

Myanmar deploying all diplomatic means with country concerned through diplomatic channel to send boat people back to place of origin

NAY PYI TAW, 3 June—The Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar issued a press release on boat people Wednesday. The following is the full text of the press release.

Press Release

1. Myanmar is making serious efforts to prevent human smuggling and illegal migration while Myanmar Navy and Air Force are regularly patrolling its territorial water. On 21 May 2015, during patrolling, Myanmar Navy found a boat with 208 people and rescued them on humanitarian ground. They are given temporarily shelters at Taung Pyo (Let Wai), Rakhine State.

2. In order to send them back to their place of origin expeditiously, the findings from the verification process were sent to the Bangladeshi side through diplomatic channel. According to the procedures, consular access was permitted to the Bangladeshi side to make necessary verification based on the verification results of the Myanmar side.

3. Also on 29 May 2015, while Myanmar Navy was on duty patrolling for the safety of territorial water, they spotted a suspicious fishing vessel located at south-

east of Pyapon Township of Ayeyawady Region. On the boat, 734 men, women and children were found. In order for them to return back to their original place, women and children are kept at temporary places near Taung Pyo (Let Wai) and the remaining people are kept at temporary shelters near Boundary Pillar No. 37 from Bangladesh border, north of Taung Pyo (Let Wai) on humanitarian ground.

4. Myanmar is deploying all diplomatic means with the country concerned through diplomatic channel to send the boat people back to their place of origin.

5. On 3 June 2015, Union Minister for Foreign Affairs U Wunna Maung Lwin received the Bangladeshi Ambassador to Myanmar, at Nay Pyi Taw. During the discussion, the Union Minister said that Myanmar is providing temporary shelters to the boat people on humanitarian grounds and urged the Bangladeshi side to expeditiously receive back the people who are given temporary shelters after completing the verification process. The Bangladeshi Ambassador said his government has given priority on the

matter and as bilateral relations between the two countries are flourishing, necessary preparations are being carried out expeditiously. He also replied that the repatriation process will begin on 7 June 2015.

6. Officials from the Embassy of People's Republic of Bangladesh in Yangon and Bangladesh Consulate in Sittwe will begin consular access on 4 June 2015 to the above-mentioned rescued people who are given temporary shelters.

7. While the Government of Myanmar is protecting the interests of its people as well as the interests of the country in the international community, arrangements are being made to send the rescued boat people back to their place of origin by taking serious consideration on the matter on humanitarian grounds.

UN special envoy calls on ethnic leaders to get ceasefire, political dialogue started as soon as possible

YANGON, 3 June—Real trust and progress in Myanmar can be brought about by ethnic rebel leaders jointly implementing a ceasefire accord with the government and starting a credible political dialogue, Mr. Vijay Nambiar, U.N. Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon's special adviser on Myanmar, said Tuesday.

Calling on the ethnic leaders to negotiate a ceasefire and political dialogue as soon as possible in his speech delivered at the opening of the Ethnic Armed Organizations Summit, Nambiar pointed out that a nationwide ceasefire is only the first step and political dialogue is the only way forward in Myanmar.

"The success of reforms in Myanmar will depend on a sustained peace

in the country. Every transition is deeply difficult and fraught with setbacks, but we cannot wait until everything is perfect. We

cannot allow the best to become the enemy of the good. If we do that we may get neither peace nor democracy", he said.

"The simple point is that the future of Myanmar rests in your hands", he added.

Nambiar continued,

"The current government has made some promises that have long been asked for by ethnic groups as well as by the international

community. Only by starting the process of a political dialogue can we begin to see if these promises can be delivered."

Nambiar also expressed the view that if the process can be started before the elections and with the support of the international community, there is a greater possibility of ensuring that the post-election government will be willing to commit to it.

With the participation of most ethnic armed groups and observers including from the UN and the People's Republic of China, the five-day summit from 2 June is taking place at Law Khee Lar in Kayin State to seek final approval of a draft peace deal approved by the Nationwide Ceasefire Coordination Team, a coalition of 16 ethnic armed groups, and Union Peace-Making Work Committee, the government's negotiating team, late March in Yangon.

MIC refuses to comment on Myakyunthar Park project in Yangon

YANGON, 3 June—Myanmar Investment Commission does make any remark on the Myakyunthar Park project which is under public criticism and media coverage recently.

The Deputy Director General Daw Cho Cho Win of MIC said the commission does not intervene in the land rental prices,

but issue permits for a suitable period.

Daw Cho Cho Win said, in an interview, that land lease permit in Myanmar is now 50 consecutive years and it can be extended by 10 years two times, totally 70 years, depending on the type of business after the two laws of the Foreign Investment Law in 2012 and the Myanmar

Citizens Investment Law in 2013 were enacted.

She also said any proposal was not submitted to MIC for the park development project, adding that it is a lawful option for investor.

The deputy director general noted that any proposal to MIC will be considered on the facts of employment opportunities,

industrial technology and environmental impacts.

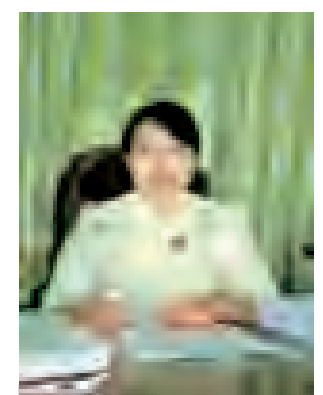
She added the Myakyunthar Park project is reportedly known that it is under the management of Yangon City Development Committee, and that the commission does not make any comment on this project.

She also said MIC is facilitating the investors

through one-stop-service after scrutinizing the investments not to damage social, cultural and environmental situations of the country.

The Ministry of Defence owned the park until 2012, and it was transferred to YCDC in 2012-2013 fiscal year.

Security forces on right track to fight against illegal trade

NAY PYI TAW, 3 June — Union Commerce Minister U Win Myint said on Wednesday the illegal trade control measures of mobile teams are being taken in collaboration with Myanmar Police Force, navy and Air Force.

MP U Than Myint of Salingyi Township constituency made a query about the government's plans to enforce safety measures for the staff controlling illegal trade, and educative programmes to be aware of the danger of illegally imported food items.

The commerce minister said security measures for the members of mobile teams are being taken by 27 officers and 98 members of various ranks from MPF.

He added that the ministry has promoting trade and awareness on food safety measures in states/regions in collaboration with the respective minis-

tries and other organizations by educating students and teachers, as well as school vendors to ensure food safety at schools.

MP U Than Win from Taungdwingyi constituency asked the impacts of exchange rate fluctuation on the country.

Deputy Governor U Set Aung of the Central Bank Myanmar said Myanmar has varieties of exchange rate, in addition to illegal exchange rate market as in other countries. He also added that currency rates in Myanmar and other countries have declined as the Federal Reserve Bank of the United States has increased its interest rate in 2014. He noted that the Central Bank of Myanmar is controlling local currency rate by addressing illegal monetary market.

Pyithu Hluttaw then approved the amendment bill on the Union Election Commission Law.—MNA

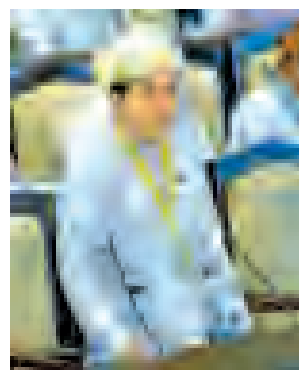

Tax exemption on school bus imports concerned with Union government

NAY PYI TAW, 3 June — Tax exemption on the import of school buses can only be allowed by the approval of Union government, said Deputy Minister for Commerce Dr Pwint Hsan to Amyoth Hluttaw on Wednesday.

MP Dr Myat Nyana Soe of Yangon region constituency 4 urged the Ministry of Commerce for tax exemption on school bus and prohibition of private cars to send children to schools.

Dr Pwint Hsan said tax

exemption scheme is a possibility with the approval of Union government under the maritime custom law on trades and the custom law, adding that the Custom Department will have to incur the 5 percent commerce tax and the 2 percent advance income tax for every unit of school buses.

He also said there is no plan to prohibit private cars for being used to send children to schools.

Dr Myat Nyana Soe, also the secretary of Amyotha Hluttaw Bill Committee, read out the report of Pyithu Hluttaw to Amyotha Hluttaw on the amendment bill on referendum law to modify the 2008 State constitution.

The report said temporary national registration card holders are ineligible for voting rights and that the approval of Pyithu Hluttaw should be confirmed.

U Sai Paung Nap of Shan state constituency 12 and Daw Khin Waing Kyi

of Yangon region constituency 1 suggested the bill on conservation of ancient buildings.

Amyoth Hluttaw Bill Committee decided the suggestions of parliamentarians.—MNA

Course aims to improve standard of primary teaching

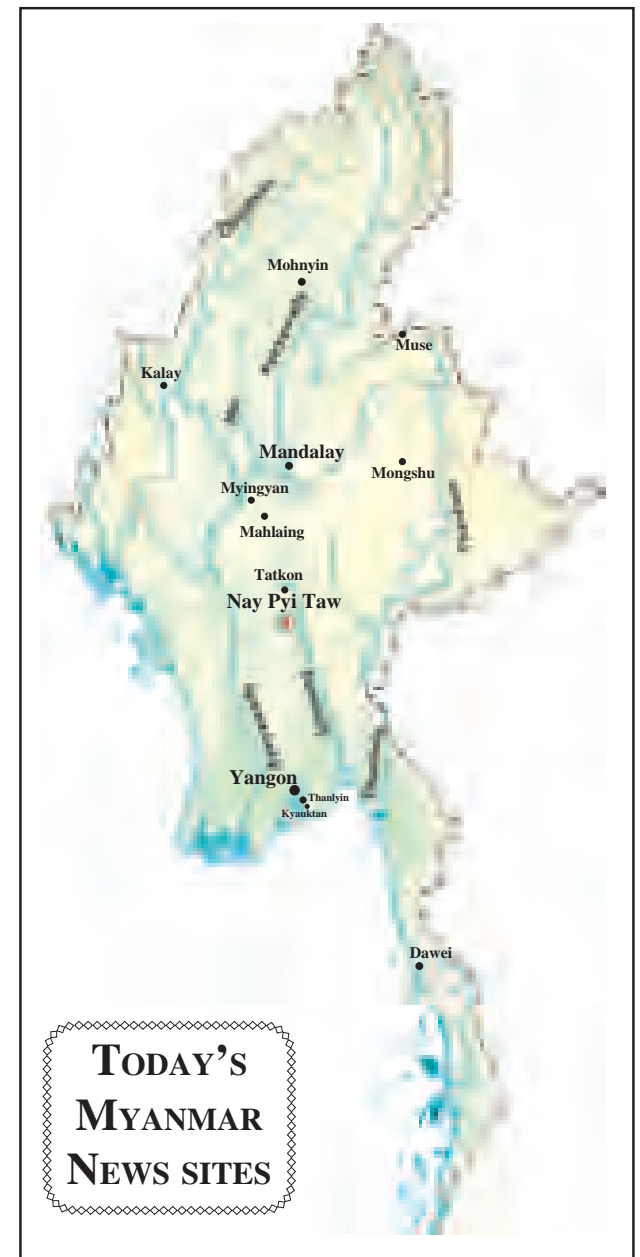

Rainy season damage restricts buses on Kalewa-Yagyi Road

The awarding ceremony was held in Cambodia's Royal Palace by Nenbutsushu Buddhist Sect of Japan in the presence of Buddhist monk leaders from Cambodia, Japan, Mongolia and Singapore.

The certificate of the honorary title signed by sect founding priest Kyuse Enshinjo called King Sihamoni a devout Buddhist who is admired for his propagation of Buddhism.

“His Majesty with the heart of high integrity is the ideal for all Buddhists in the world. In this 21st century, the period full of confusion, His Majesty is and will be a great torch of hope, brightly illumining the way to propagate Buddhism, the religion that brings true peace to the world,” it said.

The ceremony included a parade in front of the Royal Palace by thousands of people including Buddhist monks, government officials, civil servants and well wishers, during which the honorary title certificate was displayed on a golden bird-shaped float.

The award was presented less than a year after King Sihamoni attended the sixth World Buddhist Summit in Japan in December last year.

Speaking at the ceremony, the king called Buddhism “a right guidance that brings all of us to live in serenity, happiness, peace, and progress.” Some 90 percent of Cambodia's 15 million people are Buddhists.

CARICOM, India meet to further cooperation

KINGSTON, 3 June — The regional bloc the Caribbean Community (CARICOM) and India held a meeting in Georgetown, Guyana on Tuesday to further their collaboration under a joint commission.

The CARICOM-India Joint Commission is a mechanism for dialogue between the two parties to enhance cooperation in the political, economic, environmental, health, scientific and technical areas.

Though the agreement to initiate the commission was signed in 2003, the two sides had never met under the mechanism over the past 12 years.

In his opening remarks, India's Vice Foreign Minister Ramachandran Swaminathan praised the longstanding relationship between his country and the CARI-

COM, saying ties have been strengthened by mutually beneficial cooperation agreements and cricket. CARICOM Secretary-General Irwin LaRocque said that India was an important partner for the Caribbean states and has well established its presence in the region.

“This meeting allows us to exchange views and to enhance bilateral collaboration in various fields and issues on the international stage. It will further the scope of collaboration and also pave the way for regular political exchanges at a higher level,” he said.

He also said he wants the CARICOM and India to work together on climate change, and expressed his sympathy over the death of more than 2,000 Indians as a result of the ongoing unusual heat wave.—Xinhua

Singapore offers Indonesia aid to combat transboundary haze

SINGAPORE, 3 June — Singapore is renewing its offer of assistance to Indonesia to fight against land and forest fires which could lead to transboundary haze, the Ministry of the Environment and Water Resources said on Wednesday.

In the new package, Singapore will deploy one C-130 aircraft for cloud seeding operations; up to two C-130 aircraft to ferry a fire-fighting assistance team

from the Singapore Civil Defence Force (SCDF); a team from SCDF to provide assessment and planning assistance to Indonesian counterparts in their fire-fighting efforts as well as a Chinook helicopter with one SCDF water bucket for aerial fire-fighting.

The new package is the same as last year, local media said.

The Ministry of the Environment and Water Resources said the government

has been offering assistance packages to the Indonesian government from June to October since 2005 to work with its neighbours to fight against possible land and forest fires, adding that the El Nino phenomenon this year may cause drier weather, which could exacerbate the impact of transboundary haze.

Singapore has been suffering from transboundary haze for decades, with the city-state's air pollution

index soared to a record high in June 2013. The haze was mainly caused by forest fires in neighbouring Indonesia.

To combat the air pollution, Singapore has rolled out the Transboundary Haze Pollution Bill last year, saying that companies that cause haze in Singapore by setting fires on their land will face a maximum fine of up to 2 million Singapore dollars (1.61 million US dollars).—Xinhua

Beijing's largest coal-fired boiler house retired

BEIJING, 3 June — The largest coal-fired boiler house in urban Beijing was shut down on Tuesday, as part of the government's plan to cut pollution in the capital city.

The boiler house, which has four boilers with a total capacity of 80 tons of vapor per hour, accounts for over a fifth of the total coal-fired boiler capacity in

urban Beijing and provides heating for a rail equipment manufacturing company and 20,000 local residents.

The boiler house, located near the famous Marco Polo bridge in Fengtai District, will be replaced with three gas-fired boilers before November, when the city's centrally controlled heating is turned on for the winter.

The boiler house used 40,000 tons of coal and emitted 54 tons of sulfur dioxide, 57 tons of nitric oxide, 45 tons of dust and 1 ton of volatile organic compounds per year.

Beijing plans to close all coal-fired boilers in urban areas by the end of this year, according to a government work plan released in April.

Of the four major coal-fired power plants in Beijing, three have been closed so far and the last is scheduled to be closed next year. They will be replaced with four gas-fired power plants.

Beijing is aiming to limit annual coal consumption to 15 million tons in 2015 and 10 million tons in 2017.—Xinhua

Indonesia raises volcano status to top alert over increasing activity

JAKARTA, 3 June — Indonesian authorities have raised the alert status of a volcano on Sumatra Island to the highest level due to its increasing activity that may lead to a major eruption, the country's volcanology agency said on Wednesday.

In a Press statement, the Volcanology and Geo-

logical Disaster Mitigation Agency based in the West Java provincial capital of Bandung said that in the past two days, the activity of Mt Sinabung in North Sumatra Province has continued to increase drastically.

The agency said the lava dome has reached more than 3 million cu-

bic metres in volume and has been unstable. “The continuous growth of the lava dome will potentially cause lava flows and hot clouds that threaten the southern and southeastern areas on the slopes of the volcano,” it said.

“Based on visual monitoring and potential danger of Mt Sinabung, the status of the volcano has been raised from Level 3 to Level 4 from 11 pm on Tuesday,” it added.

In a related development, Sutopo Purwo Nugroho, spokesman of the Jakar-

ta-based National Disaster Mitigation Agency, said the agency has recommended the evacuation of residents living within a radius of 7 kilometres from the dome and the relocation of those living in seven villages on the slopes of the volcano.

Sutopo said coordination has been done with related institutions to deal with possible situations that may happen if the volcano erupts.

The 2,460-metre volcano has continuously erupted since September 2013. In February 2014, 16 people were killed from an eruption just after evacuated residents had been allowed to return home due to decreasing scope of eruption.

Japanese Diet enacts law to fully privatize JR Kyushu

TOKYO, 3 June — Japan's Diet on Wednesday enacted a law to fully privatize Kyushu Railway Co that serves Japan's southwestern main island.

The House of Councillors, or the upper house, passed a bill to revise the 1986 law governing Japan Railways companies following its approval by the House of Representatives last month.

Kyushu Railway, known as JR Kyushu, was established through the breakup of the deficit-ridden state-run Japanese National Railways into one freight railway and six passenger operators in April 1987.

The government earlier decided to privatize JR Kyushu, judging that it has come to secure stable business results in the fields of real estate and hotels, although it is still struggling in the railway business.

The government is considering listing the stock of JR Kyushu in fiscal 2016 starting in April next year.

JR Kyushu, which operates the Kyushu Shinkansen bullet train service, will be the fourth JR group company to be fully privatized following East Japan Railway Co, known as JR East, Central Japan Railway Co or JR Central, and West Japan Railway

Co or JR West.

Under the revised law, JR Kyushu is allowed to use some 387.7 billion yen (\$3.1 billion) in management stabilization funds previously received from the government.

The funds will be used for such purposes as payment of facility usage fees

for the Kyushu Shinkansen and repayment of borrowings.

The revised law also allows JR Kyushu not to seek government approval of its business plans, the selection of executives and long-term loans from financial institutions.

Police serve man with new arrest warrant over Tokyo drone case

TOKYO, 3 June — Tokyo police served a 40-year-old man with a fresh arrest warrant on Wednesday on suspicion of illegally modifying warning flares mounted on a drone which he flew onto the roof of the prime minister's office in April.

The man, Yasuo Yamamoto, was earlier indicted on a charge of ob-

structing work at the prime minister's office over the drone incident.

Yamamoto, a former Air Self-Defence Force member, is alleged to have maneuvered the drone during predawn hours on 9 April to the roof. The drone was found on 22 April before he turned himself in to police on 24 April. He was

indicted on 15 May.

The drone was mounted with two modified warning flares as well as a small camera and a plastic container including sand contaminated with radioactive cesium, according to the police.

The warning flares had no trace of having been fired.—*Kyodo News*

S Korea fires ballistic missile capable of hitting entire N Korea

SEOUL, 3 June — South Korean President Park Geun-hye on Wednesday watched the flight test of a guided ballistic missile capable of striking anywhere in North Korea, according to South Korea's presidential office.

"The Agency for Defence Development technically proved through this flight test the improved capability of a ballistic missile capable of swiftly striking any place in the entire North

Korea with accuracy in case of North Korea's military attack or provocation," it said in a statement.

The flight test was held at Taean, South Chungcheong Province, on South Korea's west coast.

The statement did not provide details on the flight test, but domestic media reported the missile has a range of at least 500 kilometres. In recent years, North Korea has heightened tensions in the region with

ballistic missile tests and rocket firings. North Korea said last month that its long-range missiles have now acquired the highest accuracy rate and it has already succeeded in miniaturizing nuclear warheads.

On 9 May, North Korea announced for the first time that it had successfully test-fired a ballistic missile from a submarine, saying the missile was a newly developed one.

N Korea refuses to rejoin 6-party nuclear talks

SEOUL, 3 June — North Korea has refused to rejoin the long-stalled six-party talks aimed at achieving its denuclearization, South Korean media reported on Wednesday, citing a German lawmaker who met with top North Korean officials earlier this week.

"North Korean officials mainly cited the US' attitude as the reason and

said they would not sit at the table for six-party talks," Hartmut Koschik, head of the German-North Korean friendship association, said in an interview with *Yonhap News Agency* on Tuesday.

He visited North Korea for five days through Monday before coming to South Korea on a tour of Asia. In Pyongyang, Ko-

schyk met with top North Korean officials, including Kim Jong Nam, president of the Presidium of the Supreme People's Assembly, and Vice Foreign Minister Kung Sok Ung.

"In our meetings with them, we got the impression that we are faced with a firm position," he was quoted as saying.

Relatives, politicians call on Iran to free detained Americans

WASHINGTON, 3 June — A senior US congressman on Tuesday accused the Iranian government of spitting in America's face by holding US citizens while negotiating an end to sanctions in return for curbing its nuclear programme.

At a House of Representatives committee hearing, relatives of three detained Americans, Saeed Abedini, Amir Hekmati and *Washington Post* reporter Jason Rezaian, said they should not be forgotten in the effort to seal a nuclear deal with Iran by a 30 June deadline.

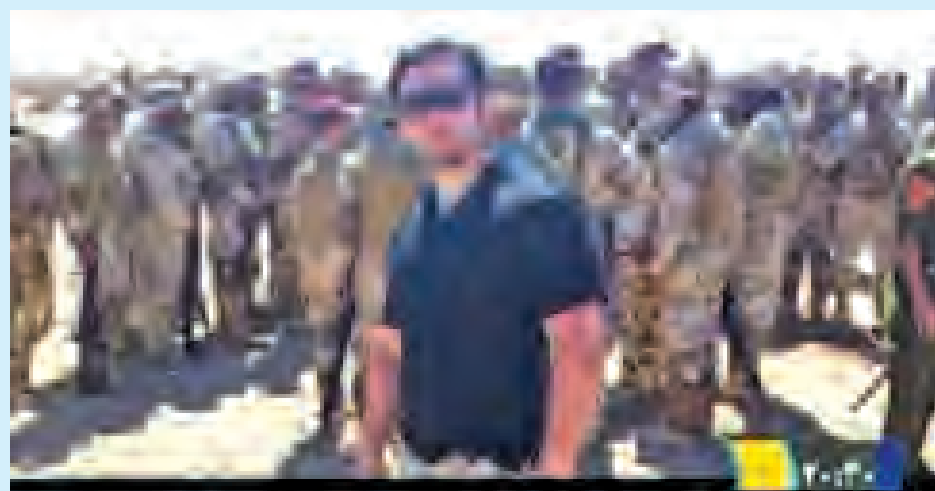
The House Foreign Affairs Committee passed a resolution calling on Iran to immediately release the three and to provide information about Robert Lev-

inson, an American missing in Iran since 2007. Committee Chairman Ed Royce, a Republican, said the detentions showed Iran's "contempt" for the United States.

"If top Iranian officials cannot be counted on to assist these wrongfully jailed Americans, can they be counted on to honour the commitments they make at the negotiating table?" he asked.

Eliot Engel, the senior committee Democrat, said that while the cases should not be tied in with the nuclear talks, it would be "ludicrous and outrageous" to have a deal with Iran that did not include freeing the Americans.

"I feel so angry that at a time when we are sitting with Iran ... to discuss a new arrangement between our

two countries ... they continue to poke us in the eye and continue to spit in our face," Engel said.

This was especially so given what he called the on-

going "show trial" on espionage charges the *Washington Post's* Jason Rezaian, he said. Sarah Hekmati, whose brother Amir, a former US Marine, was arrested in Au-

gust 2011 while visiting his grandmother in Teheran, said her father was suffering from terminal brain cancer and had several strokes in the last year.

"Our father holds on hoping to hold Amir in his arms again, but fearful that he will not," she said. Amir Hekmati was convicted of spying for the Central Intelligence Agency, a charge relatives and Washington deny.

Current and former US officials have acknowledged that Levinson was a source for the CIA when he disappeared in 2007 from Kish Island, an Iranian resort in the Gulf. Abedini, an Iranian-American Christian pastor, was sentenced to eight years in prison in 2013 on charges of undermining Iran's national security by setting up home-based Christian churches in Iran.

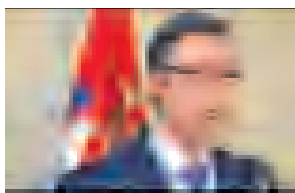

WASHINGTON / BELGRADE, 3 June — Serbian Prime Minister Aleksandar Vucic stated after Tuesday's meetings with managers of several US companies that their interest in investing contributes to the acceleration of Serbia's EU integration process and greater political support of the US.

The prime minister conferred with representatives of General Electric on cooperation in the fields of energy, health care, transport and airline industry, reads a statement issued by the Serbian government's press office.

Karan Bhatia, General Electric vice president in charge of internation-

Burnham said it was necessary to heed the lessons of last year's Scottish independence referendum, when Labour joined forces with the Conservatives and Liberal Democrats to campaign against Scotland becoming an independent country.

The decision to campaign alongside other parties alienated some of Labour's core voters in Scotland and is seen as a factor behind the rise of the Scottish National Party, which took 40 previously Labour-held seats at the election.

Labour is due to announce its new leader on 12 September.—Reuters

Richard Levaille, the company's vice president for global exploration, underlined that the company wants to give an example of a successful foreign investment in Serbia.—Tanjug

Obama signs bill reforming surveillance programme

WASHINGTON, 3 June — President Barack Obama signed into law on Tuesday legislation passed by Congress earlier in the day reforming a government surveillance programme that swept up millions of Americans' telephone records.

Reversing security policy in place since shortly after the 11 September, 2001 attacks, the bill ends a system exposed by former National Security Agency contractor Edward Snowden. The spy agency collected and searched records of phone calls looking for terrorism leads but was not allowed to listen to their content.

Passage of the USA Freedom Act, the result of an alliance between Senate Democrats and some of the chamber's most conservative Republicans, was a victory for Obama, a Democrat, and a setback for Senate Republican Majority Leader Mitch McConnell.

After the Senate voted 67-32 on Tuesday to give

final congressional approval to the bill, Obama used his Twitter account, @POTUS, to say he was glad it had passed. "I'll sign it as soon as I get it," the tweet said.

Before voting, senators defeated three amendments proposed by Republican leaders after they reversed themselves and ended efforts to block it. The House of Representatives passed the measure overwhelmingly last month.

In the end, 23 Senate Republicans voted for the Freedom Act, joining 196 who backed it in the House. In a rift between Republicans, who control both chambers, House leaders had warned that amendments proposed by McConnell would be a "challenge" for the House that could delay the bill.

A federal appeals court on 7 May ruled the collection of "metadata" illegal.

The new law would require companies such as Verizon Communications Inc and AT&T Inc, to collect

and store telephone records the same way that they do now for billing purposes.

But instead of routinely feeding US intelligence agencies such data, the companies would be required to turn it over only in response to a government request approved by the secretive Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Court.

The Freedom Act is the first major legislative reform

of US surveillance since Snowden's revelations two years ago this month led to debate over how to balance Americans' distrust of intrusive government with fears of terrorist attacks.

Along with the phone records programme, two other domestic surveillance programs authorized under the 2001 USA Patriot Act have been shut down since Sunday.—Reuters

Canada says no danger posed by US anthrax shipment

OTTAWA, 3 June — The Canadian government confirmed on Tuesday that it received an anthrax sample kit from the US Department of Defence that might have contained live bacterium, but it said there were no reported illnesses.

In a statement, the

Public Health Agency of Canada said it received the sample in August 2006, but that it had not been used for over five years and was relocated to a secure laboratory.

Live anthrax samples were shipped to three laboratories in Canada by a

US military lab, USA Today reported on Monday, following disclosures last week that samples of the bacteria were mistakenly sent to 11 US states and two other countries.

The newspaper cited two Defence Department officials as saying the sam-

ples sent to Canada came from the Dugway Proving Ground in Utah, where the other samples appear to trace back to as well. It is one of the US military labs responsible for inactivation and shipping of biological material.

Greece will not pay IMF on Friday without prospect of a deal — lawmaker

ATHENS, 3 June — Greece will not make a 5 June repayment to the International Monetary Fund if there is no prospect of an aid-for-reforms deal with its international creditors soon, the spokesman for the ruling Syriza party said on Wednesday.

The payment of 300 million euros (218 million pounds) is the first of four this month totalling 1.6 billion euros from a country that depends on foreign aid to stay afloat.

Greece owes a total of about 320 billion euros, of which about 65 percent to euro zone governments and the IMF, and about 8.7 percent to the European Central Bank.

On Tuesday, Greece's creditors drafted the broad outlines of an agreement to put to the leftist government in Athens in a bid to conclude four months of negotiations and release aid

before the country runs out of money.

"If there is no prospect of a deal by Friday or Monday, I don't know by when exactly, we will not pay," Nikos Filis told Mega TV.

Greek Prime Minister Alexis Tsipras heads to Brussels on Wednesday to meet European Commission President Jean-Claude Juncker.

Tsipras, who has vowed not to surrender to more austerity, tried to preempt a take-it-or-leave-it offer by the creditors, sending what he called a comprehensive reform proposal to Brussels on Monday.

A Syriza European Parliament lawmaker said the government's 47-page proposal would be a good basis for discussion at a meeting of euro zone deputy finance ministers in the so-called EuroWorking Group which would convene on Wednesday.

"If the lenders show the same realism that the Greek government and the Greek Prime Minister is showing, then we can have a deal in principle by Friday or before Friday," Dimitris Papadimoulis told Antenna TV.

He said this could turn into a comprehensive deal next week.

"But right now there

is no deal, there is convergence," he said.

Deputy social security minister Dimitris Stratoulis said a deal with lenders would have to respect the government's commitments. "The agreement will either be compatible with Syriza's policy pledges, the core, or there will not be a deal," he told Antenna TV.

Syrian insurgent advances put Assad under pressure

BEIRUT, 3 June — Steady advances by insurgents on key fronts in Syria mean President Bashar al-Assad is under more military pressure than at any point in the four-year-old war. Losses in the north, east and south to groups including al-Qaeda's Syr-

ian arm and Islamic State may test Assad's hold over western parts of the country that are the most crucial to his survival.

After his loss of Palmyra, a symbolic and militarily strategic city, and nearly all of Idlib Province, he appears to be circling

his wagons more closely to a western region that includes Damascus, Homs, Hama and the coast.

Sources familiar with the thinking in Damascus acknowledge that pressure is growing but say the government is confident the army can defend crucial

territory with the help of its allies.

Assad still controls areas in more far-flung parts of Syria, but these are dwindling in number. His decision to maintain forces in places such as in Deir al-Zor, Hasaka and Aleppo suggests he still wants to preserve a nationwide presence, rejecting Syria's de facto partition.

Sources familiar with the government's thinking say Assad is confident about standing his ground: extra support is expected from Iran, his strongest ally, which said on Tuesday it would continue to stand by Syria. The Lebanese group Hezbollah, which is backed by Iran, is more widely deployed in Syria than ever.

And Assad still believes the West will eventually rehabilitate him as a partner in the fight against Islamic State — a shift that shows no sign of happening but which he thinks is inevitable given the risk of

a full jihadist takeover.

"The summer will be tough on the ground, but red lines will not be breached," said one source familiar with the thinking in Damascus, declining to be named because he was discussing private conversations with Syrian officials. Assad has survived such pressure before, notably at the end of 2012 when the West thought his government was near collapse. But the difference now is that the insurgents have grown in strength while government forces have been weakened after more than four years of fighting.

Assad has also lost Iraqi Shi'ite militiamen who had been fighting alongside Syrian forces. They went home to fight Islamic State after it captured Mosul and other Iraqi cities last June. The sudden advances also added to the military pressures facing Iran both in Syria and Iraq.

Insurgent groups in the north and south of Syria

have emerged as the war's most dynamic force in the past two months. They are better organized and armed than before and are believed to have received new support from Assad's regional enemies.

"Clearly the trends right now are working against the regime, but it appears the regime's backers — and Iran in particular — may increase their support in an attempt to reverse those trends," said Noah Bonsey, senior analyst with the International Crisis Group thinktank.

"It is too early to tell what such an escalation could achieve," he said. "The regime is still seeking to maintain as much of its geographic reach as it can."

Lebanon's *As-Safir* newspaper on Tuesday said more than 20,000 Iraqi, Iranian and Lebanese fighters had entered Idlib Province in readiness for a counter attack. *Reuters* was not able to independently verify the report.—*Reuters*

Palestinian NGO denies Hamas ties, threatens Israel with legal action

UNITED NATIONS, 3 June — The British-based Palestinian Return Centre on Tuesday threatened Israel's UN mission with legal action after the Jewish state accused it of having ties to the Palestinian militant group Hamas, an allegation the group said was false.

The Israeli accusations came after a United Nations committee that oversees non-governmental organizations voted to approve UN accreditation for the PRC, which Israel's mission said was not only linked to Hamas but promoted "anti-Israel propaganda in Europe."

"We announce that PRC is considering legal action against the Israeli delegation at the UN," the group said in a statement circulated to the 19-member UN Committee on Non-Governmental Organizations. "Such allegations and defamation

where we are described as terrorist and affiliated to Hamas are dangerous, baseless and will have negative ramifications on our work and members," the group added. On Monday, the mission said Israel had banned the PRC in 2010 because of its ties to Hamas, labelling it "an organizational and coordinating wing of Hamas in Europe" with members that include senior Hamas officials. The Israeli mission responded to the group's announcement by saying its statement still applied.

Hamas said in a statement that its deputy chief, Ismail Haniyeh, phoned PRC Chairman Majed Al-Zeer to congratulate him on the successful UN vote. But Sameh Habeeb, a spokesman for PRC, denied the conversation took place.

The PRC operates as a legal entity in Britain.

The British mission did not react to Monday's vote in the UN NGO committee. The United States and European Union have designated Hamas, the de facto authority of the Gaza Strip, a terrorist organization.

The internationally recognized Palestinian Authority controls the West Bank. The PRC statement said the Israeli allegations had no credence and were solely based on Israeli intelligence and other sources from within Israel. It added that there was no corroborating evidence from a third country.

The PRC said it would soon send an official letter of protest to UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon and the 54 member states of the UN Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC), which has final say on NGO-related matters.—

IS expansion result of US invasion of Iraq: experts

CAIRO, 3 June— The 2003 US invasion of Iraq was a main reason for the expansion of the Islamic State (IS) militant group as well as the general chaotic situation in the Middle East region, said Egyptian political experts.

On Tuesday, the 24-nation, US-led coalition against IS held a summit in Paris to see how to help Iraq to take on the militant group after the fall of strategic city of Ramadi and the IS alarming expansion in the region.

Talking to reporters ahead of the meeting, Iraqi Prime Minister Haider al-Abadi lamented that Iraq is not getting enough support from the coalition, adding that the Islamic State's gains in his turmoil-stricken country showed a "failure" on the

part of the whole world.

"The US invasion of Iraq led to this result and IS expanded and controlled more land, causing regional chaos and making Iraq and other Arab states tremble," said Saeed al-Lawindi, political researcher and expert at Cairo-based Al-Ahram Centre. After more than 4,000 anti-IS airstrikes in less than one year, the expert sees it "illogical" that a Western-led coalition of big powers cannot defeat a small terrorist group, "as if this group is a big power itself." During the meeting in the French capital city, French Prime Minister Laurent Fabius said that the coalition realizes that it faces "a long-term battle," while the Iraqi leader asked the world for support against the IS militants messing with his country.

"The United States sees IS as a scary tool for Arab states that would always refer to Uncle Sam for protection and purchase more US weapons," Lawindi told *Xinhua*, expressing belief that the presence of IS is in favour of the West in general and the United States in particular. "Rather, it would be also in favour of the United States to have conflicts between the Sunnis and the Shiites in the Middle East region," the expert added. He cited that the United States hailed an initial deal with Iran regarding its nuclear activities as "historical," although it raised concerns of most Sunni states in the region and that the recent US-Gulf summit in Camp David ended up with nothing but a US weapon deal offer.—*Xinhua*

28 paramilitaries killed in car bombings in Iraq's Baiji

TIKRIT, (Iraq), 3 June — Car bomb attacks killed at least 28 government-backed militiamen and wounded 36 others in Iraq on Tuesday, a security source said.

The casualties were inflicted by four suicide

car bomb attacks on the edge of the IS-held town of Baiji in Iraq's northern central province of Salahudin.

The suicide attacks occurred on the edge of Baiji, some 200 km north of the Iraqi capital Baghdad, as the Iraqi security

forces and allied militias, known as Hashd Shaabi, or Popular Mobilization, were advancing to recapture the IS-seized town, the source said on condition of anonymity.

The powerful blasts stopped the advance of the troops and allied militias,

while heavy clashes continued, the source said.

The battles in Baiji came two days after the town's mayor, Mohammed Hamed, told *Xinhua* that the troops freed several villages outside the town and were preparing to launch an offensive to

recapture it.

Since 2 March, some 30,000 Iraqi troops and thousands of allied Shiite and Sunni militias have involved in Iraq's biggest offensive to recapture the northern part of Salahudin Province, including Tikrit and other key towns and

villages, from IS militants.

The security situation in Iraq has drastically deteriorated since last June, when bloody clashes broke out between Iraqi security forces and IS militants.

**Liquefied stimulant drugs shipped to
Japan disguised as sesame oil**

TOKYO, 3 June — Around 8 kilograms of liquefied stimulant drugs were found hidden in 40 bottles of hot sesame oil shipped by air to Japan from Hong Kong last September, police said on Wednesday.

The liquefied drugs were dyed red, similar to the colour of hot sesame oil, and shipped by express mail to Narita International

Airport near Tokyo. When synthesized into powder, they have a street value of 700 million yen (\$5.6 million), the police said.

Police have searched a Taiwanese restaurant in Tokyo's Shinjuku Ward, which was the shipping address, among other places.

They also arrested a 59-year-old Chinese man, Zhang Kai, for allegedly

producing some 190 grams of stimulant drugs at his home in Shinjuku between February 2012 and last November, and suspect his involvement in the smuggling of the liquefied stimulants.

Police said they confiscated a manual for manufacturing drugs from his home. Zhang has denied producing drugs, they said.—*Kyodo News*

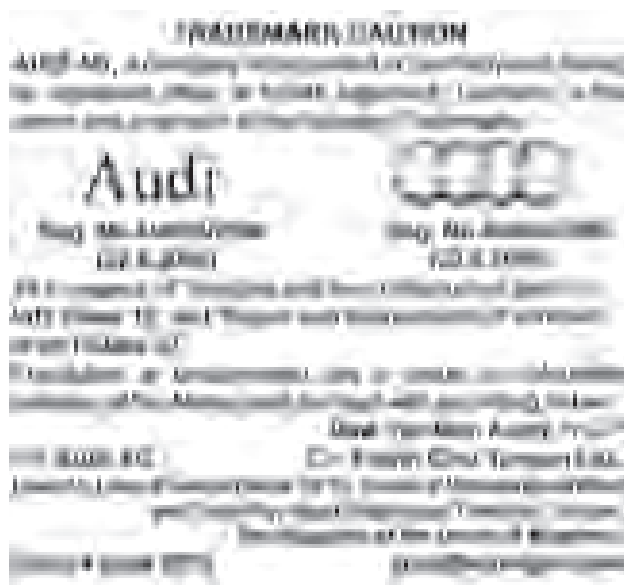

LOS ANGELES, 3 June — The pool parties, glamorous girls and fast cars of "Entourage" are back in a movie spinoff of the hit HBO show.

Entourage, due in US theatres on Wednesday, revisits the bromance between a group of friends from Queens, New York, who become high-flying Hollywood power players.

"The theme of friendship is universal and really doesn't change," said Entourage creator and director Doug Ellin. "But Hollywood, the players, where the money moves, obviously shifted."

Four years after the HBO show concluded with eight seasons, Entourage returns with movie star Vince Chase (Adrian Grenier), whose ambitions have now turned to directing.

This allows the film to explore the behind-the-scenes world of movie-making, especially the challenges of financing, as Vince's posse struggles to produce a \$100 million remake of "Dr Jekyll and Mr

Hyde."

The film is meant to act as a standalone to the series, with the hopes of drawing new fans, Ellin said.

Despite that he has received many awards during his career, this one was special because it was attributed by foreign journalists who "spoke heartily" of Portugal, the artist said.

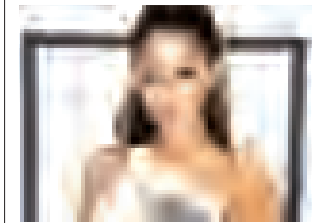
Carlos do Carmo, 75, made history last year when he became the first Portuguese artist to have won a Grammy by the Latin Recording Company.

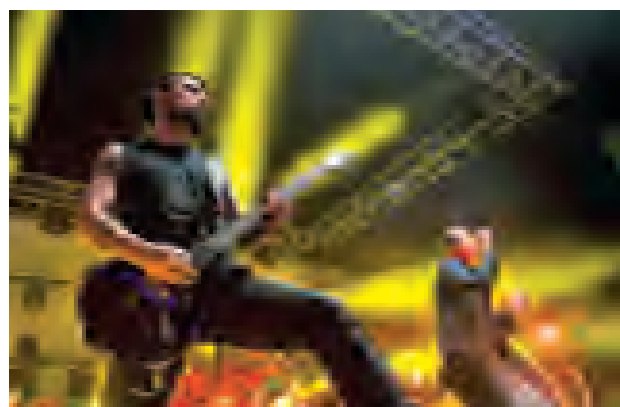
Kim Kardashian's dress catches on fire at CFDA Awards

Spanish restaurant tops world's best

Tsonga, Wawrinka prevail but Federer's gone with the wind

PARIS, 3 June — Swirling winds caused mayhem and chaos at Roland Garros on Tuesday but Jo Wilfried Tsonga and Stan Wawrinka emerged unscathed to set up a French Open semi-final. On a day when Wawrinka would have hoped to bask in the glory of beating his celebrated rival Roger Federer 6-4, 6-3, 7-6(4) for the first time on a grand slam stage, it was a freak accident that set the claycourt major abuzz. Tsonga had whipped the delirious Court Philippe Chatrier crowd into a frenzy as he charged into a 6-1, 5-2 lead against Japan's Kei Nishikori when piercing screams were suddenly heard from high up in the stands. A large rectangular metal panel had fallen from underneath the TV commentary boxes, hitting spectators on the top row.

The incident even caught umpire Carlos Bernardes unaware, as he tried to resume the contest by calling for "Quiet Please" before he realised that everyone was distracted

by the mishap which left a silver-haired spectator and two others injured. As the stricken fans were led away by first-aiders, Tsonga and Nishikori were ushered off court for what turned out to be a 40-minute disruption, during which 12 rows of spectators were evacuated and the area cordoned off.

The unexpected break initially did nothing to stall Tsonga's momentum and he returned to finish off Nishikori in the second set.

But after the Japanese hero threatened to gate-crash the French party by roaring back in the next two sets, Tsonga sunk to his knees in triumph as he once again raised hopes of ending France's 32-year wait for a men's Roland Garros champion with a heart-pumping 6-1, 6-4, 4-6, 3-6, 6-3 victory.

The celebrations for Tsonga did not end there as he etched "ROLAND, JE T'AIME" into the red clay with his right shoe before collapsing on to his back to form the T in the message.

"You supported me. I will never forget it," he told the roaring crowd. Gusting winds also proved problematic in the two women's quarter-finals to take place on day 10 of the championships — but 2008 title winner Ana Ivanovic and Czech 13th seed Lucie Safarova weathered the conditions that periodically turned the courts into red dust bowls to set up a last four date.

For men's second seed Federer, however, hopes of a second French Open crown were gone with the wind as he was outplayed, outthought and outwitted by a rival he had beaten in every one of their previous four grand slam meetings.

Federer's wife Mirka hid her worried eyes behind dark shades and bit her nails ragged as the match neared its inevitable conclusion, with a forehand volley from Wawrinka killing off the 2009 champion's chances of adding to his 17 grand slam trophies.

"Many things... didn't

go well, but mostly it's because of Stan's quality of shot making, forehand, backhand, serving big when he had to," said the 33-year-old. "(The conditions) were tough. So it's impressive the way Stan was able to play." A day after knocking out 2014 champion Maria Sharapova, Safarova's excitement kept soaring as she stormed into her first Roland Garros semi-final with a 7-6(3), 6-3 win over Spain's Garbine Muguruza. "It's not easy because you have so many emotions going on... I couldn't really fall asleep yesterday, and then I woke up so early," said Safarova, who is bidding to become the first Czech to triumph in Paris since Hana Mandlikova in 1981.

"So I was a little tired in the morning. But the will to win and to be in the semi-finals was so big that once I stepped on the court I was just fighting and playing really well." Ivanovic's boyfriend, Bayern Munich midfielder Bastian Schweinsteiger, looked far more animated than his Serbian girlfriend when she completed a 6-3, 6-2 win over Ukraine's Elina Svitolina. Whooping and exchanging high-fives with the rest of Ivanovic's entourage in the player's box, Schweinsteiger stood up to give the seventh seed a standing ovation as she reached a grand slam semi for the first time since her 2008 Paris triumph.

Chimps have mental skills to cook: study

NEW YORK, 3 June — They're not likely to start barbecuing in the rainforest, but chimpanzees can understand the concept of cooking and are willing to postpone eating raw food, even carrying food some distance to cook it rather than eat immediately, scientists reported on Tuesday.

The findings, based on nine experiments conducted at the Tchimpounga Sanctuary in Republic of Congo and published in Proceedings of the Royal Society B, suggest that chimps have all the brainpower needed to cook, including planning, causal understanding, and ability to postpone gratification.

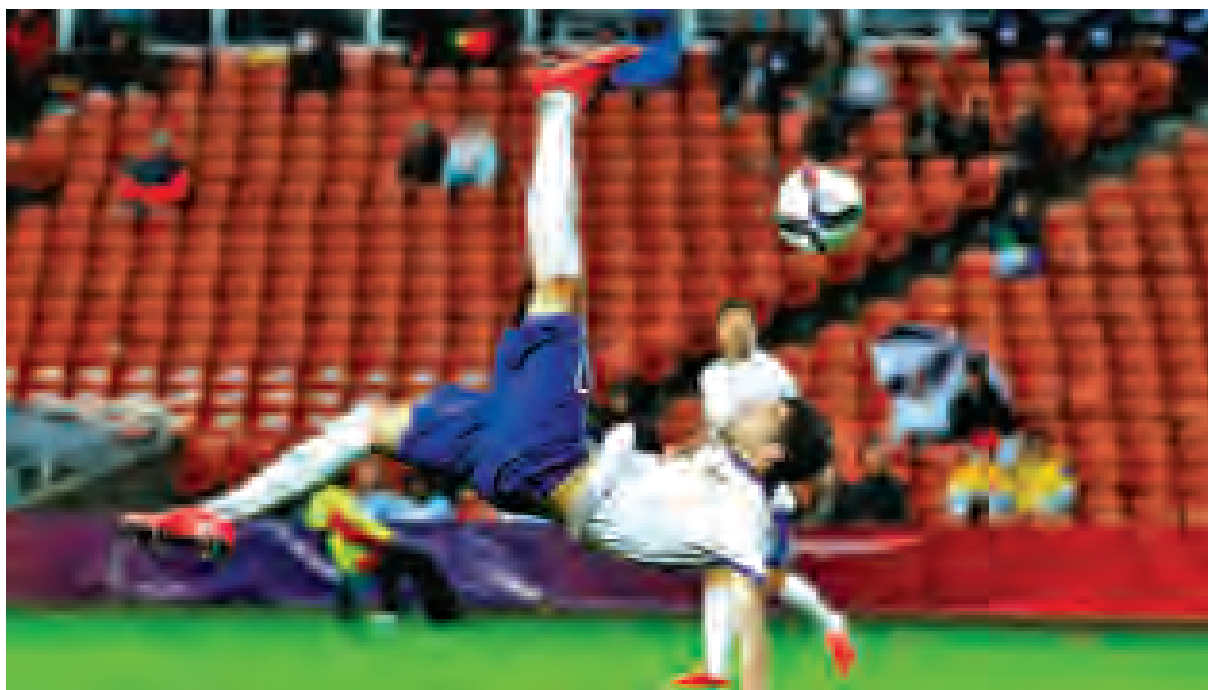
They do lack the ability to produce fire. But if they were given a source of heat, chimps "might be quite able

to manipulate (it) to cook," said developmental psychologist Felix Warneken of Harvard University, who conducted the study with Alexandra Rosati.

Whilst the finding may seem esoteric, it lends support to the idea that cooking accelerated human evolution. Cooked food is easier to digest, spurring the growth of large brains in our australopithecine ancestors, Harvard's Richard Wrangham proposed about a decade ago.

If chimps have the cognitive skills to cook, australopithecines likely did, too, said Wrangham, who was not involved in the study: "It suggests that with a little extra brainpower, australopithecines could indeed have found a way to use fire to cook food." —Reuters

Sweet 16 for rampant Portugal

HAMILTON, 3 June — Portugal have cruised through to the last 16 at New Zealand 2015 after a thumping 4-0 win over Qatar at Hamilton's Waikato Stadium.

Winger Ivo was the star of the show, scoring two and setting up another as Helio Sousa's side weathered a torrential downpour to comprehensively outclass the Asian champions. Qatar, who must now win their final Group C match to stand a chance of qualifying, rarely threatened, although they did carve out the first chance of the match.

That came in nine minutes when Portugal keeper Andre Moreira unconvincingly gathered at the second attempt after Ahmed Alsadi had raced through on to an accurate

long ball and shot weakly. Possession was dominated by the Europeans throughout but it took patience for their probing to pay off, with 34 minutes having elapsed before they took a deserved lead.

Andre Silva was the scorer, ghosting in unmarked to steer home an inch-perfect inswinging cross from Gelson Martins, who had drifted in cleverly from the right. It was a fine goal but nothing in comparison to the spectacular strike that doubled Portugal's lead soon after, as Ivo took centre stage.

Qatar's failure to clear their lines was punished in superb style, with the Victoria Guimaraes youngster adjusting his body to meet Chico Ramos's looping header and sending an acrobatic overhead kick beyond

the helpless Yousof Hassan. Ivo continued to shine as the match progressed and on 66 minutes doubled his tally, climbing powerfully at the back post to direct a downward header through the legs of Hassan.

And he wasn't done yet because, with 16 minutes remaining, the winger helped complete the rout with an impressive assist.

Nice skill, along with a little luck, took him past his marker on the right and his cutback was swept first-time into the roof of the Qatari net by substitute Joao Vigarario.

Portugal can now plan for the Round of 16, while Qatar know that only a win against Senegal on Saturday will maintain their slim hopes.—FIFA

United striker Van Persie keeping options open

AMSTERDAM, 3 June — Robin van Persie is keeping his options open over his future at Manchester United as he enters a final season of his contract with the club, Dutch media reported on Wednesday.

The striker returned from injury towards the end of the season but was no longer able to command a regular place in the team.

"The club must do its homework and so must I. It's a new situation," he told reporters in an interview with several Dutch newspapers ahead of Friday's friendly international between the Netherlands and the US in Amsterdam.

"I'm going to calmly and relaxed sit down and consider everything.

"I still have ambitions of playing every week. I feel top fit and I think I can still go on for several years. Take note of my words," said the 31-year-old, who moved to Old Trafford from Arsenal in 2012.

Van Persie said he should have had six or seven more goals than the tally of 10 he netted for the club last season.

"People don't accept that I just scored 10. Actually that's a compliment because they expect more of me on the basis of what I can do. I was the club's second highest goal scorer together with Juan Mata and behind Wayne Rooney (14 goals).

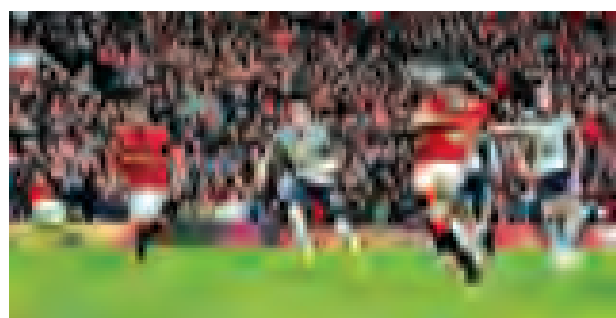
"It's not good that a top club like Manchester United does not have a scorer with

20 or more goals behind his name each season and that is why we only finished fourth."

Van Persie struggled with an ankle injury through the season, blaming a hectic pre-World Cup training programme, as he battled to get fit for Brazil, and then a lack

of a break after the tournament last summer.

"After I came back from injury I realised that I would not automatically get back in the starting line-up," he said. "But I didn't have a problem with that because they were playing well at the time.—Reuters

Blatter unconvincing, should go ASAP before next election: Tashima

TOKYO, 3 June — FIFA executive committee member Kozo Tashima said on Wednesday that he is not buying President Sepp Blatter's explanation for his resignation and that the leader of soccer's world governing body should consider stepping down before his successor is decided.

Hours after the about-face took place at FIFA headquarters in Zurich, Tashima said he was stunned by Blatter's announcement to quit amid a corruption scandal, just four days after he was re-elected to a fifth term.

But Tashima, who learned of the news as he watched the live broadcast of the French Open quarterfinal between Kei Nishikori and Jo-Wilfried Tsonga, is not convinced by Blatter's reasoning that he did not have the "mandate of the entire world of football."

Tashima also does not see why Blatter, now said to be a target of a federal US corruption investigation, has to stick around for the Extraordinary Congress, expected to take place in between December and March next year where the new president will be chosen.

"At the ExCo meeting (on Saturday), he spoke glowingly about how he had been given a new mandate and at the time, he looked like he was raring to go again," Tashima said. "But I'm shocked to see him change the way he has in the two days since, and I can't stop myself from asking what has happened."

"There were no charges against Mr Blatter himself, only rumors. But if there is something that's forced him to resign, he has an obligation to explain himself. He cannot be allowed to leave things as fuzzy as they are, and it's a kind of a farce now for the next six months or however long it takes to decide the new president."

"There's no reason for him to resign if there's nothing on him. But if there is something on him then you could make the argument that he shouldn't be allowed to stay on a moment longer."

"He said he's standing down because he didn't

have enough support within football, but he knew that before the voting took place and the situation certainly didn't change in the following day or two. So I need to know what went on."

Blatter should not be the only one having to offer an explanation, Tashima said. His right-hand man, secretary general Jerome Valcke, has been tied to a \$10 million transfer used as a bribe in the bid.

"Common sense dictates that it's just not normal for \$10 million to be switching hands the way it supposedly did," Tashima said. "If it is a fact that Mr Valcke did transfer \$10 million, then he needs to offer a thorough explanation."

Tashima expects Blatter's decision to have far-reaching consequences at the Asian Football Confederation, which backed Blatter at last week's Congress as a bloc although Australia withdrew its support at the last minute.

The AFC so far has only said that it is "closely monitoring the situation."

"I think there will be huge repercussions," Tashima said. "The top man of a massive organization like FIFA has quit in this fashion and two vice presidents are under investigation."

"It remains to be seen how things will unfold but one thing is clear: that we are starting to see factual evidence of corruption in the organization."
