## Low pressure over West Central Bay of Bengal can intensify into storm within 24 hrs

Yangon, 19 June — According to observation at 6.30 pm Friday, a low pressure zone over West Central Bay of Bengal can intensity into a small storm within 24 hours, bringing strong winds and rough seas especially along and off Rakhine and Ayeyawady coasts, said Meteorology and Hydrology Department.

In the announcement of the department Friday, the weather bureau has warned fishing boats and vessels to be alert to rough seas due to the stronger monsoon caused by the lower pressure zone.


Due to the low pressure, squalls with rough seas can occur occasionally off and along Myanmar coasts, with surface wind speed reaching 40 miles per hour, the announcement said. Meanwhile, Dr Tun Lwin, the prominent weather expert of Myanmar and former director-general of the Meteorology and Hydrology Department, forecasts that waves can reach 15 to 20 ft of high with surface wind of 35 to 40 miles per hour due to the low pressure zone.


Meanwhile, the monsoon is strong to vigorous in the Andaman Sea and Bay of Bengal, the weather bureau said.

Rain or thundershowers will be isolated in lower Sagaing, Mandalay and Magway regions, scattered in Kayah State, fairly widespread in Bago and Ayayarwady Regions, Shan and Rakhine States and widespread in the remaining regions and states on Saturday.

The weather bureau forecasts that isolated heavy fall is expected over Mon State on Saturday, with 80 percent degree of certainty.— *GNLM*

To officially hand over 37 persons from rest of the said boat people, the flag meeting followed by handing over ceremony was held in the afternoon of 19 June 2015, in Taung Pyo (Let We) nearby the friendship bridge between Myanmar and Bangladesh.
- 2. At the said event, Deputy Director U Saw Naing, Maungtaw District Immigration Officer, and acting Police Colonel Kyaw Tay Za from Myanmar and the Consul from the Bangladeshi Consulate in Sittway, the Commanding Officer of No 17 Border Guard Battalion of Cox's Bazar, a representative from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, two representatives from the Border Guard Battalion from Bangladesh were presence as special guests and observers. U Tun Tun, Assistance Director and Deputy District Immigration Officer, handed over (37) Bangladeshi nationals to Major Inmara, Deputy Commanding Officer of No 17 Border Guard Battalion, and they proceeded to Bangladesh accordingly.
- 3. Myanmar and Bangladeshi authorities have continued verifying remaining (13) persons, the rest of the 200 boat people, and over 700 boat people who were rescued on 21 and 29 May 2015, respectively. They will be handed over to the country of origin after completion of the verification process.

St. Petersburg, 19 June— The forum's theme reflects the challenges facing the global financial system and current integration processes and collaboration between oil, gas and energy industries, Vice President U Nyan Tun on Friday told the 19th St. Petersburg International Economic Forum under the theme "Time to Act: Shared Paths to Stability and Growth".

He expressed his belief that the forum will come up with an engaging platform for pressing issues of global economic downturn, financial instability, integration processes of international trade, infrastructural projects and geopolitics.

Myanmar has become a new economic hub of Asia as the country is sand-

"Currently, necessary preparations for the survey are being made by the NNC.



### Villagers tap natural spring to ensure water supply



### Thailand took four days to confirm first MERS case; scores monitored

BANGKOK, 19 June — Thai authorities took nearly four days to confirm the country's first case of Middle East Respiratory Syndrome (MERS), the health ministry said on Friday, a time lag likely to raise fears of a further spread of the deadly virus in Asia.

Thailand confirmed its first case of MERS on Thursday, a 75-year-old business-

man from Oman, just as an outbreak in South Korea that began last month and has infected 166 people, and killed 24 of them, appeared to be levelling off.

The infected man arrived in the Thai capital, Bangkok, on Monday on an Oman Air flight for medical treatment for a heart ailment at a private hospital.

Public Health Minister

Rajata Rajatanavin declined to identify the hospital and said the patient had been put in quarantine at an infectious diseases institute in Bangkok on Thursday. "It took about four days to diagnose this case and two lab tests," Rajata told *Reuters*.

Authorities wanted to monitor all 106 people on board the man's flight, he said, though it was not clear how everyone could be traced. Among those being monitored were the man's two sons, who were considered at high risk because of their proximity to their father. The two had been tested and results were due later on Friday, Rajata said.

Most of those under observation had been told to stay at home for 14 days.

The Thai case will compound fears in Asia of a repeat of a 2002-2003 outbreak of Severe Acute

Respiratory Syndrome (SA-RIS), which began in China and killed about 800 people globally. Shares in Thai aviation companies and hotels fell on Friday with hotel operator Central Plaza Hotel (CENTEL.BK) plunging 6.6 percent. Airports operator Airports of Thailand (AOT. BK) dropped 4.2 percent to a more than three-week low.

MERS was first identified in humans in Saudi Arabia in 2012 and the majority of cases have been in the Middle East.

Isolated cases have cropped up in Asia before South Korea's outbreak began last month, and Thailand is the fourth Asian country to register a case.

China has had one case recently, that of a South Korean man who travelled to China via Hong Kong despite authorities suggesting he stay in voluntary quaran-

tine at home. South Korea's outbreak, the largest outside Saudi Arabia, has been traced to a 68-year-old man who returned from a business trip to the Middle East in early May. It has spread through hospitals with all of its infections known to have occurred in healthcare facilities. The outbreak in South Korea appeared to have peaked, with just one new case reported on Friday and the number of people in quarantine down 12 percent to 5,930, though authorities were taking no chances.

"Given the current developments, we have judged that it has levelled off, but we need to watch further spread, further cases from so-called intensive control hospitals," the South Korean health ministry's chief policy official, Kwan Deok-cheol, told a briefing in Seoul.

As part of those ef-

### **Hijacked Orkim Harmony** tanker released, pirates escape

Kuala Lumpur, 19 June The hijacked oil tanker Orkim Harmony has been released by pirates, who fled in the ship's rescue boat, Malaysian navy and maritime officials said on Friday.

The Orkim Harmony, hijacked on 11 June off the Malaysian coast by pirates reportedly armed with pistols and machetes, was now being escorted by the navy to Malaysia's Kuantan Port.

Officials said only one member of the 22 crew was injured, suffering a gunshot wound to the thigh. Three Malaysian navy ships and two aircraft were hunting the fleeing pirates. The hijacking is the second seizure of a tanker by pirates in Southeast Asia this month, raising further concerns over piracy in the region. The 7,300 deadweight tonne (DWT) Orkim Harmony was hijacked about 30 nautical miles from the Malaysian port of Tanjung Sedili carrying around 50,000 barrels of RON95 gasoline. The Malaysia Maritime Enforcement Agency (MMEA) said the gasoline on the ship was owned by state-controlled oil and gas company Petronas.

The Orkim Harmony

is operated by Malaysia's Orkim Ship Management. On board is a crew of 22, including 16 Malaysians, five Indonesians and one Myanmar national. After the tanker was hijacked, the pirates repainted the ship and changed the name to Kim Harmon. Malaysia's Chief of Navy Admiral Abdul Aziz Jaafar says eight pirates were involved. The Malaysian naval vessel shadowing the tanker in Vietnamese waters on Thursday was trying to persuade the hijackers to surrender, says Jaafar.

Early on Friday, Malaysia said the hijacked ship was still being shadowed by a navy ship and had been redirected to Indonesia's Natuna Island, where it was expected to arrive on Saturday.

A subsequent MMEA report said the pirates had fled the ship. Earlier this month, a 7,100 DWT oil tanker, Orkim Victory, carrying diesel loaded from Petronas was hijacked on 4 June in the same area and on the same route. The Orkim Victory was later released by the hijackers after about 770 metric tonnes (6,000 barrels) of its cargo had been siphoned off.—Reuters

### South Korea MERS outbreak has 'levelled off'; one new case

outbreak of Middle East Respiratory Syndrome (MERS) in South Korea appears to have levelled off, a health official said on Friday, as the country reported just one new patient, a day after Thailand reported its first case.

A total of 166 people have been infected in the South Korean outbreak, the largest outside Saudi Arabia. It has been traced to a 68-year-old man who returned from a business trip to the Middle East in early May.

It has spread through hospitals, killing 24 people.

The Thai case, a 75-year-old businessman from Oman, does not appear to be linked to the South Korean outbreak

MERS was first identified in humans in Saudi Arabia in 2012 and the majority of cases have been in the Middle East.

Isolated cases have cropped up in Asia before

South Korea's outbreak began last month, and Thailand is the fourth Asian country to register a case.

The current cases in Asia have stirred fears of a repeat of a 2002-2003 outbreak of Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome (SARS), which began in China and killed about 800 people globally.

MERS is caused by a coronavirus from the same family as the one that triggered SARS, though MERS does not spread as easily as SARS.

South Korea's single new case reported on Friday was the smallest number since 3 June, and marks a sharp drop from double-digit increases on some days last week.

The South Korean out-

break has taken a toll on Asia's fourth biggest economy, with tourists cancelling visits and consumers staying at home, and has dented the popularity of President Park Geun-hye, whose government was criticised for its initial response. Park's approval rating fell to 29 percent in a weekly poll released on Friday by Gallup Korea, the lowest since she took office in 2013. All of the infections known to have occurred in South Korea have taken place in healthcare facilities. The vast majority of MERS infections and deaths have been in Saudi Arabia, where more than 1,000 people have been infected since 2012, and about 454 have died.

### Abe unlikely to attend anniv event to mark Japan-S Korea relations

Токуо, 19 June — Prime Minister Shinzo Abe is unlikely to attend an event in Tokyo next week to mark the 50th anniversary of diplomatic relations between Japan and South Korea, a senior lawmaker said on Friday, as the neighbours continue to suffer strained bilateral ties.

Abe was quoted by former Chief Cabinet Secretary Takeo Kawamura as saying during a meeting that it would be "difficult (to attend) due to Diet schedules." The prime minister needs to attend deliberations on bills at parliament.

Kawamura made the remarks after he and former Prime Minister Yoshiro Mori met with Abe at the prime minister's office, during which Mori urged Abe to attend the reception at the South Korean Embassy in Tokyo on Monday. Earlier

this month, Mori and Kawamura met South Korean President Park Geun-hye during their visit to Seoul.

Issues such as differing perceptions of history and a territorial row have kept Abe and Park from holding a bilateral summit since they took office in 2012 and in 2013 respectively. Abe has maintained that the door for dialogue with Park is always open.

South Korean Foreign Minister Yun Byung Se is slated to attend the commemorative event on Monday during his two-day trip to Japan from Sunday, which marks the first visit by South Korea's top diplomat to Japan in four years. A similar commemorative event will be held the same day at the Japanese Embassy in Seoul. The Asian anniversary neighbours' will come amid strained bilateral ties due to a spat over a South Korea-controlled, Japan-claimed group of islets in the Sea of Japan and conflicting views on Japan's 1910-1945 colonial rule of the Korean Peninsula. The issue of the so-called Korean "comfort women," who were made to work in wartime brothels for the Imperial Japanese Army, also remains a thorny bilateral issue. The Japanese government dispatched a senior Foreign Ministry official on Friday, continuing efforts to resolve the issue and also seek South Korea's understanding of the proposed UNESCO World Heritage listing of historical industrial sites in Japan, which Seoul opposes by saying some 60,000 Koreans were conscripted to work at some of the 23 proposed sites during World War II.

### **India top court sets terms for Sahara** chief's release from jail

Mumbai, 19 June — India's Supreme Court on Friday set fresh terms for releasing troubled conglomerate Sahara's founder Subrata Roy, jailed for more than a year in a long-running dispute over issuance of illegal bonds. The court said Sahara, which has assets ranging from a Formula One team to 1 V channels, will have to pay 360 billion rupees (£3.6 billion) in nine instalments after Roy's release from jail.

Roy will also have to submit his passport to the court after his release on bail, the court said. Roy was arrested in March last year after the company failed to comply with a court order to refund money it had raised from millions of small investors by selling them bonds later ruled to be illegal. The court on Friday said Sahara owes as much as 360 billion rupees to the bond investors. Sahara previously said it had repaid 95 percent of the amount due to the investors.—Reuters

Voters whose names are absent from rolls must submit form No. 3, the statement said, while those listed with incorrect information must use form No. 4-C. People may contest the nomination of unsuitable persons, such as those who are deceased or imprisoned, with form No. 4.

Visitors' names will be included in voter list of permanent residences provided they submit household registration form No. 66/6. Political parties should cooperate with the Union Election Commission in assisting voters to be properly enrolled and to have comprehensive voter lists, the statement said.—MNA

### White man arrested in slaying of nine blacks at South Carolina church

19 June — A young white man suspected of shooting nine black people dead after spending an hour with them in Bible study at a historic African-American church in South Carolina was arrested on Thursday, a day after a massacre authorities say was motivated by racial hatred.

The mass shooting set off an intense 14-hour manhunt that ended with 21-year-old Dylann Roof

arrested in a traffic stop in a small North Carolina town, 220 miles (350 km) north of Charleston, where the church rampage occurred, officials said.

Roof, who an uncle said received a gun as a 21st birthday present in April and whose social media profile suggests a fascination with white supremacy, waived his right to extradition and was flown back to South Carolina hours after his arrest.

### **Danish centre-right** opposition wins election, PM quits party

COPENHAGEN, 19 June Danish voters ousted Prime Minister Helle Thorning-Schmidt in an election on Thursday and handed power to an opposition centre-right alliance including huge gains for a eurosceptic, anti-immigrant party.

Opposition leader Lars Lokke Rasmussen said he would try to form a government but is likely to have to make big concessions to ensure support from the rightwing Danish Peoples' Party (DF), which ended up with more votes than his Liberal

With all of the votes counted on the mainland, the centre-right won 90 seats in parliament to 85 seats for the centre-left bloc of Thorning-Schmidt, who wrongly gambled that an economic upturn would win her re-election.

Denmark's first female prime minister, elected in Thorning-Schmidt conceded defeat and quit as party leader after the vote.

DF, the second-biggest party behind Thorning-Schmidt's Social Democrats, has supported the Liberals in government before and its backing gives the centre-right led by Rasmussen its overall majority.

"Tonight we have been given an opportunity, but only an opportunity, to take leadership in Denmark," Rasmussen told supporters in parliament.

"We take that upon ourselves and I take that upon myself ... What I offer today is to put myself at the head of a government," he said.

DF's strong results were expected, but the party has been coy throughout the campaign about whether it would join a government for the first time in its 20-year history. It could leave the Liberals to form a government by themselves but support their policies in parliamentary votes, as it has done before.

"What we have said before the election is also what we will follow after the election — that we will be where the political influence is greatest," said DF leader Kristian Thulesen Dahl.

Four pastors, including Democratic state Senator Clementa Pinckney, 41, were among the six women and three men shot dead at the church nicknamed "Mother Emanuel."

The church was burned to the ground in the late 1820s, after plans of a slave revolt drafted by one of its founders were discovered. It was later rebuilt.

The gunshot victims ranged in age from 26 to

87. Three who were present survived the rampage unscathed, including a 5-year-old who, according to CNN, avoided being shot by playing dead.

CNN also broadcast a Snapchat video taken from inside the church during the study session, which appeared to show Roof before the massacre.

"The fact that this took place in a black church obviously raises questions about a dark part of our history," said US President Barack Obama. "Once again, innocent people were killed in part because someone who wanted to inflict harm had no trouble getting their hands on a gun."

The United States has been shaken by a string of shootings in recent years, including the 2012 massacre at Sandy Hook Elementary School, where a gunman killed 20 children and six adults. But Democratic-led efforts to tighten the nation's gun laws failed after that incident.

"If what I heard today is true, this calls for very serious talks with the European Commission on their attitude towards Serbia, its interests and the interests of its citizens," Dacic told Serbian journalists after meeting Gazprom CEO Alexei Miller.

### Melee erupts at Yemen peace talks, underscoring rifts

GENEVA / SANAA, 19 June — A fistfight erupted on the sidelines of peace talks in Geneva on Thursday between supporters of different warring factions in Yemen, underlining the divisions that have thwarted United Nations efforts broker a truce in the near three-month conflict. Yemeni opponents of the Houthi forces that drove the government into exile interrupted a news conference by Houthi officials, throwing shoes and insulting them as "criminals" and "dogs" who were "killing the children of south Yemen".

A Saudi-led coalition has been launching air raids against the Iran-allied Houthis since late March in a campaign to restore the exiled government and back its armed supporters.

The fighting continued on Thursday, with around 30 killed in clashes between Houthis and tribesmen in the central province of Mareb, tribal sources said, while the capital Sanaa was hit by air strikes targeting Houthi military sites. The peace talks are struggling to bring together the rival factions and, with discussions due to conclude on Friday or Saturday, delegates have reported little progress toward the cease-

fire the UN has requested.

Hamza Al-Houthi, head the Houthi delegation to the UN-sponsored talks, stayed composed throughout the brawl that began when a woman in a pink headscarf went to the podium and threw a shoe at him, a particular insult in the Arab

A fistfight then broke out between Houthis and protesters before the latter were escorted out.

A representative of Yemen's General People's Congress, which is allied to the Houthis, said they supported a pause to let humanitarian aid into Yemen but doubted others would do the same. "We are absolutely in favour of a humanitarian truce. I don't think this pause receives the approval of Saudi Arabia, after all they are aggressing us, it is up to them," Yasser Al Ewady told reporters in Geneva.

But Khaled Bahah, Yemen's Vice President in exile, suggested the Houthis would use a ceasefire to expand their reach.

"We are hoping for a permanent humanitarian ceasefire, not a temporary truce. Because a temporary truce is exploited to spread the battlefield and as a tac-

### Militant group denies US air strike killed Algerian Belmokhtar

NOUAKCHOTT, 19 June The Sahara-based Islamist group al-Mourabitoun on Thursday denied reports that veteran Algerian militant Mokhtar Belmokhtar, one of its leaders, was killed in a US air strike in eastern Libya last week.

government first announced on Sunday that Belmokhtar, blamed for a deadly assault on an Algerian gas field in 2013 and a major figure in insurgencies across North Africa, had died alongside other militant leaders. While Washington confirmed that he had been the target of the strike, it has yet to say if he was killed.

In a statement received by the Mauritanian news

agency Alakhbar, al-Mourabitoun denied Belmokhtar was present in the area targeted by the raid.

"We announce to our mujahideen brothers everywhere in the world that the news of the death of commander Khaled Abou El Abbas in an American air strike is false," the statement said, referring to Belmokhtar by one of his aliases. Reuters could not immediately verify the authenticity of the statement, which was published in Arabic on Alakhbar's website. The agency has been used in the past by Islamist militant groups including al-Mourabitoun to publicise their statements.

"There is virtually no water and food is hard to come by...There is virtually no access to proper health

care." It was a snapshot of the human disaster wrought by four years of uprising and civil war in Syria. A UN report issued last month said the conflict had killed over 220,000 people and left 12.2 million of the 22 million population in need of humanitarian aid as well as a third of the population homeless.

The ICRC said it had also been able to deliver food to collective kitchens run by SARC and other charities in and around Aleppo in Syria's north and to airlift medical equipment with SARC from Damascus to Hasaka in northeastern Syria, which it said

was inaccessible by road.

The ICRC's president said in March that the group had "well-established contacts" with the Syrian government and "reasonably good cooperation" in terms of it granting permission for convoys, visas and imports.

Aid groups have to work carefully in Syria alongside the government or local aid organizations and have been pushing to reach populations across conflict lines. This week Oxfam said it was seeking greater access for its water projects in the country after a visit to Damascus.

### Clinton — US must face 'hard truths' after South **Carolina shooting**



Las Vegas, 19 June — Democratic presidential contender Hillary Clinton said on Thursday after a deadly shooting at a historic African-American church in South Carolina that the United States must face "hard truths" about race and gun violence.

'We have to face hard truths about race, violence, guns and division," Clinton said at the beginning of scheduled remarks at the annual National Association of Latino Elected and Appointed Officials conference in Las Vegas.

"How many innocent people in our country from little children, church members to movie theatre attendees, how many people do we need to see cut down before we act?" Clinton asked.

Clinton was responding to the shooting late Wednesday at a Bible study at the Emanuel African Methodist Episcopal Church in Charleston that left nine dead. She was also referring to the 20 children and six adults killed during the 2012 shooting spree at Sandy Hook Elementary School in Connecticut, and a rampage at a Colorado movie theatre the same year that left 12 dead.

"So as we mourn and as our hearts break a little more, we will not forsake those who have been victimized by gun violence, this time we have to find answers together,"

"I pledge to you I will work with you," Clinton told the room of elected officials. "Let's unite in partnership, not just to talk but to act."

Clinton has a second campaign stop in Nevada on Thursday at a veterans' centre in Reno.—Reuters

### Indonesia sets minority stake for Inpex, Total in oil, gas field

Jakarta, 19 June — The Indonesian government announced on Friday that state-owned oil and gas company PT Pertamina and local authorities will control a 70 percent stake of the gas-rich Mahakam Block in 2018, leaving Japan's Inpex Corp and French energy giant Total E&P Indonesie and with minority shares.

Energy and Mineral Resources Minister Sudirman Said said in a statement Total and Inpex, which have been involved in the project for almost 50 years as operators and investors, will only get a combined 30 percent stake.

Pertamina and regional state-owned companies in East Kalimantan Province on the Indonesian part of Borneo Island will later discuss their portions in the country's biggest gas block.

Total and Inpex currently have a 50-50 share in operating the project.

Amid nationalistic sentiments that run high in the country, President Joko "Jokowi" Widodo said early this year that his administration will put expiring contracts of the country's natural resource management under bigger control of national companies.

Starting its first production in 1974, the 2,740-square-kilometre gas field's current annual production is 1,750 million metric standard cubic feet per day of gas, or 25 percent of the country's total gas production of around 6,963 million metric standard cubic feet per day.

The block also currently produces 69,186 barrels of oil per day of oil and condensate. The government's current contract with Total and Inpex will end on 31 December, 2017.

### At least three dead as Tropical Depression Bill lashes central US

OKLAHOMA CITY, 19 June — Tropical Depression Bill pelted the central United States with heavy rain on Thursday after causing at least three deaths in the region, including a toddler in Oklahoma who was swept out of his father's arms by raging waters, officials said.

In the southern Oklahoma city of Ardmore, emergency workers on Thursday found the body of the 2-yearold boy who died in flooding the day before after he and his father were swept into a creek, said Ardmore Police Captain Eric Hamblin.

One person in neighbouring Missouri was killed this week by flooding caused by rains from the storm hitting the region and a woman died in central Texas when she lost control of her car while driving through the storm, officials said. Broadcaster KOTV, citing police, reported on Thursday the body of an 80-year-old woman also was discovered in a submerged vehicle near Tecumseh, Oklahoma, about 45 miles (72 km) southeast of Oklahoma City.

Reuters could not independently confirm the report as local officials could not be reached for comment.

Bill, the second named tropical storm of the 2015 Atlantic hurricane season, was on a path to the northeast, through Arkansas and Missouri into West Virginia. Some areas could see as much as 12 inches (30 cm), the National Weather Service said

By Friday, the centre of the storm is expected to be

over southern Missouri and weaken over the next few days, the National Weather Service said.

Missouri Governor Jay Nixon declared a state of emergency, due to floods.

"With more heavy rain in the forecast, we will continue to remain in direct contact with law enforcement and local officials as we work to protect lives and property," Nixon said in a statement.

The storm, which came

ashore in Texas on Tuesday, lashed an area from Houston to Dallas with heavy rain.

In late May, severe weather killed nearly 40 people in Texas and Oklahoma with storms causing flooding that damaged thousands of structures.

Tropical Depression Bill could cause rivers already swollen by those torrential rains to spill over their banks again, the National Weather Service warned.

### US Senate backs Japan's use of collective self-defence right

WASHINGTON, 19 June — The US Senate, in a defence bill passed on Thursday, supported Japan's proposed policy of enabling the country help allies militarily even when Japan is not directly attacked.

The move comes as debate heats up in Japan on whether legislation put forward to parliament by Prime Minister Shinzo Abe's government to allow the country to exercise the right to collective self-defence violates the country's war-renouncing Constitu-

"The United States supports recent changes in Japanese defence policy, including the adoption of collective self-defence," says the Senate's bill for the National Defence Authorization Act for fiscal 2016.

The House of Representatives cleared the bill last month.

Last July, the Abe administration lifted Japan's self-imposed decades-old ban on exercising the right to collective self-defence by reinterpreting Article 9 of the Constitution, which previous governments had long said only allows the country to use force to defend itself. Legislation now in parliament is aimed at amending relevant laws.

The legislative change would enable Japan's Self-Defence Forces to help the US military and the armed forces of other countries Tokyo considers to be its close allies.

US government officials have voiced hope for Japan's bigger role in future security operations, but the legislation has spurred intense debate in and outside Japanese parliament over its constitutionality.

While 20 people died within hours, 13 more succumbed late Thursday night, the official said, adding that 10 more are in a critical condition at hospitals.

## Justin Bieber, Usher ordered to face copyright lawsuit

New York, 19 June, Justin Bieber and Usher were ordered by a US appeals court on Thursday to face a \$10 million lawsuit claiming the singers illegally copied parts of a song composed by two Virginia song-

By a 3-0 vote, the 4<sup>th</sup> US Circuit Court of Appeals in Richmond revived a May 2013 lawsuit by Devin Copeland, an R&B singer known as De Rico, and his songwriting partner Mareio Overton, saying a lower court judge was wrong to dismiss it.

The plaintiffs claimed that three versions of the song "Somebody to Love" recorded by Bieber, Usher or both shared the beat pattern, time signature, and similar chords and lyrics with their song with the same name.

"After listening to the Copeland song and the Bieber and Usher songs as wholes, we conclude that their choruses are similar enough and also significant enough that a reasonable jury could find the songs intrinsically similar," Circuit

Judge Pamela Harris wrote for the appeals court.

Among the other defendants were publishers such as Vivendi SA's Universal Music Publishing Group and Sony Corp's Sony/ATV Music Publishing. Defence lawyers did not immediately respond to requests for comment.

Duncan Byers, a lawyer for the plaintiffs, in an interview said the panel "recognized what my clients have said all along: it's the same melody and the same chorus."—Reuters



## China cinema boom excites Shanghai film festival

Shanghai, 19 June — The sense of excitement at the Shanghai International Film Festival is understandable — these are boom times. for the Chinese film industry, as cinema box office soars and capital pours in.

"It's only a matter of time before China surpasses the United States to become the world's largest movie market," said Shi Chuan, deputy chairman of the Shanghai Film Association, on the sidelines of the festi-

After 11 years of grad-

ual growth in the number of cinemas in China, the country reached 10,000 screens in 2011. But that had doubled within three years. As of the end of May, China had 28,000 cinema screens.

The United States has 40,000 but the number has remained almost unchanged over recent years.

China is on course to overtake the United States within three to five years, said Shi.

US moviegoing among Hollywood's key 18- to 39-year-old audience fell to

its lowest level in five years in 2014, as overall attendance in most markets around the world was flat or declining, according to a report released in March by the Motion Picture Association of America.

The notable exception was Asia and in particular China, in which growth in the number of theaters continued to be robust. Box office reached 29.6 billion yuan (around 4.8 billion US dollars) in 2014, more than 30 times that of 2002.

"Furious 7" reaped

more than 2 billion yuan in April in China and became the country's most successful movie ever, overshadowing the US market. China's box office so far this year has surpassed 17.5 billion yuan, up 55 percent year on year.

"Several years ago, we were proud of a theater chain taking a billion yuan in a year. Now, one billion is just the box office of a single film," said Lu Yang, a manager with Wanda Cinemas, the film arm of the Wanda Group conglomerate.

Wanda Cinemas has

more than 1,300 screens across China and accounted for 14.5 percent of the country's box office in 2014.

Seeing the bright prospects, big names like e-commerce giant Alibaba have been investing heavily in the film industry.

Alibaba paid 6.24 billion HK dollars last year for 59.32 percent of Hong Kong-listed China Vision Media Group Ltd and renamed it "Ali Pictures". In March, Alibaba acquired an 8.8-percent stake in Enlight, one of China's leading film

and TV production companies. It announced at the film festival that a Netflix-style video streaming service will be launched within two

The lucrative market has also attracted global movie mainstays like DreamWorks to open studios in Shanghai. Major movie academies, including the University of Southern California School of Cinematic Arts and Vancouver Film School, have established branch schools in China.

### 'Veep' production moving from Washington's backyard to California

WASHINGTON, June — The HBO comedy "Veep," which depicts the inner workings of the White House from the perspective of a female vice president elevated to the presidency, is moving production to California from Maryland, a spokesman for the show said on Thursday.

The Time Warner Inc unit is shifting the Emmy Award-winning show because of better tax incentives, HBO spokesman Quentin Schaff said in a statement. "The producers and HBO would like to thank Maryland for making the last four seasons of Veep such a success," Schaff said. "We look forward to returning with another production in the future."

HBO, which has filmed several projects in Maryland over the years, including "The Wire," "The Corner" and "Game Change," had long been considering the move for tax incentive reasons.

"Veep," starring Julia Louis-Dreyfus as Vice President Selina Meyer, who takes over for the president when he resigns, is one of four shows selected to receive tax credits for relocating production to California, according to the California Film Commission. The panel earmarked \$6.5 million in film tax credits to "Veep" if the show moved to California, according to the commission's executive director, Amy Lemisch.

"Veep" has been filmed in Maryland for four years, primarily in Columbia, Baltimore and Sykesville. It received \$13.9 million in tax credits in its first three seasons, said Karen Bell Hood of Maryland's Department of Business and Economic Development. —Reuters

### Hilary Duff dives back into music with 'Breathe In. Breathe Out'

### Peru beat 10-man Venezuela, Group C all square

VALPARAISO, 19 June — Peru beat 10-man Venezuela 1-0 at the Copa America on Thursday to leave all four Group C teams level on points with one more firstround match left to play.

Peru captain Claudio Pizarro scored the winner after 72 minutes, slamming a powerful shot into the net off the underside of the crossbar. Venezuela played most of the match with 10 men after defender Fernando Amorebieta was sent off in the 29<sup>th</sup> minute for stamping on Paolo Guerrero, leaving the Peruvian striker with bleeding stud marks on his left thigh.

From then on the Peruvians dominated possession but, untilPizarro's late strike, struggled to break down an orderly Venezuelan defence.

Peru face Colombia in their final group match on Sunday while Venezuela face Brazil, with all four in the hunt for a place in the last eight of the competition.

Venezuela made the brighter start and Salomon Rondon, the goalscorer against Colombia in their first match, almost put them ahead after six minutes but fired his close range volley into the arms of goalkeeper Pedro Gallese.

The match changed with Amorebieta's dismissal. The defender tugged Guerrero to the ground and then stood on his thigh in an ugly and unnecessary challenge on the touchline.

Despite the numerical advantage, it took Peru a further 40 minutes to make the breakthrough.

Guerrero and Christian Cueva combined well on the edge of the box to put Pizarro through on goal to score, sealing Peru's fifth victory over Venezuela in seven meetings at the Copa

America. Both sides defied expectations by reaching the semi-finals at the last Copa America in 2011 and both still have hopes of making at least the quarter-finals this time.—Reuters

"She was just a beautiful woman," Campbell said. "We enjoyed her words of wisdom." Talley was born in Georgia and moved to Michigan in 1935 with her husband, Alfred Talley, for his job at a Ford plant. He died in 1988.

Robert Young, director

of the Gerontology Research Group's Supercentenarian Research and Database Division, said Talley's death came as a surprise as she lived an active lifestyle.

"She was walking around as of a few weeks ago," Young said.

The next person who could possibly claim status as the oldest in the world is Susannah Mushatt Jones, Born in Alabama, she is living at the Vandalia Senior Centre in Brooklyn, New York, a representative for the centre confirmed on Thursday. Talley was an active member in the New Jerusalem Missionary Baptist Church in Inkster. Services for Talley will be held on 27 June at the church.—Reuters

## Johnson, Stenson share Open lead, Tiger cards 80

UNIVERSITY PLACE, Washington, 19 June – Dustin Johnson and Henrik Stenson set the first-round pace at the US Open on Thursday on a day of remarkable highs and lows as Tiger Woods shot an 80, his fourth-worst score as a professional. American Johnson and Swede Stenson fired matching five-under-par 65s on a firm and fast-running Chambers Bay layout while Phil Mickelson made an encouraging start with a 69.

The long-hitting Johnson piled up six birdies and a lone bogey to finish level with Stenson, who birdied four of his last five holes at the British Open-style venue in the year's second major, being played for the first time in the Pacific North-

They were one stroke ahead of American Patrick Reed, while Americans Matt Kuchar, Ben Martin and amateur Brian Campbell trailed by two.

"I hit the ball really well ... had a lot of good looks at birdie all day," Johnson, who like Stenson is seeking a first major title, told reporters.

"It's firm but you could control your golf ball, for sure. Today I controlled my ball very well. The confidence is definitely there. I feel really good about where I'm at and going into tomor-

Stenson joined Johnson at the top after draining a 20-foot birdie putt on the 18th for a homeward nine of four-under 31.

"It was a good day," said the Swedish world number six. "I was striking

it nicely, which led to a lot of birdie opportunities for me. "I felt like I was really keeping my patience and a level head out there. I hit some beautiful putts and managed to slip a few in

Mickelson, who is yearning to complete a career grand slam of the four majors by winning his first US Open, was "very

pleased" after a round that included four birdies and three bogeys. "I hit a lot of good shots today," Mickelson, a runner-up at the US Open a record six times, said. "I shot under par the first day of the US Open.

"The first round was the round I was going to be most nervous at, getting started. You don't want to have to fight to come back all the time. You want to get off to a solid start around par. I'm very pleased with the way the round went."

### No lapses if Williams wants Serena Slam — Evert, McEnroe

New York, 19 June — Serena Williams has a great chance to sweep to victory at Wimbledon and hold all four grand slam titles at the same time but she must raise her consistency, former champions Chris Evert and John McEnroe said on

at this year's Australian and French Opens — but must overcome her recent lean spell on grass.

After winning the last of her five Wimbledon titles in 2012, the American world number one has fallen before the quarter-finals

"Serena's ... chasing history in terms of her grand slam titles," McEnroe said. "Even though she's still playing arguably her best tennis, you have to wonder at a certain point how long that can keep up."

The American commentators agreed that the lapses of concentration that hampered her at Roland Garros could prove more costly at the All England Club. "When she is at her best she is better than anybody else," Evert said. "But a (Sabine) Lisicki, who has at the same time we've seen some hiccups and we've seen some drama, like at the French Open. She can't afford to have any more drama like at the French Open."

Williams battled flu during the second week of her run at Roland Garros, where she survived five three-set battles to win the title, beating Lucie Safarova in the final. "On grass, a couple bigger hitters ... (could) win more points on the serve than they would on a clay court or a hard court," McEnroe said.

"They're not as easily attackable because of the nature of the grass being a little bit more difficult to gauge where the ball's going to be..." Evert concurred.

"On the clay, you have the luxury of playing your way into a match a little bit more," she noted. "Even when she was a set and a break down, she could still play her way back into it.

"As John says, she gets a big serve, (Petra) Kvitova, (Victoria) Azarenka, somebody who is hot that day, grass is not the same surface as clay. You can't play your way into it as easily."
