters

## Sony Music denies pulling Beyonce Knowles’ songs from Tidal

LOS ANGELES, 1 June— R&B star Beyonce Knowles’ songs will not be removed from the streaming service, Tidal, Sony Music has said.

The music corporation’s CEO Doug Morris dismissed the rumours that it threatened to remove its artists from the streaming service, via a statement, reported Acheshowbiz.

“Jay-Z is a friend and business associate for many years. I have always admired his business acumen, his entrepreneurship and his passion for music,” he said. “All of our content, including Beyonce, is available through the Tidal service, and we have announced no plans to remove our catalog from Tidal. Like all of our other partners, we are rooting for Jay and Tidal to succeed.”

Sony was allegedly asking for “a large advance” in exchange for their catalogue which includes other Tidal co-owners like Daft Punk, Usher, and Alicia Keys.

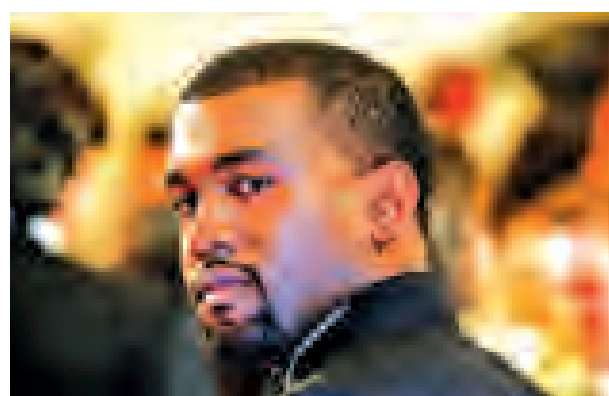
Iggy Azalea cancels Great Escape Tour

## Tsonga lights up Paris to reach last eight, Cornet out

PARIS, 1 June — Frenchman Jo-Wilfried Tsonga illuminated a grey day in Paris with a thrilling win over Tomas Berdych to reach the French Open quarter-finals on Sunday but Maria's Sharapova's title defence was put on hold by the rain.

Roger Federer, the 2009 men's champion, was another player kept waiting by the weather and although the Swiss did get on court, he walked off in the gathering gloom unsure about his last eight prospects, locked at one-set all with Gael Monfils.

After home favourite Alize Cornet's run petered out in a bitter 6-2, 7-6(9) defeat by Ukraine's 19<sup>th</sup> seed Elina Svitolina in a match held up for three hours by the rain, home eyes turned to Tsonga on Court Philippe Chatrier.

All seemed to be going well when the local favourite led by two sets against bad-tempered Czech fourth seed Berdych, who seemed unhappy to be playing in

on-and-off drizzle, but when he served for the match at 5-4 in the third the dampness seemed to get into his circuitry and he fluffed his chance.

Berdych pounced to take the third set on a tie-break and, as French cheers from fans huddled under colourful umbrellas in the stands turned to near silence, the Czech moved a break ahead in the fourth and looked favourite to go on and win.

Out of nowhere, however, the spring returned to Tsonga's step and with an onslaught of heavy hitting he reeled off five games in a row to win 6-3, 6-2, 6-7(5), 6-3.

The injury-plagued Tsonga sealed victory when Berdych wafted a backhand long and the Frenchman danced for joy before conducting the crowd's "Oles" with his towel.

It was only the third time in nine meetings that 30-year-old Tsonga, seeded 14, had beaten Berdych

and his reward is a quarter-final against Japan's Kei Nishikori.

Title tip Nishikori had not struck a ball in anger since his second-round win over Brazil's Thomaz Bellucci on Wednesday after his third-round opponent Benjamin Becker of Germany pulled out with an injury. If there was any rust, however, he soon shook it off to outclass Russian Teymuraz Gabashvili 6-3, 6-4, 6-2 and reach the quar-

ter-finals at Roland Garros for the first time.

He also became the first Japanese man to get this far at the French Open for more than 80 years and he sounded like he had no intention of stopping yet.

"I think quarter-final that's the first goal for this week," the 2014 US Open runner-up said. "I hope it's just the start of my journey, and I hope I can keep going." Eighth seed Stan Wawrinka made up for lost time as he blew away Frenchman Gilles Simon 6-1, 6-4, 6-2 to set up a last eight encounter with either fellow Swiss Federer or Monfils.

Two of the scheduled women's fourth-round matches were postponed — Sharapova's clash against Czech 13<sup>th</sup> seed Lucie Safarova and Italian Flavia Pennetta's meeting with Spain's Garbine Muguruza. Those matches will be wedged into Monday's schedule when better weather is expected in the French capital.—Reuters

## Lazio survive missed penalty to take Champions League place

ROME, 1 June — Lazio survived a storming Napoli fightback, including a missed penalty, as they won 4-2 on Sunday to finish third in Serie A and qualify for the Champions League playoff round after both teams finished with 10 men.

Gonzalo Higuain scored twice as Napoli, needing to win to pip Lazio to third spot in coach Rafael Benitez's last game in charge, hit back from 2-0 down at halftime to equalise in a game in which both teams finished with 10 men.

Argentine Higuain then had a golden chance to send his team into the Champions League when they were awarded a penalty with 15 minutes left but he fired a wild effort over the bar. Lazio took full advantage as Ogenyi Onazi and Mi-

roslav Klose scored in the last five minutes before the silenced Stadio San Paolo emptied with astonishing speed.

Lazio finished their campaign on 69 points, with Fiorentina fourth after a 3-0 win over Chievo and

Napoli on 63.

The final weekend produced 47 goals in 10 games, with Cagliari beating Udinese 4-3, Inter Milan overcoming Empoli by the same score and Torino thrashing Cesena 5-0.

Lazio appeared to be

cruising after Marco Parolo scored with a deflected shot and Antonio Candreva pounced on Kalidou Koulibaly's mistake to send the visitors in 2-0 at halftime.

But Napoli suddenly found belief after Higuain tapped in Jose Callejon's low cross 10 minutes after the restart.

As the hosts increased the pressure, Lazio's Stefan de Vrij denied Dries Mertens an equaliser with a goal-line clearance and the visitors then had Parolo sent off for a second bookable offence in the 62<sup>nd</sup> minute.

When Mertens cleverly set up Higuain to level two minutes later the momentum was clearly with Napoli but they self-destructed in a manner painfully familiar to their fans.—Reuters

## Japanese gov't begins "Super Cool Biz" campaign

TOKYO, 1 June — The Japanese government began its annual "Super Cool Biz" campaign on Monday, encouraging employees to dress casually to help reduce use of air conditioners for energy saving.

The campaign, which allows workers to wear polo shirts, sneakers and even Hawaiian aloha shirts in the office, began in 2011 following the 11 March earthquake and tsunami that triggered the Fukushima nuclear crisis and caused power shortage concerns amid the halt of nuclear power generation in the country.

The campaign running through September is an enhanced version of the "Cool Biz" initiative, which started 11 years ago to allow workers at central government ministries and agencies to work without their usual ties and jackets.

Prime Minister Shinzo Abe and his Cabinet members will wear "kariyushi" — a summer shirt, similar to a Hawaiian shirt, from Okinawa, southern Japan — at a Cabinet meeting on Tuesday to promote the campaign.

Kentaro Ogita, an Environment Ministry official, said in a blue aloha shirt that he felt somewhat embarrassed on his commuter train. "But I admit it is very comfortable and cooler. I recommend this style to everyone," he said.

The ministry will also hold "Super Cool Biz" fashion shows and talk shows across the country as part of efforts to promote the initiative.

The mercury has risen in Japan recently, with the Japan Meteorological Agency forecasting usual summer heat this year.

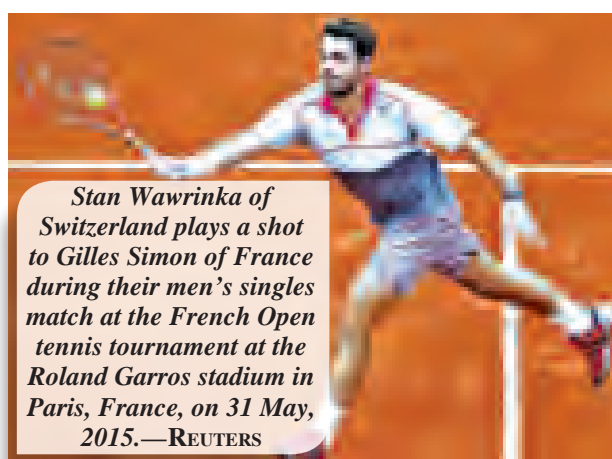

## Rampant Germany smash eight past Fiji

CHRISTCHURCH, 1 June— Germany cruised to the most comfortable of victories in their FIFA U-20 World Cup opener, beating debutants Fiji 8-1 in Christchurch.

A rampant first-half performance, with Hany Mukhtar and Niklas Stark getting three and two respectively, saw the 1981 winners storm into an unassailable lead, though the Pacific nation's fans did have something to cheer about when Iosefo Verevou claimed an unexpected consolation strike.

Fiji started out in a fashion that they no doubt would have been pretty content with, defending stoutly in the opening stages, though possession was all Germany's. However, with the islanders unable to retain possession, it was little surprise when the deadlock was broken, and those first 18 minutes were not reflective of how the half would continue.

As soon as Stark had converted Marc Kampf's header back across goal the U-19 European champions had a second, with Marc Stendera converting from the penalty spot after Mohammed Khan's handball. Impressive footwork from Grischka Promel saw him fire in at the near post to make it three in five minutes, before Stark headed his second.

Mukhtar opened his account in fine style, curling in from the edge of the area, before he doubled his personal tally following a great burst down the left wing by Julian Brandt. With a half-a-dozen to their name, Frank Wormuth's side were already guaranteed victory, and as a result were lulled into something of a lackadaisical rhythm. They had quite a rude awakening after the break, however.

With only pride to play for, Fiji returned emboldened and following a tortuous first 45 minutes for the Pacific fans, they were given something to cheer. A deep cross saw Verevou peel away from his napping marker, with his header back across goal giving him the title of Fiji's first goal-scorer at a FIFA tournament.

And while the Fijians did all they could to prevent the deficit increasing, with Mukhtar denied his hat-trick thanks to a fine goal-line clearance, substitute Marvin Stefaniak pulled an effort out of the top drawer. After being on for a matter of seconds, he curled a delightful dipping shot over Misiwani Nairube to return some extra shine to the scoreline.

The goals were then rounded off with a second spot-kick, this time handed to Mukhtar so he could finally complete his treble. Germany will expect a sterner test when they face Uzbekistan, while Fiji will hope to pick up their first FIFA points against Honduras.

## Mighty Mervo sinks Korea DPR

NEW PLYMOUTH, 1 June — Hungary shot to the top of FIFA U-20 World Cup Group E thanks to a fabulous showing from hat-trick hero Bence Mervo, seeing his side beat Korea DPR 5-1. The powerful forward was unplayable all night as he tore in the Koreans' back-line, and while An Ye Gun's side briefly drew level they were always second best, with the Europeans pulling out of sight with three second-half goals.

The game began as something of a slow burner, with Hungary in charge but with little penetration. Attila Osvath was first to test Cha Jong Hun in the Korea DPR goal, but the breakthrough came just six minutes later for the Magyars. A poor clearance by captain Kim Kuk Chol allowed Donat Zsoter to swing in a sumptuous cross which Mervo only had to glance into the far corner.

The Koreans were struggling to fashion many chances, but when they did they were invariably from free-kicks launched

into the area, an approach which paid dividends. A high, searching pass found the head of So Jong Hyok. His flick was perfectly into the path of Choe Ju Song who was brave enough to volley beyond the oncoming Gyorgy Szekely. It was parity that held for a matter of seconds, though. Hungary's next foray forward saw Krisztian Tamas charge down the left — where the first goal emanated from —

and Zsolt Kalmar did well to climb highest when surrounded by goalkeeper and defender to reclaim the lead. Korea could have gone in level on terms, with Ju Song spurning a great chance, but after the break the game got away from them. The game was effectively over when the pair who made the first goal combined again superbly. Zsoter plucked the ball out of the air and playing it into the feet of Mervo.

He turned on a sixpence fantastically and slotted it into the corner. An error by Jung Hun made the game safe as he misjudged a bouncing free-kick to allow David Forgacs to head into an empty net, but icing on the cake came as Mervo completed his treble. Picking the ball up in the area he danced around Jong Hun with sublimely quick feet, before curling in from a tight angle.—FIFA
